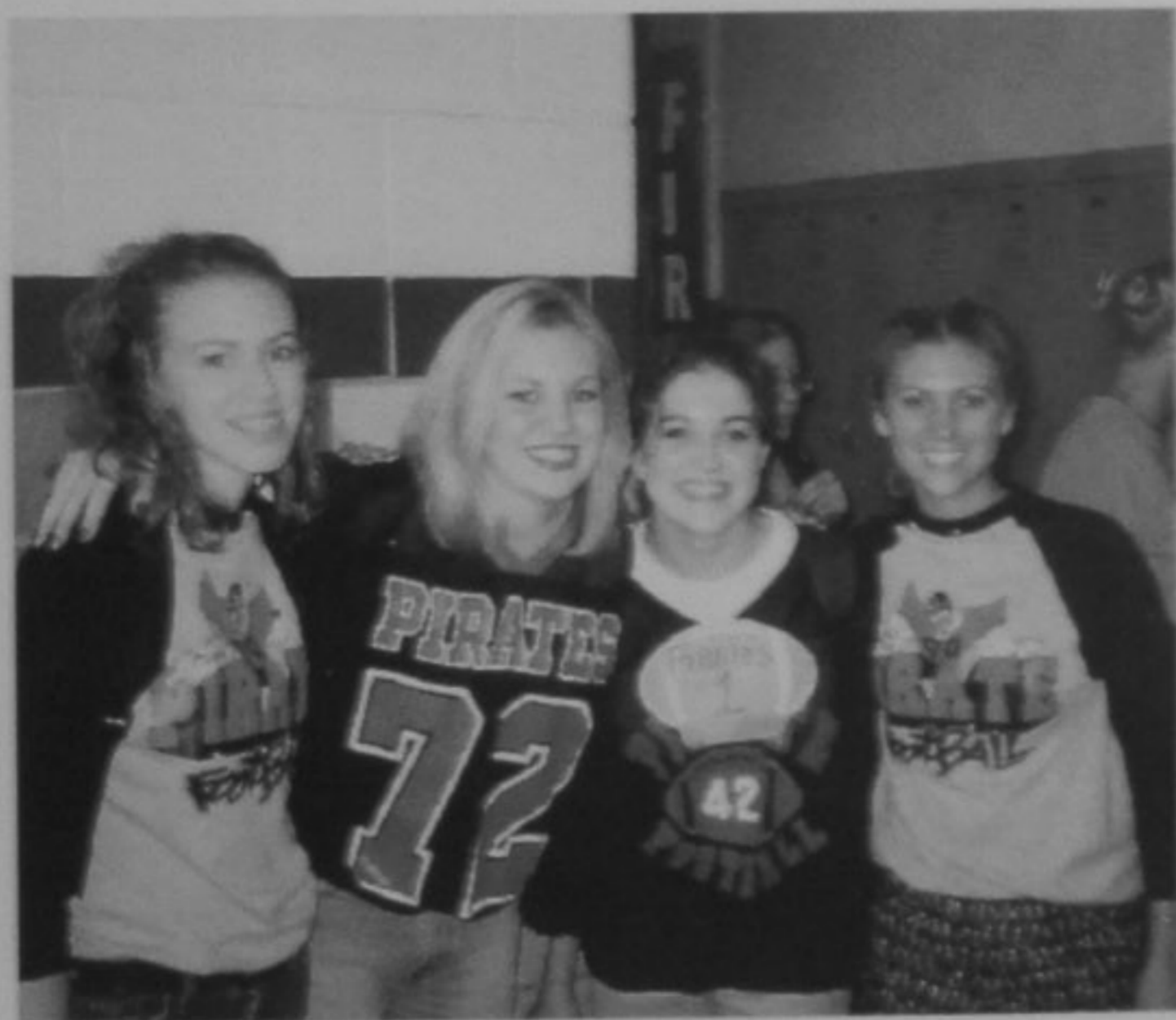
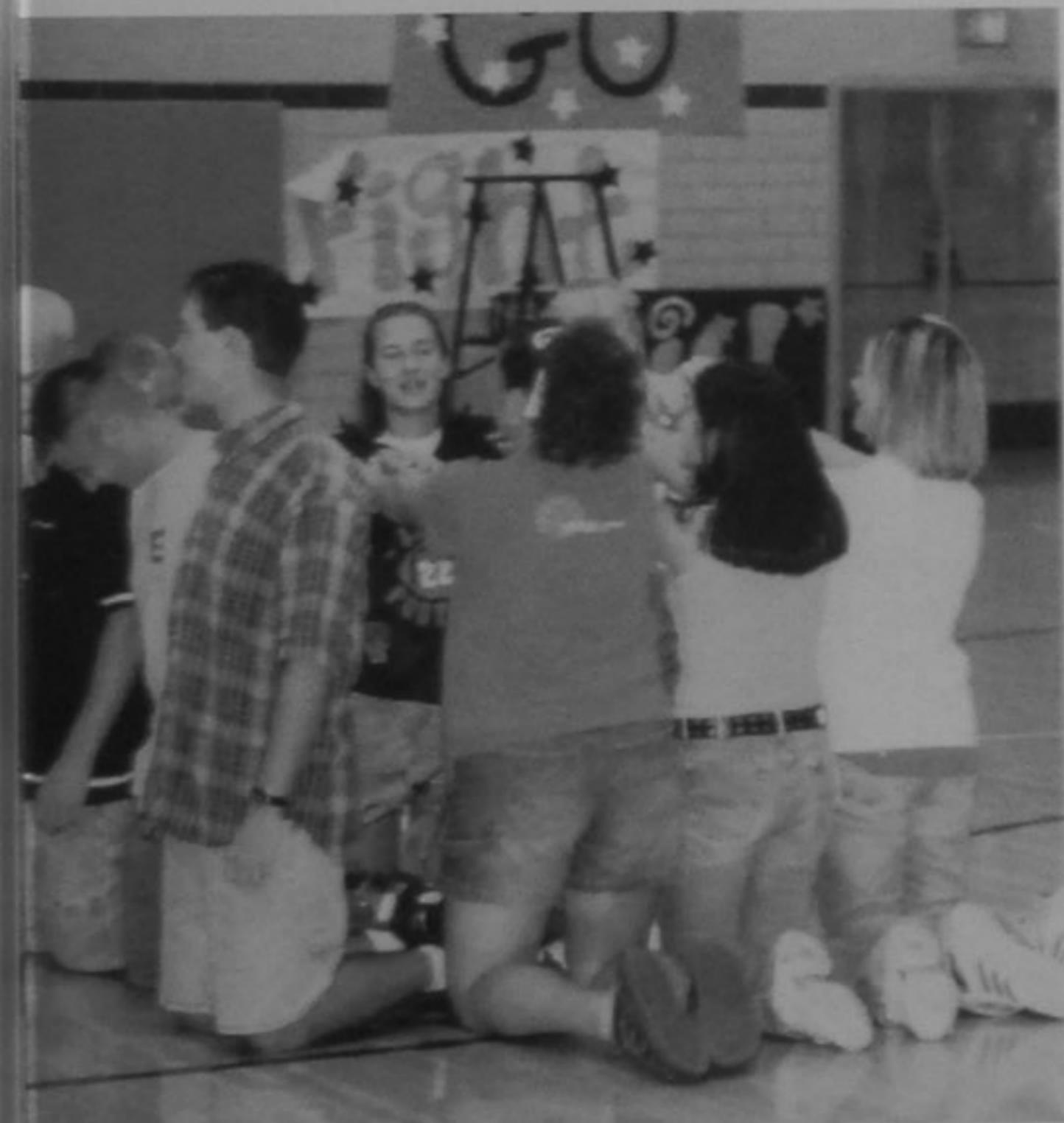


One Of A Kind

express their personal convictions through informal classroom debates among the student body.

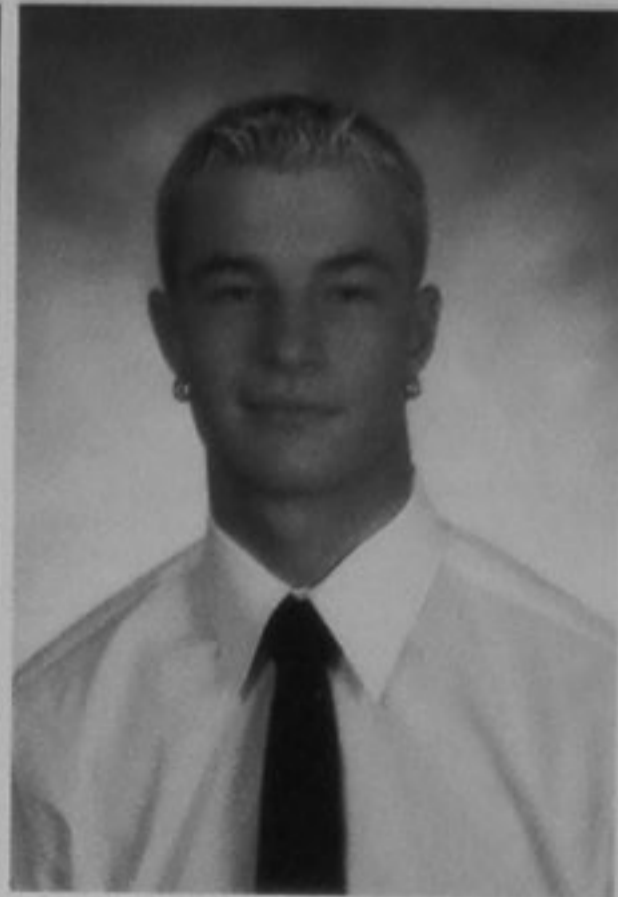

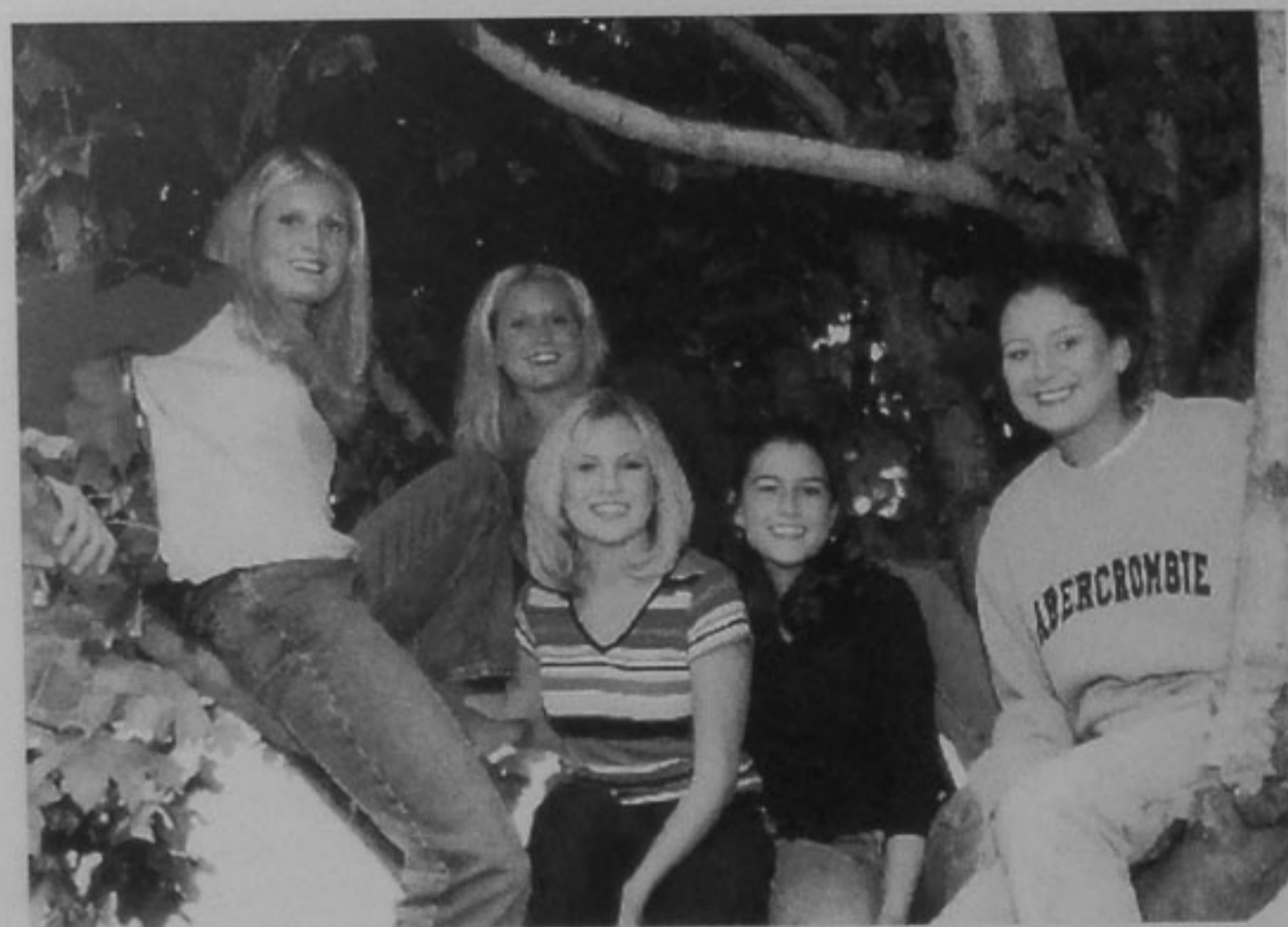
As long as we have waited for graduation to come, we will all miss each other and high school in general from

