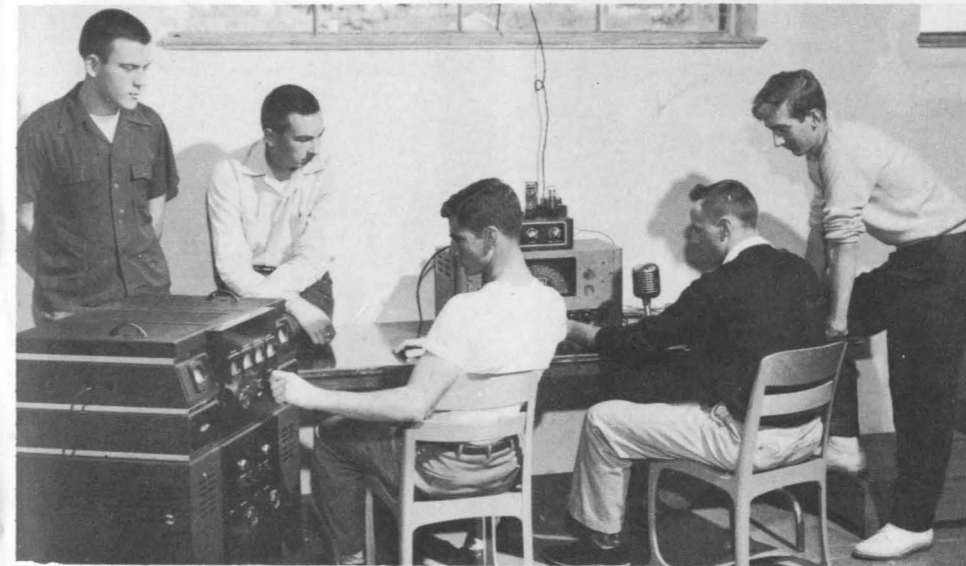

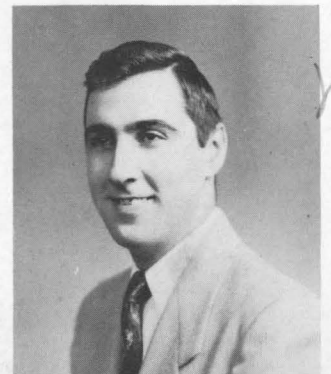

