


FOREWORD






Administration




C. H. DUDUIT



We concluded the year with a picnic at Lake White.

Our senior year, which began with an enrollment of forty-seven has been a busy one. Four seniors lettered in basketball this year, contributing greatly to the winning of the Scioto County league. All of our activities were pursued with the help of our sponsor, Mr. Warren, and our class officers, Don Miller, Bob Klingman, Phyllis Lang, and Juanita Weidner. The annual has been published by the seniors with the help of four juniors and four sponsors. We enjoyed a trip through the Portsmouth Steel Mill and climaxed our Senior year by a picnic.

We will always be grateful to our parents for providing us with the opportunity to receive a high school education, and to our teachers for the patience and consideration they have shown throughout the years we were with them. Our faith in our homes and our school is the basis of the confidence with which we face the future.


PRINCE OF PEACE DECLAMATION CONTEST
