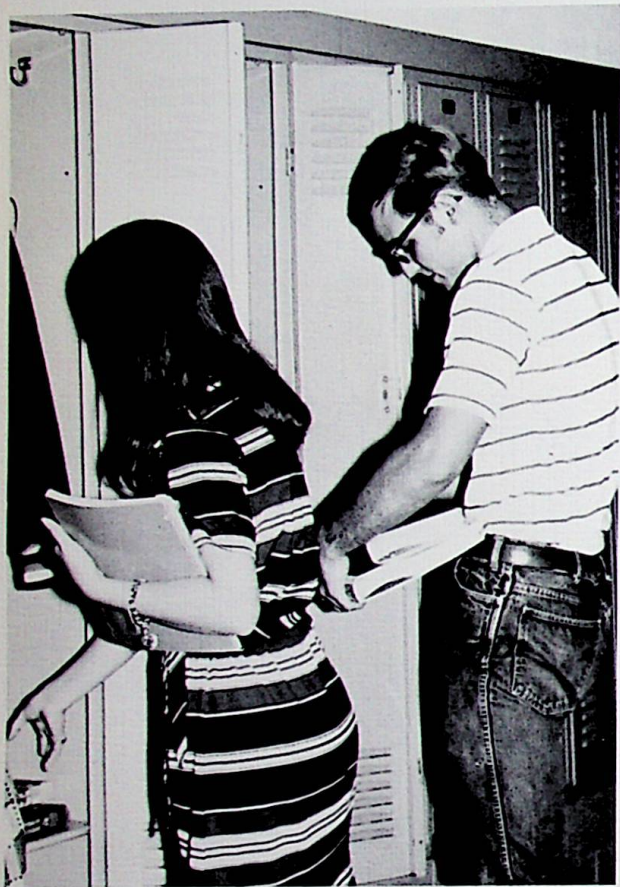
A Year to Remember



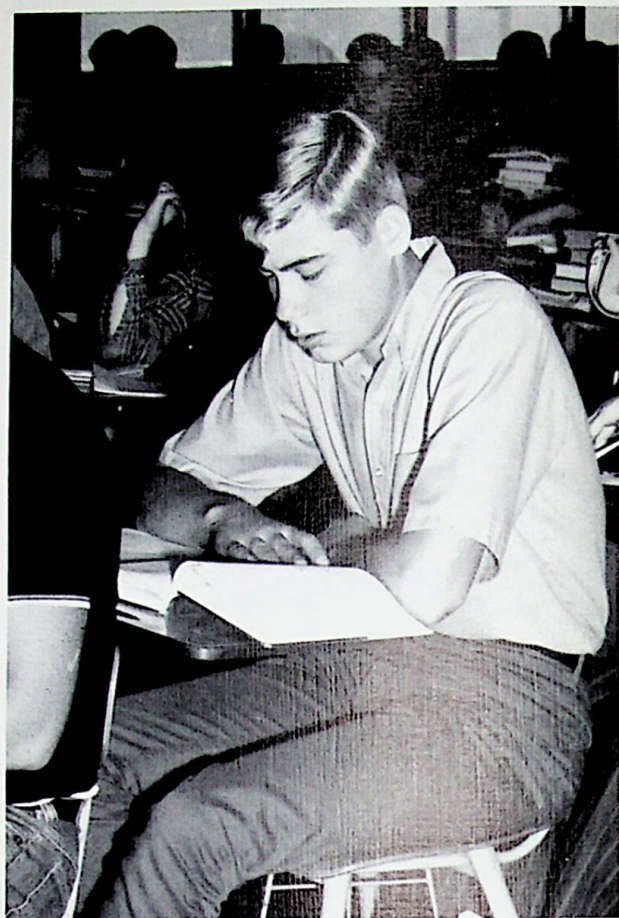

Administration

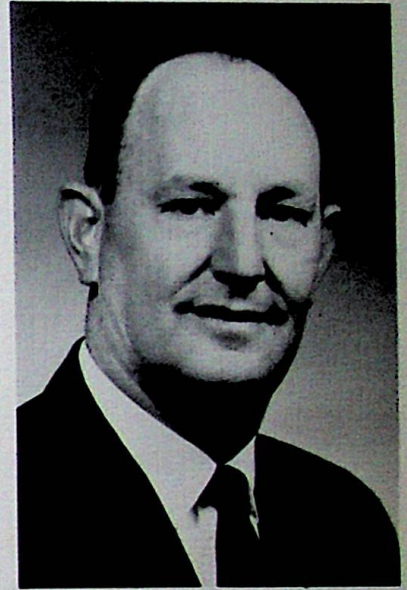
The educational systems throughout the country have gone through many changes in recent months. Our administration has done well in keeping up with the trend of progressiveness.

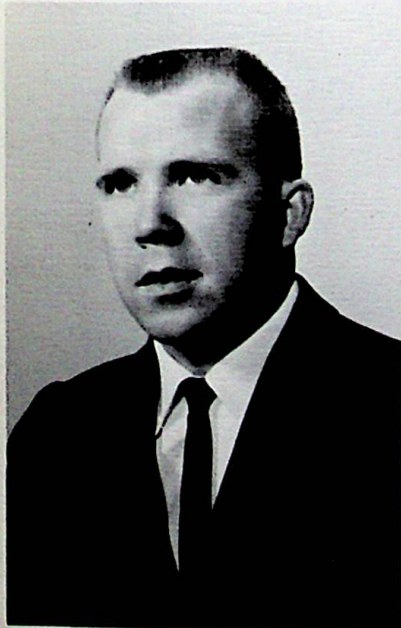
The local board of education consists of elected members of the community. They assist in solving the financial problems of the district and in the maintenance of the buildings.

