

P.H.S. EDGED IN "CLOSE SCRAP" BY ROGER BACON, 7-0

Municipal Stadium, September 16

Cincinnati Roger Bacon squeaked by the Portsmouth High Trojans before an opening night crowd of 3,500 fans. It was a closely fought contest as both teams battled to a standstill in the first half. However, Roger Bacon broke the deadlock early in the third quarter when halfback Walt Roeckers drove over from one yard out. Roeckers used the same play to score the extra point.

Late in the fourth quarter the Trojans showed their "fighting" spirit by stopping a Spartan drive on their own 37-yard line. The Trojans then drove to the Spartan's 2-yard line

only to lose the ball on a fumble.

Although the Trojans were beaten, they were very aggressive in this initial contest.

TROJANS SMASH TOMCATS 21-6 Municipal Stadium, September 23

Portsmouth High School's speedy halfbacks, operating behind a hard charging forward wall, engineered three long scoring drives to give the Trojans an impressive 21-6 victory over Ash-

land.



Price himself scored one T.D. and halfbacks Billy Spinks and Nap Brown, scored the other two tallies. John Thatcher booted three straight extra points. 
SPRINGFIELD TRIMS PORTSMOUTH 33-12

Municipal Stadium, September 30

Springfield's mighty Wildcats unleashed a powerful running attack to overcome Portsmouth High School's promising Trojans. Although the score was 33 to 12, the game was actually closely fought. At the half Springfield led the Trojans by just six points. However, in the second half the experience and weight of the number four team in the state took its toll. Springfield drove in for two touchdowns in the third quarter. In the fourth quarter the men of Troy refused to admit defeat as they rallied for two T.D.'s, Quarterback Tony Price pitched to Don Whitaker for the first touchdown, and halfback Napoleon Brown scored the other tally.

The Trojan's defensive line was especially great, as they held the hardcharging Spartan backs to one touchdown. In spite of the fact that the field was slippery, the speedy Trojan backs racked up four touchdowns. This impressive victory evened the season's record at two wins and two losses.

MIDDLETON RALLIES TO DEFEAT PORTSMOUTH 34-6

Barnitz Stadium, October 14

Middletown's mighty Middles spotted Portsmouth 6 points in the first quarter, and then in the second quarter they exploded for 21 points. Quarterback Glenn Hall sparked the Middies as he ran for two touchdowns and passed for two others. Portsmouth took advantage of a bad Middletown punt to score their only touchdown. Arlin Stadium, November 4






TROJANS HAVE LEAD, BUT FREMONT TRIUMPHS 28-20

P.H.S., 81; Minford, 60




