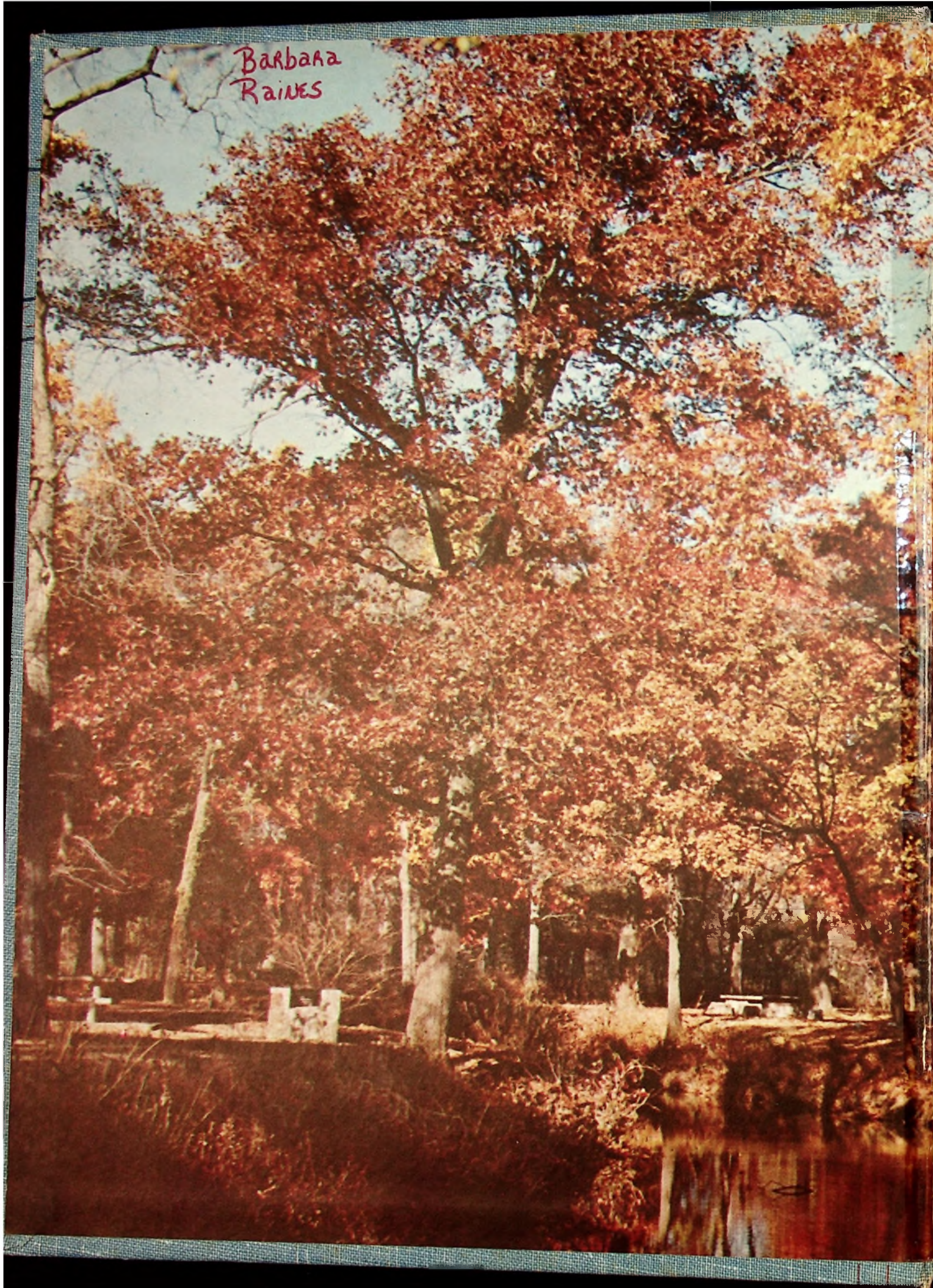

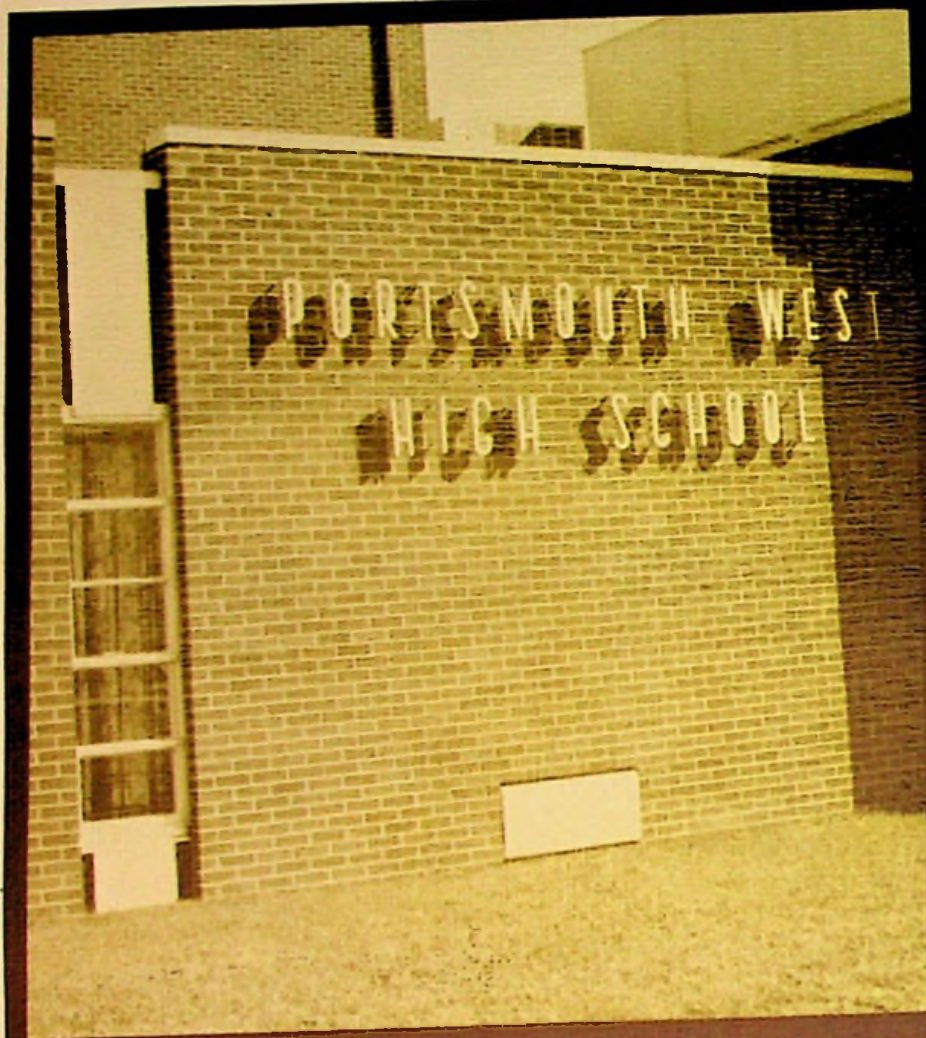

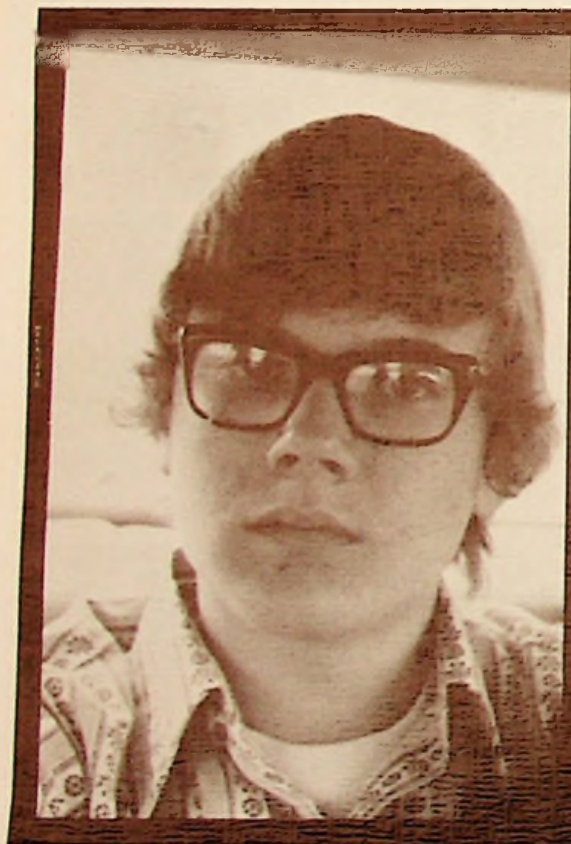
