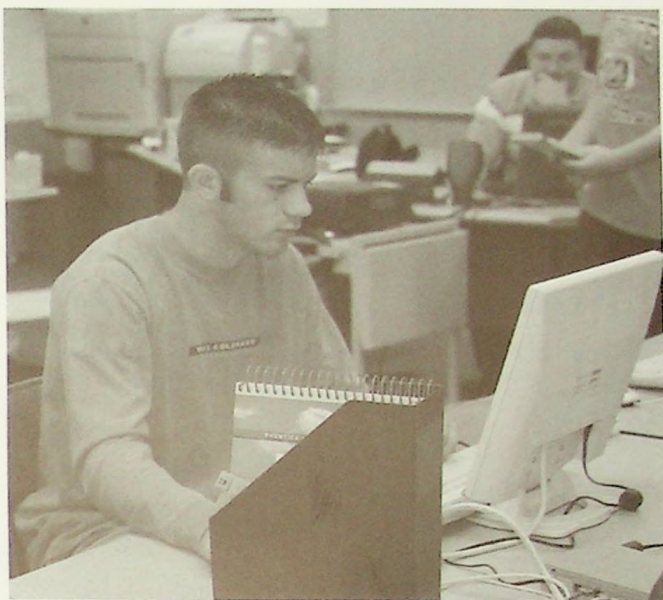

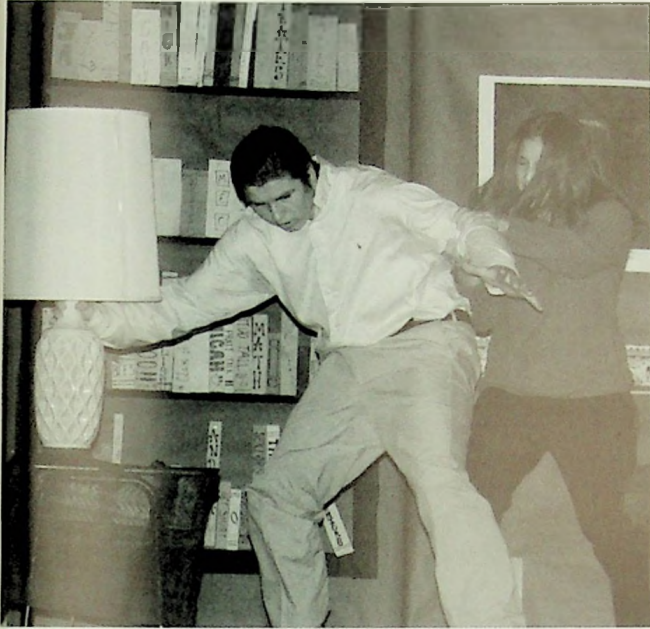

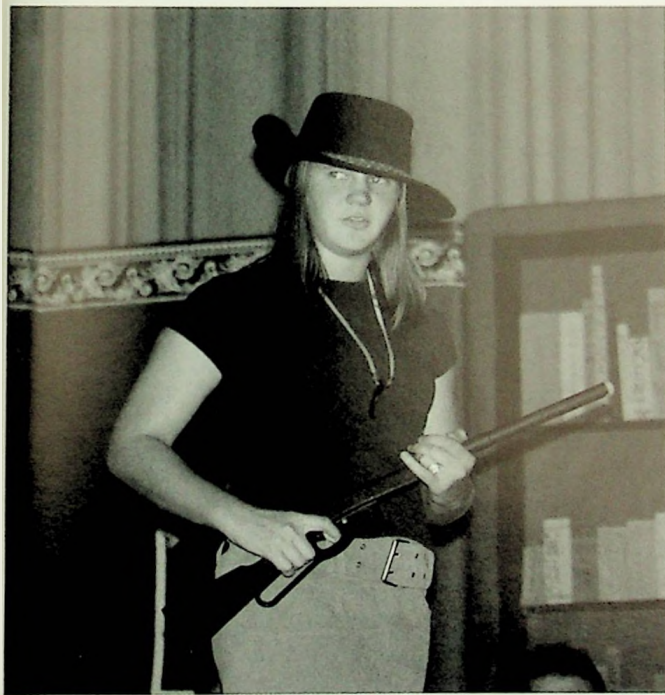

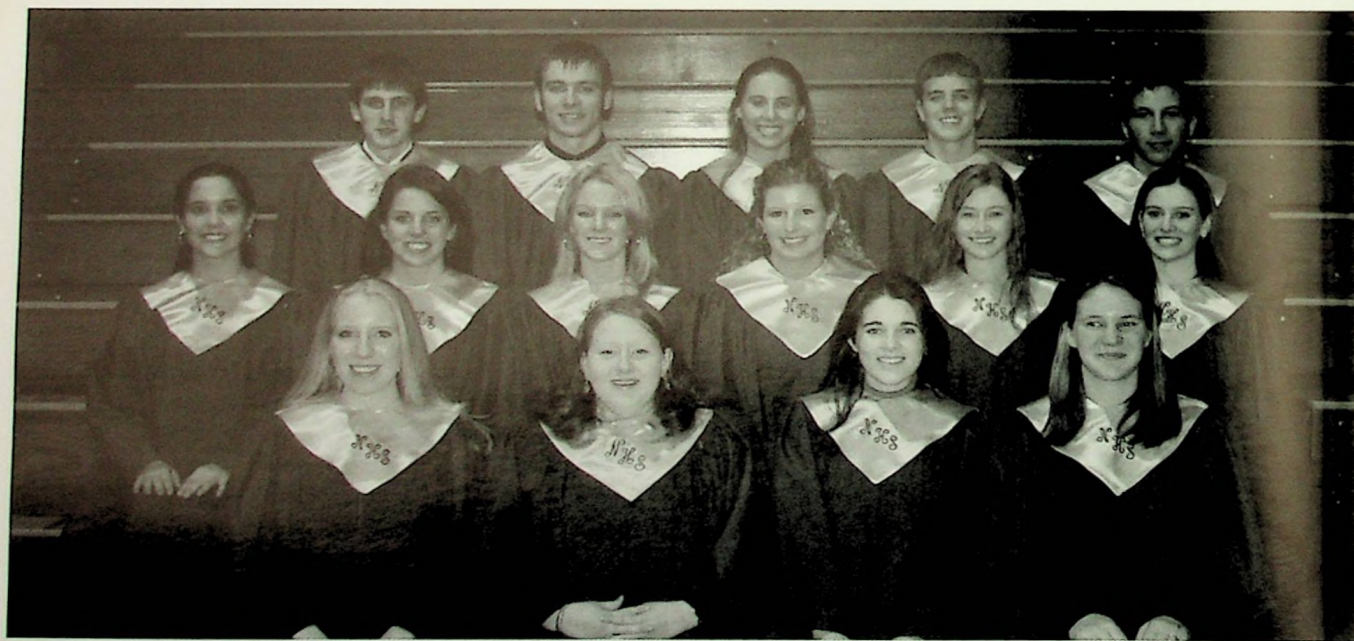

