


























HONOR SOCIETY

Field Commanders for the year were Senior Paul Madden and Junior April Dawson. Kim Queen, also a senior, performed as a feature twirler.






"HOORAY FOR HOLLYWOOD"




DESTINY





A CHAMPIONSHIP SEASON












































A "SOCC"-ESSFUL SEASON

























BAD TO THE BONE




TENNIS TEAM FINISHES 20-1