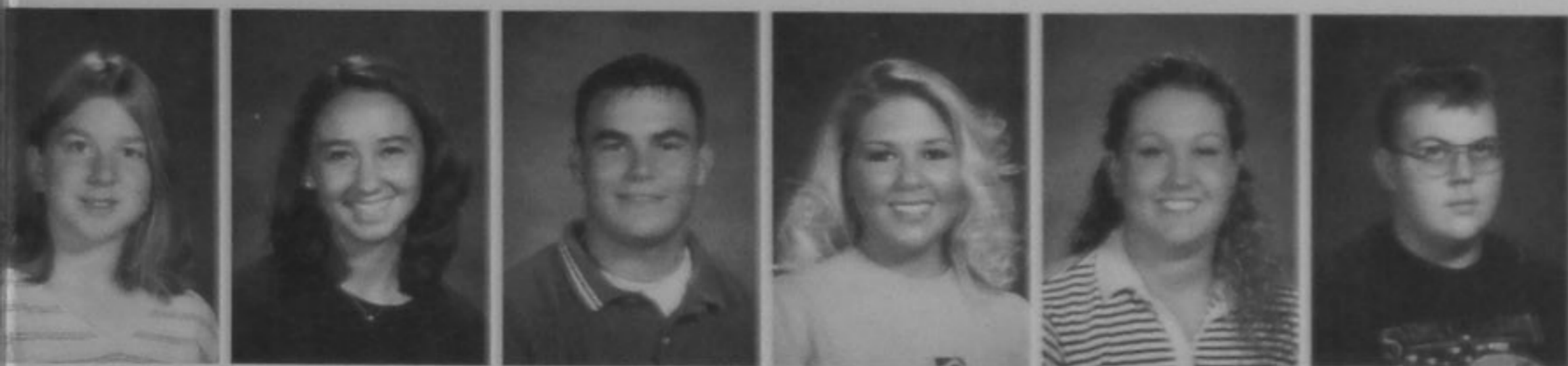

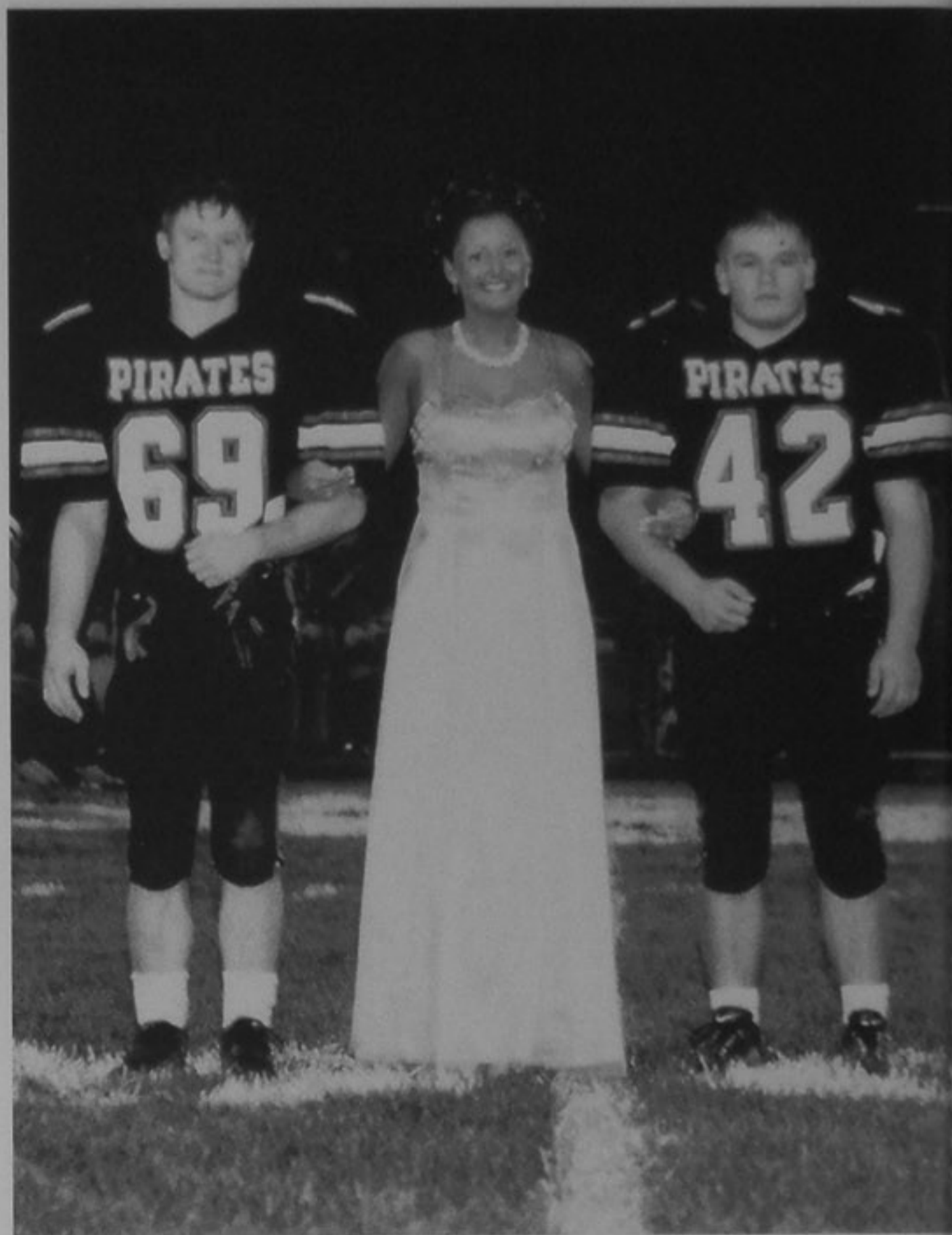




Football Homecoming

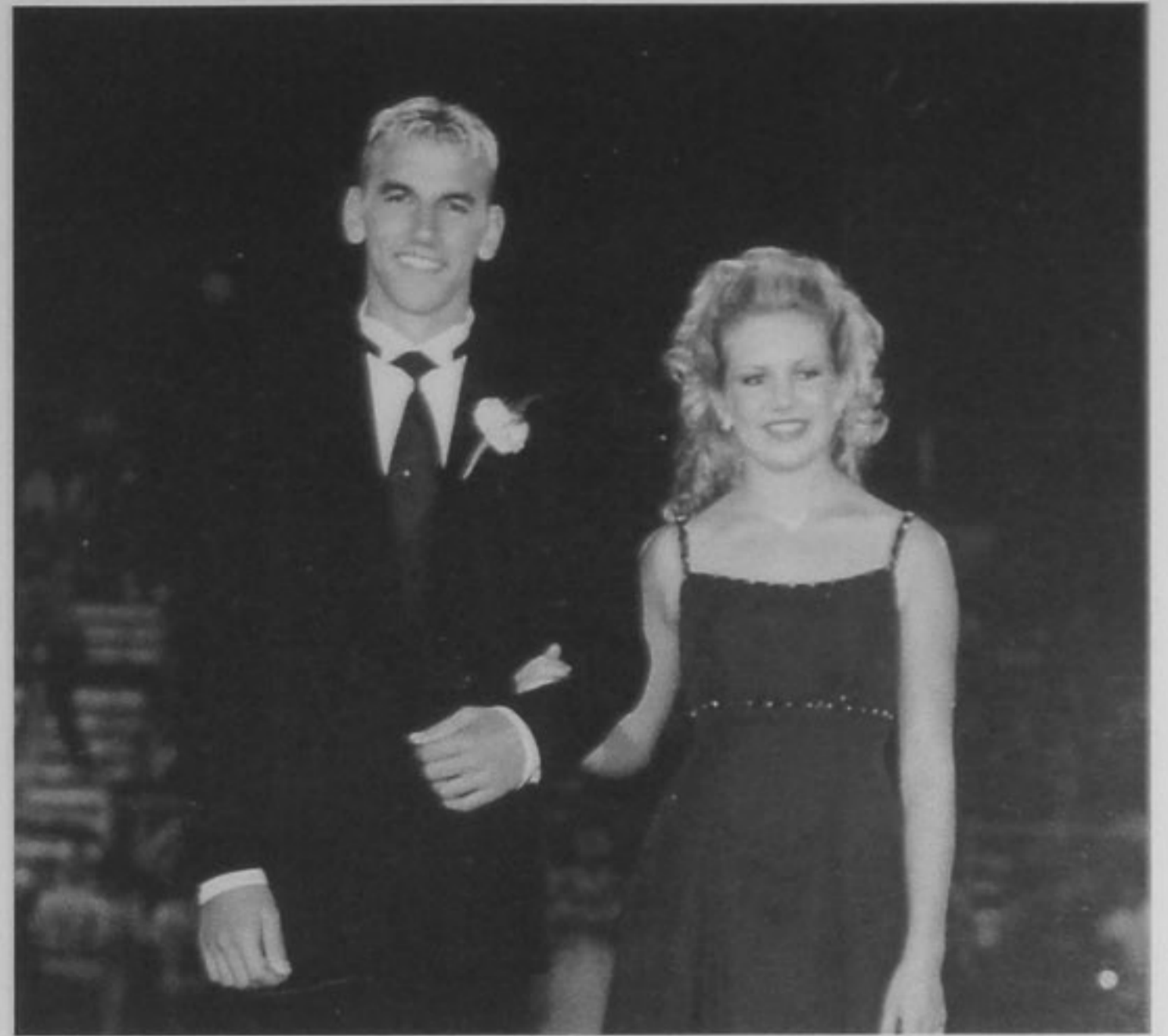

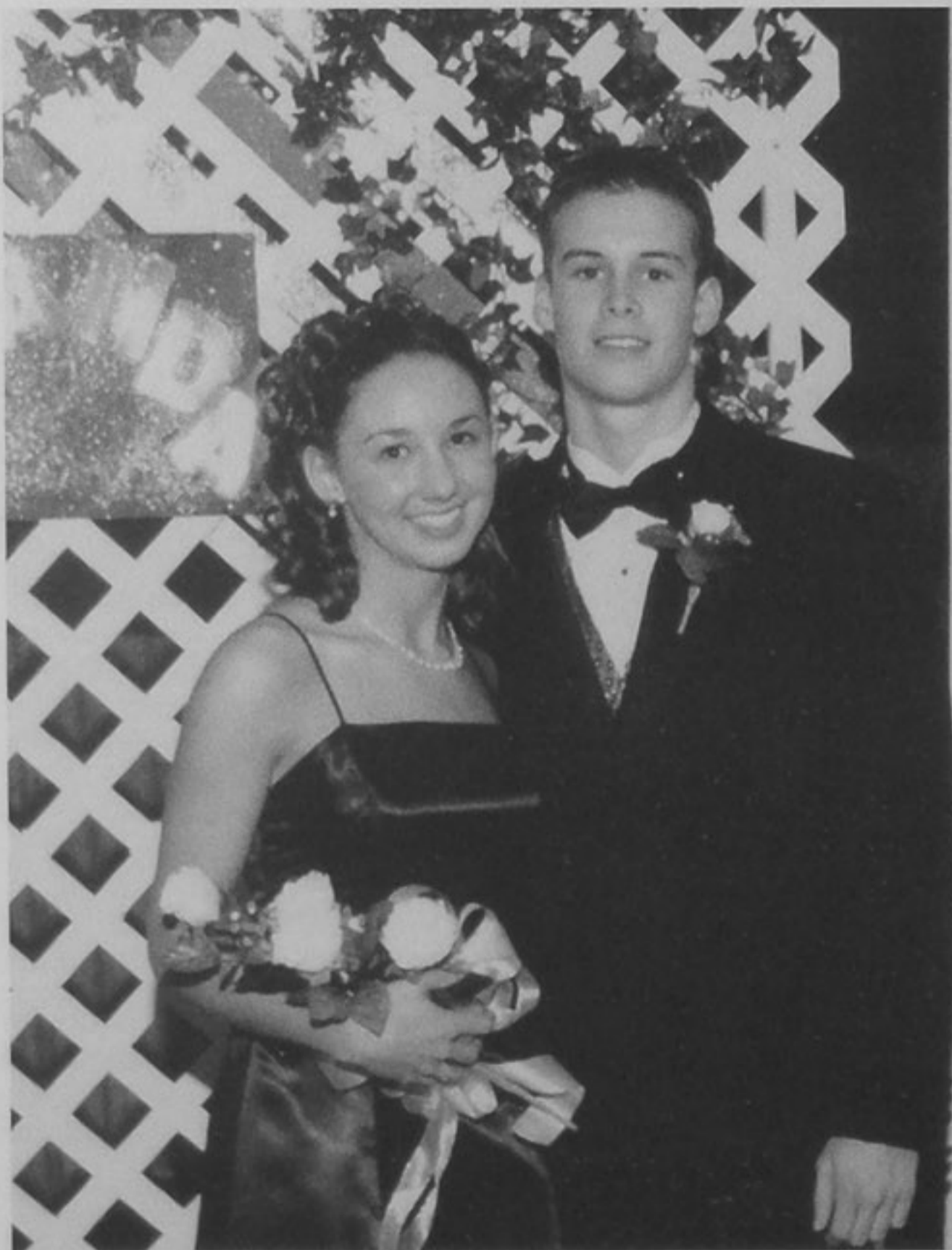

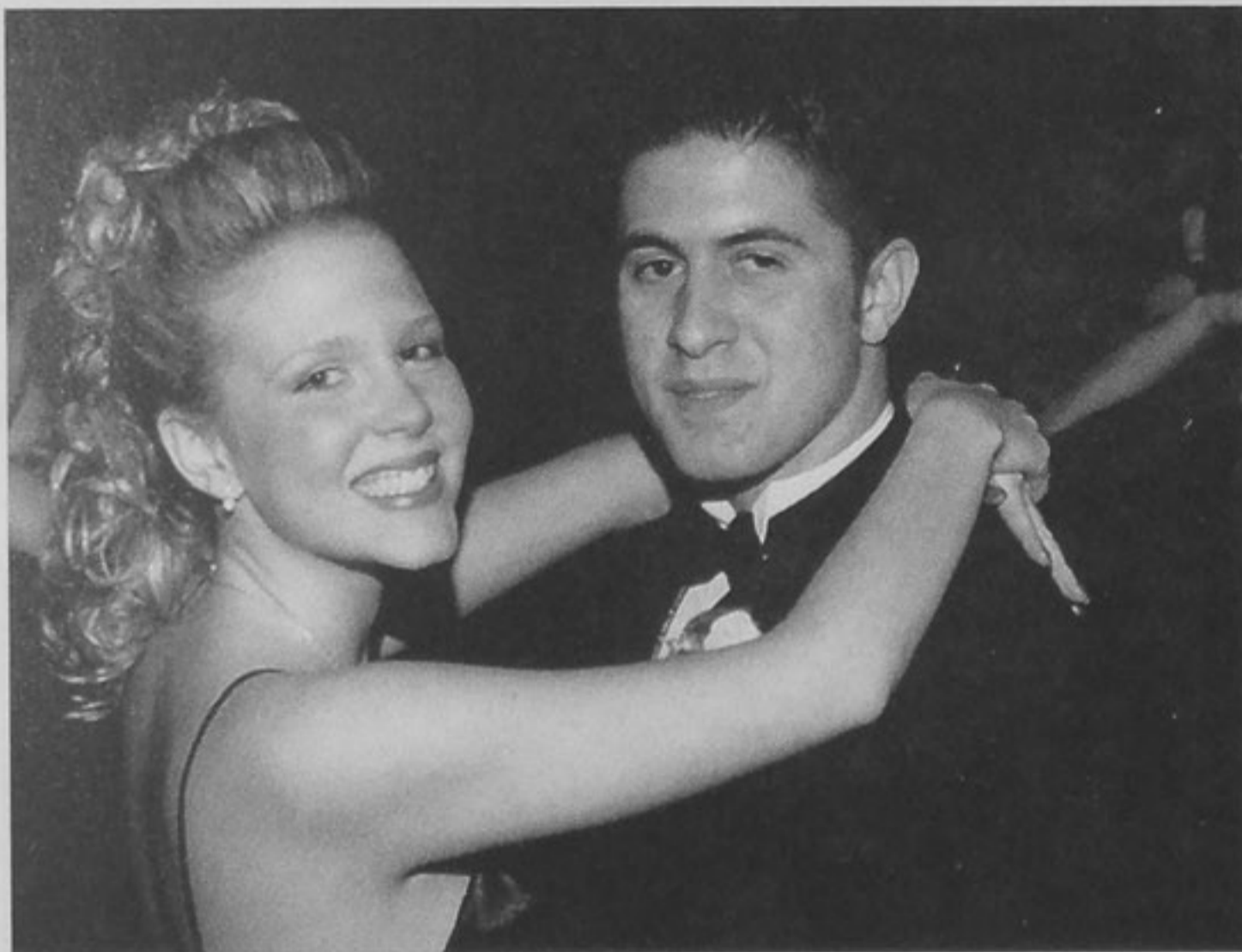

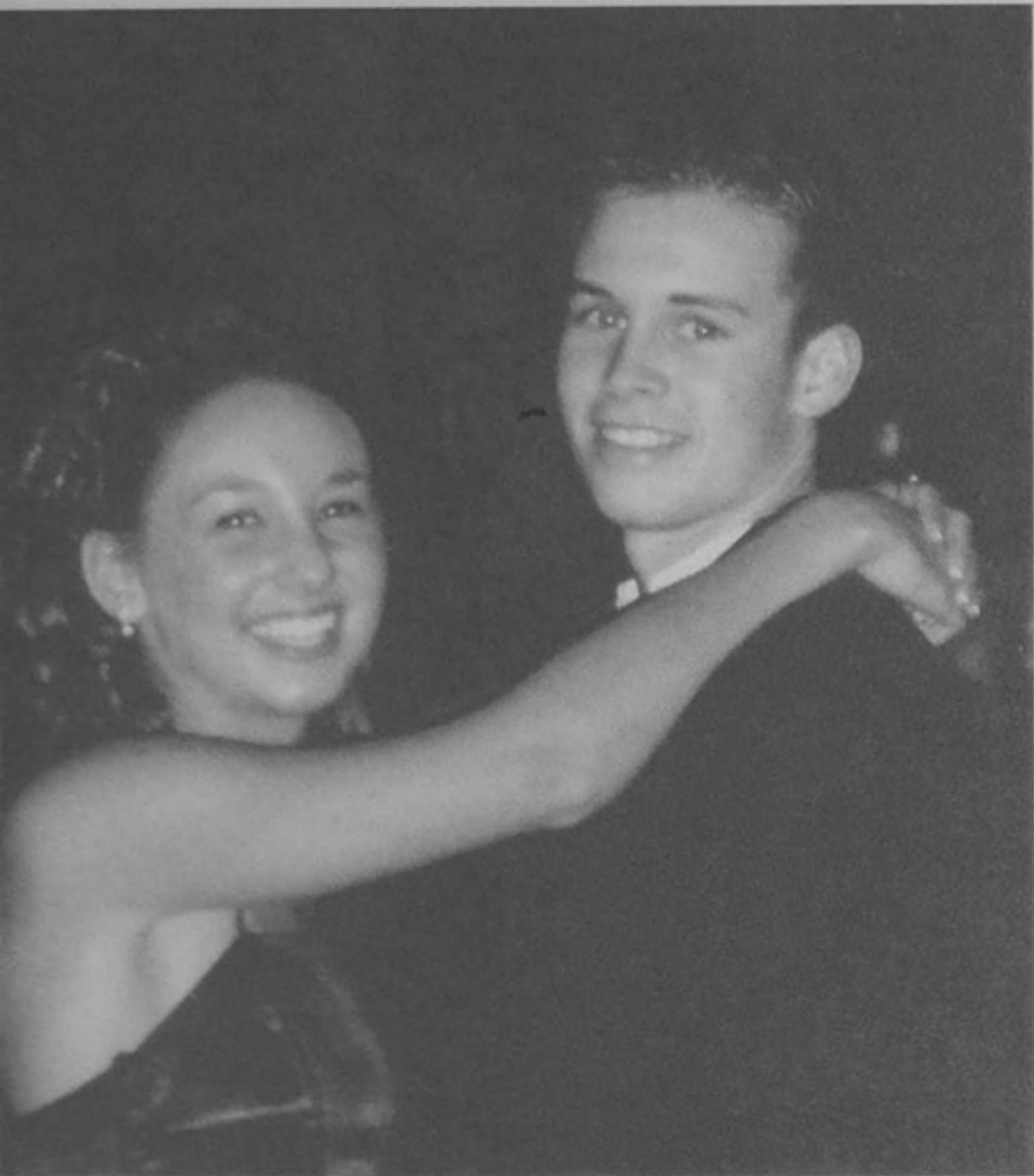

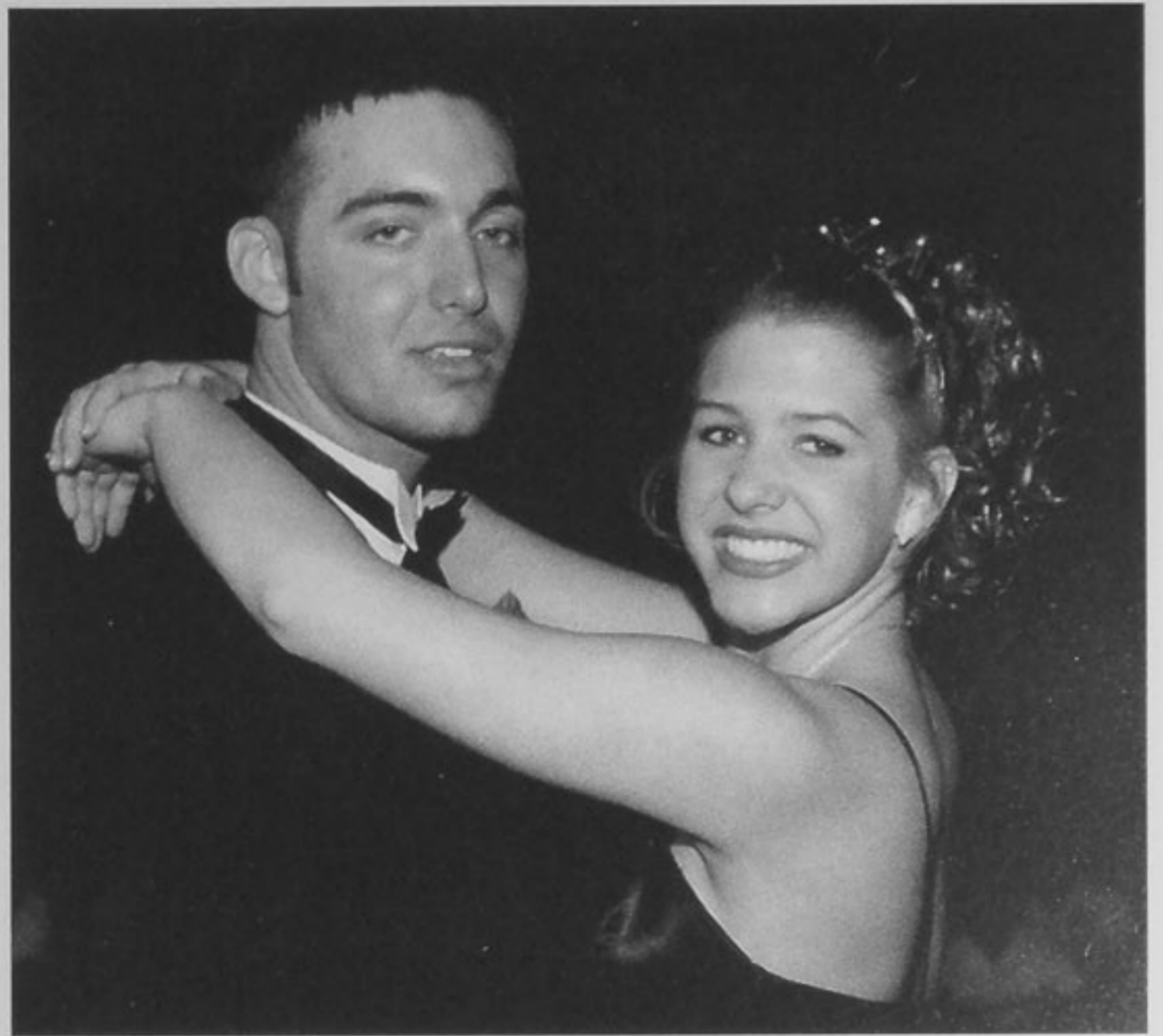

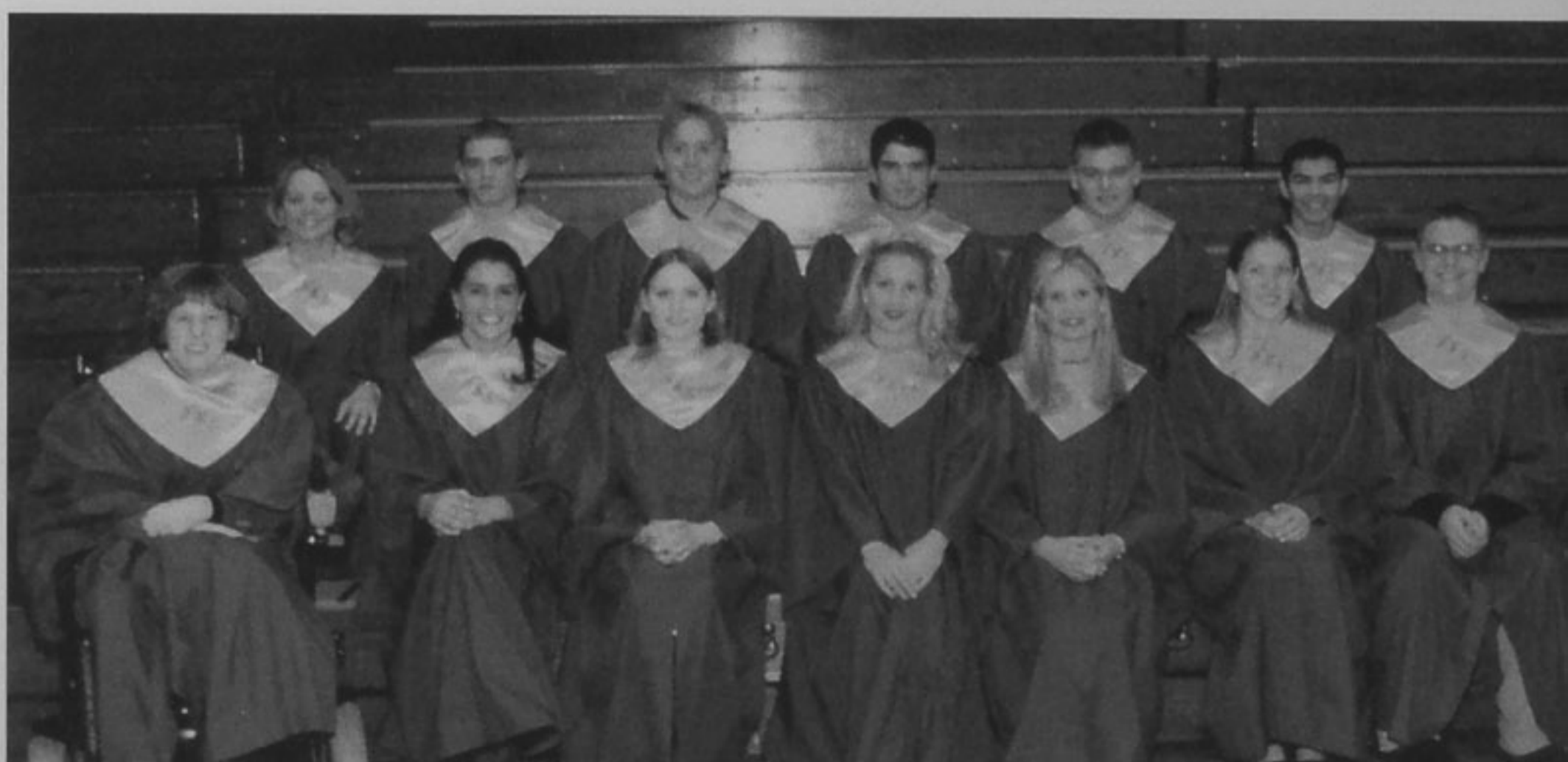

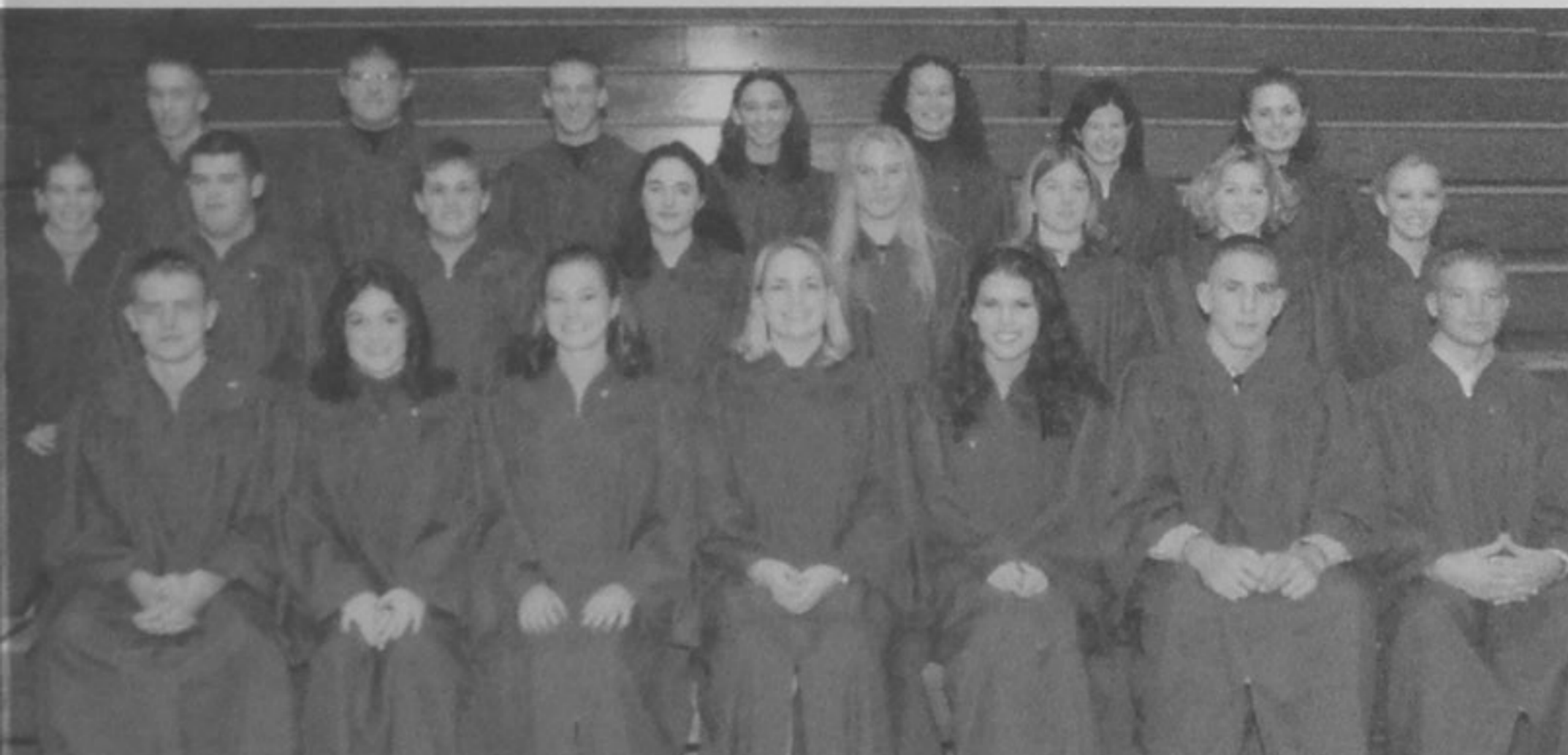

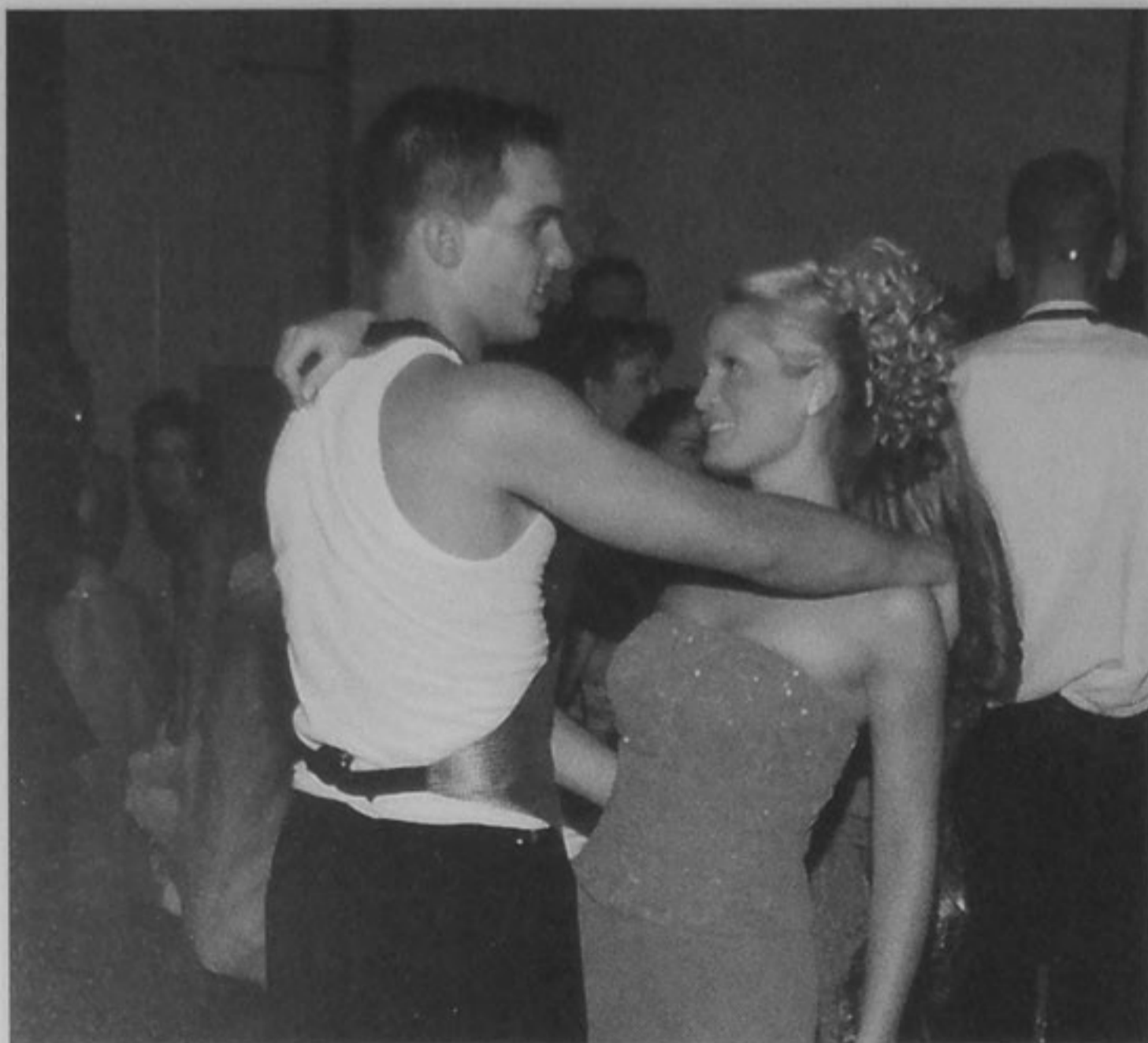

