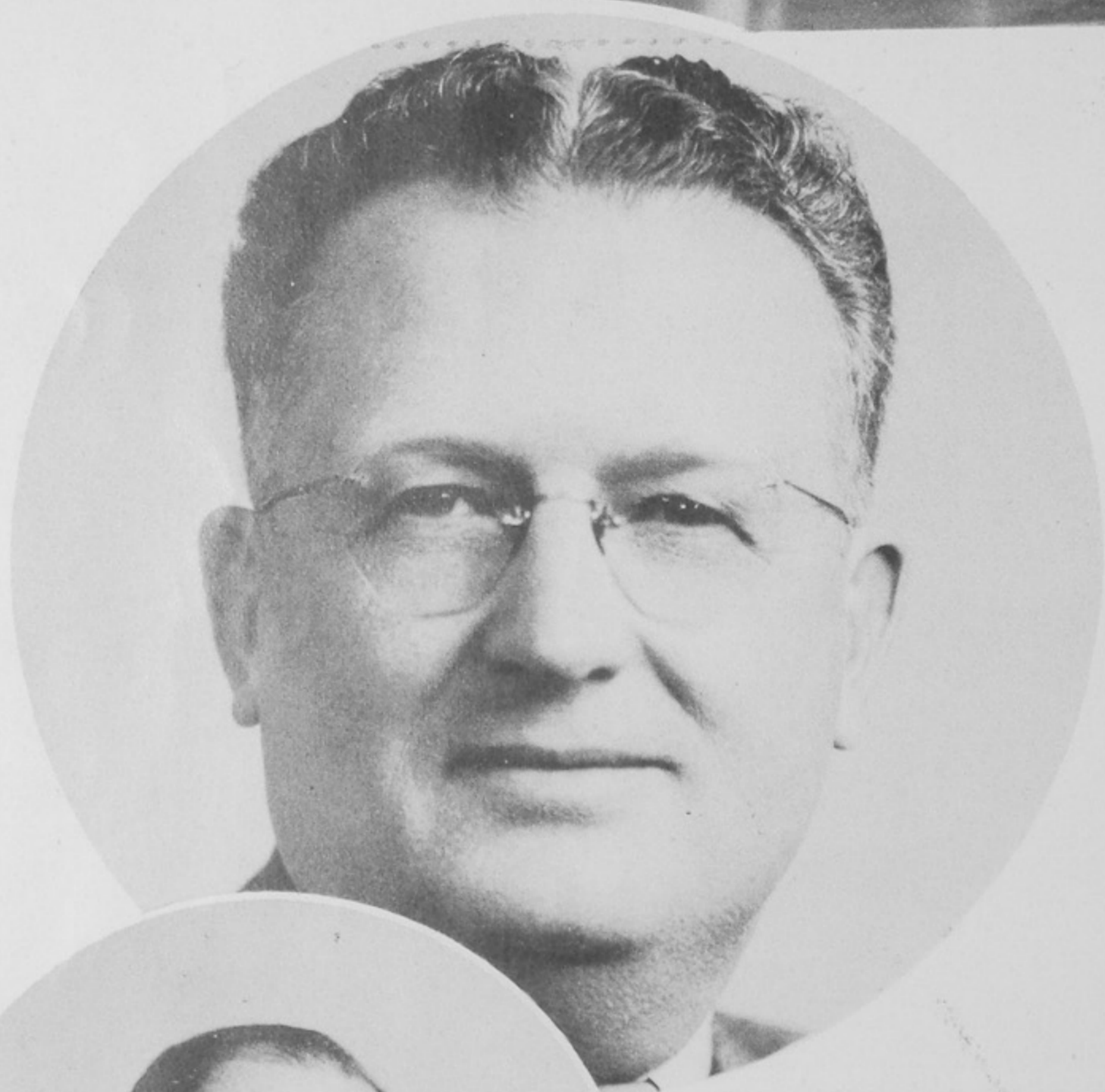




P.H.S. PRINCIPAL

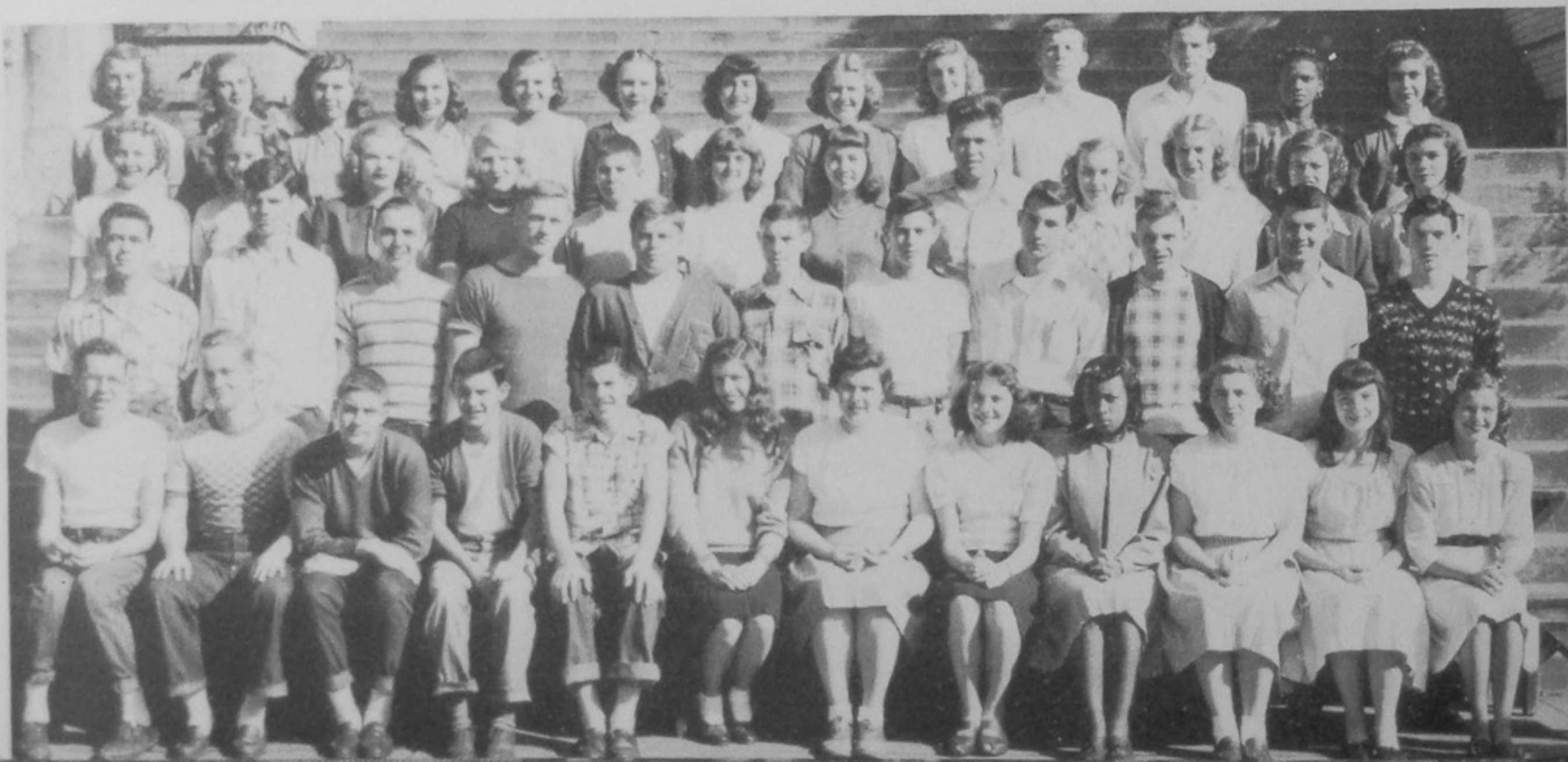
FRENCH CLUB

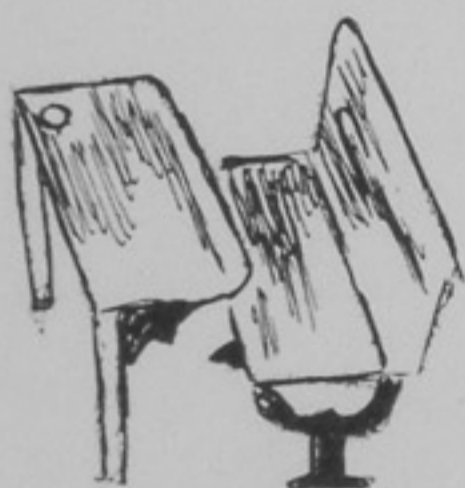

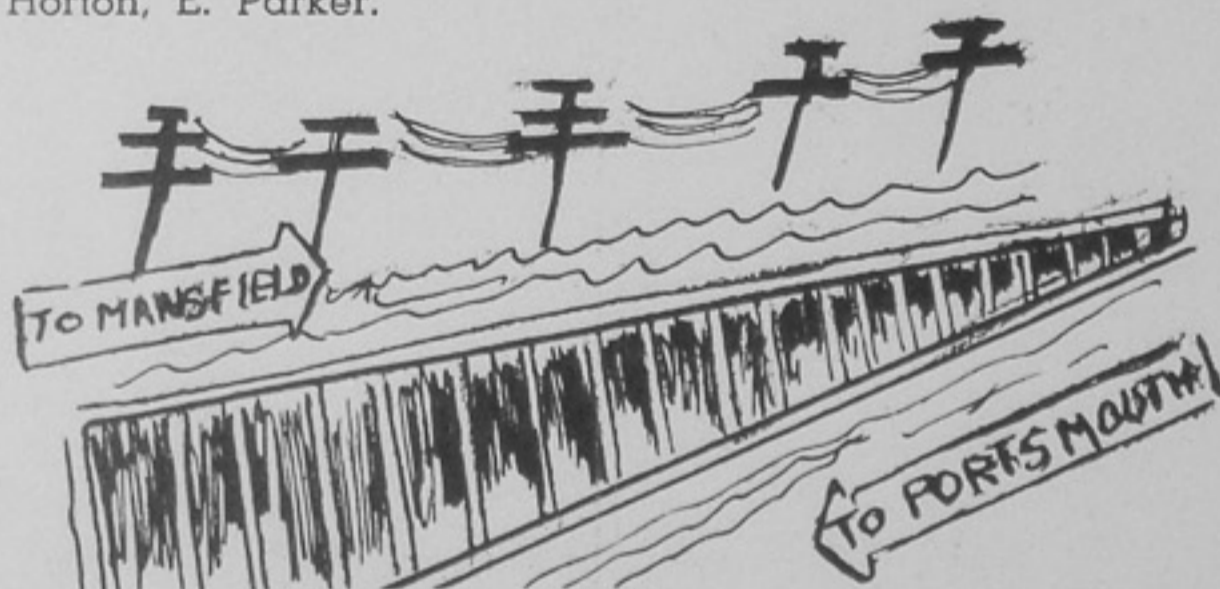




JUNIOR CLUB

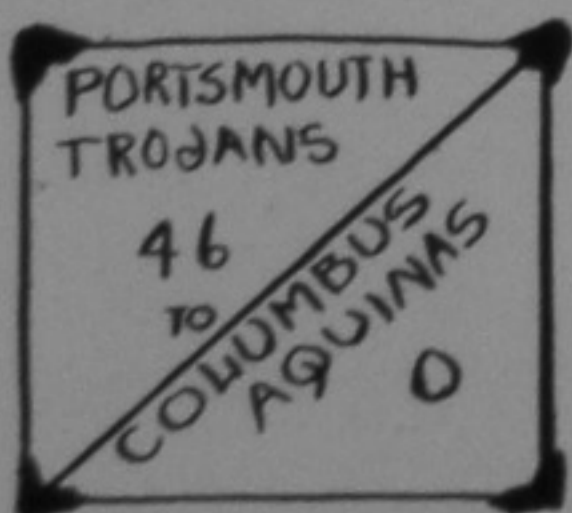
FOOTBALL GAMES

Exploding with seven touchdowns, the Portsmouth High School Trojans gave their new mentor, Coach Vincent "Rocky" Snyder, an auspicious debut before 5,000 pleased spectators. Gib Clowe turned in the "longest and mostest" touchdown run as he sprinted 72, 10, and 1 yards for scores. "Corky" Sparks, Jim Scott, Russ White, and Dee Mauk accounted for a six-pointer each in a tilt which saw the entire Trojan bench swept clean.

Keeping up the torrid pace set the week before, the Trojans ripped through a powerful Springfield eleven. Center John Thomas scored twice on pass interceptions, kicked an extra point, and sparked the Trojan defense as Portsmouth chalked up its first Greater Ohio League victory. End Dick Anderson tallied on a 25-yard pass play and Halfback Gib Clowe added to his list of scores with a 90-yard kickoff return.

