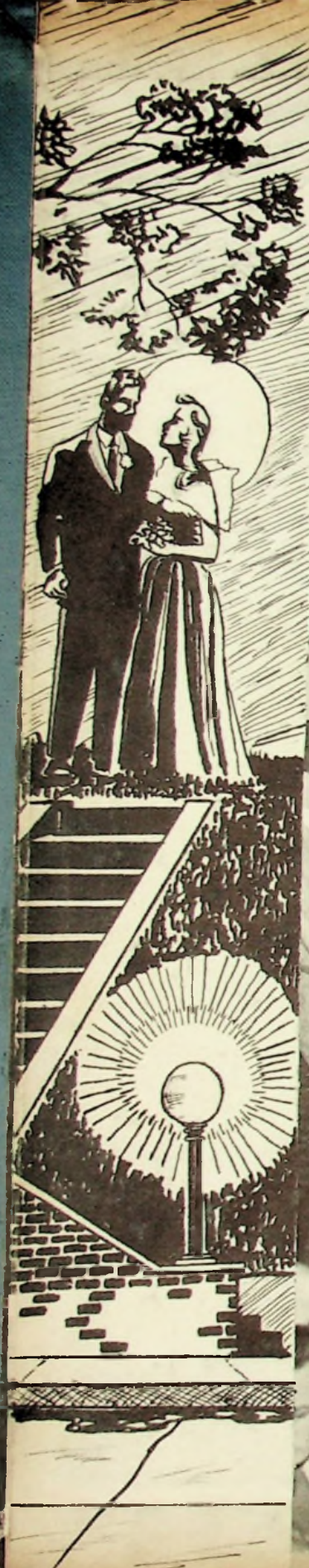



I SPEAK FOR DEMOCRACY

by DAVID ROTH

Long before Jesus of Nazareth was born, the Greeks stressed the idea of the dignity and the worth of the individual, and of his right to govern himself. The Hebrew-Christian teachings strengthened the idea of the individual's dignity and self-respect by emphasizing that all men are brothers in the eyes of God. These are the first great teachings of democracy—that all men are equal and brothers and that they have the right to govern themselves.

One of the first major steps toward the democracy we have today, came in England with the signing of the Magna Charta in 1215. Gradually, after this, Parliament and the courts began to gain power, and the rights of the individual began to increase. But even in the following years, true democracy was not reached in England or in any of the Old World countries. It was not until the Pilgrim Fathers landed at Plymouth Rock, that the hopes of a true democracy began to take shape. But, even then, the new world settlers continued some of the practices from which they had hoped to escape. The time was not yet right to pluck the fruits of democracy from the "Tree of Life". But the time was right in 1776, when the people of the colonies rose up in rebellion against the suppression of their rights. Then, for the first time in history, they set up a genuine democracy—not a perfect one—still—a democracy. One which could be perfected.

As Henry Van Dyke says in "The Heritage of American Ideals": "There are those who tell us that the builders of the Republic were too short-sighted to behold this vision. We are asked to believe that their eyes were not opened in regard to the greatness of America as a nation. We are asked to believe that they did not dream of the future greatness of the country which they founded, otherwise they

would have founded it differently." I do not believe it.

The road ahead, even in America, was a long and hard one—an uphill climb all the way. We owe a great debt to those men—Washington, Franklin, Jefferson, Jackson—who helped set us on the right road to democracy. But progress was slow. Even 1861, true democracy had not been won in the United States. It has been fourscore and seven years since the Great Emancipator, Abraham Lincoln, fell before an assassin's bullet. He, like many before him and many after him, gave his all—his life—for his country. But he also gave his life for democracy. It was he who put one of the great finishing touches to democracy in America. He made equality, under law, a reality.

