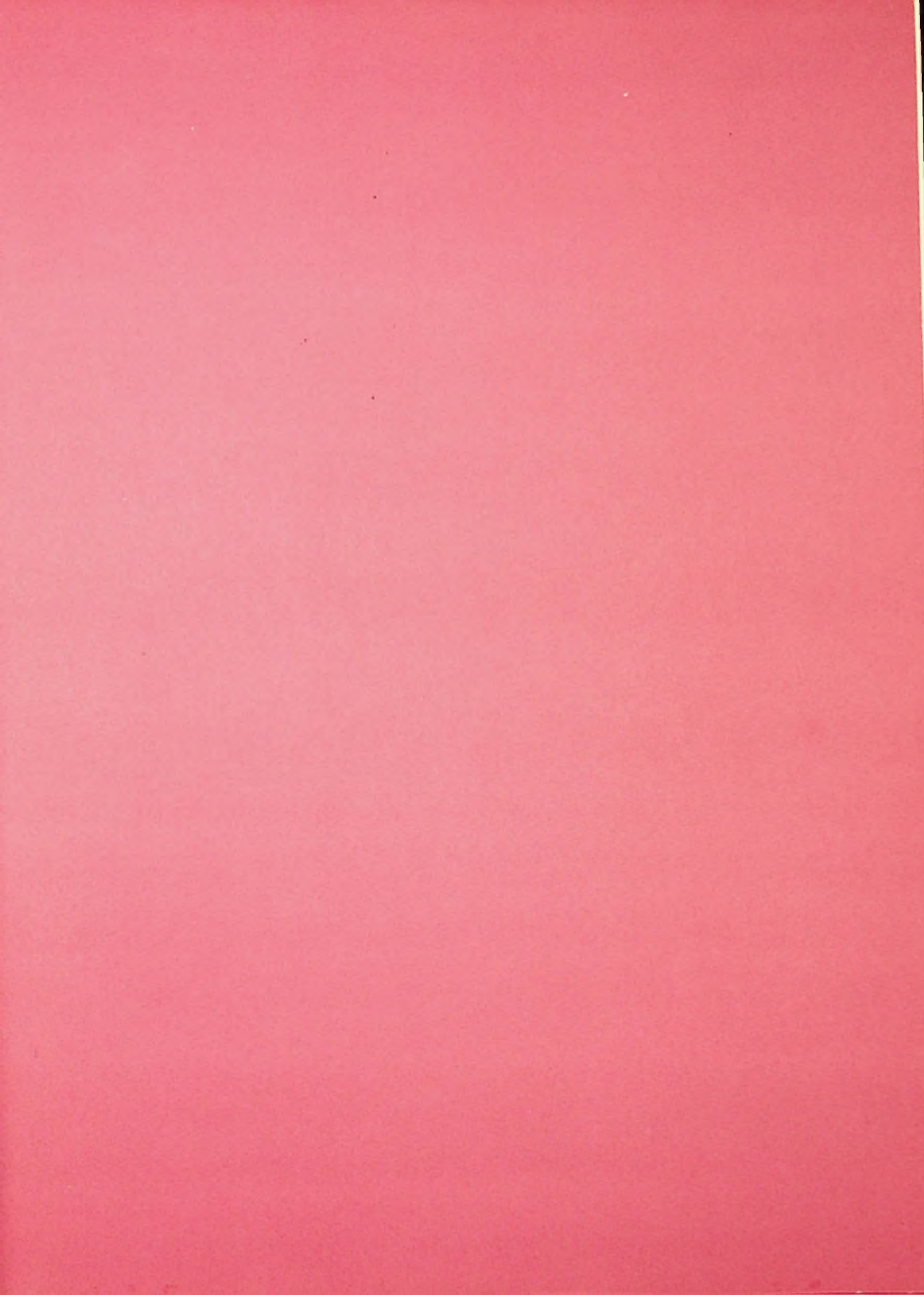

"Only the ignorant and the blind believe that the soil ever comes to rest."

