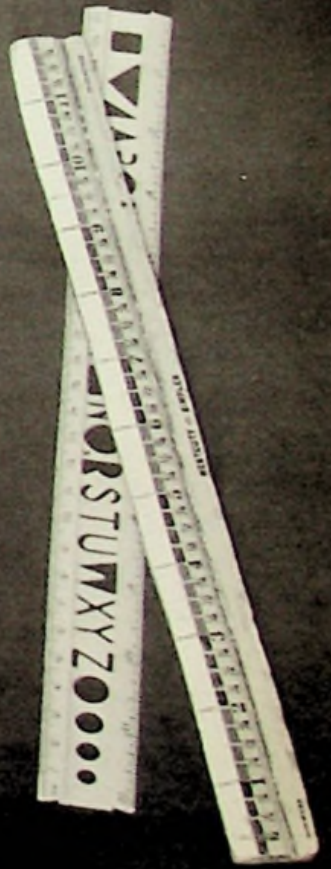




# CLASSES

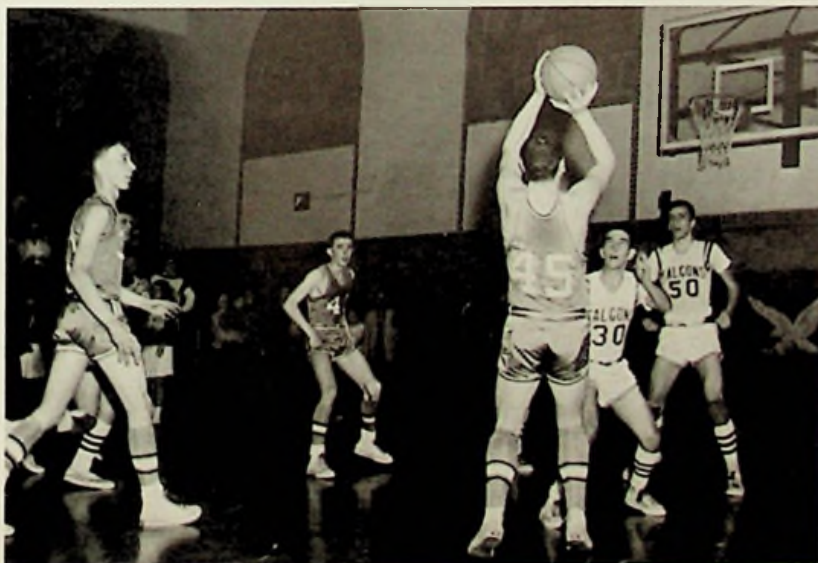
