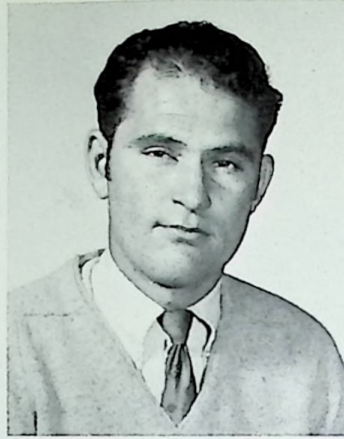

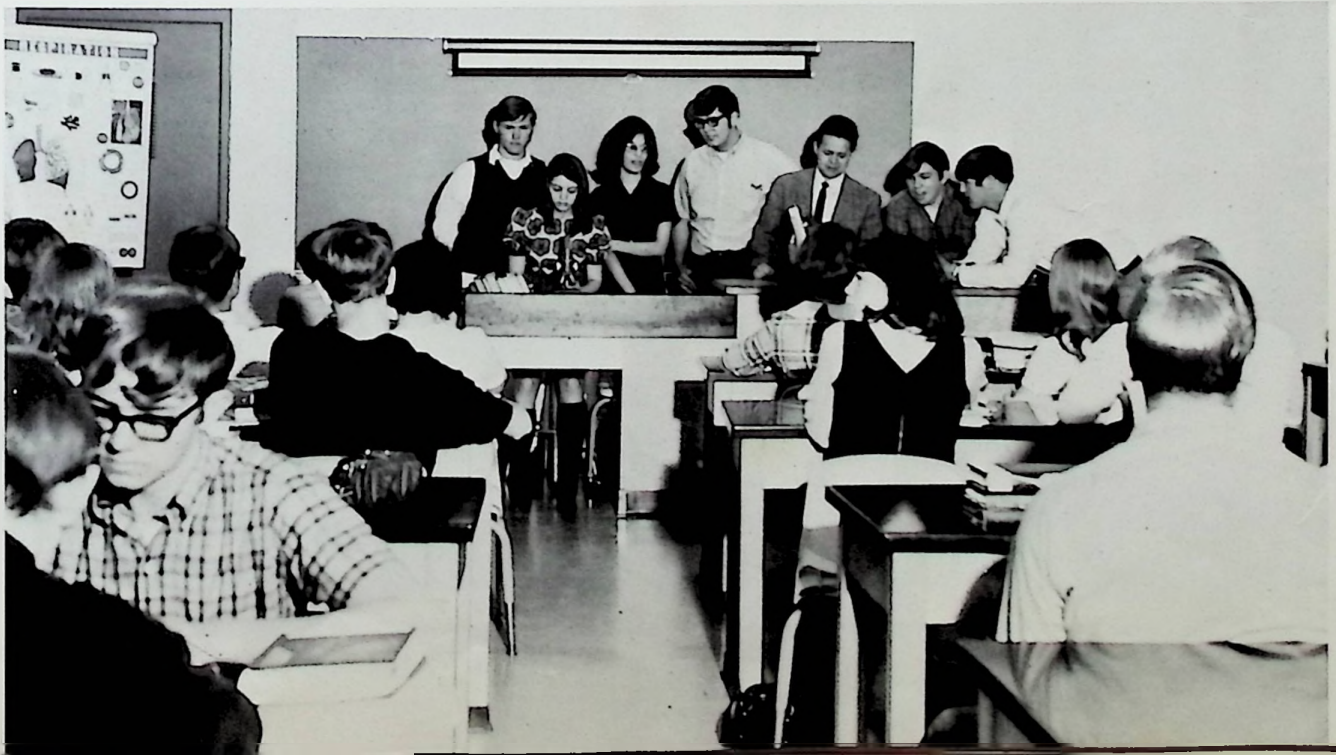
