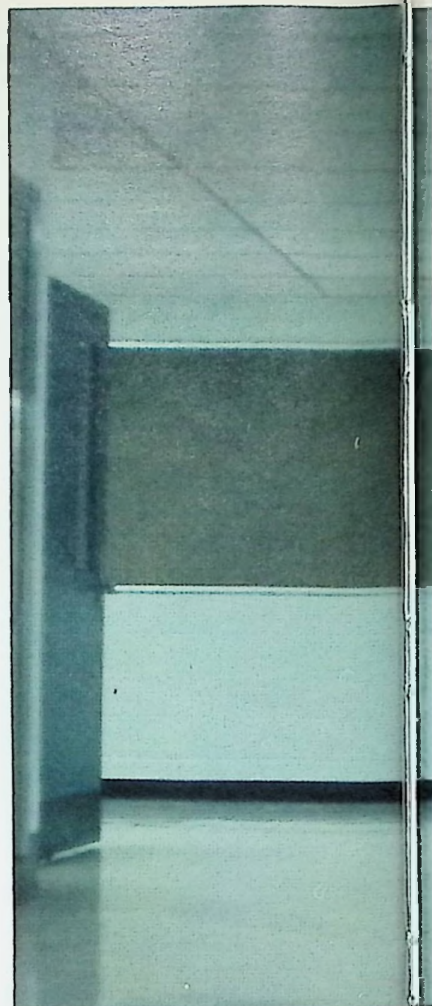


The seasons go quickly but always return. Spring, summer, fall, winter . . . They revolve; a year is over. I, like that year, am constantly changing into the person I am to become.



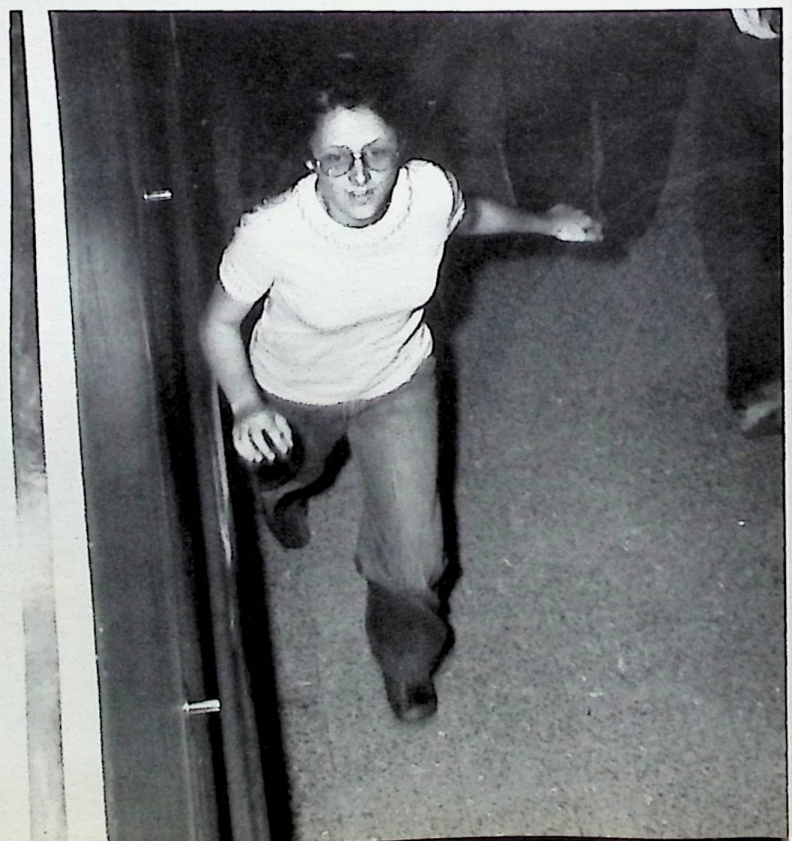
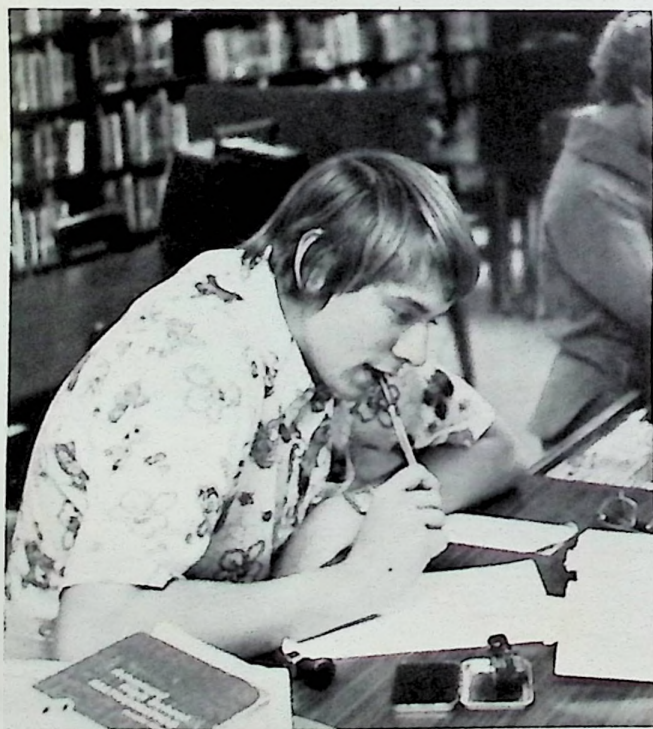


