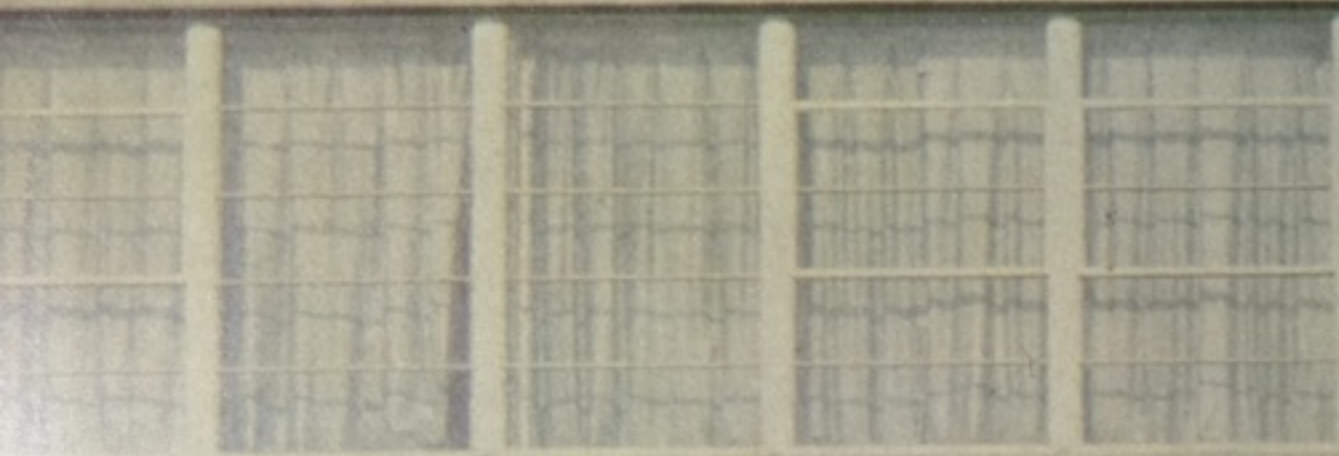

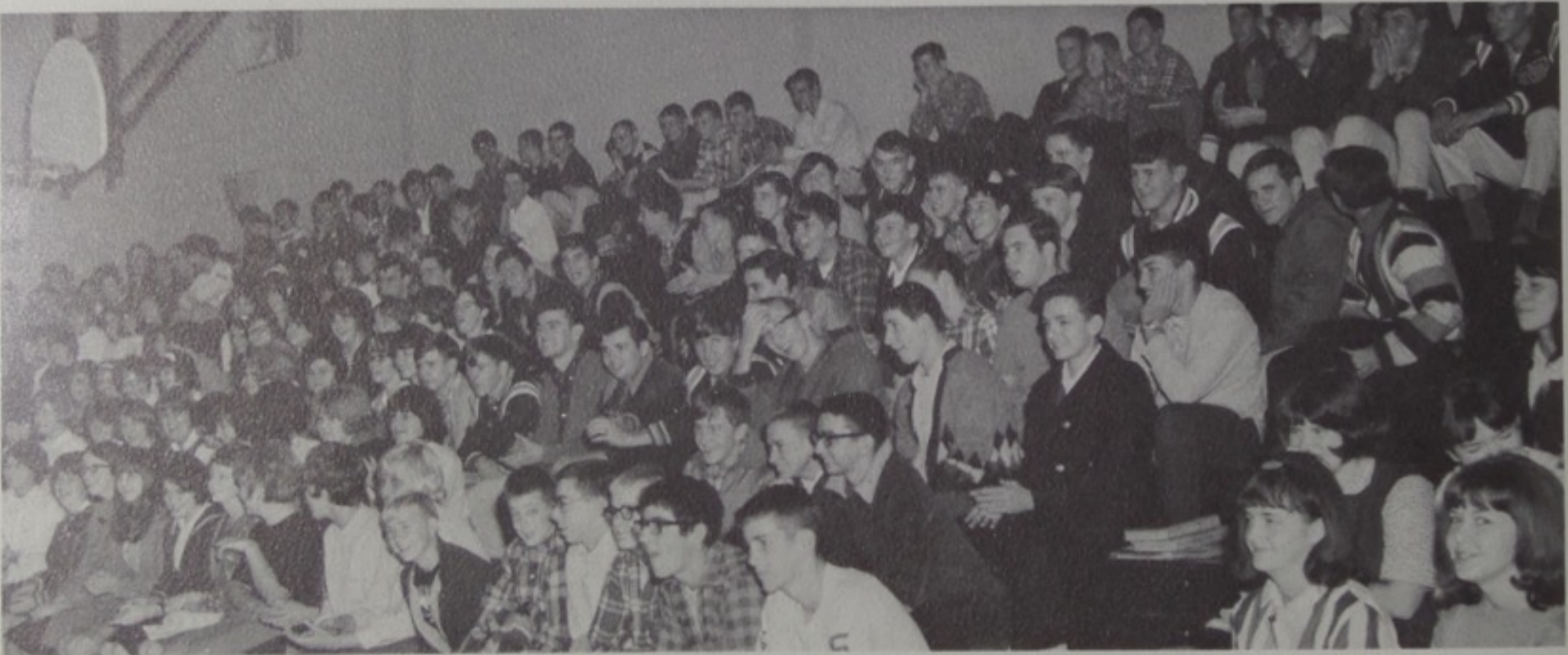

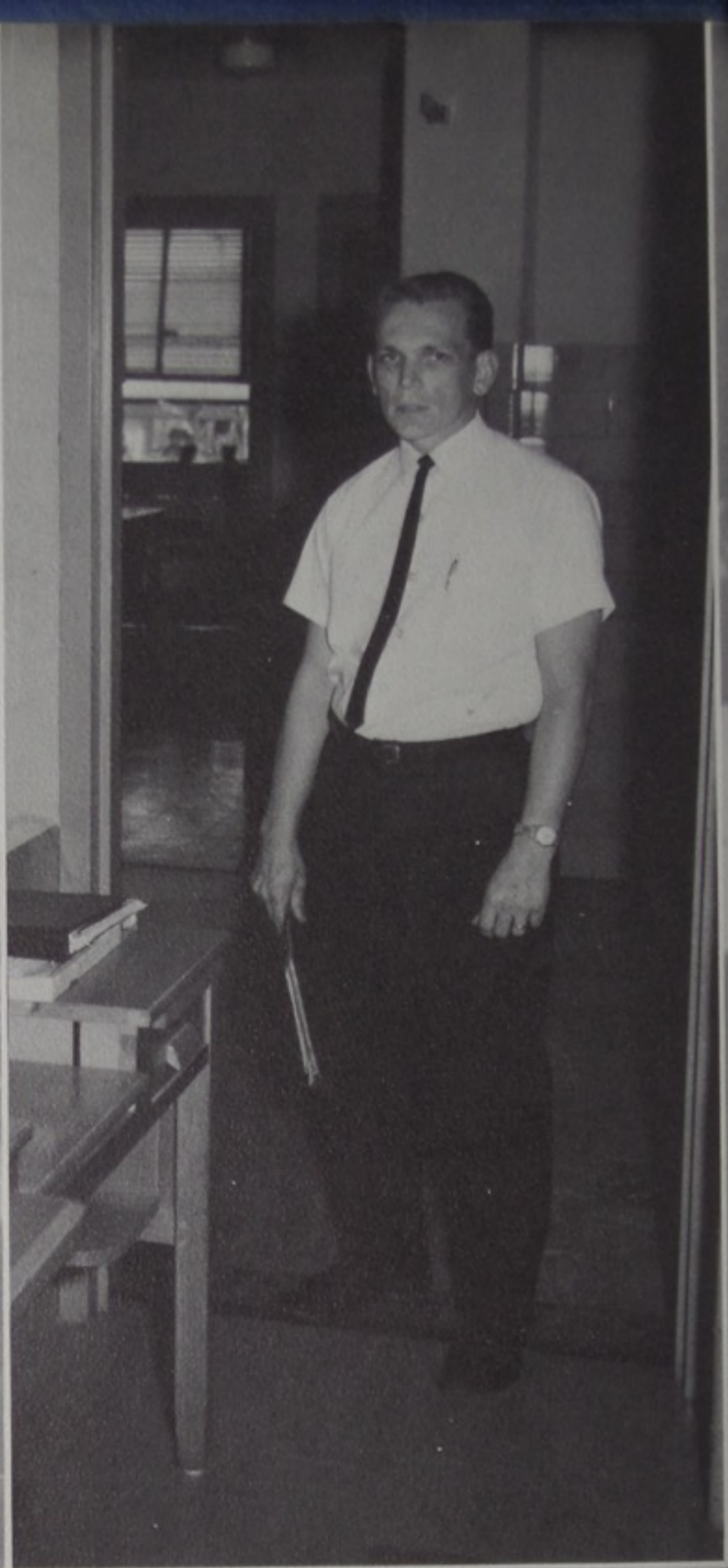
An unassuming man--an honest man. These words are the most appropriate to describe Mr. Reed, head of of the Industrial Arts Department.