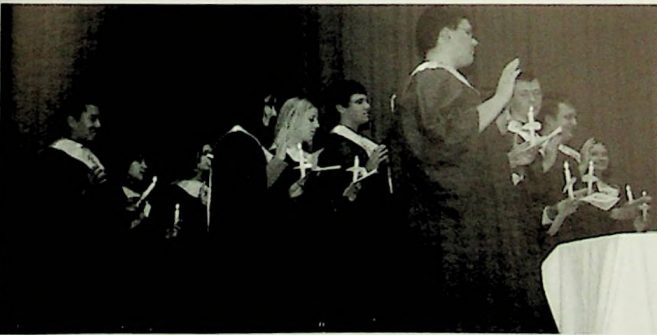

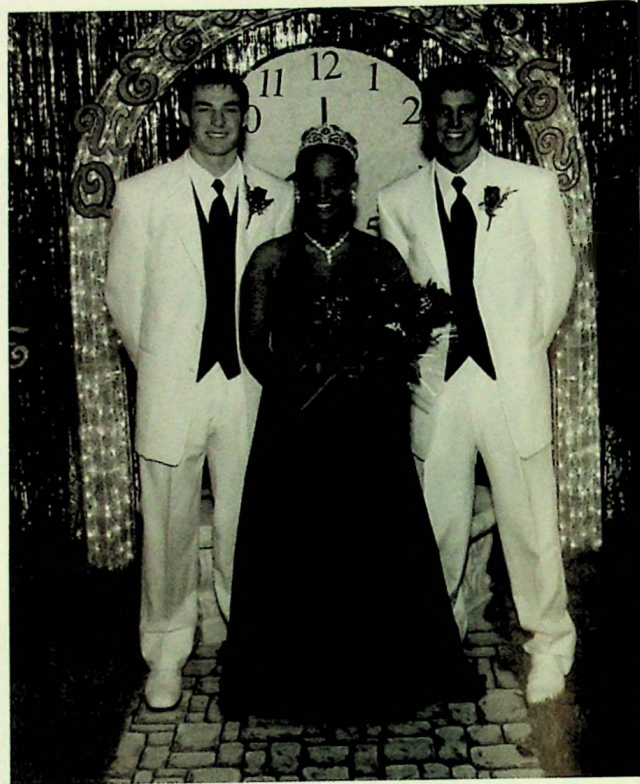

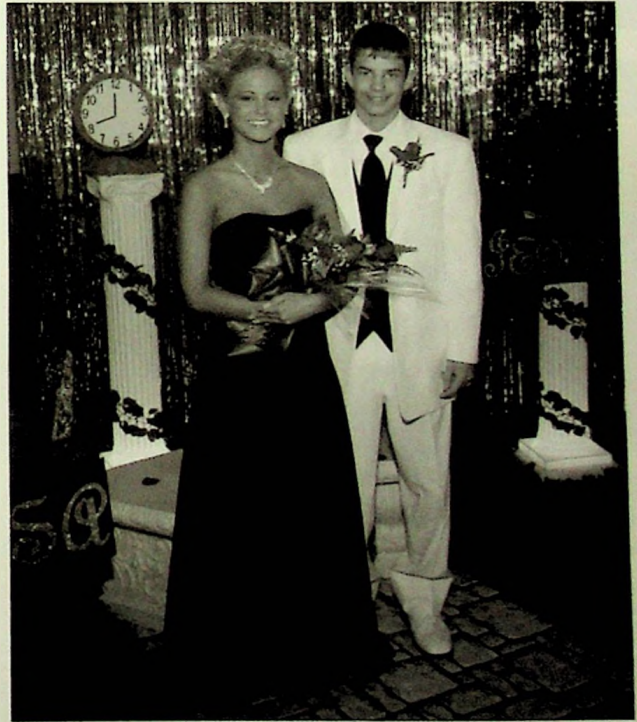

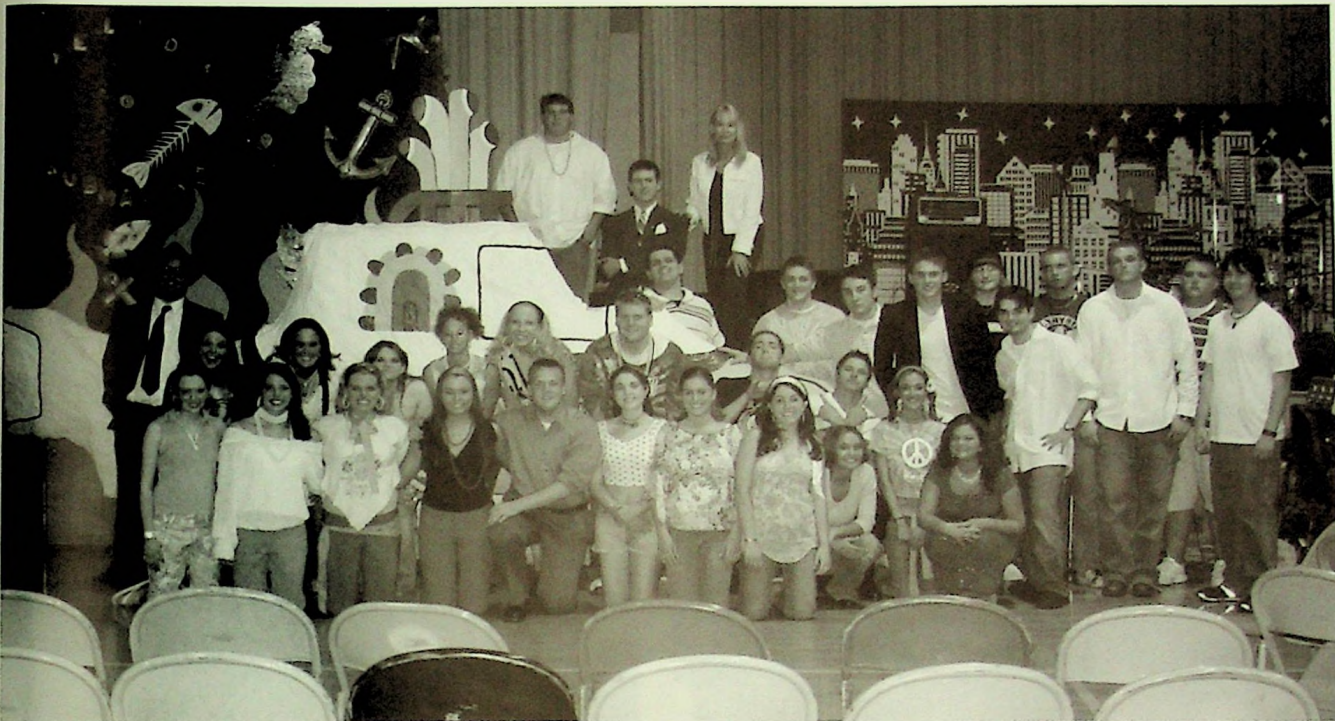