for most of us, knowledge of our world comes largely through sight, yet we look about with such unseeing eyes that we are partially blind. (rachel carson)

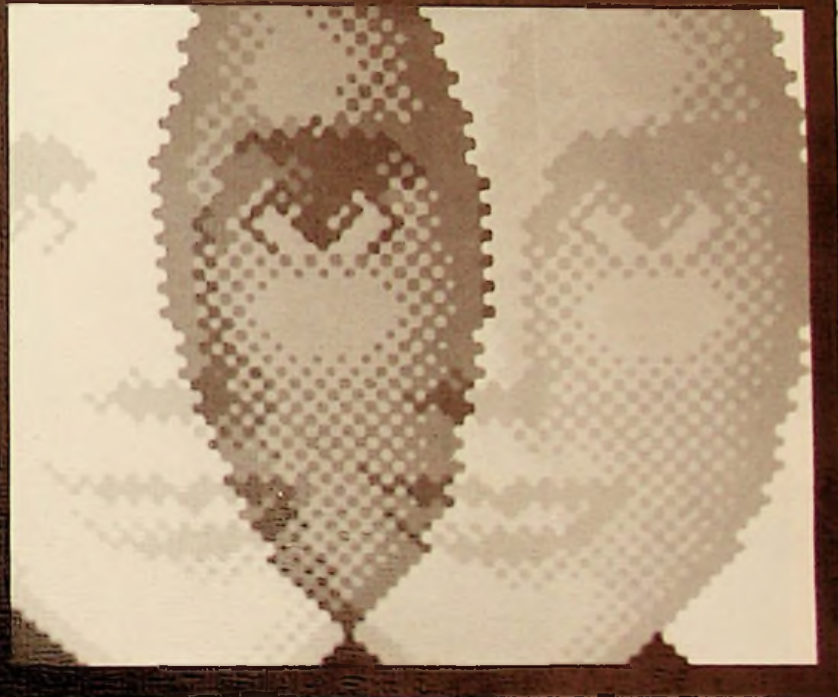

i awaken hopeful and determined. i seek the power to awaken the world. -always, for you and for me, i am searching.