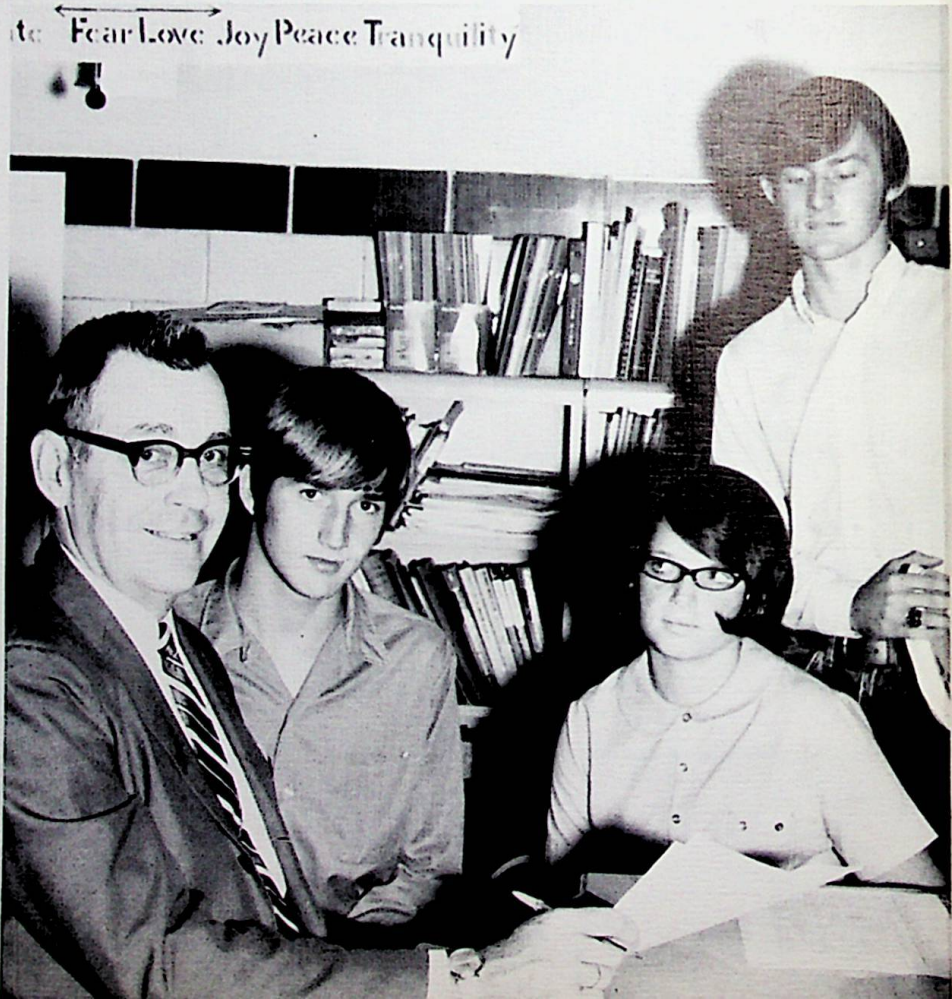

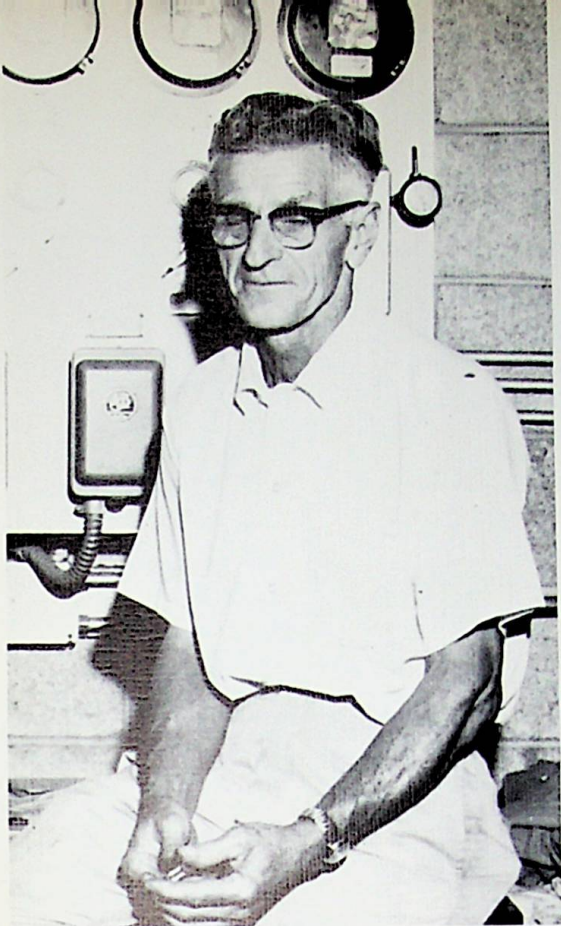

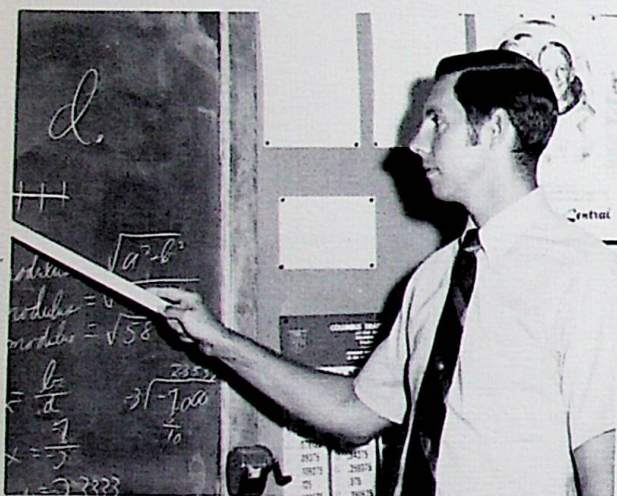

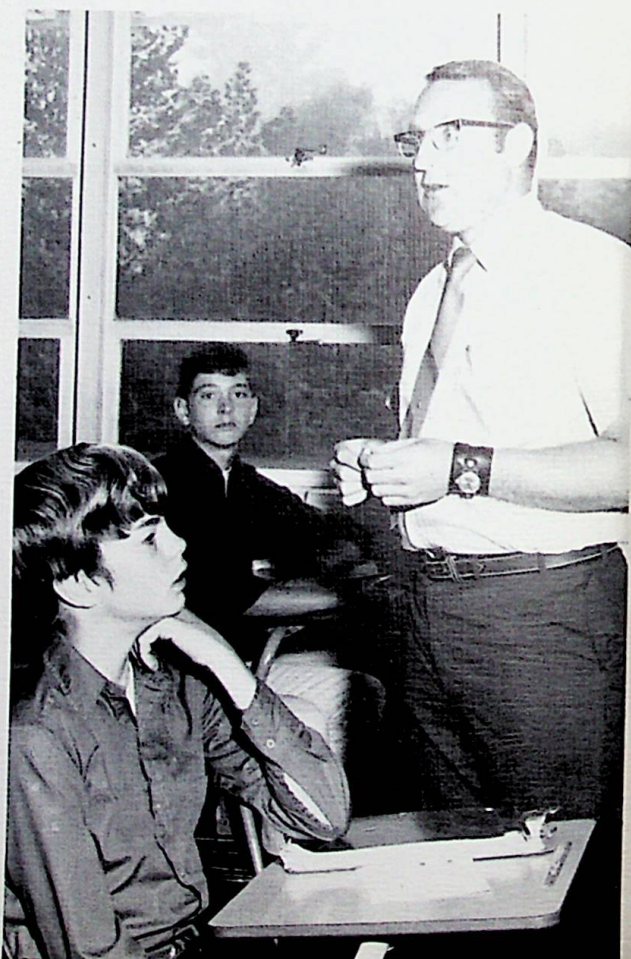

