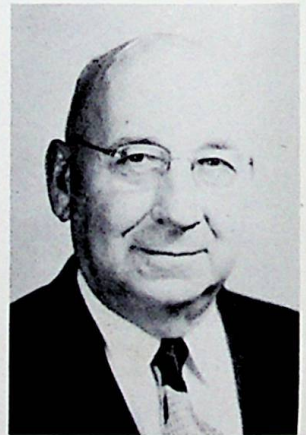


EDWARD R. McCOWEN
