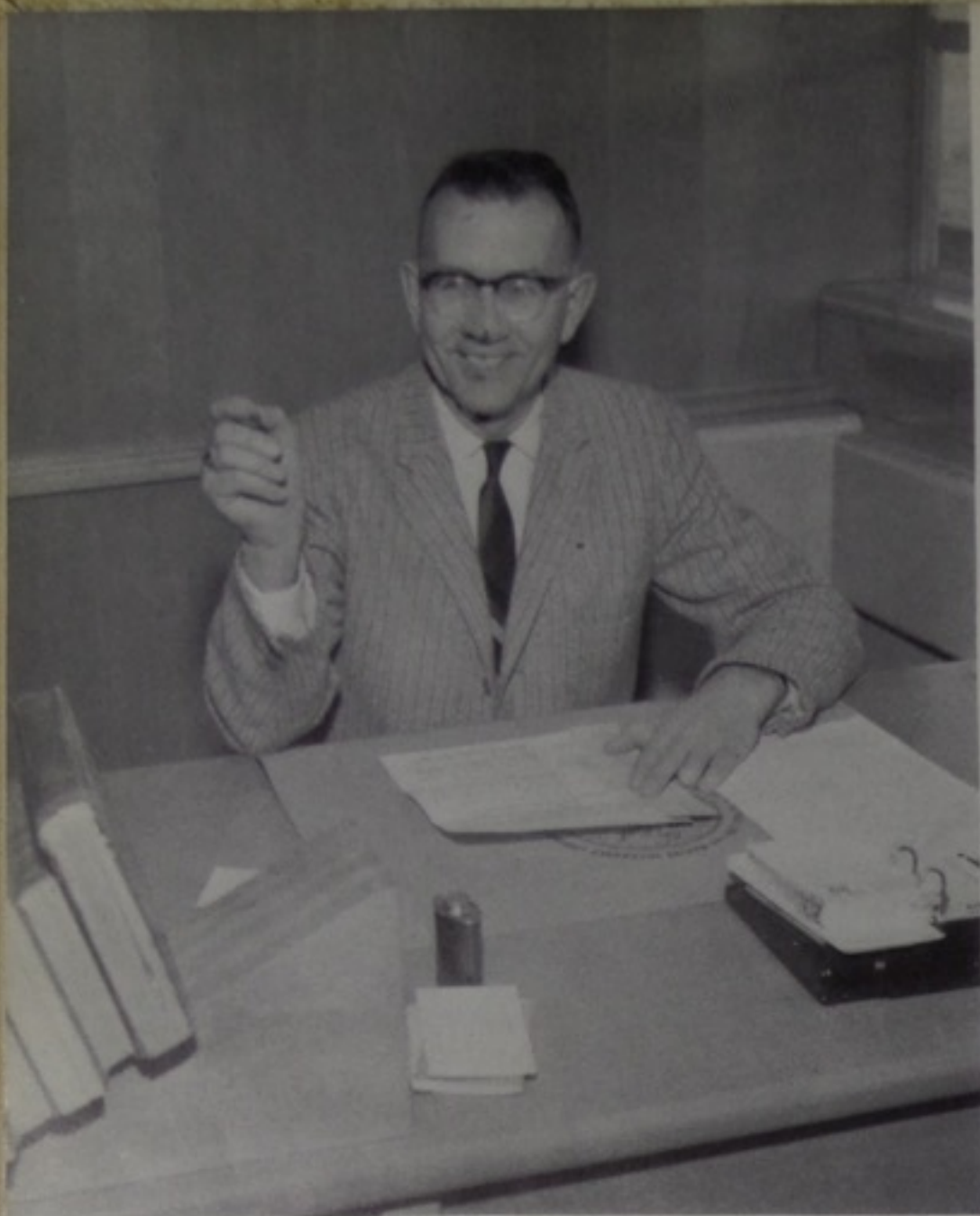

I hope you will understand me a little better after you have read me through.

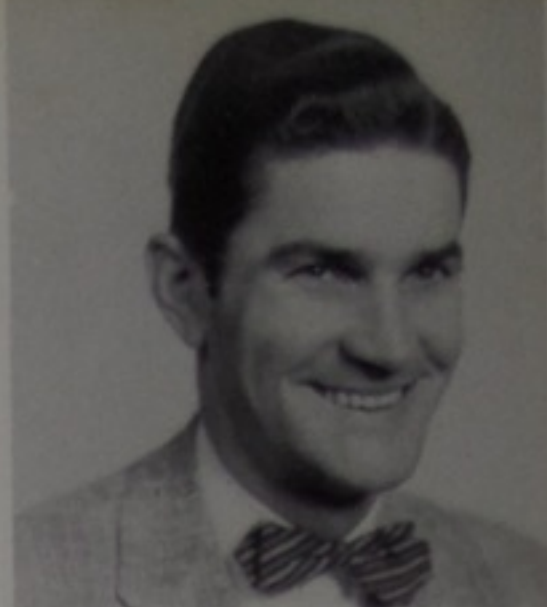

DETROIT STEEL

The role of Detroit Steel is an important one, for it is the lead role in the play written by industry. It is now time for our play to begin. A hush comes over the audience, the light dim, and the curtain rises on our presentation "The Role of Detroit Steel in the Community."

Act I is the making of steel and for this scene we find ourselves in the Detroit Steel Mill in Portsmouth, Ohio. Before us a huge machine is shoveling iron, coke and limestone into a fiery furnace. We are standing thirty feet from the furnace, but even at this distance we can feel the intense heat and see the metal begin to melt. Next, slag which will be used in the making of modern highways is drained off, and the molten metal is poured into molds. These molds are called ingots.

