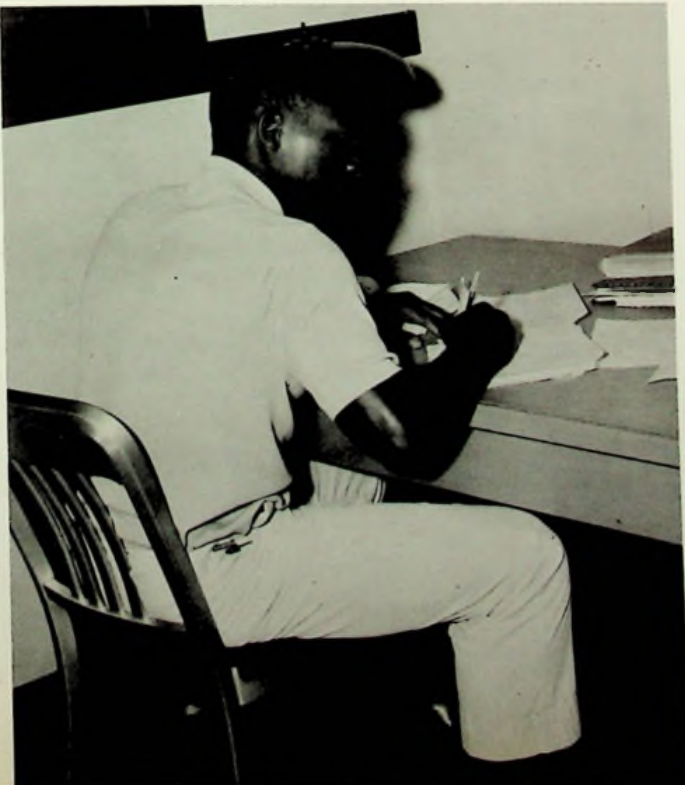

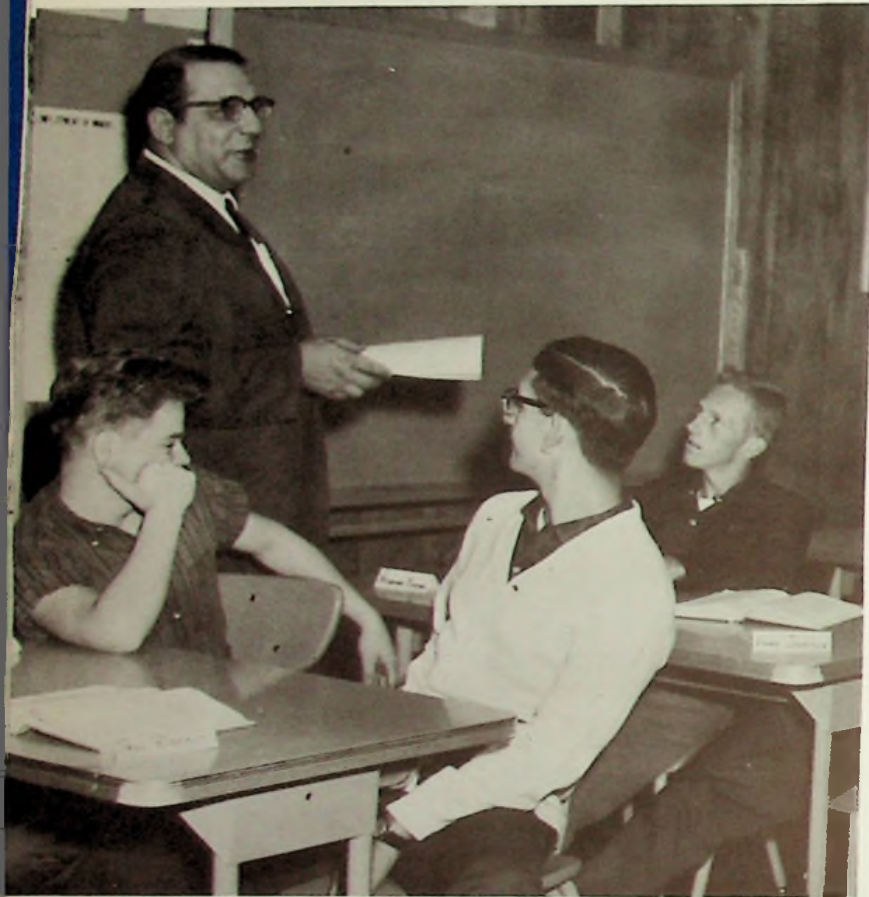

When the Portsmouth High School students heard the historic news of the assassination of President John Fitzgerald Kennedy on Friday, November 22, 1963, silence swept through the school. Within the hour, the stunned students filed out of the school, each going home to mourn the tragic loss in his own way. On Monday, November twenty-fifth, the students returned to school, briefly, for a Memorial Service.



"I LOOK FORWARD to a great future for America—a future in which our country will match its military strength with our moral restraint, its wealth with our wisdom, its power with our purpose.

"I look forward to an America which will not be afraid of grace and beauty, which will protect the beauty of our natural environment, which will preserve the great old American houses and squares and parks of our national past and which will build handsome and balanced cities for our future.

"I look forward to an America which will reward achievement in the arts as we reward achievement in business or statecraft.

"I look forward to an America which will steadily raise the standards of artistic accomplishment and which will steadily enlarge cultural opportunities for all of our citizens.

"And I look forward to an America which commands respect throughout the world not only for its strength but for its civilization as well.

