
IS HARD WORK OUT OF DATE?

Such a program must be coordinated and systematized with other existing school developments. It must be planned for a long range.

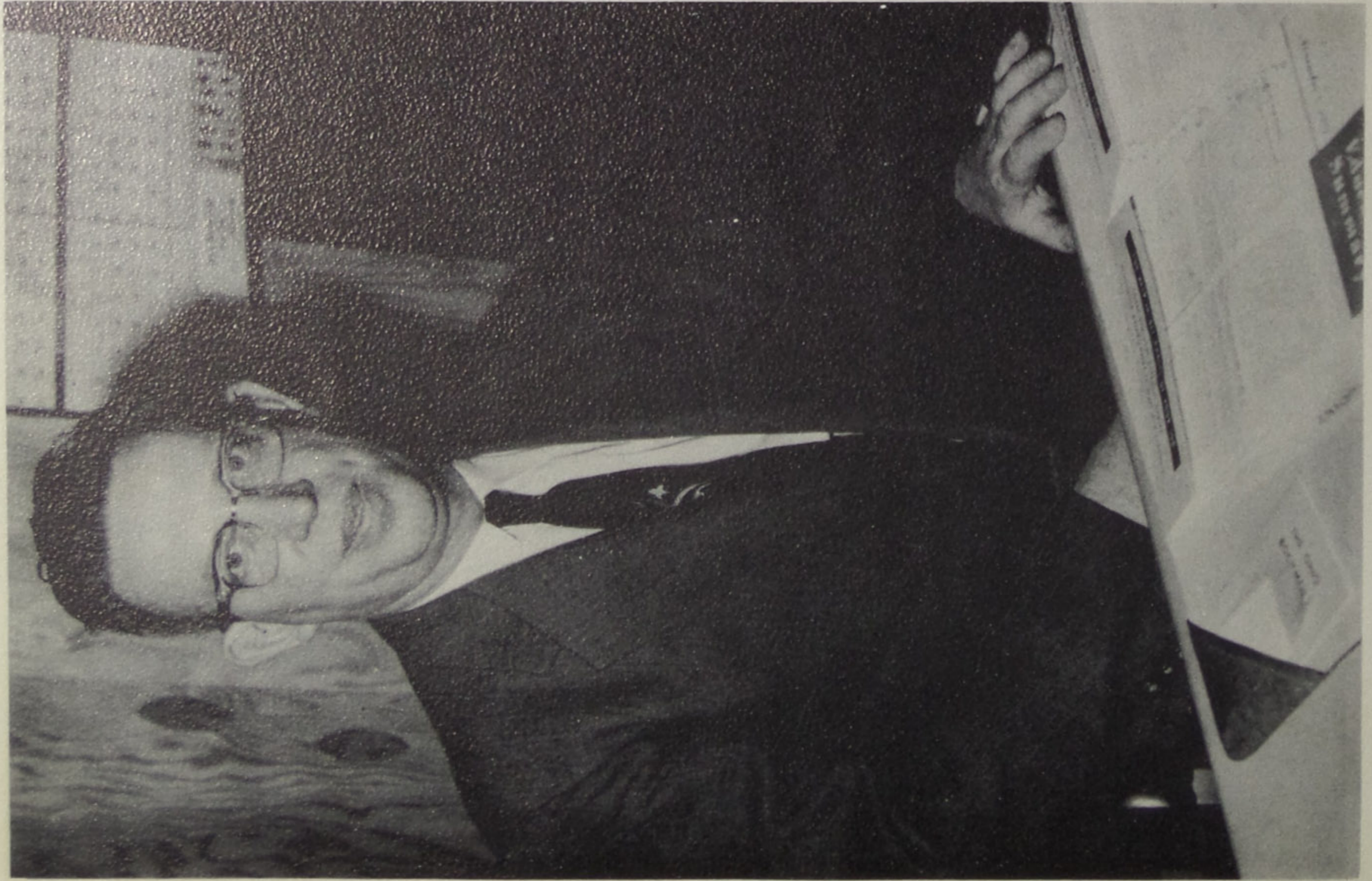
We shall initiate new services and strengthen existing ones in our school system. The following is a list of services centralized in the Guidance Counseling Program:

