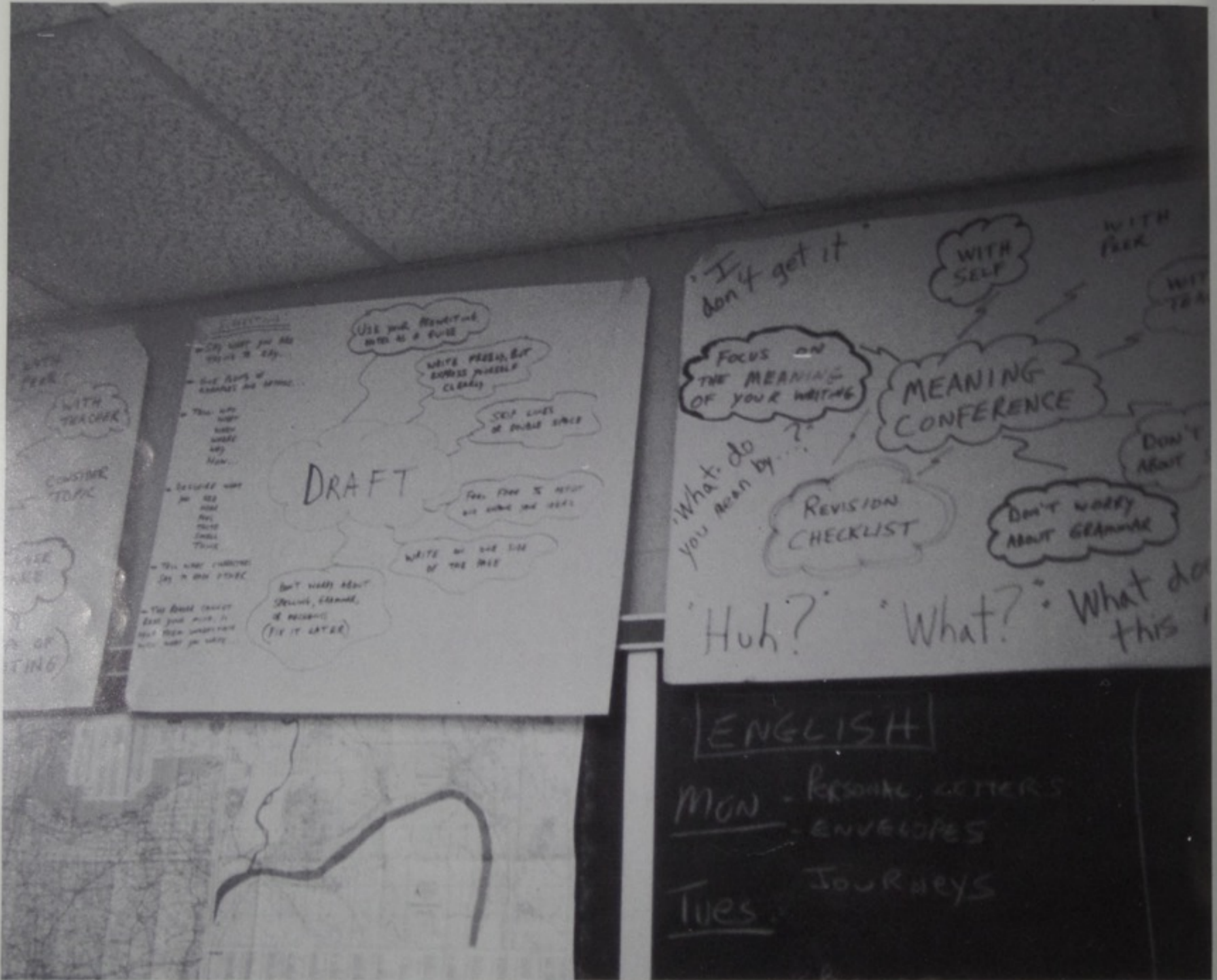
**A notebook for every subject...**

# Notes were now taken on "I" Sheets



### Organization PLUS!

Teachers used structured overviews to maintain focus on lesson objectives. The topic, main idea and details of each lesson were now recorded on I-sheets, so-named because of their form (as a lower case "i").



### Clarifying Details

English teacher Mrs. Dooley reviews some of the techniques of maintaining the I sheets with Desirée Crosett.



### Writing Summaries

As each I sheet was completed, students were then required to write a summary of the information contained on the I sheet to facilitate studying for tests.