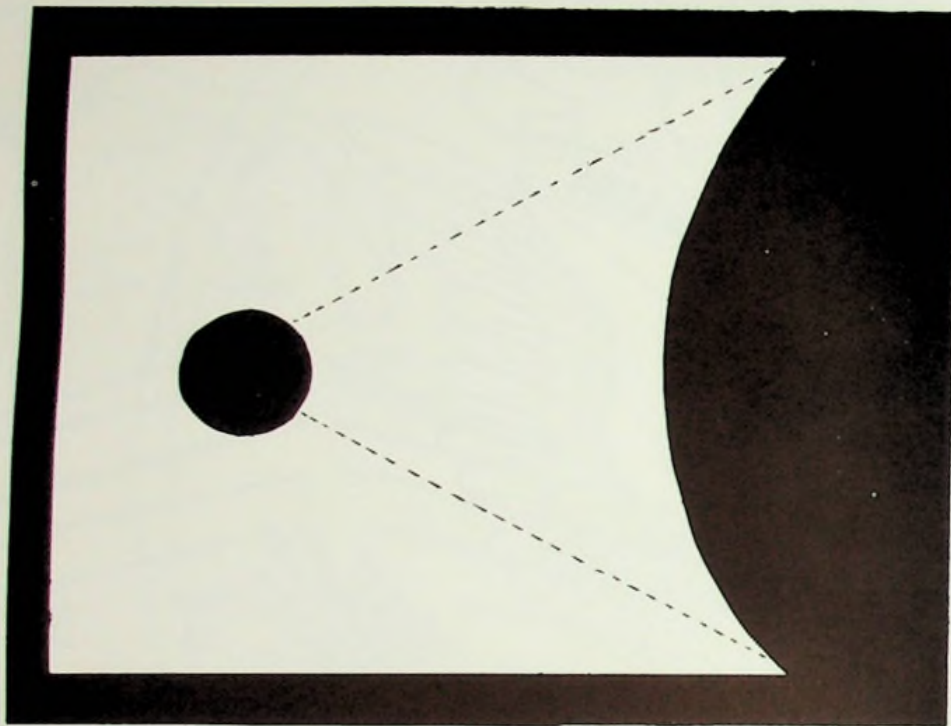

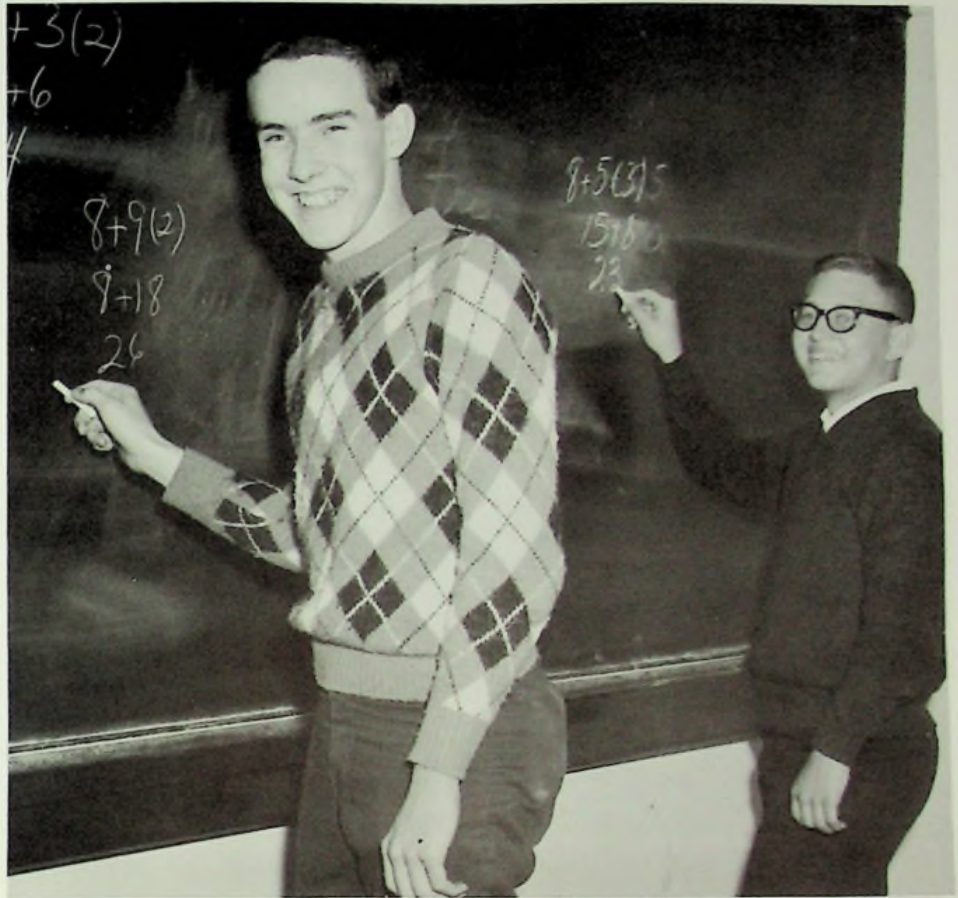

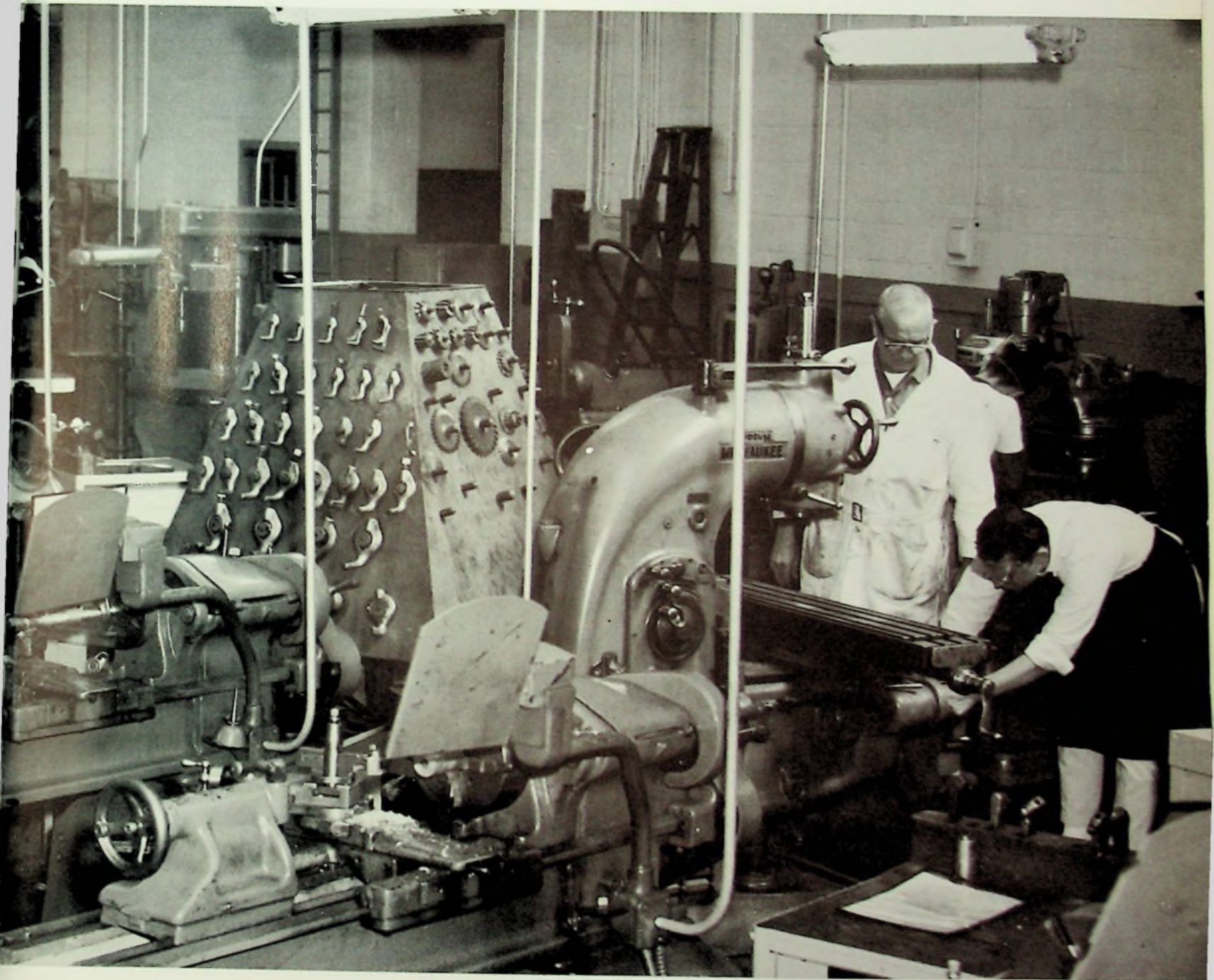
Trade and Industrial Education is a modern educational program which has for one of its direct objectives the preparing of high school students for entrance into specific trades or occupations to be found within the area serviced by the educational system.

Three hours each day are spent in the "shop" of the student's choice where the correct use of hand and machine tools are taught. Approximately thirty per cent of the student's time in school each day is devoted to the study of trade technology which includes shop mathematics, science, blueprint reading, sketching, and trade information. Also, one period each day is spent in English or American History and Civics.