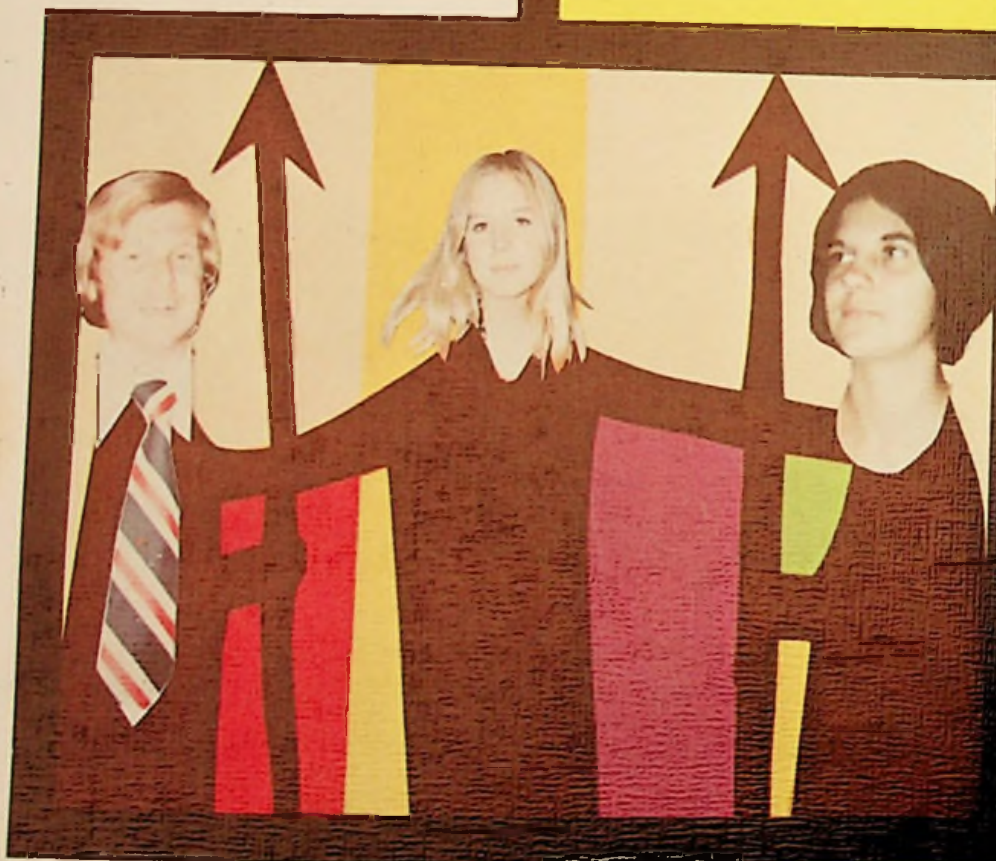


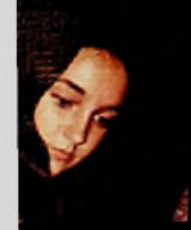

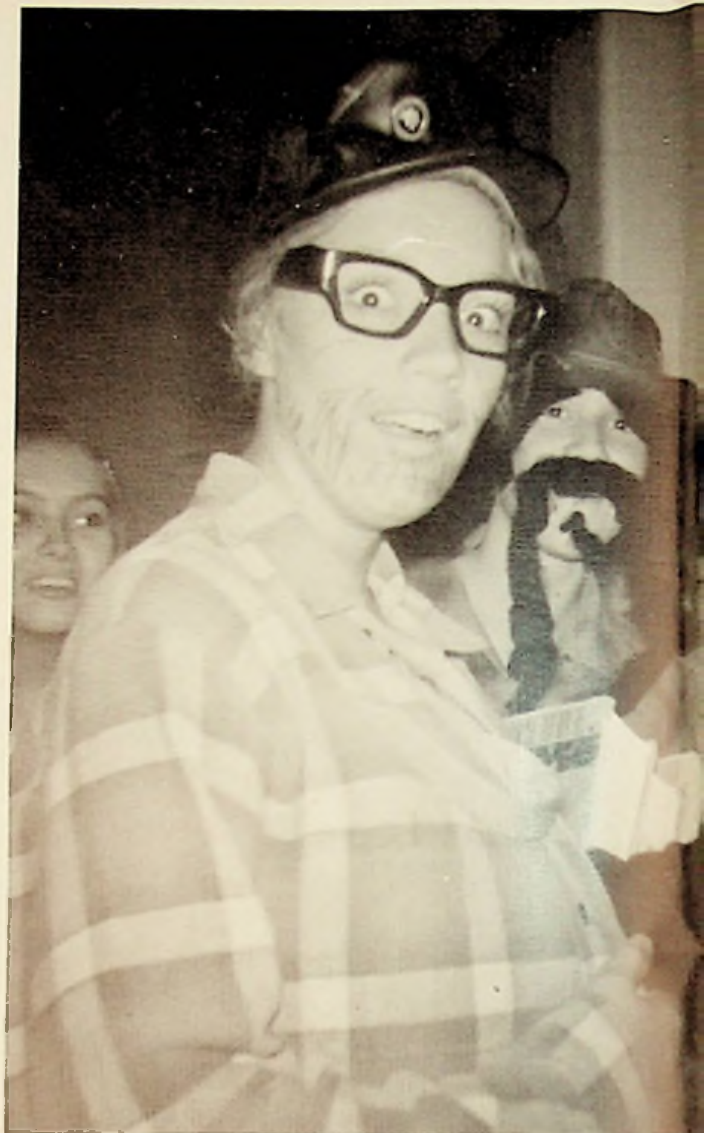

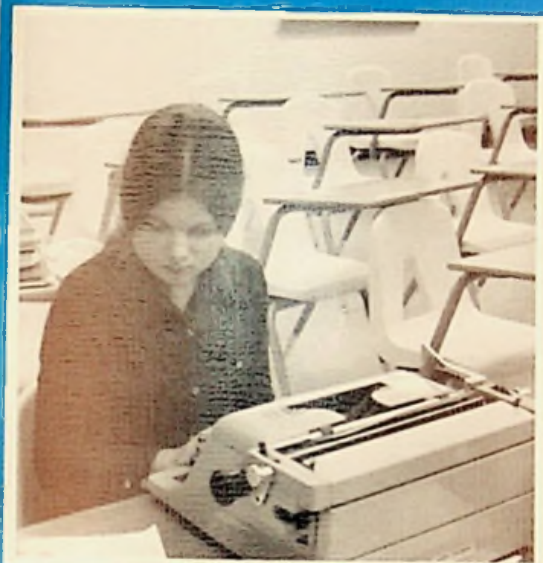
journalism paints authentic west picture

