EDWARD R. McCOWEN

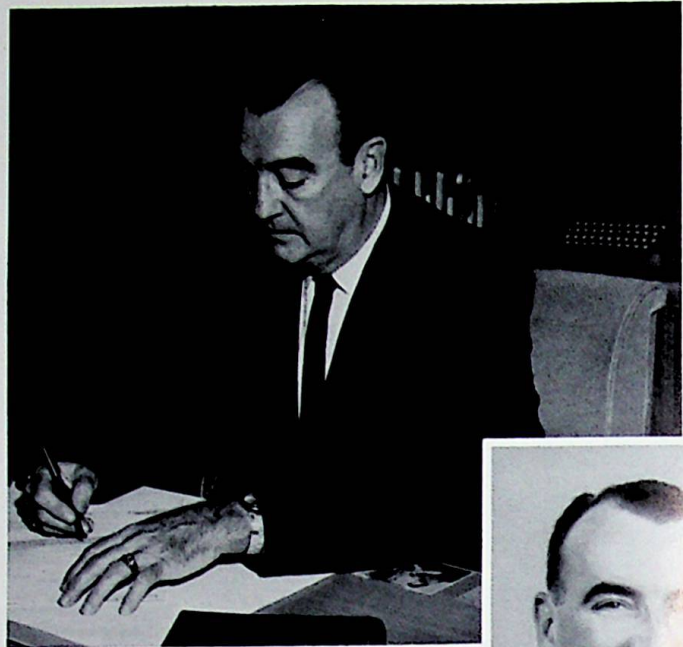
County Superintendent of Schools, B.S. Degree, Ohio University; Master's Degree, Northwestern University; has attended Otterbein College and Harvard University.

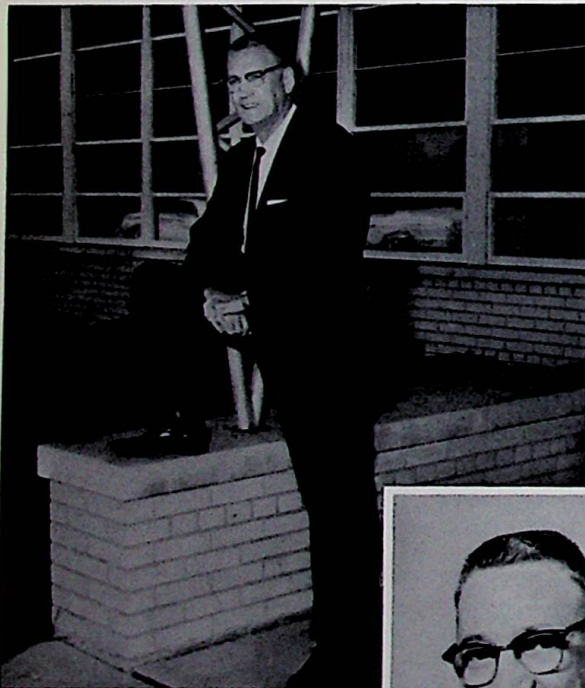
The United States of America will be stronger by these seniors taking their place in our great democratic society.

The staff members of the 1965 Wheel have worked long hard hours to present you with the best Yearbook in the history of Wheelersburg High School.

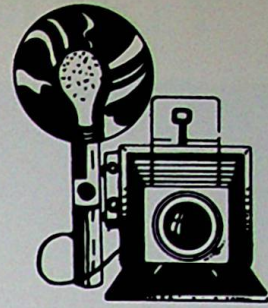
Before school started this year Sharon Barringer, our editor, was already busy giving assignments for soliciting ads.

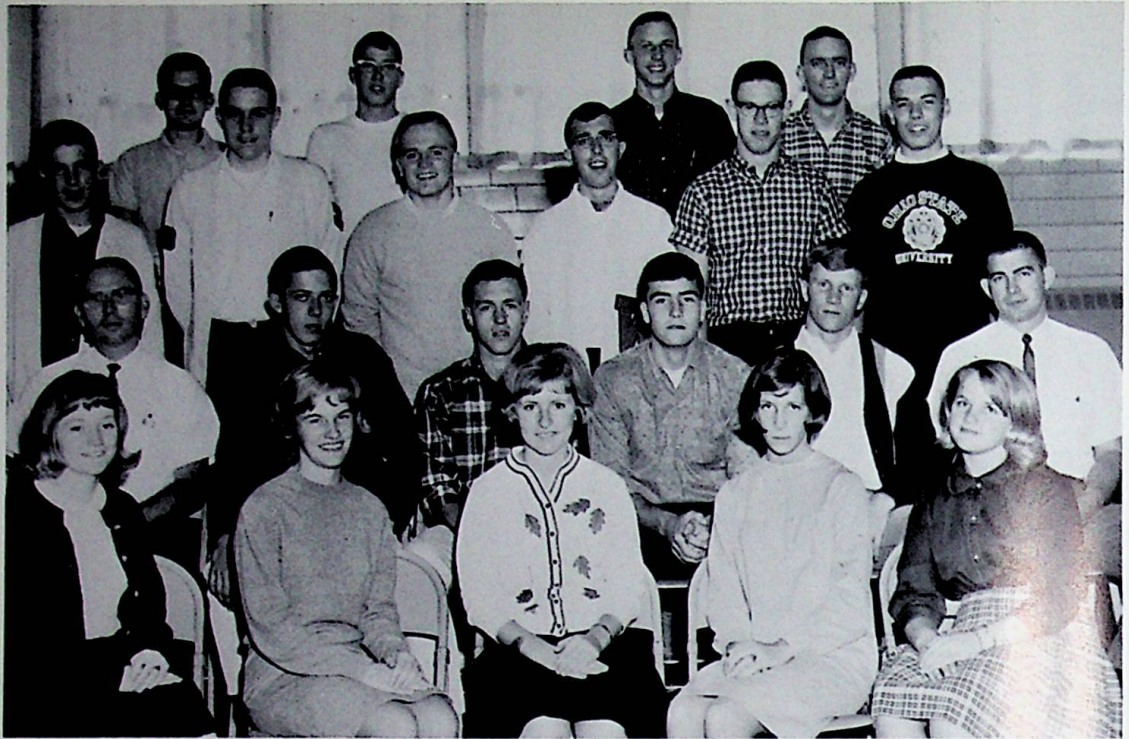
The library staff learns through experience how to read shelves, categorize books, take inventory, and how to help students select and find the book they wish to read.