MISS YVETTA JACOBS, who teaches home economics, received a B. A. degree in vocational home economics from Marshall University.

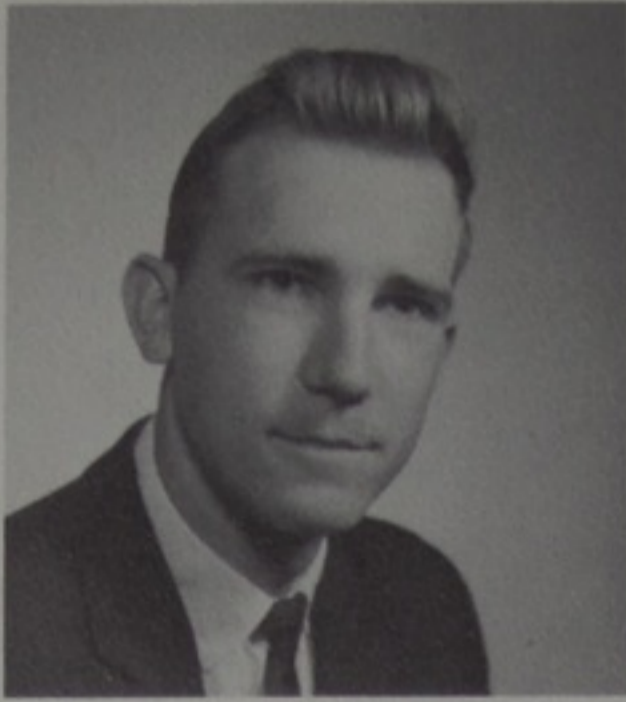
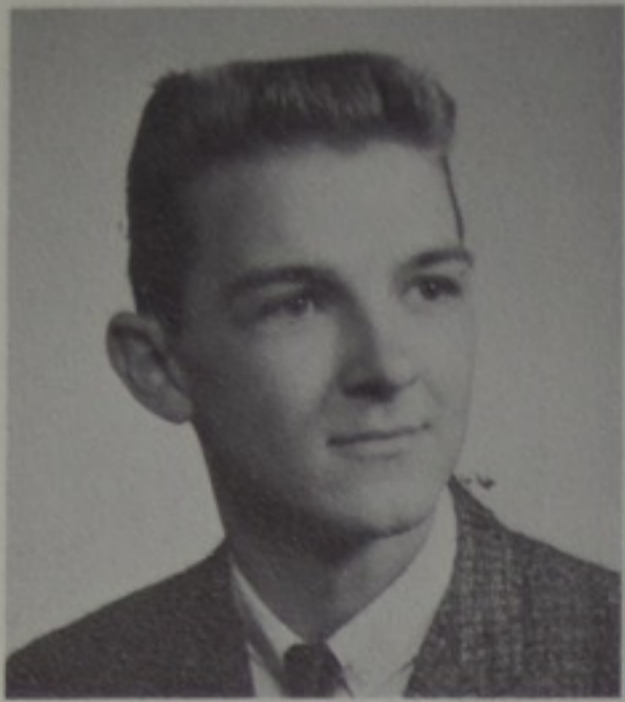

