The French visitors attempted to negotiate with the local Shawnee Indians but the Indians were closely allied with the British traders in the area. This attempt at a French settlement failed. In 1763, this and the surrounding territory became a British possession.

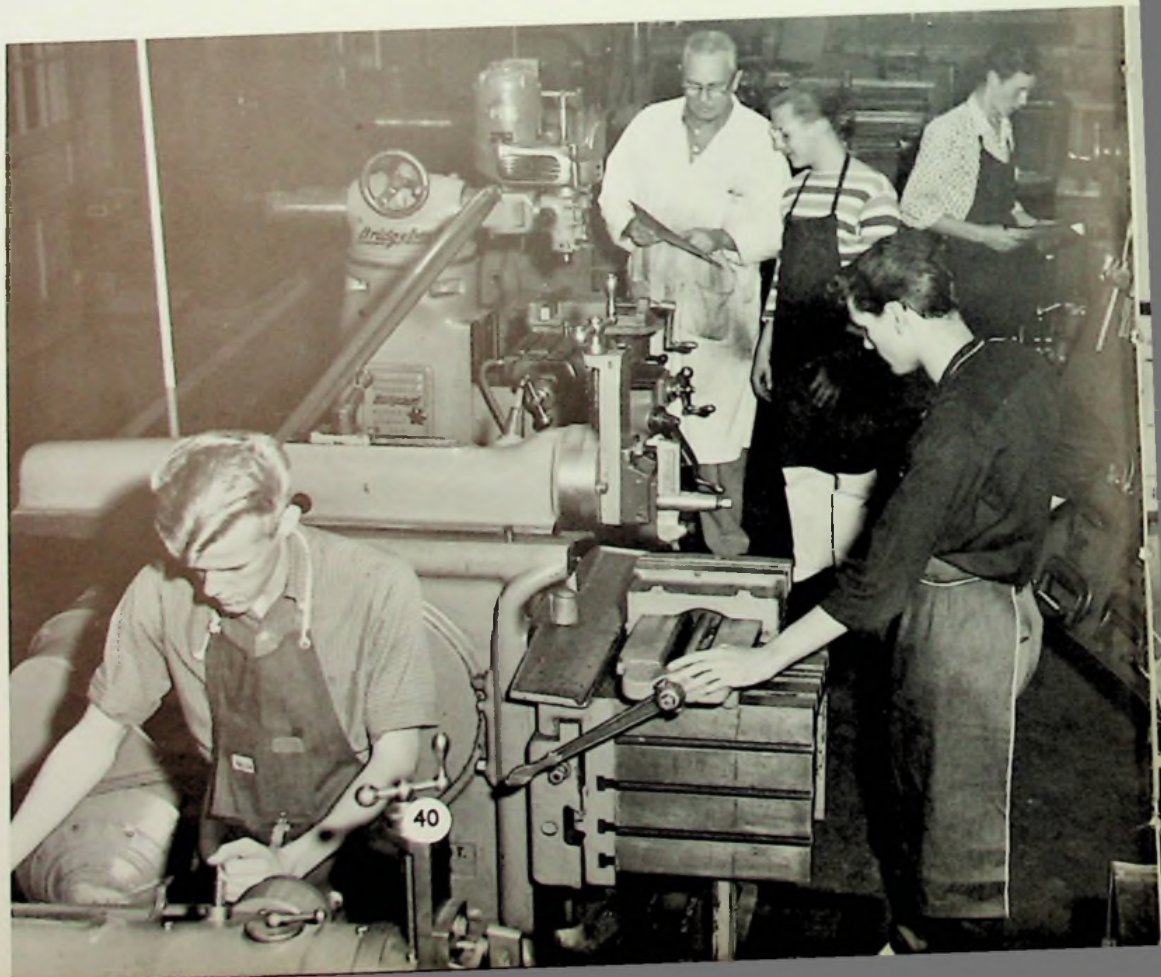

Trade and Industrial Education

O. M. GWINN, Vocational Supervisor

Are you mechanically minded? Do you like to work with tools and blueprints?

Students study and work in the "shop" of their choice where the correct use of hand and machine tools are taught. The work performed in the shop must be on a useful or productive basis under actual job conditions so far as is possible. Students are given individual attention rather

than group instruction in their shop training.