Science Teachers Aid Students in Solving Questions of Environment

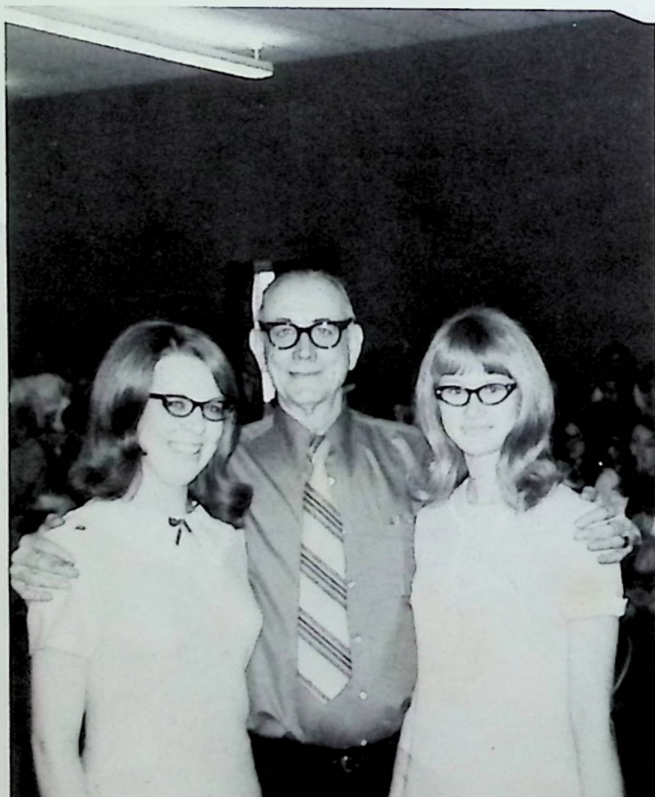

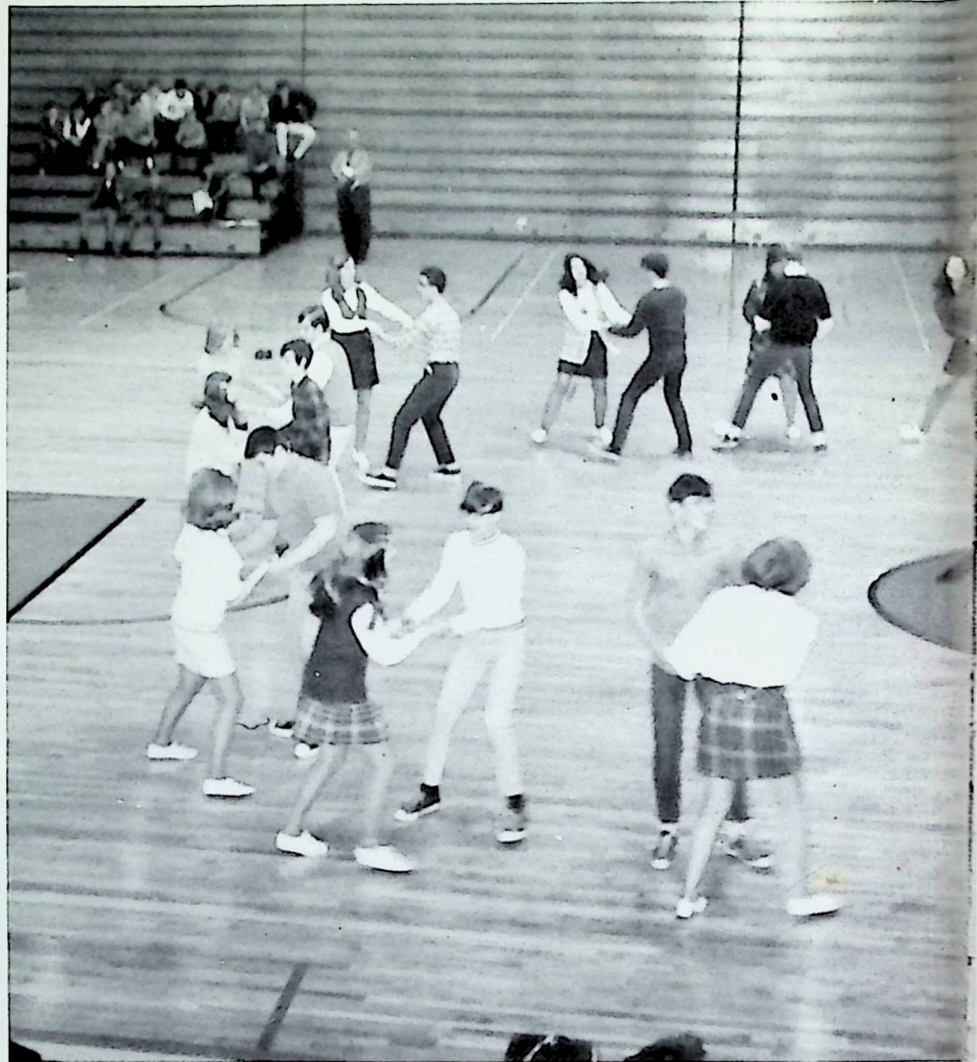