To describe democracy, one must be a part of democracy. One must work for democracy. One must speak for democracy. (For democracy is not a static idea which you or I or anyone can say has been achieved. It is a growing idea in which one strives toward that ideal which is true democracy.) Democracy means many things to many people. Some have described democracy as having a free feeling when, with hand over heart and lump in throat, they watch the flag go by. Others have described it as feeling at peace, without any worry, when they kneel before the altar of God. Still others have described it as feeling safe and secure when they are at home with their families. Today, when so many people take democracy for granted, it isn't how one describes it, but rather the fact that one is able to describe it. Today the world looks to America for leadership. We can never be responsible for this leadership unless each realizes his responsibility, and speaks—to the whole world—for democracy. Remember, LIBERTY and DEMOCRACY ARE INSEPARABLE. SPEAK FOR DEMOCRACY!

There is work to be done by every citizen if America
is to remain the "land of the free,
and the home of the brave".

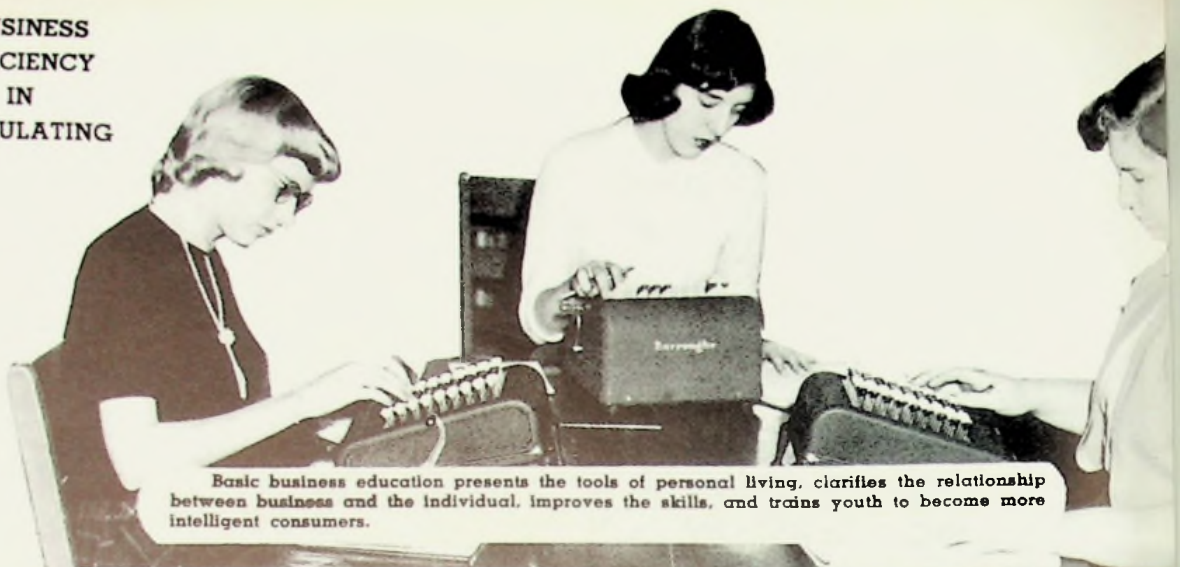

PORTSMOUTH 12—CINCINNATI WOODWARD 12

The P. H. S. Trojans opened the 1952-53 season by tying a strong Cincinnati Woodward team 12-12 before some 3,500 fans at Municipal Stadium.

Leading 12-0 at half, the Trojans were unable to stop the Woodward team in the final canto.

The Trojan offense was superb but the defense bogged long enough for Woodward to score.

Big Tom Quinn placed the Trojan attack; the big quarterback managed to set up the scoring plays. On defense Chuck Rodgers was the mainstay in the Trojan forward wall.

PORTSMOUTH 37—AQUINAS 27

Portsmouth High Trojans went on a 6 touchdown scoring spree to outscore Columbus Aquinas 37-27 before some 4,000 jubilant P. H. S. fans at Municipal Stadium.

It was a sweet victory for the Trojan gridders, and although it was a team victory, several Trojans were stellar both on offense and defense.