Approximately thirty per cent of the student's time in school each day is devoted to the study of trade technology which includes shop mathematics, science, blueprint reading, sketching and trade information. These subjects differ from general subjects in that they are designed to apply directly to the chosen trade.

TROJANS TROMP TAFT IN FINAL GAME OF SEASON 56-14

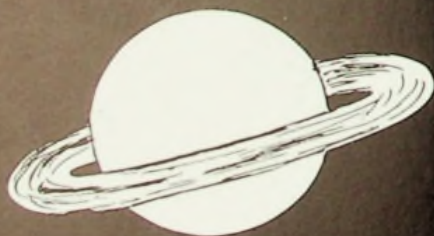


A 2-point outburst in the second period carried the Portsmouth Trojans to a 56-14 win over the Hamilton Taft in the final game of the season for both teams.

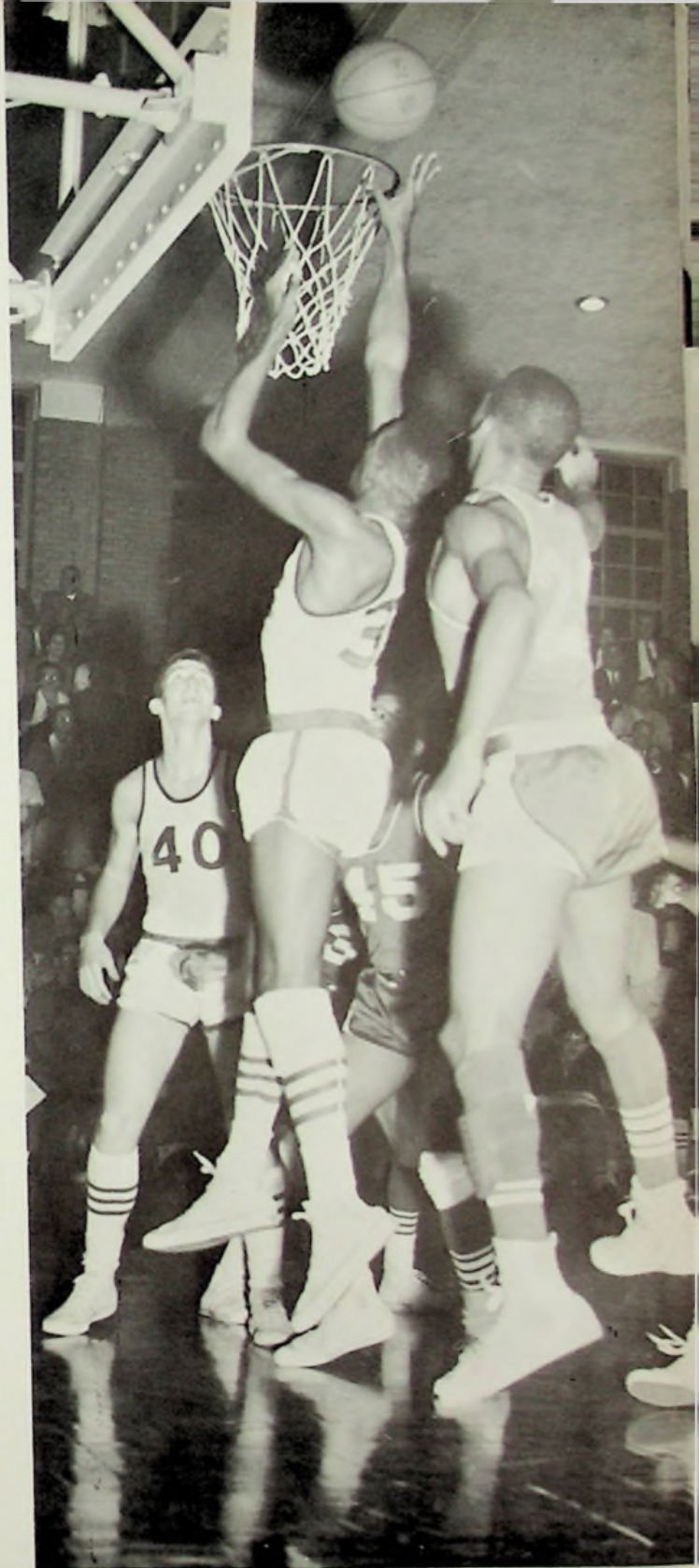
P.H.S. Triumphs Over Ironton, 79-54

This win sent the Trojans to the district semifinals of the Class AA Tournament in Athens.