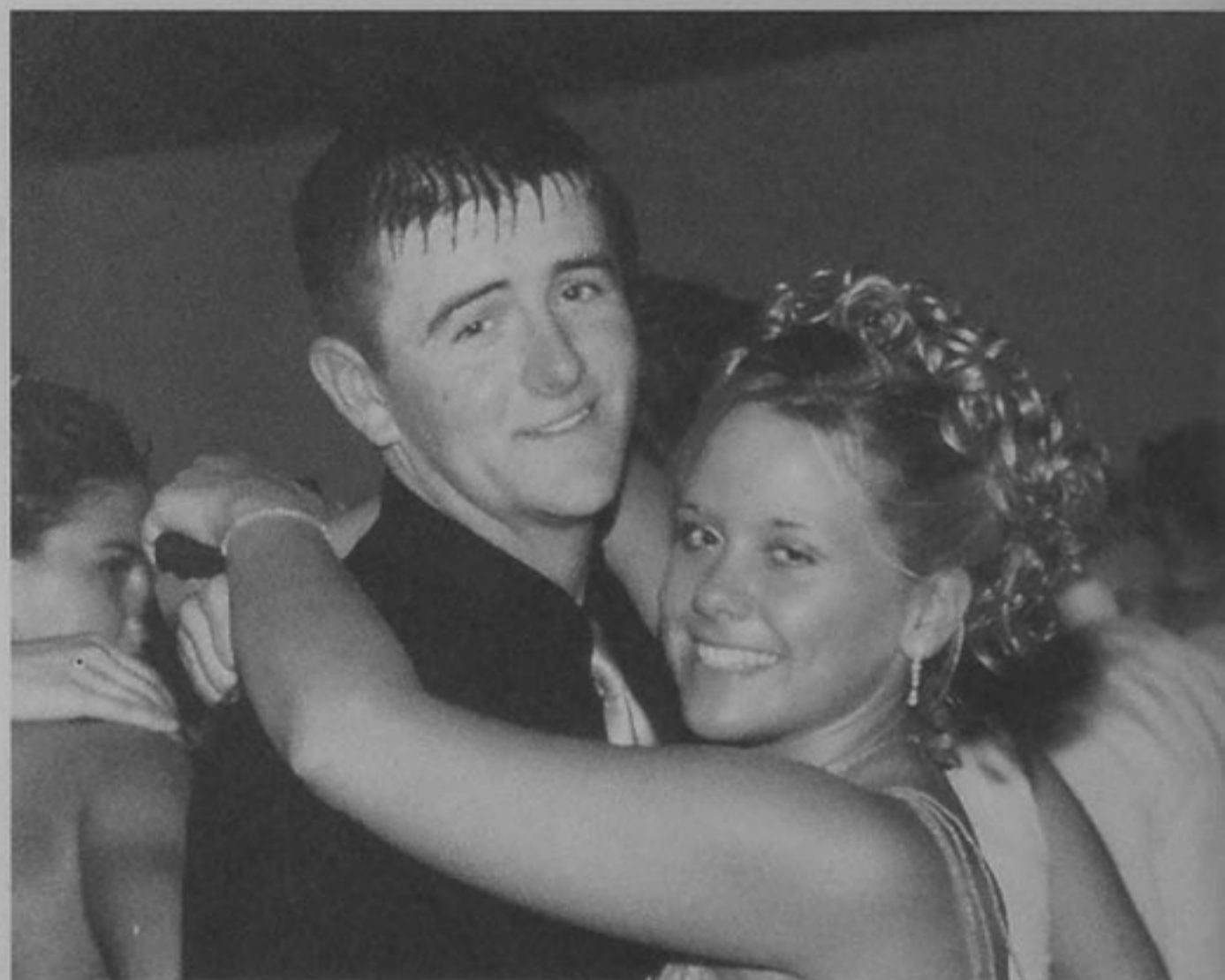

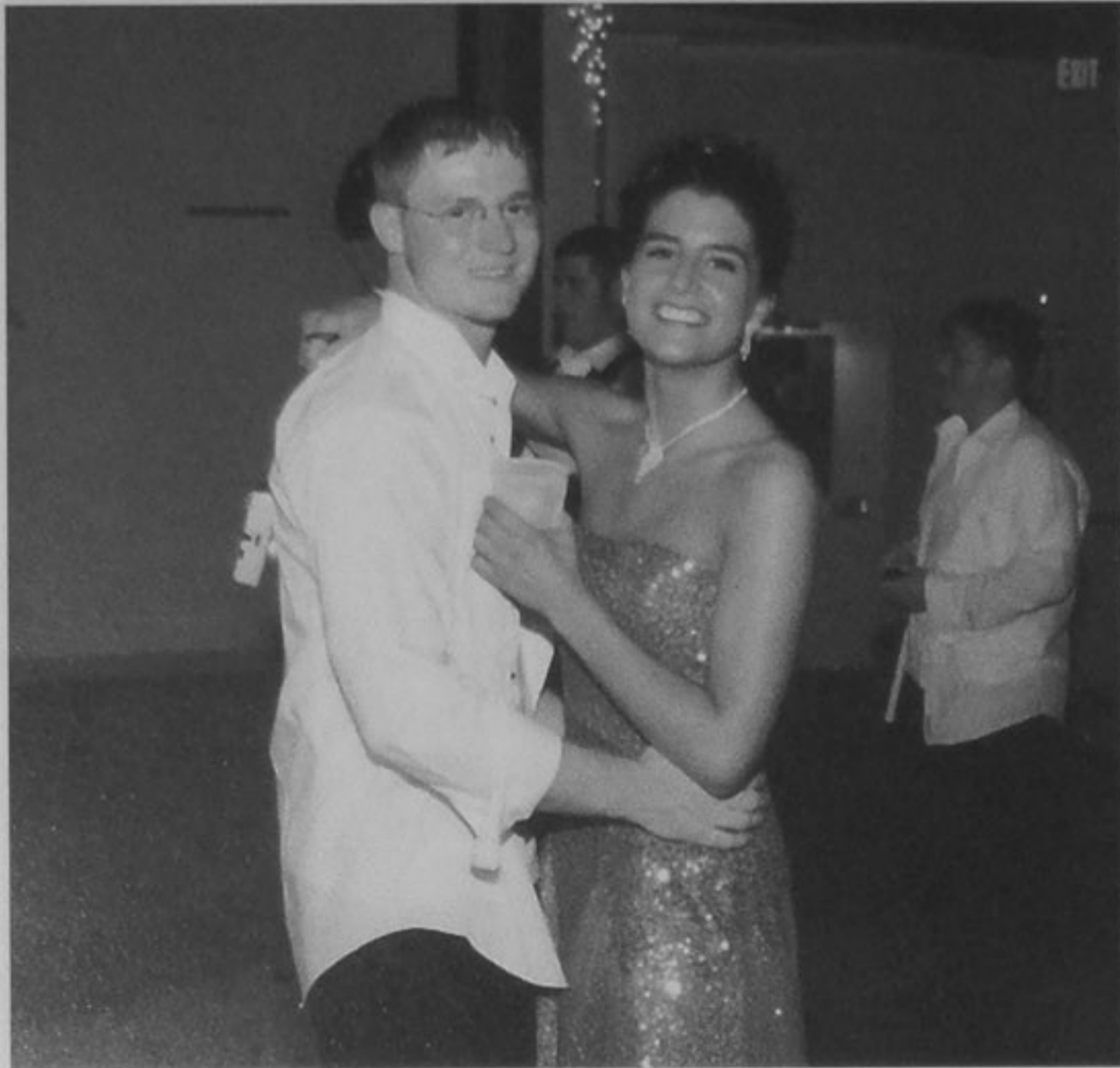

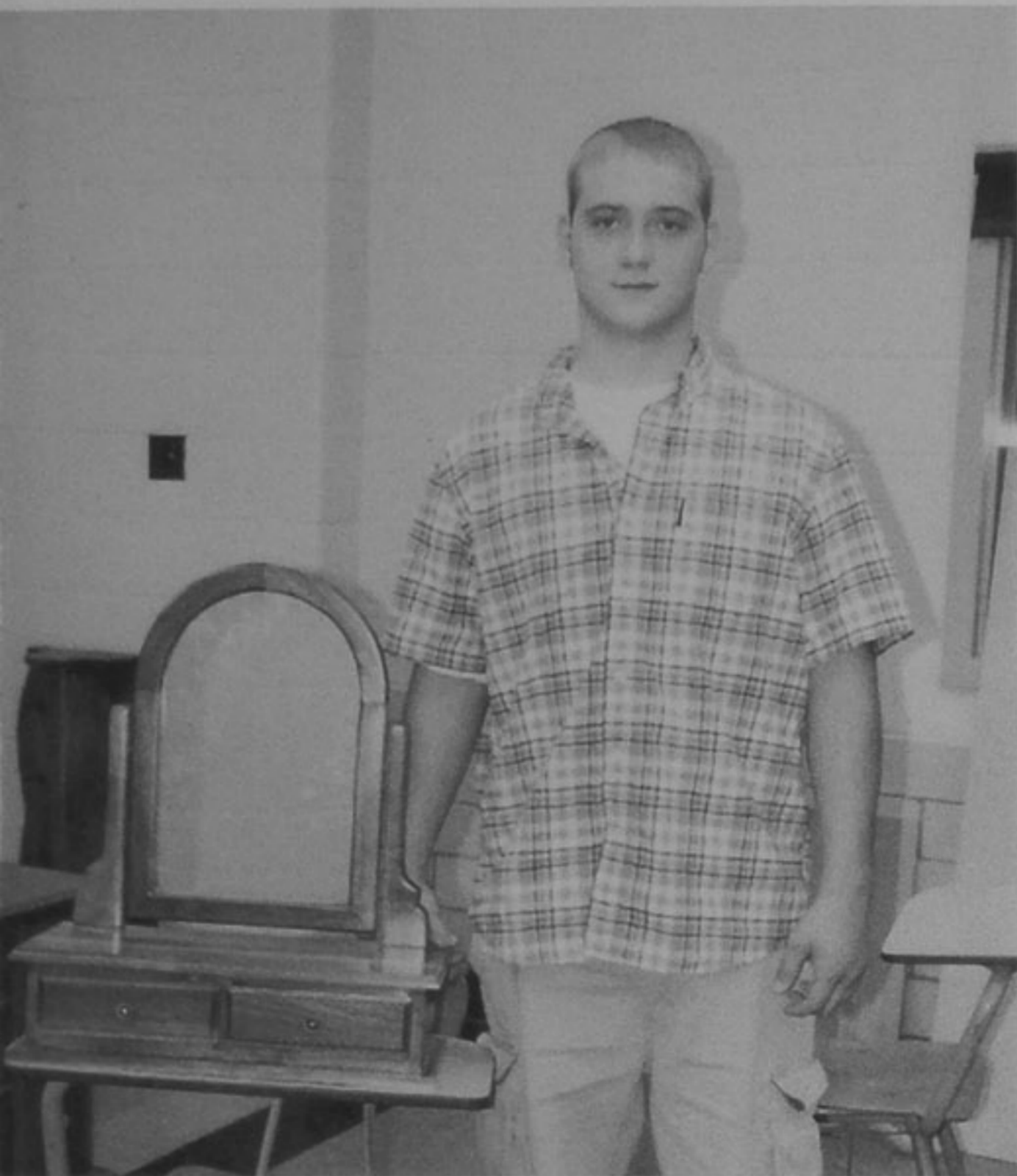

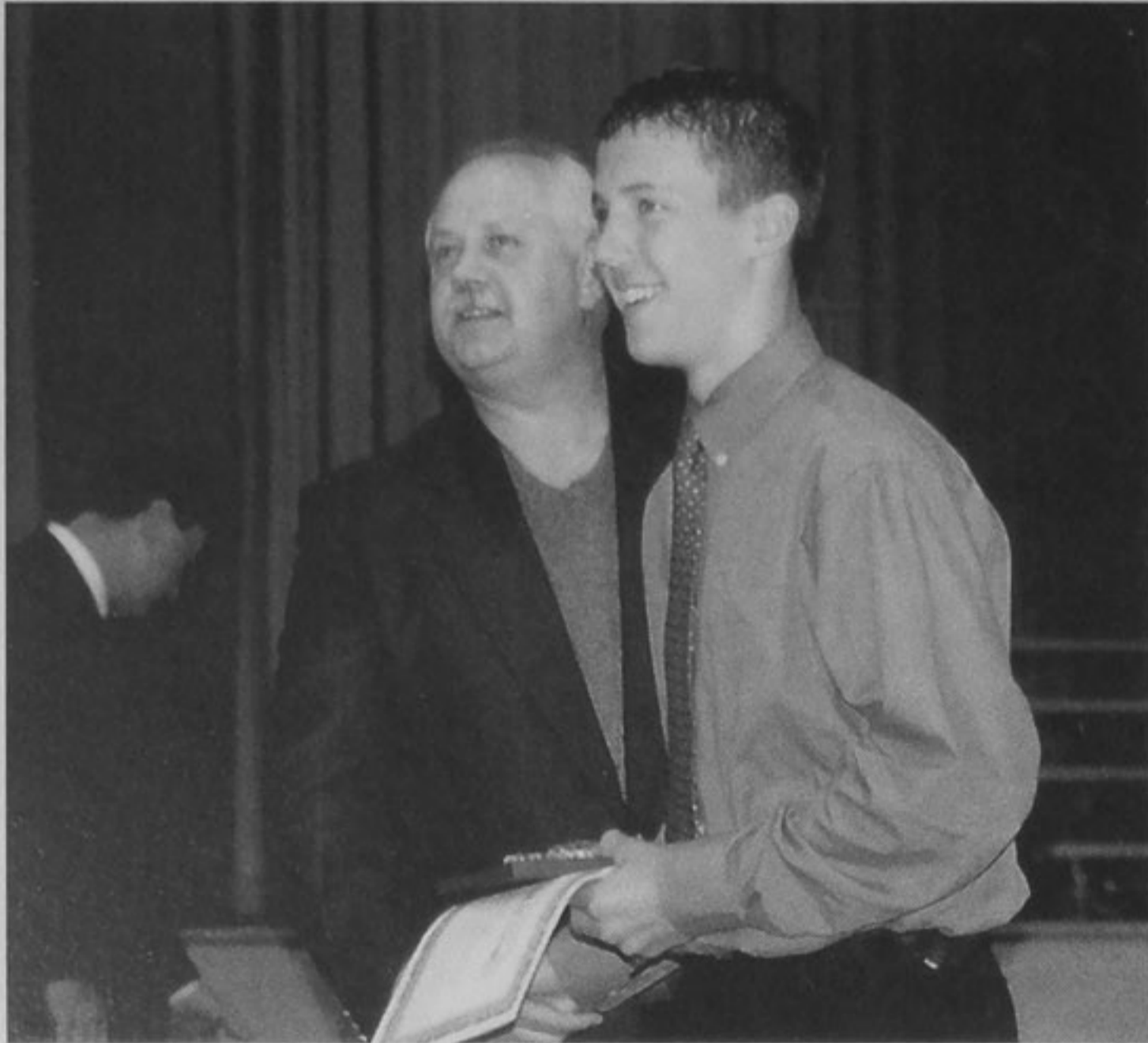

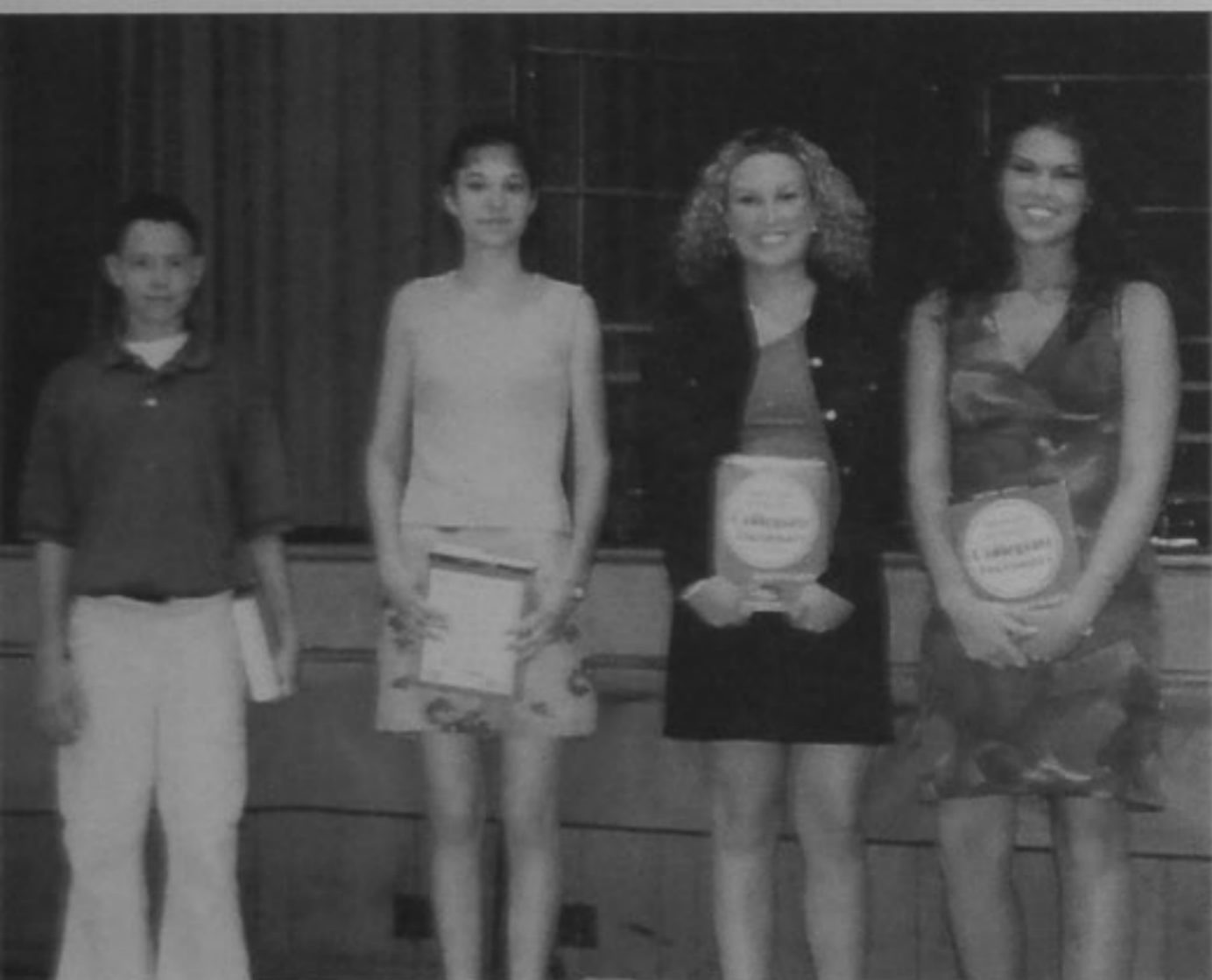




Scholarship Reception

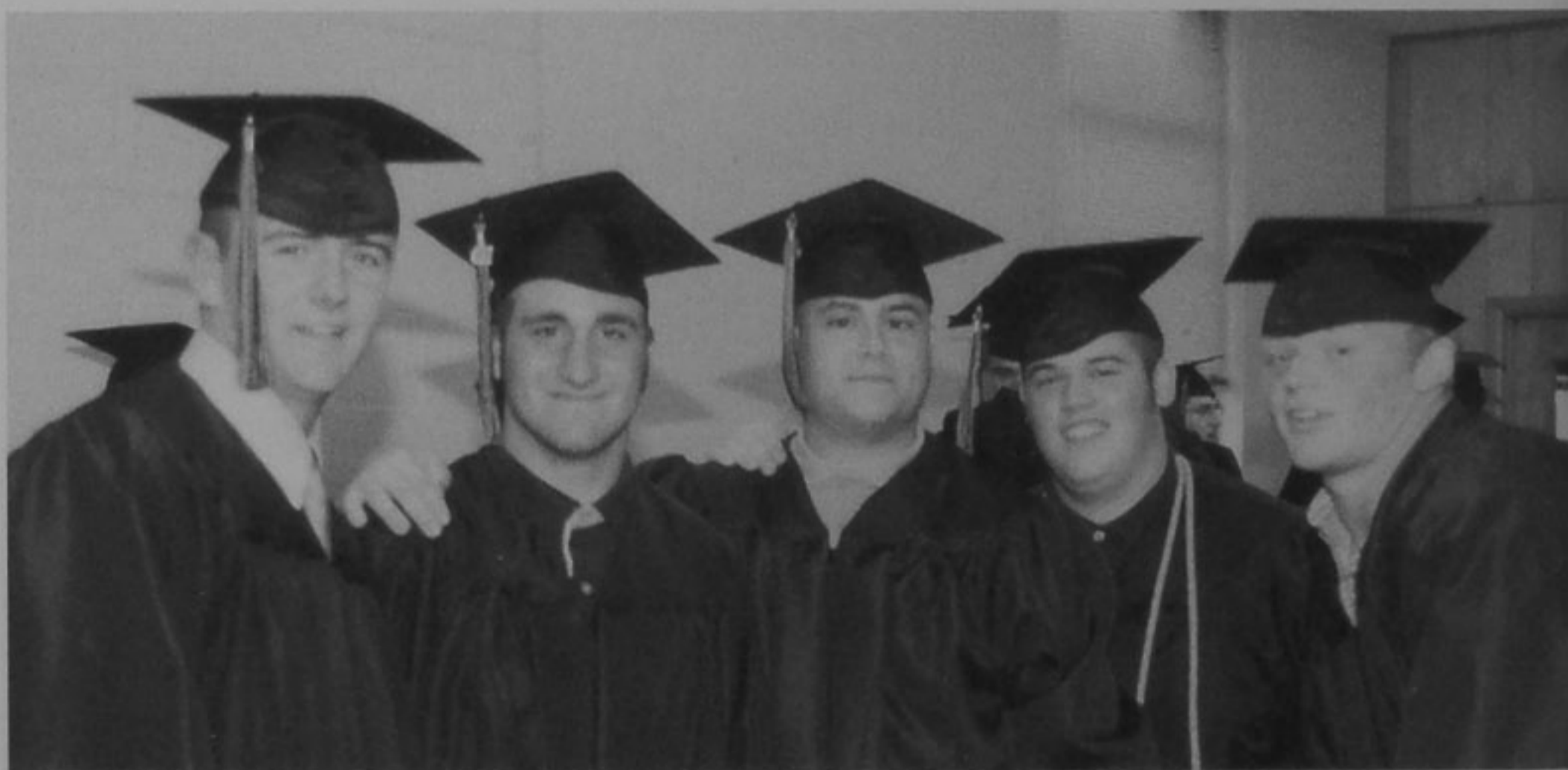

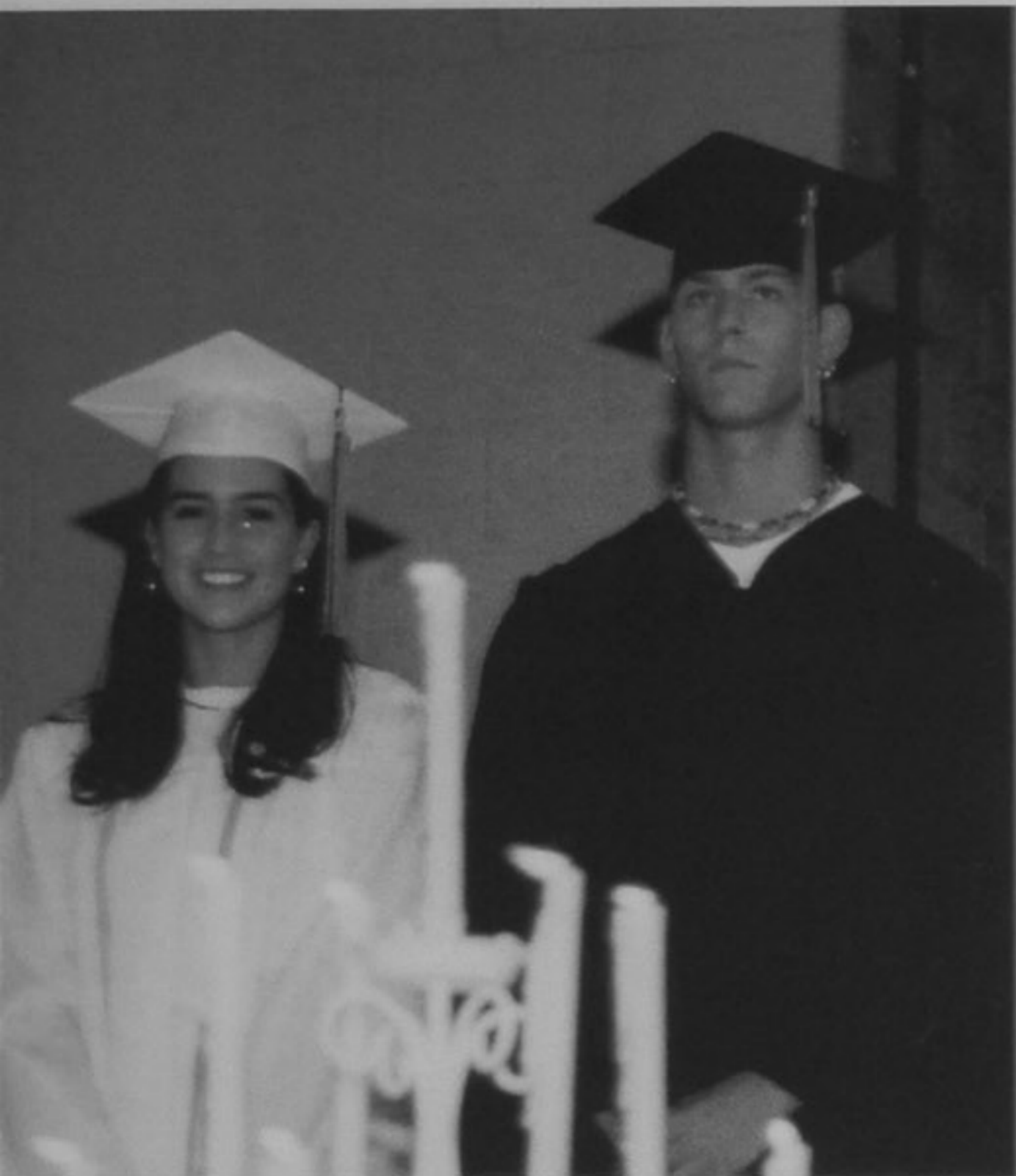

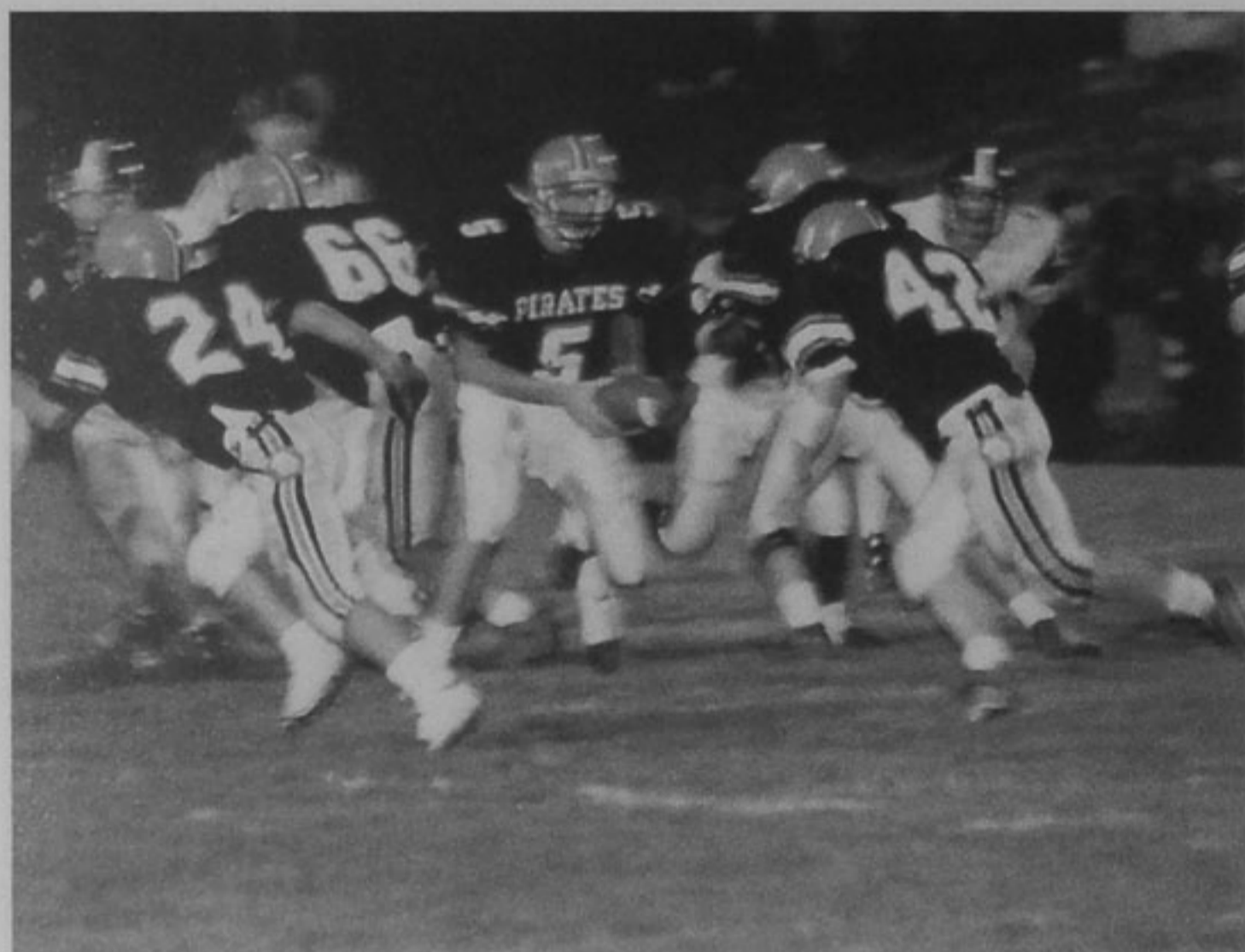

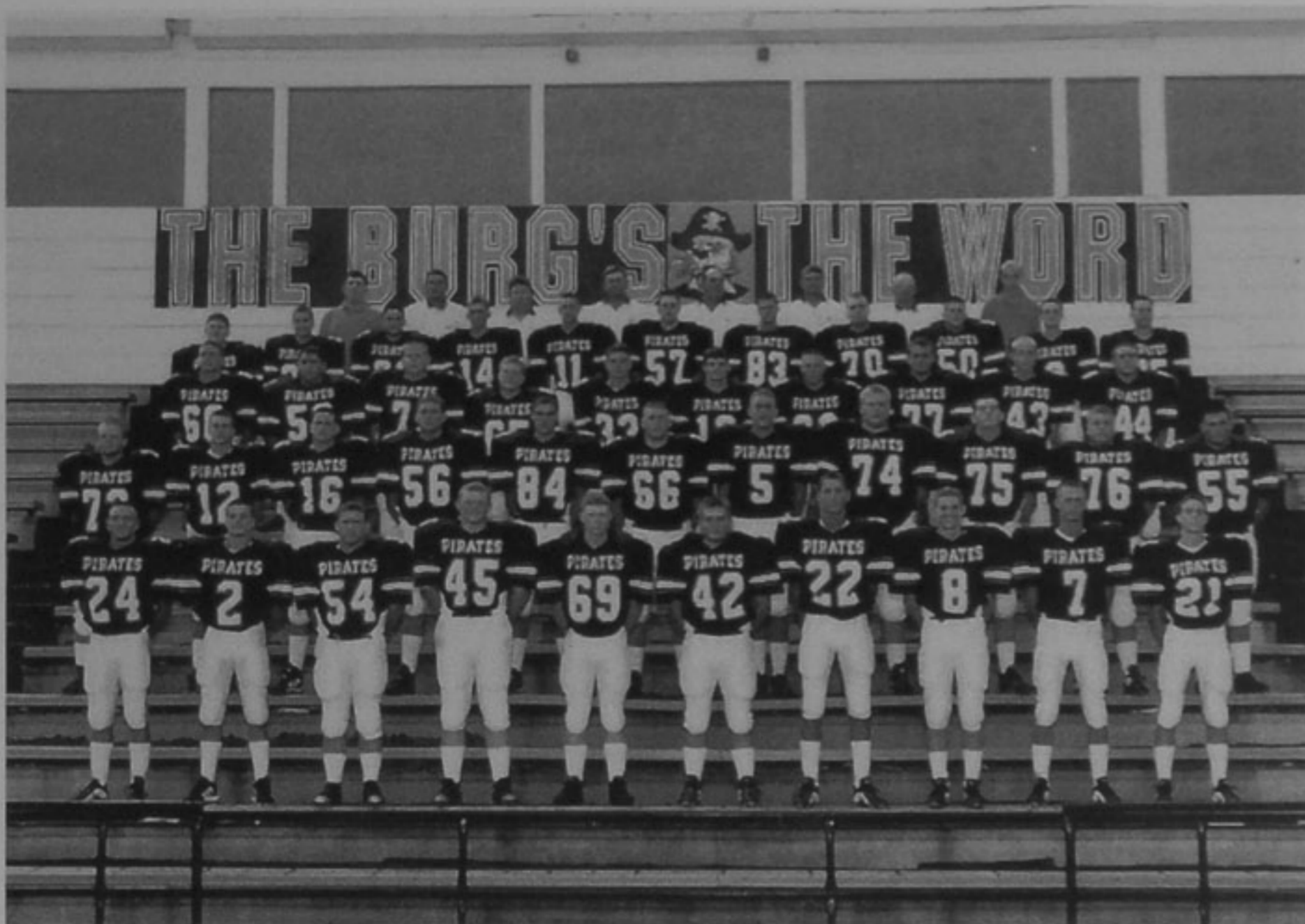

