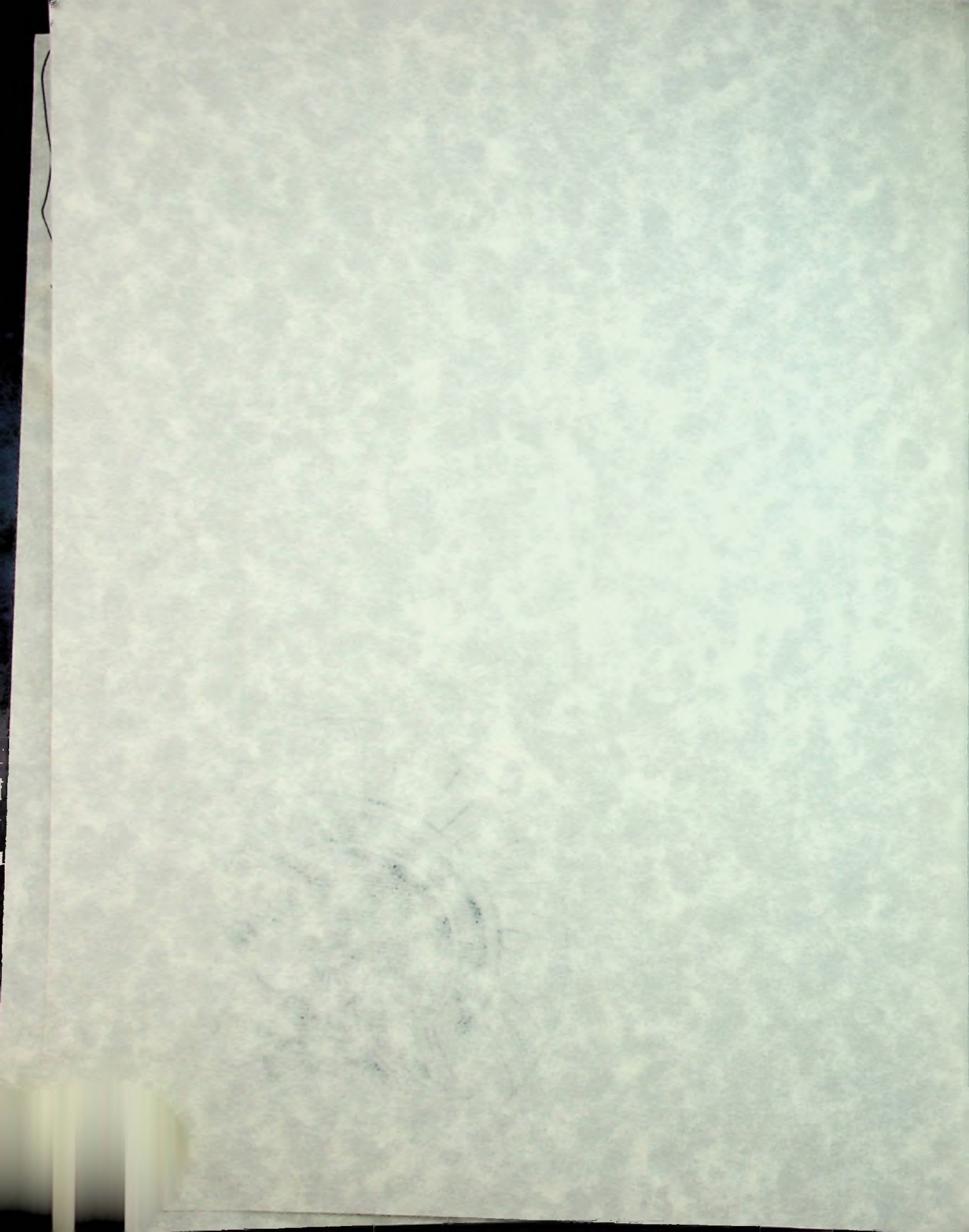

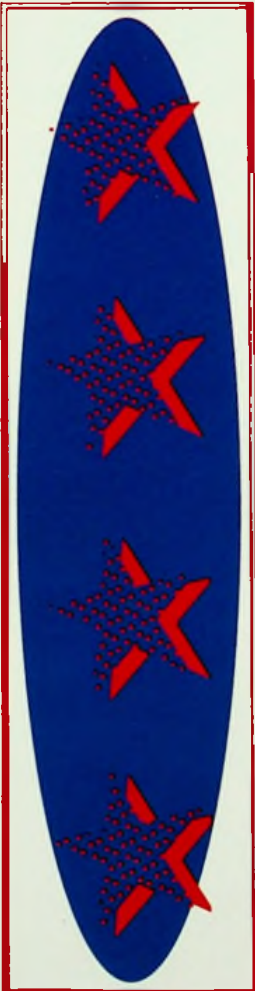

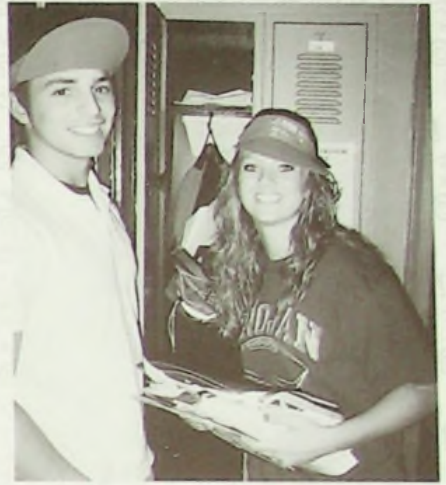

## River Days 2004

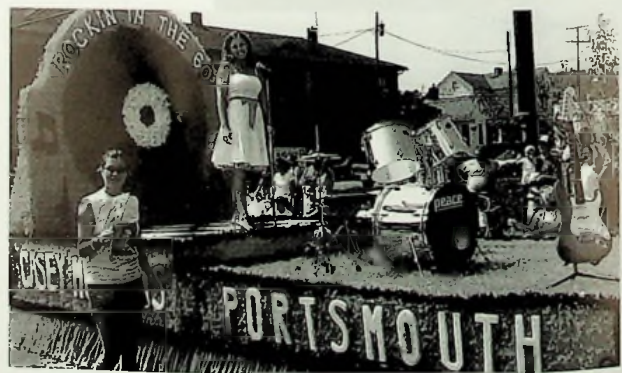

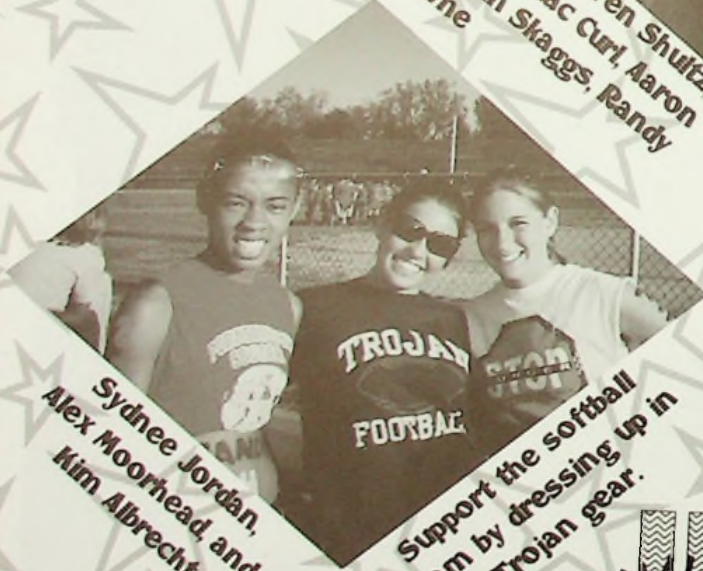