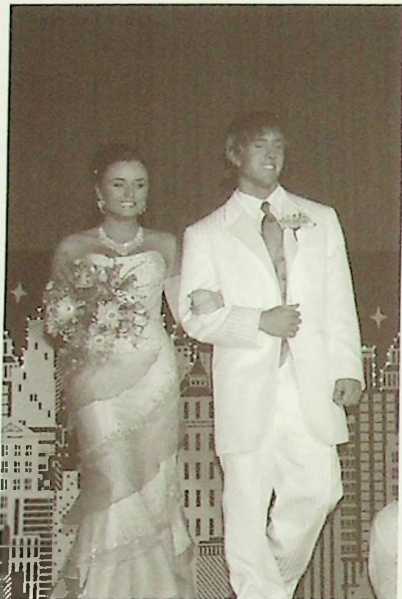

## A Night to Remember

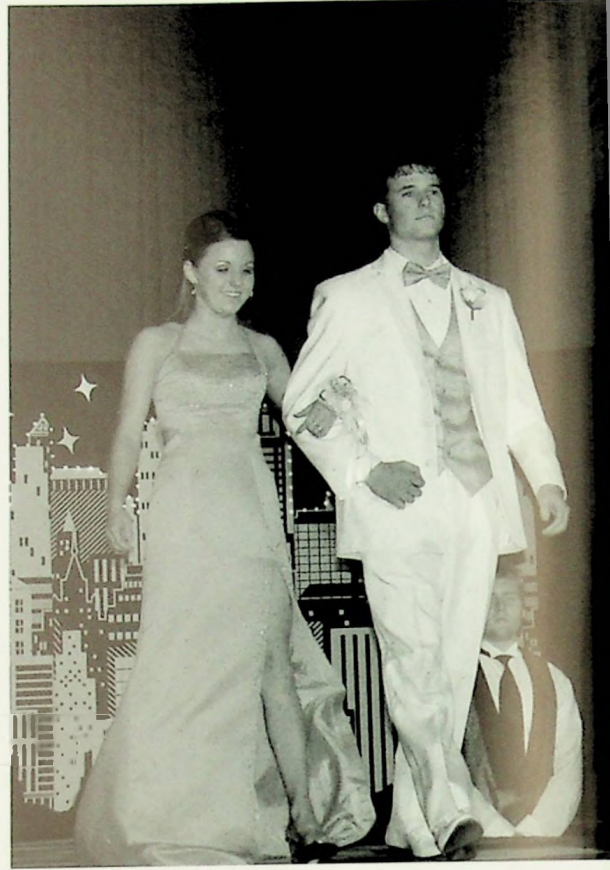

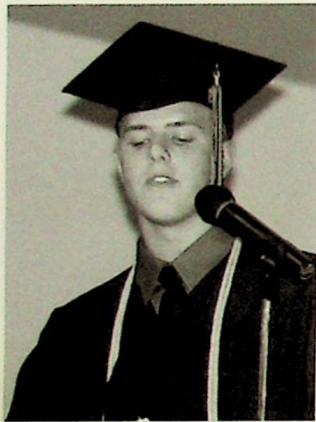

