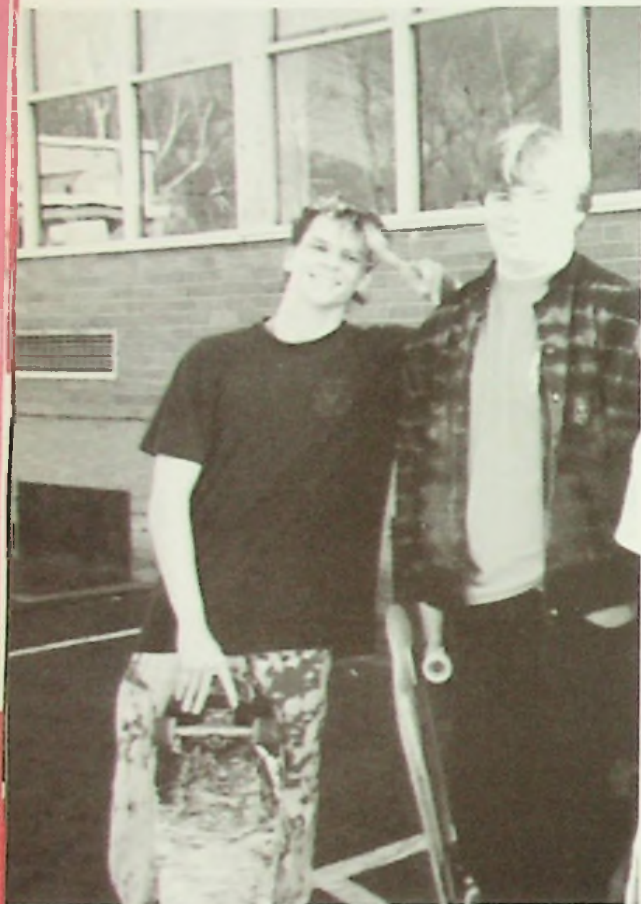

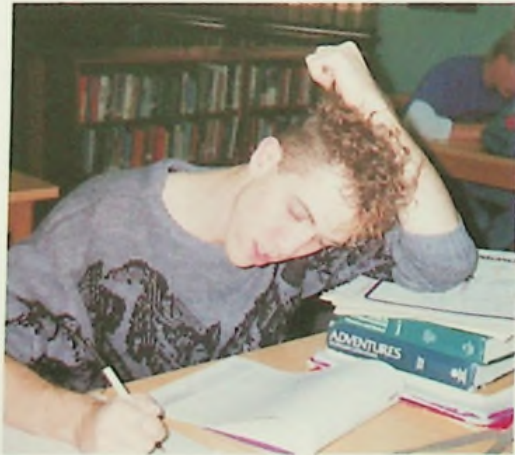