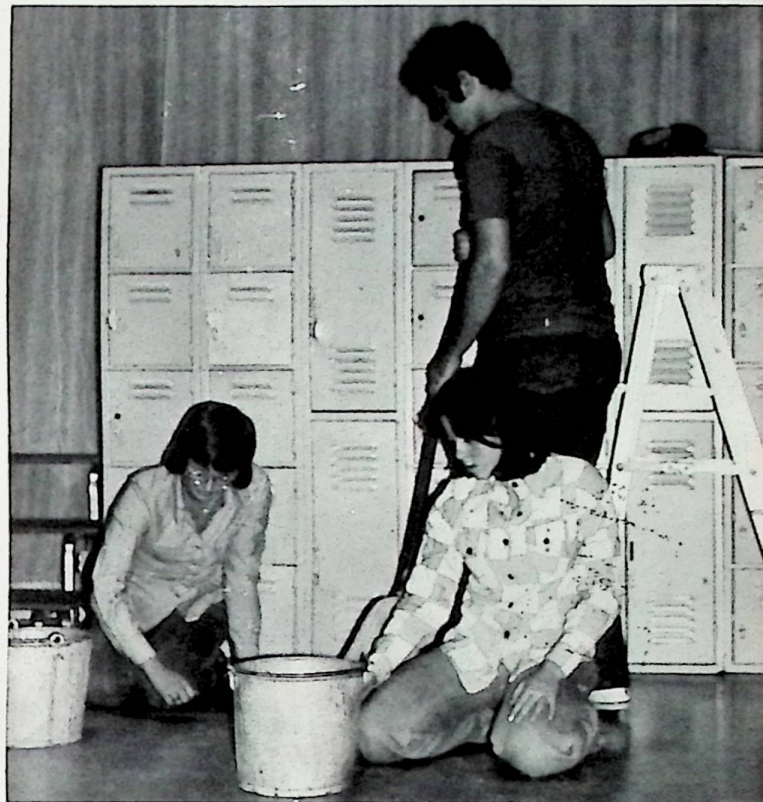

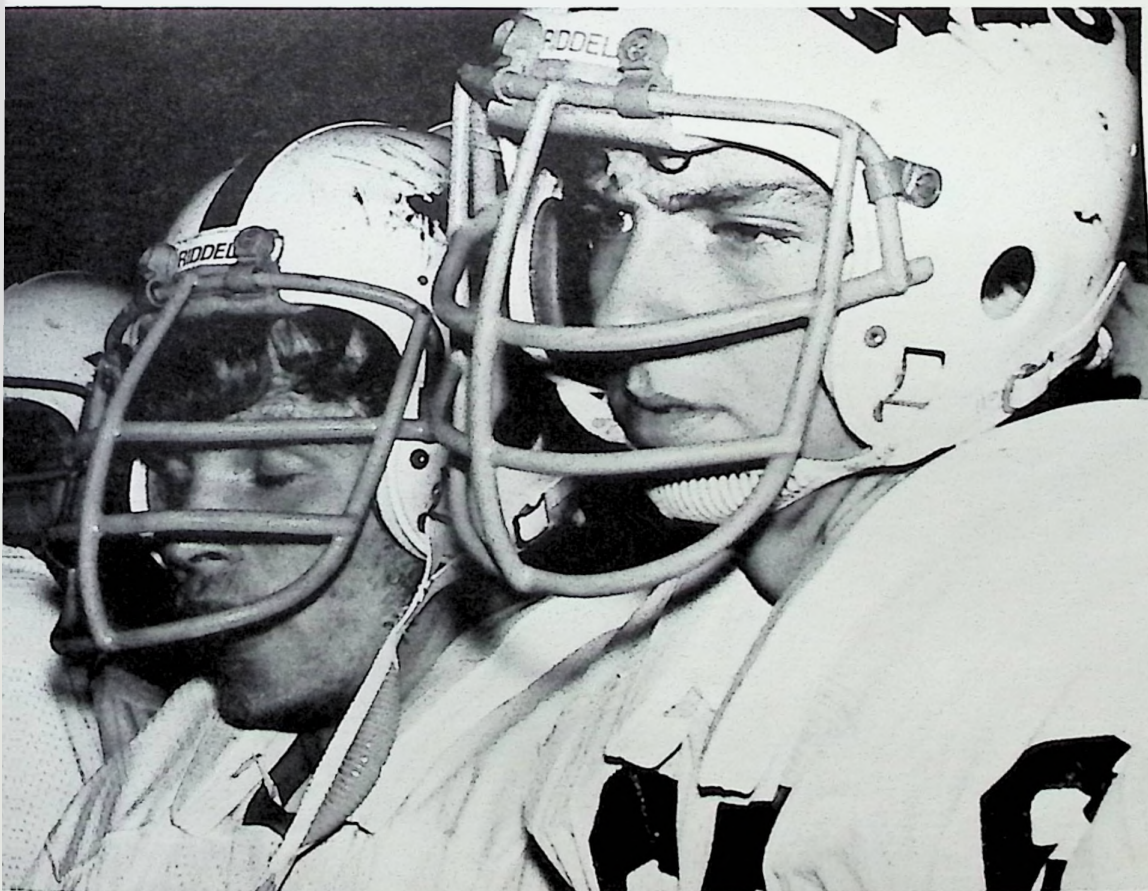


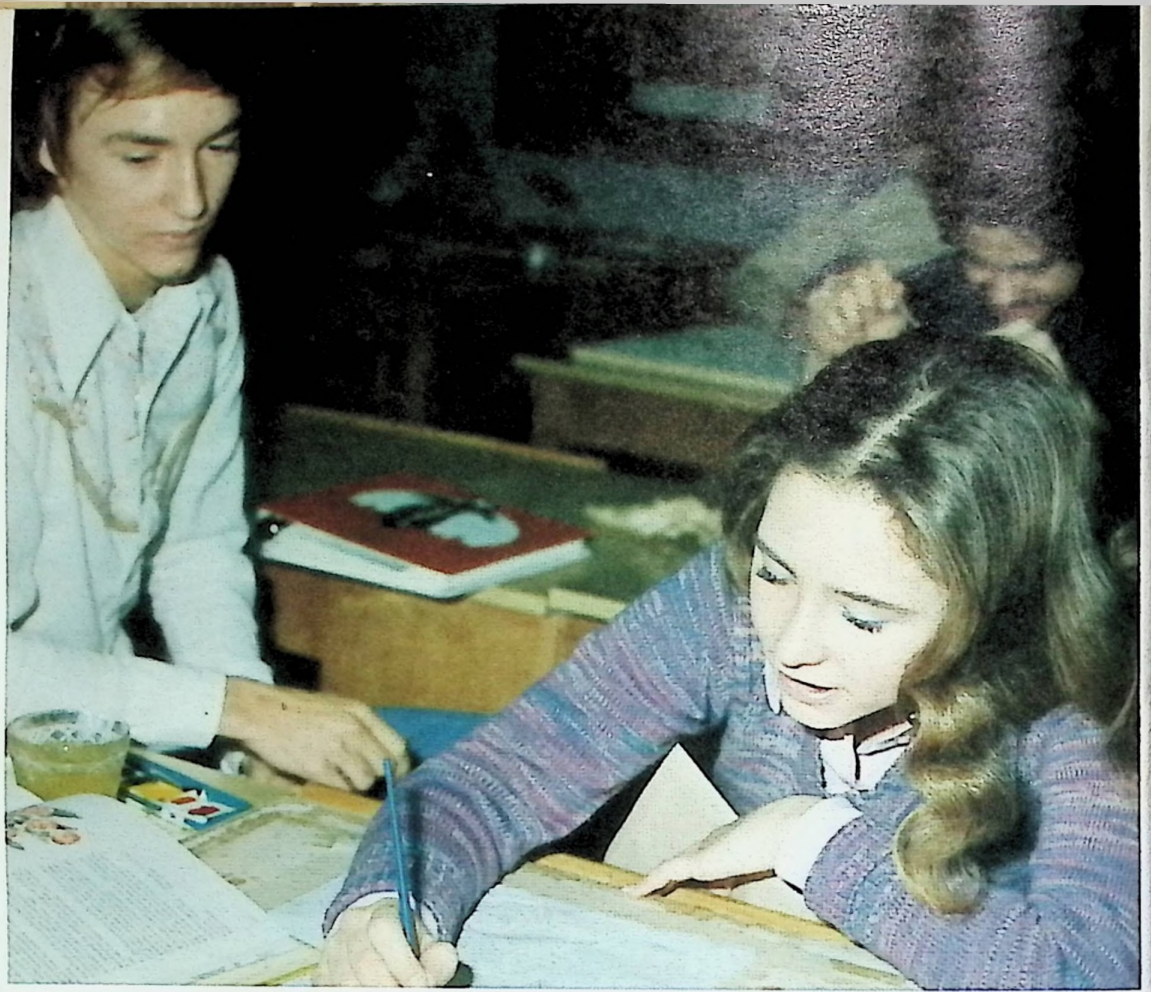






At times, those changes bring loneliness. At others, humility, patience, exhilaration. Then I cannot move; nothing changes; it's the grind.