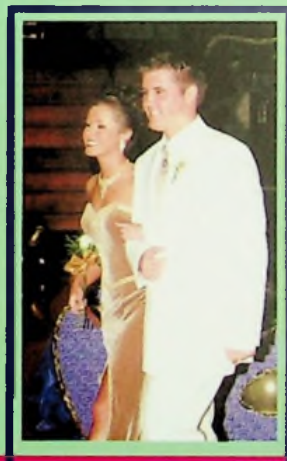

# Trojan Tabloid

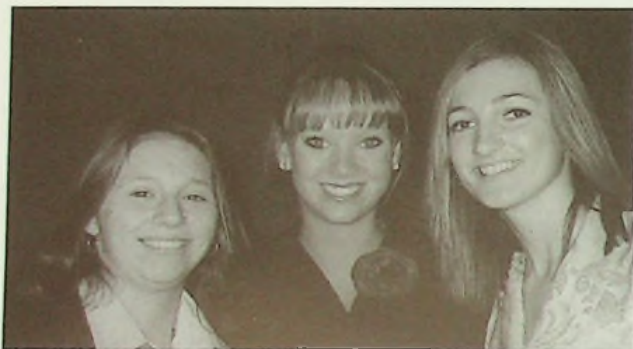

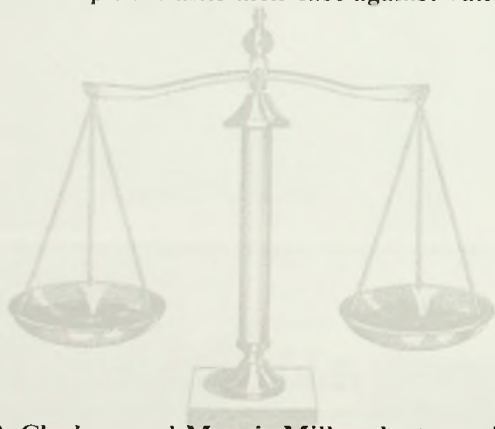

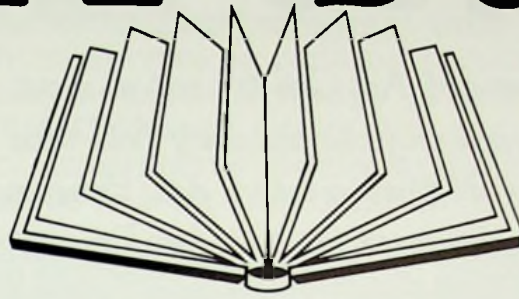

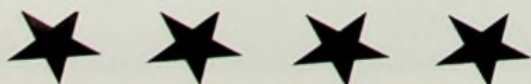

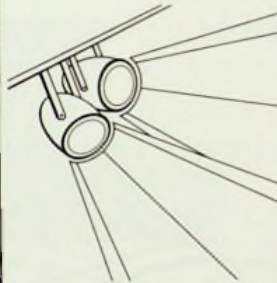

