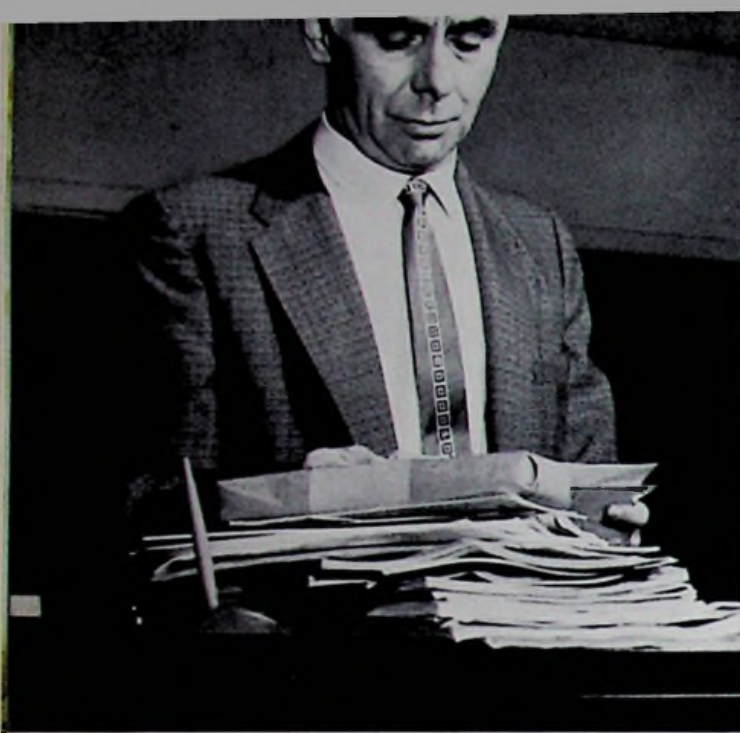
Principal's Message

Two retired teachers with much in common were honored at a party given by New Boston Teachers' Assn. at Harold's Restaurant.

The former teachers, both of whom retired this year, are Mrs. Fern Curry Floyd and Miss Fern Curry Wheeler.

In addition to the similarity in names, Mrs. Floyd and Miss Wheeler have another common factor: Each taught 37 years.

Mrs. Floyd and Miss Wheeler were presented gifts by the Teachers' Assn.

THE PARTY was attended by 63 persons, including three other retired New Boston teachers. They are F. M. Jackson, Herbert C. Rickey and Mary G. Evans. All received recognition passes to New Boston public school activities.

