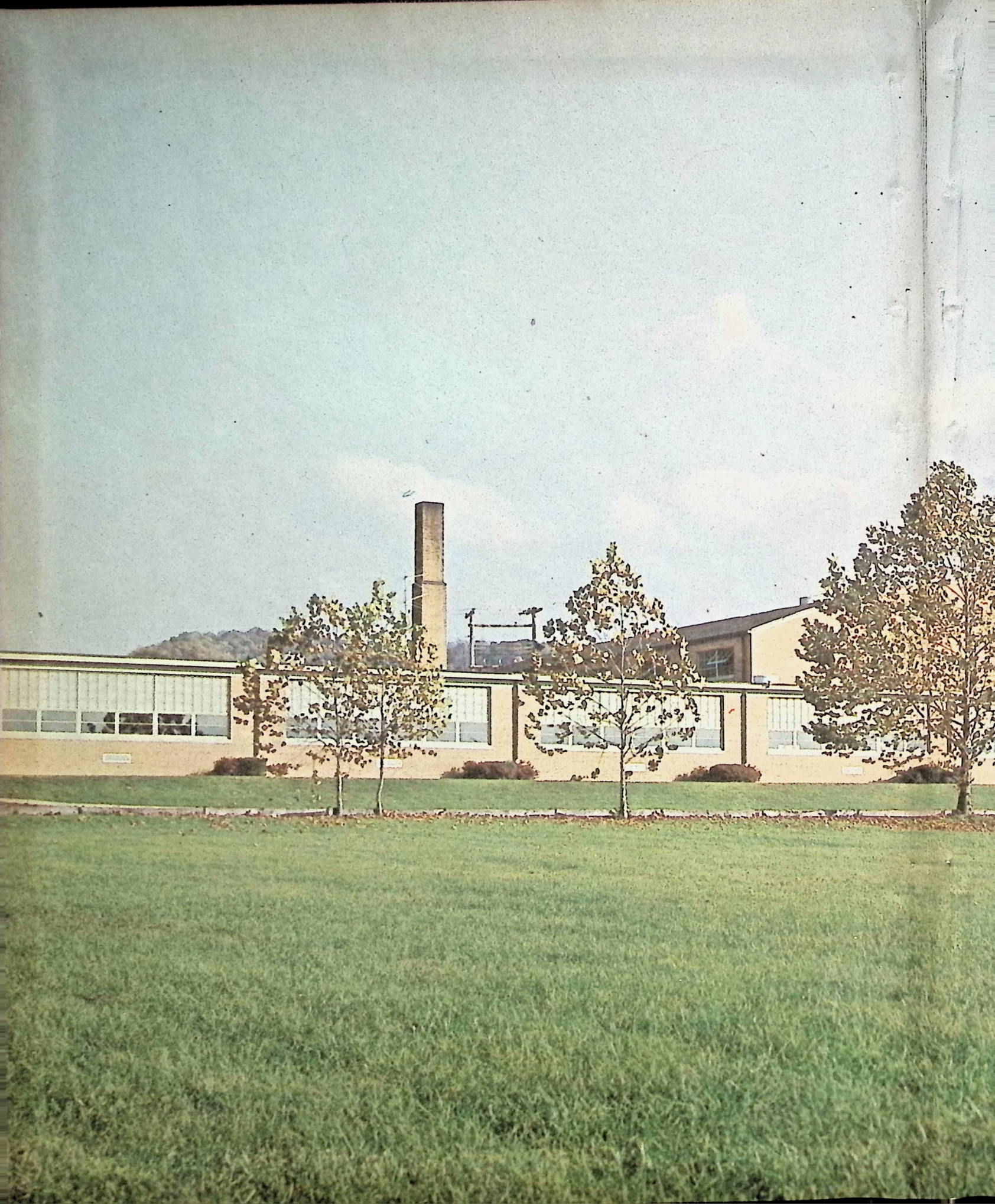

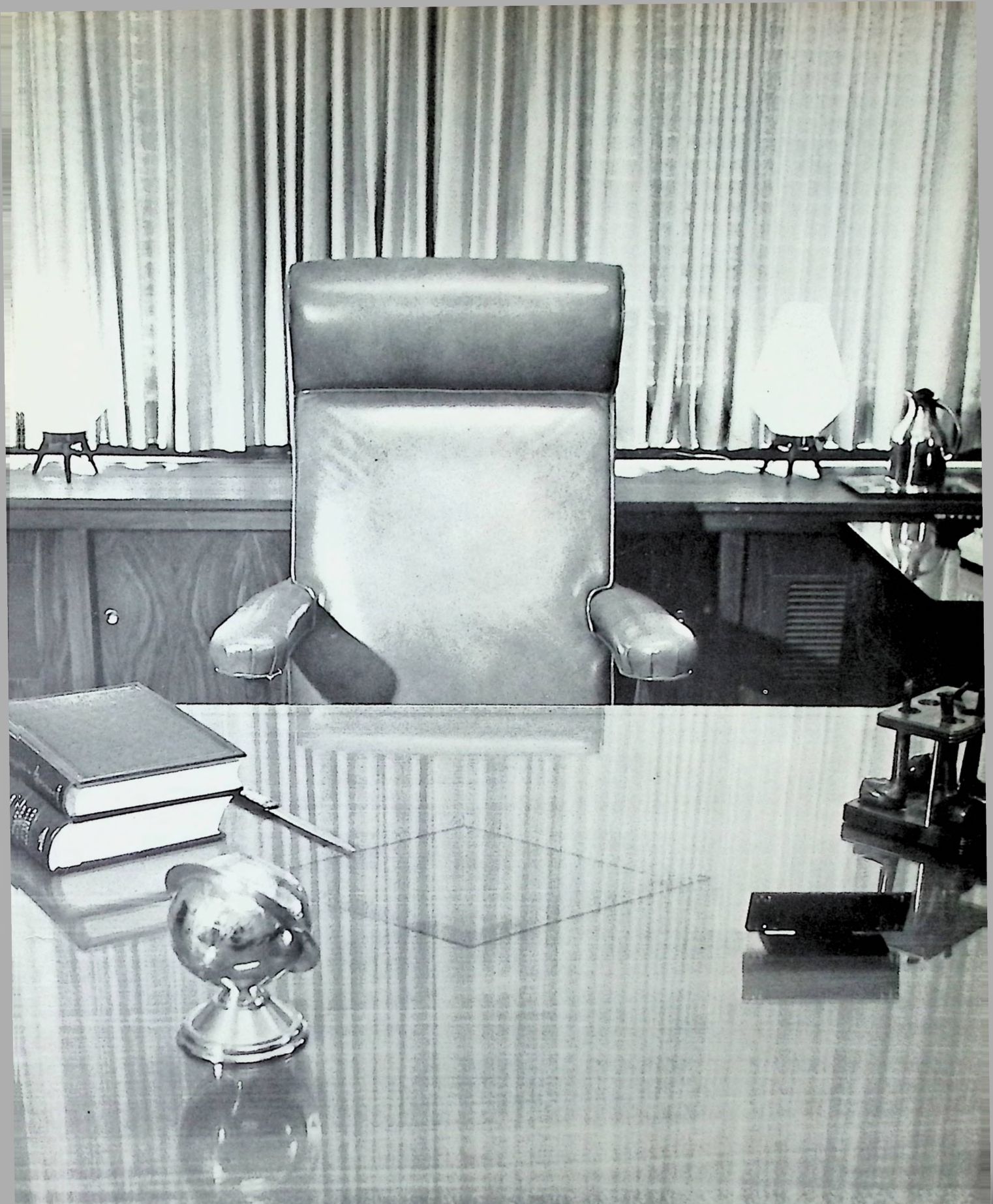

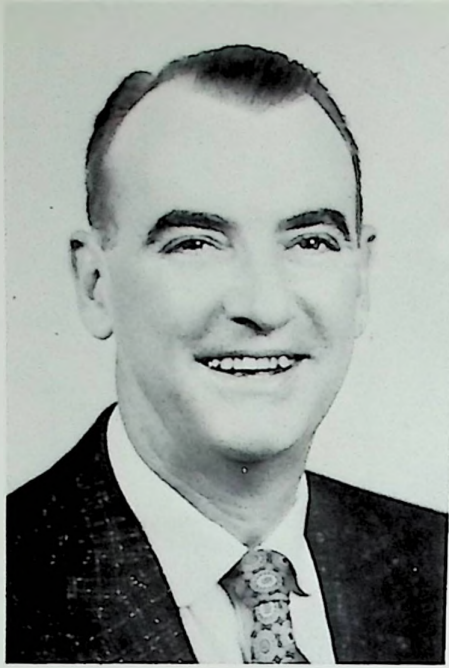