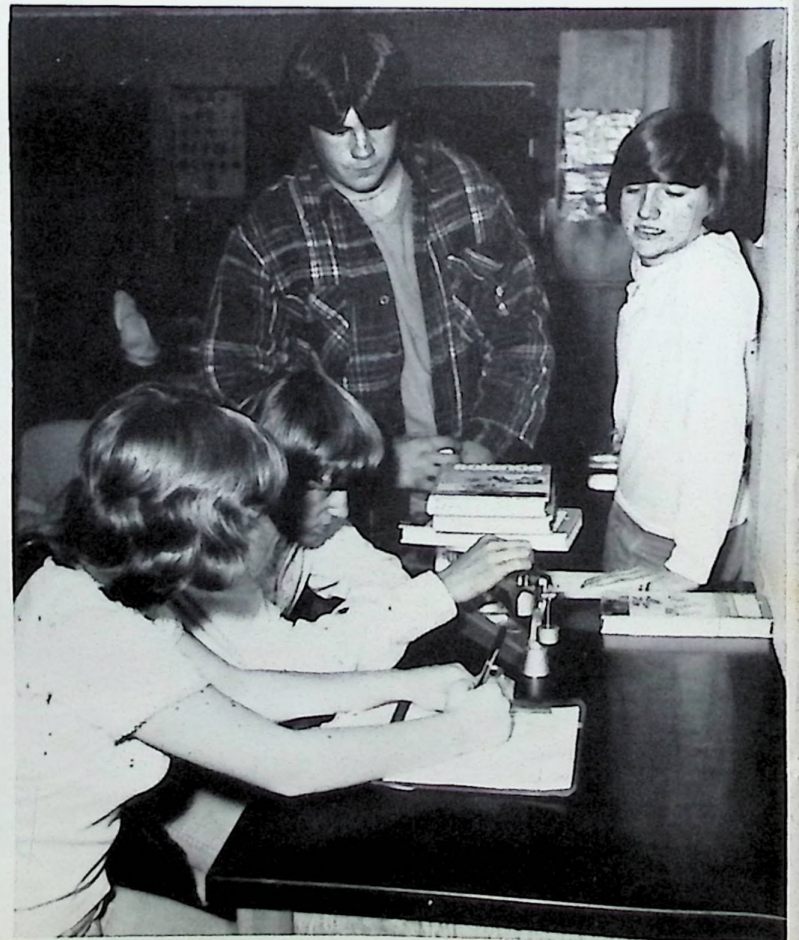






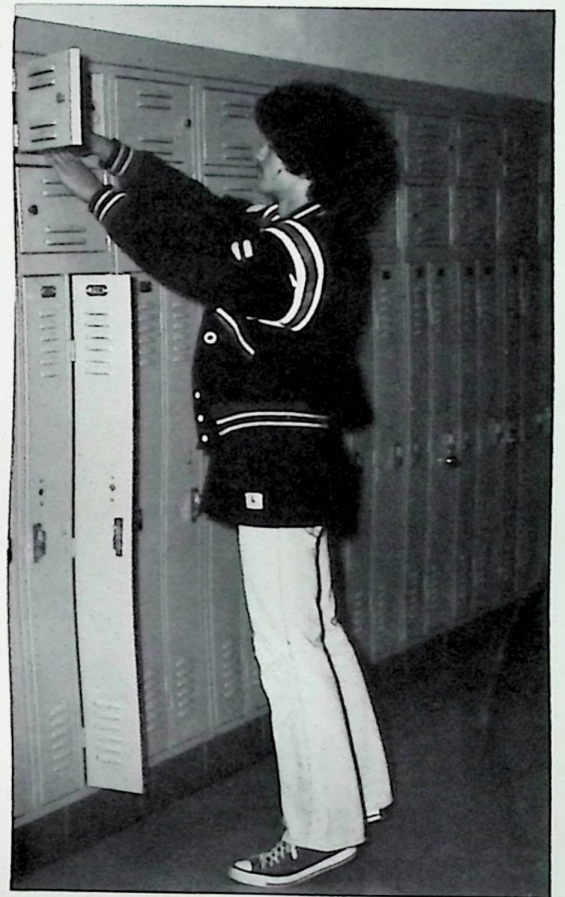
Spring generates activity, growth, and awareness. Now, suddenly, I know myself and can explore all the new directions open to me.



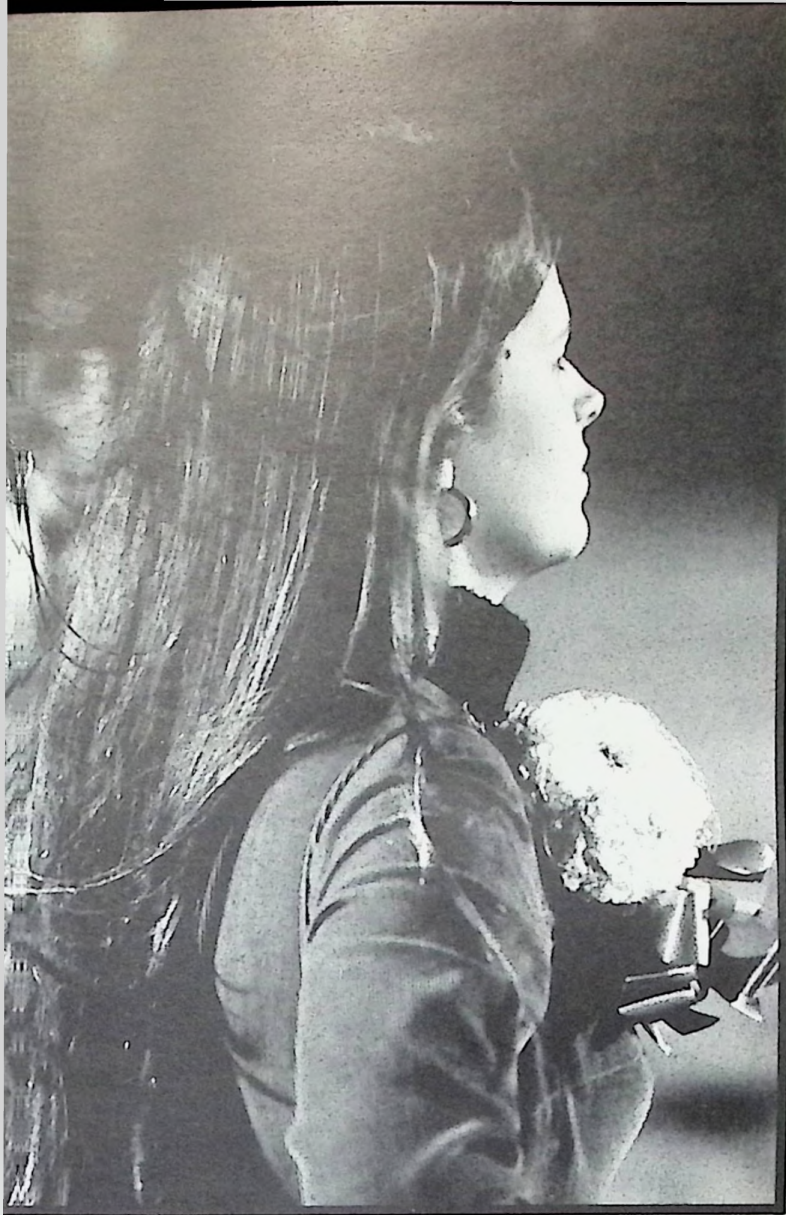

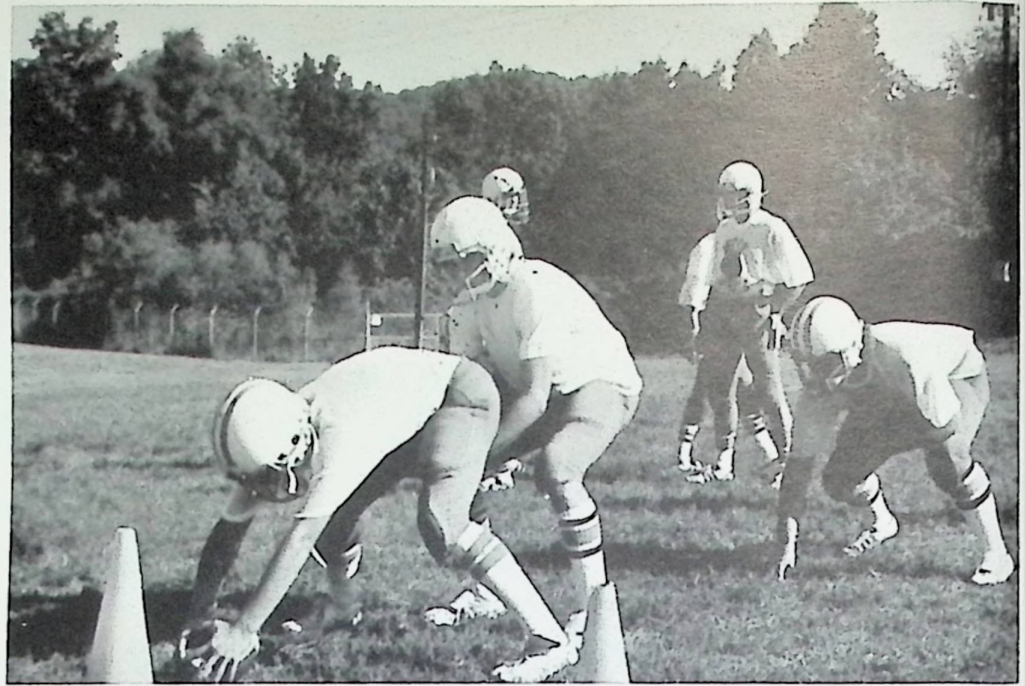

Members of the band and the football team practice through August, and this year Valerie Reutinger attended Girls' State in June.