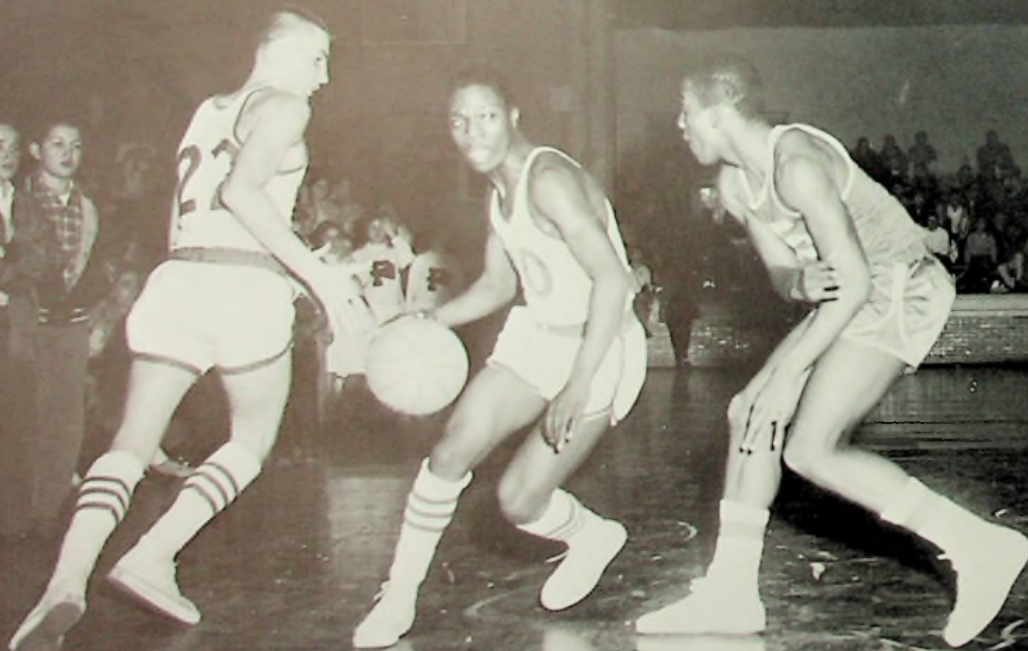

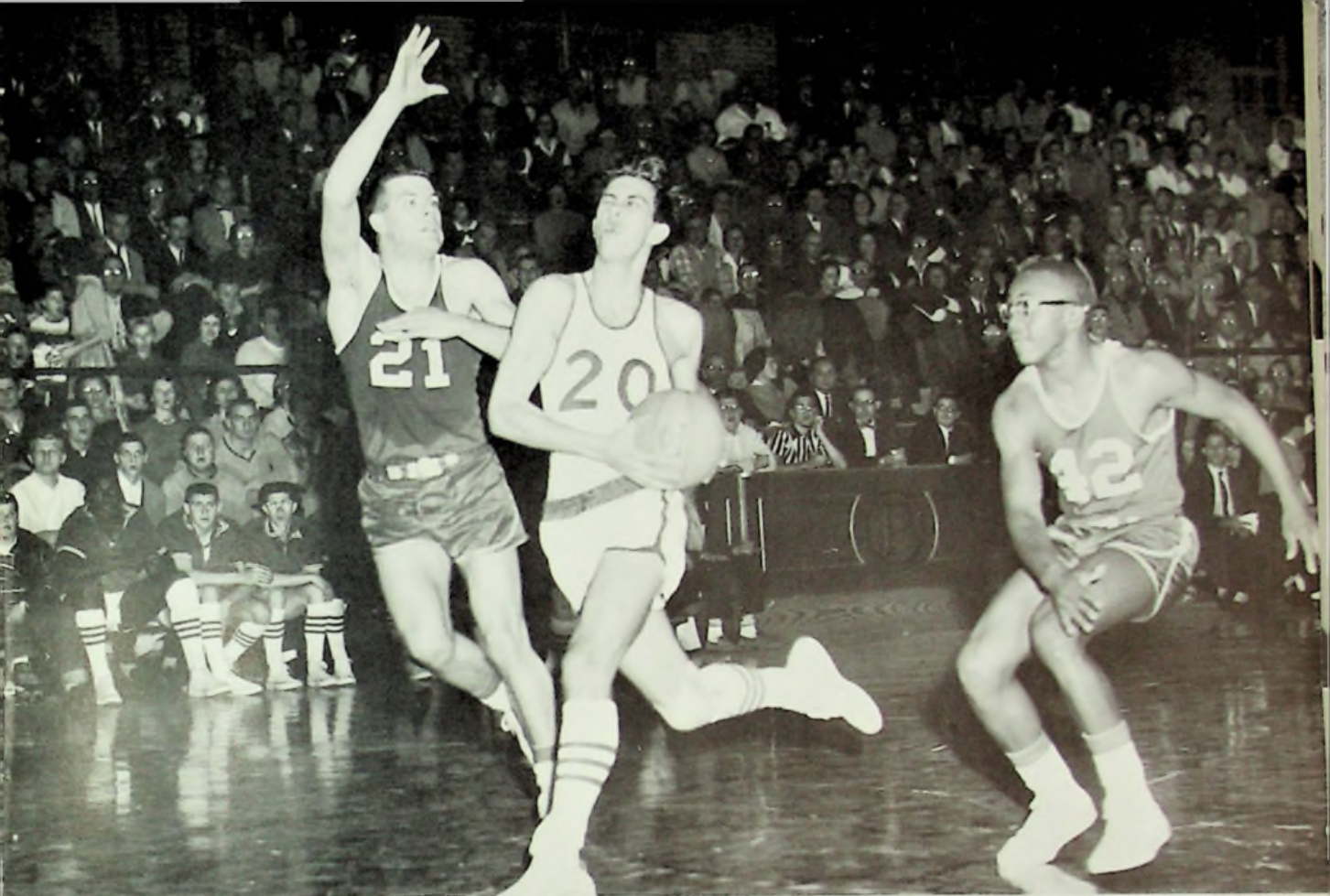
Grover Center Gymnasium—March 10

St. John Arena—March 25

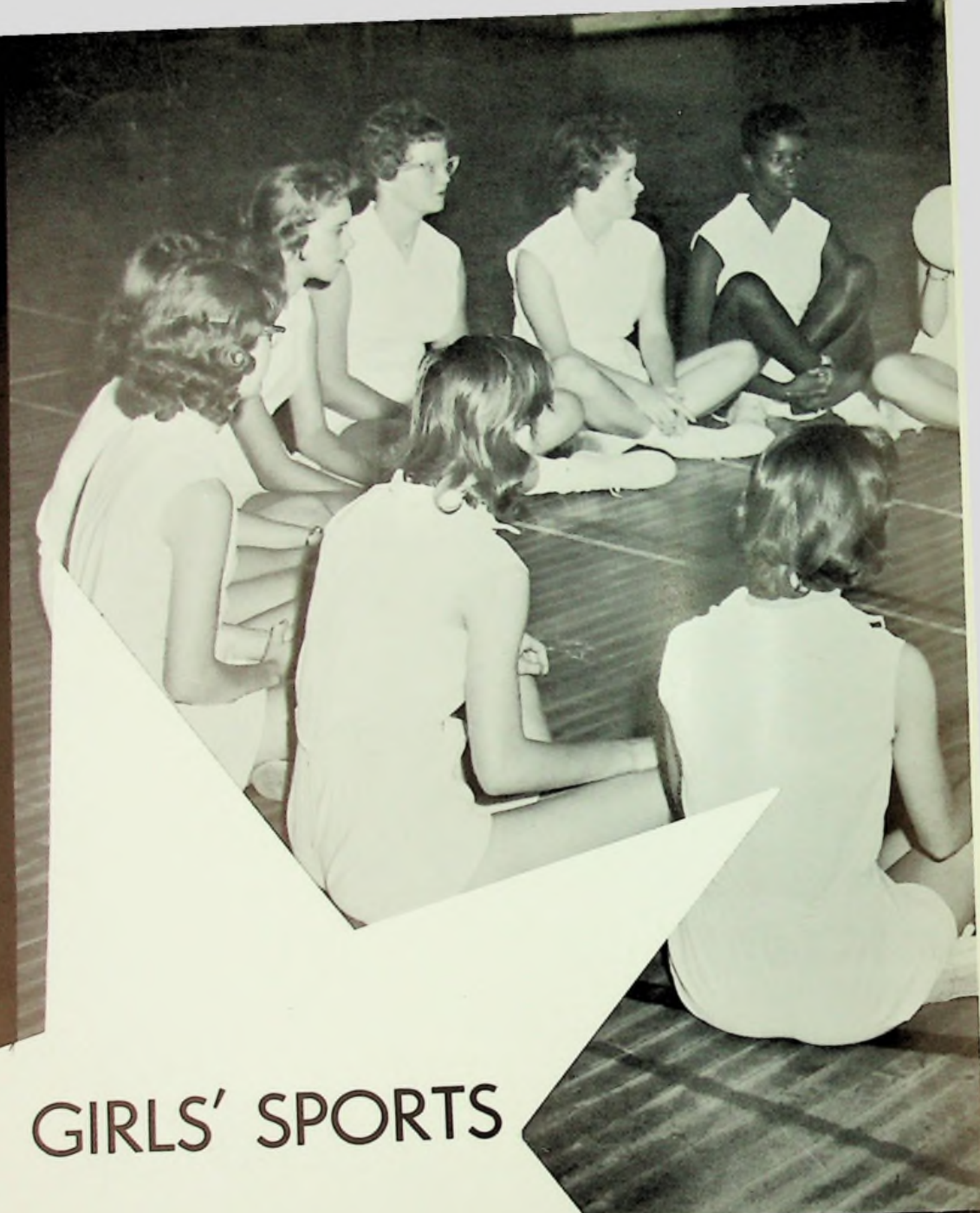
The Trojan Warriors took the Class AA State Basketball crown for the first time in 30 years by defeating the Urbana "Hillclimbers" by a 50-44 margin.

