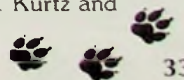

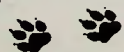

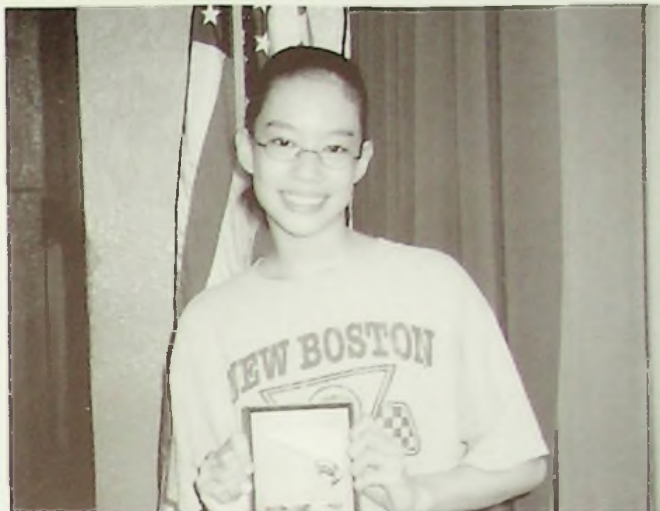

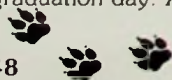

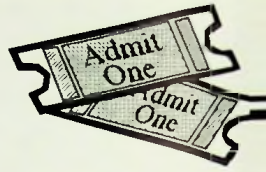

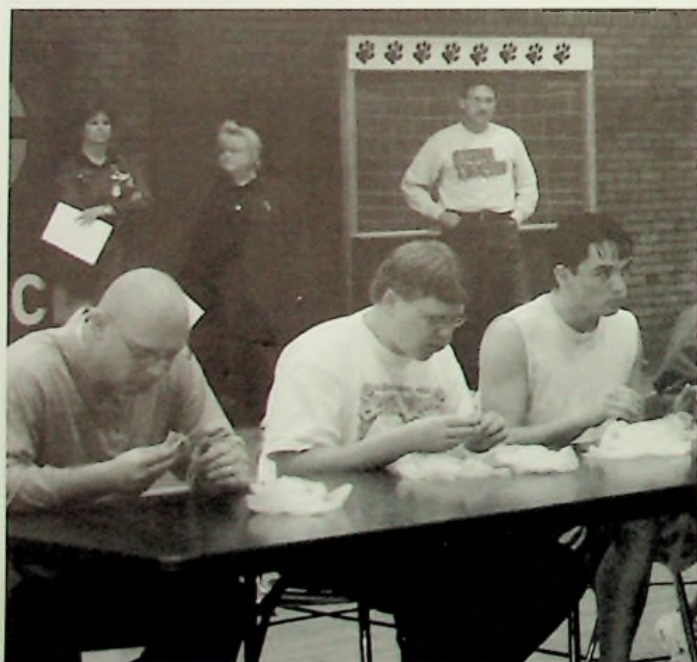

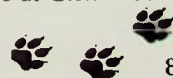

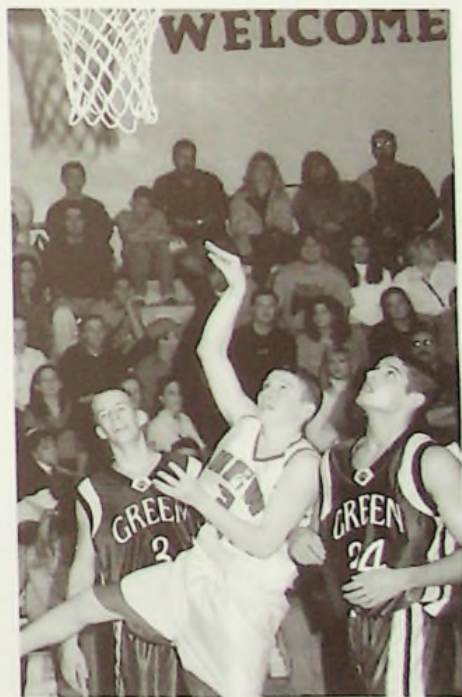

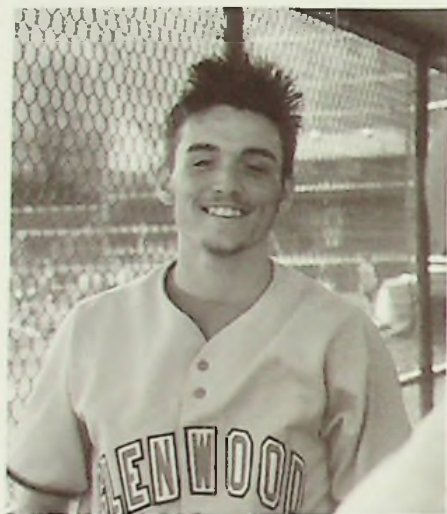

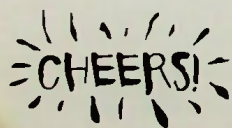

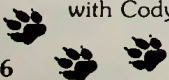

in one of the couple's many houses. Amanda arrived in her 2011 Porsche and her husband followed her in his Special Edition 2011 BMW.

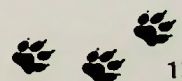

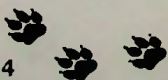

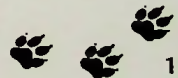