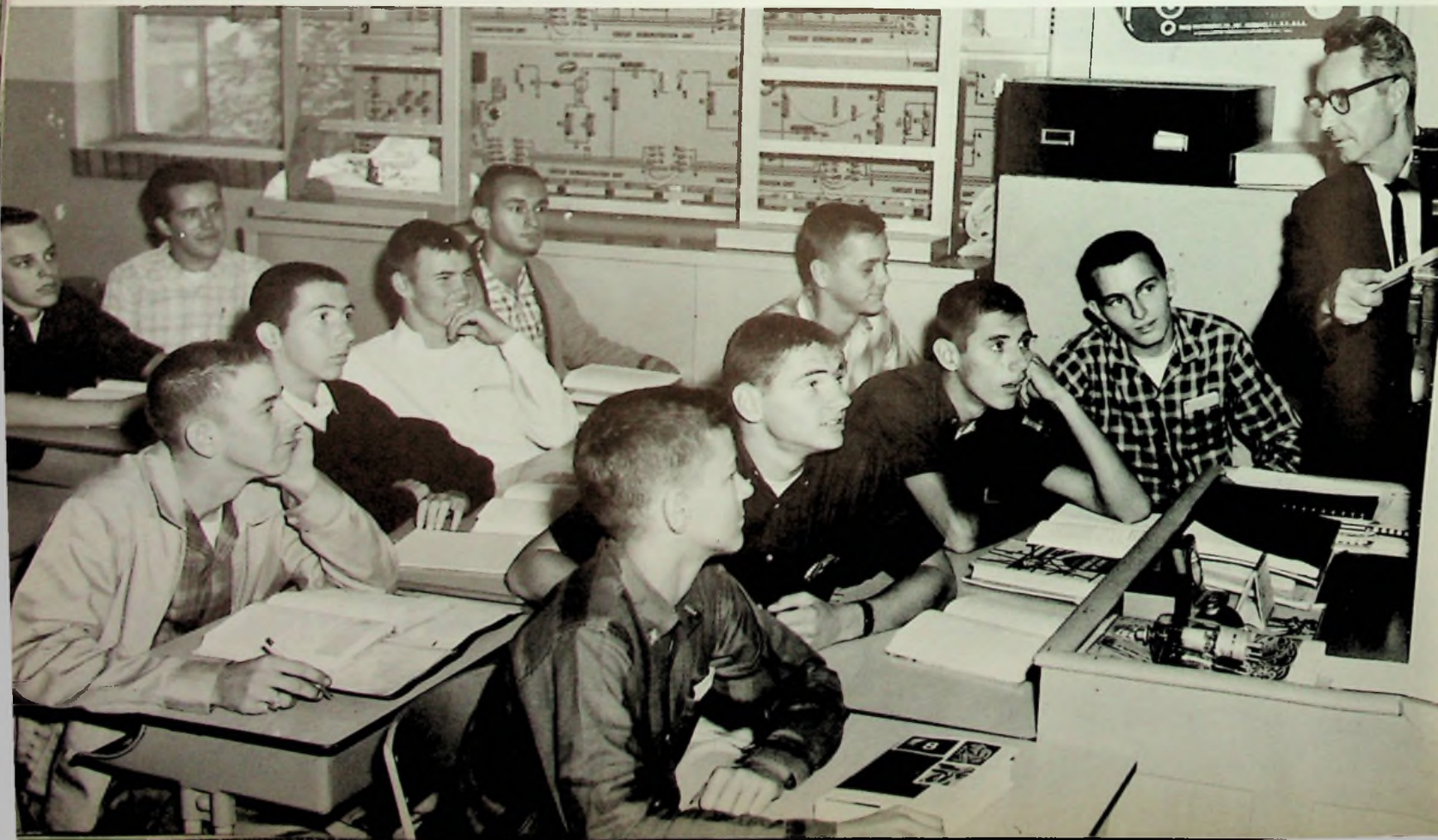

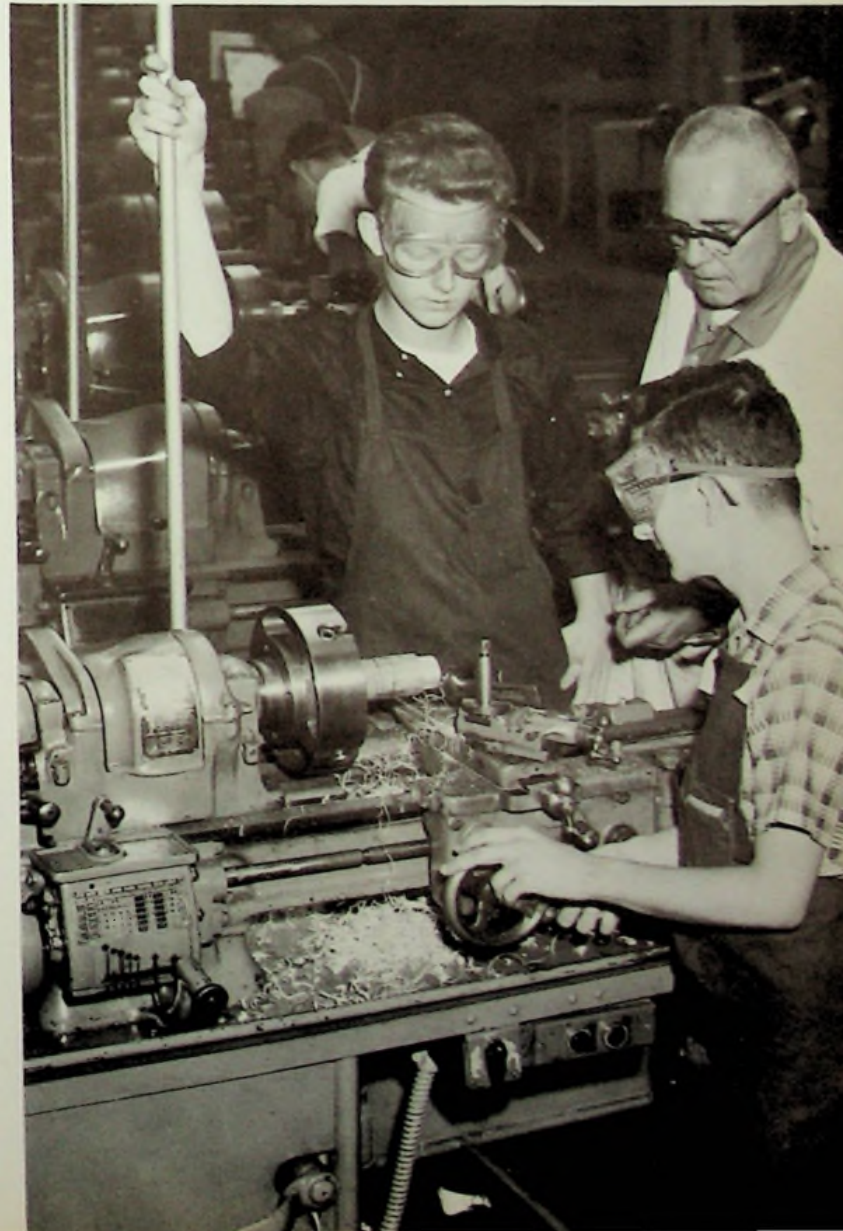

"The cooperation of downtown merchants is essential to the success of our Distributive Education Program," so explained Mr. Charles McClure and Miss Mildred Bailey, directors of Portsmouth High School's excellent vocational educational program.

The program enables seniors at PHS to attend school a half-day, work a half-day to gain actual business experience rather than a "mock-up" situation in the classroom. In addition, the students' earnings are a definite deterrent to drop-outs.

The Distributive Education Program is sponsored jointly by state and federal governments and also by the local board of education. Supervision must be made by a certified teacher who has broad experience in the retail selling field. English, merchandising, advertising, fundamentals of selling, display, speech, and other subjects related to the retail selling field are included in the program.