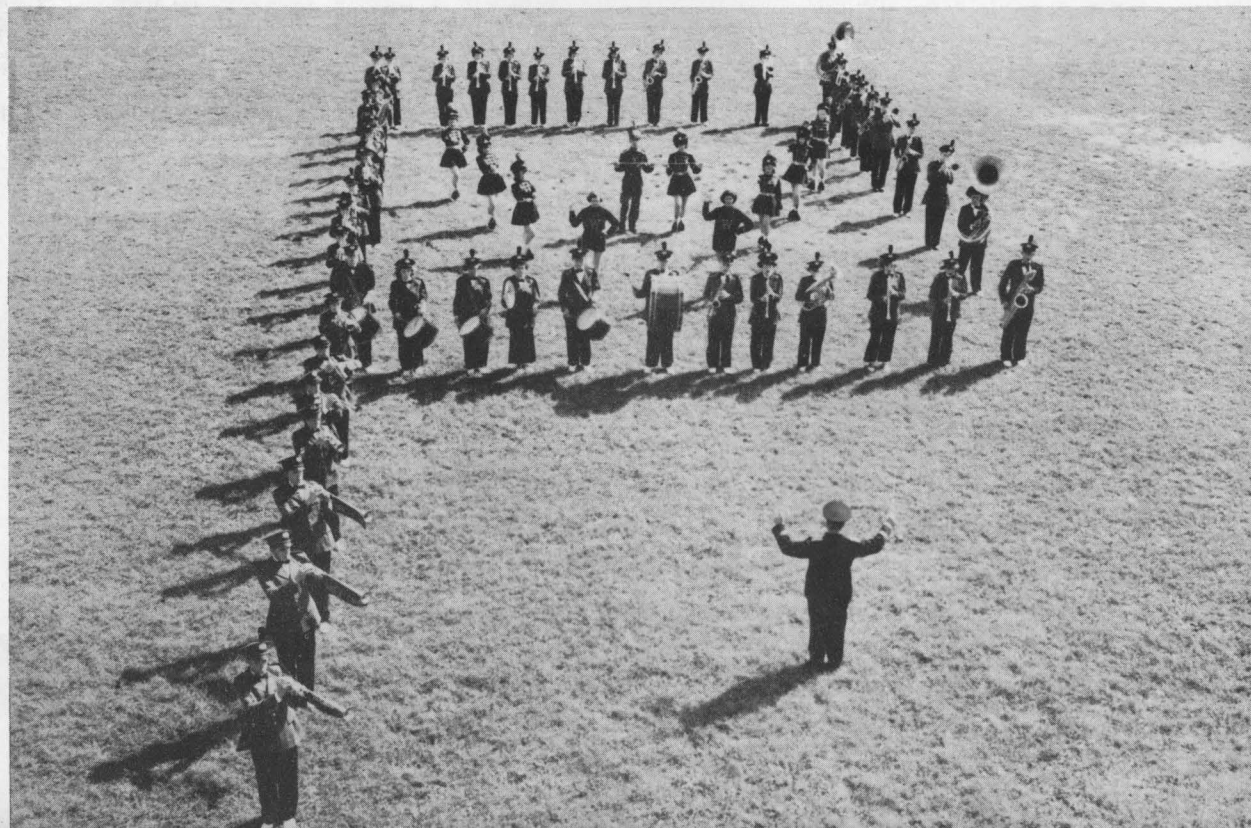

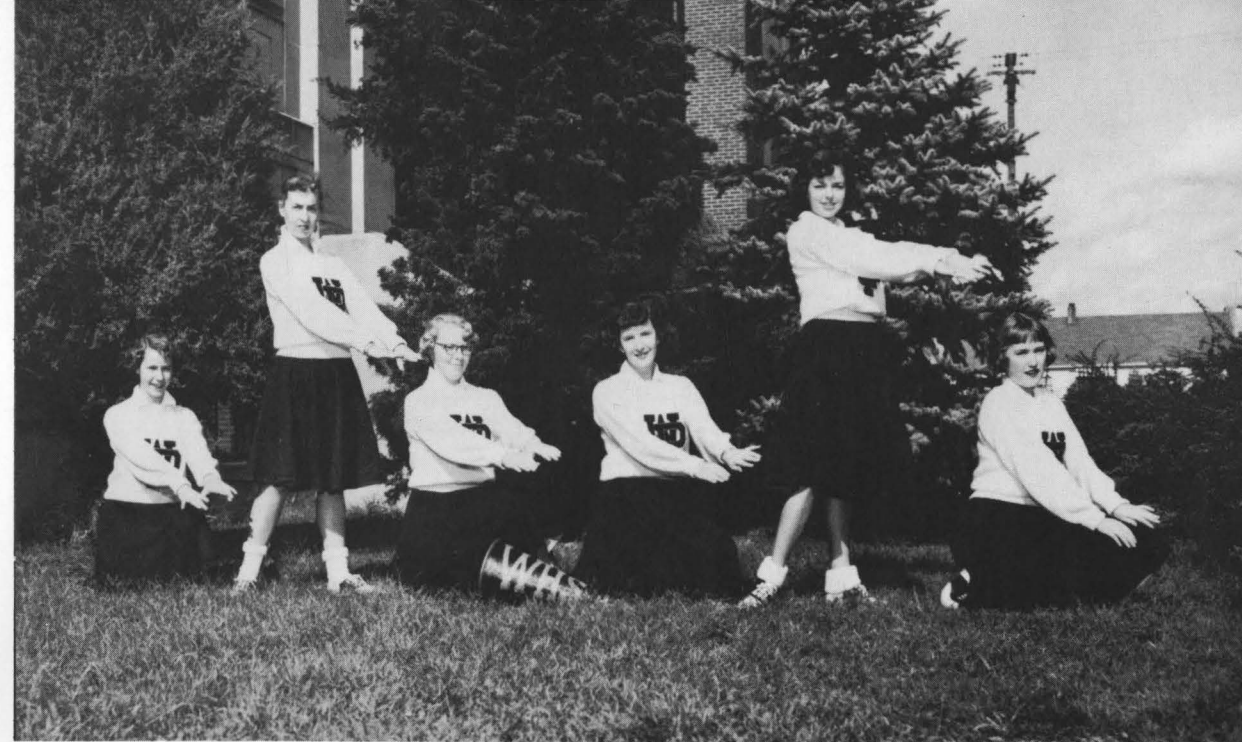
## A MESSAGE FROM THE ATHLETIC DEPARTMENT
