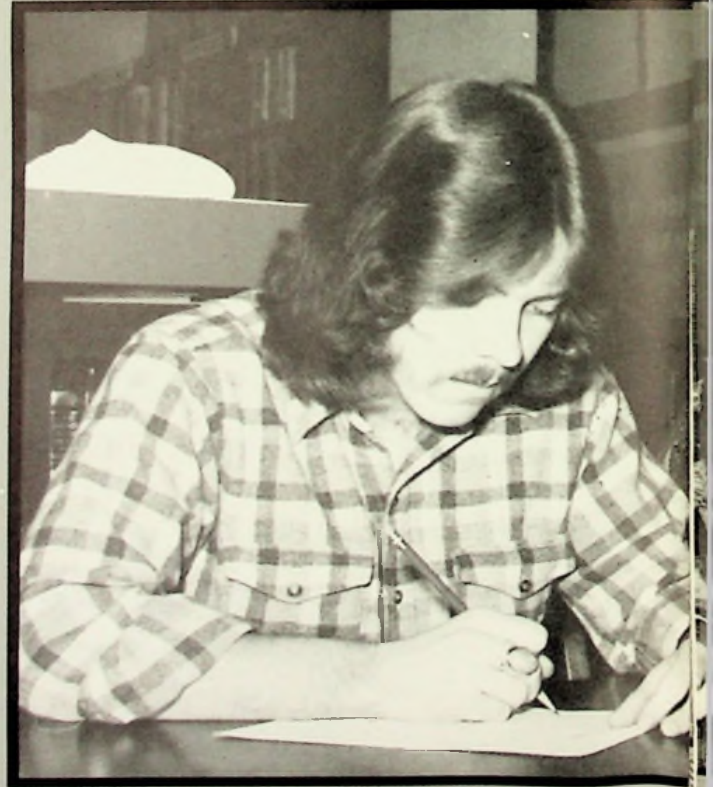
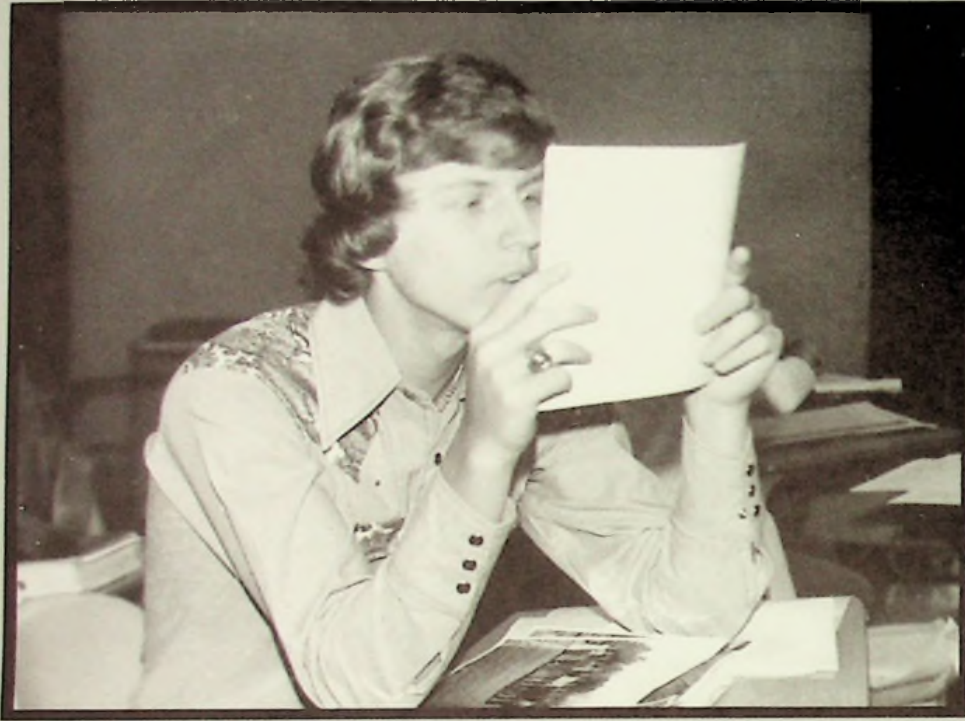






Our past is a pattern that is given to us and that we readily accept. It is as important as our present and our future. But the past isn't the end-all of our lives.



