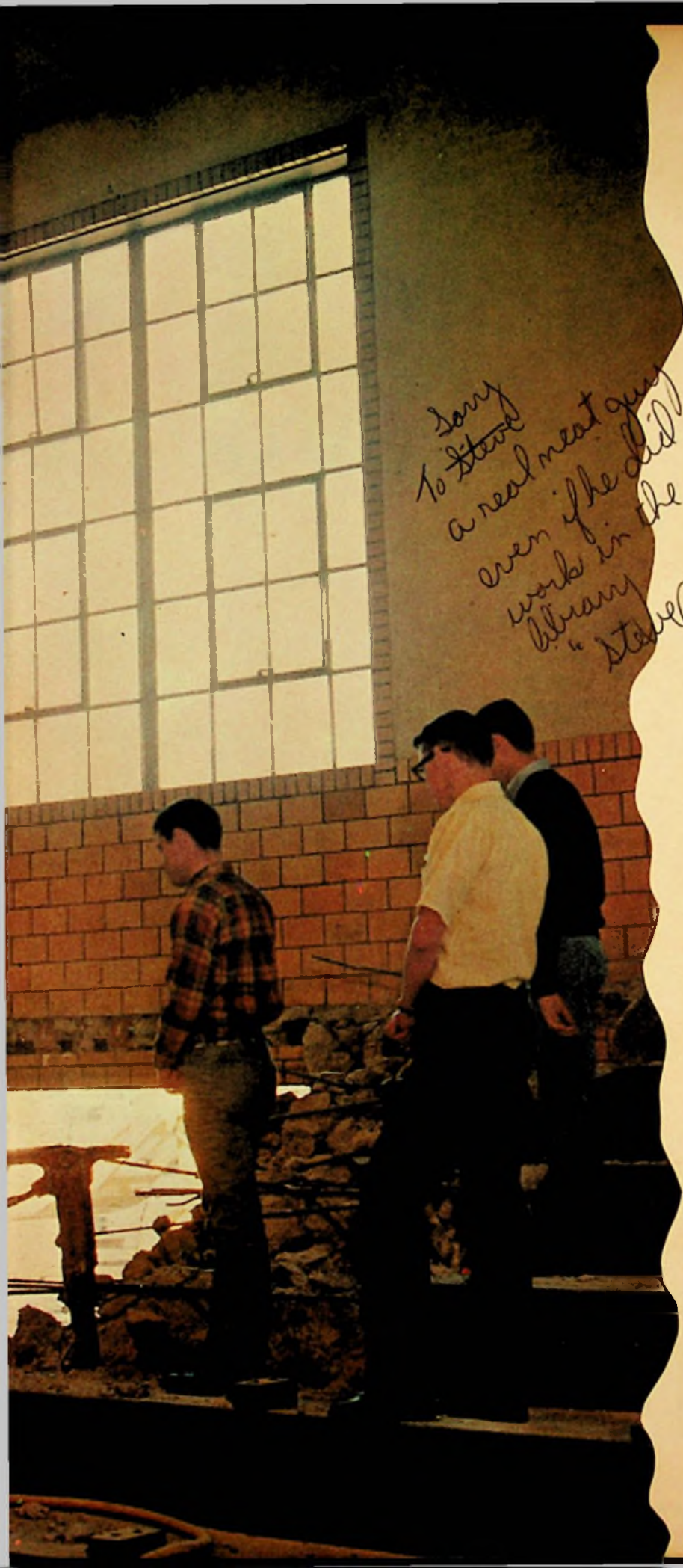

John Mitchell, always well-liked and respected for his openness, honesty, and cheerfulness, is now more than ever admired by all who know him because of his courage and great strength.