In Act II we shall see how the ingots reached the stage where they will be made into finished products. For this part of our story we move on through the mill until we come to the soaking pits where the ingots are reheated for processing. Then the red-hot ingots go through a series of rolling mills and are rolled out into sheets. Some sheets are rolled into long strips, then cut and stacked ready for shipment, while others are wound into coils. In another part of the mill, rods and wire are made and the wire is coiled on gigantic spools. We have now seen Act II of our play, and we wonder what all the sheets and wires are made into. We shall soon see.

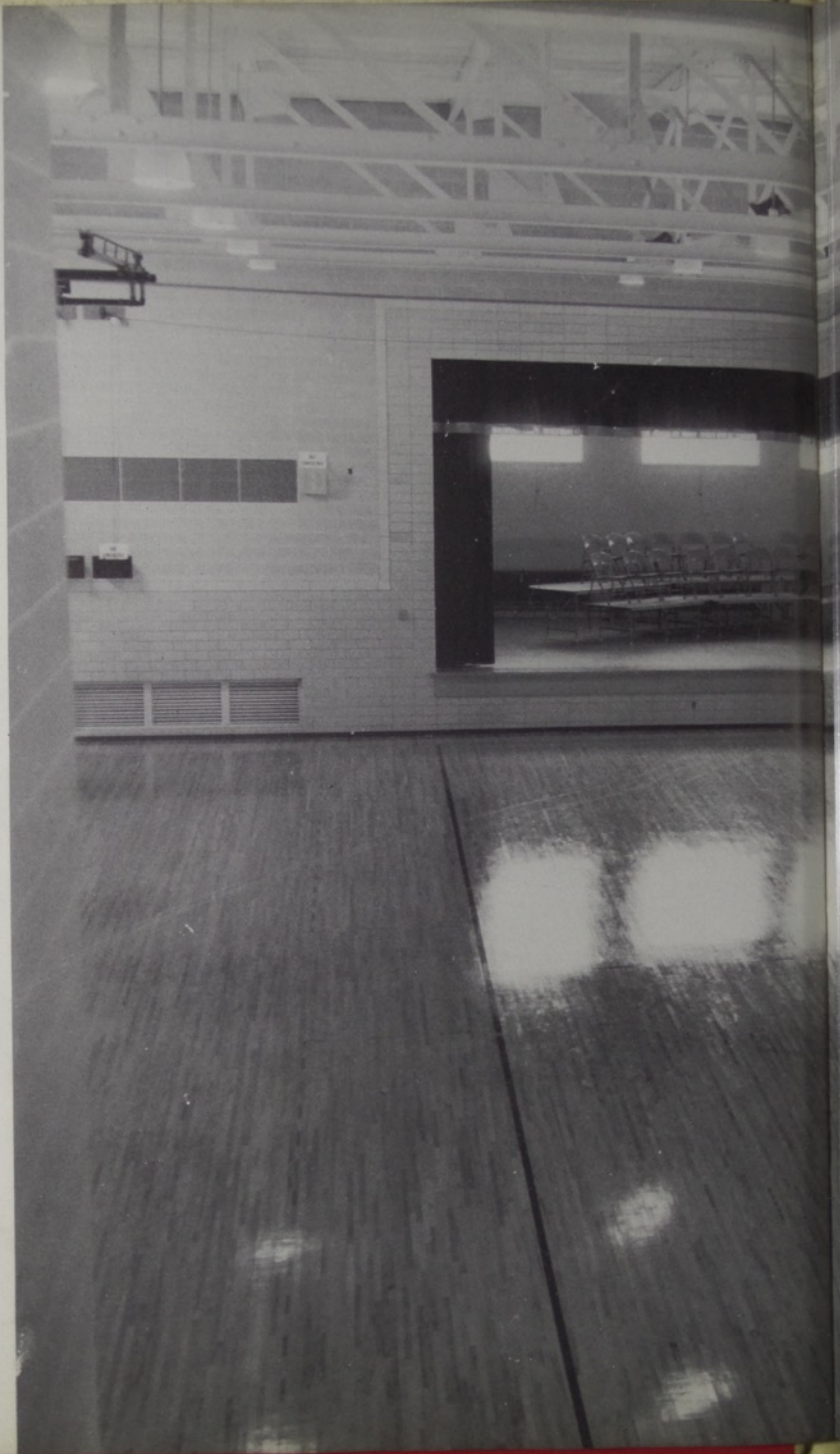
As the curtain rises on Act III we realize that the scene has changed. We are now on a hilltop overlooking Portsmouth. We look down, and we begin to see how much part of our daily life depends on steel. We see the modern streamlined cars, the mighty trains, the river boats, and then we hear the roar of an engine overhead. We look up and see a shining steel bird seemingly glide across the sky. We glance over at the bridge which spans the Ohio River connecting two states and two peoples. We gaze at tall buildings, among them a school and a hospital, which were built on a framework of steel. We see a housewife in her home working in a modern and easy to clean stainless steel kitchen. A farmer plows the earth with a tractor made from steel. A group of children playing in a schoolyard on steel equipment. And we could go on and on reciting the many products of steel. But the curtain must go down on Act III.

Soon the curtain rises again and our star, Detroit steel, takes a well deserved bow for it is the star in a play that will run forever, because the whole world is its stage.