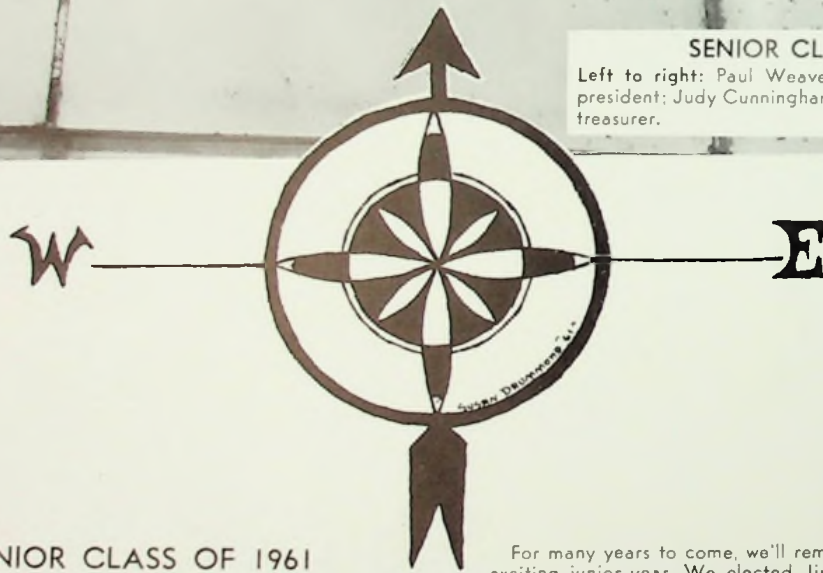

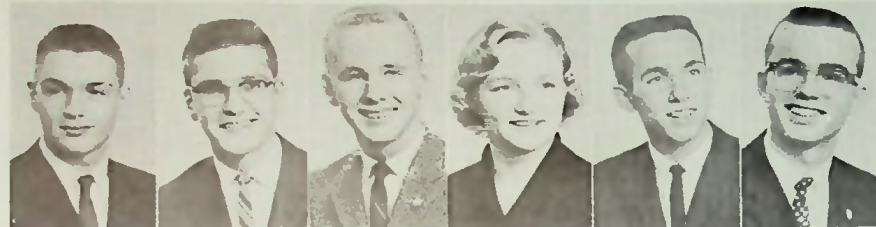

Senior Honor Council Future