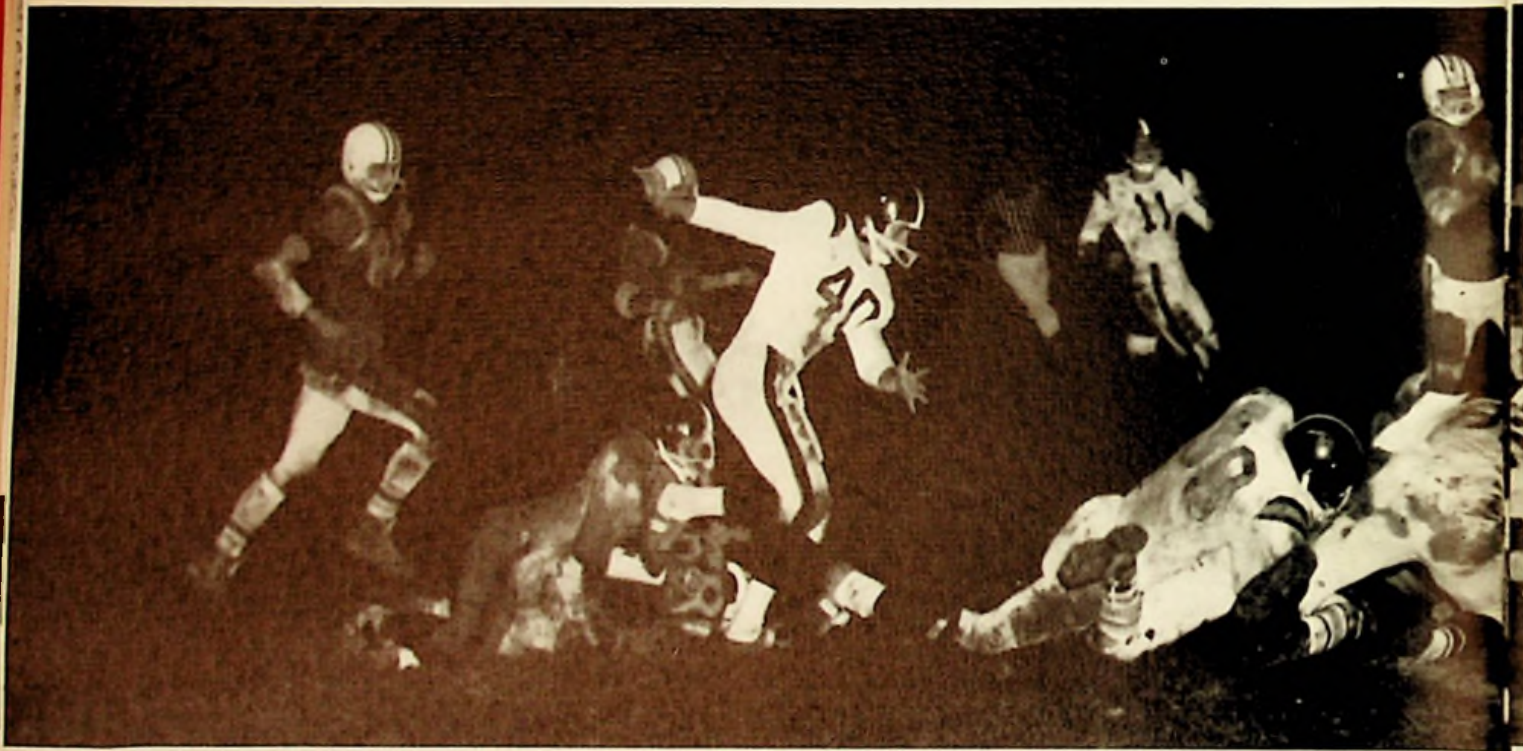

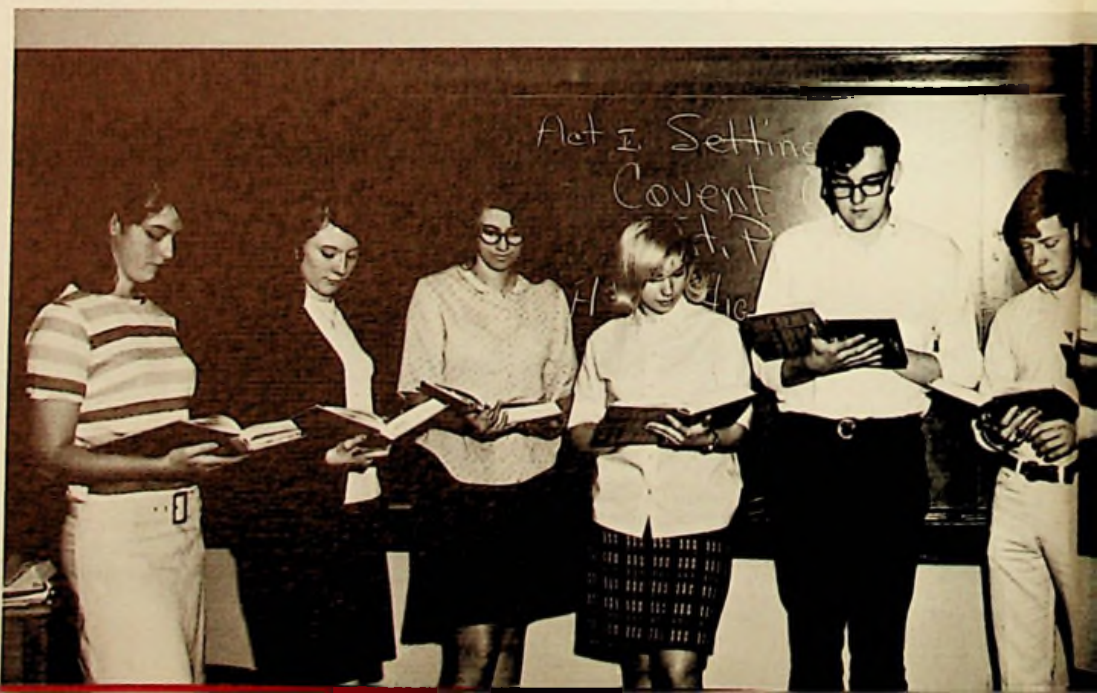
ENGLISH DEPARTMENT TEACHES

Portsmouth West's English teachers are intelligent, conscientious, and dynamic teachers. They help students express their ideas and feelings by teaching them how to write—how to logically organize their thoughts and how to clearly and concisely express those ideas on paper. The English teachers not only help students express their own ideas, but help them understand and write about the