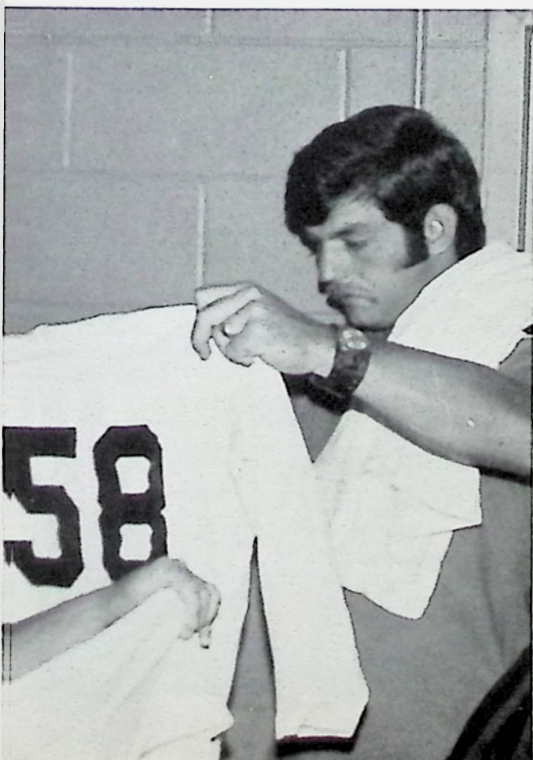

Potent Defense Helps Offense

The Senators enjoyed another fine gridiron season with an offense that averaged 25 points per game. The defensive unit complemented the offense as they posted six shutouts en route to a nifty 7-3 season mark. West's defense yielded but 6.7 points per game shutting out their opponents in the first quarter of every game. Posting three consecu-

tive whitewash wins to open their season, the Senators fell victim to Notre Dame Titans in game four, 9-0. West then reeled off four straight victories. During that stretch, the "Orange Crush," as they became known to their fans, allowed just eight points. The final two weeks of the schedule saw the Senators losing 20-7 to Wheelersburg and 30-

0 to state-ranked Reading Community of Cincinnati. The new stadium for the second season, housed large home crowds as the team enjoyed tremendous fan support. In fact during the Wheelersburg contest, followers lined the sidelines to witness the decisive Southern Ohio Conference game.

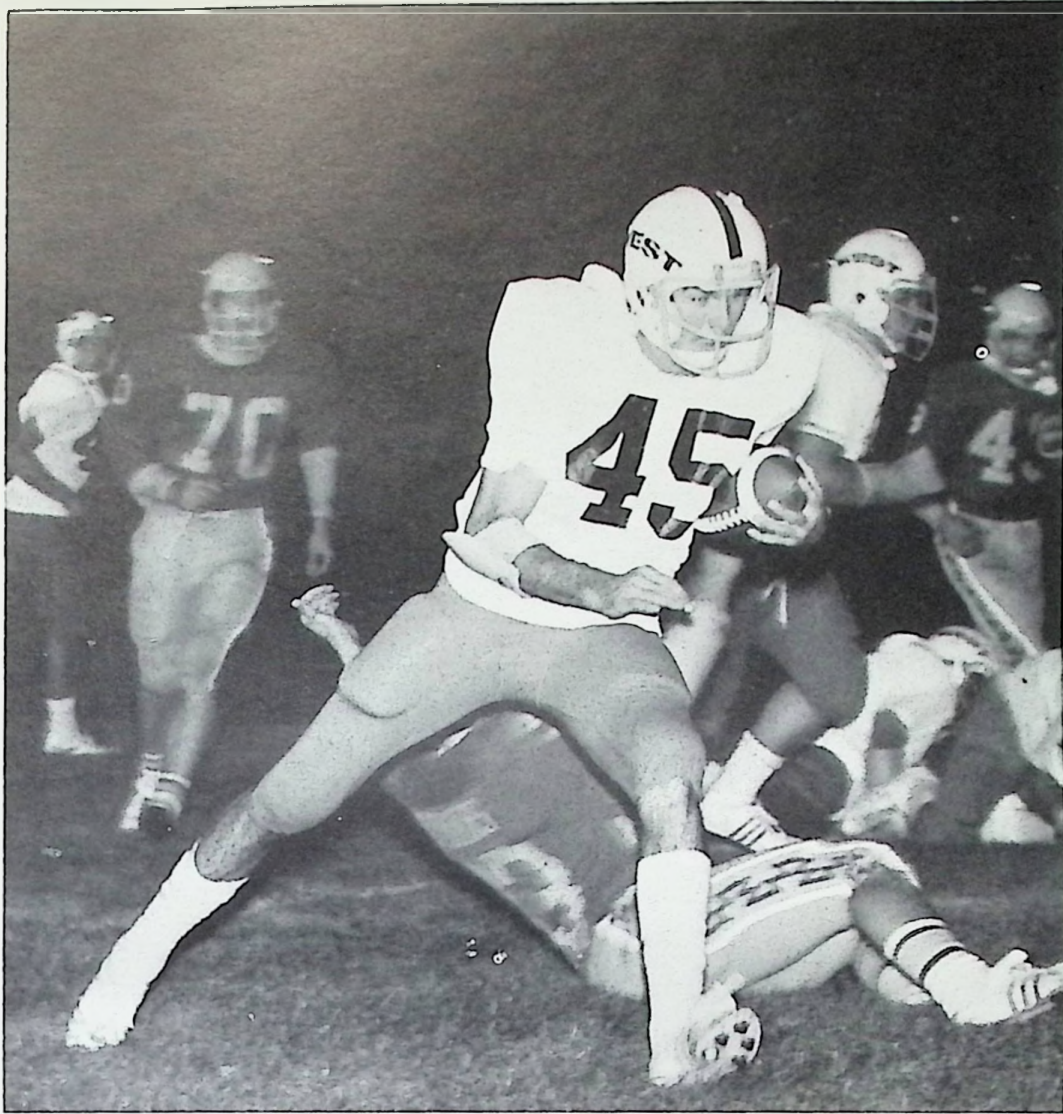

Coaches Litteral and Dunham did an exemplary job with the junior varsity football team. Playing an abbreviated six-game schedule, the jayvees won three and lost three.

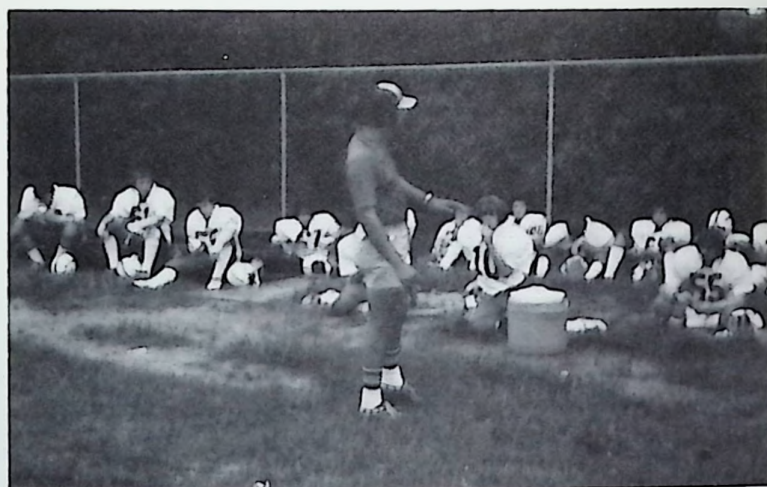
The young Senators squared off against the Greenup County Muskeeters in the season's opener. West tallied on their first possession and

West seemingly peaked at this point of the season as they posted back-to-back shutouts against Notre Dame and Northwest.