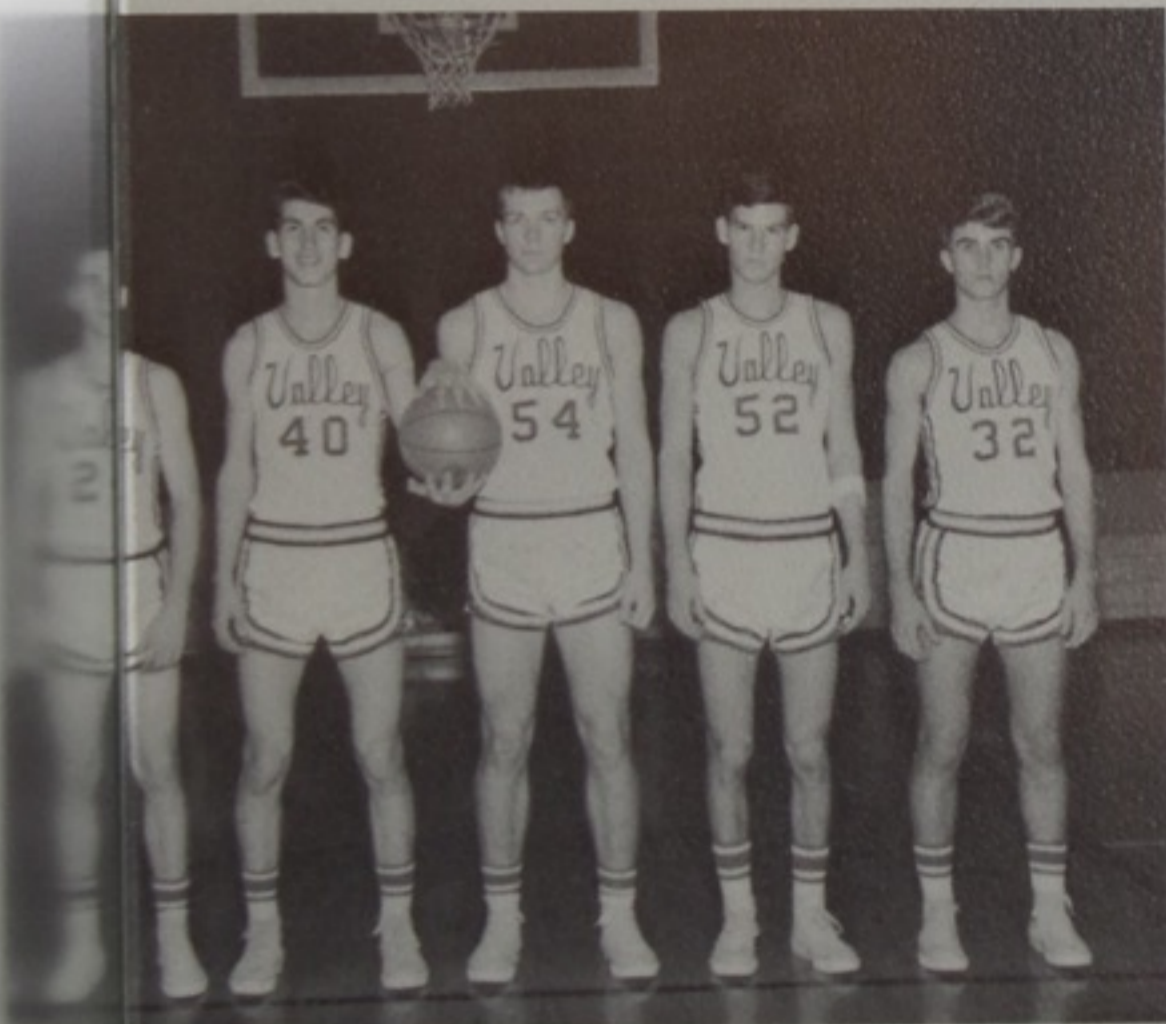
Follow me boys

Although the team was small in stature, not having a man of great height, they were giants in desire and hustle. The boy's determination to win was equal of that of their coach, the fiery, fearless, fighting Doug Booth. The team putting forth their best effort ended the season with a fine record of 11 wins and 7 losses.