### Listing Vocabulary

Also included in the I sheet was a space for listing new or unfamiliar vocabulary. Here, students in Mrs. Canter's World History class work on that task.

### Study Questions

Finally, students were required to compose 1 or 2 study questions based on the details included in the I. Mr. Erwin's class creates questions and then checks to make sure the details can answer the questions they have composed.

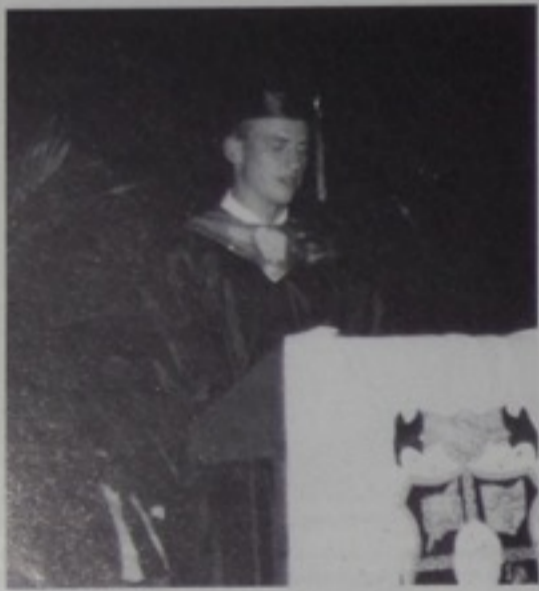

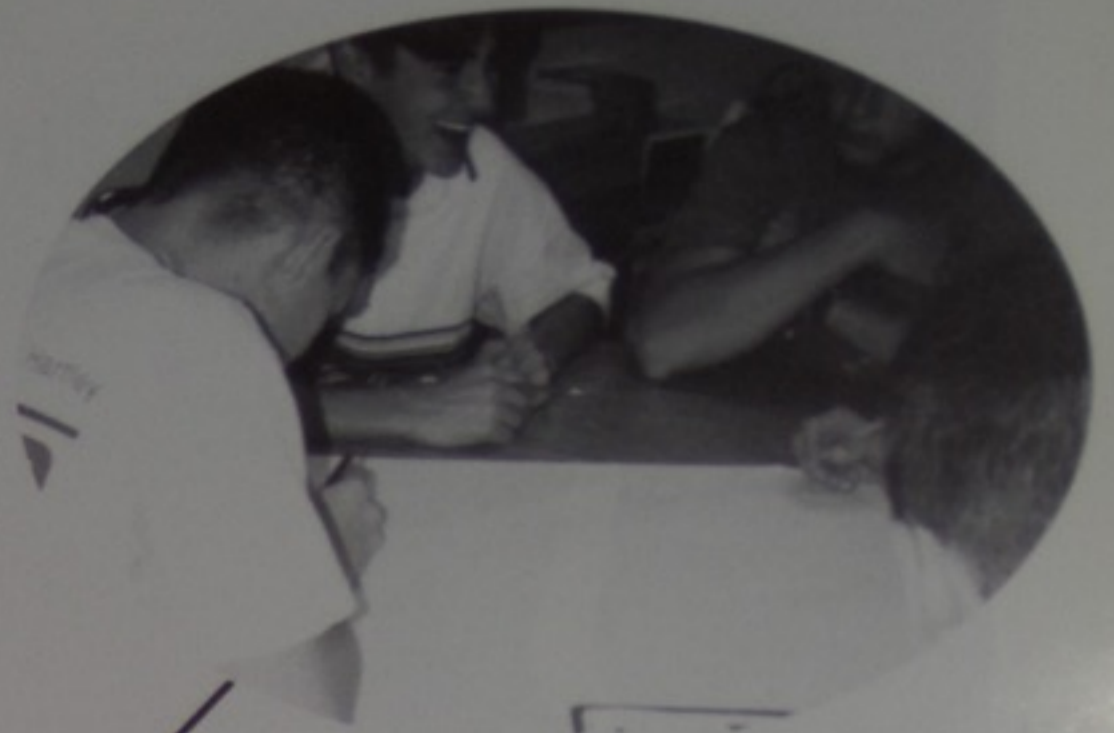

