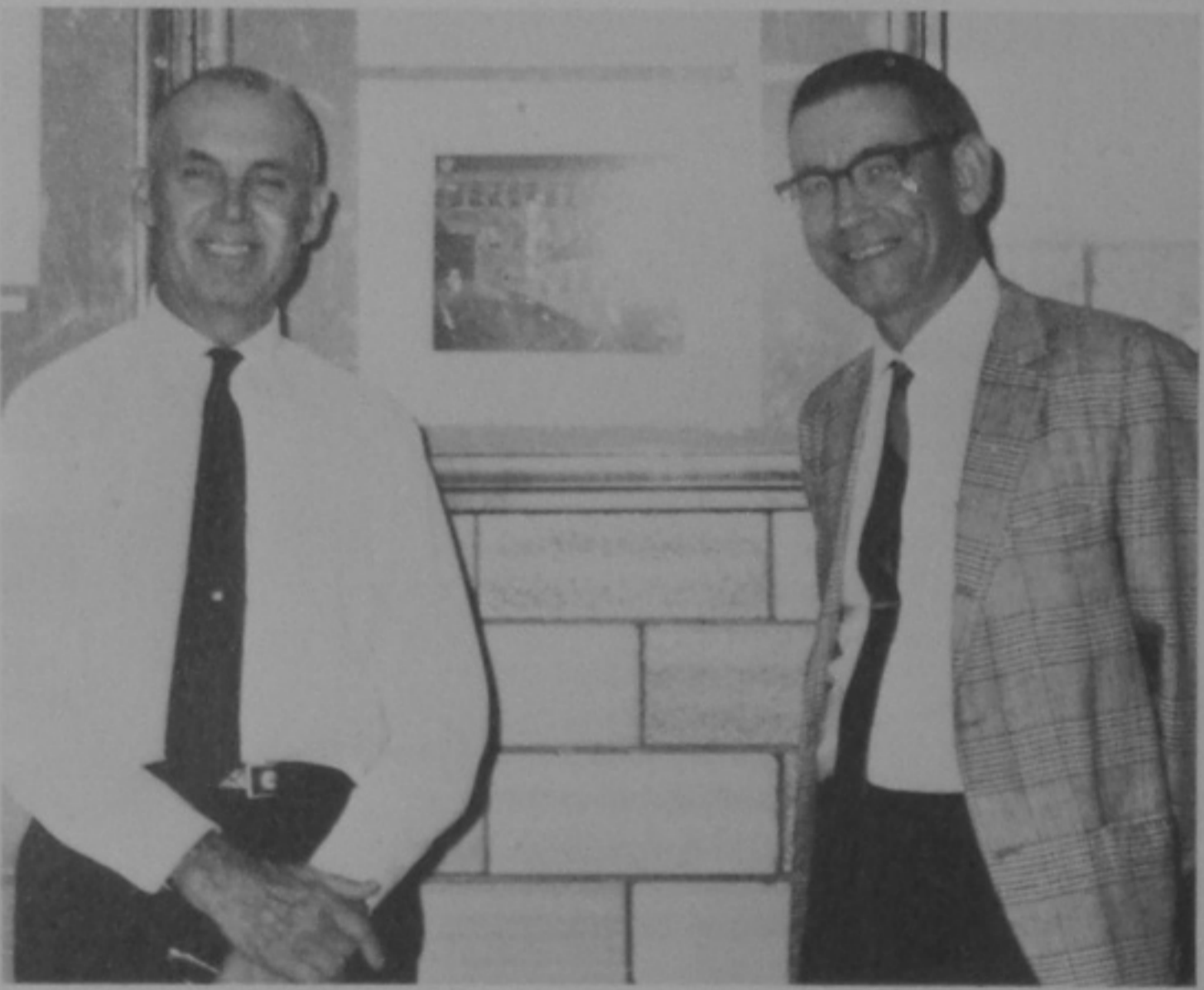
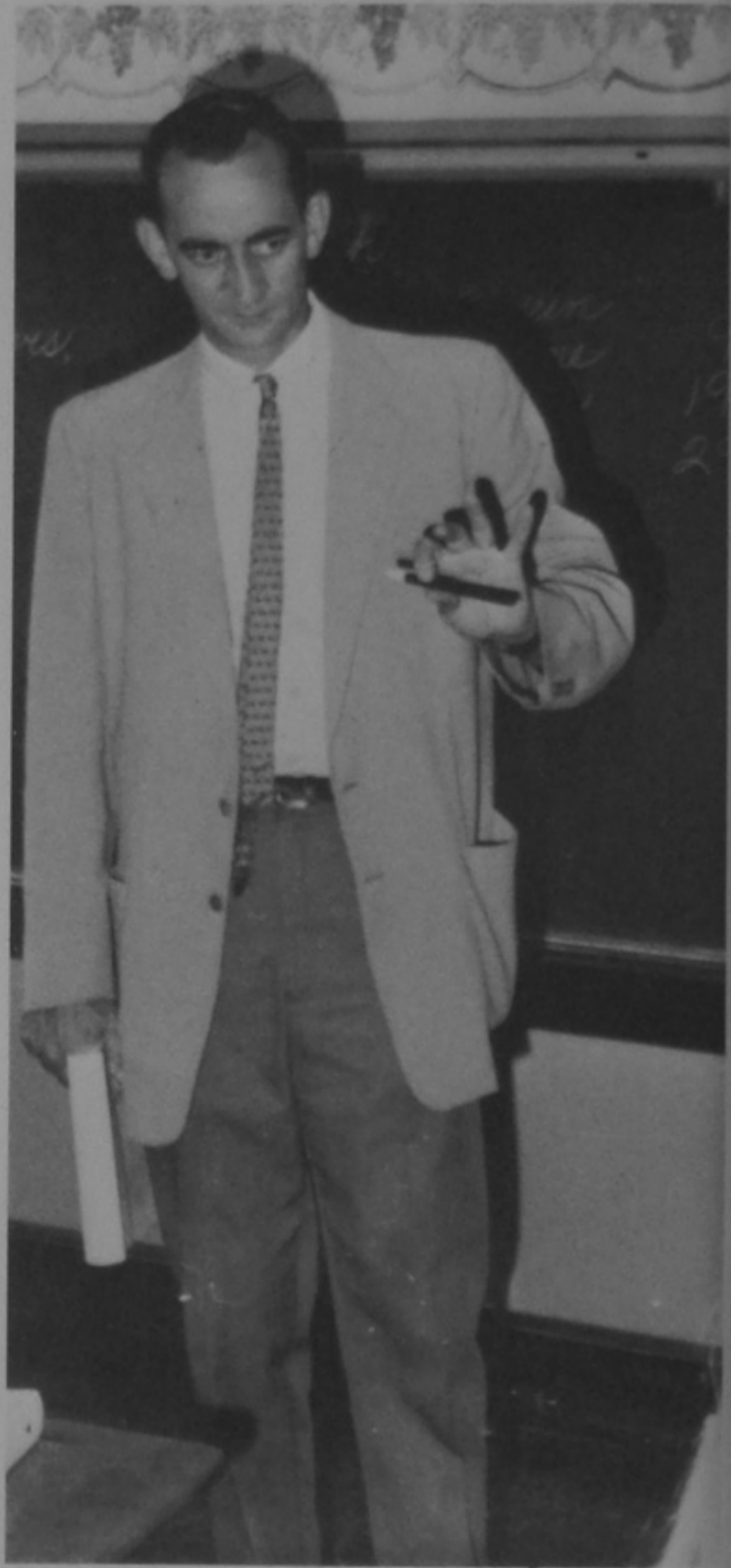

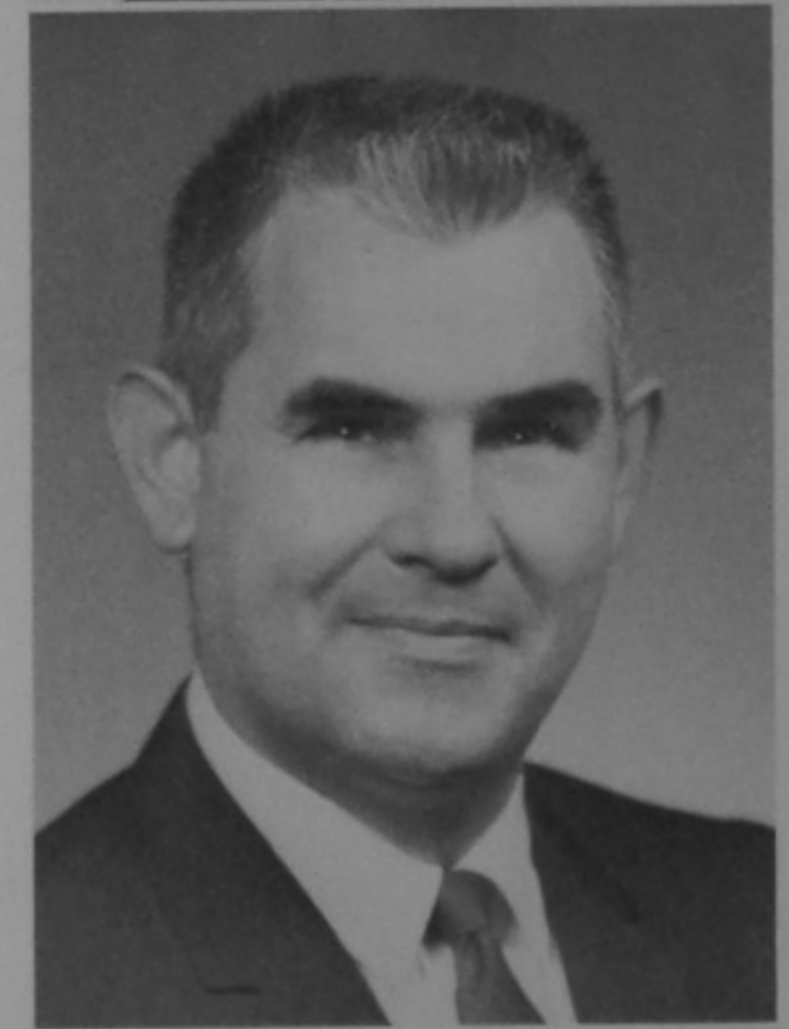

While it will provide the knowledge and work skills necessary for employment, it will also be more inclusive