Big Tom Quinn, converted halfback shone brightly from his new quarterback slot. Quinn crashed over for three T. D.'s and passed for another.

On defense the Trojan backfield was superb. The Trojan secondary batted down 6 passes, and intercepted 2 to hold the Terriors to 65 yards in the "yards gained by passing" column.

Mittendorf, Hacquard, Gentry, and Rodgers also looked good for the victorious Trojans.

PORTSMOUTH 6—SPRINGFIELD 40

Some 10,000 Springfield fans saw their Wildcats hand the P. H. S. Trojans their first defeat of the 1952 football campaign.

The Trojans just couldn't seem to hold the pigskin. The Trojans handed the Wildcats their second T. D. on a silver platter. An attempted punt was fumbled in the end zone and the Wildcats jumped on the ball. Four more miscues, and the Wildcats had the game in the bag.

Although the Trojan offense wasn't up to par, their defensive alignment turned in a fine performance. Dick Mittendorf played one of the finest defensive games P. H. S. fans have ever seen.

PORTSMOUTH HIGH 28—CINCINNATI CENTRAL 27

Some 4,000 happy fans sat out in ideal football weather to see the P. H. S. eleven capture it's second victory of the campaign, 28 to 27.

Cincinnati Central turned loose a group of fleet-footed backs to keep even with the Trojans in the T. D. department, but their try for the first extra point failed.

After the first P. H. S. touchdown, Ken Ledman, a sub, who had been team manager the week before, trotted on the field to make the all important point after the touchdown. The performance was repeated three times and those four extra points provided the game winning margin.

PORTSMOUTH 27—MIDDLETOWN 54

Middletown High School turned loose a herd of hard running backs at Municipal Stadium as the Middies scored in every quarter to completely outclass the Portsmouth High Trojans 54-27 before some 3,000 chilled fans.

Five different Middie backs had a hand in scoring as Middletown racked up its third victory of the season while handing the Trojans their second loss of the campaign.

It was all offense and no defense for the Trojans. Thom Gentry and his brother Curt were the mainstays for the Trojans both on offense and defense.

PORTSMOUTH HIGH 6—CINCINNATI PURCELL 32

Cincinnati Purcell proved its right to be classed with the state gridpowers by scoring a 32-6 victory over a stubborn Portsmouth High eleven at Municipal Stadium before some 2,500 fans.

Purcell, paced by a fleet of hard running backs and tough defensive forwards rolled over the Trojans to score its sixth victory of the campaign and hand the Trojans their third defeat.

Outside of the score being on the wrong side of the scoreboard, the night was sad in other ways. Frank Gerlach, who had been playing heads up ball on defense, was lost to the Trojans for the rest of the season. The big tackle suffered a broken leg early in the game.

PORTSMOUTH 26—HAMILTON 6

Portsmouth High exploded for three touchdowns in the third quarter to break up a defensive battle, and opened the drive that gave the Trojans a 26-6 ramp over a fighting eleven from Hamilton at Municipal Stadium.

Some 3,500 fans watched in perfect football weather as the Trojans completely outclassed the Big Blue to give the grads a happy ending to home coming day.

It was by far the most impressive showing both on offense and defense of the year so far for the Trojan eleven. It would be unfair to give any one person credit for the victory.

PORTSMOUTH HIGH 21—STUBENVILLE CENTRAL 19

Stubenville Catholic Central High got into the spirit of Halloween night and gave the Portsmouth High gridders the scare of their lives before the Trojans could eke out a hard earned 21-19 victory of the Crusaders in the Crusaders' own stadium.

For the second time this season Ken Ledman came in from the Trojan bench to kick the extra points that meant victory for the Trojans.

Tom Quinn was the big gun in the Portsmouth attack as the big quarterback crossed the Central goal line two times in the final half.