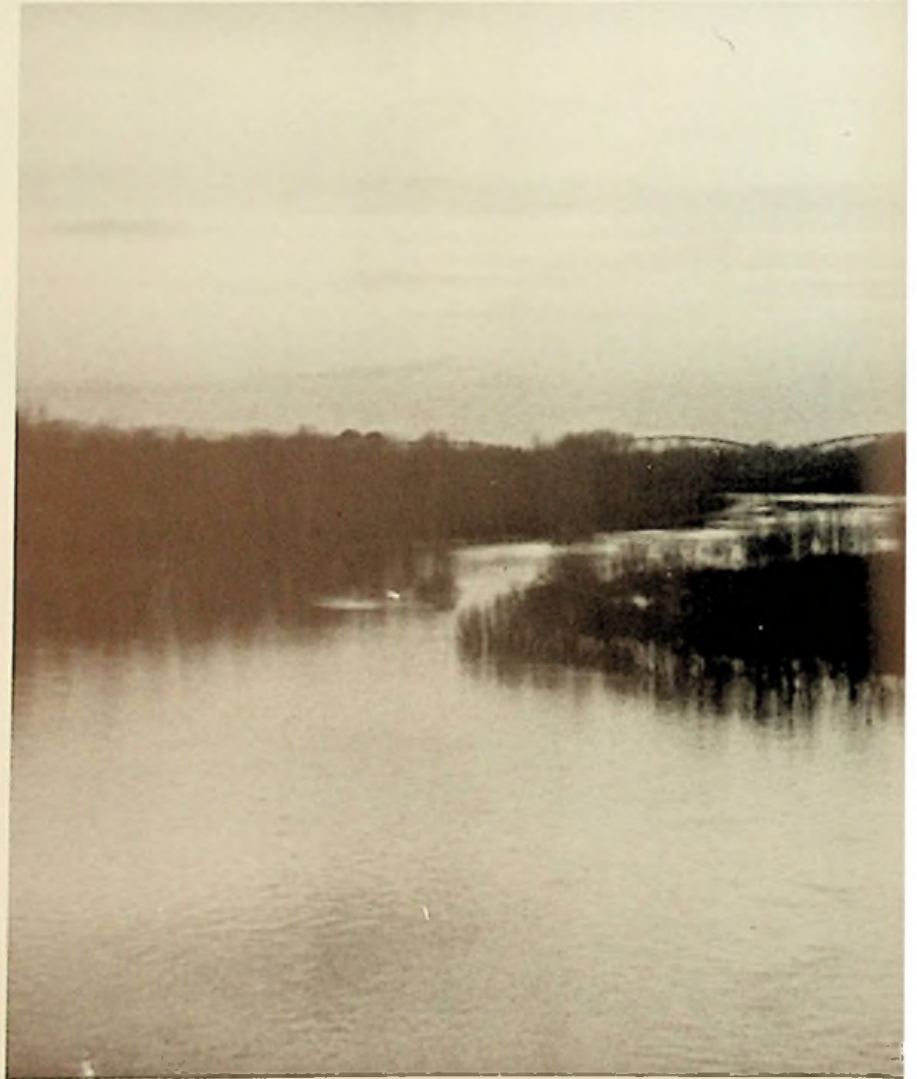

"Never is it in such intense travail as in autumn."

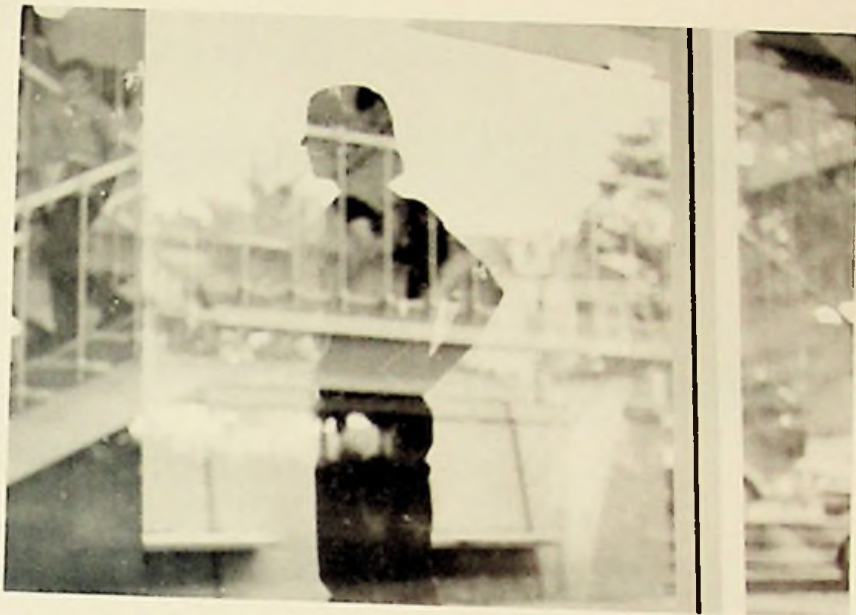