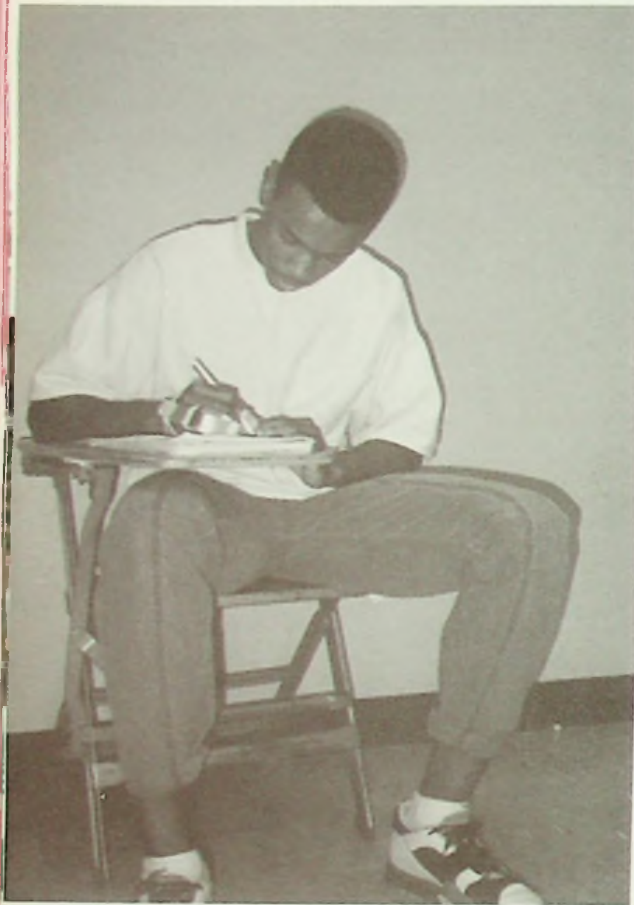

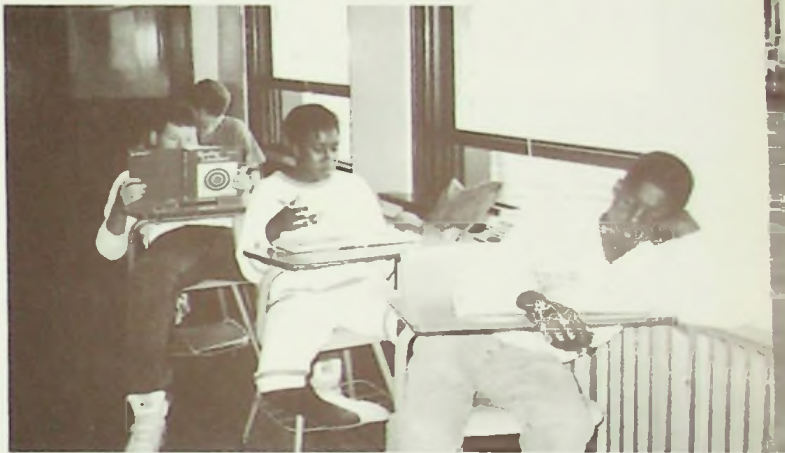