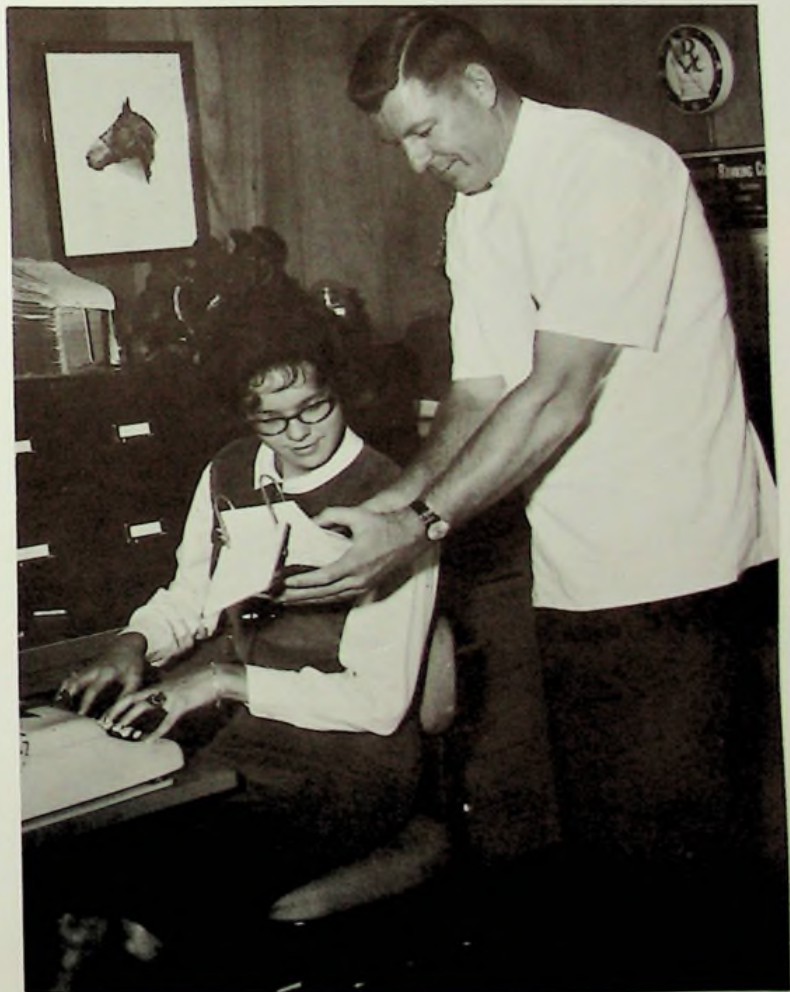

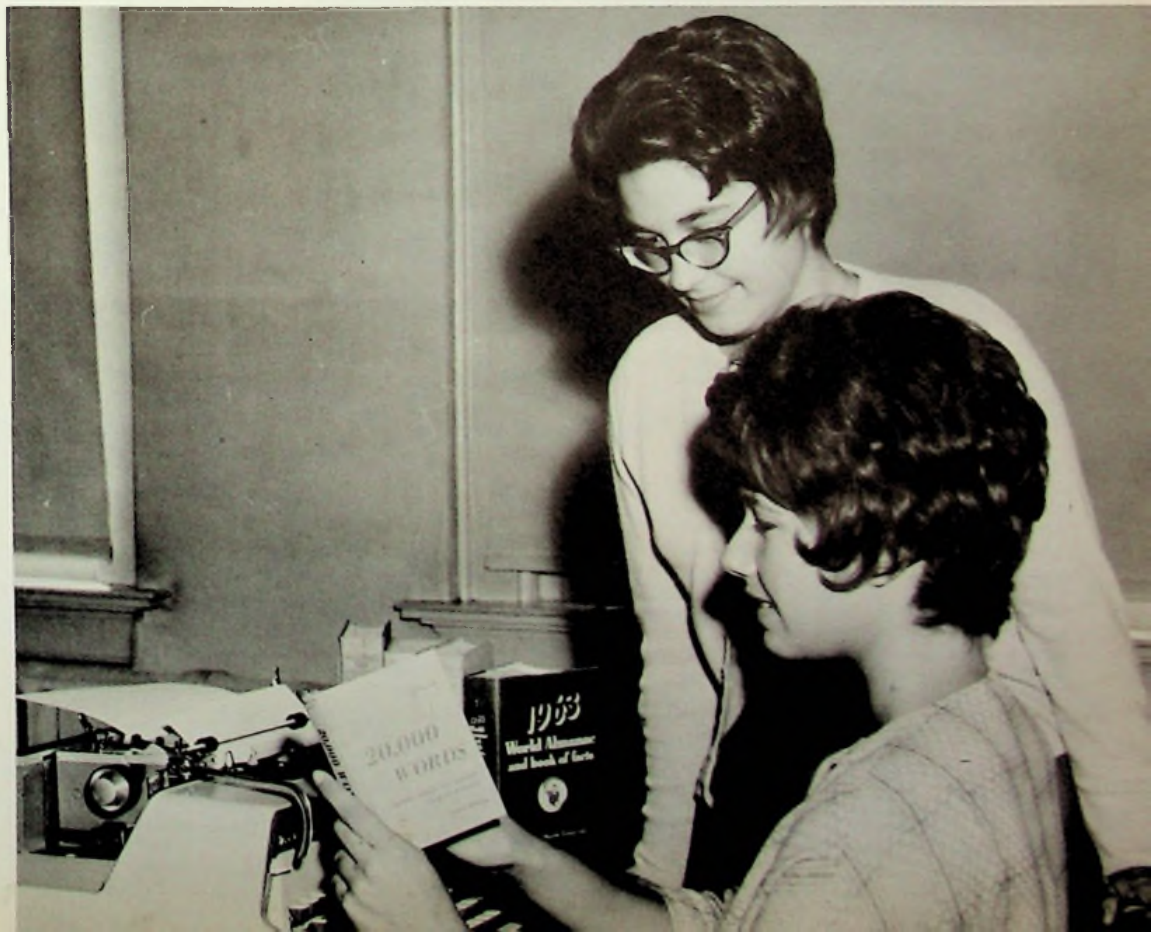

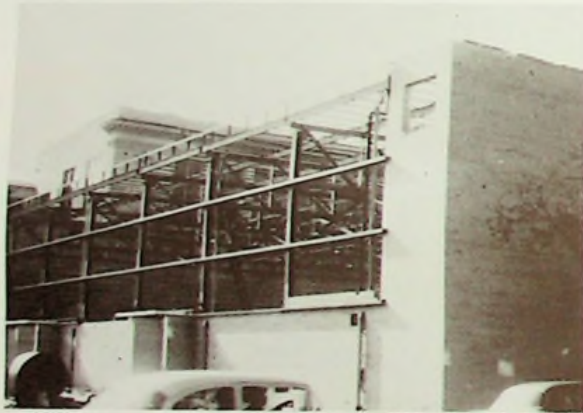

TO PROVIDE THE BEST FACILITIES FOR AN EVER - INCREASING STUDENT BODY . . .