FOREWORD

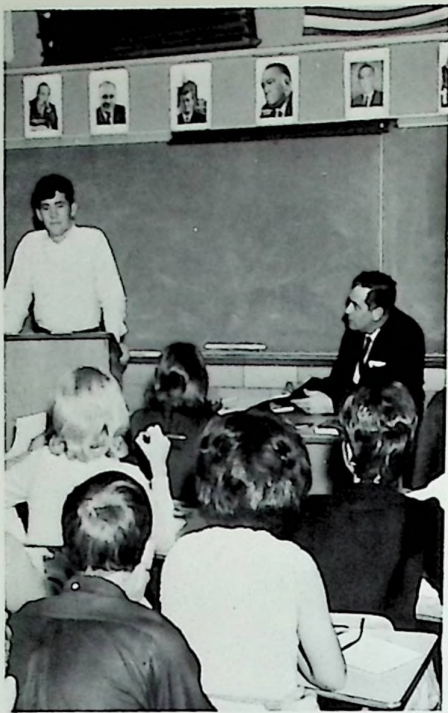

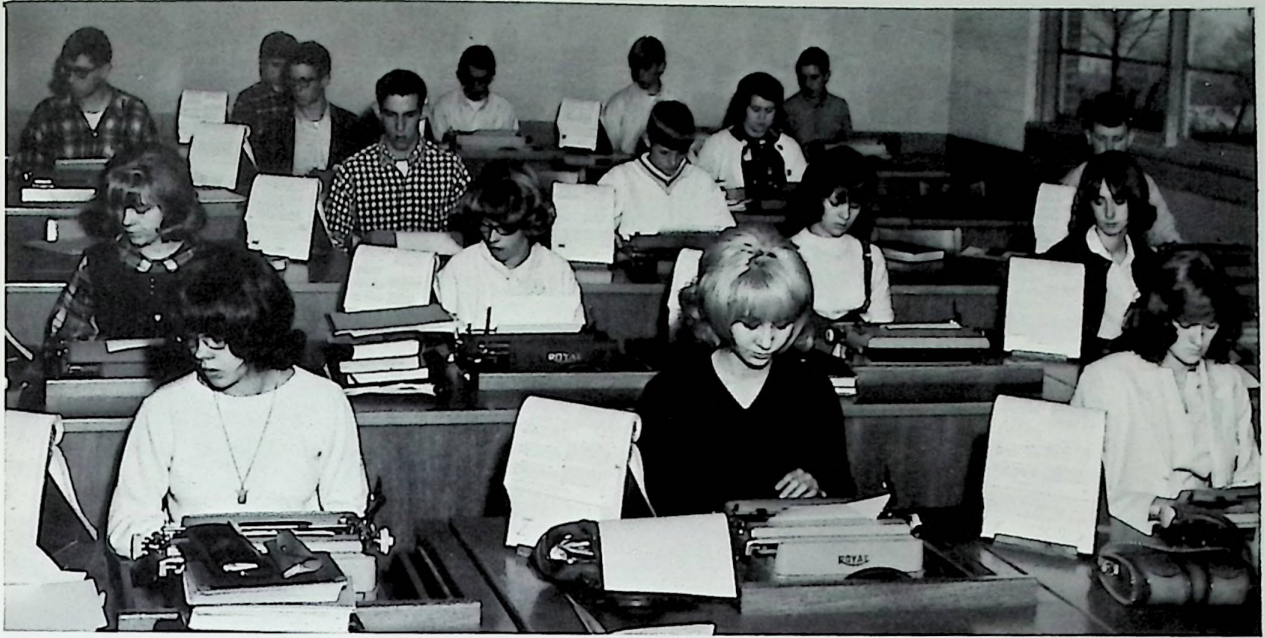