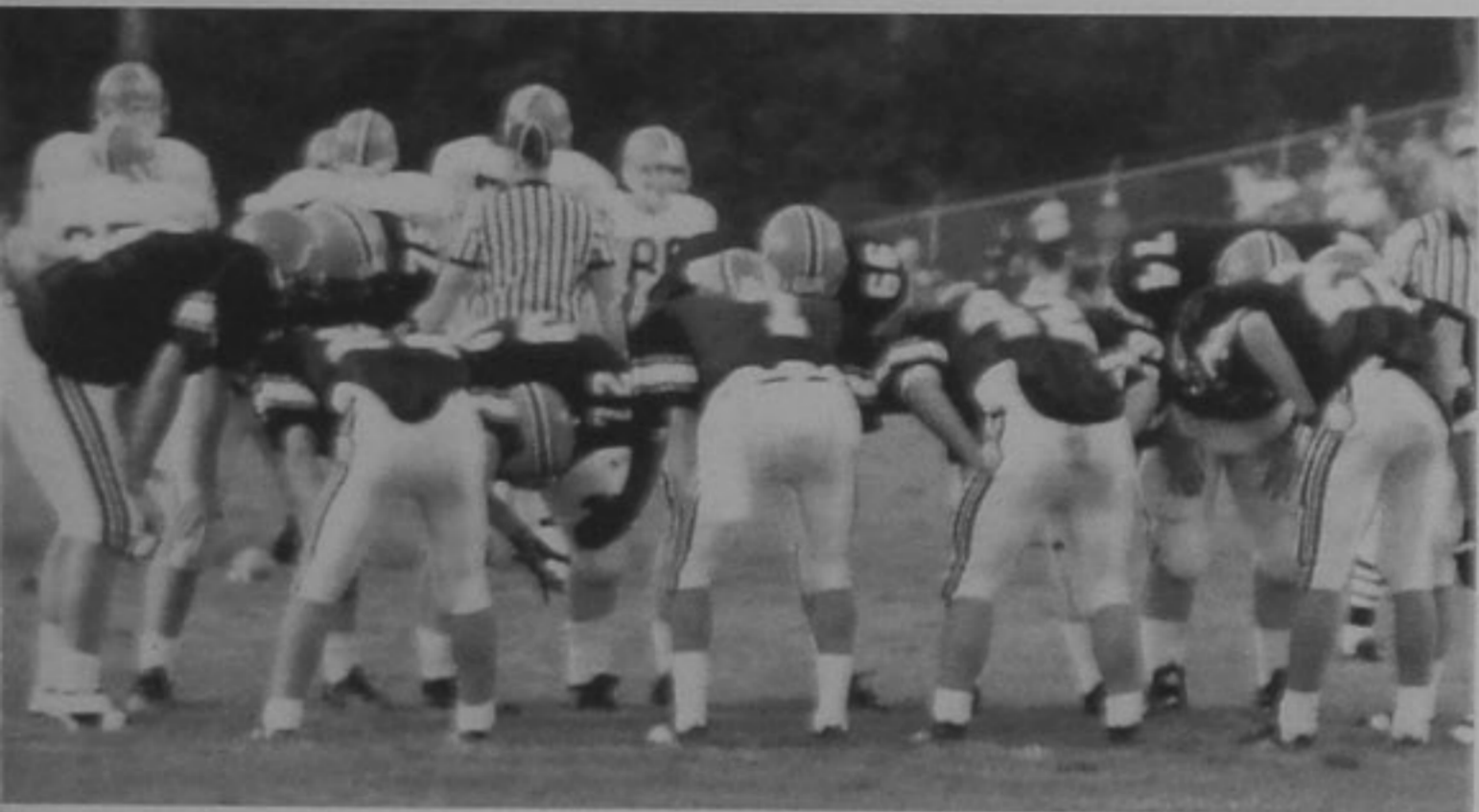

The fourth-state ranked Pirate Soccer team continued their reign atop the SOC this year by earning a share of the conference title with Minford with a 17-2-1 on the year. The "Booters" squared off the first time with the Falcons and were defeated 0-1, but the Pirates regained their position atop the SOC by defeating Minford the second time with a landslide 4-0 victory for the Pirates on their