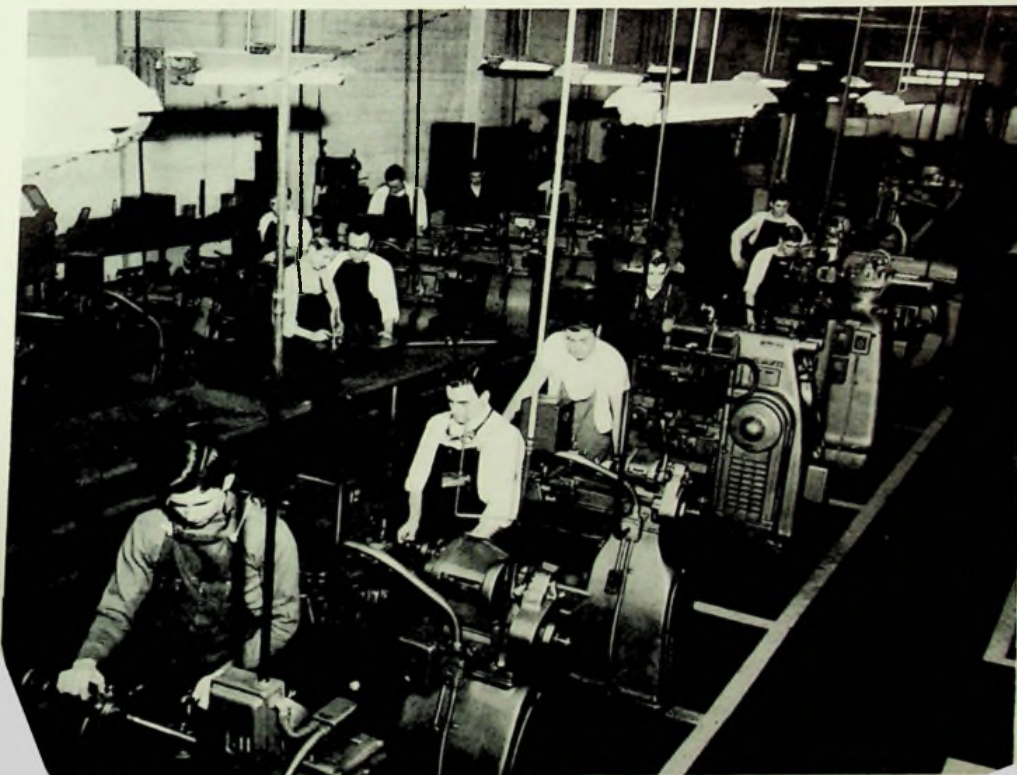

Although the Trojans suffered a few injuries all year several members of the team got banged up. None were seriously injured.





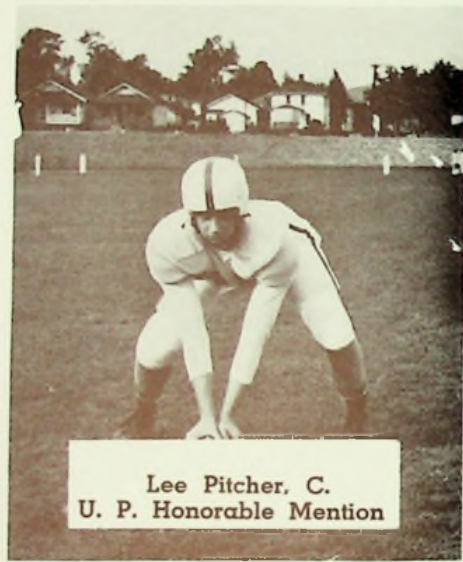