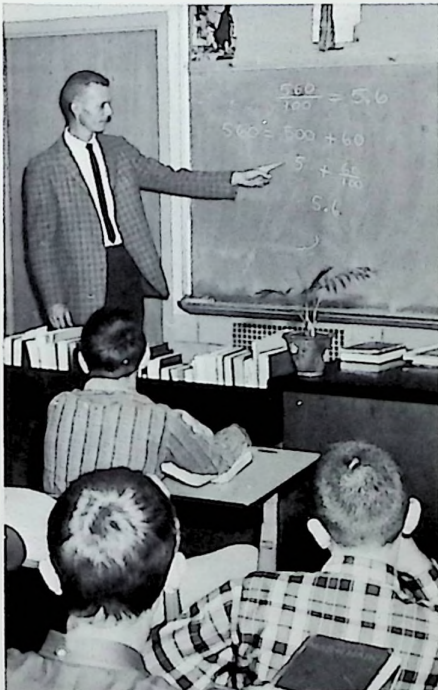

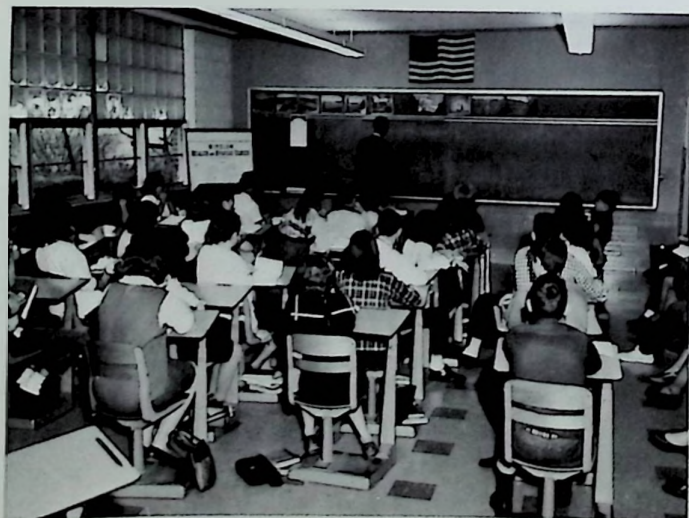

