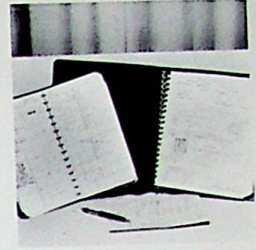
May this yearbook bring back fond memories of the labors which are the foundations of your future and may the rewards be great.

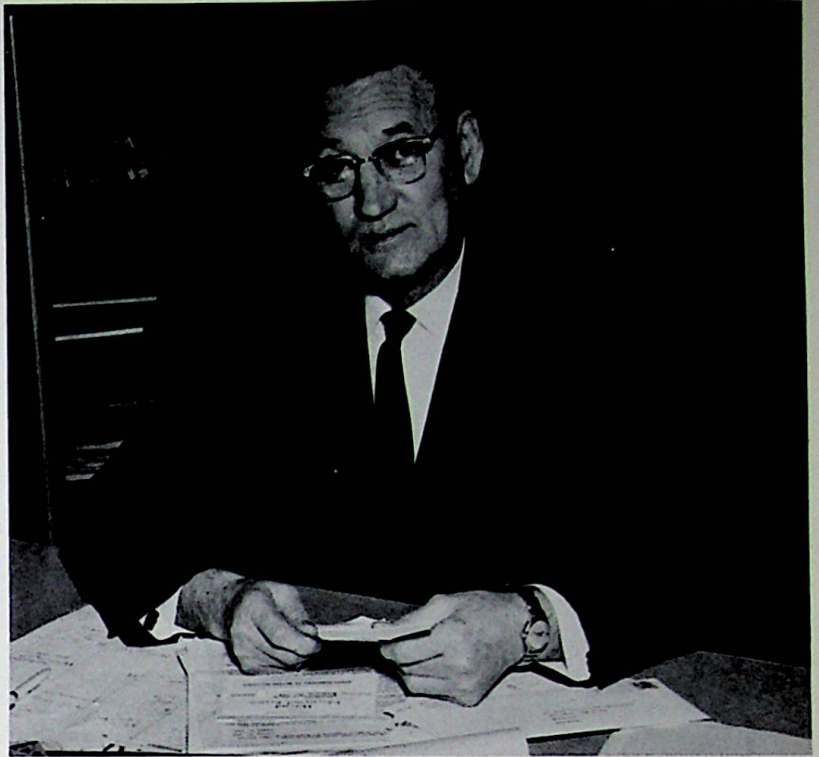
OUR HARD WORKING

Our local school board is an elected group of men who organize and maintain a system of graded schools in our township. They give many hours of time to see that our school system operates efficiently.

Mr. Arthur D. Preston is the Local Superintendent of Wheelersburg Schools. This means that he is very busy in the field of public relations. Mr. Preston is the coordinator between the Board of Education and the entire personnel of the school system. He acts as planning commissioner to incorporate all federal, state, and local aid to improve education. In addition Mr. Preston secures and recommends to the Board of Education all personnel. The Superintendent works closely with the county Superintendent and County Board. Mr. Preston attended Ohio University, University of Cincinnati and received his B.S. in Education at Wilmington College. He has done graduate work at Marshall University.