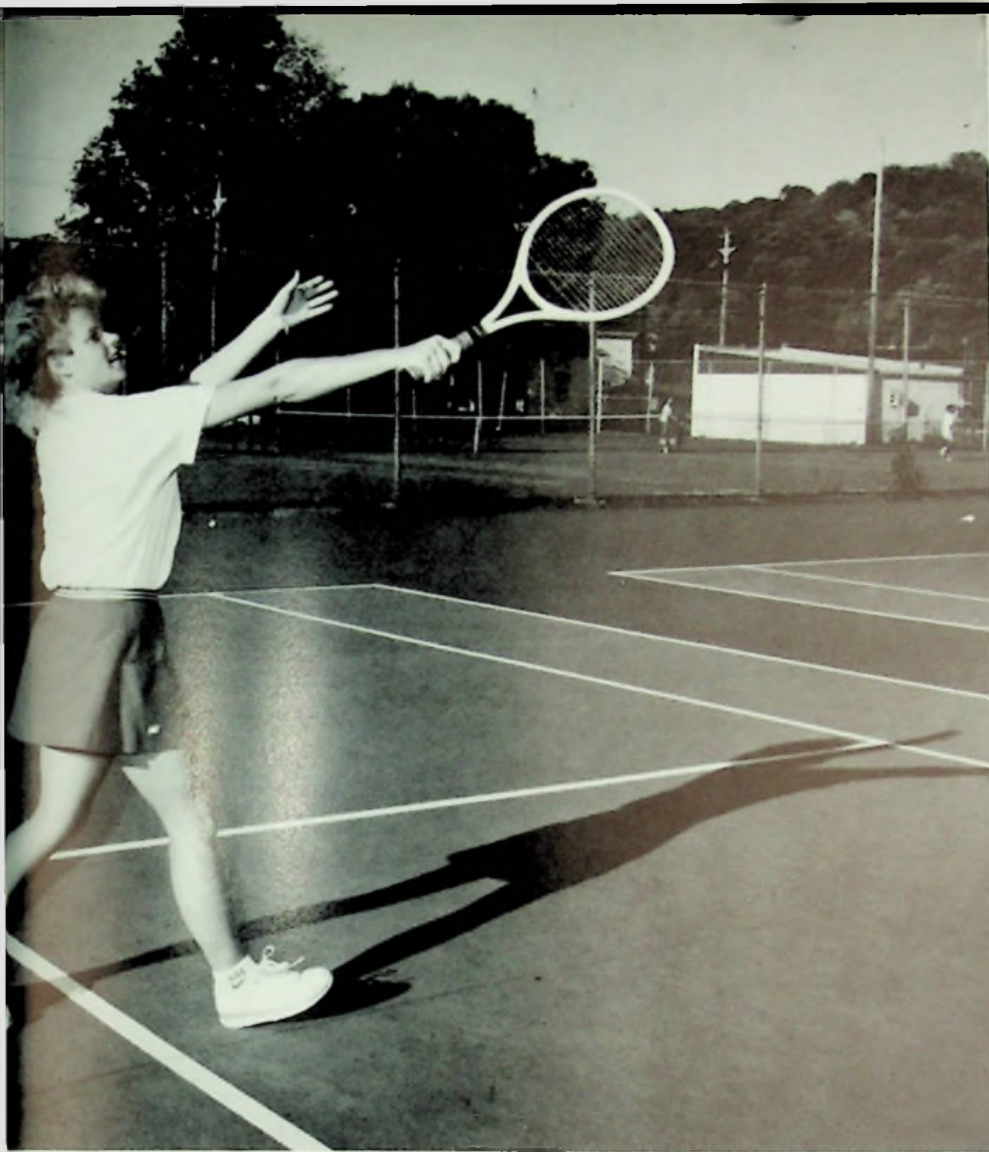

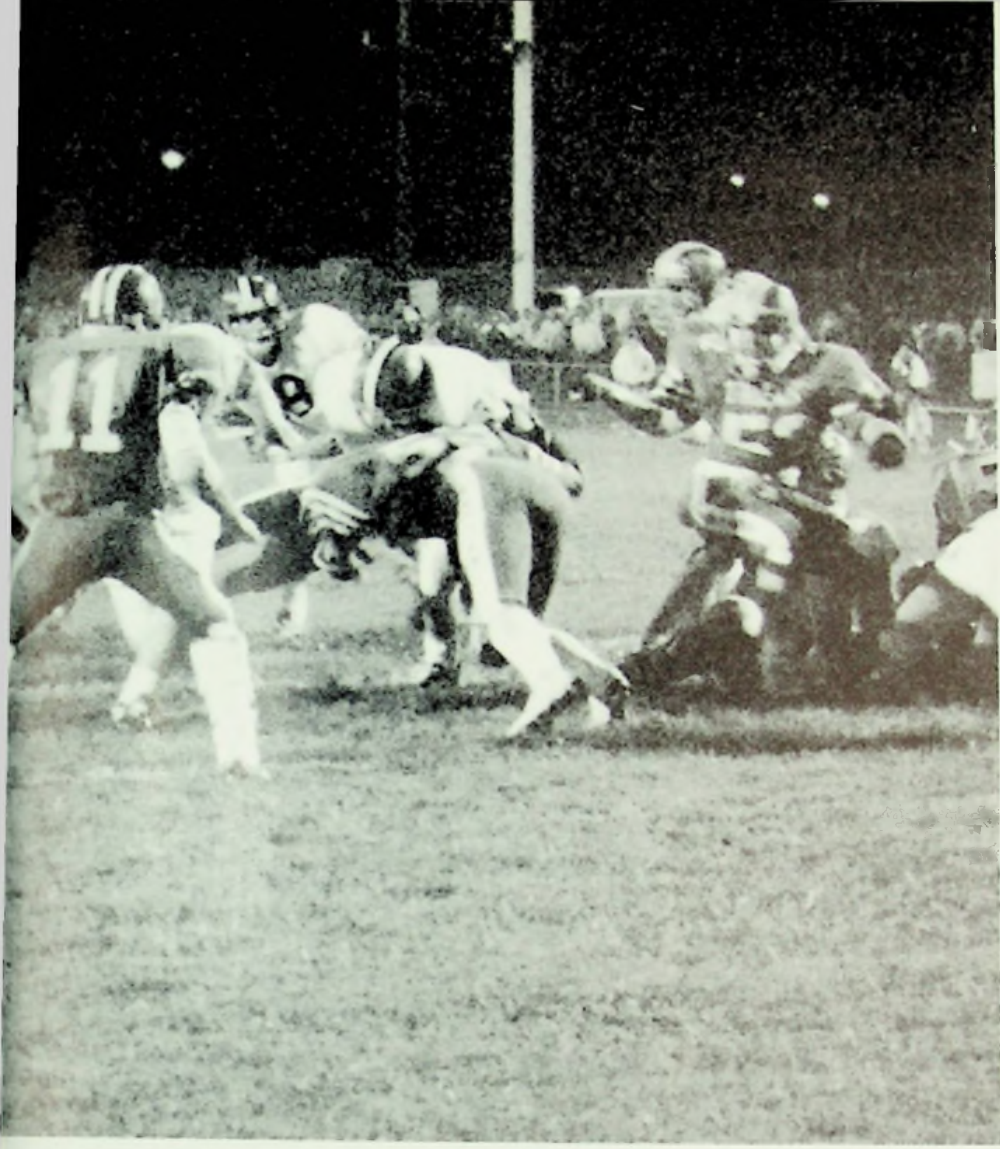
Playoff Bound