Teachers of America

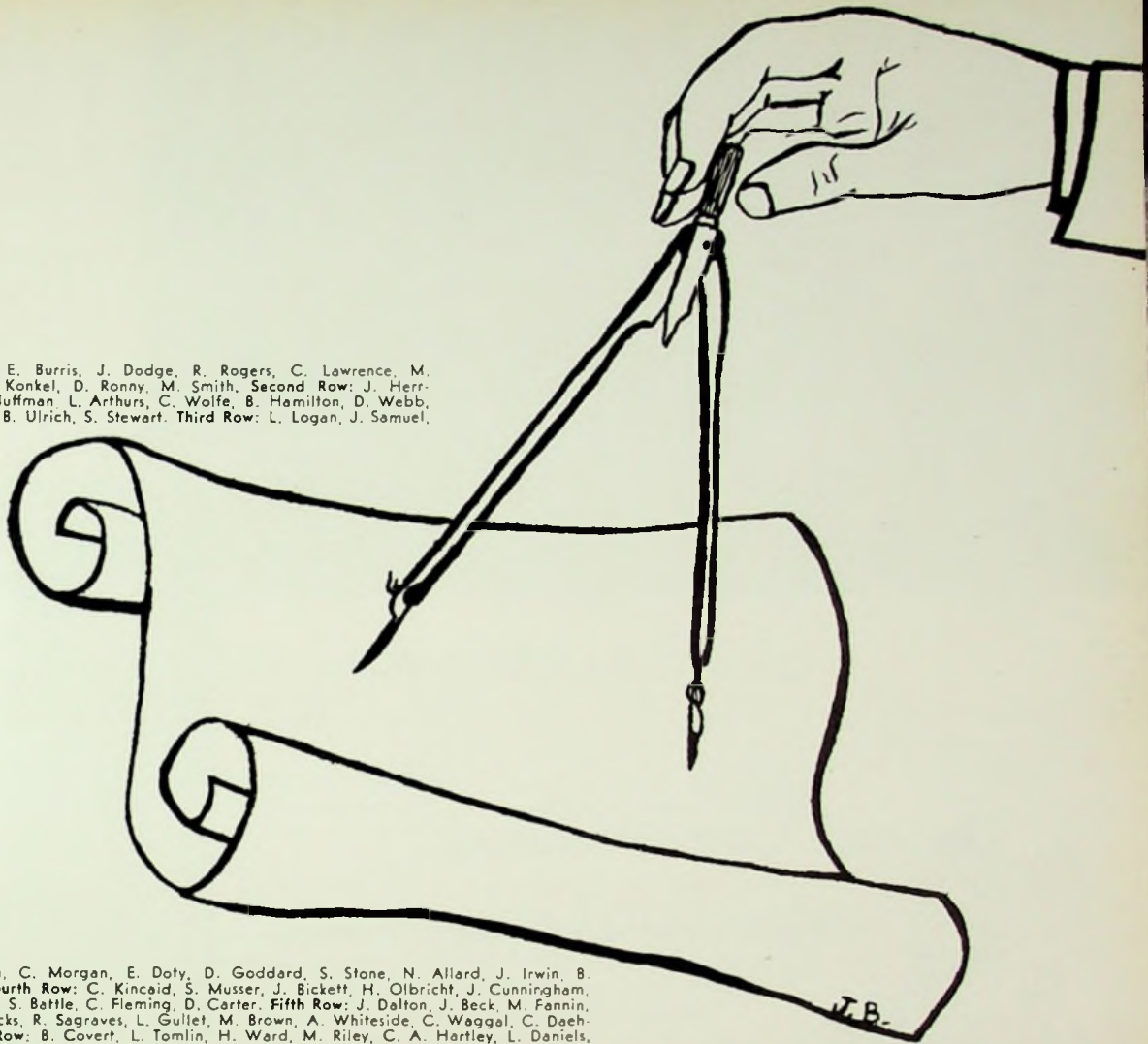

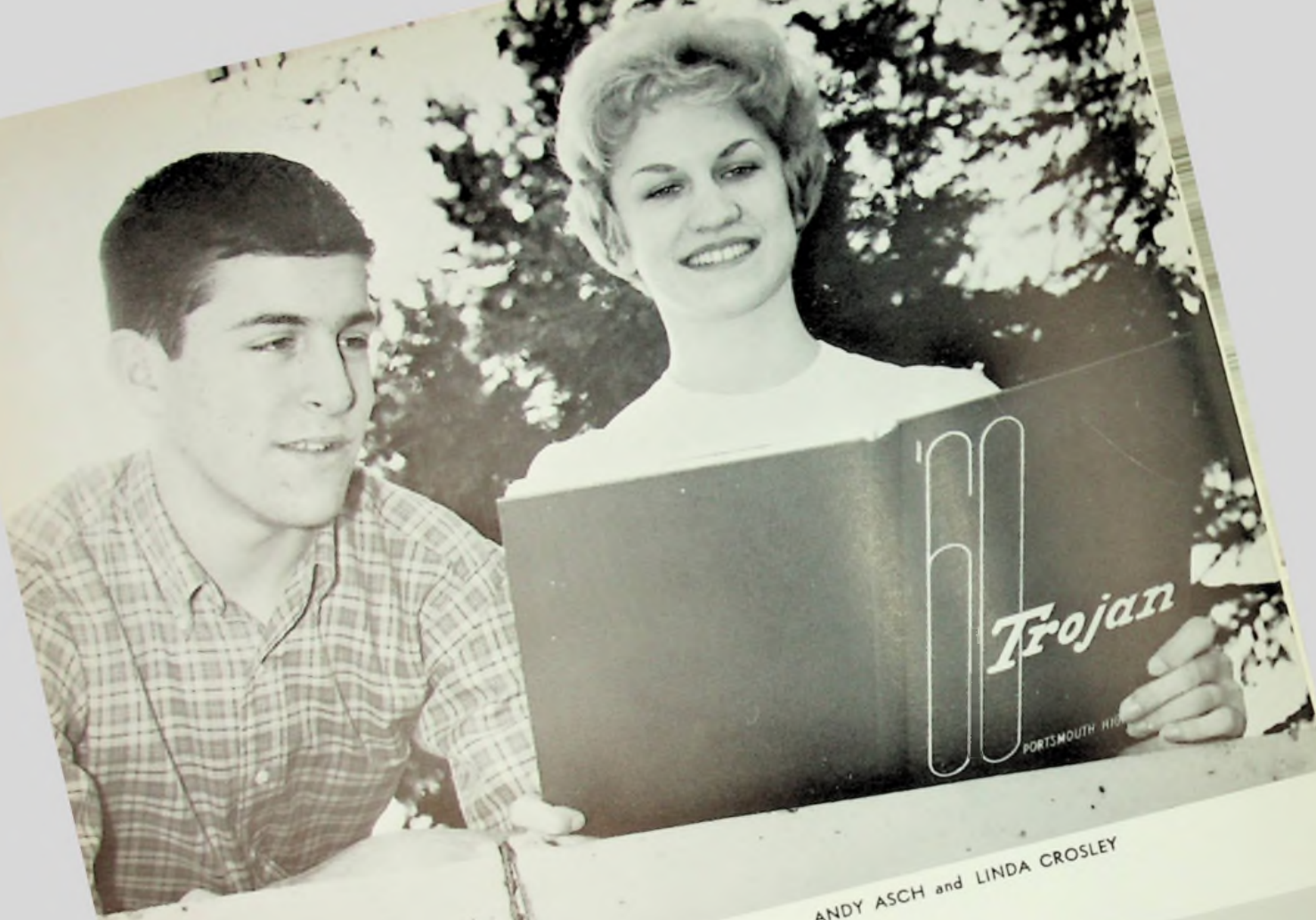
The Office Practice Class, under the guidance of Miss Hazel Wyant, was responsible for the TROJAN business records and accounts.