home field. The memorable 2000 SOC season with a 11-1-0 record became the seventh year in a row that the Pirates have won the title. The team continued winning through the tournaments, becoming the District Champions for the third consecutive year. The Pirates scored 89 goals, only allowed 8 goals, and recorded 14 shutout victories to break the previous school record they set in 1999. 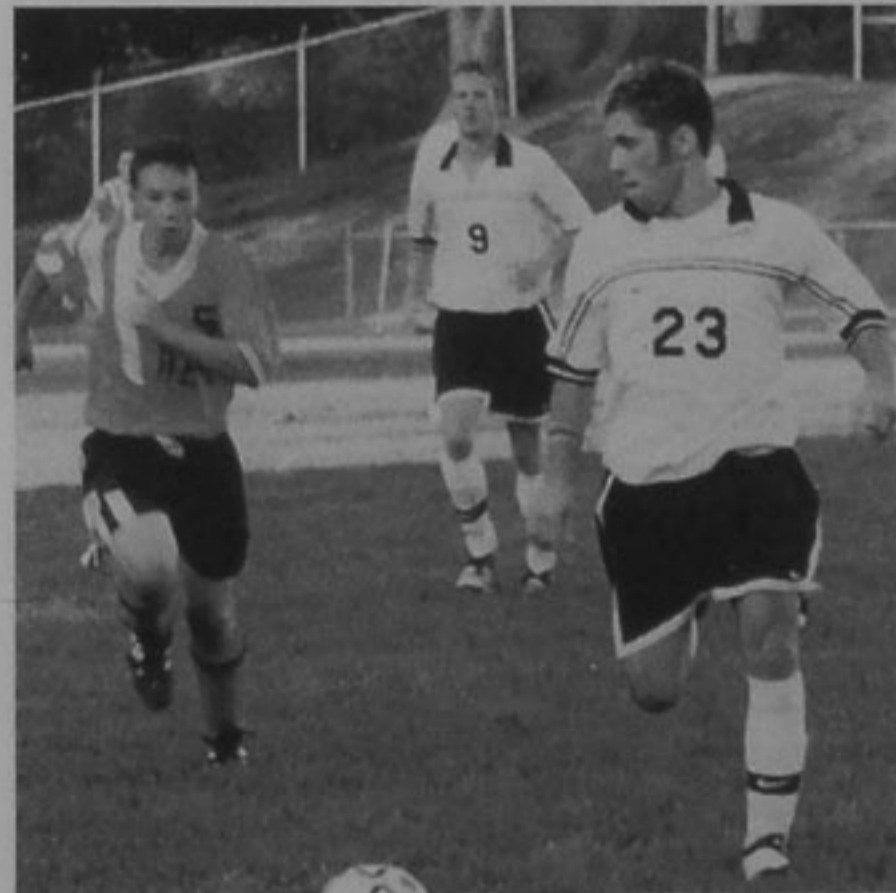