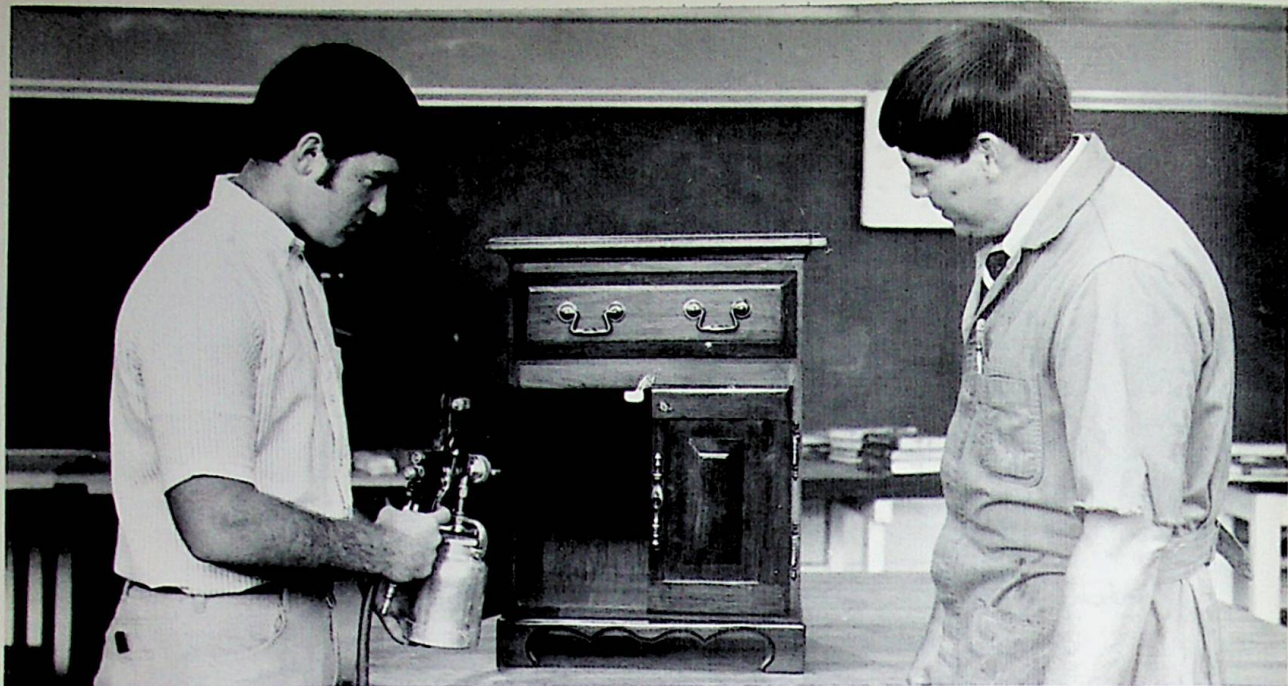
Commercial

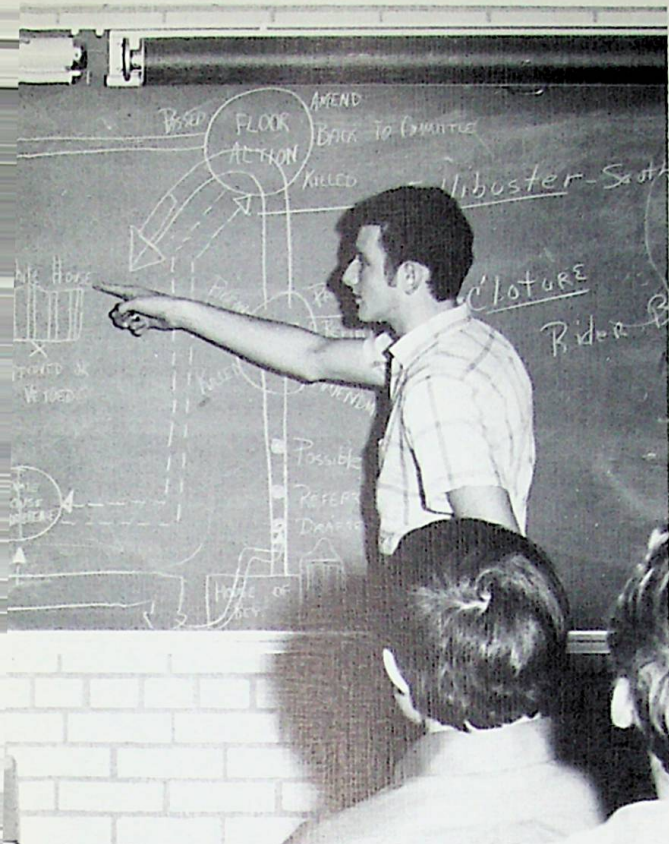
Social Studies

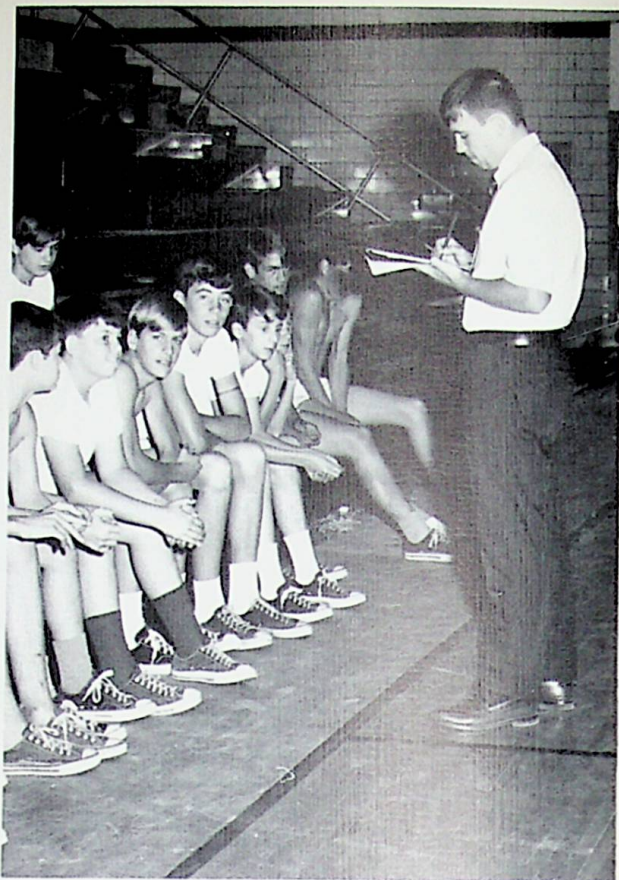

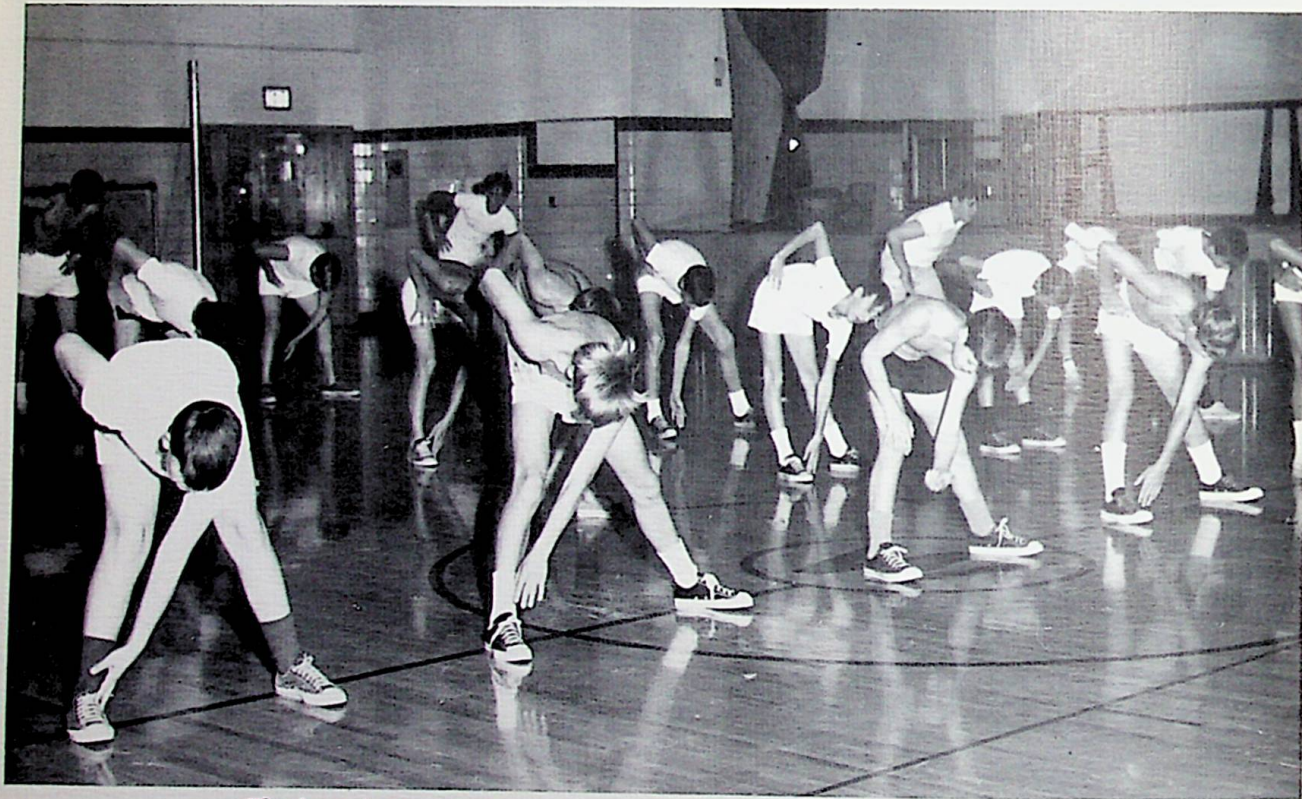
Physical Education

Physical fitness is essential to a sound character. At WHS two years of physical education is a requirement. This program helps to strengthen, develop, and co-ordinate young muscles.