ideas, thoughts, and beliefs of the world's great writers. But before the students can write about other authors' philosophies, they must thoroughly understand those philosophies. It is the task of the English teachers to explicitly present these philosophies so that the students comprehend their meaning. After a student understands the ideas of other authors, he can then objectively and intelligently think about them and possibly apply them to their own lives. 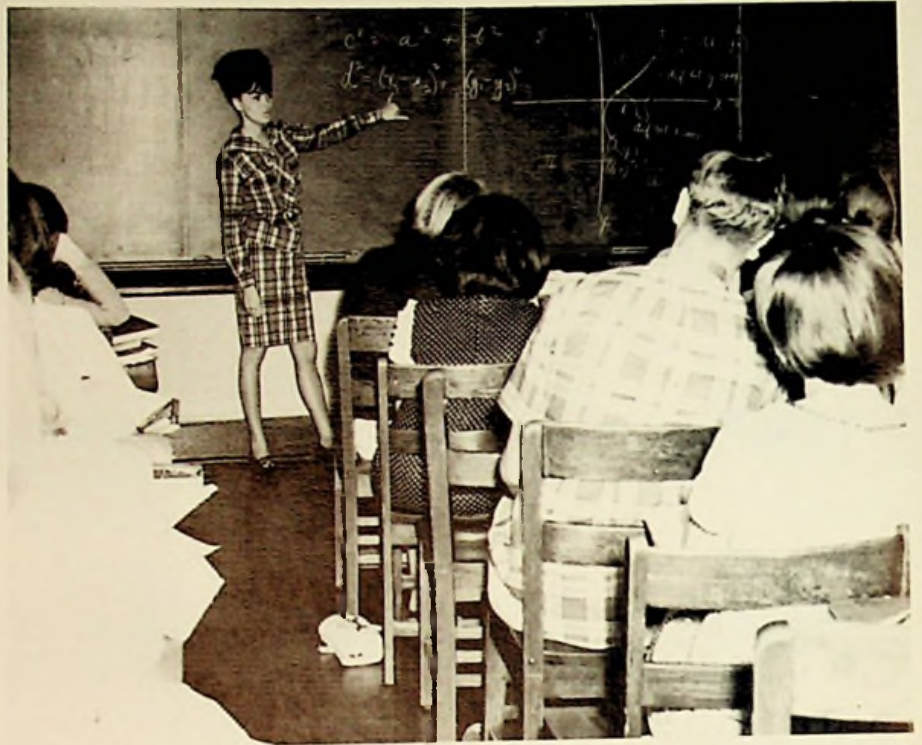