A spirited Portsmouth eleven fought to the end against a superior Mansfield squad, but bad breaks brought the Trojans to their first defeat. After a first period Tyger score, Gib Clowe raced 80 yards in the third stanza to knot the count. A Trojan fumble set up another Tyger touchdown; a safety and a third Mansfield TD completed the scoring.

A third quarter slump cost the Red and Blue another defeat in its third straight road trip. After leading 20 to 12 in the second half the Trojans watched the Highlanders push across three touchdowns to sew up the game. Gib Clowe, who turned in the best offensive and defensive plays of the game, returned the second half kick-off 90 yards, and tackled Fetty on the six-yard line after Fetty had broken through the entire Trojan defense on a kick-off. Clowe also scored the other two Trojan markers to bring his total to ten for the first five games.



A rugged Cavalier air offense nearly turned the tables on Portsmouth and kept the fans in suspense until the last 70 seconds when Clowe scored the winning marker. Overcoming leads three times the Trojans ran through the Chillicothe line to score four times and capture victory number 3. Yeagle, Clowe, and Mauk shared offensive honors for this game.

After a tight first half in which the score was tied at six all, the Big Blue of Hamilton staged a strong comeback to defeat the Trojans of Portsmouth 18 to 6. Clowe was responsible for the lone Portsmouth tally. The Trojans won on first downs but couldn't seem to gain the necessary strength for a scoring thrust.

An inspired P.H.S. squad came from behind to tie Middletown, ranked second in the state, before a homecoming crowd of 6,000 thrilled spectators. Sparks and Clowe tallied the scores for the Trojans, and Yeagle added the all-important extra point. Every Trojan gridded his heart out for his team in this homecoming tray. High scorer Clowe was injured in this game, and was out for the rest of the season.

On a rain-soaked field and through a steady downpour the Trojans were almost upset by an underdog Youngstown team playing over its head. Only two extra points from the educated toe of Ray Yeagle provided the margin of victory. Campbell and Gambill scored the touchdowns which gave the Trojans a third period lead of 14 to 0. However, Youngstown came back with two markers which made the final count close.

Rounding out a successful season the 1947 edition of the Portsmouth High School football Trojans soundly defeated their ancient rivals, the Ironton Tigers, 19 to 6. Two Juniors, Dee Mauk and Dave Gambill, stole the game from the fifteen Seniors who played their last game in Trojan uniform. Mauk scored twice and Gambill once to lead the Trojans' revenge of last year's defeat. Ray Yeagle split the goal posts for the extra point.