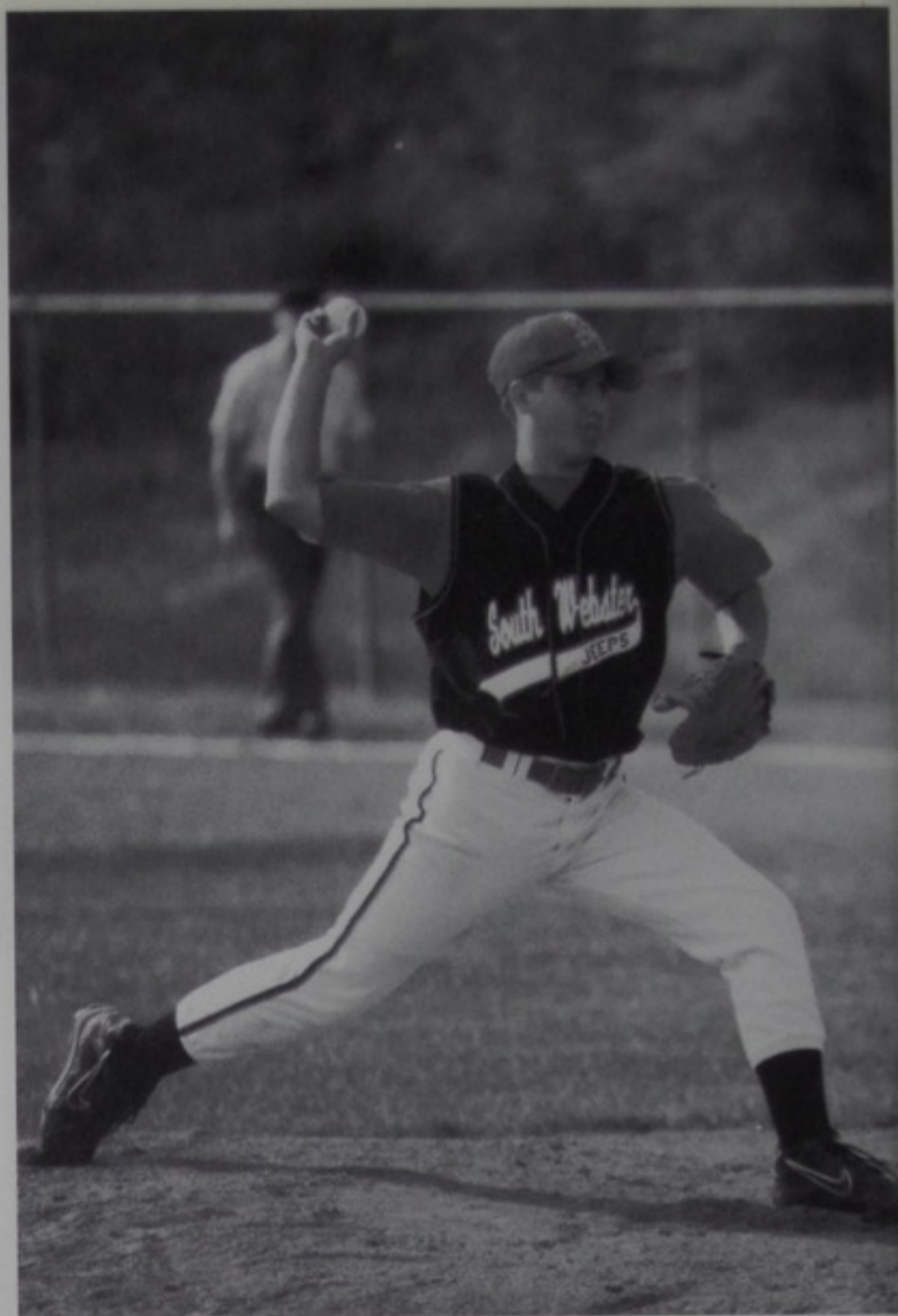

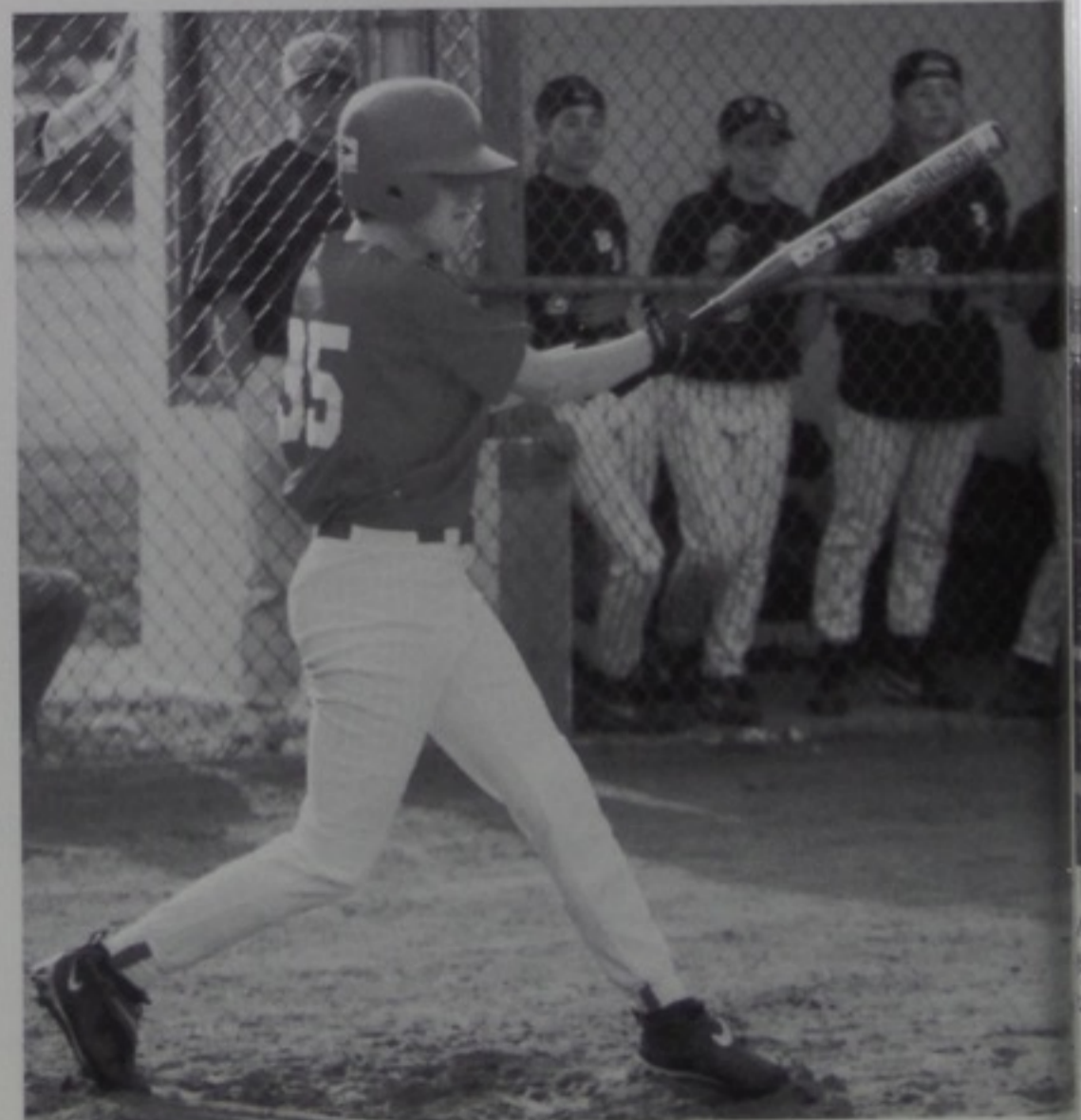

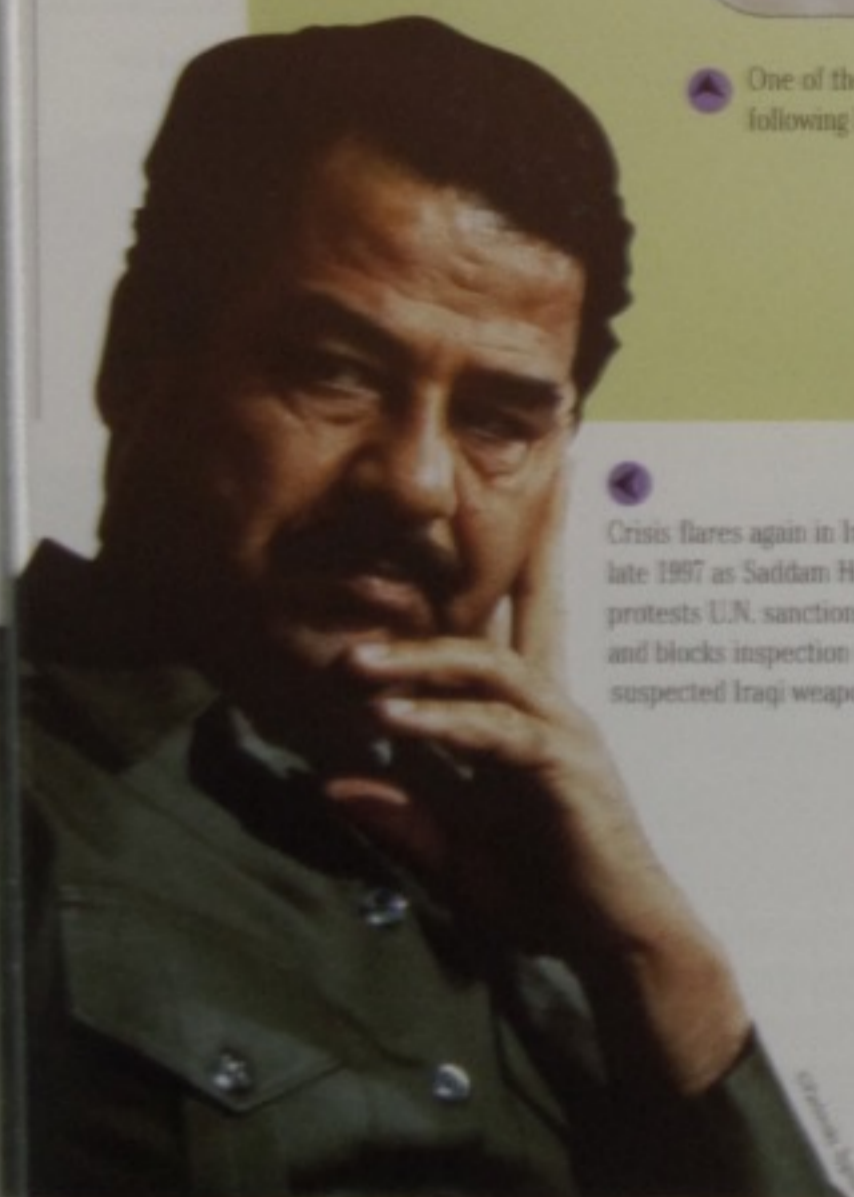

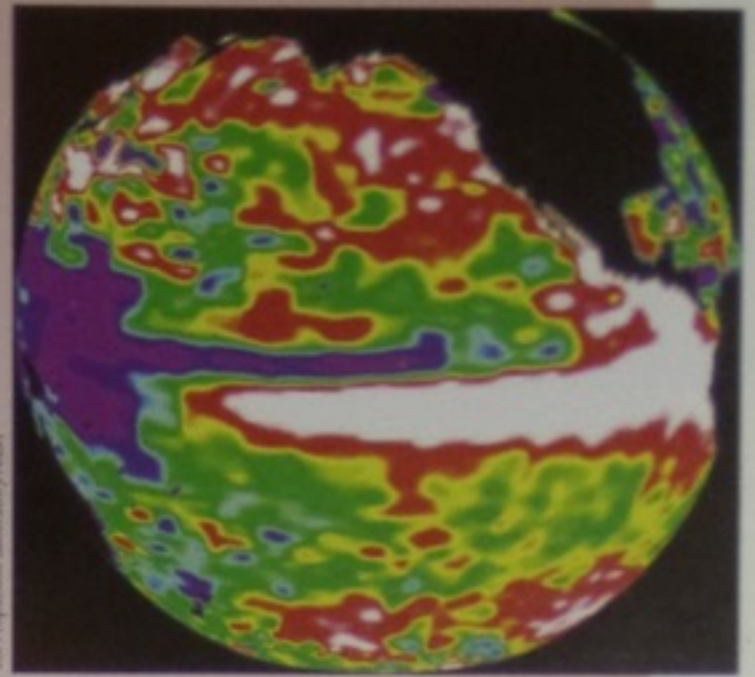