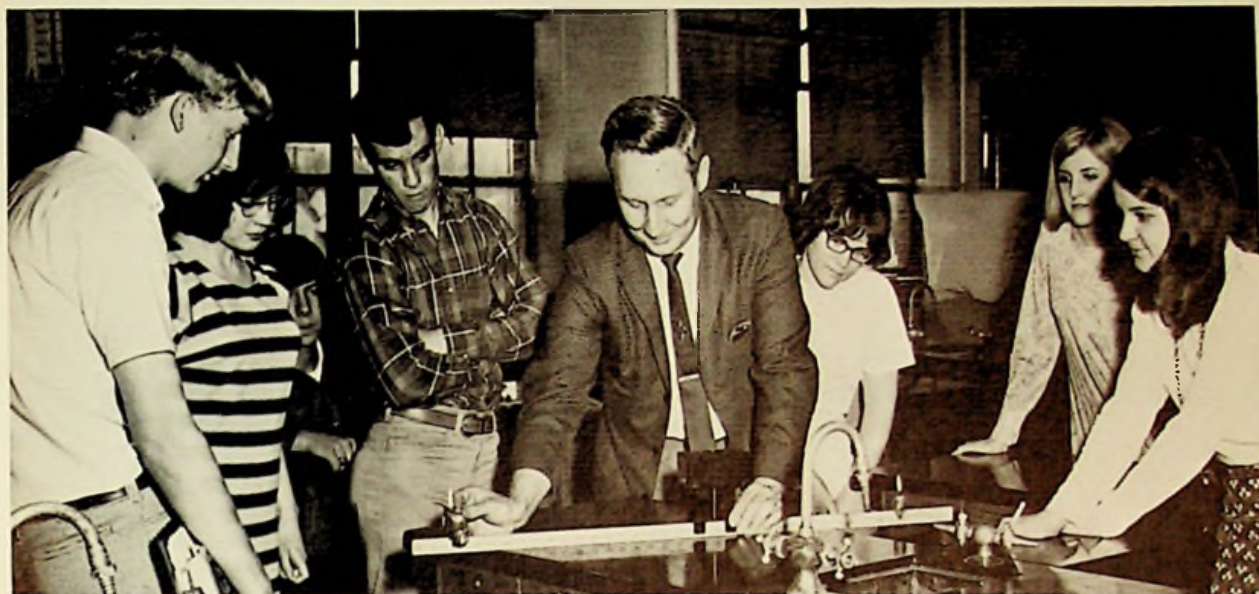

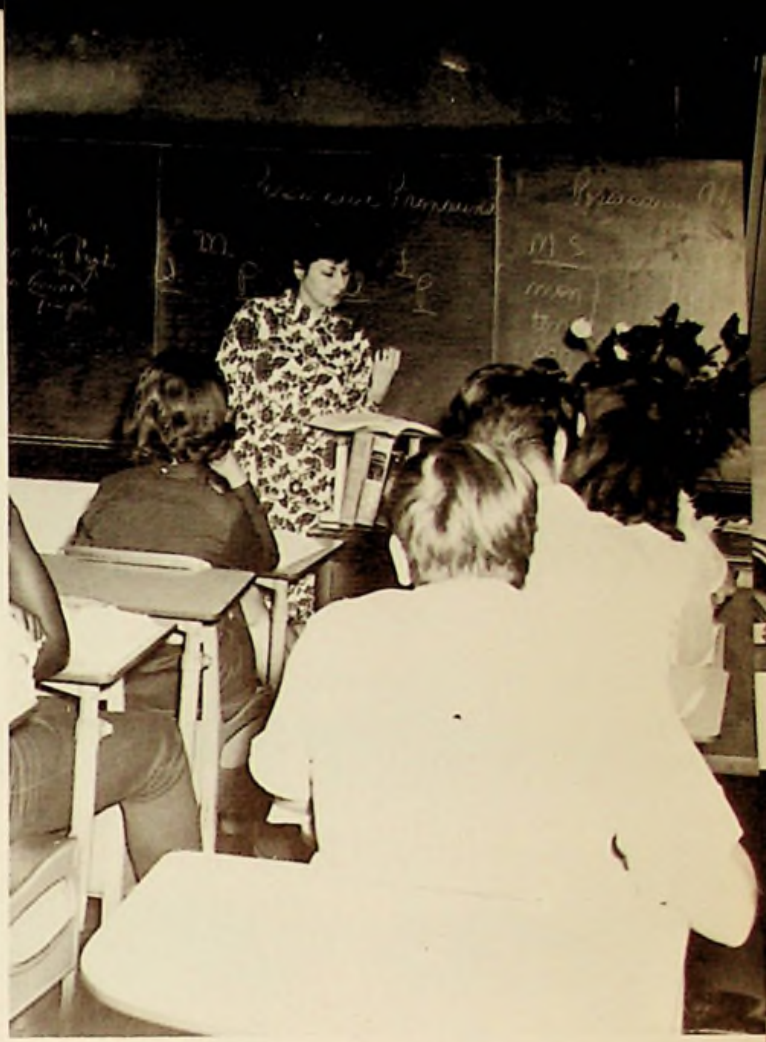



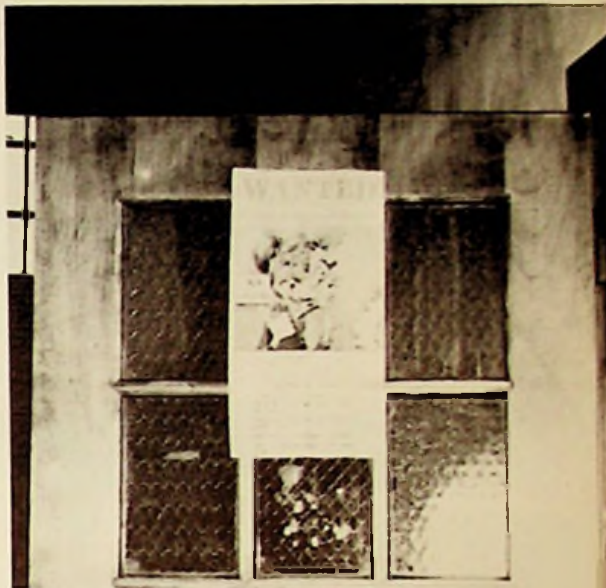