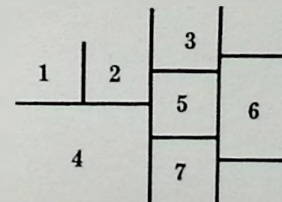
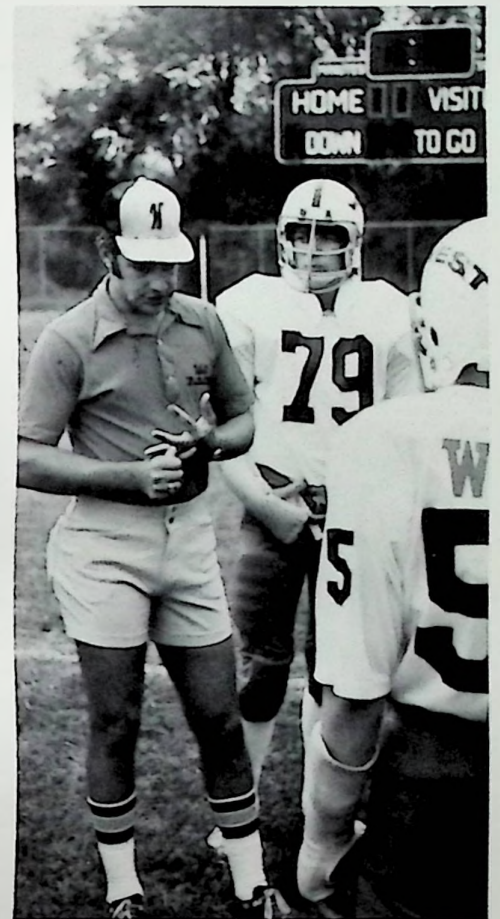
The final two games were close ones with the Senators on the losing end. Wheelersburg edged West 12-6 and Rock Hill squeezed out an 8-0 triumph.

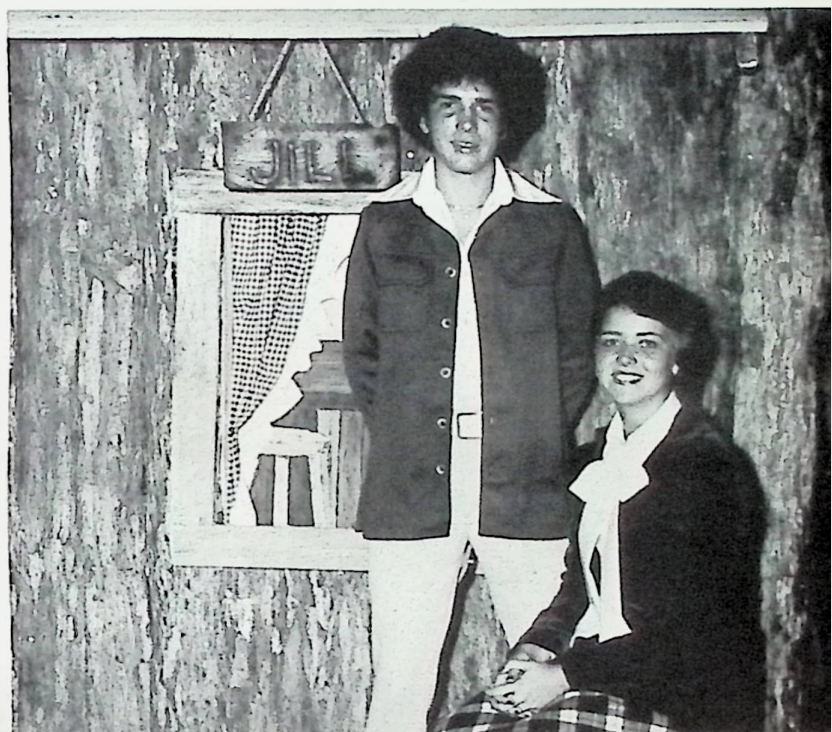
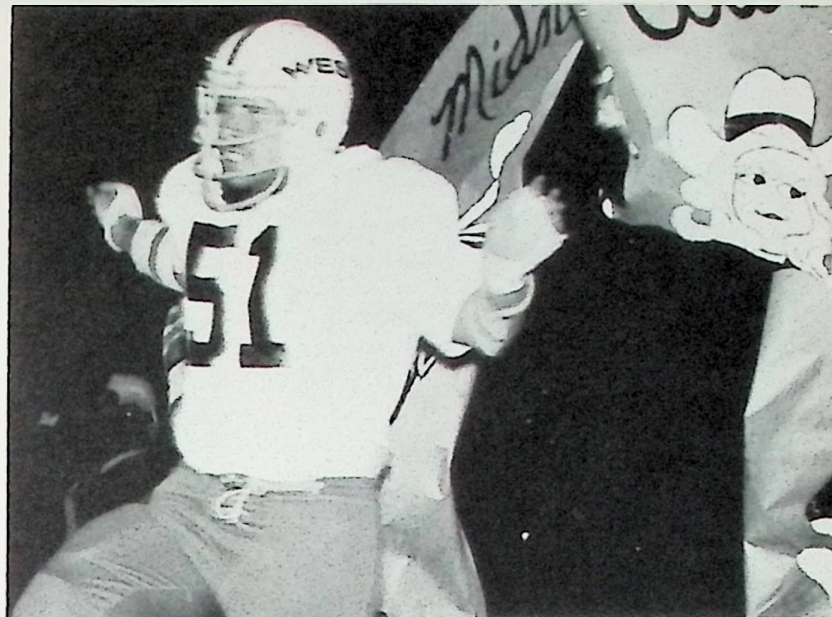