The capacity of the new PHS gym will accommodate 700 more spectators than Grant Gym and may be expanded in later years to meet future growth demands. It provides for the seating of 2,150 persons with features allowing for the addition of another 1,000 seats. The attractive all-steel upper walls are blue and tan, and all sidings are backed by insulation panels. The gym has a special "floating floor" designed and built by a unique construction so that the floor actually floats. Trojan teams now have a new modern gym in which courageous warriors may continue to battle for the "red and blue" of Portsmouth High.





## SUPERINTENDENT OF PORTSMOUTH CITY SCHOOLS

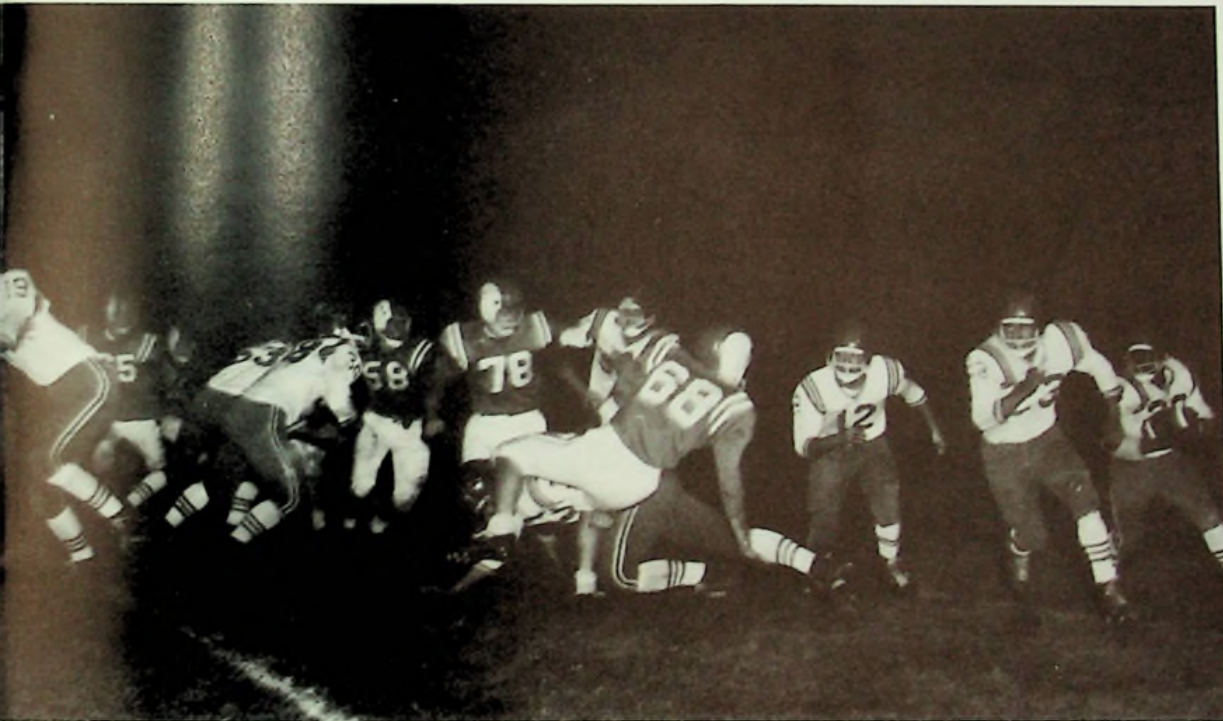
## TROJANS TOPPLE TO ASHLAND 40-22

# TROJAN BASKETBALL RECORD 1963-1964 SEASON

## GRANDVIEW DUMPED IN OPENER 65-56 Grant Gym—November 29

The Trojans opened their 1963-64 season on a winning note by defeating Columbus Grandview 65-56.