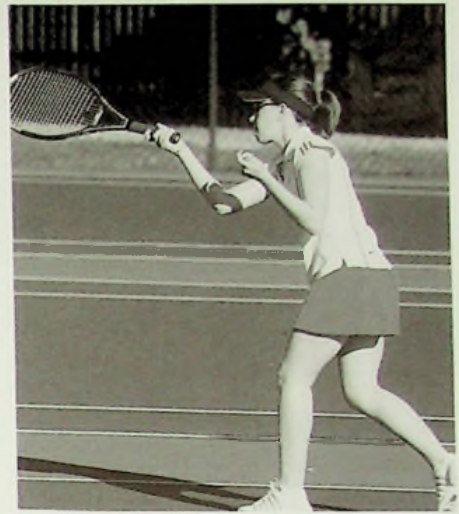

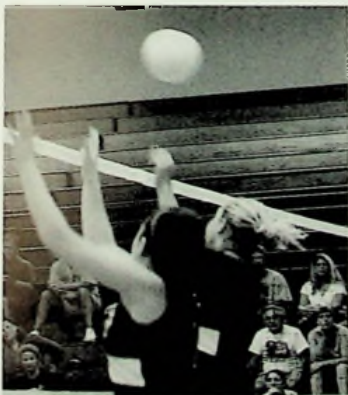

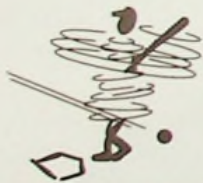

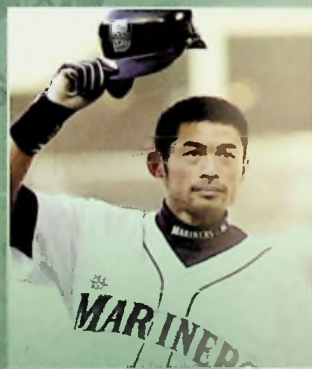
## IT'S HOW YOU PLAY THE GAME

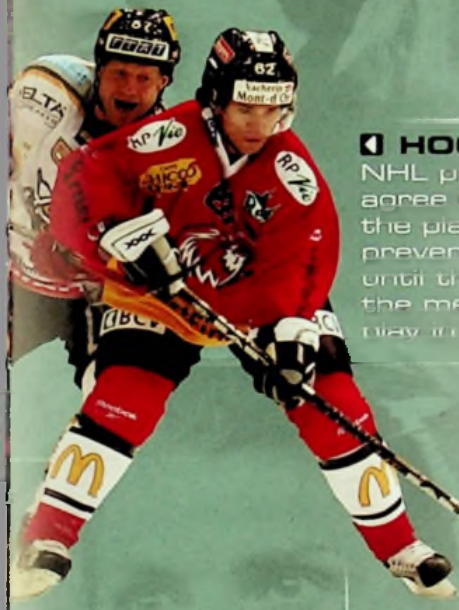