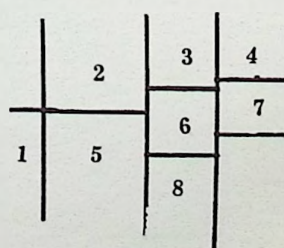
Western Highlights

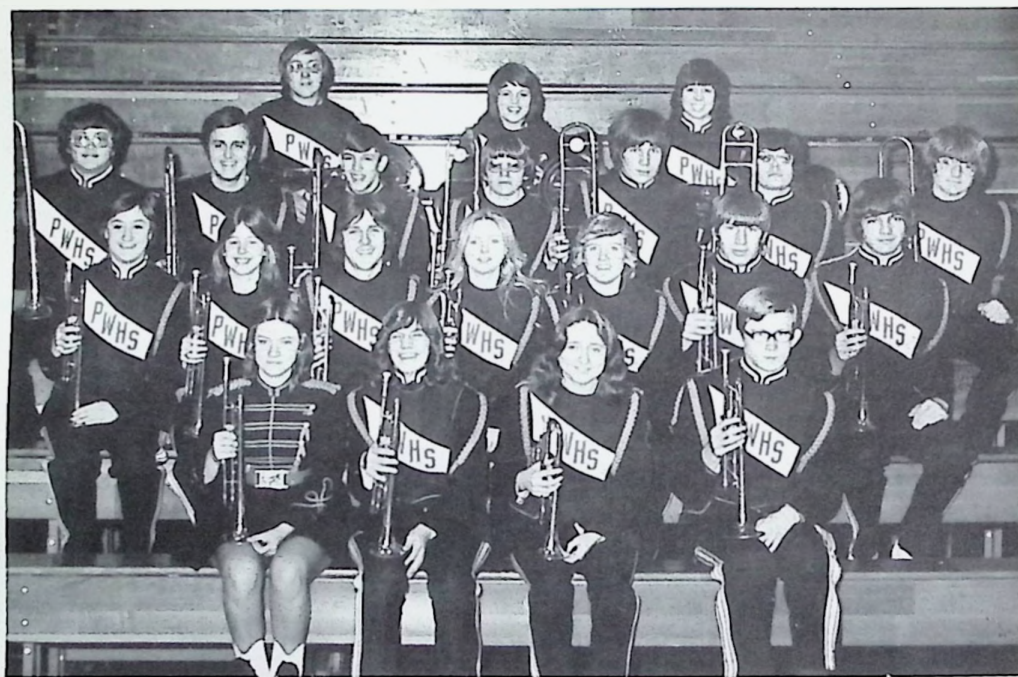
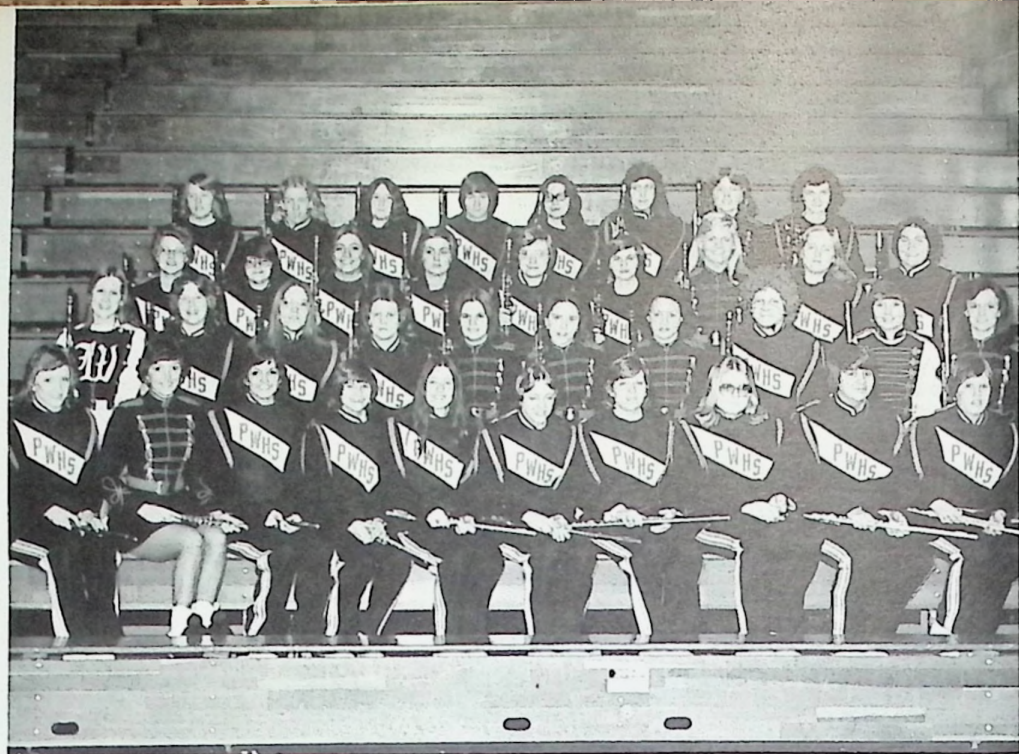