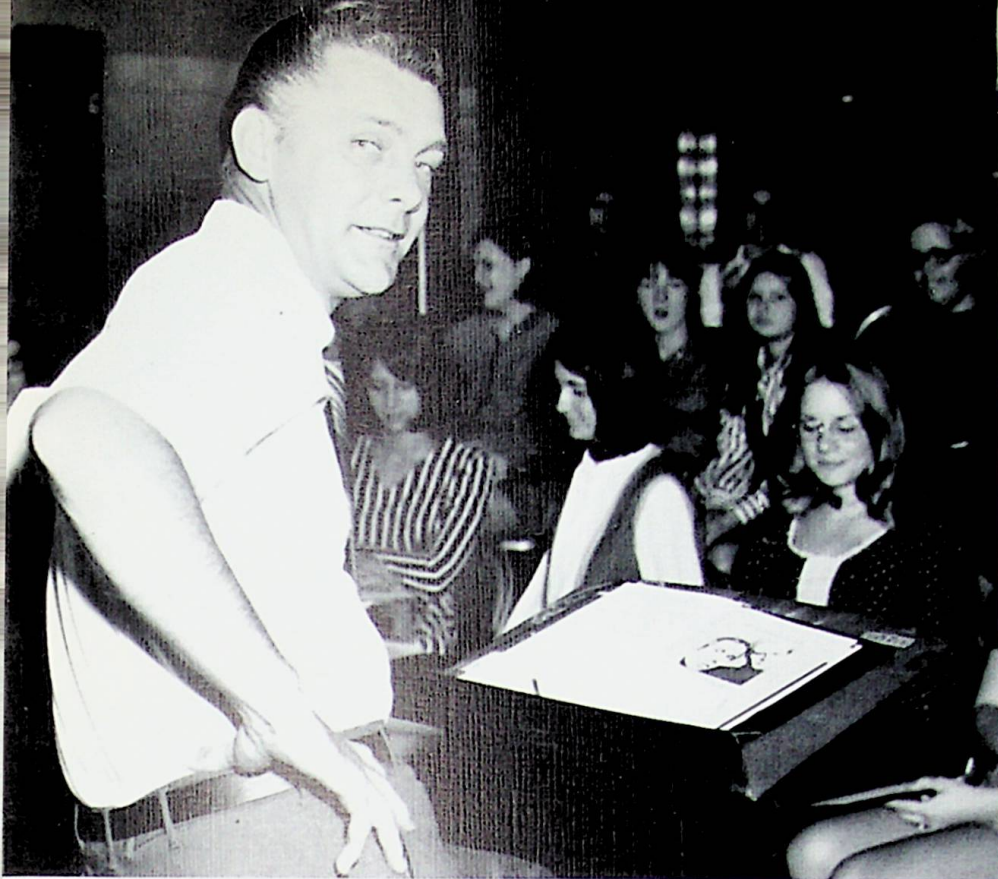

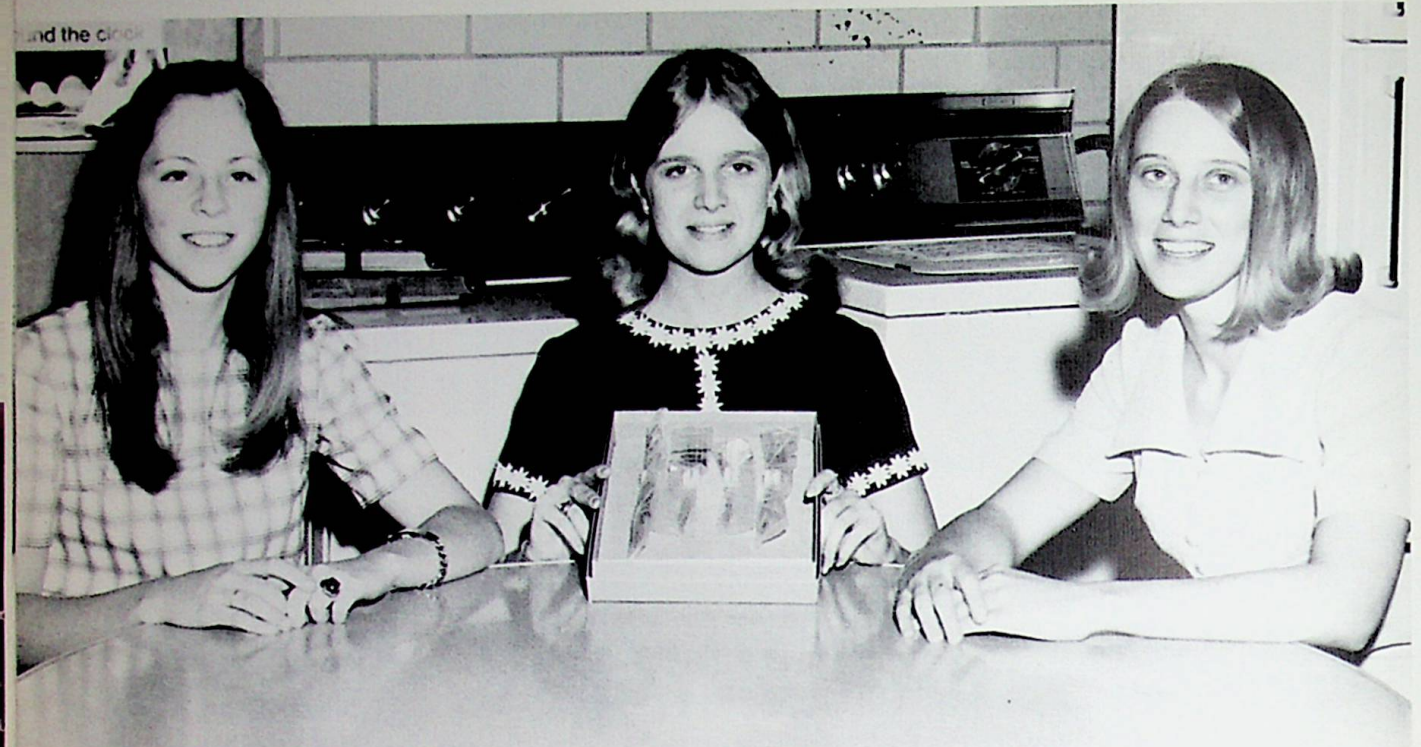
Music

The Juniors are now beginning to make decisions about the future and are looking forward to next fall when they will begin their final year of high school.

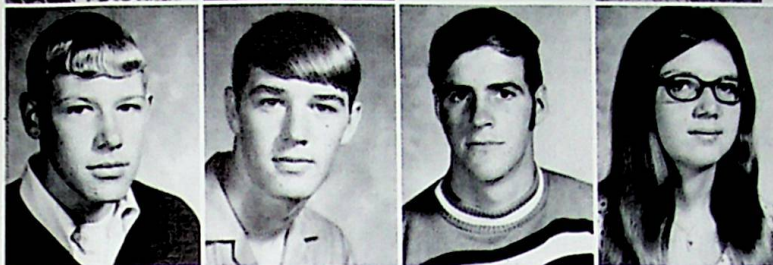

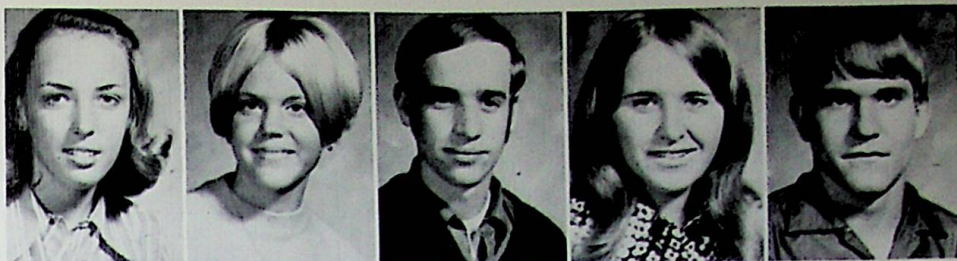
The most important event during the year for the sophomores was the ordering of class rings. This year, the sophomores received their rings in April, earlier than any previous class.

The sophomores will soon take that long-awaited step from underclassmen to upper-classmen. Even as the road becomes steeper, they are coming closer to their goals.