HUB OF PORTSMOUTH WEST — THE LIBRARY

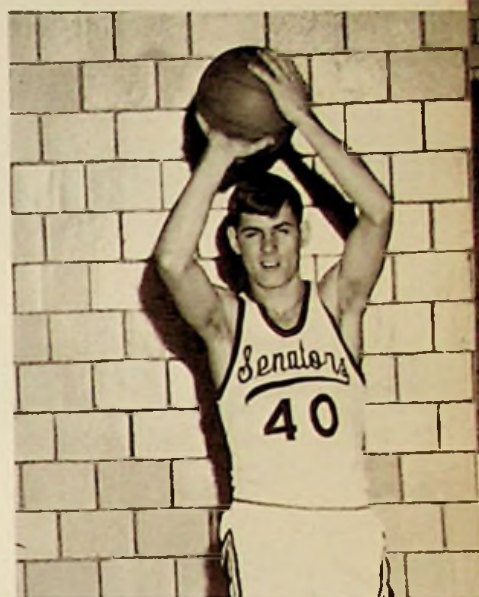

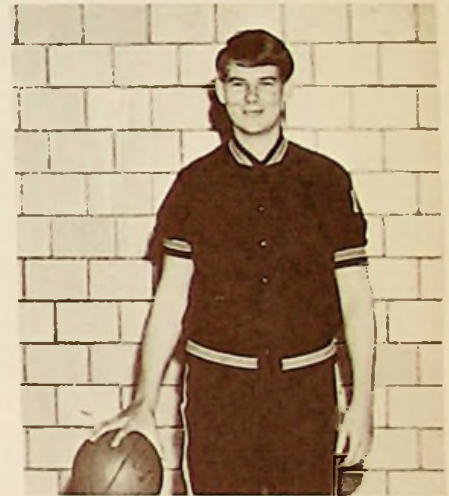

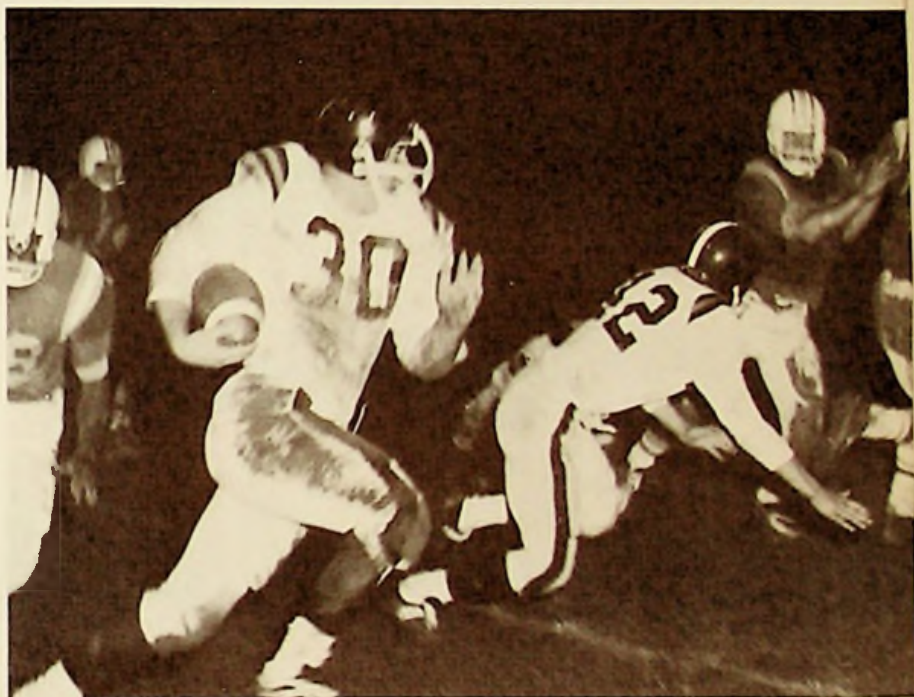

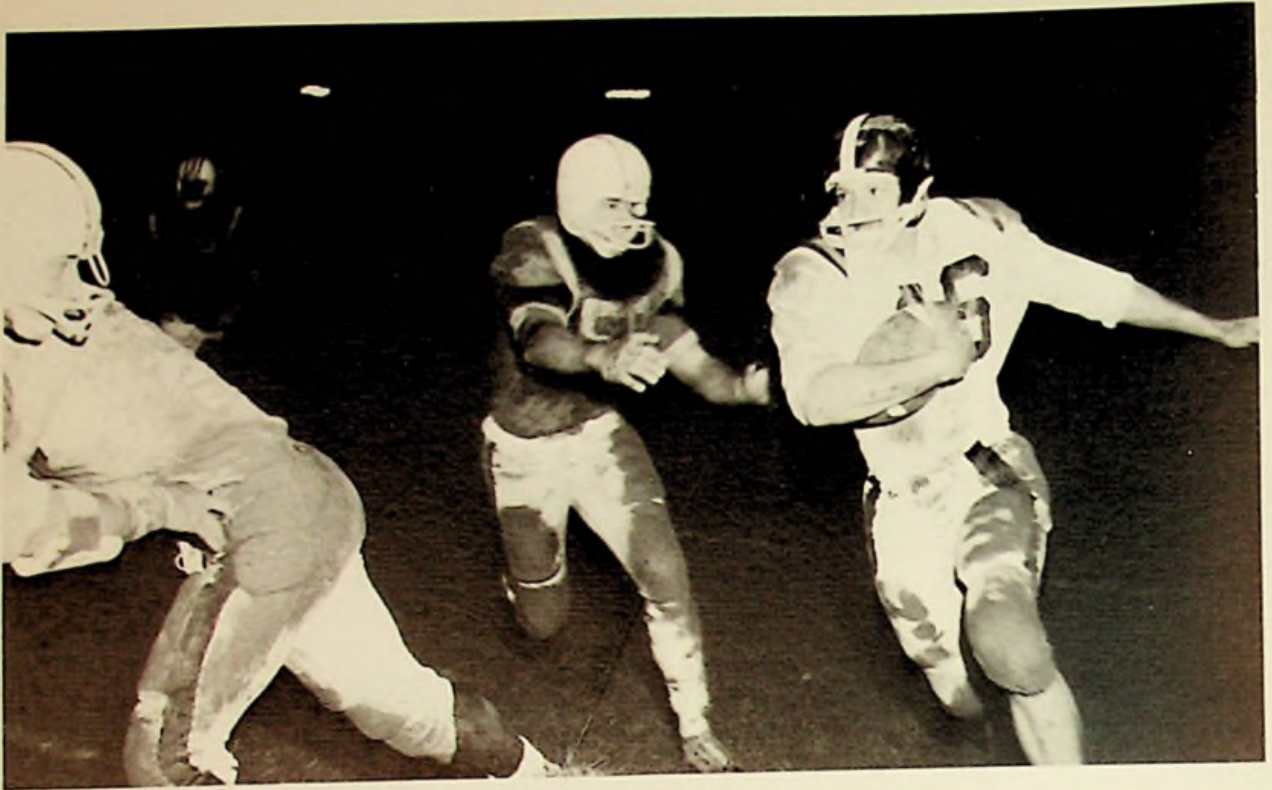

