



1895

total eclipse of
the moon
I stayed up
until it was
about half
over.

Wed Sept 4

A nice day
I cut melons
I spent in
the orchard

I finished the
Tch in the p.m.
against noon.

I then carried
in the beam in
to the granary.

Sun. Sept. 22

A warm day
Aft. hung all
day. Smith
J. & I. took
a stroll over the
hills to the
millet patch.
Found it beginning
to get ripe.
I drove up to
the Summit
after the mail.
Emma Hollman
went with me.
A right nice drive.
I received a letter
which I appreciated highly.

Mon. Sept. 23

A nice day.
Pa & I worked on
the drill wheel
the most of the
day.
Rita Baker & Rock-
well came over
past. Got on
a trade.

Tues. Sept. 24

A nice day.

I cut corn in
the orchard until
noon.

Worked around
the rest of the
day. Looked
after the beans
and picked
some apples.
Guel. Benn. came
and been off
the creek.
He took his up
to Smith's in the
evening.

Wed. Sept 25-

A nice day

Looked a little like
rain this morning
but failed.

I finished cutting
corn in the orchard.

After dinner Pa &

I thrashed the
buckwheat cut.

Mr. Hork is
here. He is a
great talker.

I wrote a letter

Pa took a mule, Benn.

Hoble up to Betty's.

He then got a load

of potatoes. 14 or 15

Thurs. Sept 26.
A nice day. Some
threatened rain
but failed.

Jim & O began
to cut the millit
Old Mill and
mules got out of
parking and O
came up to
sunch paper H.
Mrs. Ayck left
hill to stay

Fri. Sept 27.

Jim & O worked
at the mill all

the olives.
