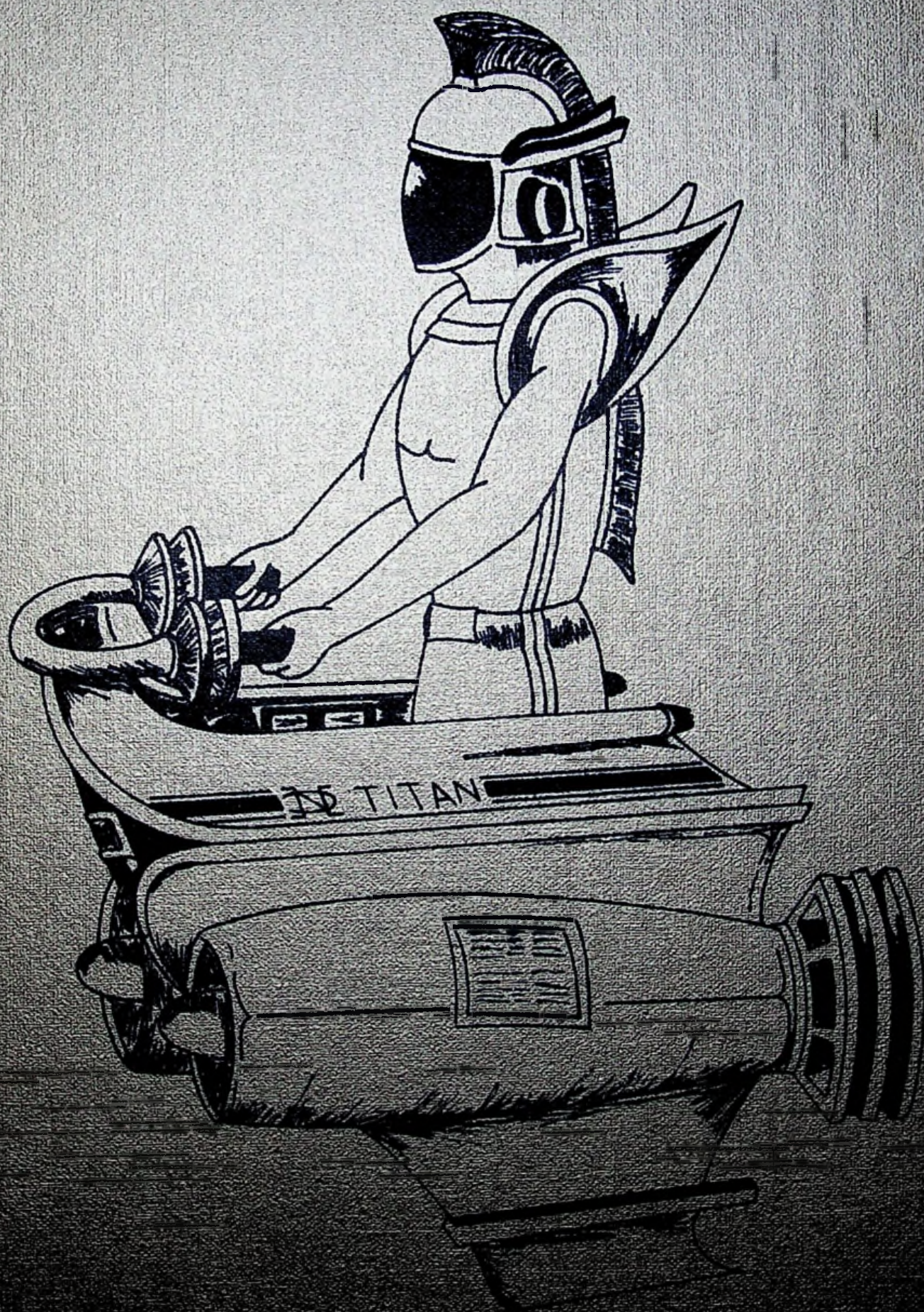

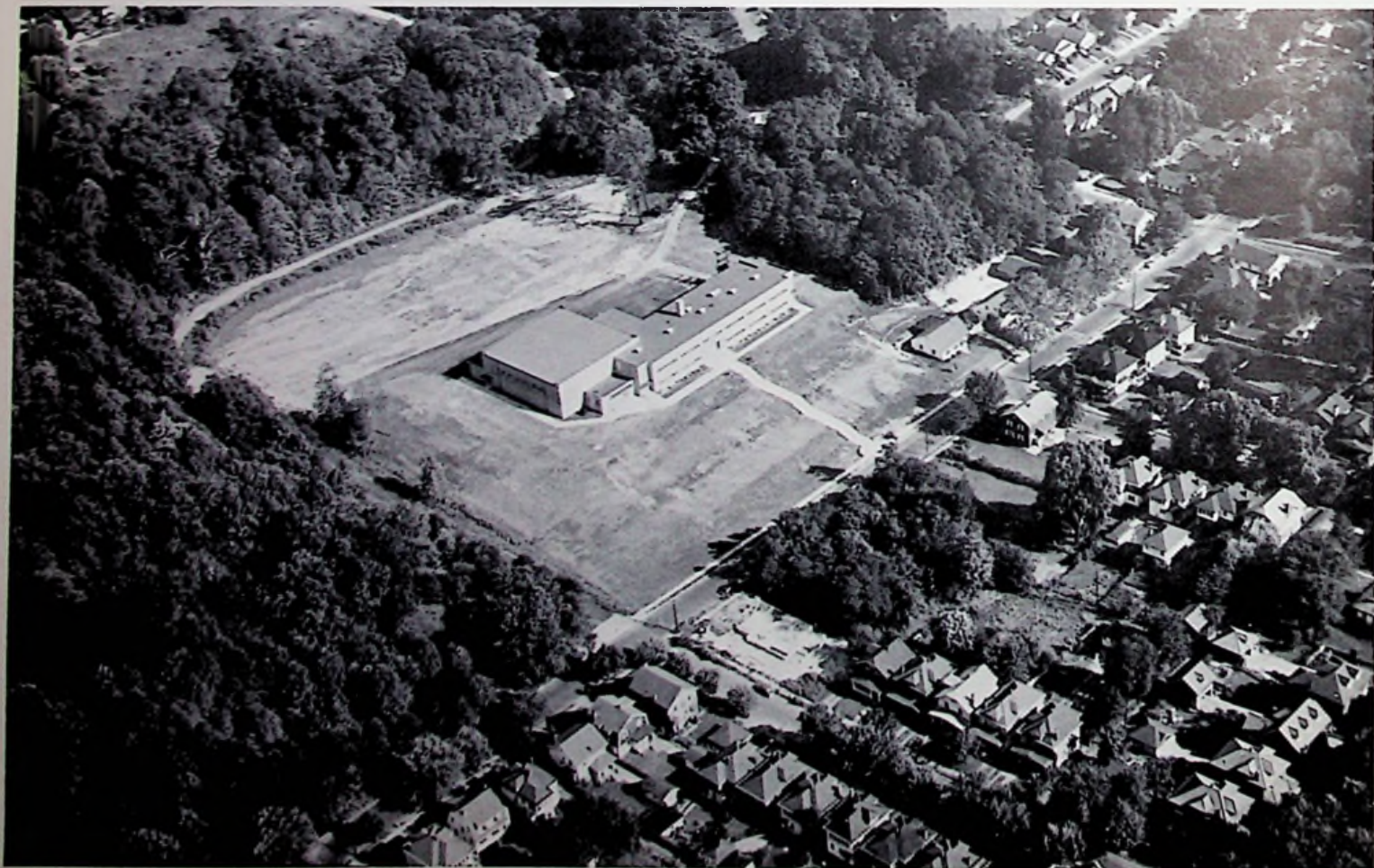


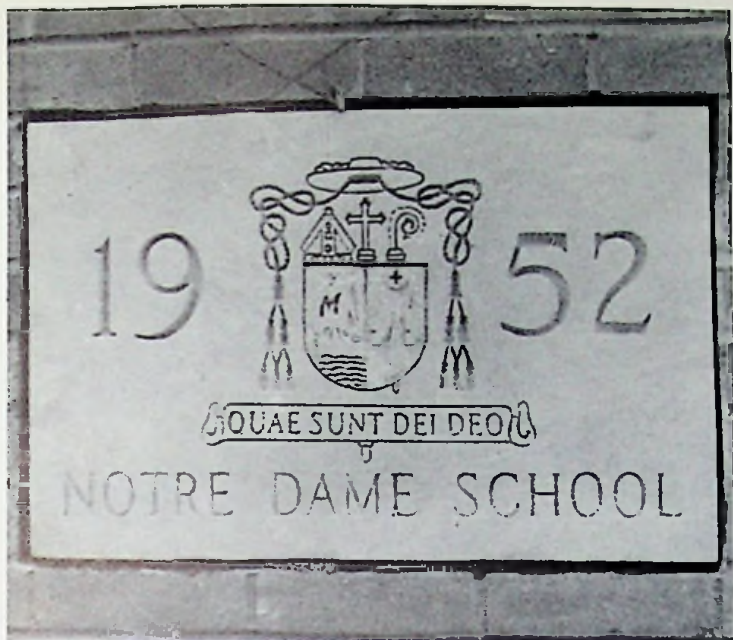


25TH

After much planning by Monsignor Goebel, Father Klinec and Monsignor Casey, ground was broken for the new Notre Dame High School on July 15, 1952. The first faculty was composed of 8 nuns, 4 priests, and "Pat" Darone as varsity football and basketball coach. The student body was made up of 31 seniors and 134 underclassmen. Reverend Robert White was the first principal. Highlights of this first year bring to mind the Homecoming Queen Suzanne Davis, and attendants Anne Coyle, Ruth Oberling, Sandra July, and Mary Ruth Walsh. Cheerleaders that year were Judy McGlothlin, Carolyn Kirby, Mary Sue Burk, Annette Dadosky, and Rita Middlecamp. "Evening Stars" was the theme of the Junior-Senior Prom which was held in the school gymnasium with Lou Martin's band providing the music. The school newspaper entitled "The High Light" was