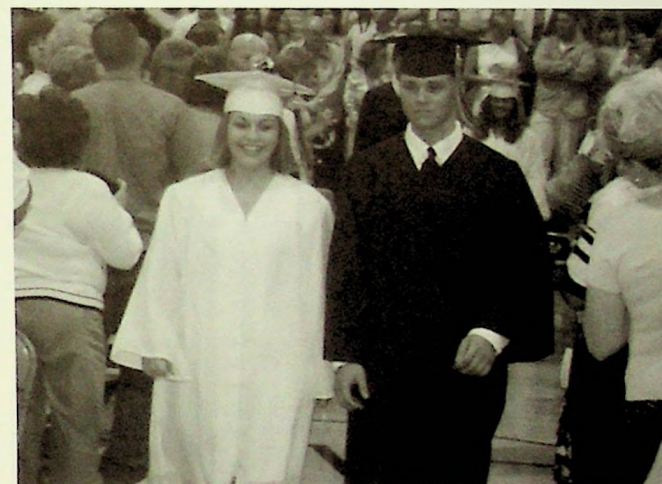

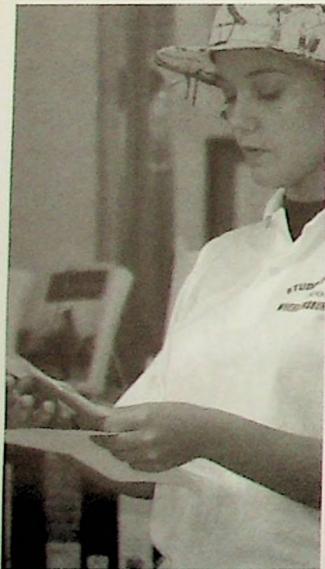


# Student Council

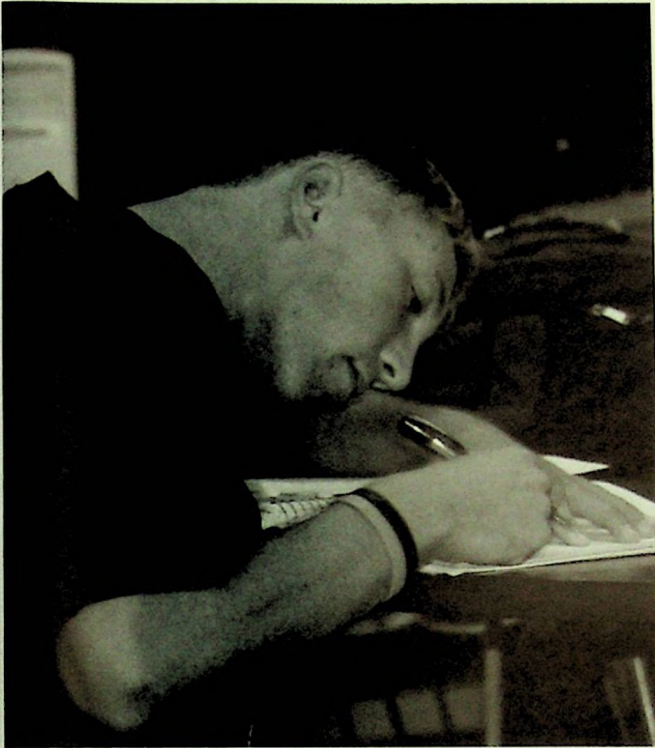
# Bible Club