PORTSMOUTH 41—IRONTON 7

Portsmouth High went on its biggest scoring spree of the season as the Trojans racked up an easy 41-7 victory over the winless Ironton Tigers before some 3,000 chilled spectators at Municipal Stadium.

It was the most impressive offensive showing of the year for the Portsmouth eleven, as the Trojans scored in every quarter to coast to the fifth victory of the season. The Trojans had at least four more touchdowns called back because of penalties.

Three Portsmouth gridders—Leroy Carr, Preston Smith, and Tom Gentry—accounted for all the scoring as the Trojans ground out almost five hundred yards both in rushing and in the air.

PORTSMOUTH 28—ASHLAND 25

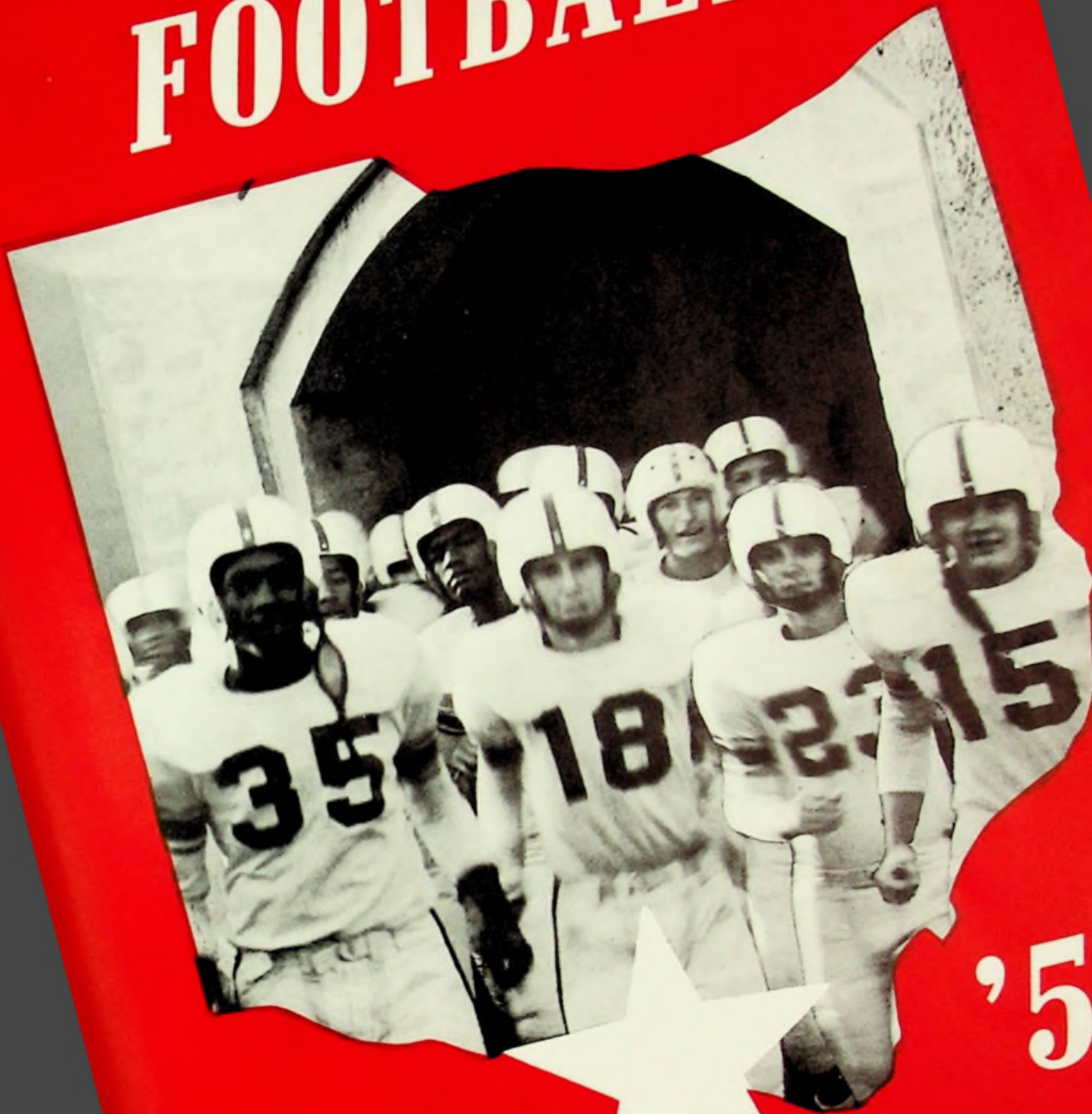
Portsmouth High rode the magic toe of Ken Ledman and the running of Tom Gentry and Preston Smith to a tremendous 28-25 victory over highly-rated Ashland High Tomcats before some 5,000 fans at the Ashland Stadium.