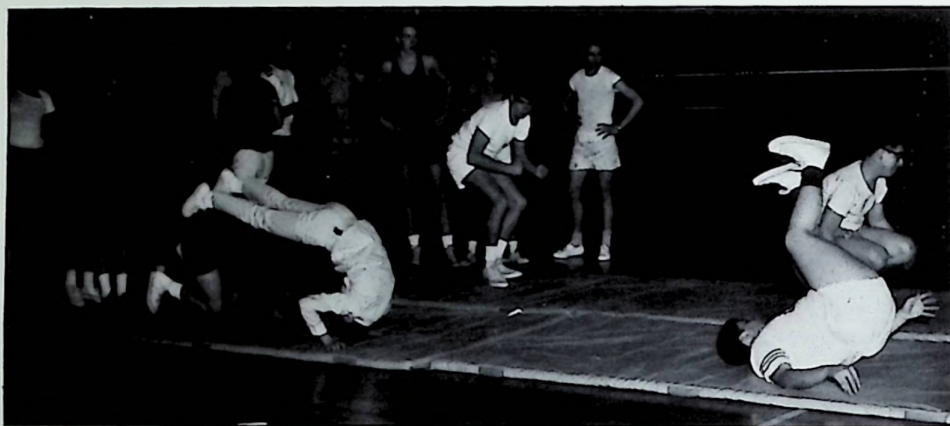

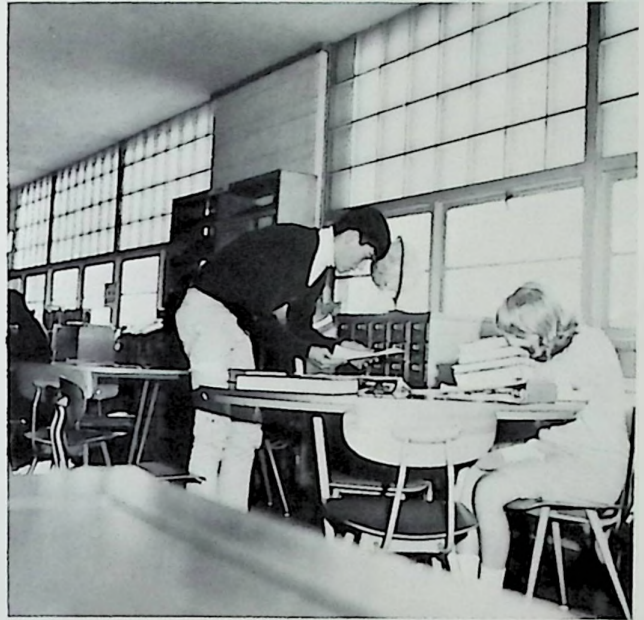

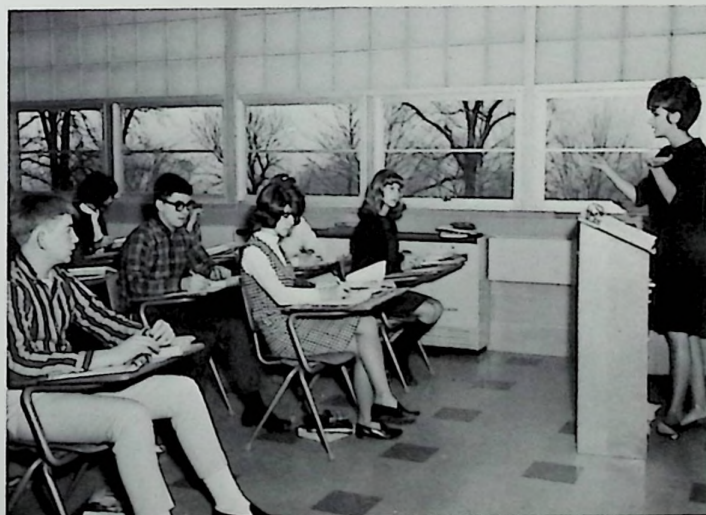