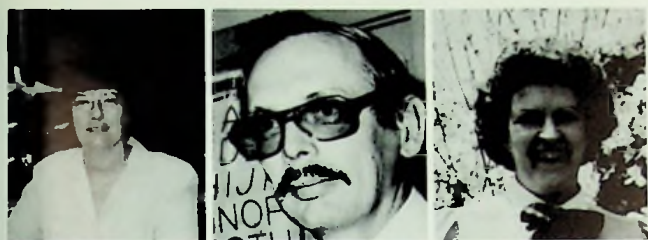

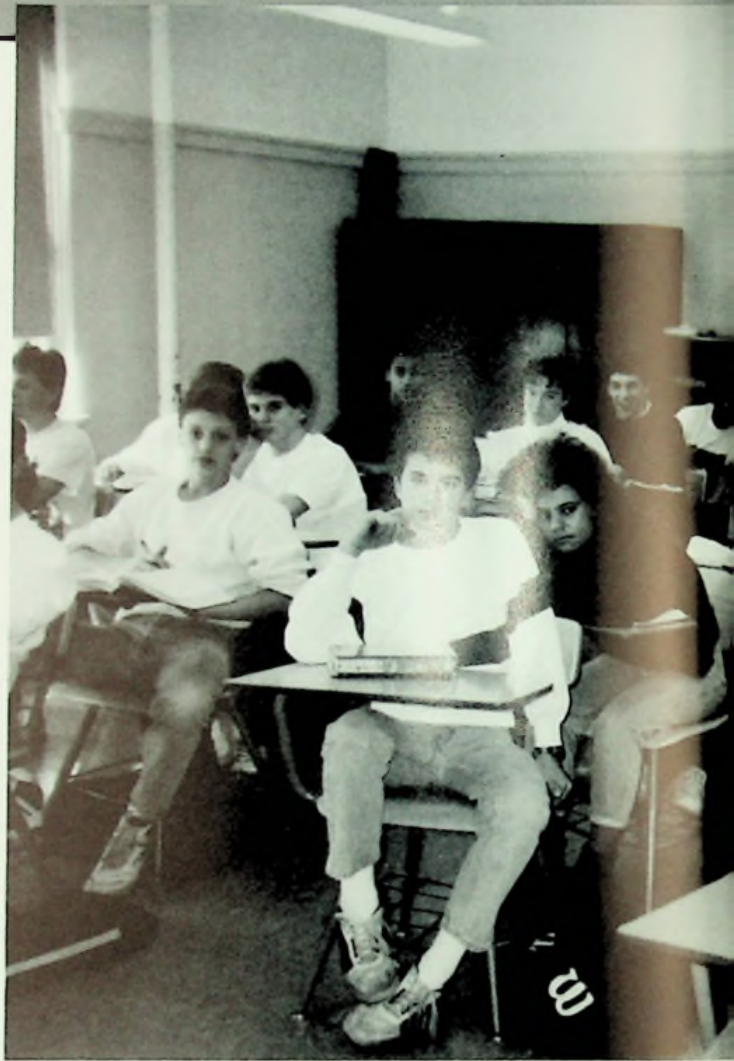