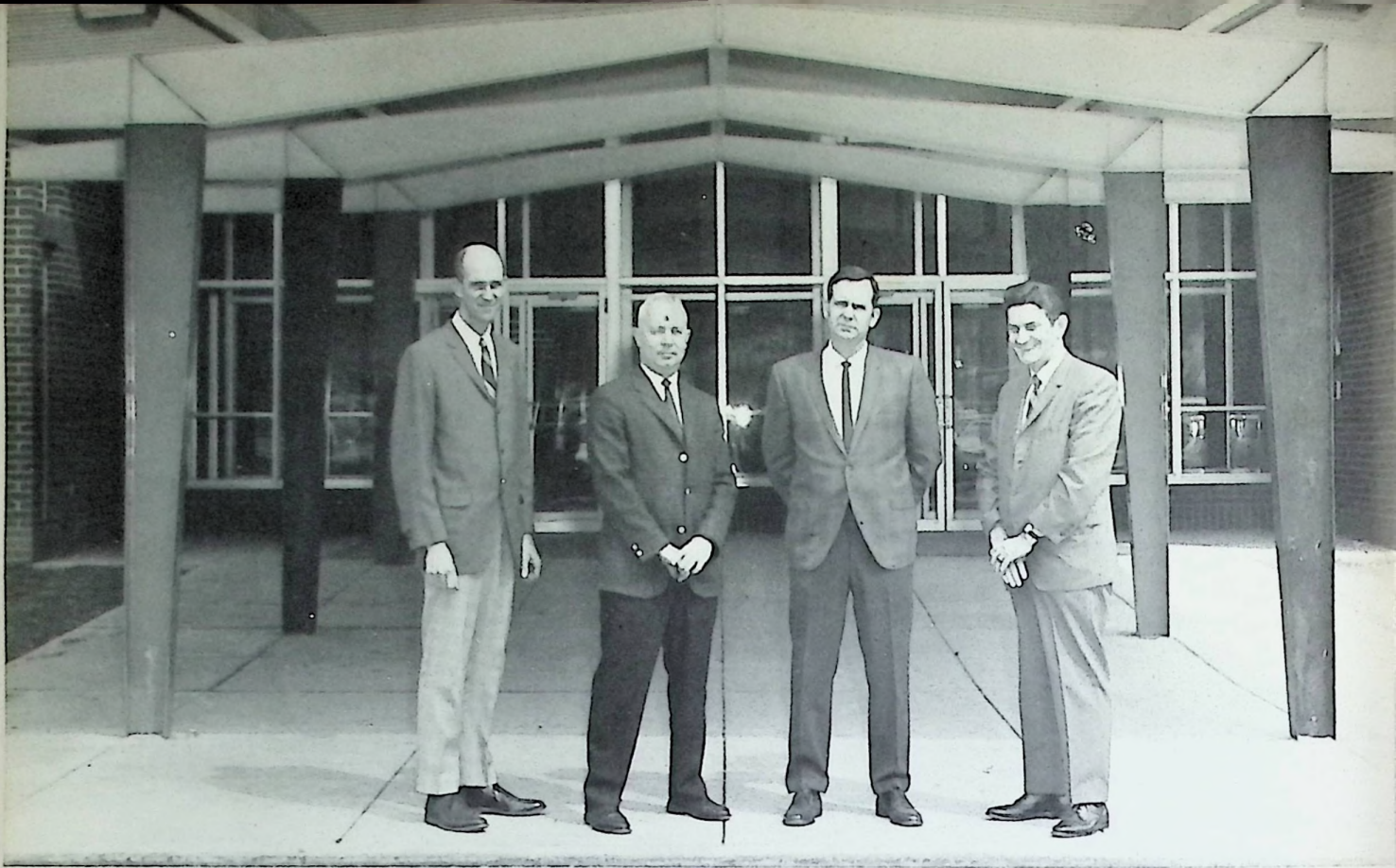

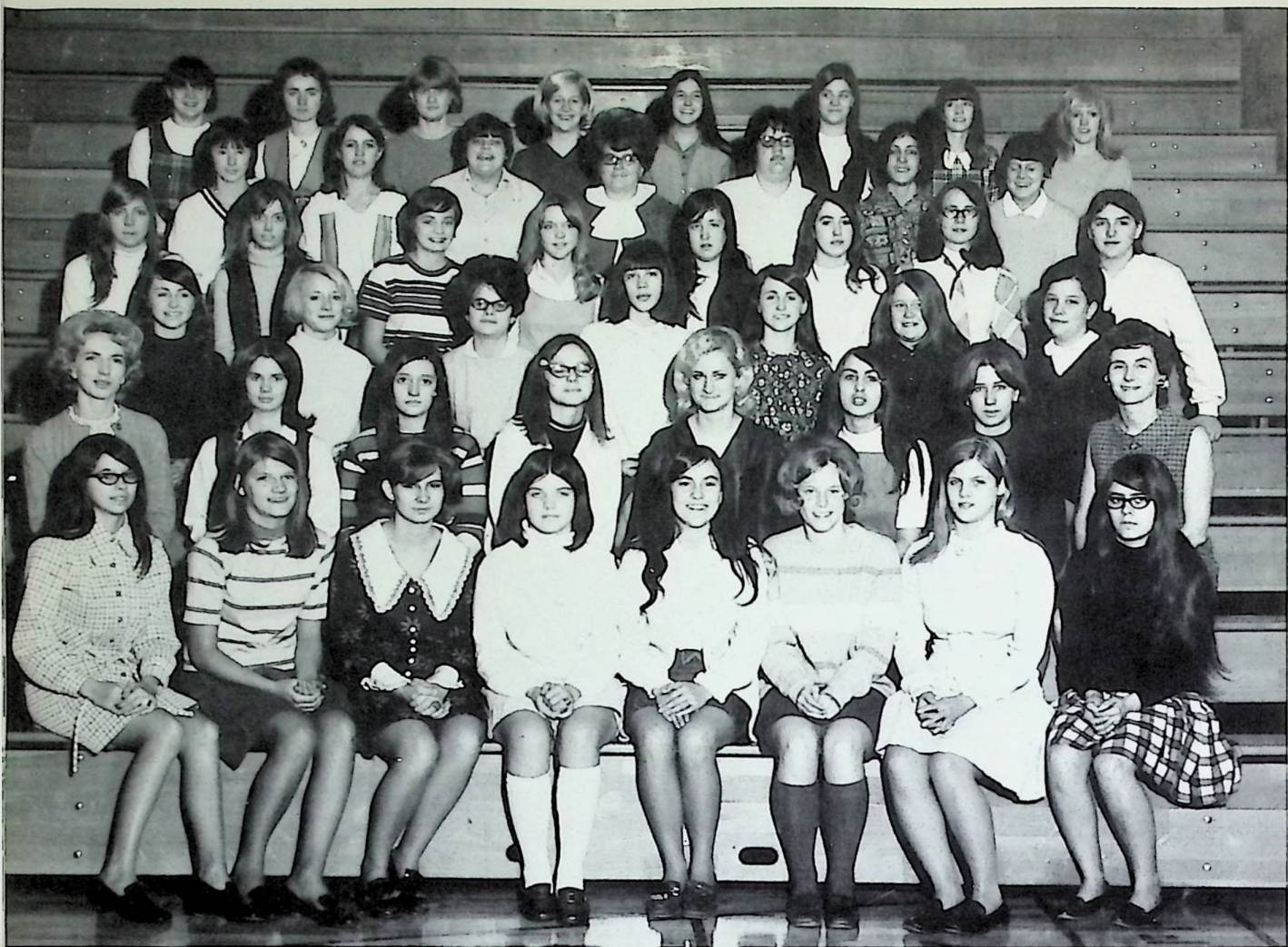