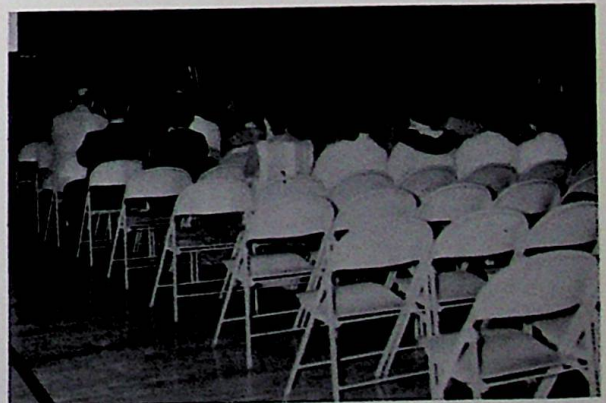


BAND BOOSTERS

There was a trip to Cincinnati which was a bonus for all members.



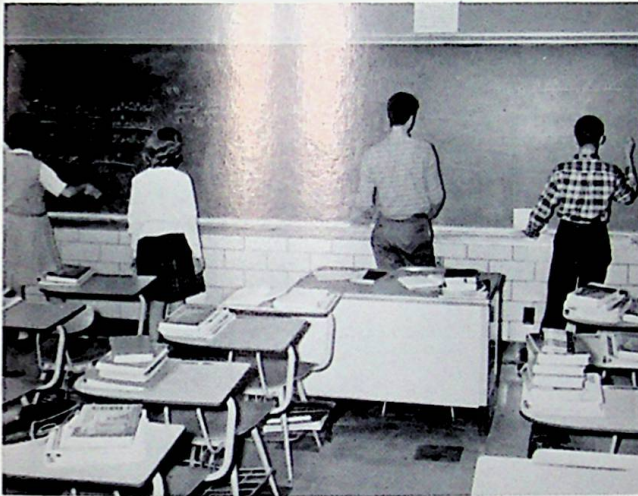

In December the group went Christmas caroling. Later they returned to school for a party and program with Heikki Matilla, a Finnish foreign exchange student, as guest speaker.

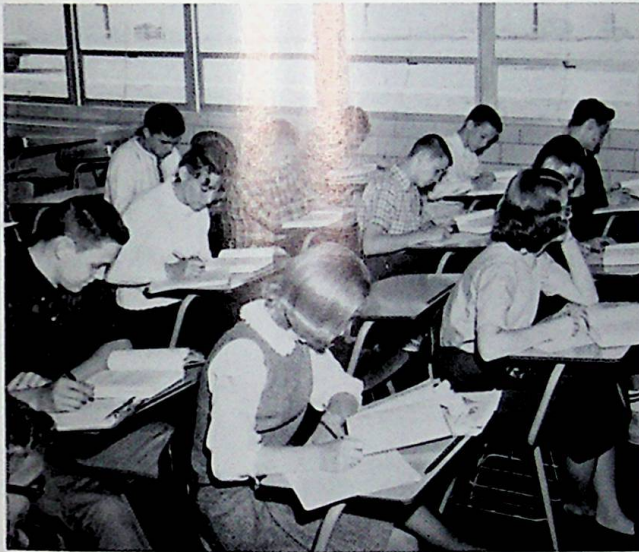
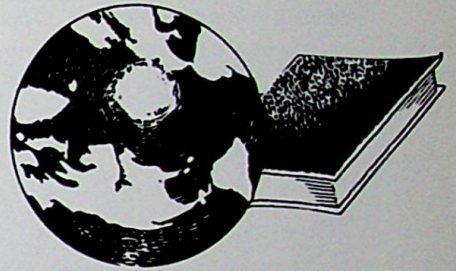

Grisson And Young Maneuver

ift, First To Shift Orbit Path



On the spot news creates interest!