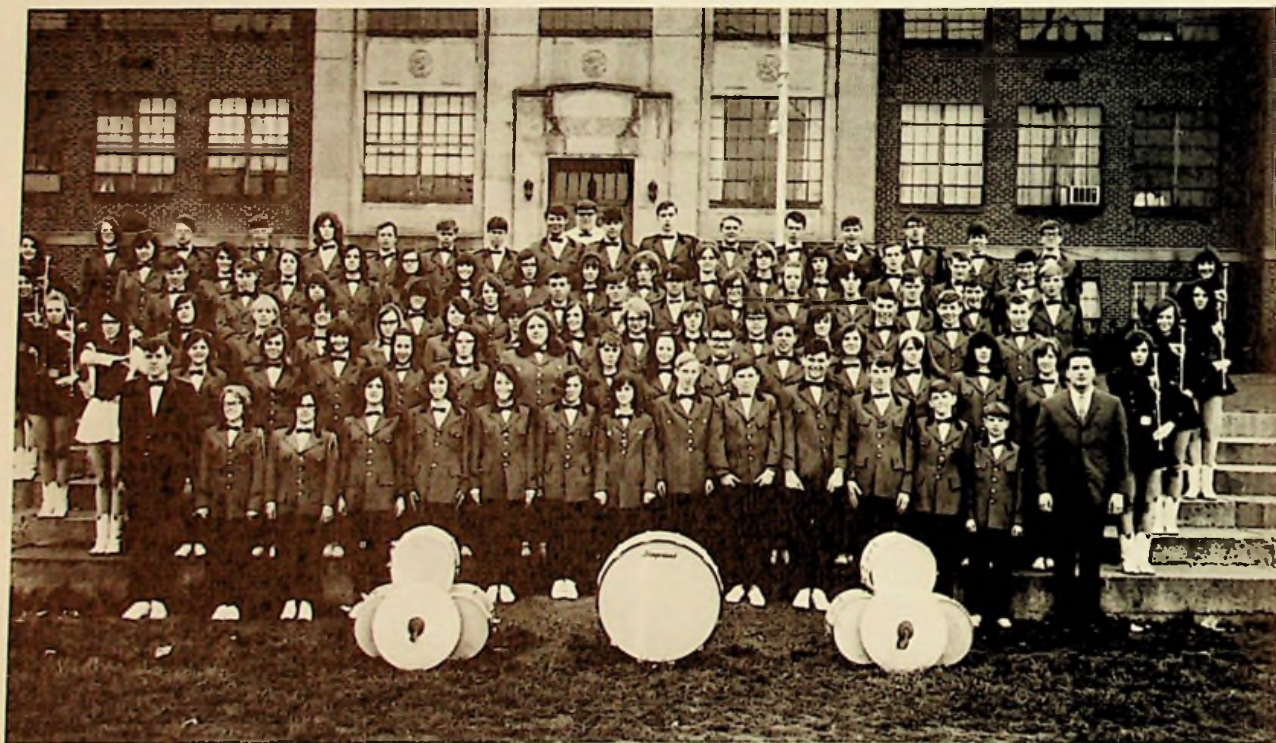
VARSITY BAND

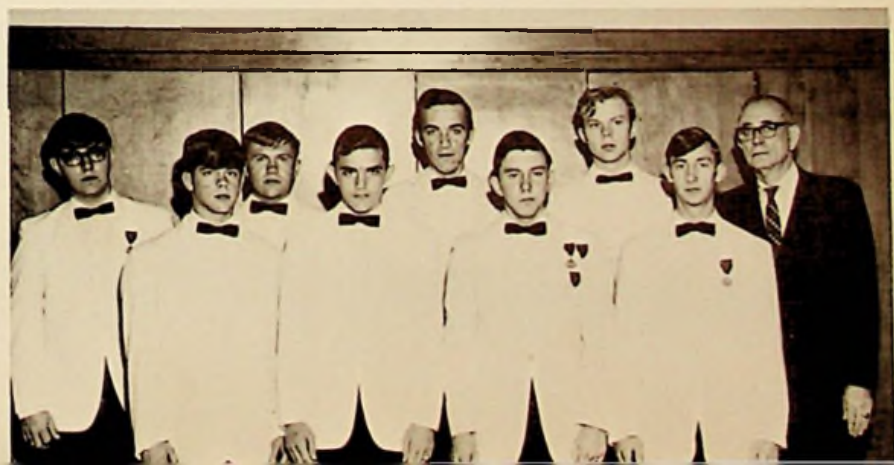

