Each day at noon, the boys take up positions along the street, and see that everyone gets safely across. Due to their vigilance, there has not been a single accident since they have been on duty.

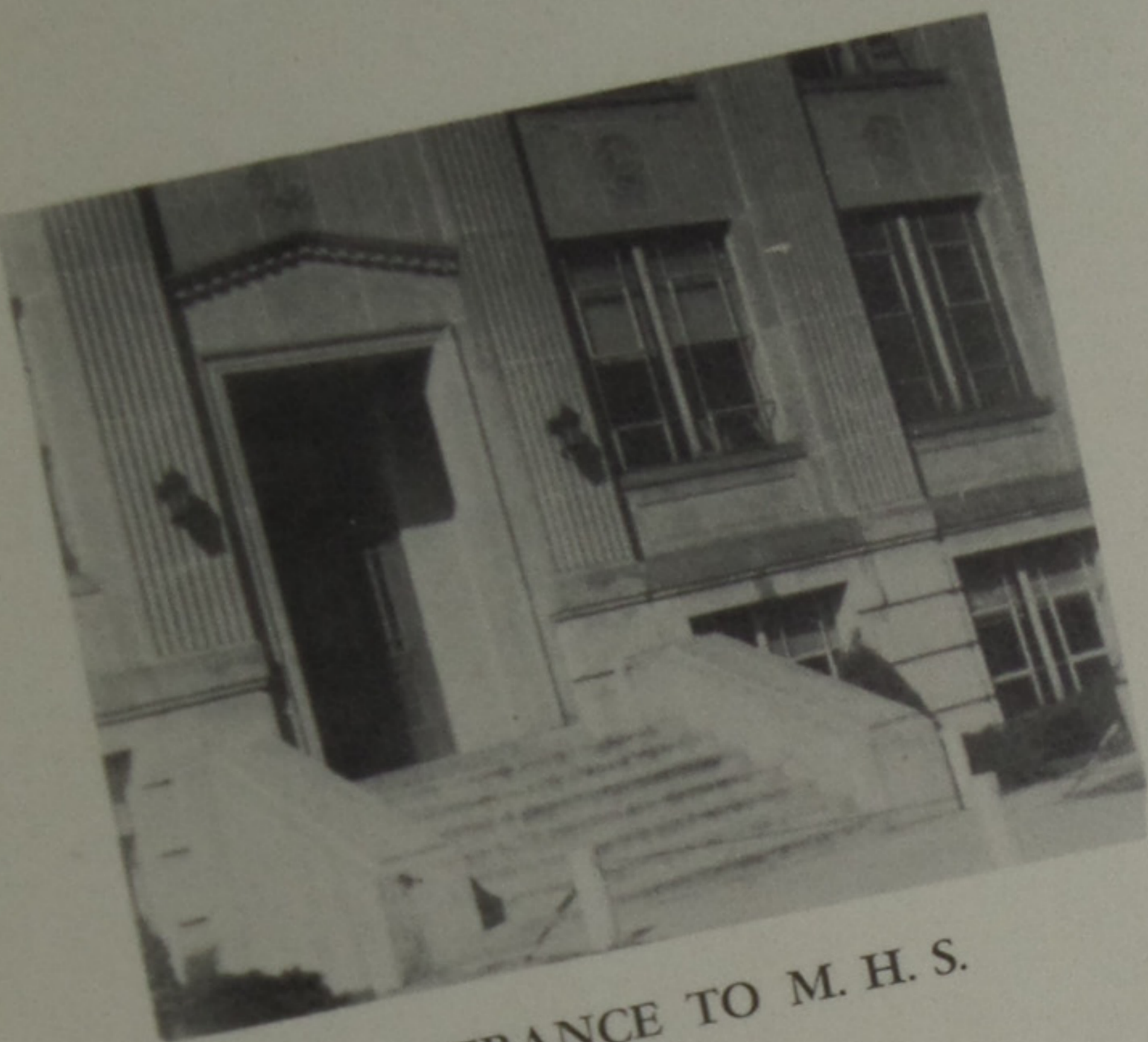