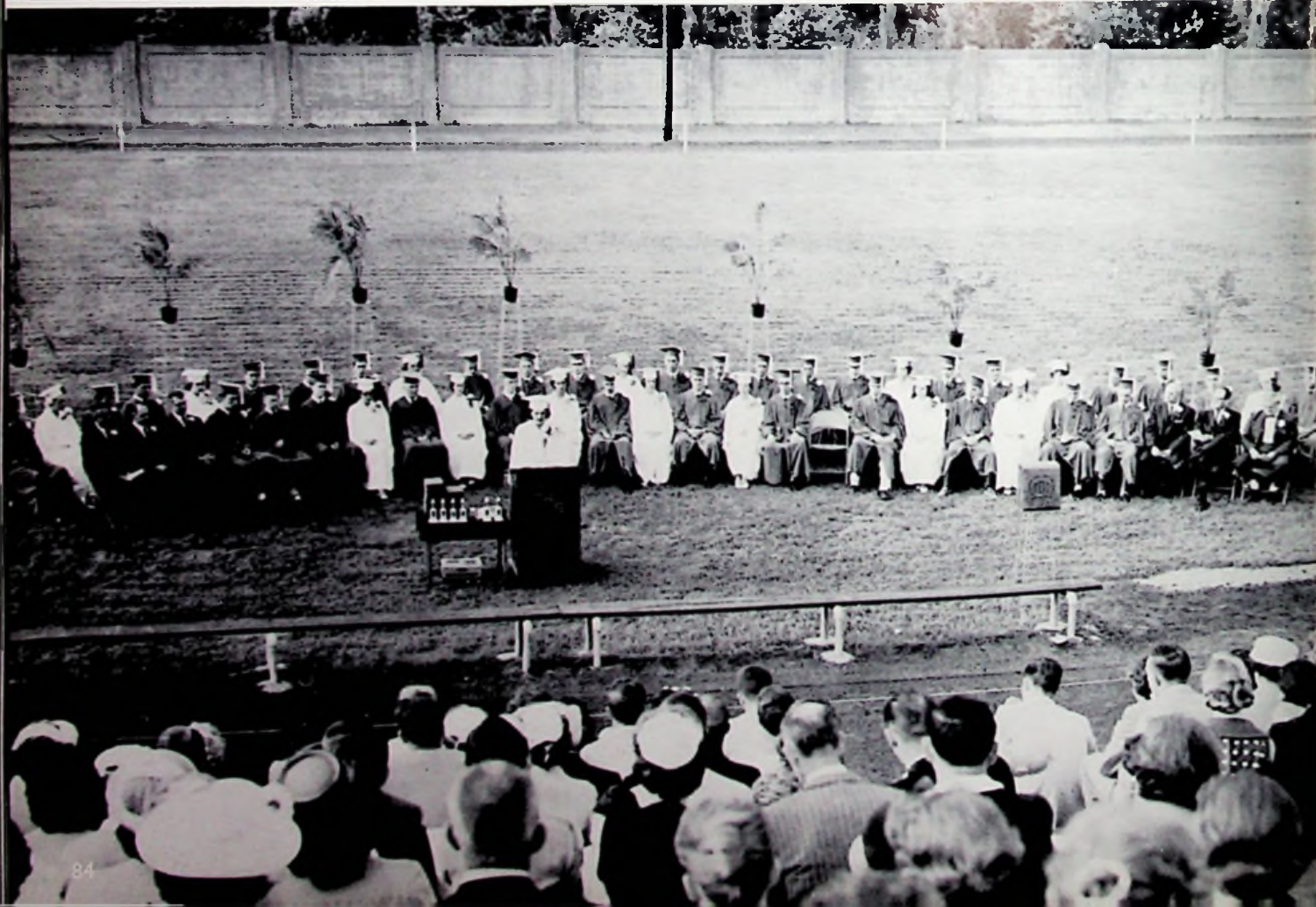


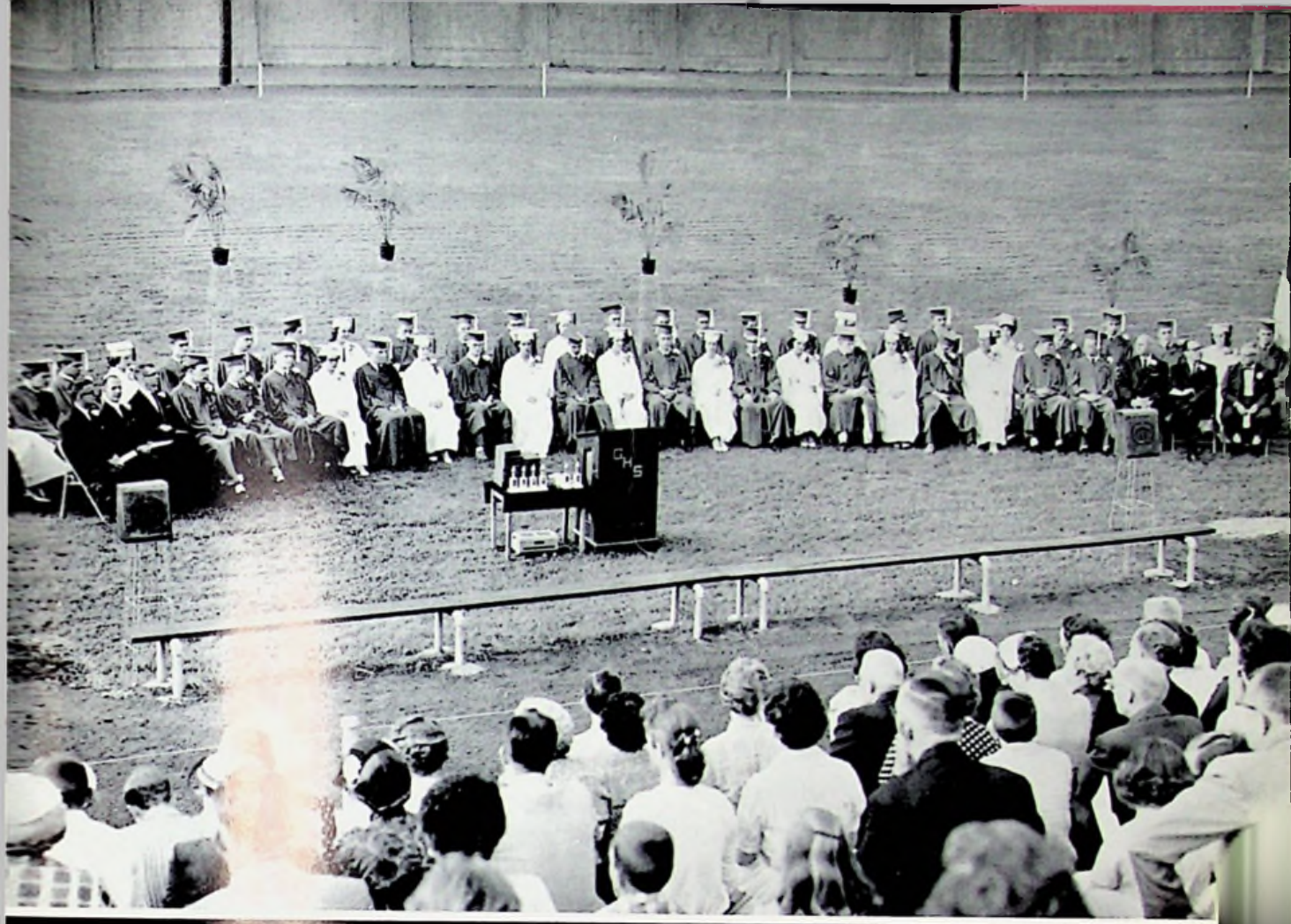