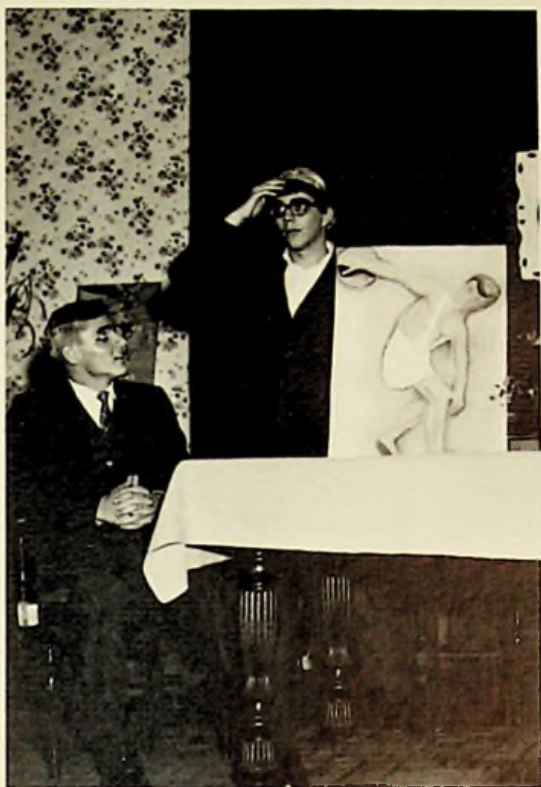

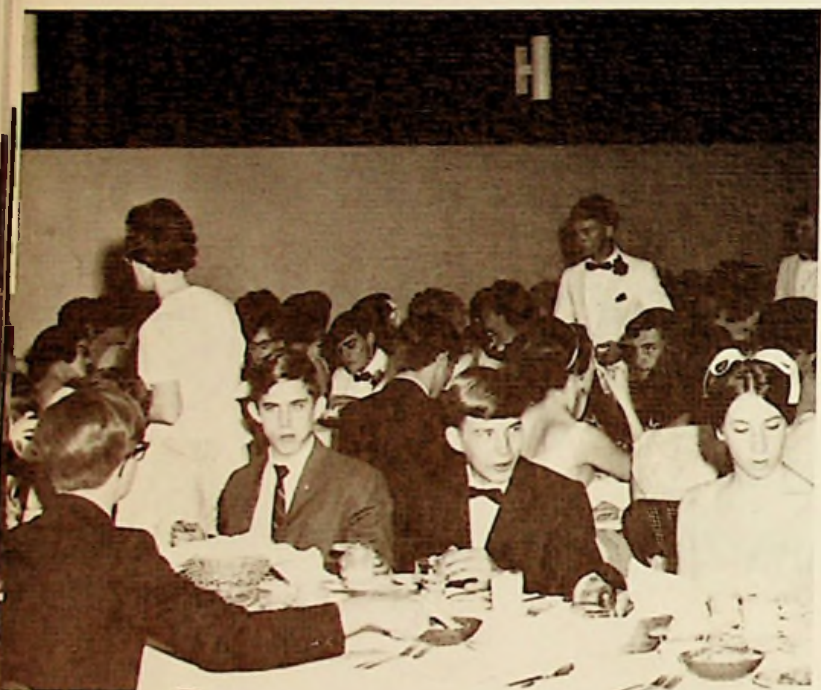

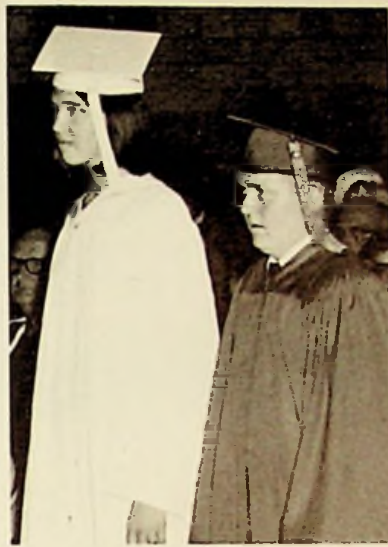