Officer at F.T.A. State Convention

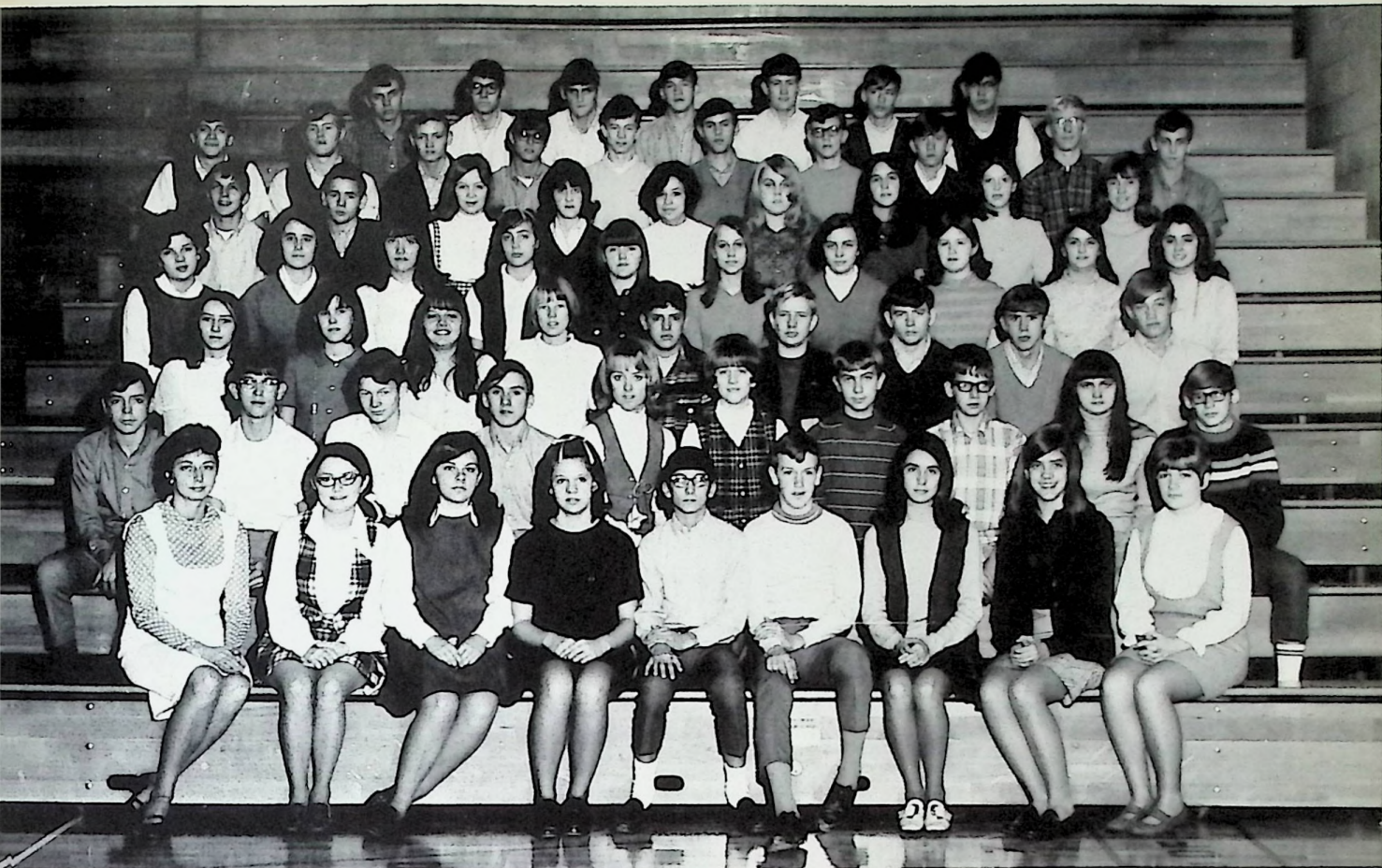