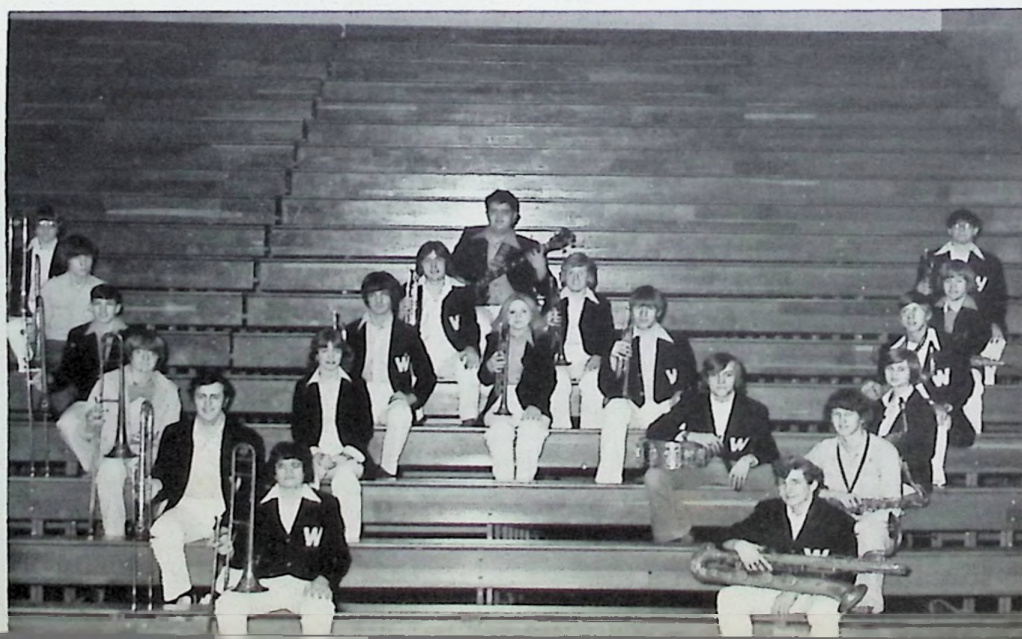


An Active Year

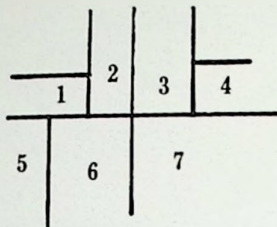




Library Staff Learns at Work

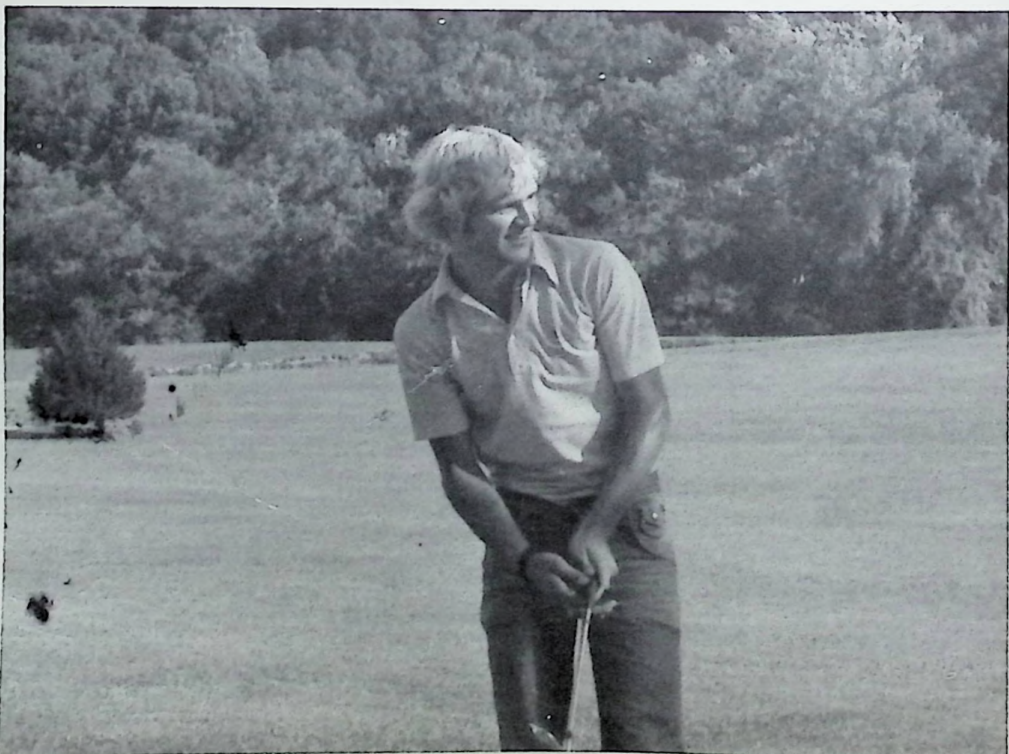


West Is SOC Golf Power Again

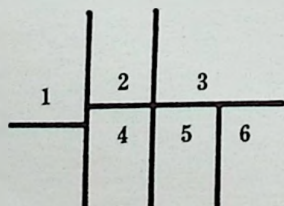

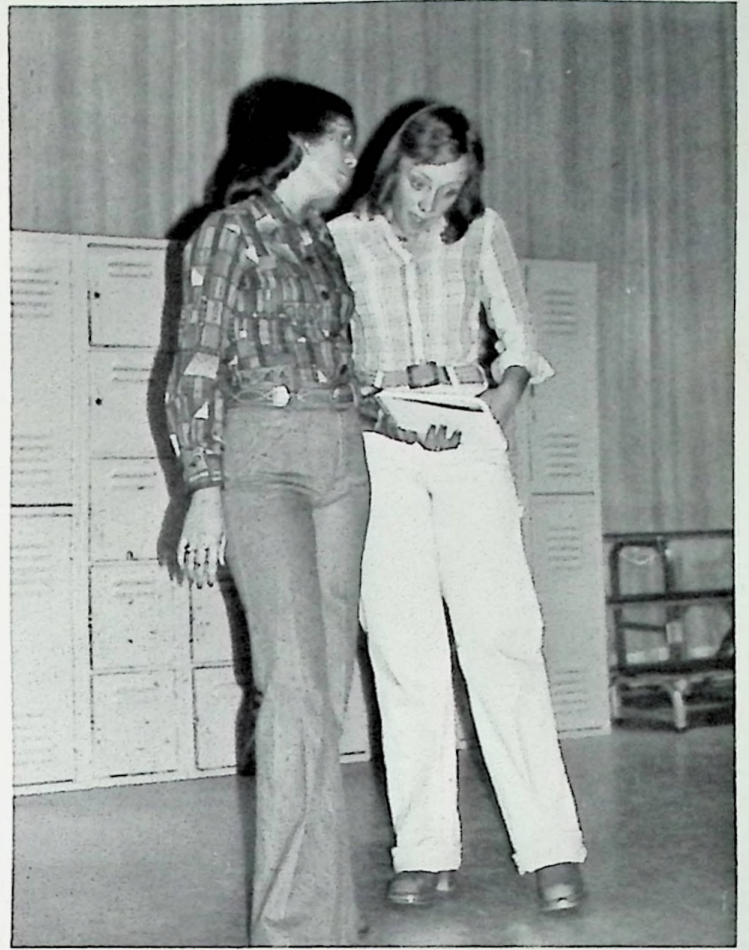




Seniors Romp Through *Just for Kicks*

West played well in its opening game against the Waverly Tigers but succumbed to the Tigers 52-45, in a non-league game at Waverly.

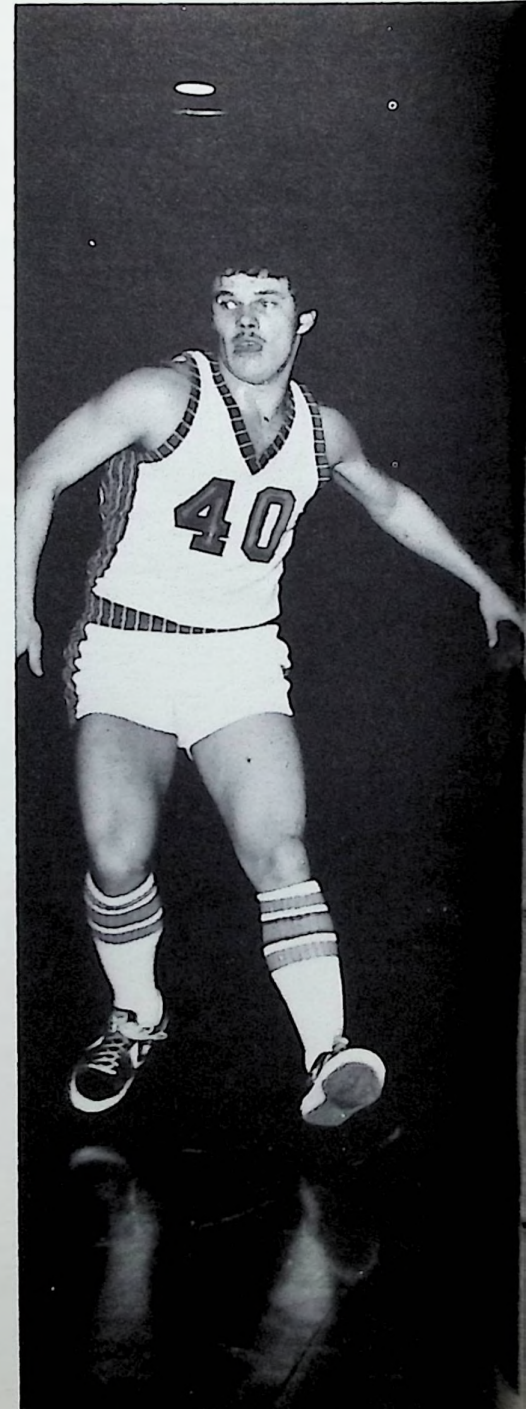
Rebounding from the opening loss,

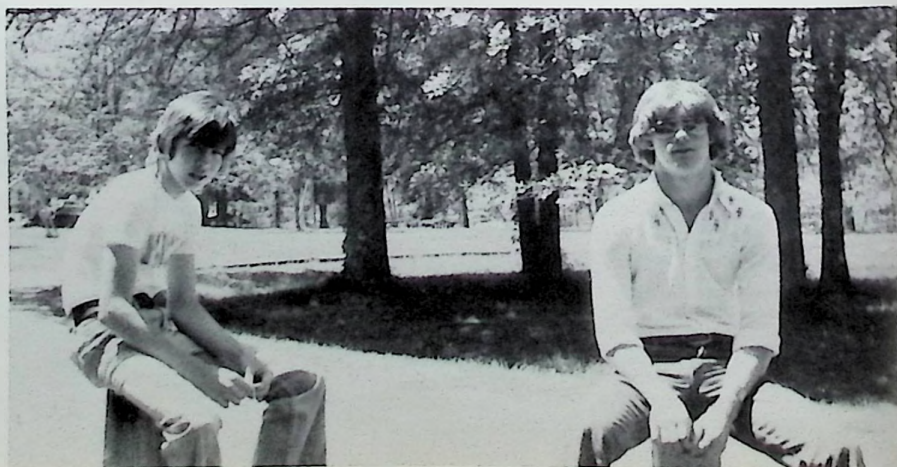
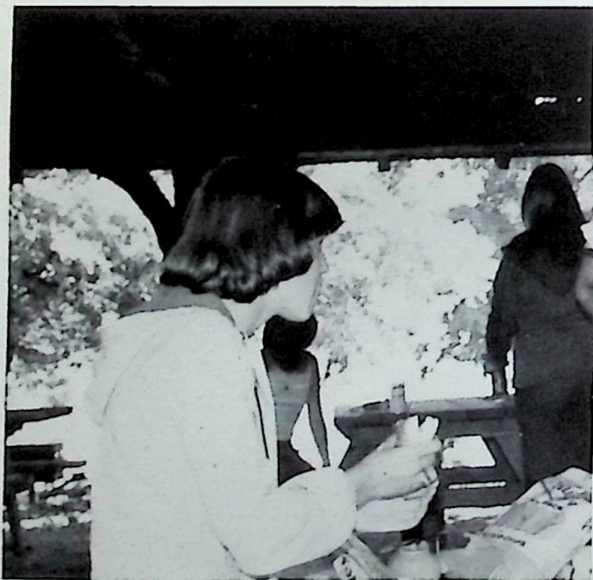