The Valley Indians Basketball team was coached by Roger Lundy. Many outstanding feats were accomplished by this year's team. This season was very successful in many ways. The team won 15 of its 20 games.

This year's team was a very high scoring team and probably the highest in Valley's High School basketball history. The team set a high scoring pace with 77 points per game. Twice they rolled over the 100 points a game mark. The team set a new scoring record with 105 points. The old record was 98 points. That record was held by Gene McKenzie's team. His son, Ron, was a member of the team that broke that old record this year. Four members of the team received top recognition in league honors and was recognized for their outstanding scoring and playing, either by making an all-star team or by honorable mention on the team.



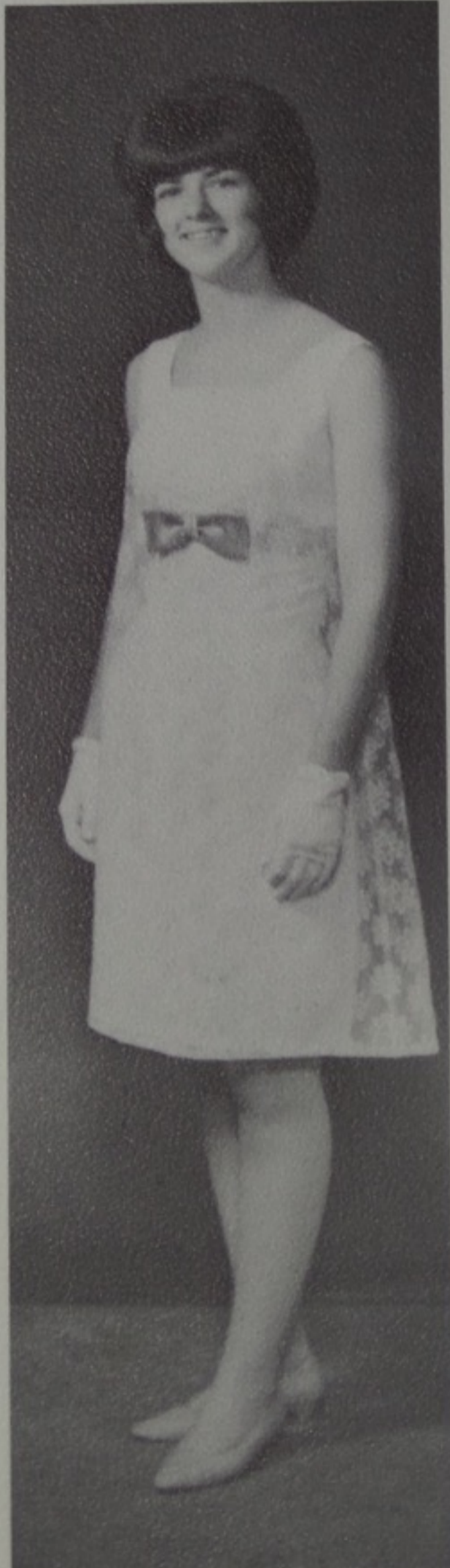

MIKE CRABTREE was a good ballhandler and a good shot. He was second on the team in scoring and was a great asset to the team.