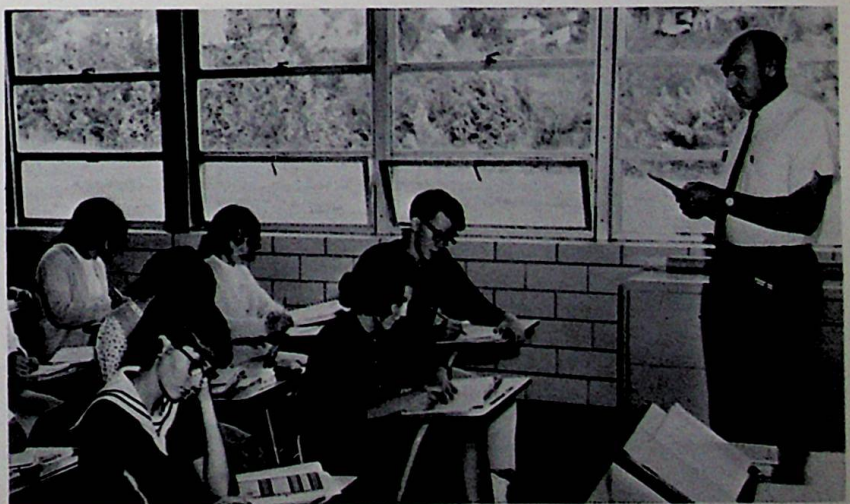
KEY TO THE BUSINESS WORLD

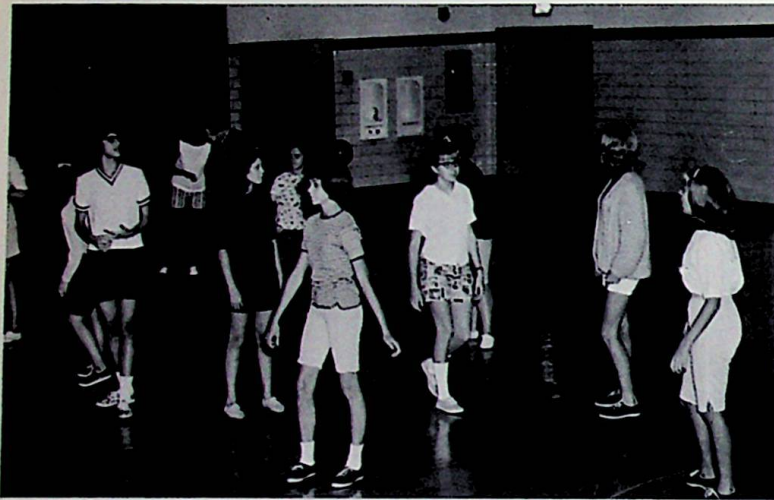

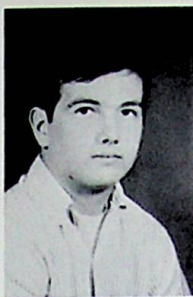
With able officers and helpful sponsors to guide them, the Junior class accepted the responsibilities of upperclassmen. In return, they received a feeling of unity never before experienced.

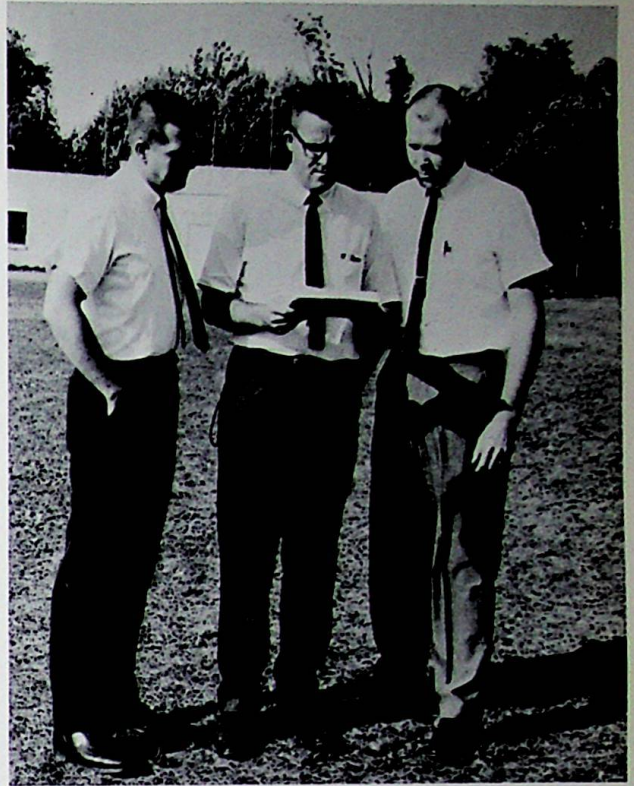
The 1965 football season was full of excitement for the loyal, enthusiastic Pirate fans. The Pirates played well and finished the season with an impressive 7-3 record.