The fans sat in amazement as Gentry and Smith ripped the vaunted Ashland High defensive platoon to shreds to lead the Trojans to their first victory over the Tomcats in the last four starts.

While there were many Trojan stars, it was a team effort that gave the Portsmouth eleven this satisfying victory.

The Trojans had a highly successful season under the able leadership of head coach Brownson and his assistants. The Trojans ended up with a 6-3-1 record. We wish them another highly successful season next year.

1952-53

TROJANS 82—WALNUT HILLS 58

The Portsmouth Trojans opened the '53 season with a romp over an outclassed club from Cincinnati Walnut Hills. Dave Arnold, high scorer with 19 points, was closely followed by Leroy Carr with 18 points.

TROJANS 61—MARIETTA 55

On their first road trip, the Trojans had some trouble in turning back a rough Marietta team. Ted Hacquard was the big gun for Portsmouth with 19 points. He was able abetted by Arnold with 16 points.

TROJANS 62—HAMILTON 60

The Trojans nipped the Big Blue of Hamilton in an overtime thriller. Ted Hacquard took scoring honors for the Portsmouth five with 17 points, followed by Carr with 14 points.

TROJANS 70—CINCINNATI ELDER 56

Portsmouth looked alternately sharp and ragged as the Trojans made it four straight wins in downing Elder of Cincinnati easily. Four of the five starters wound up the night's action in double figures. The two big men—Leroy Carr and Thom Gentry—accounted for 31 points.

TROJANS 61—DAYTON ROOSEVELT 74

The Trojans lost their first game in five starts to a tall aggressive Dayton team on a small court. Oppenheimer, Carr, and Captain Arnold were fust via the foul route. Ted Hacquard, Thom Gentry, and Leroy Carr were the big guns for Portsmouth with 18, 12, 13, respectively.

TROJANS 90—COLUMBUS CENTRAL 58

The Trojans had a hot night as they ran roughshod over an outmanned Central quintet. Coach Heller pulled out his starting five in the third quarter and the reserves kept up the blistering pace set in the opening canto. Leroy Carr was high with 24 points.

TROJANS 74—AKRON NORTH 64

Portsmouth defeated Akron to cop a successful and thrilling cage carnival. It was the first thrilling defeat for the Akron Vikings after rolling over five previous opponents. Ted Hacquard played a terrific game on offense and defense to pace the Trojans with 22 points. Jack Doll, who came in the second quarter, ended the game with 14 points to help give the Trojans their margin of victory.

TROJANS 58—SPRINGFIELD 55

Portsmouth had to rally in the third quarter to beat a rugged Wildcat five. The Wildcats led for the first half but wilted under the pressure of a mighty quintet of Trojans. Leroy Carr, a good rebounder, was high again with 17 points.

TROJANS 70—MIDDLETOWN 76

The Trojans journeyed to Middletown's new field-house and battled the Middies in a close, hard-fought game. A third quarter slump proved fatal to the Trojan's high hopes of victory. Leroy Carr wound up with 21 points and was closely followed by Arnold with 18.