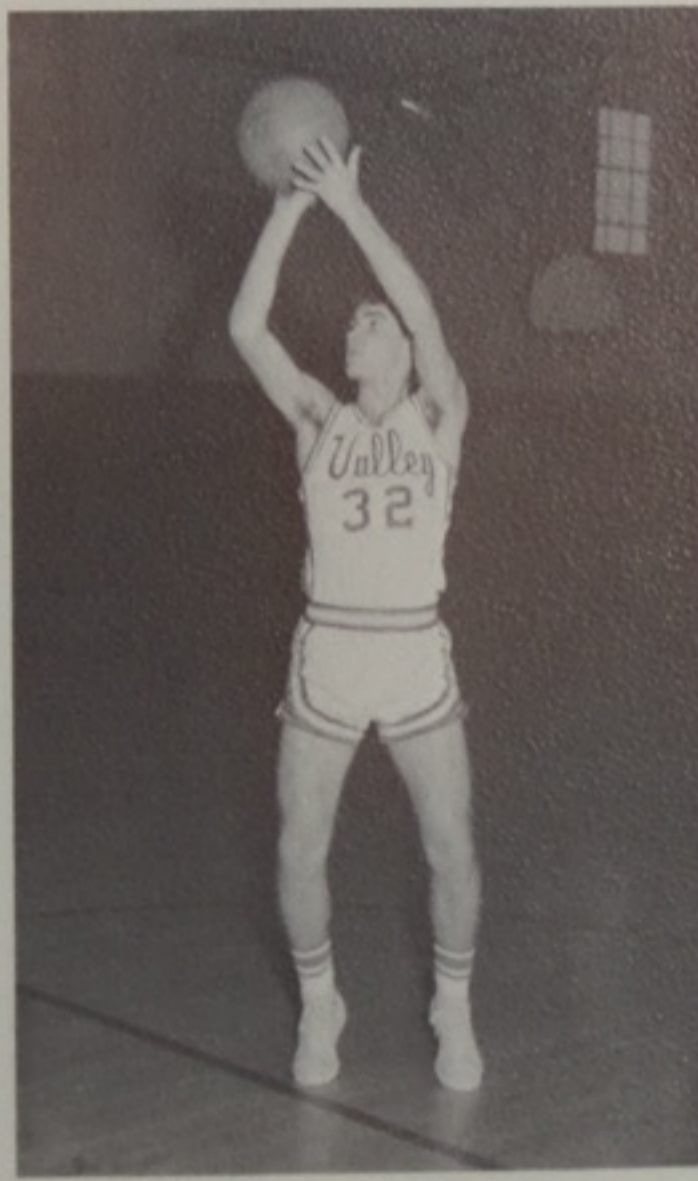

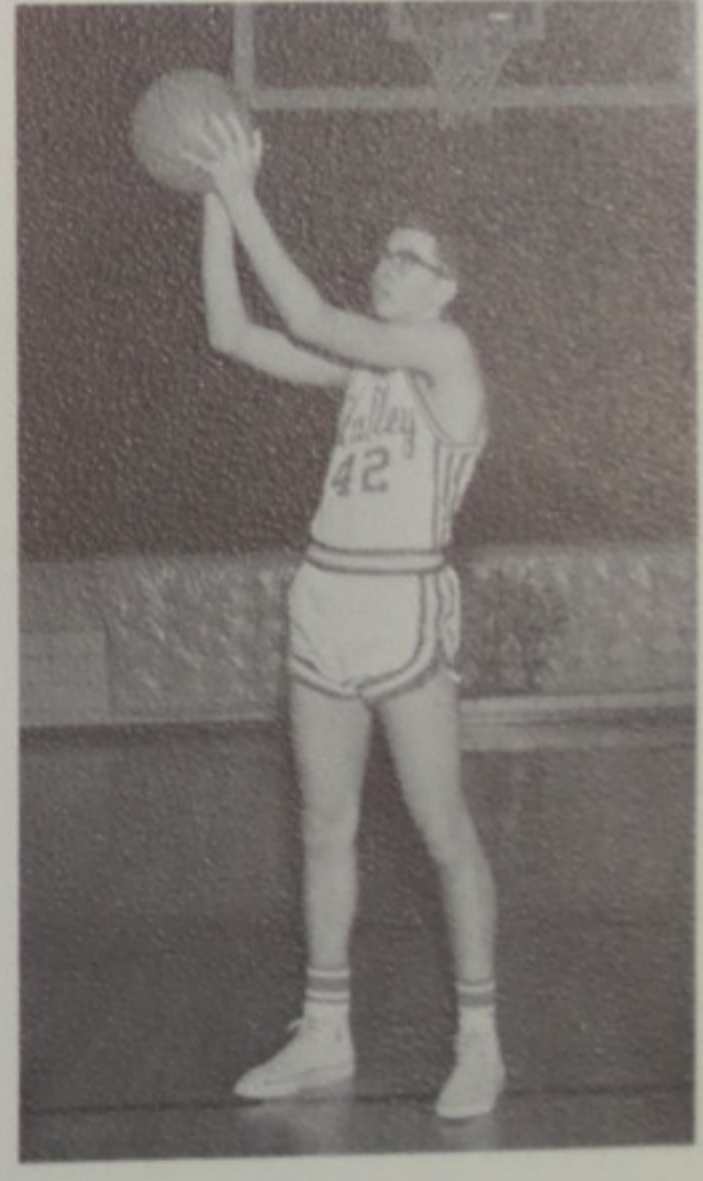
DOUG ARRICK was the "scrappiest" man on the floor. He was second in the foul shooting with 85%. He also maintained a 4.0 academic average during the season.