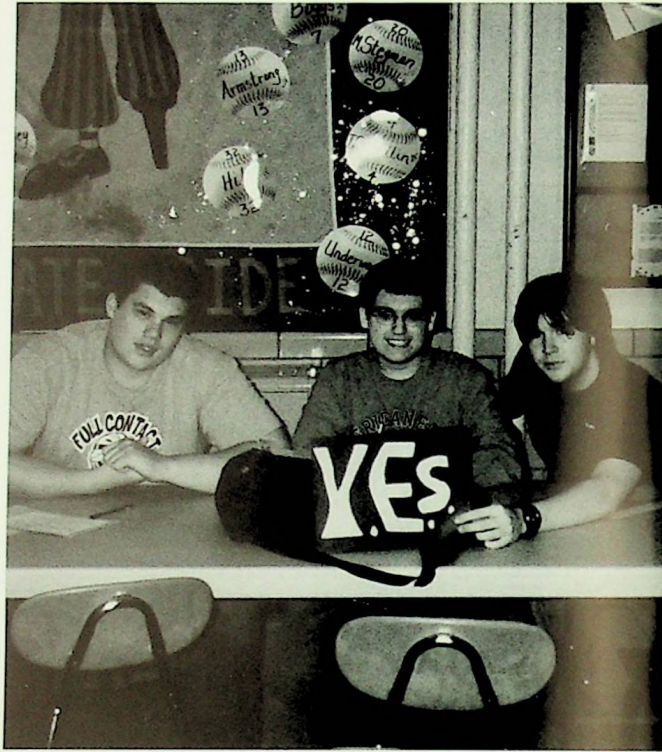

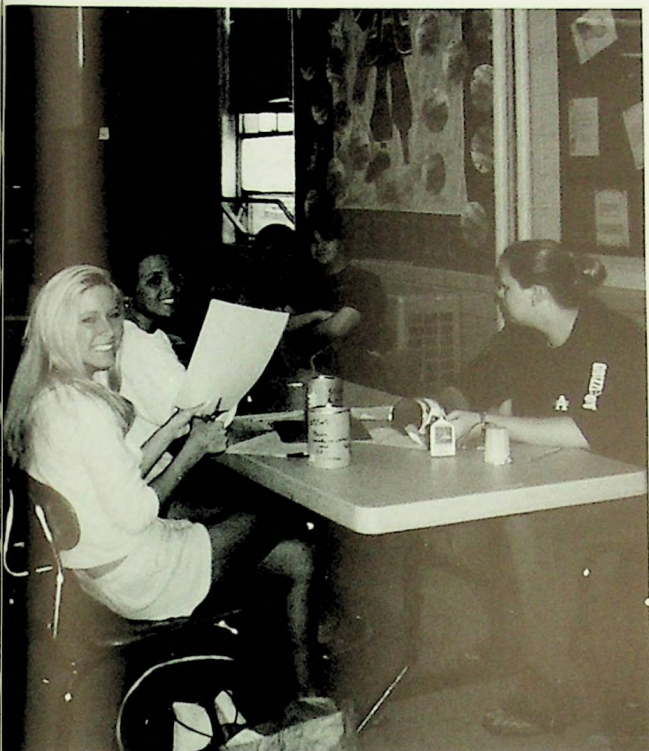
# Y.E.S.

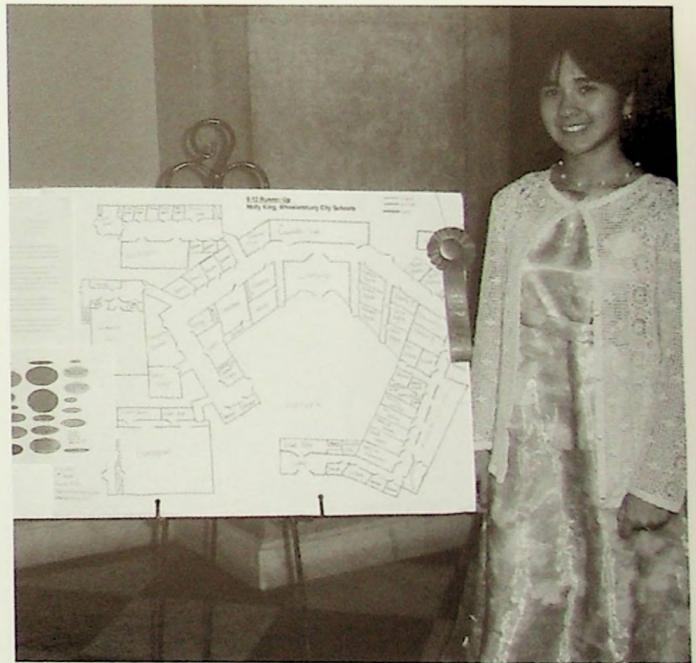
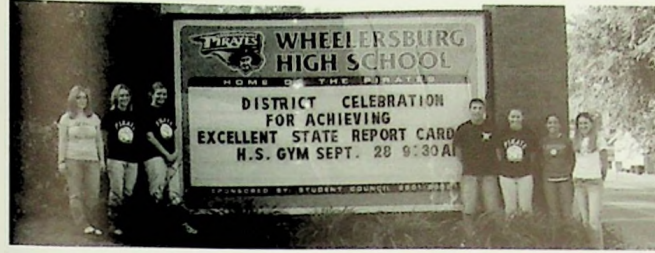