TROJANS 83—IRONTON 64

The Trojans bounced back from a defeat at the hands of the Middies to blast the Ironton Tigers by 19 points. Leroy Carr kept up his average by scoring 21 points to lead the scoring. Hacquard, second with 18, and Arnold, third with 16, helped keep up the fast pace.

TROJANS 67—COLUMBUS EAST 64

The Hellermen had to go all out in the final minutes to cop their eighth victory. Columbus proved to be a tough opponent with their sparkling play. Oppenheimer hit on five field goals and six charity tosses to pace the winners. Carr and Arnold tied for second with 13 points.

TROJANS 85—SPRINGFIELD 47

Portsmouth clobbered Springfield on the Wildcat's home floor for their tenth victory. All five of the Trojan starters hit the double figures. Arnold led with 20 points and was followed by Carr, 16, Hacquard, 15, Gentry, 14, and Oppenheimer added 11 as the Trojans hit from every angle.

TROJANS 70—MIDDLETOWN 63

The Trojans beat the No. 1 team in the state to jumble the cage picture in Ohio. Portsmouth wound up in second place in the A. P. ratings after defeating the Middies in a rough and tumble game. Ted Hacquard had a field day on his driving layups, scoring 19 points. He was followed by Oppenheimer with 15 hard earned points.

TROJANS 63—HAMILTON 73

Portsmouth played on even terms the first three quarters but Hamilton got hot in the fourth quarter to trip the Trojans. The Trojans played their heart out but couldn't keep rolling in Hamilton's "Cracker Box Gym"; Leroy Carr, our high scoring center, led the attack with 18 points. Ted Hacquard, who was voted the toughest man they played against by Hamilton, scored 17 points.

TROJANS 96—LIMA CENTRAL 69

The Trojan Warriors, bounding back from a defeat Friday, set a new scoring record for Portsmouth High School with 96 points. Leroy Carr again took scoring honors with 28 points. Captain Arnold added 20 points.

TROJANS 84—IRONTON 57

The Trojans journeyed to the "Tank Town" to battle the "Ironton Tigers" and earned a margin of victory to make it number 13. The Trojans got rolling in the second quarter to wallop the Tigers. Leroy Carr had a night of it picking up 23 points.

TROJANS 49—WESTERN HILLS 58

Western Hills, the champs of the Public High School League upset the Trojans on their own floor. Heller jerked out the five starters who just couldn't get rolling and put in Grooms, Quinn, Williams, Doll, and Armstrong who played sensational ball. They cut the Maroon's lead and finally tied the score. Western Hills rallied late in the third quarter to put the game on ice. Leroy Carr was high for the P. H. S. five with 11 points and Jack Doll ran a close second with 10.

TROJANS 53—DAYTON STIVERS 58

Dayton Stivers, the No. 1 quintet of Ohio, parleyed its tremendous height and experience into a hard-earned victory over the Trojans in an overflow crowd at Grant Gym. Thom Gentry played a great game and took scoring honors with 13 points. Bill Oppenheimer playing one of his best games of the season wound up with 12 points.