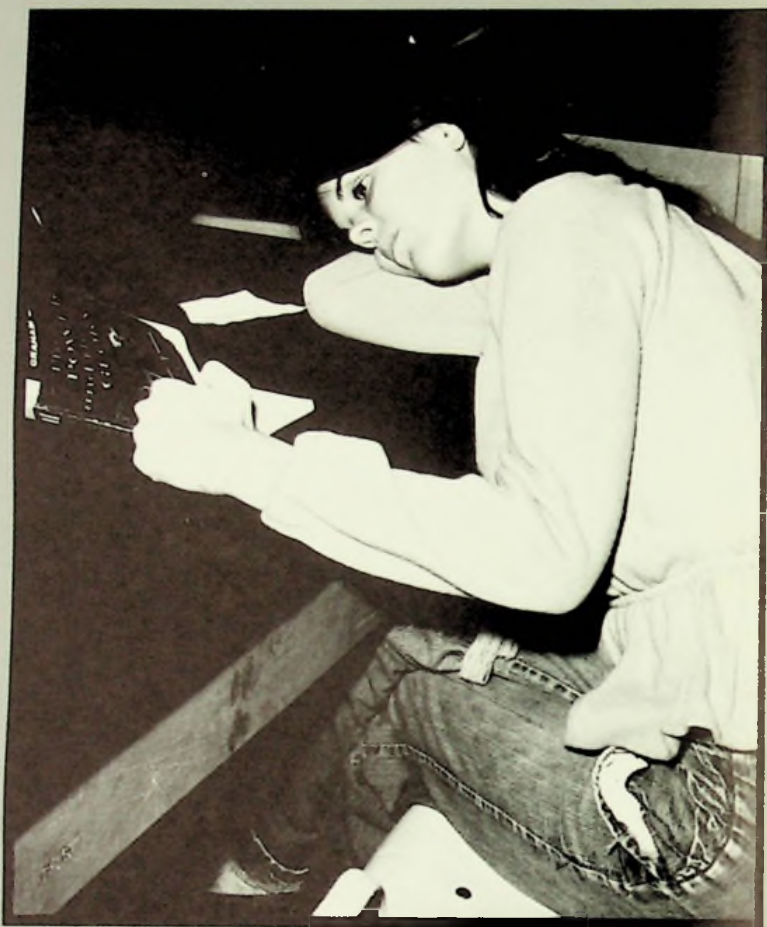




We can't worship the past. That's wrong. But we have to respect our past because it holds those forces that have shaped us. We can benefit from our past when looking for a way to the future.

Europe stopped to spend the night at a mysterious castle and soon came under the spell of the Dracula family. The talented cast and their director,

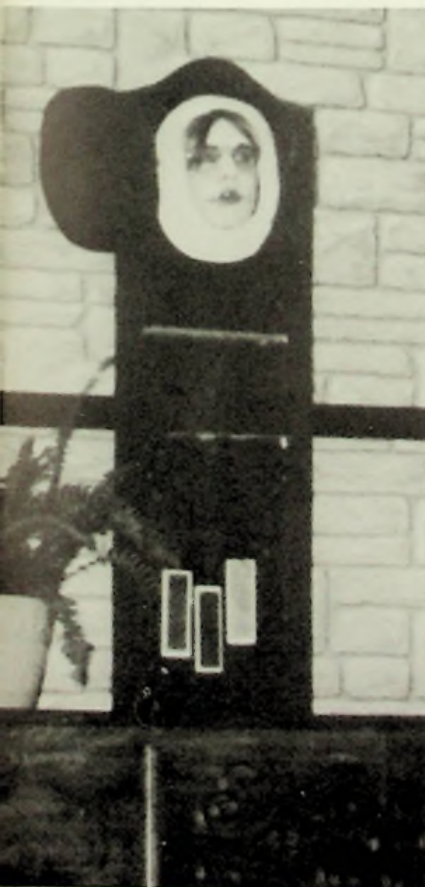
Mrs. Distel, provided great entertainment. **BOYS AND GHOULS TOGETHER** was a smash and ended with a scream of laughter!