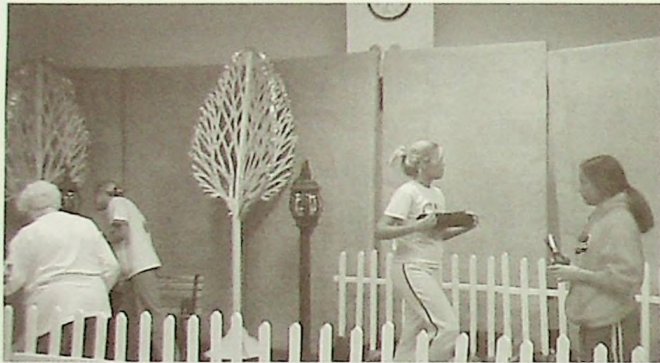

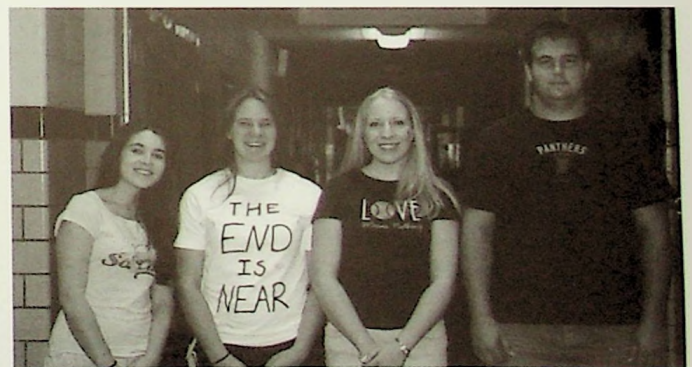
# Book Club

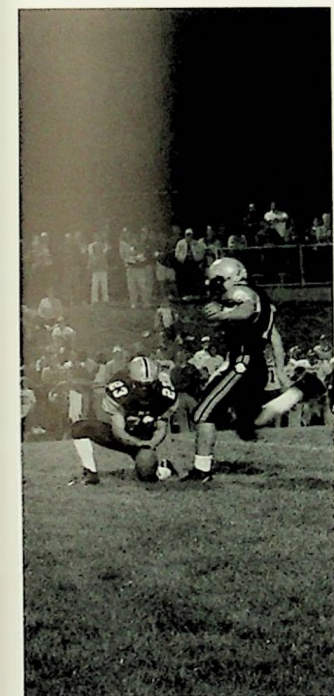

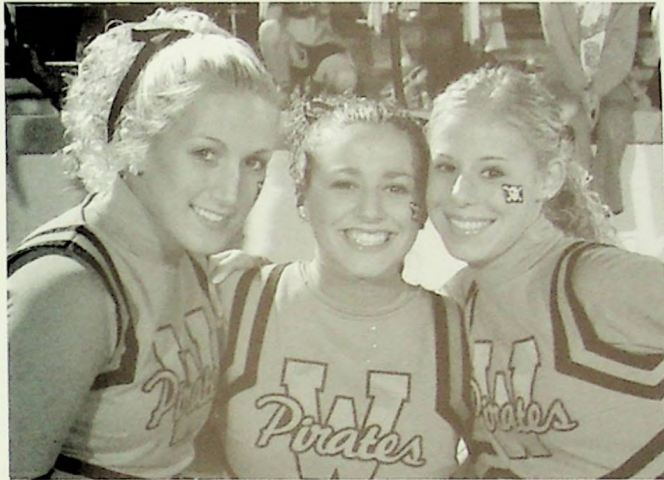

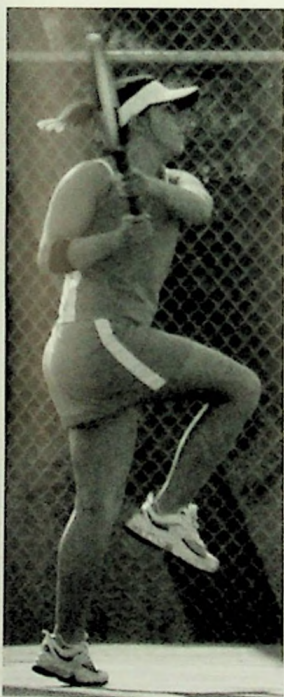

