



The Student Council, under the supervision of Mr. Nickel, completed many projects this year. Members of the Student Council bought a new flag for the school.


The Student Council decided to recognize the valedictorians, so they bought a plaque on which the valedictorians names were engraved. It was planned to hang the plaque in the trophy case.



We hope that Leticia will remember her reign as Miss Spring, but it is a certainty that West High will never forget it.




Graduation