Fun With Foreign Customs

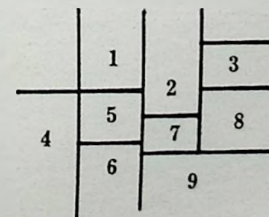
Practice Makes Perfect

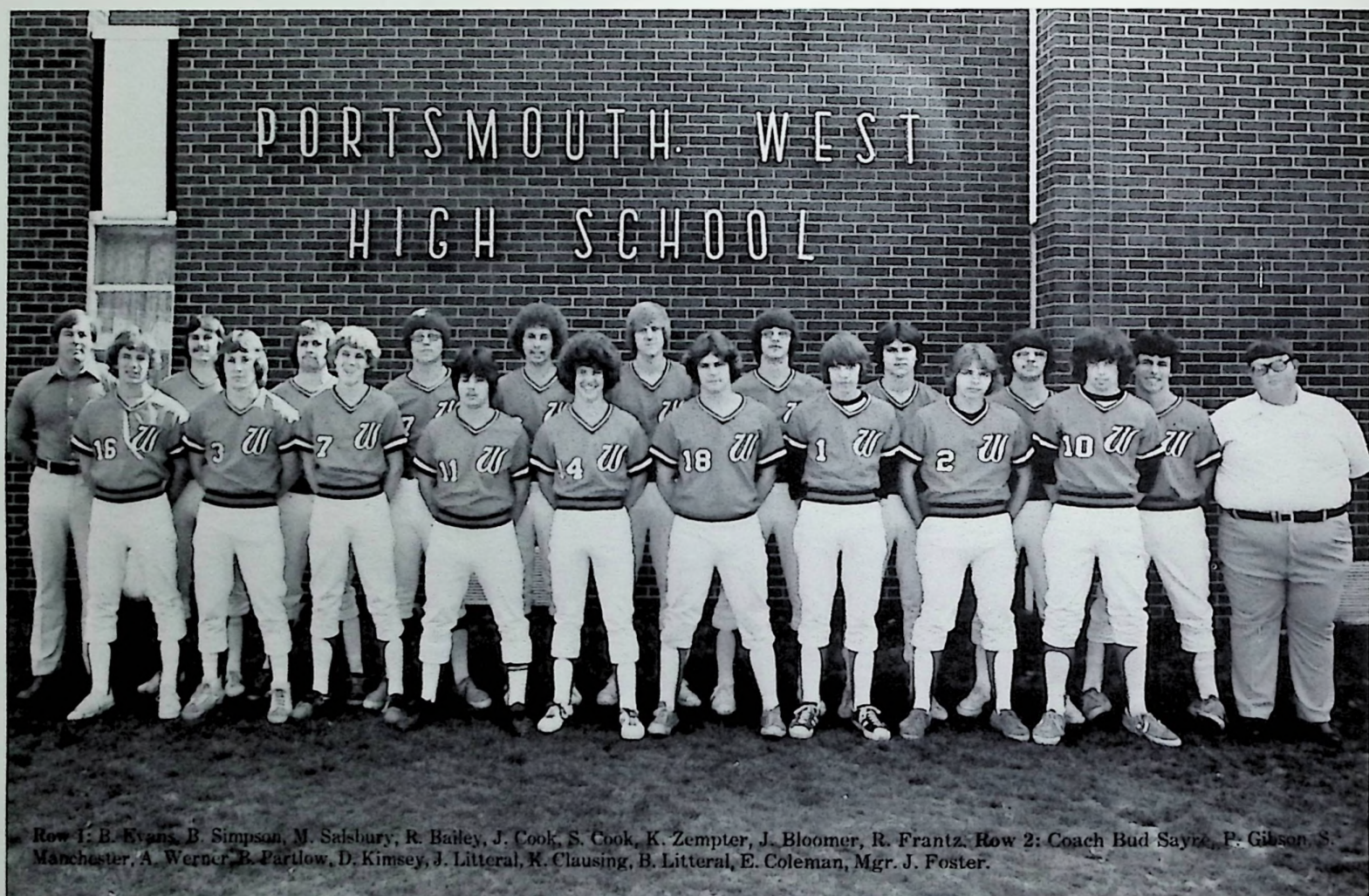
West Captures S.O.C.-S.C.L. Crowns; Sectional Champs, District Runner-Up

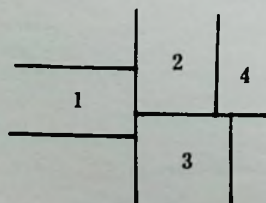
This year's team came away with league championships in both the S.O.C. and the S.C.L. The Senators also won the sectional title and were runners-up in district play.

Senior Doug Kimsey led all hitters with a hefty .563 batting average, 30 RBI's, and six homeruns. Another

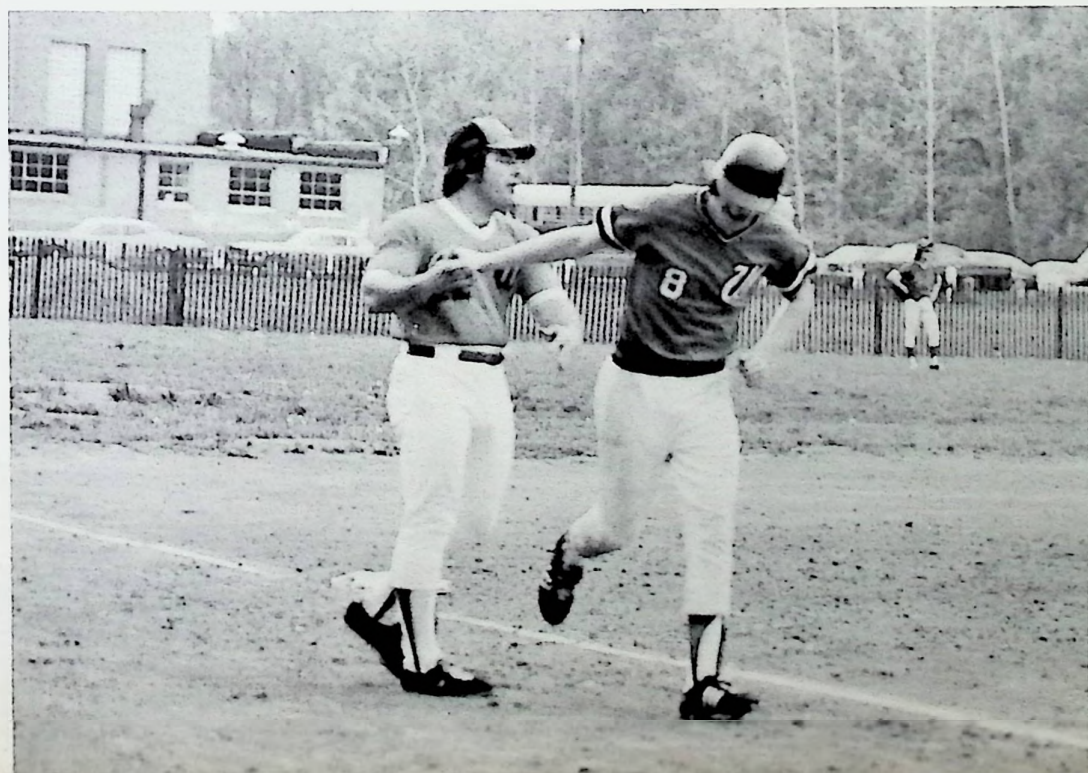