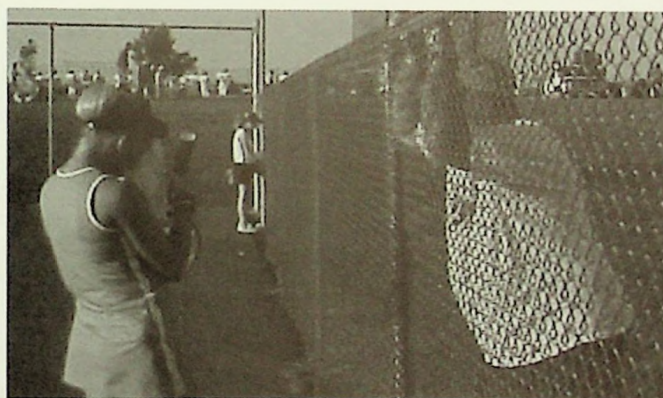

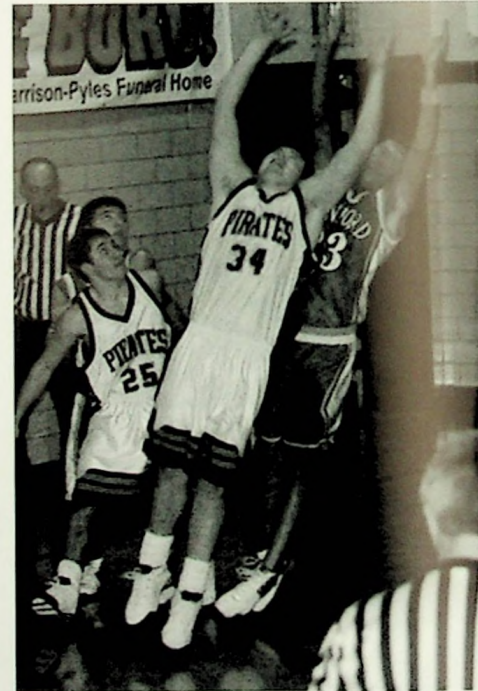

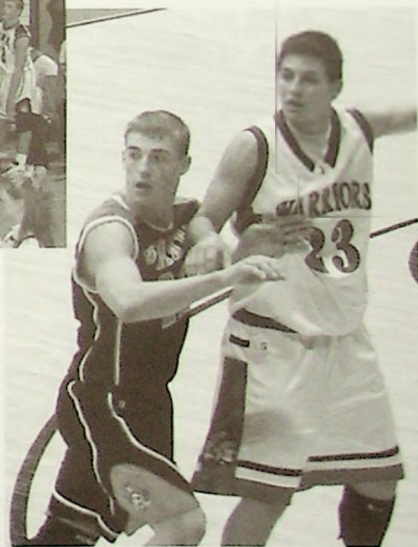

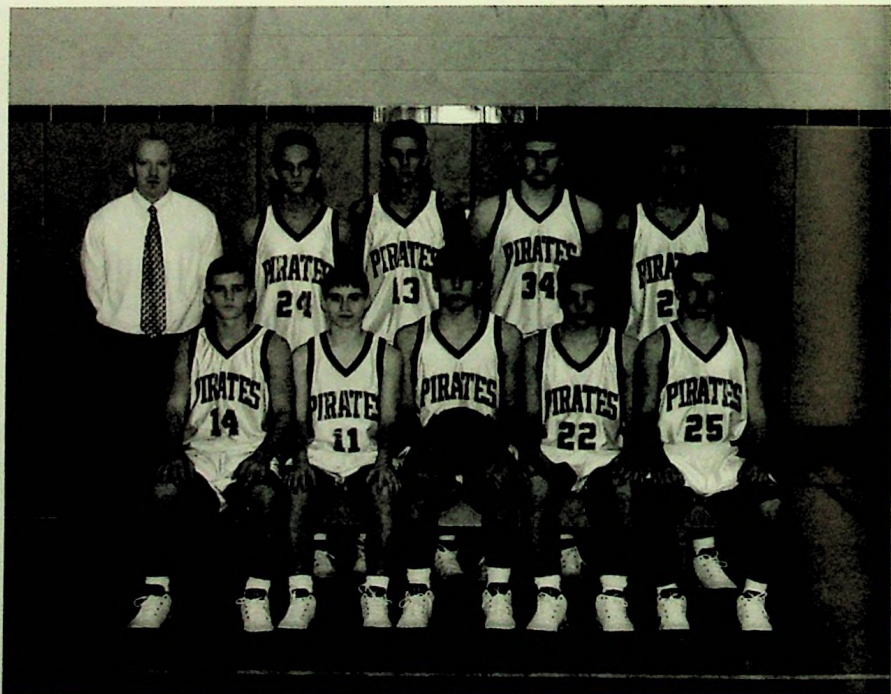

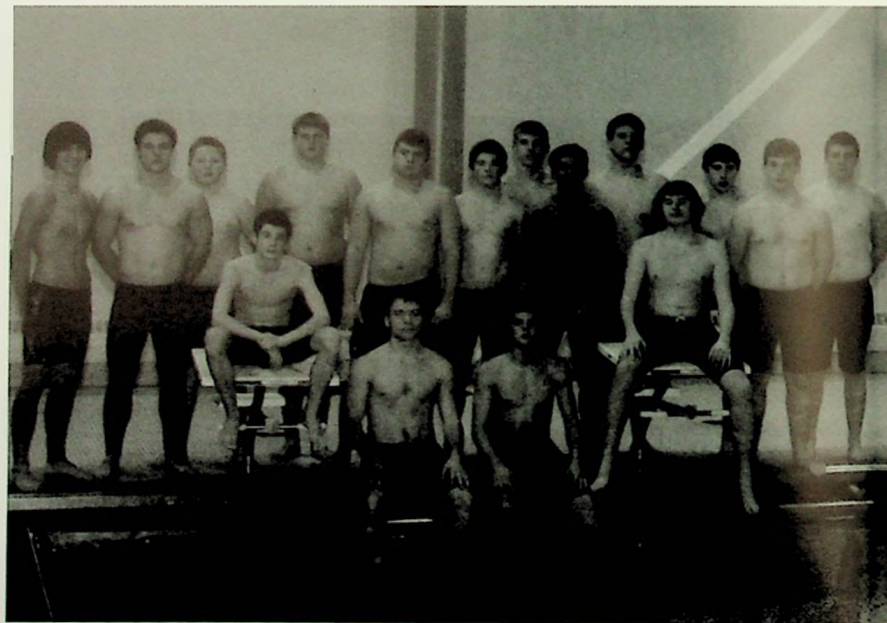