#### TROJANS CAPTURE DISTRICT CROWN 58-54

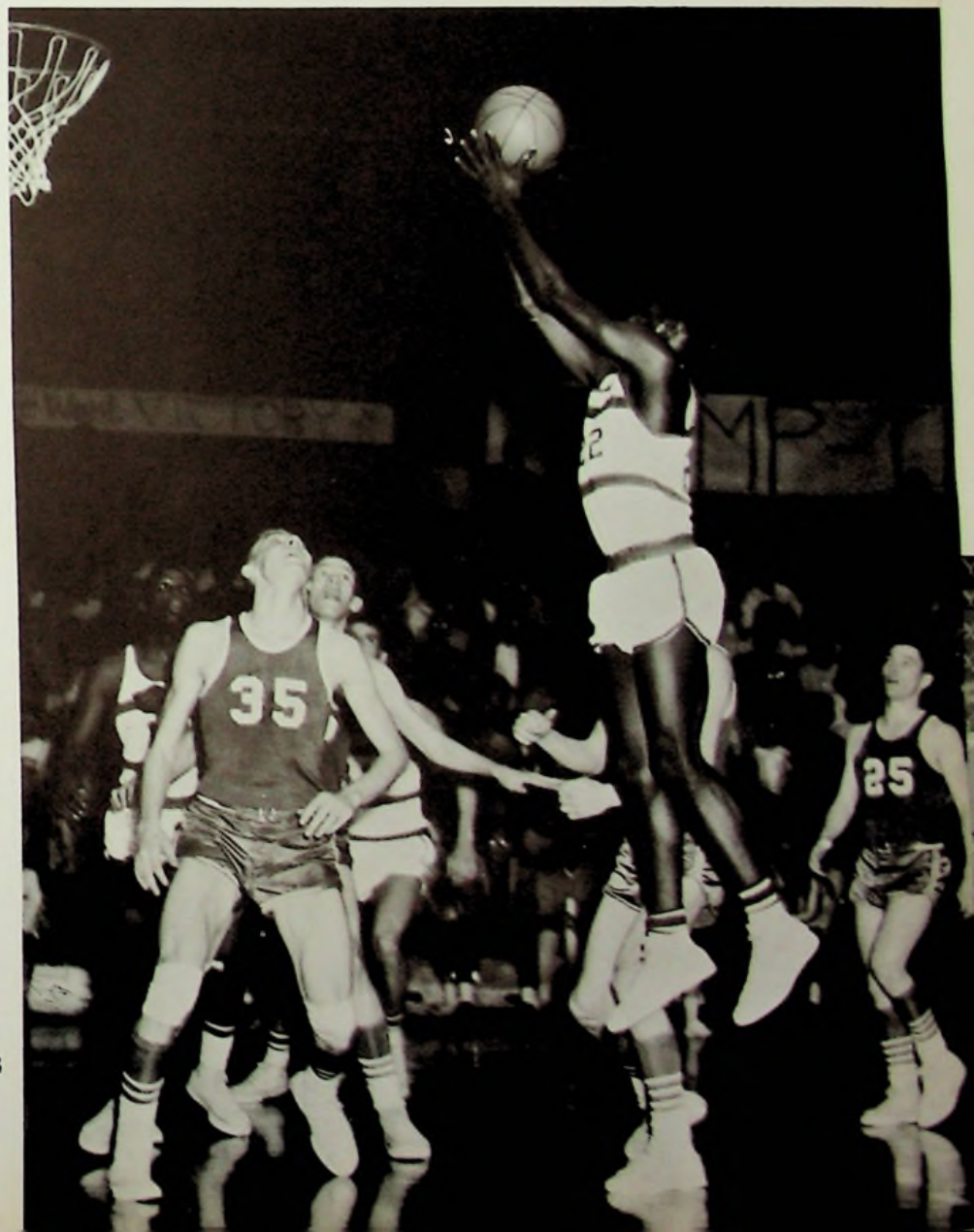

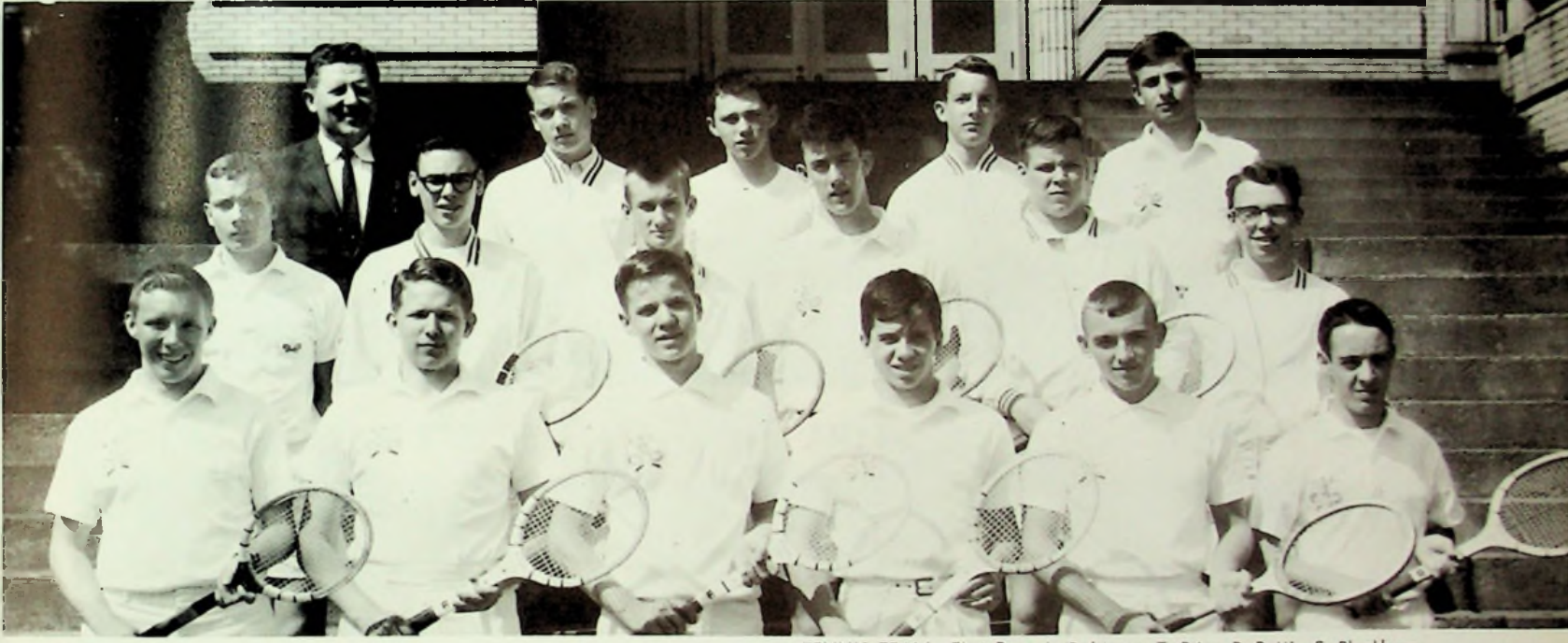

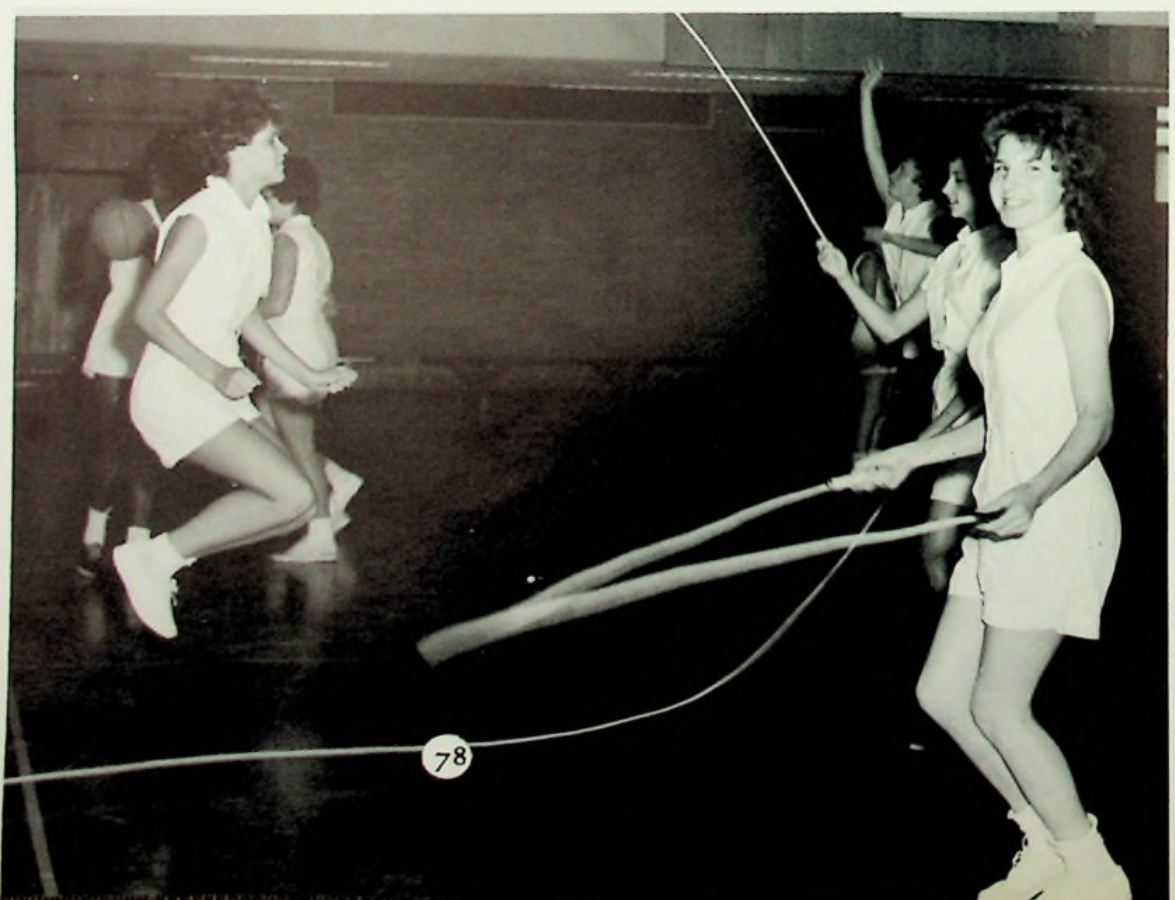

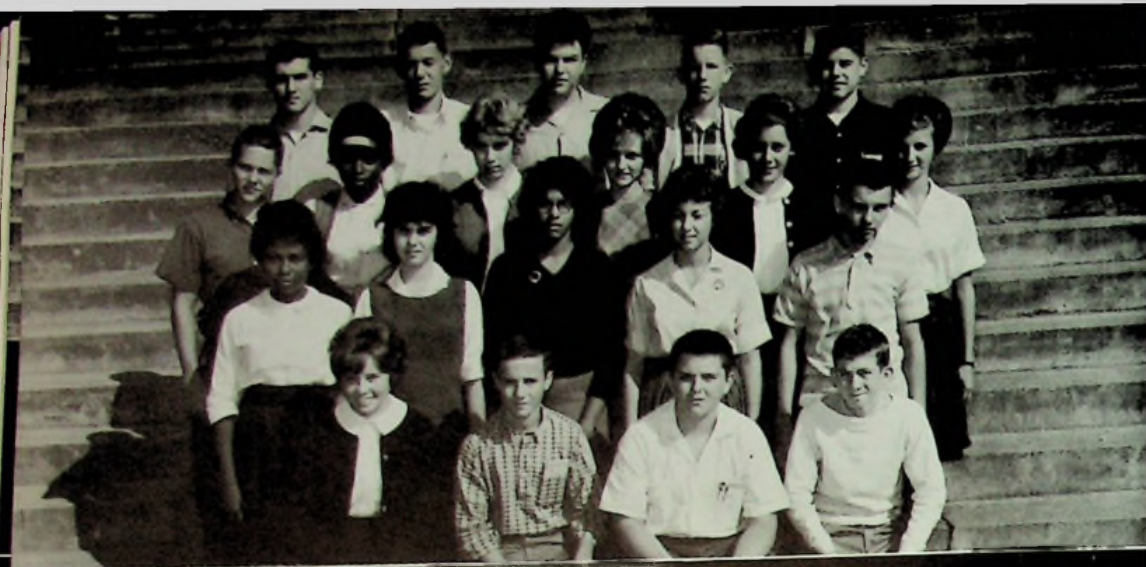

## THE PURSUIT OF EXCELLENCE NATIONAL HONOR SOCIETY

Of all the many extra-curricular activities at Portsmouth High, the one most sought after for membership, and the one most closely allied with the true purposes of education, is the Emily Ball Memorial Chapter of the National Honor Society.

The primary purpose of this organization is to recognize excellence in scholarship, character, leadership, and service of students.