9. In School Service.





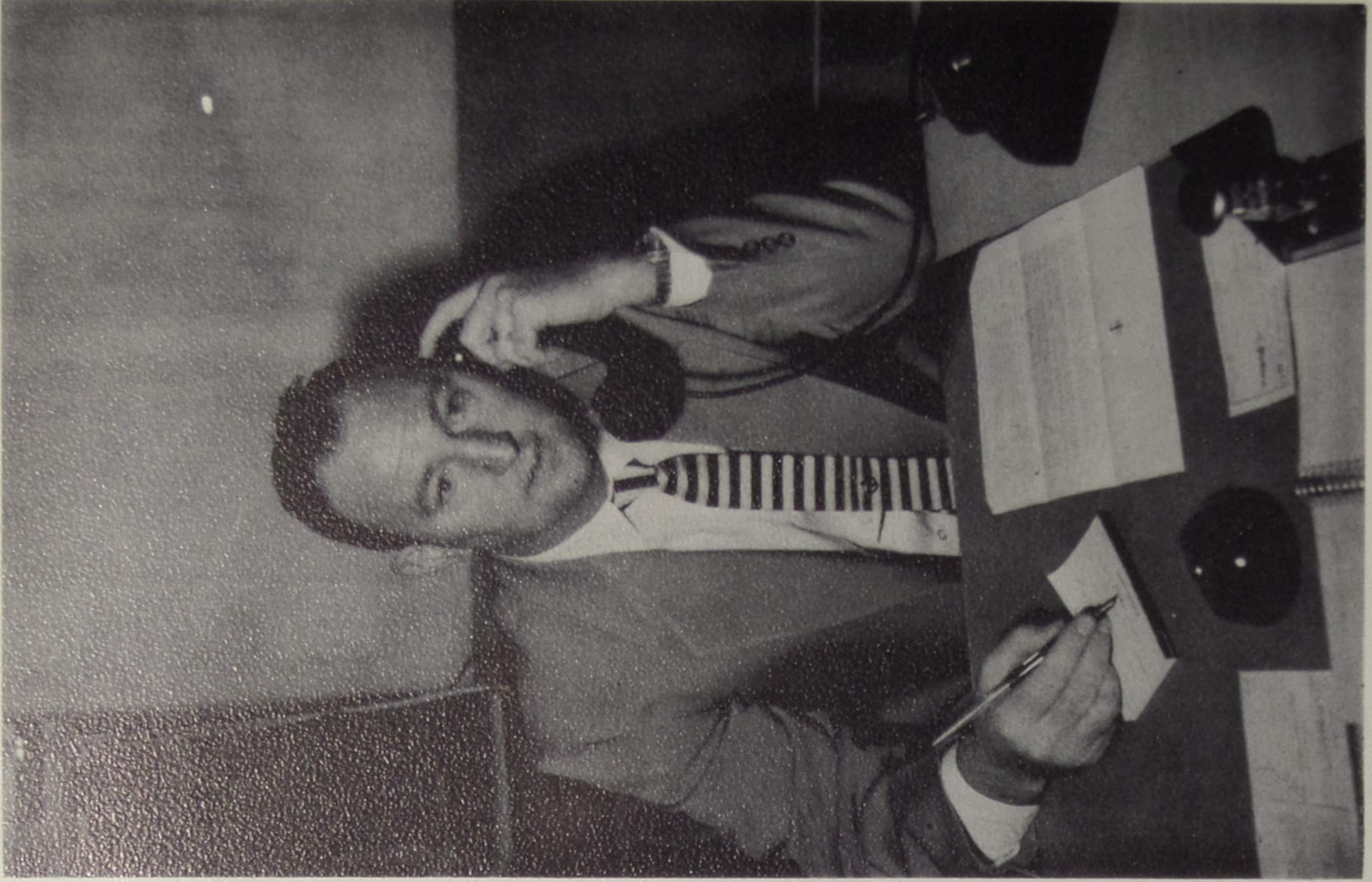

The Student Council is composed of representatives from home rooms elected by members therein. Class presidents are automatically seated. This year there were 21 members in the Student Council.