# S W I M

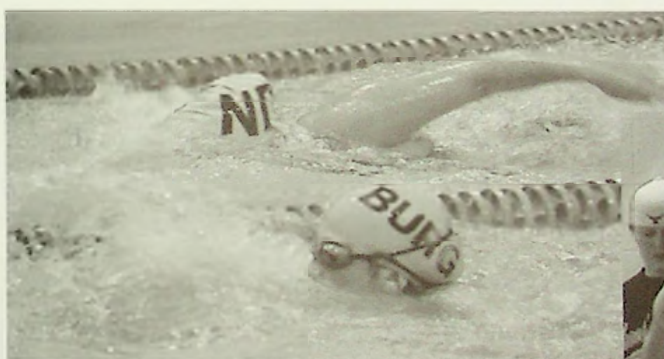

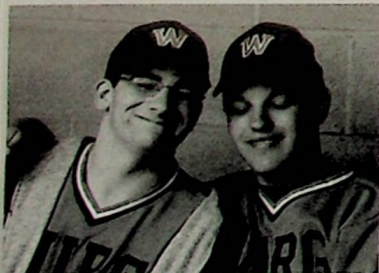

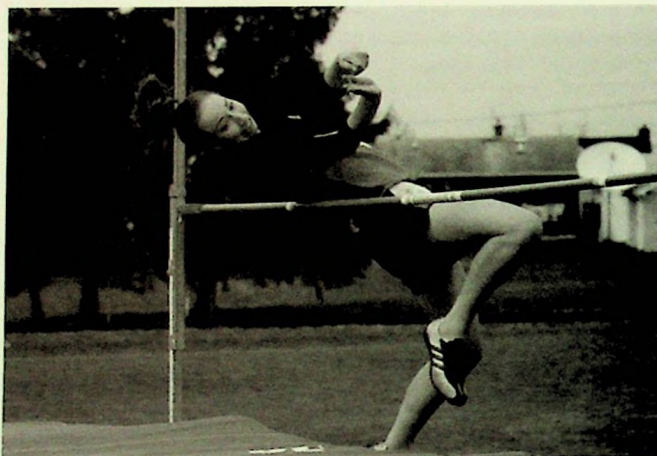

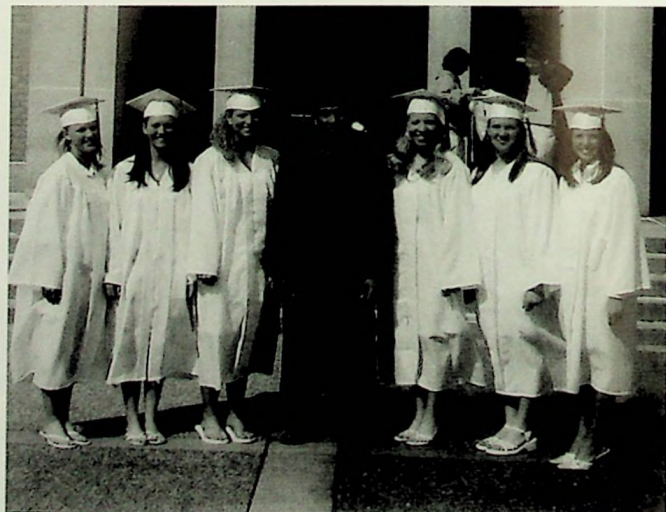
# Foreign Exchange Student
