

Our senior year brought the realization that high school really does not last forever. Instead, it is over before you know it. As we prepare to go out into the world, we take with us the lessons we have learned, the


memories we have made, and the skills we have developed in our years at East.

We are proud to say that this year was both a challenging and fun experience. The many new expectations we met this year make us look forward to the ones we will face next year.







More Potential Than Expected






So Few With So Much































National Honor Society