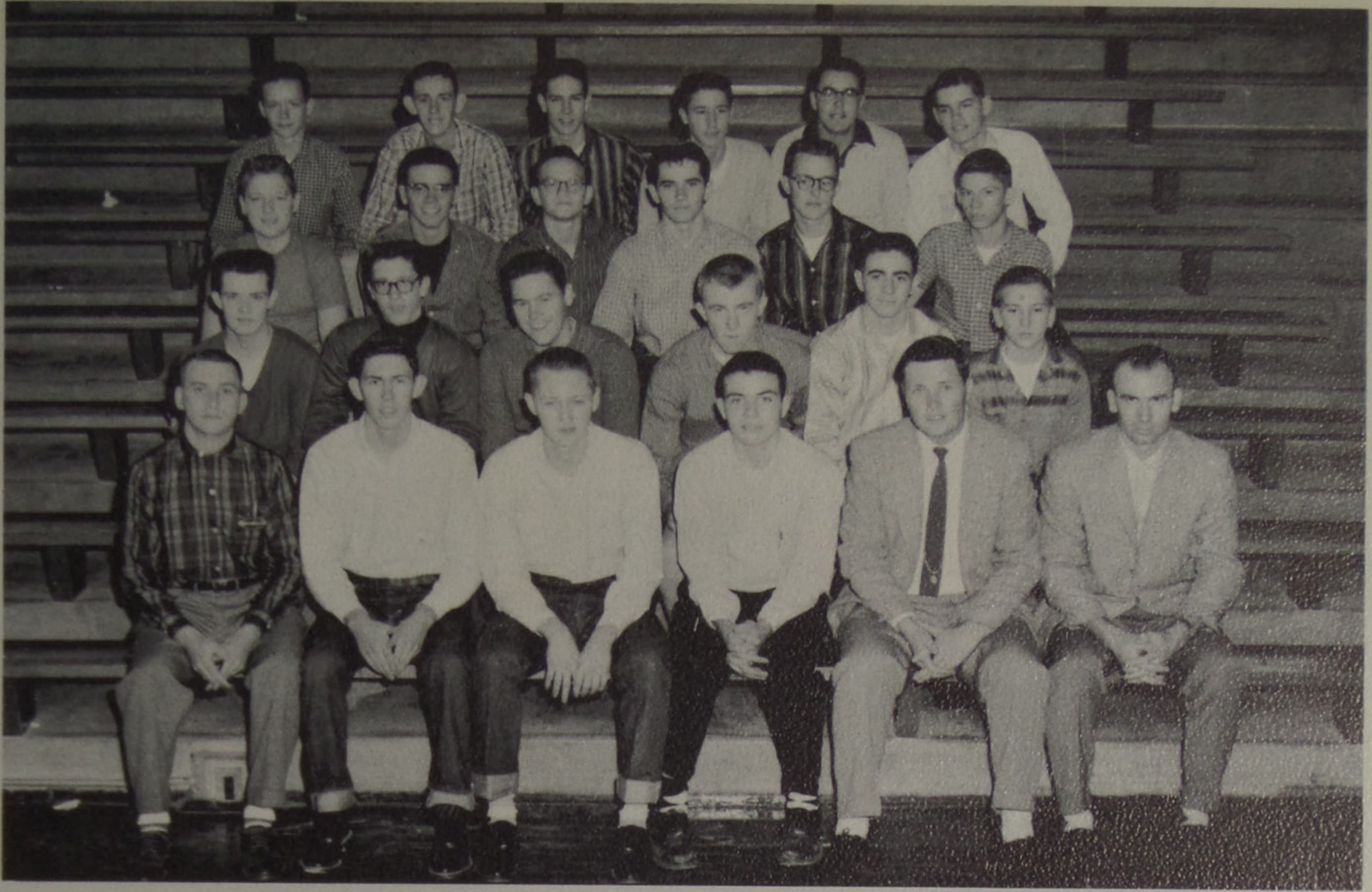