INSTRUCTION





Tool For All Subjects

Language is a road into the past to see the world before our own time. It is the knowledge of a culture's people thousands of miles away without having ever visited them. Whether we study French, Spanish, or literature in our English classes, we learn to broaden our attitudes about people and their institutions everywhere. But most significantly, we learn to use language as a tool to develop our thoughts into expressions of ideas that may be valuable to others. 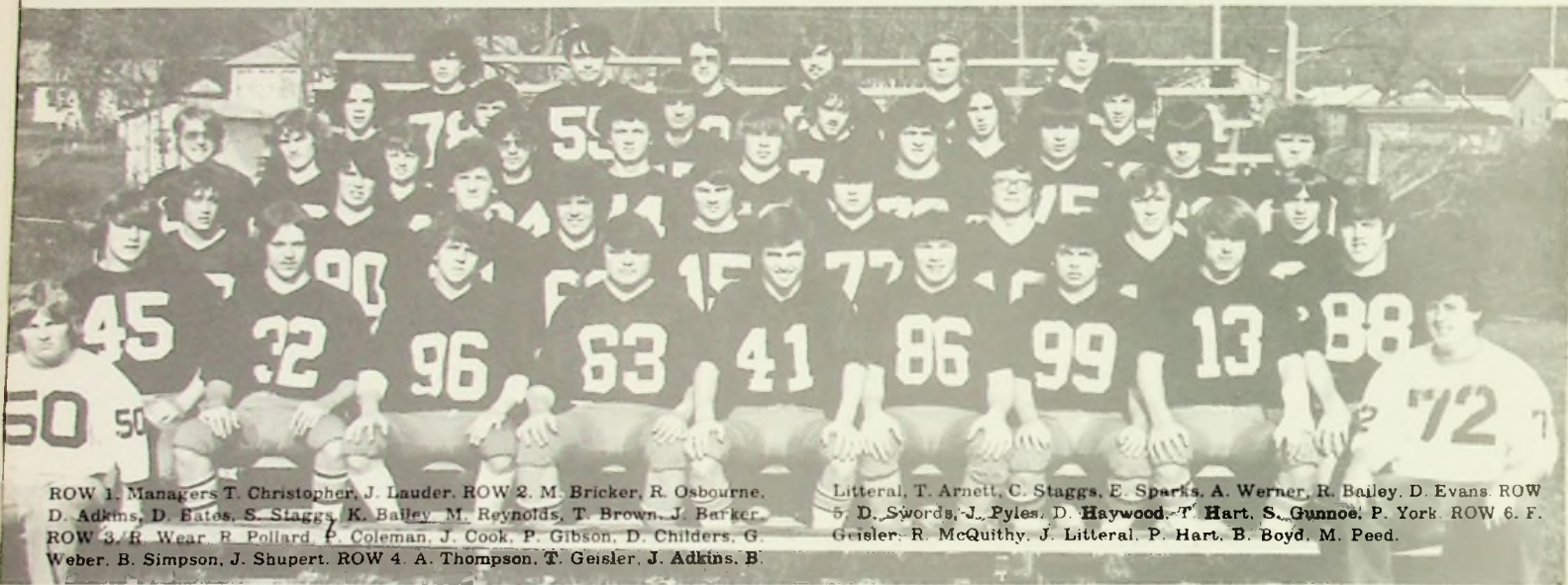


Defense: Senator Trademark

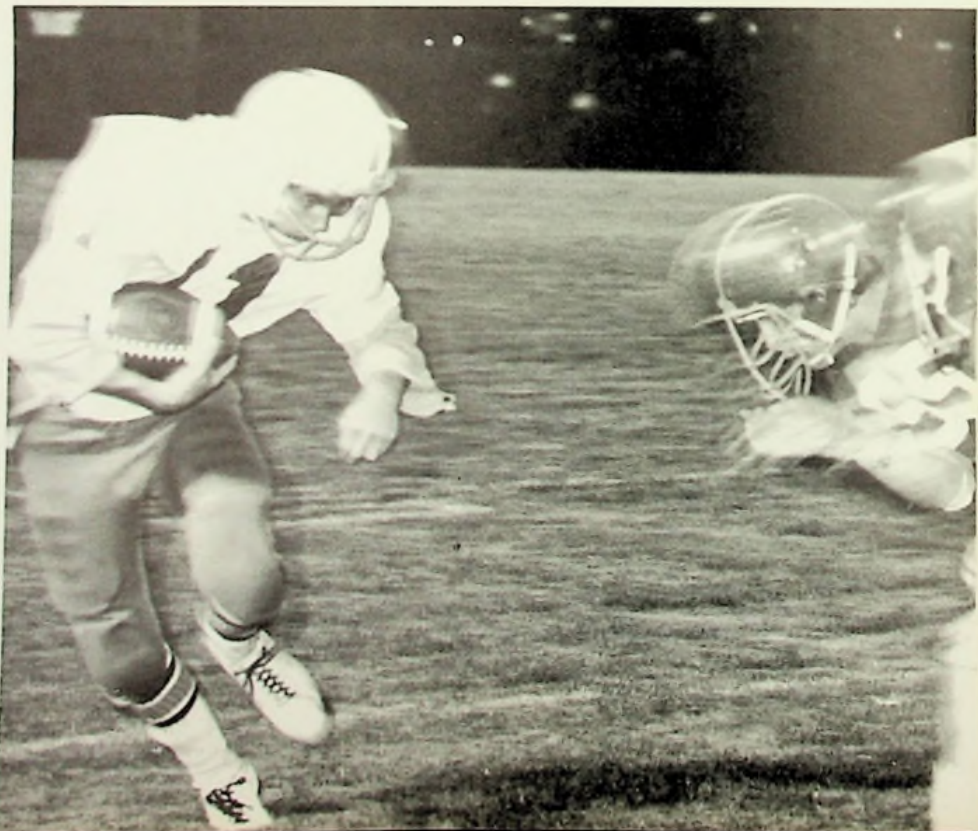
sidelights were the Senators' holding their opponents scoreless in the first quarter of every game and moving into their new stadium which added a new dimension to West football.

