

It Is Always Growing Weather.


"Only the ignorant and the blind believe that the soil ever comes to rest."











School's In, School's In; Students Start to Work Again




New Coach Backed by Experienced Team Results in Successful Football Season





Junior Varsity Breaks Even With 9-9 Record