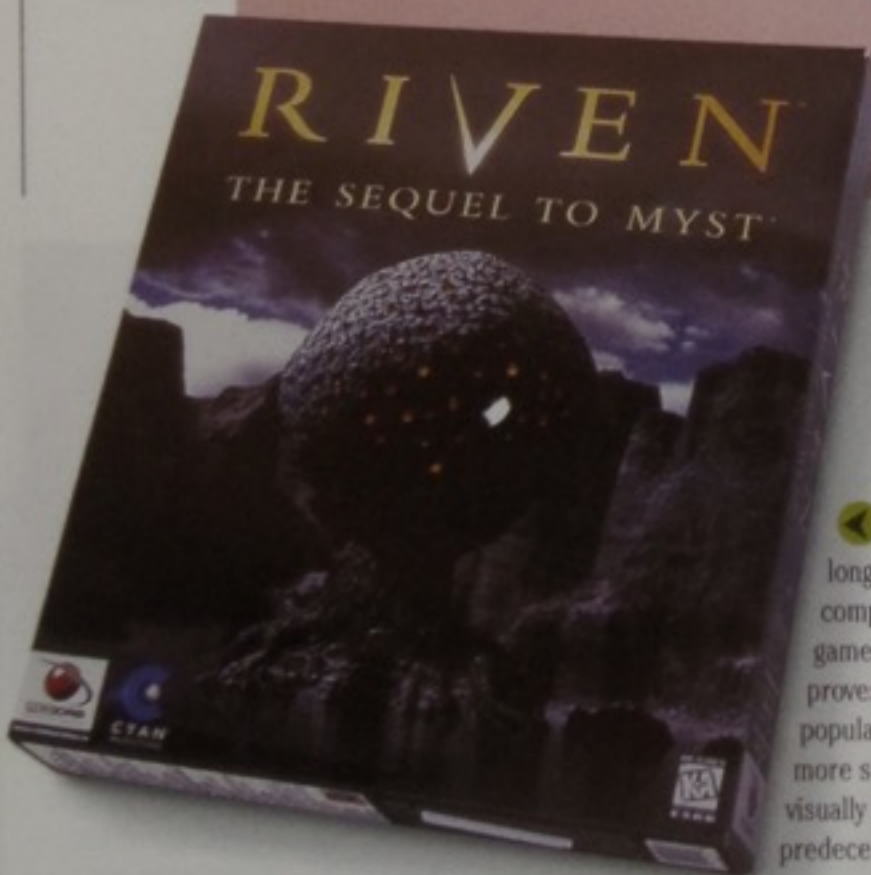

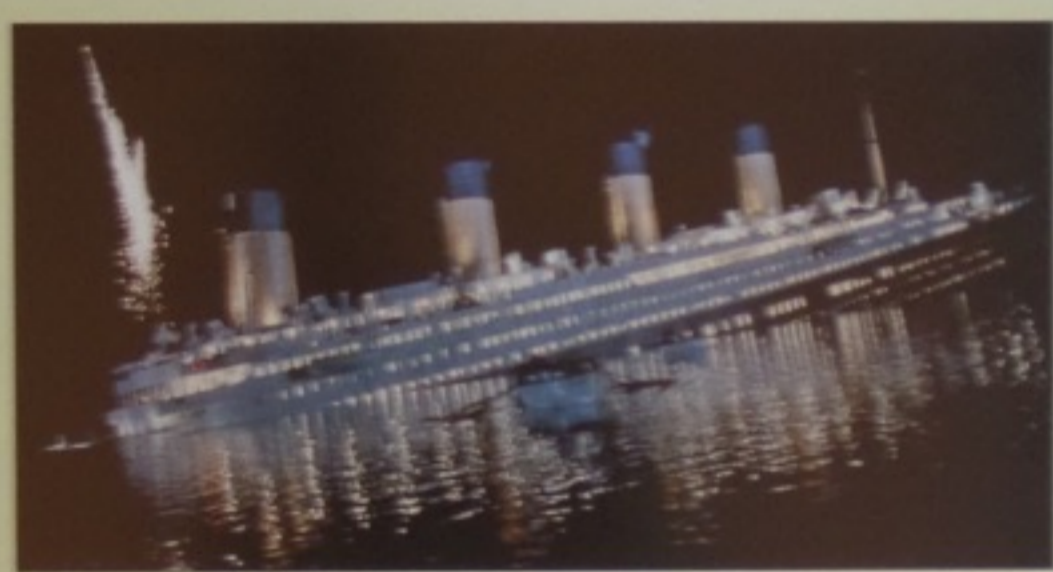

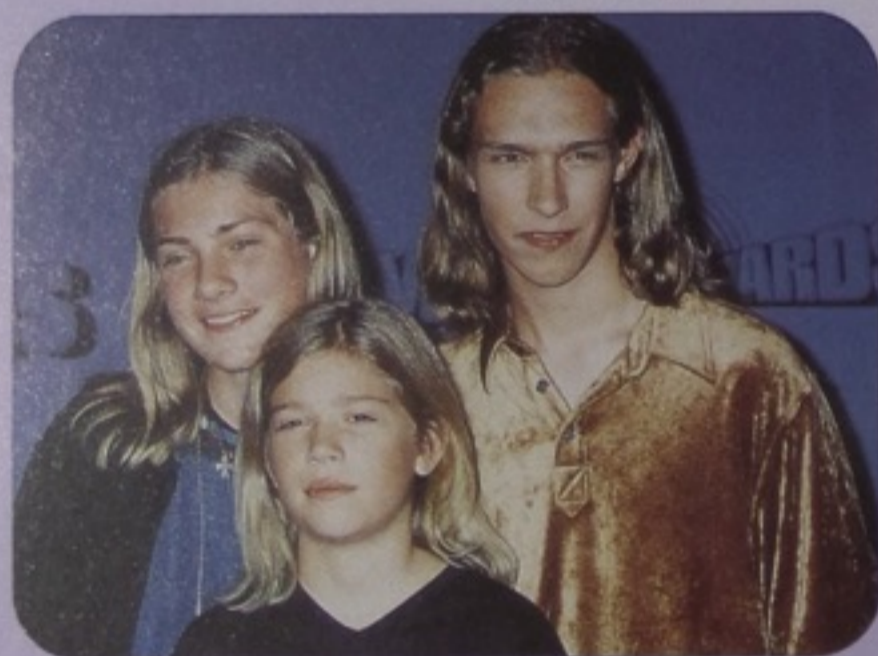