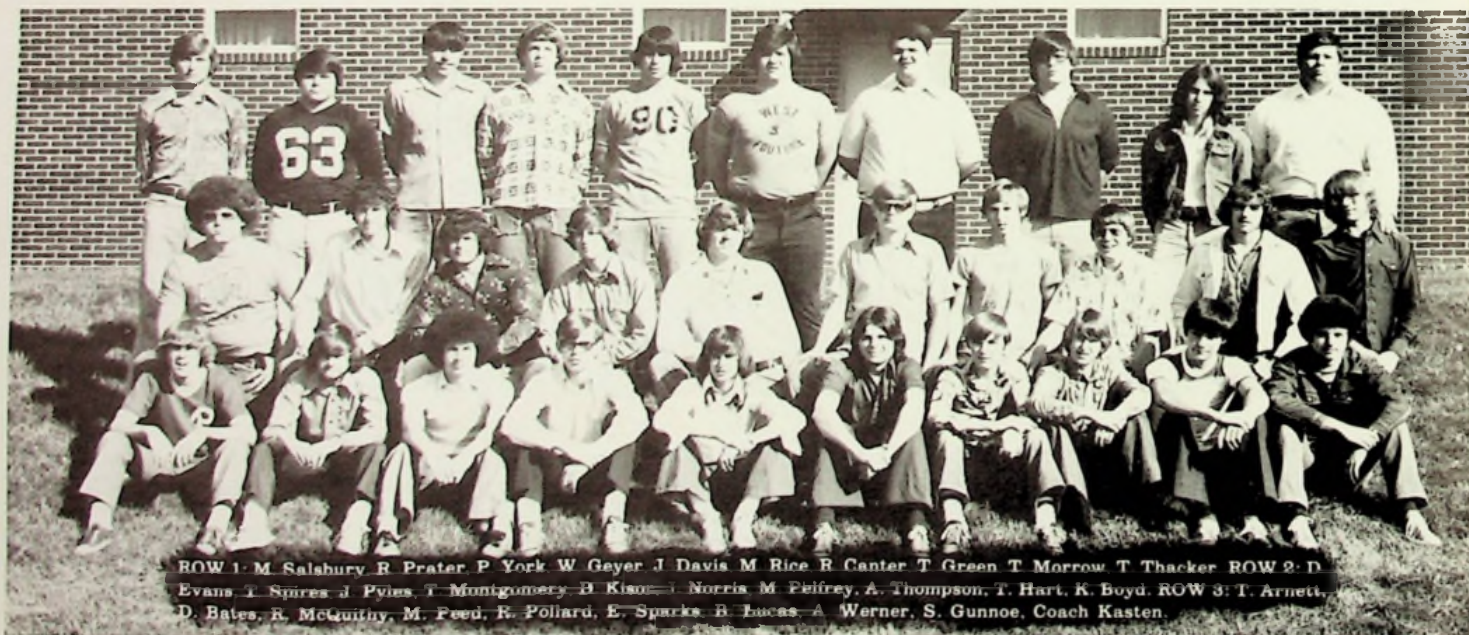