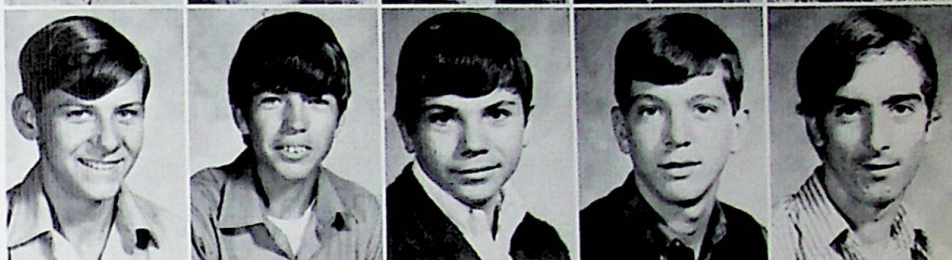

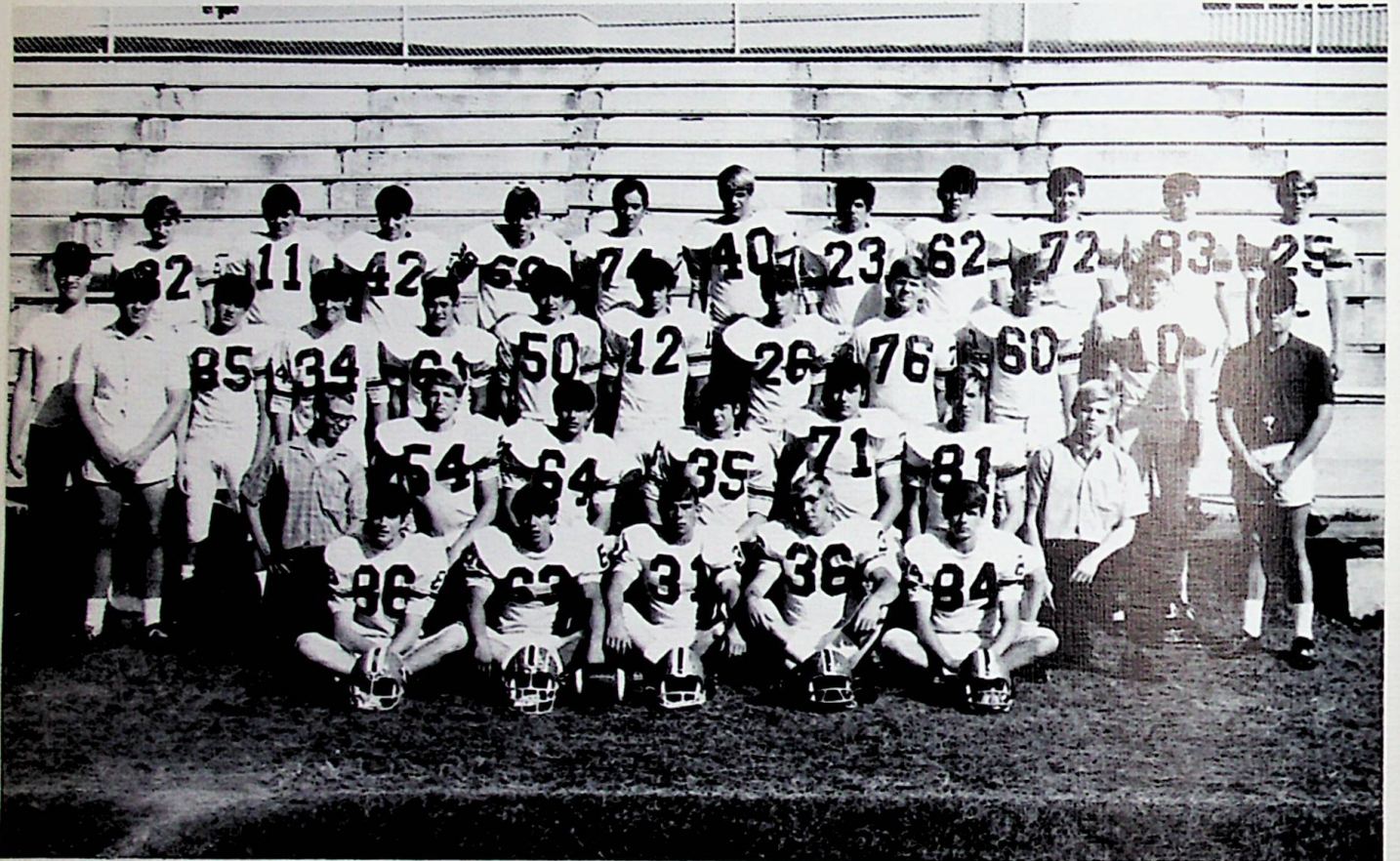


Football 1970

This was the first year for organized freshmen basketball in the county league. The fifteen freshmen boys on the team had a winning season of 11-3.



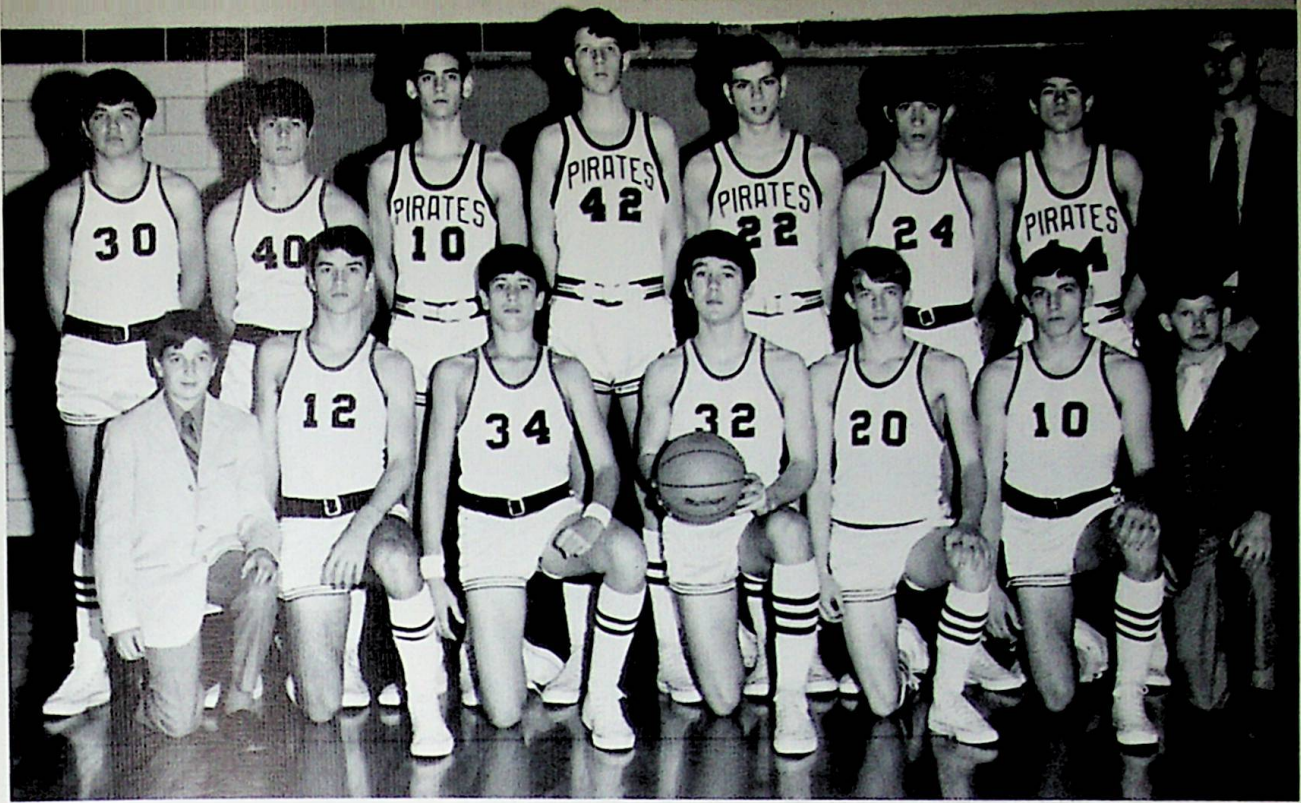

Their year's objective was to send a representative from Wheelersburg High School to Boys' State or Girls' State.



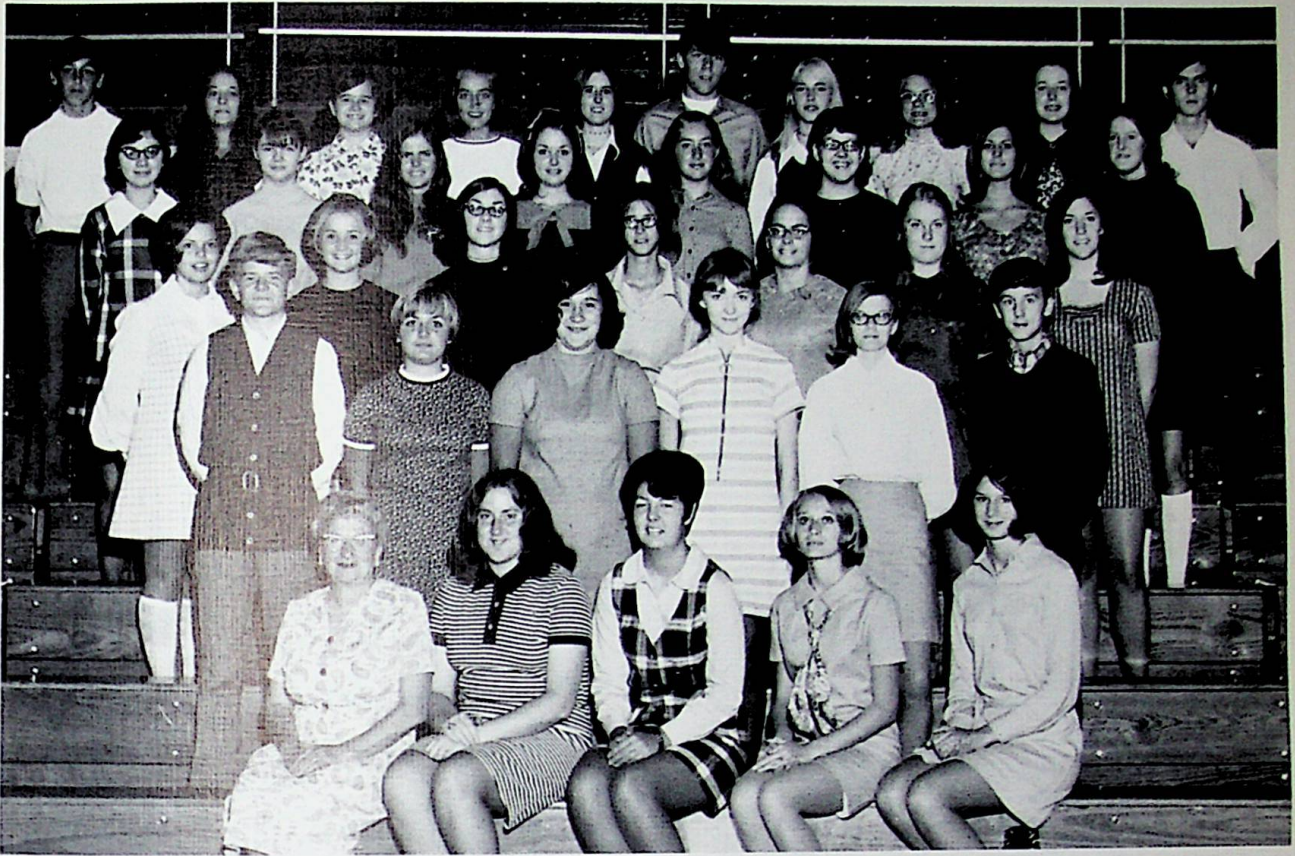

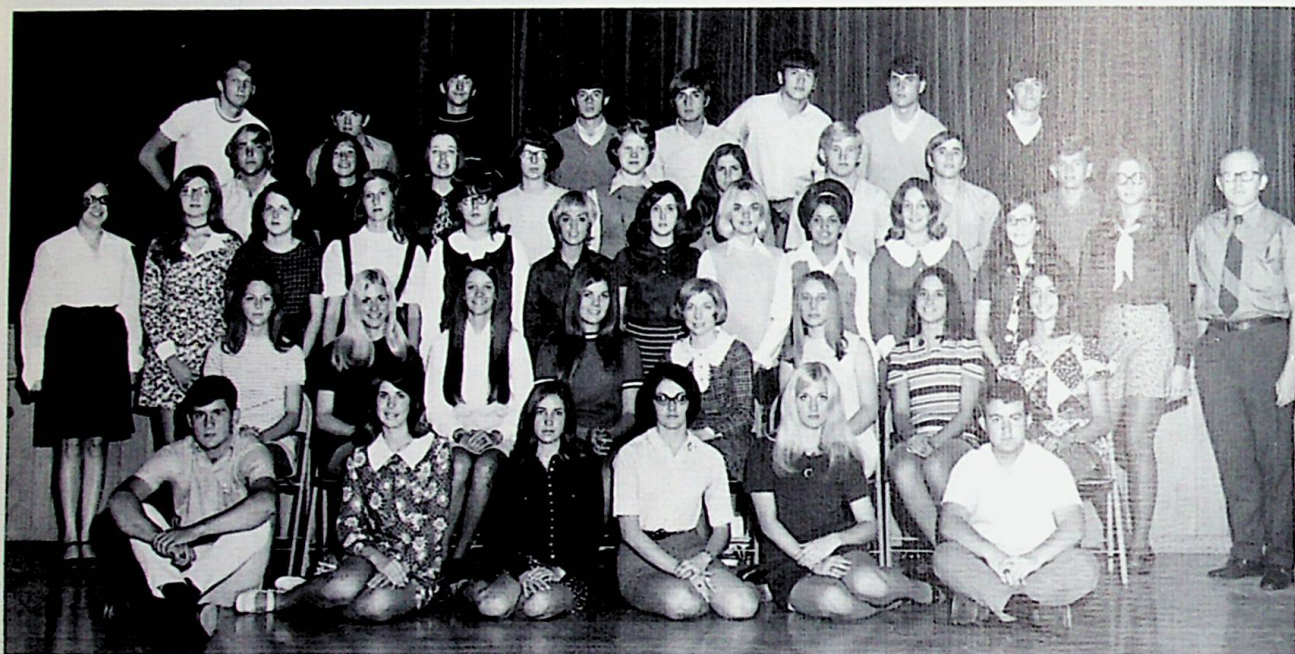
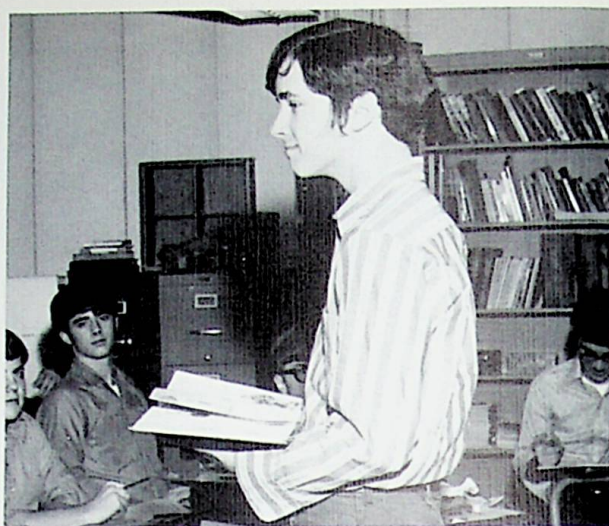
Language Club

The Chess Club and the Science Club pooled their funds and came up with one of the most enjoyable end-of-the-year get-togethers ever.

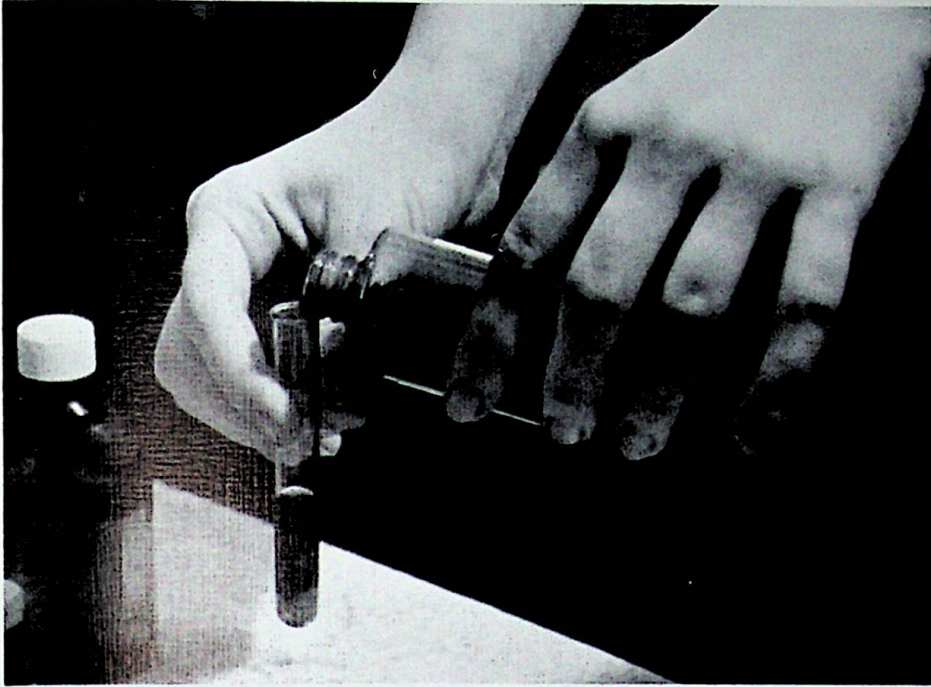

Science Club

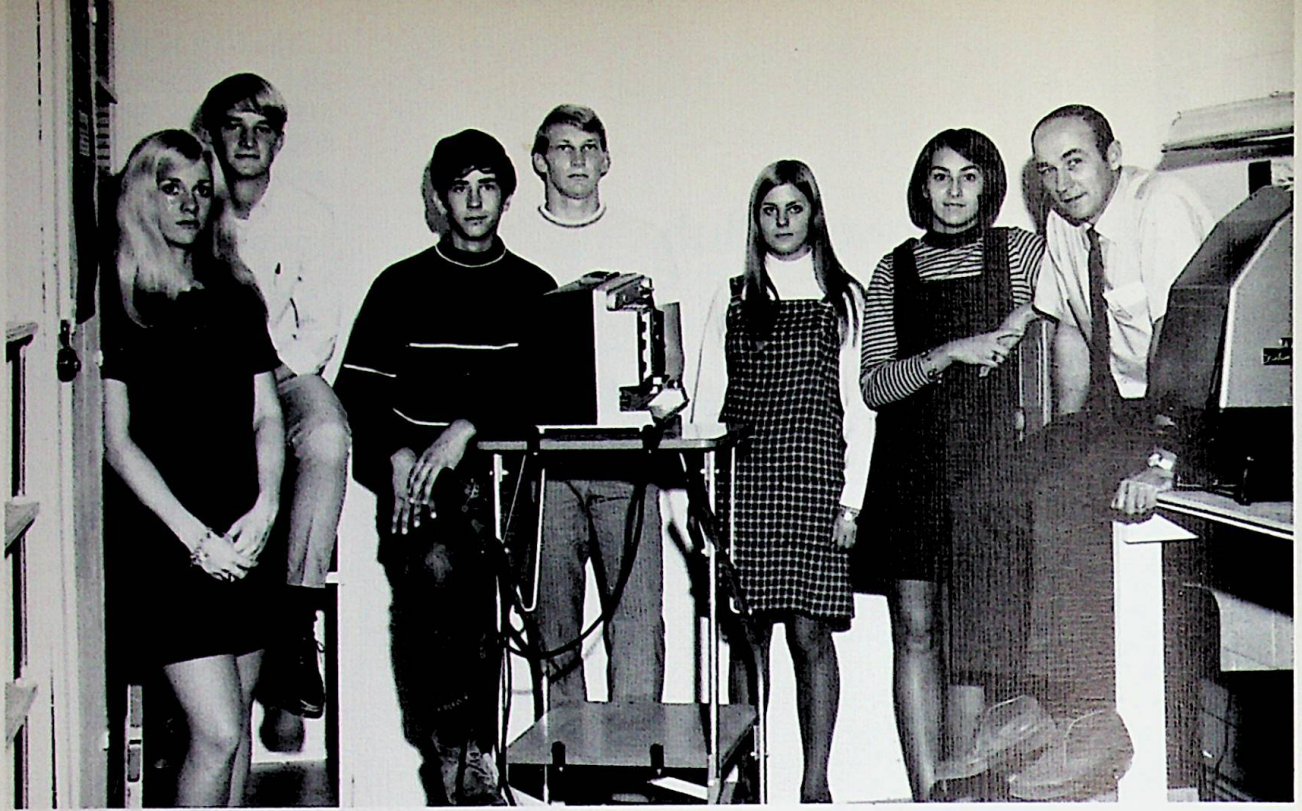

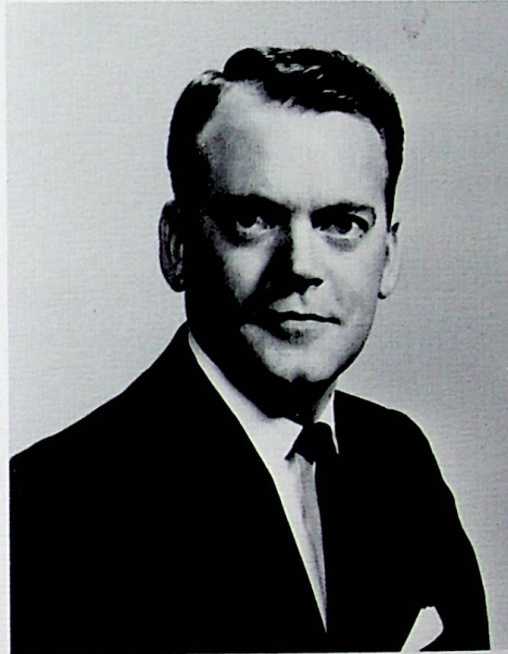


In Memoriam