Tuesday, March 23, 1965 was a day to remember. Astronauts Virgil I. Grissom and John Young manned the Gemini spacecraft in outer space.

Twenty minutes after liftoff, while Grissom and Young soared high over Africa, they made checks of their life support system. Grissom reported to a tracking station in the Canary Islands that all systems were working well.

As they wheeled around the globe, the astronauts were to fly their 7,000-pound vehicle backward, forward and sideways, pitch its nose down and stand it on its tail. During most of the mission, they were to face the direction they were flying instead of backward as the Mercury pilots did.

Grissom was to be in control most of the time and twice during the flight he was to lower the orbital path by about 50 miles in the first attempt to change an orbit on a manned

ed. The high point was lower than the planned 149 miles. This would have no effect on the mission.

After 30 minutes of flight, the control center had not reported any direct remarks from the astronauts to news media following the progress of the shuttle at a press site on the Cape.

This contrasts with earlier flights, when a steady flow of chatter came down from the Mercury astronauts.

As the spacecraft swooped over East Africa during the first orbit, Grissom activated one of three scientific experiments planned on the flight.

He rotated the handle of a 2-ounce container mounted inside the spacecraft. The container carried sea urchin eggs which Grissom was to fertilize at various

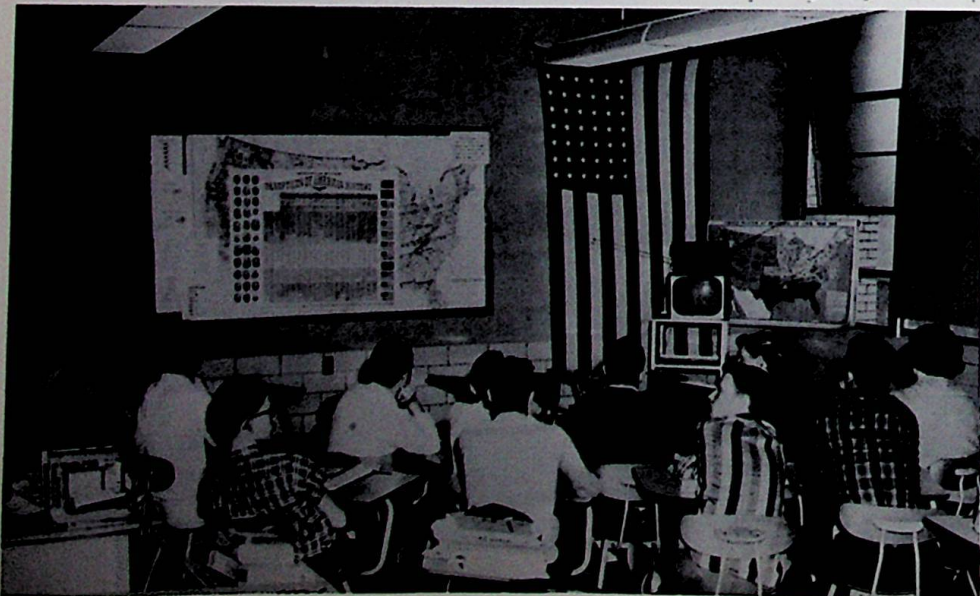

Some three hours before Grissom and Young vaulted into space, Soviet cosmonauts Alexei Leonov and Pavel Belyayev returned to Moscow to a heroic welcome for their flight last week, when Leonov stepped out of his craft into space.

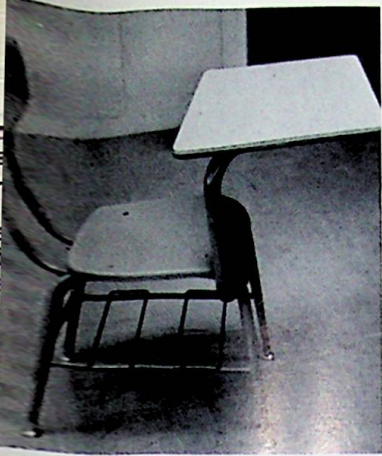
Grissom straightened out a minor problem that developed over Africa and a short time later the mission control center at Cape Kennedy gave him the green light for a second orbit. He replied that the crew was in "go condition."

Some difficulty had developed in a secondary electronic system associated with a jet thruster that helps maneuver the craft, but Grissom reported over Australia that the problem had been solved.

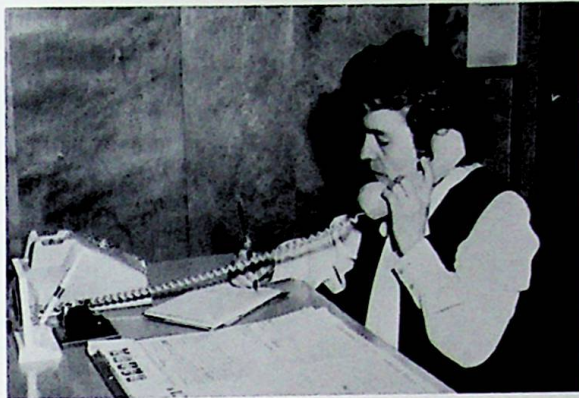