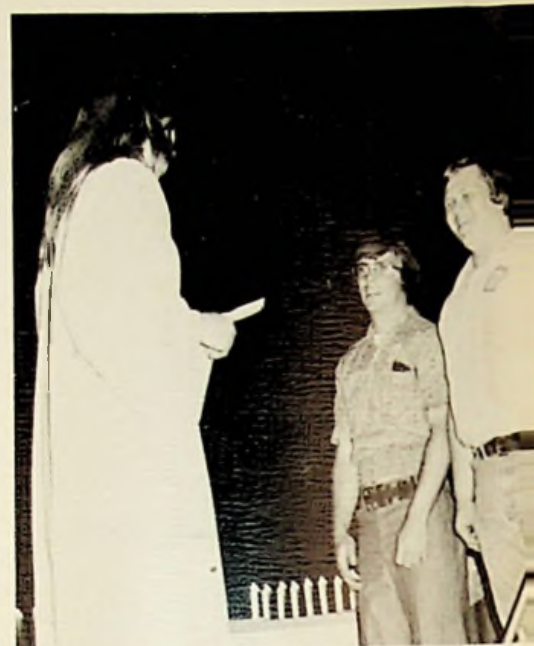

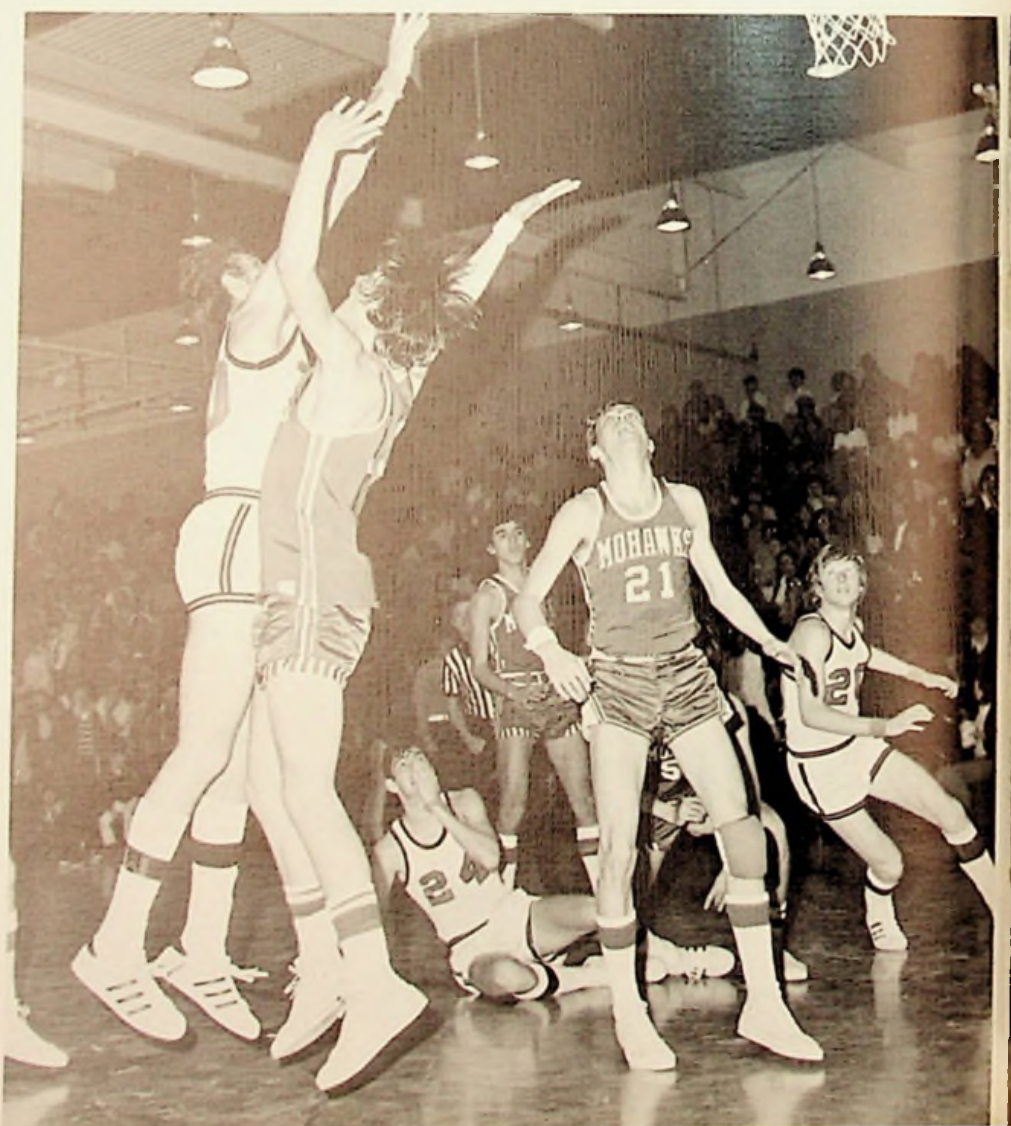
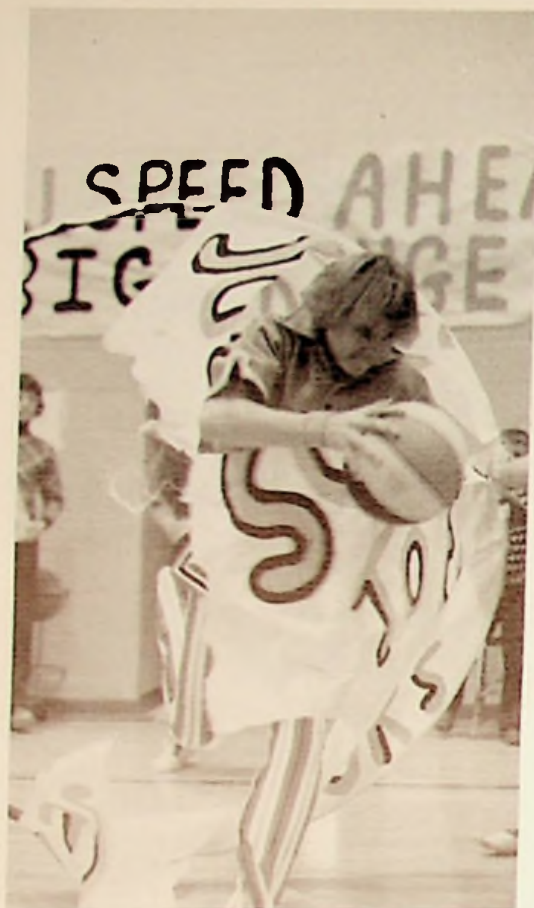
the spirit of the players and students seemed to be dampened by the injuries. the outlook was dismal, but by friday night the excitement had generated and the spirit ran high.

