Harison Rolled all  
day. I finished  
planting corn  
We all went down  
to the pump  
& Keller & Cole  
& Ed. Bailey came  
out for groceries

Sun. June 6.

Went to  
D. got ready and  
showed only to  
Mr. Curill's.

Took some notices  
over to Mrs. Curill.  
She seemed  
by well pleased  
she seem to  
better.

Monday June 7.

Shelled over the  
rest of the day.

I fractured can  
made sweet potato  
ridges planted  
rotten ear corn  
and hoed the  
main patch at  
Gene & Father's  
eyes on little  
Sewer.

Sun. June 13.

A nice warm day  
At home all day  
Syons came out &  
stayed all day  
Father & Mother with  
4 children came  
over.

Emma Hollman &  
Clara Cook came  
down to Father's  
but finding her  
gone came down  
and spent the  
afternoon here  
Father came  
home with the  
team - left Gene  
down at the hill

I took her to  
church in the  
morn  
A small show

Sun. June 2d  
A hard storm  
came up about  
noon.  
I took the new  
buggy and  
drove in the  
barns  
Had a good  
party & took a  
drive up to  
Hall's Hill

Mon. June 27.  
A milk dog  
I got here at  
noon.  
My Carriage  
not feeling so  
well  
I moved down  
the afternoon  
with Bill's  
team.  
My sister - Ghael  
Philip's friend  
came all day  
I felt cool  
last night

Thurs. June 22,

Sun. June 27.

A warmer day. I spent the day over at Mr. Chaffin looking at their new barn and their crops. I got a couple of balls of twine for them.

Gene gave me the sheep gall.

cut for Baley  
using James  
mower.  
Sent Ed Baley  
down to the  
burg after wine  
Started Jim  
Kearns, Hagler  
and John Jones  
in to the corn

I finished Ed's  
wheat and mowed  
up and began to  
cut my wheat  
Wheat in my