started and is still being published under the same name. The yearbook then was called The Crown. The band was organized in June, 1952, and the mixed chorus boasted a hundred members. The chapel was added later with the first mass being celebrated by Father White on February 20, 1954. This first year established guidelines for future classes at Notre Dame. Some have been abandoned, some remain.

**Notre Dame On Sunrise Nears Completion**

**MODERN BUILDING TO OPEN SOON**



A symbol of hope for the future, Notre Dame High School will soon open her doors to Catholic students of Portsmouth.

Hundreds of dreams came true this fall when 163 Catholic high school boys and girls of Portsmouth and vicinity combined to form one student body working with one faculty of Sisters of St. Francis under the name of Notre Dame High School. Long anticipated by thousands, the combination climaxed years of work on the part of Monsignor Joseph E. Coery of Holy Redeemer Parish and Father Julius J. Klonek of St. Mary Parish.

Progress on the new building on Sunrise Avenue, also under the direction of Monsignor Coery and Father Klonek, is watched daily and with eager eyes, as high school classes continue in temporary quarters until its completion. Latest developments are the finishing of stairways and windows, the pouring of the gymnasium roof and floor and the laying of sidewalks. Wiring, woodwork, stairroom shelves, chair boards, and doors are in the process of being made ready for use. Purchases have been purchased and are presently in storage.

The Notre Dame faculty heads a new principal and three new teachers. Sister M. Verter, principal, also teaches social science and bookkeeping. Father James Hanley, religion I and II; Father John Tacker, religion III and IV; Sister M. Marygrove, Latin and English, and Sister M. Lick, science and home economics. Other faculty members are Sister M. Mathia, who teaches typing and about:
