



HISTORY SCHOLARS

Brent Cowen and Bill Mitchell were selected from 17,000 high school students throughout Ohio to participate in Ohio University's Thirtyfifth Annual American History Contest. In the preliminary competition, Bill placed first in the state while Brent ranked third in the county. Bill's outstanding score qualified him to be the recipient of the Carl Gustavson Book Award. The final round at the Athens campus involved an essay contest; cash and scholarships were awarded to the winners.

MERIT SEMI-FINALISTS




RIO GRANDE INTERNSHIP WORKSHOP



GINGER MARTIN, CHAMPION FIELD COMMANDER


NATIONAL HONOR







RIGHT TO READ WEEK