O. district tournament.

TROJANS 70—MINFORD 75

Even though the Trojans outscored the Falcons 30 field goals to 20, the Falcons outscored the Trojans 35 to 10 at the foul line. 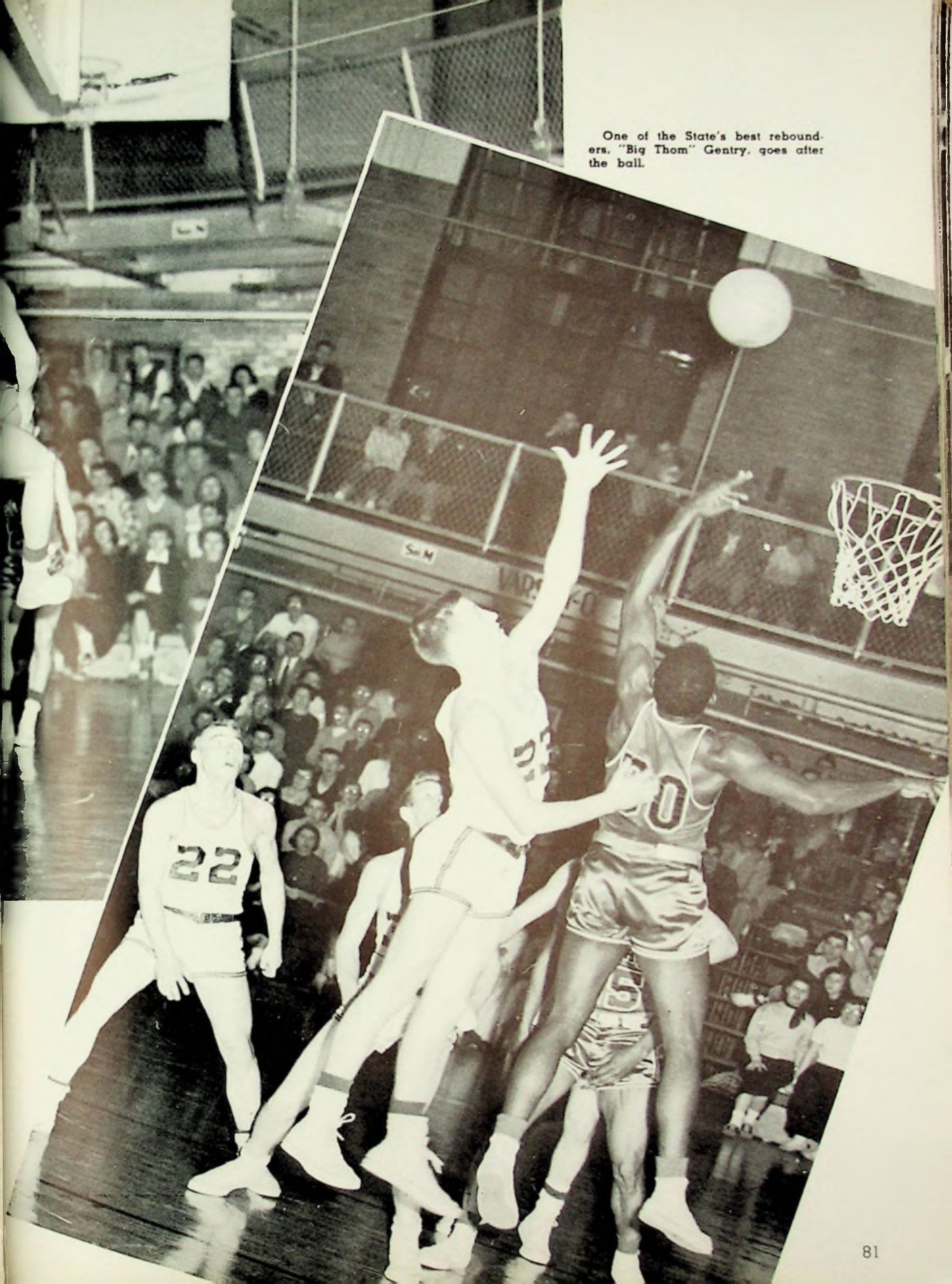

Our last year, too, with its class play, annual spring dances, and excursion to Washington is also among our most pleasant memories. Our able leader was Frank Gerlach.

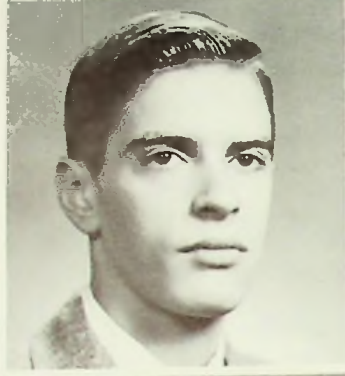