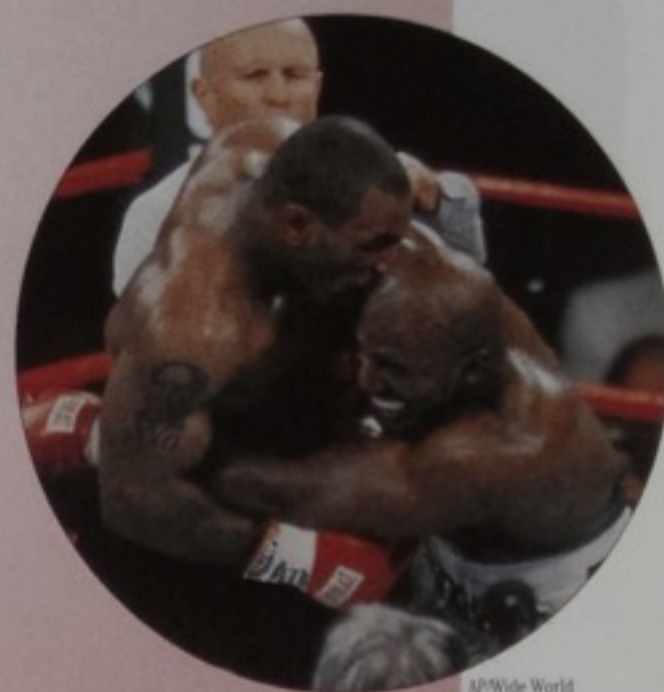

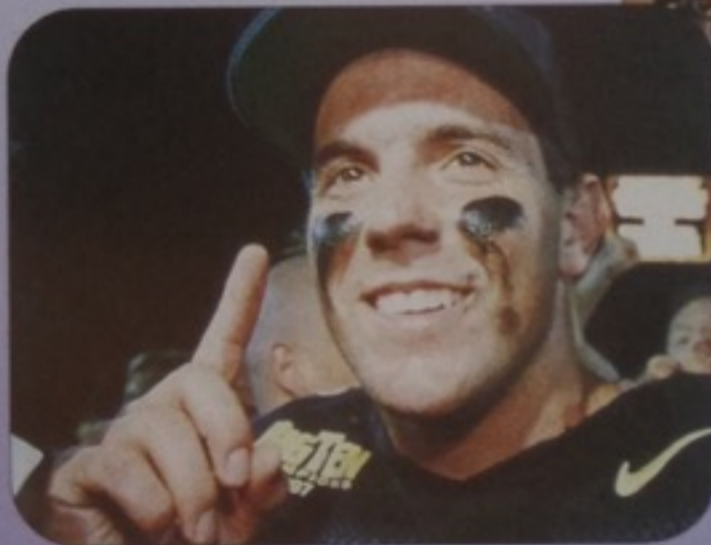

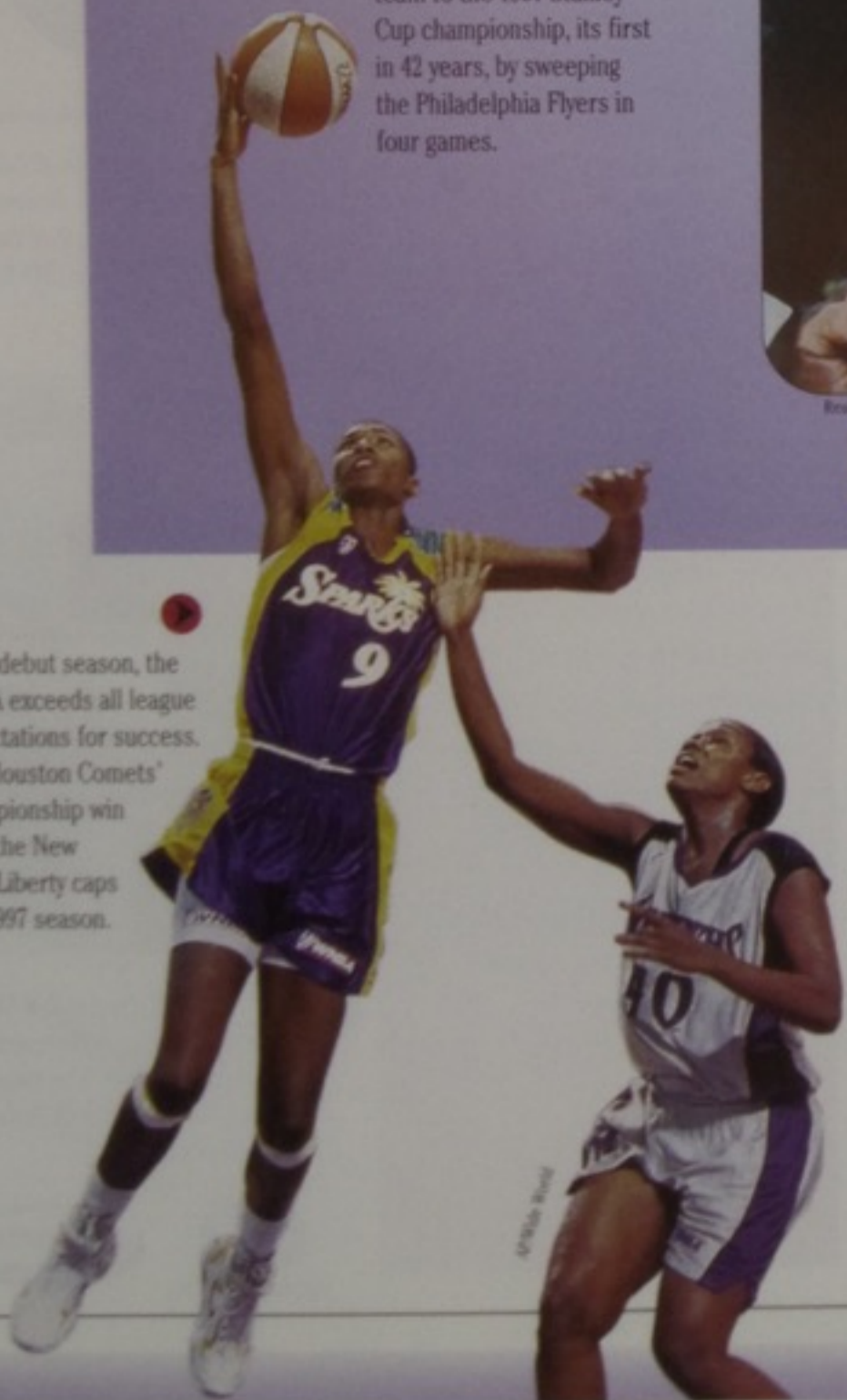
