

A Glance At The Past

In 1860, there were four school districts in Lucasville and the surrounding area.

They were the Johnson School, north of Lucasville at Clifford; Lucasville School, West Street, and later moved to North Street; Cockrell's Run School; and Marsh School, U.S. Route 23, north of Houston Hollow Road.

In 1878, the Miller's Run School was built making five school districts in the Lucasville area.

The schools in Valley Township were consolidated in 1900, and the first central school was located in Lucasville.

In 1911, a new high school was erected. It is now the older section of the former Valley Elementary.

Due to an increase in enrollment, in 1928, another new high school was built. It served as the high school until 1956, and currently is Valley Intermediate.

Construction on the "old" high school began in 1955, with 1957 being the first graduating class. It is currently being renovated to house grades six through eight in the Valley Local School District.

The Dream Becomes Reality



The levy was passed, the land purchased, construction began, and we were able to see that the dream was finally becoming reality.

We eagerly anticipated the completion of the new schools. Monday, April 12, 1993, was set as the date for instruction to begin in the new schools. Spring break was spent moving books and other supplies from the old buildings into the new.

Unexpectedly, on Sunday, April 11, a riot at the Southern Ohio Correctional Facility put the dream on hold. Classes in the Valley Local School District were cancelled for nine days.

When the uprising was settled, the dream finally became reality as students and faculty entered the new buildings on Friday, April 23, 1993.

A Message From The Superintendent

DREAM BECOMES REALITY AS VALLEY BUILDS

FOR THE 21ST CENTURY

This dedication booklet is provided to commemorate this historic occasion and introduce to the public our new Valley Elementary and new Valley High School. The construction of these facilities is an event that brings a great deal of pride to our local school community. The history of our school district is well documented and preserved, but now we have facilities to take our students well into the 21st Century.

To preserve these memories for our current high school students, as well as the supportive community members who made this dream possible, we included a sixteen page color section in our 1993 annual yearbook, as well as printing these copies of this special commemorative issue.

I feel that it is appropriate to dedicate our new schools to the students for their enhanced learning opportunities, to the staff and students for their excellent environment in which to teach and learn, and to our community which so proudly supported our most precious assets - our children.

The new high school is built for 500 students and the elementary for 600 students. Both climate-controlled buildings feature large computer rooms and libraries. The floors are carpeted or tiled in appropriate areas. The elementary contains four classrooms for each grade level, kindergarten through fifth grade, as well as a carpeted gymnasium designed especially for elementary students. Both buildings received new furniture.

The high school features academic classrooms and specialty rooms for art, drafting, music, industrial arts, home economics, laboratory science and business. The gymnasium area includes locker rooms, storage areas for equipment, a training room, and a weight room. The two-level cafeteria, seating more than 400 persons, contains a stage with lighting suitable for musical and theatrical productions. Each student will be assigned his own locker, equipped with a combination lock.

There are many other unique features to our buildings for meeting the needs of our handicapped. We have the following: (1) hardware that is easy to operate on all doors, (2) alarms for the hearing impaired, (3) braille on room signs, (4) curb cuts, (5) Extra exterior and interior lighting, (6) restrooms and facilities easily accessible to all.

The Valley Local students, staff, and Board of Education invite you to take a good look not only as our new facilities, but a leader in education, the VALLEY LOCAL SCHOOLS.


The spacious elementary library is equipped with furniture designed specially for grade school students. Approximately 98% of all the furniture in both buildings is new.

The classrooms in the elementary building include open storage areas for students' coats and belongings. Also, incorporated into each room are built-in storage and file cabinets for teacher use.





Valley Schools Prepared For The 21st Century

Education in Ohio has undergone many changes over the past few years and many more changes are expected. The recently completed elementary and high school buildings in the Valley Local School District have been designed with these changes in mind.

The number one priority in designing the schools was academics. All classrooms have been created to facilitate learning and include ample storage, modern desks, carpeting (which helps eliminate noise), and are air conditioned for comfort. The speciality rooms such as the computer labs, science rooms, art rooms, etc., have been designed and furnished with modern equipment to increase student learning opportunities.

Since a well-rounded curriculum focuses on more than scholastic achievement, modern sports facilities have been created for students. The gymnasiums have been designed to enhance physical education programs, as well as extracurricular athletic events.


The completion of the two new buildings, along with the future renovation of the old high school, will enable the Valley School District to meet the educational needs of students as we move into the 21st century.

Venetian inds are incorporated between the inside and outside glasses of the windows.

The students' restrooms in the elementary building have been designed for easy access for the handicapped. The automatic sinks are open to the hallway for teachers to supervise students' activities. The primary colors, shown on the tiled walls, are appropriate to an elementary school and are used throughout the building.











A second grade classroom featuring the Leisure Boards which have been installed in all of the classrooms in both buildings. The contemporary surface of the Leisure Boards allows not only for the use of traditional chalk, but also water-color markers and permanent markers.


The Industrial Arts area of the high school has been equipped with modern machinery. The staircase leads to a loft for storage. An overhead door to the room allows for convenient delivery of supplies.

The Music Department features a large tiered practice area. Also included are a uniform storage room, instrument storage room, small practice room for students, and teachers' office.









The hallway in the west wing of the high school. The student lockers located in the hallways can be programmed with five different combinations, and will be changed at the beginning of each school year.








These are just a few of the notable events and happenings this school year that went beyond imagination, and helped make the 1992-93 school year such a memorable one.





Serving as the team's bailiff and timekeeper was Ben Ogg.



For the first time in school history, the Indians went 10-0. They were S.O.C. Division I Champions, and were rated number 19 in the state.






Mr. Ed Kelly retired as Maintenance Supervisor of the Valley Local School District on July 1, 1993.
