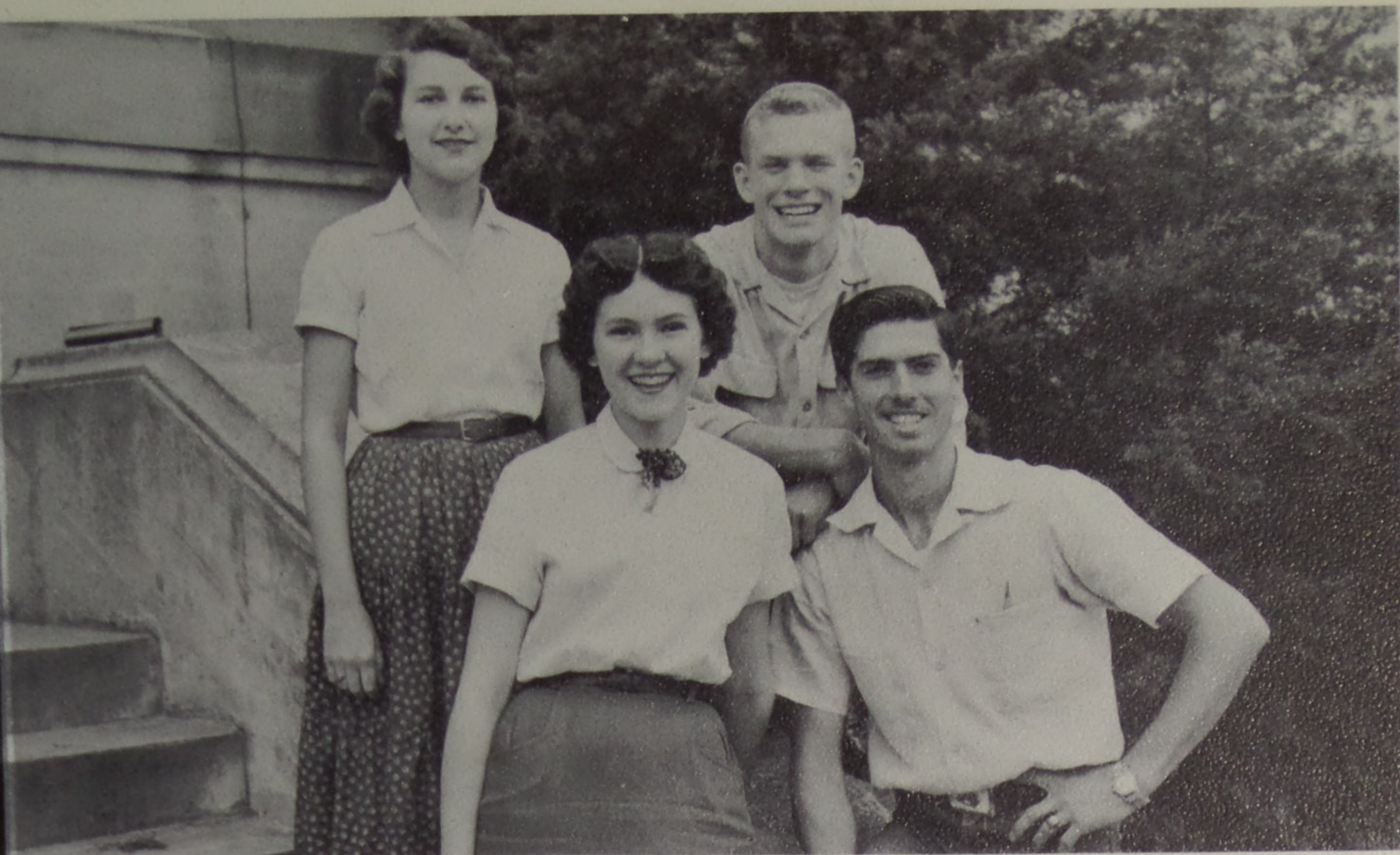

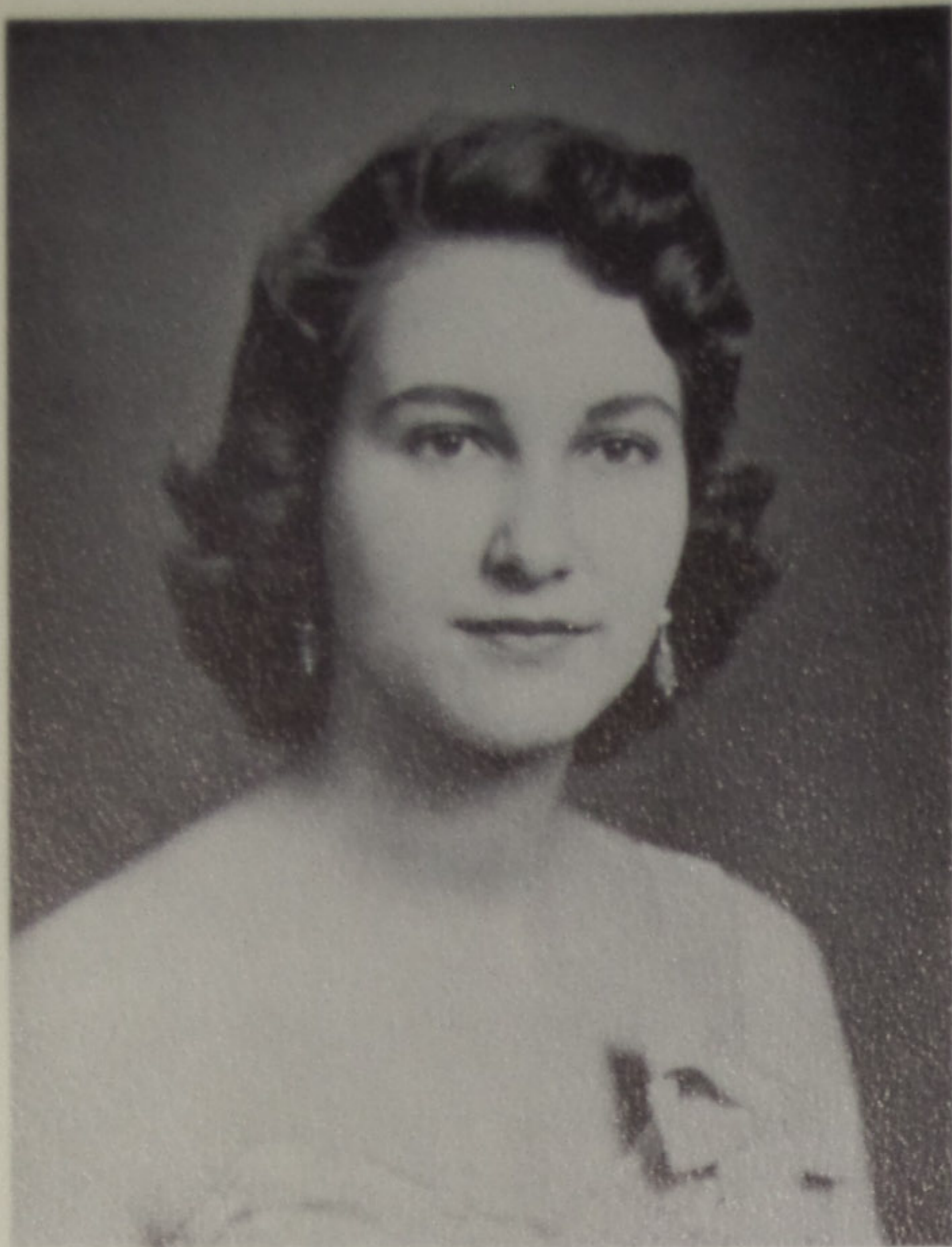
HOME EC CLUB

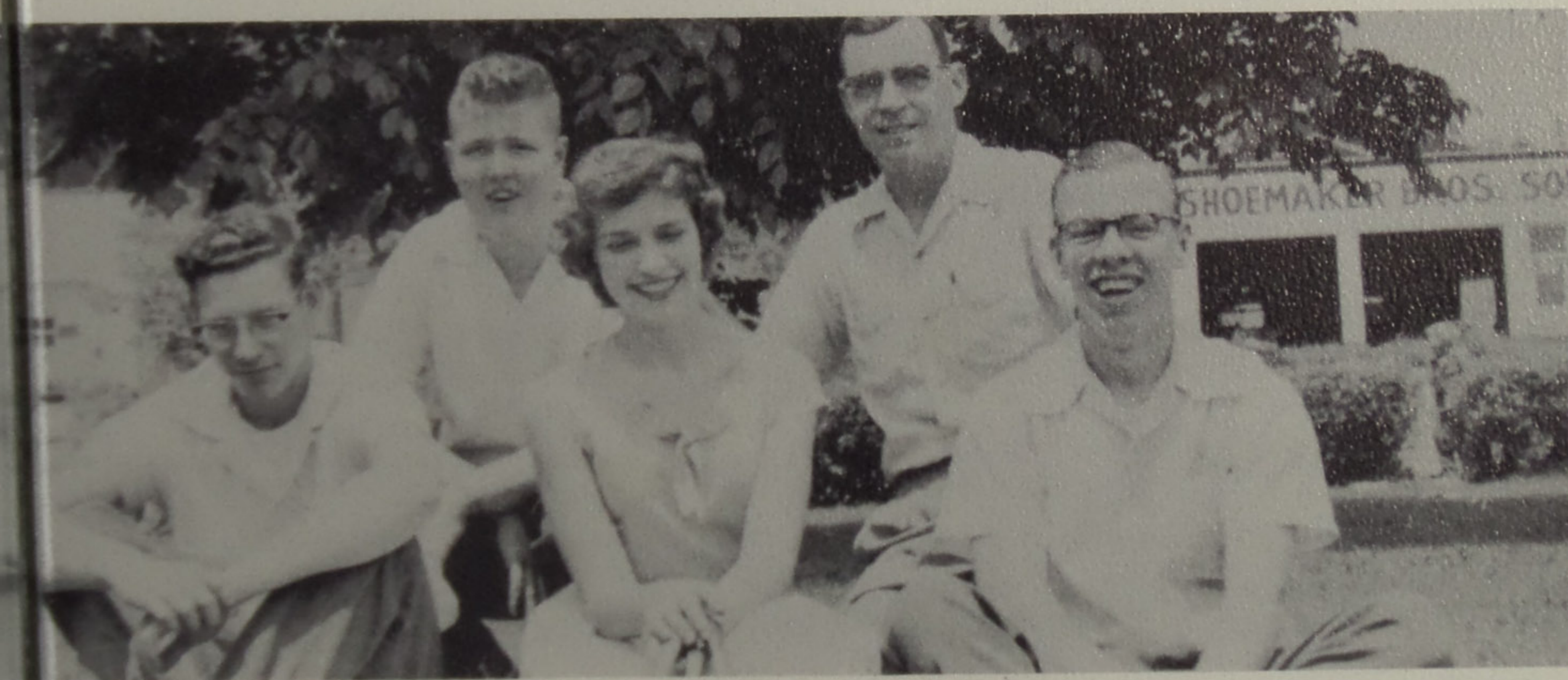

CLASS HISTORY

In the fall of 1952, after eight years of grade school, 100 carefree and excited Freshmen answered roll call. With eager anticipation, we started up the rocky road of education. Guiding our way through the first year of high school were our home room teachers, Mr. Pflieger and Mr. Potts.

Our peep into high school activity was the election of class officers. As leaders, we chose: Larry Gilliland, President; Jim Will, Vice President; Bill Adams, Secretary; Betty Pflieger, Treasurer.

As Freshmen, we were active in intramural sports. We also participated in Glee Club, Band, Home Ec. Club, and scholarship.

To end our first year of high school, we gave a skating party. We watched our basketball team win the Scioto County Tournament by beating Clay three times. They went on to the Waverly Tournament and won it by upsetting New Boston 76-44. Although we lost our first game in the Athens Tournament, we gave Nelsonville a hard time.

We felt honored when fourteen of our classmates were elected to the new chapter of the National Honor Society of our school.