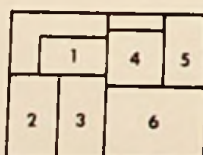

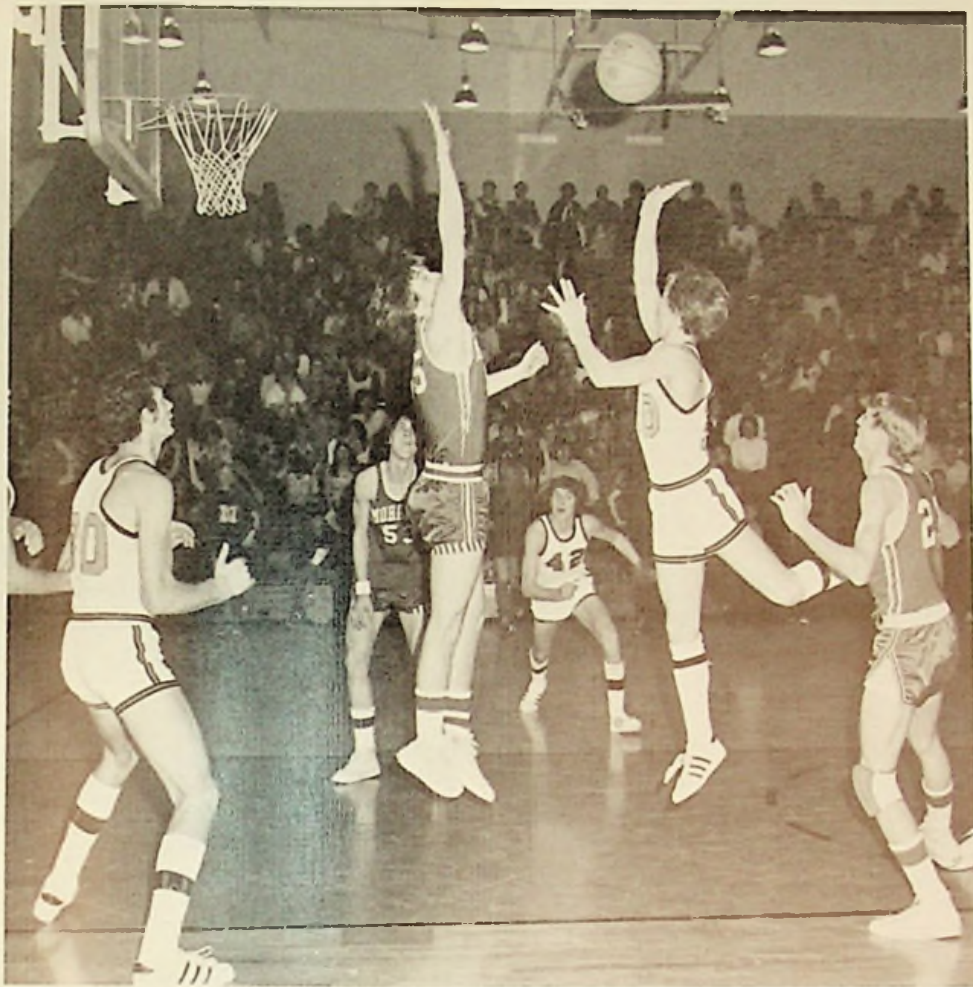


experience and hard work mark 13-6 season

the vocal music department also has many fine soloists and ensembles who brought back excellent ratings when they traveled to athens for state competition.





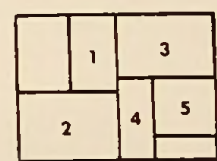