than training for job skills; it will develop the abilities, attitudes, work habits and appreciations which contribute to a satisfying and productive life. It will be a part of a well-rounded program of studies

aimed at developing qualified, efficient workers.

The Scioto County Joint Vocational School must prepare both youths and adults for employment, retrain them for different jobs and help them upgrade themselves from their present positions. These preparatory and retraining programs must provide the skills, knowledge and safety judgements necessary for occupations not requiring a college degree.

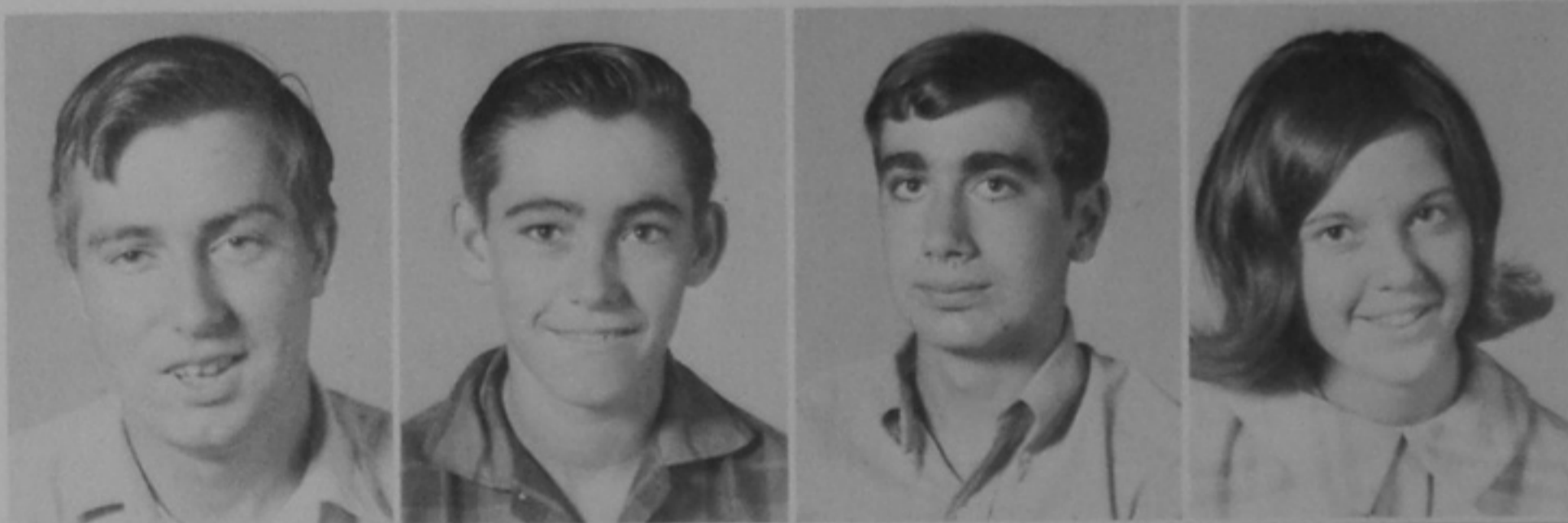

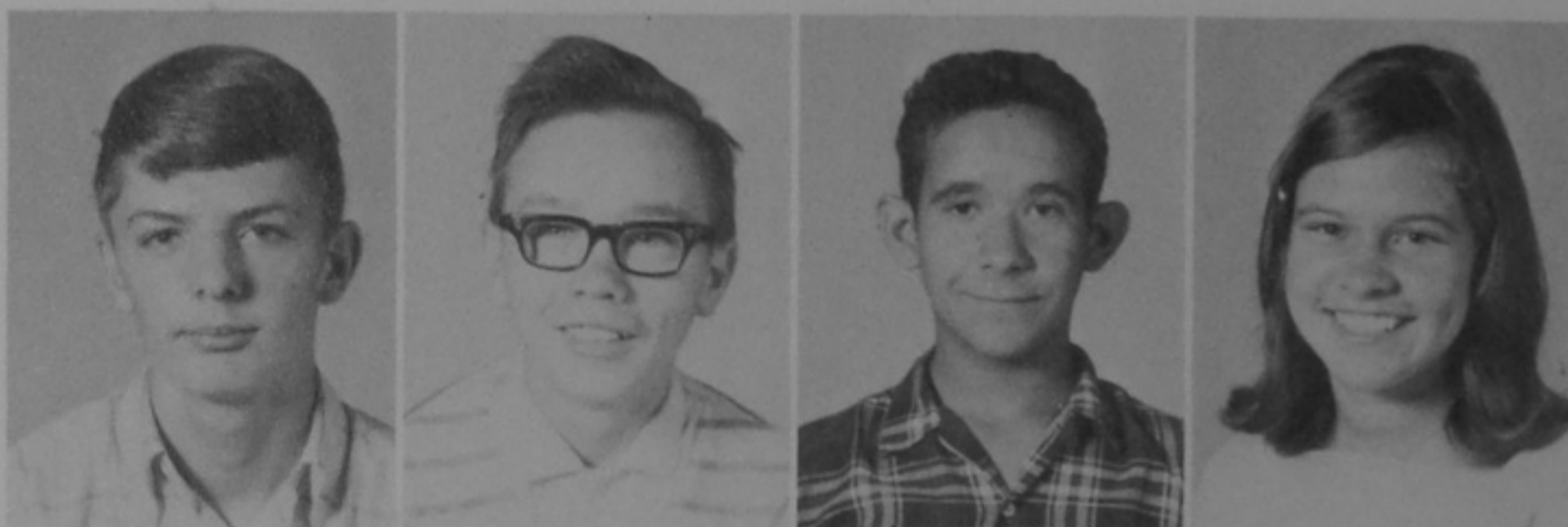
Sophomores