RON WELLS led the team in field goal percentage and in foul shooting with 86%. He was also third in scoring.

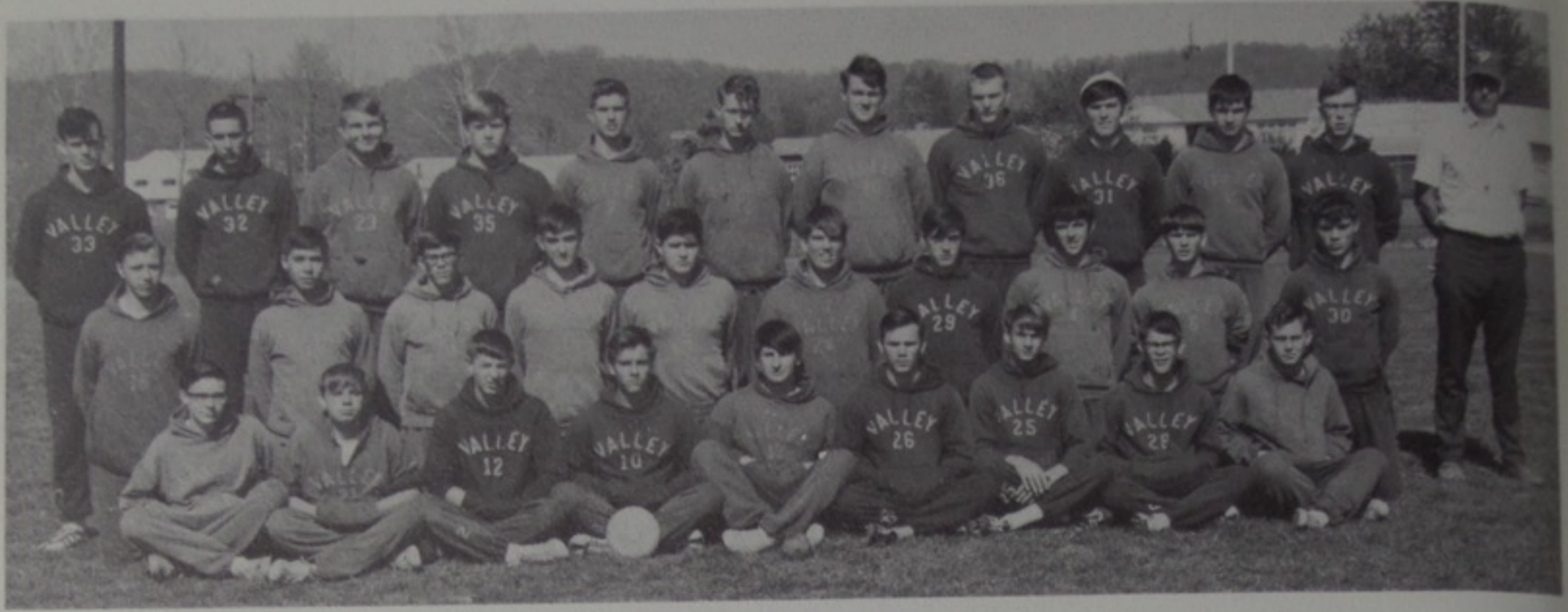


RON MCKENZIE led the team in scoring and also was a good rebounder. He also led the team in assists and shot 80% from the foul line.

Soon you will close the door of your room and turn off the lights and, for a moment, be quite alone.