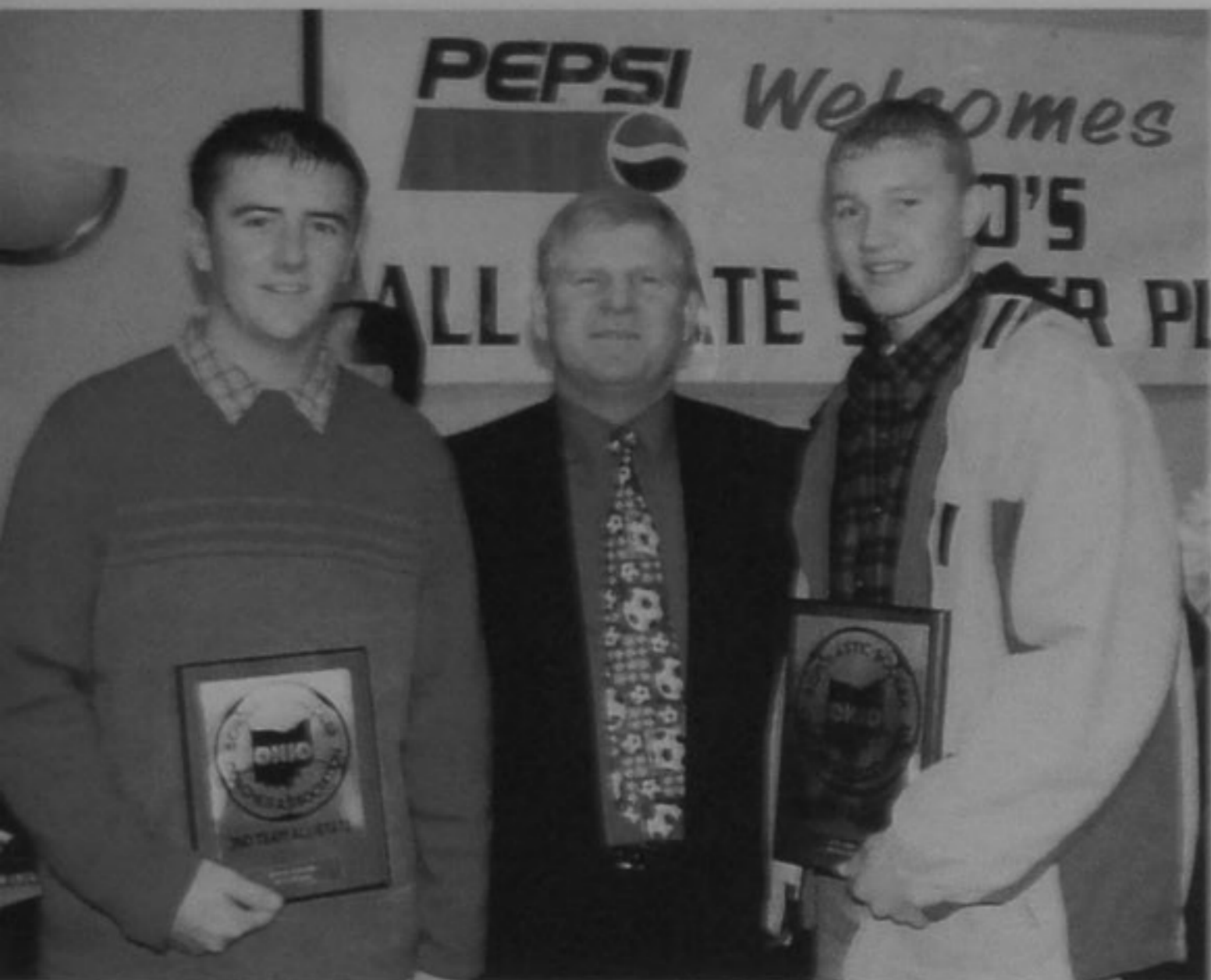

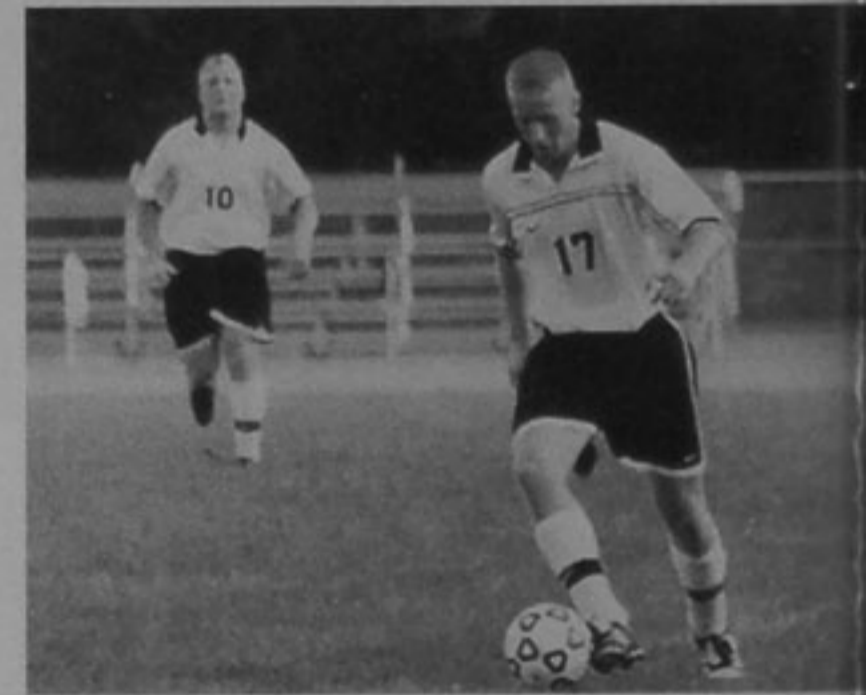

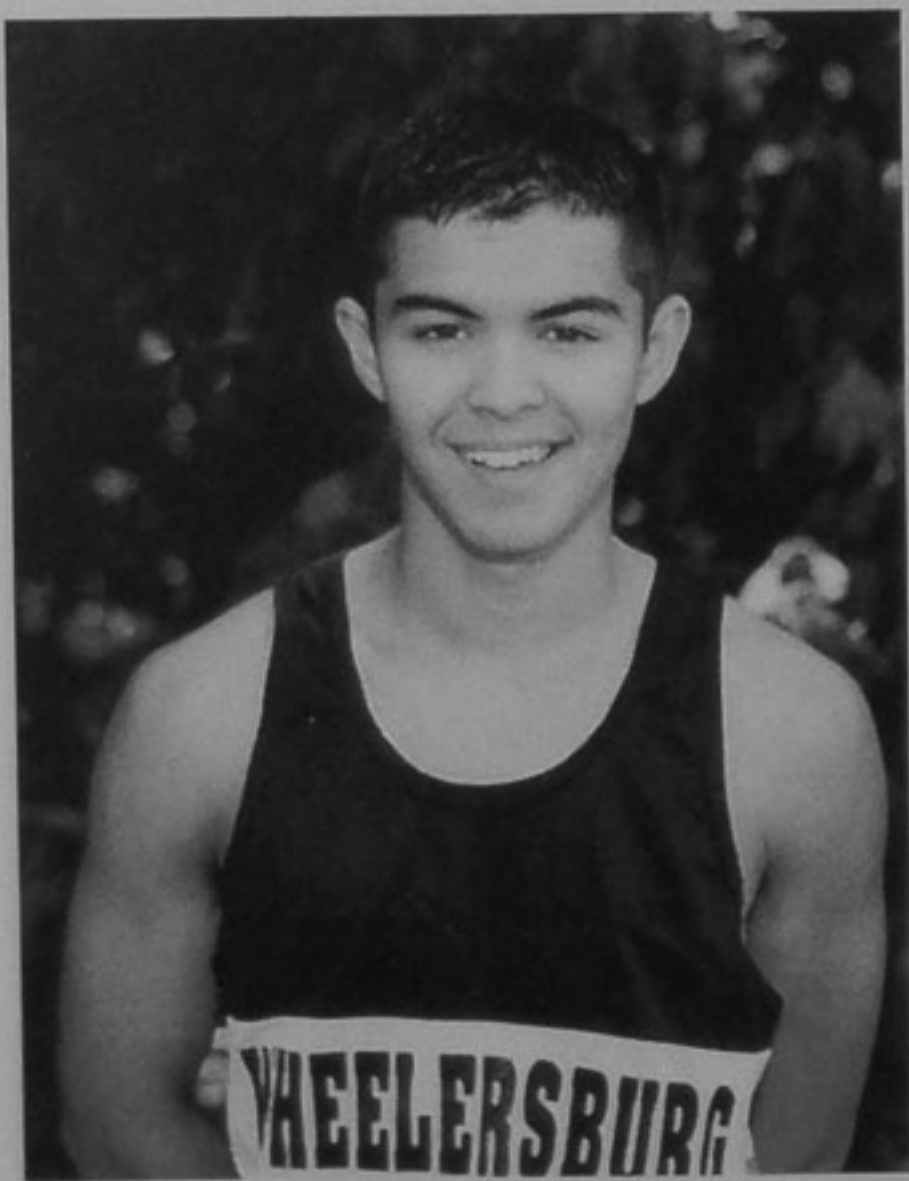

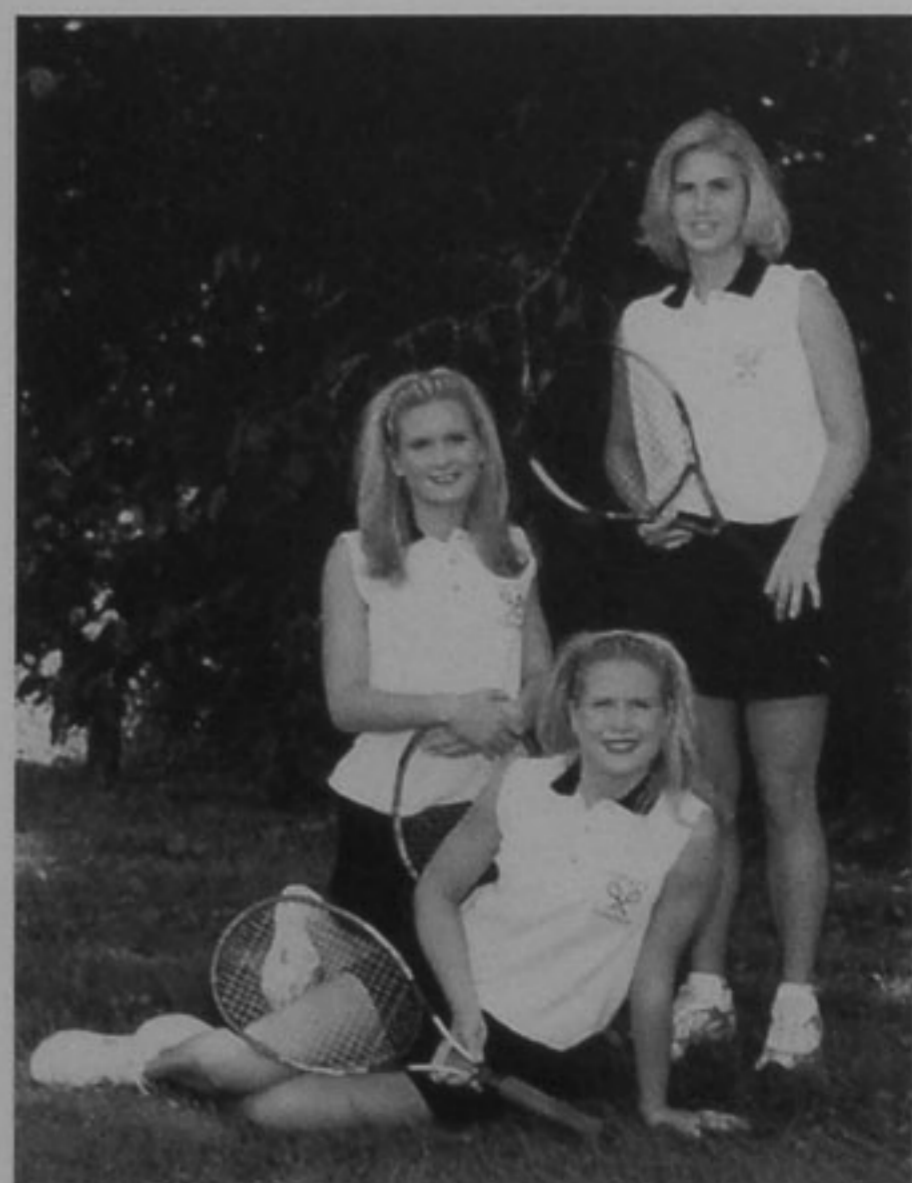

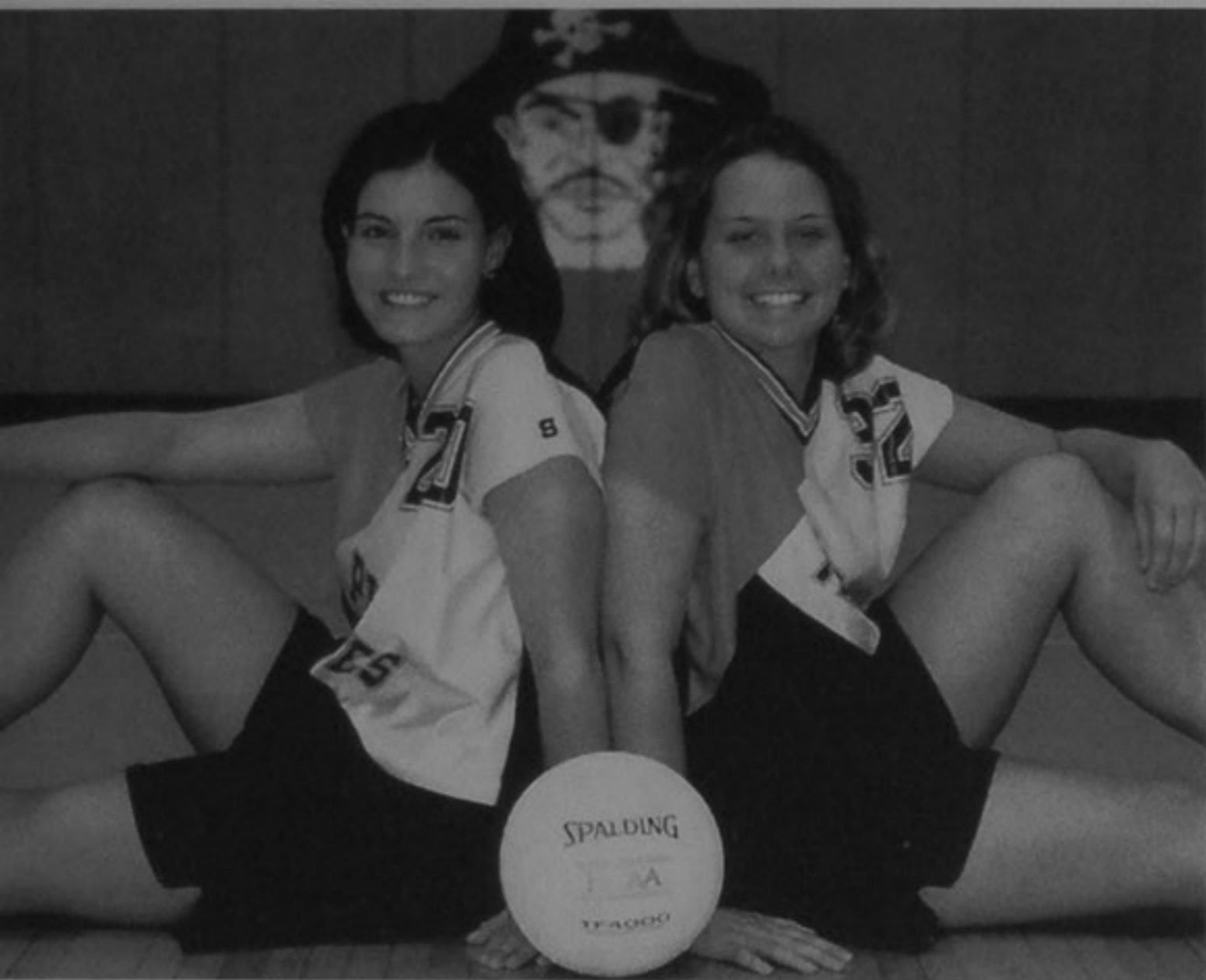

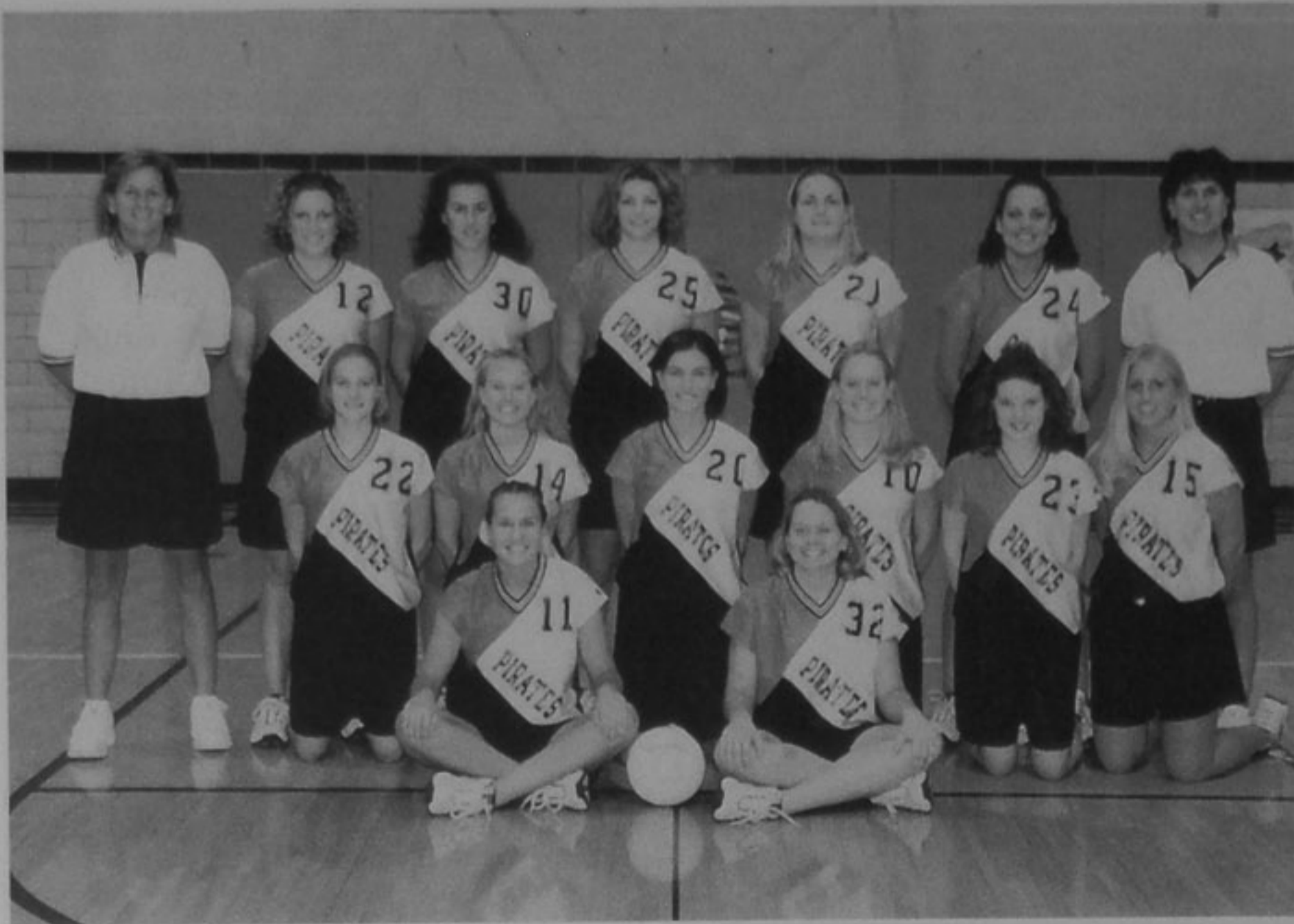

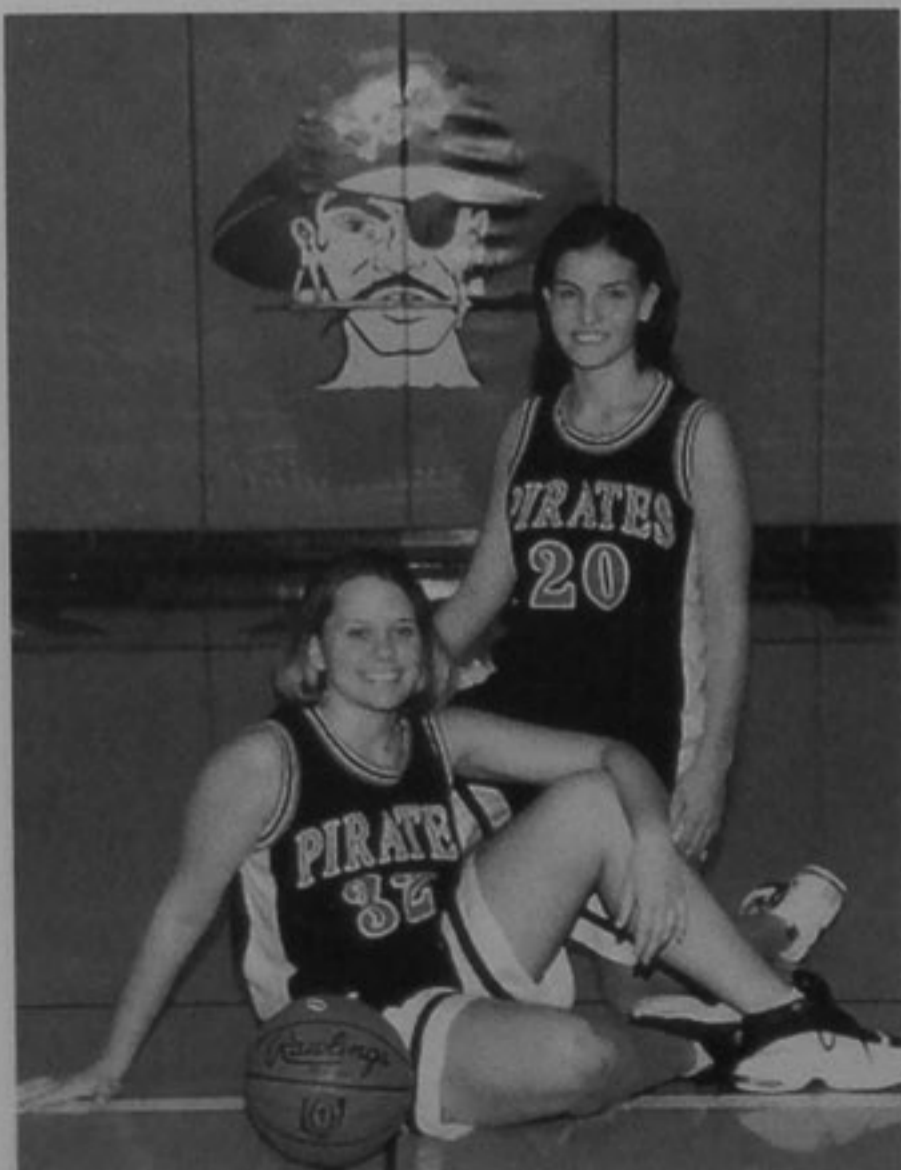

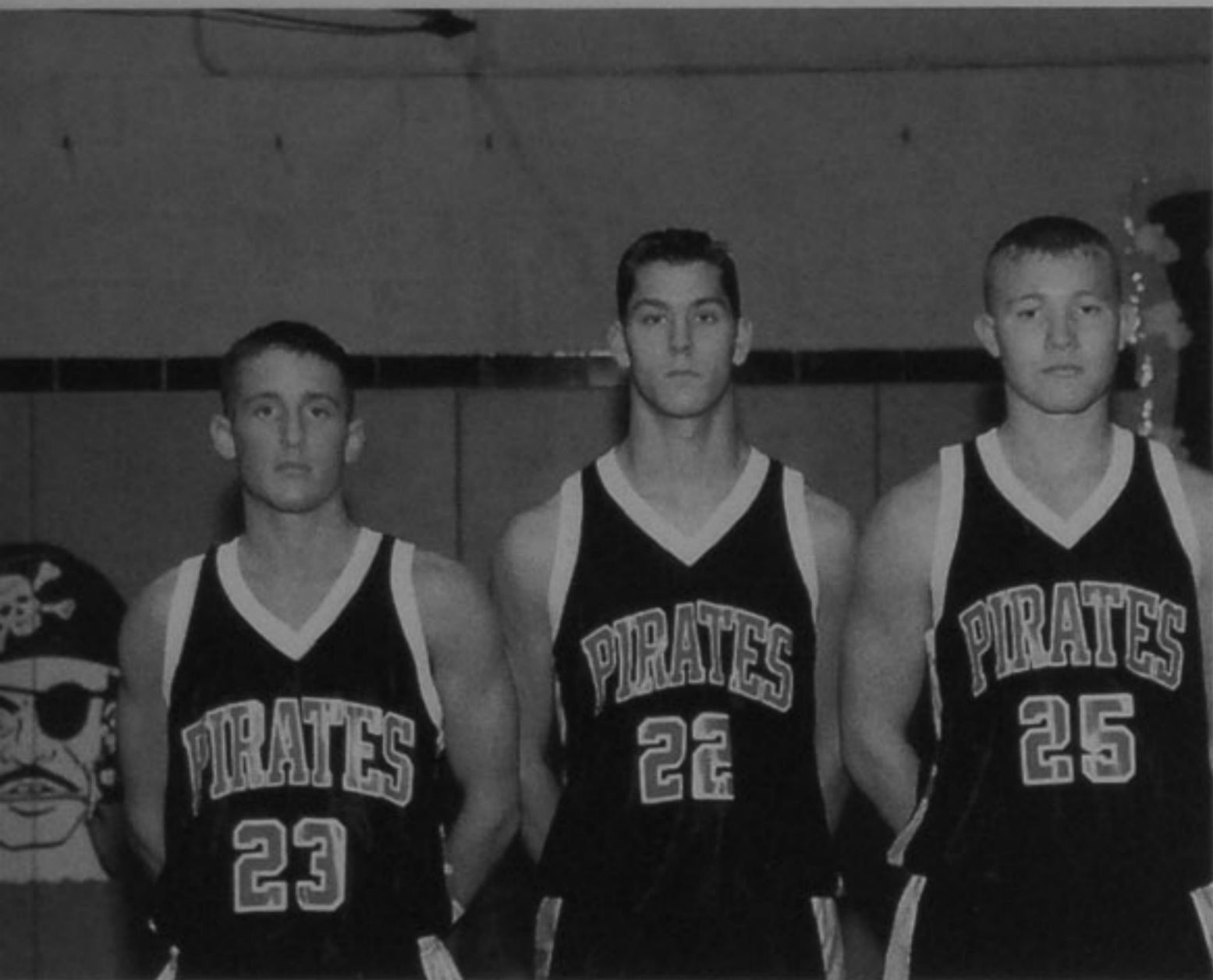

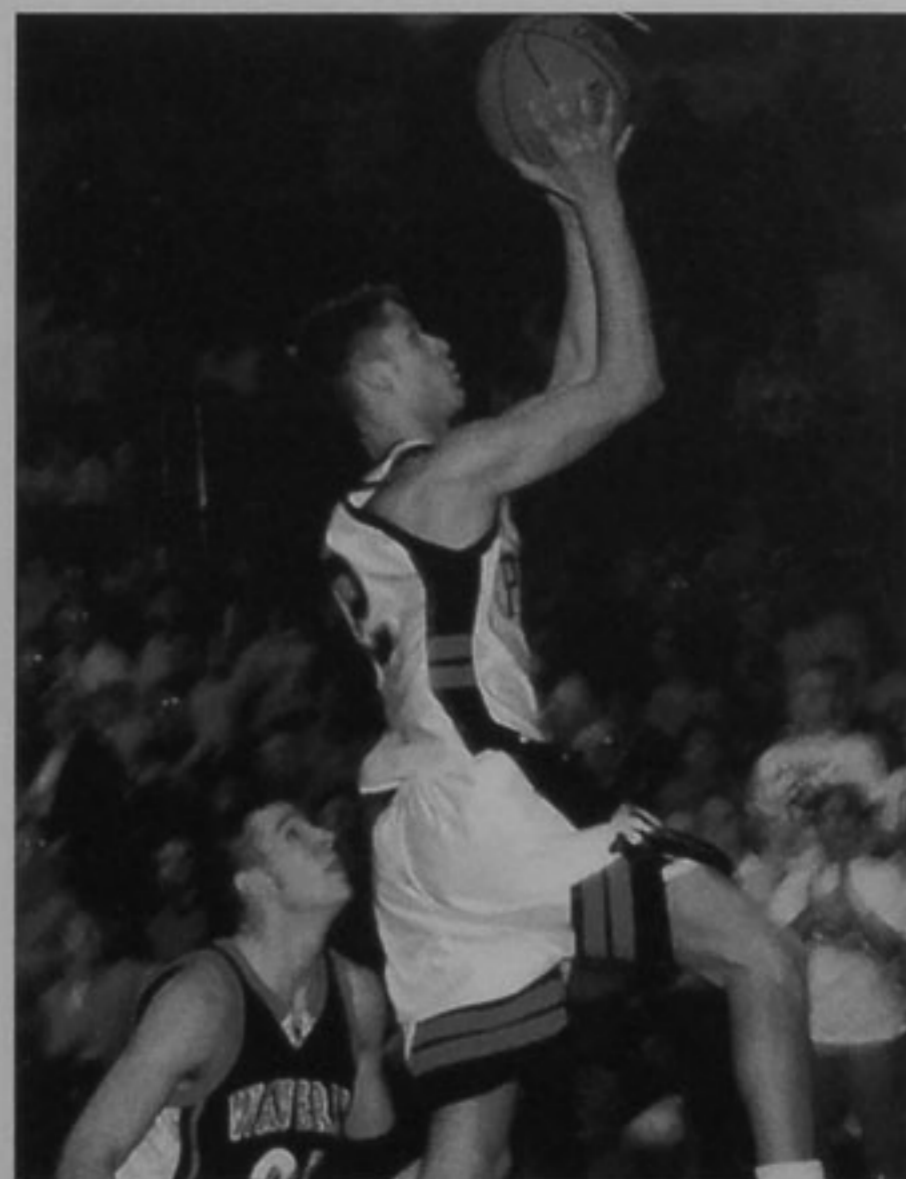

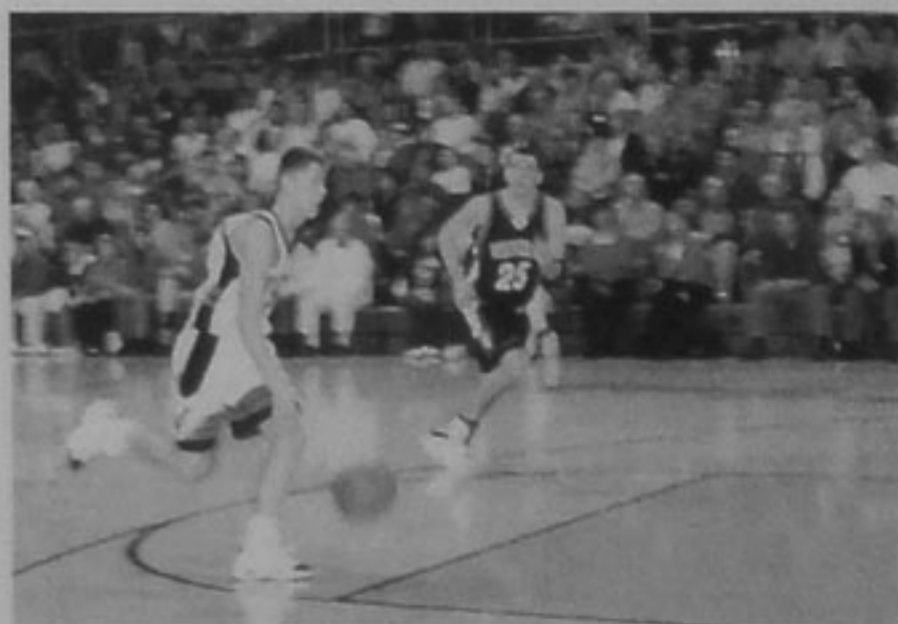

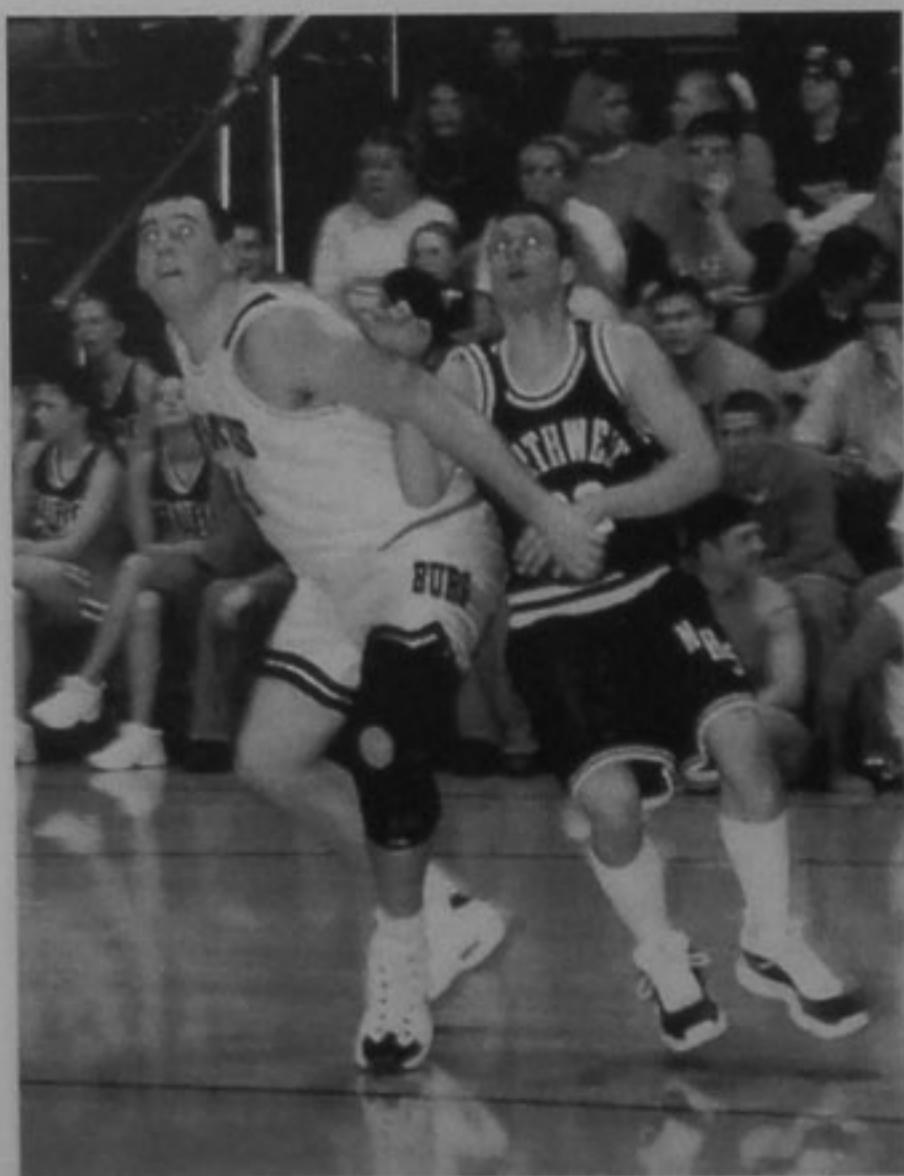

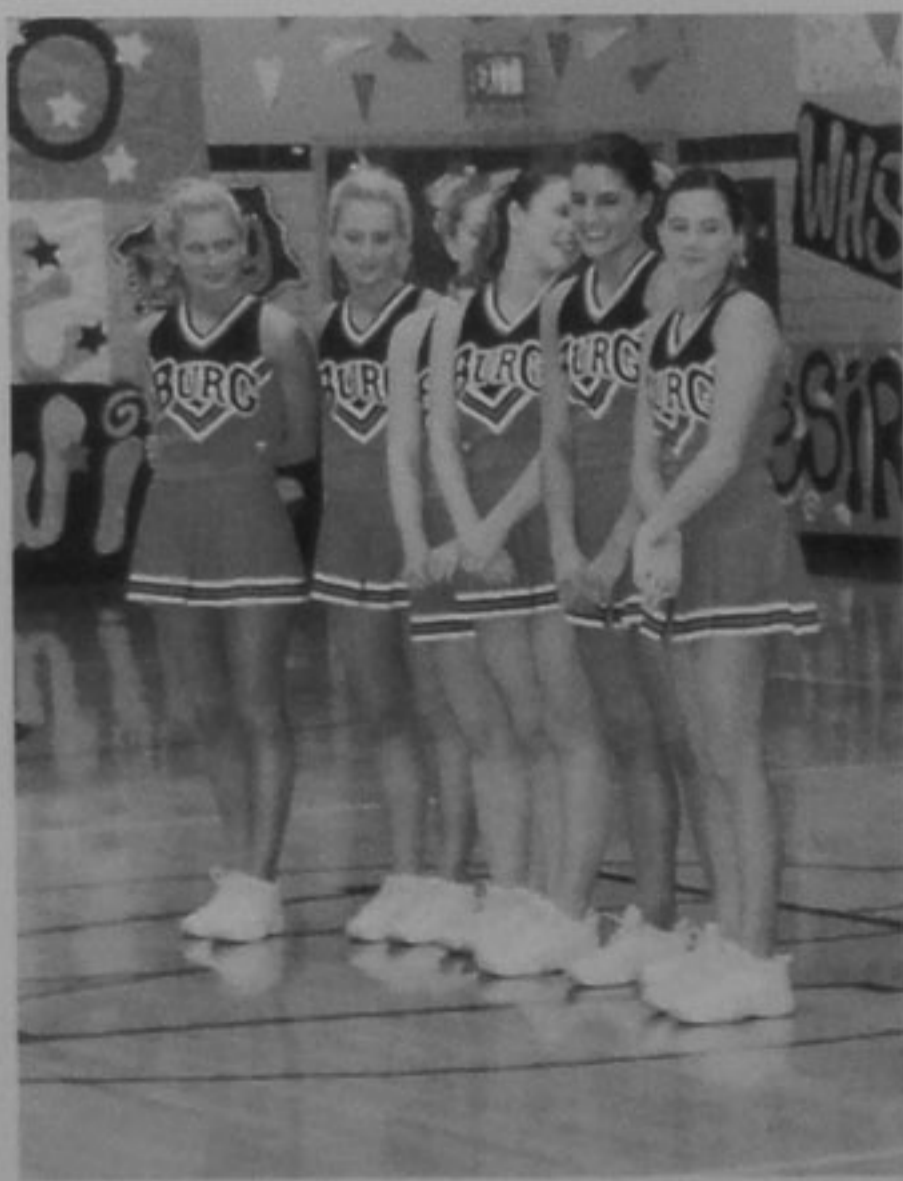

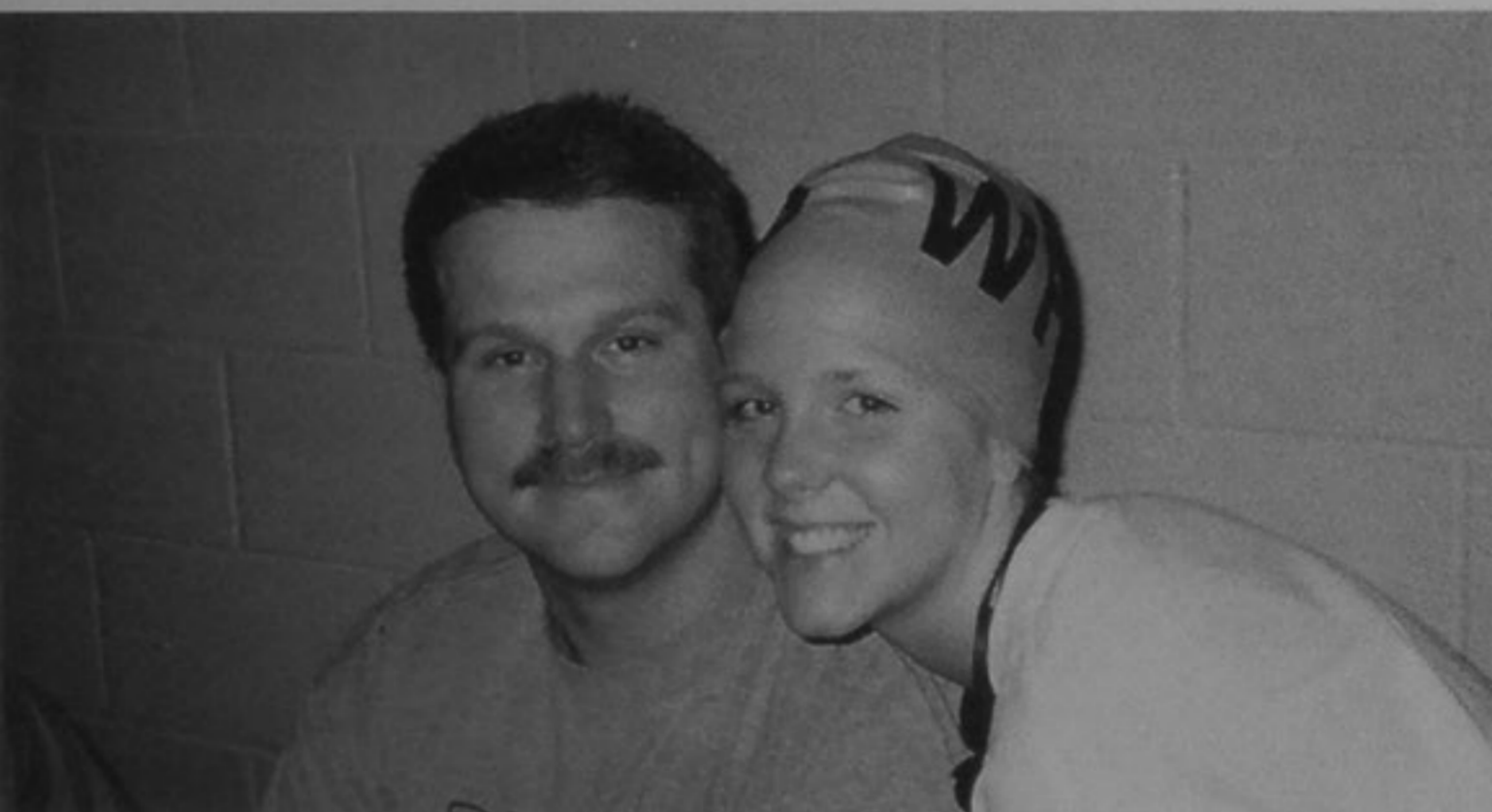

The boys' track team won all of the track meets that it competed in this season. They broke records, won titles, and overall completed an excellent year. The boys' team won our home invitational with 140 points and although the team only won four out of the 16 events, they scored in 15 placing two in eight events. This revealed Wheelersburg's ability to work together as a team. At the SOC meet, the boys' team placed first with several members named all SOC. These included the 3200m relay team of Dustin Winebrenner, Matt Weaver, Matt Ruggles, and Justin Hopkins; the 400m relay team of Jared Chamberlin, Dusty Chamberlin, Billy Dever, and Travis Riepenhoff; and the 1600m relay team of Brandon Jackson, Travis Riepenhoff, Matt Weaver, and Jonathan Dunham. The 1600m relay team set a new SOC record with a time of 3:30.6 which they later broke with a time of 3:26.60 with Jared Chamberlin replacing Brandon Jackson. Individually, Dusty Chamberlin was named All SOC in long jump, Adam Salyers in the shot put, Jared Chamberlin in the 110m and 300m hurdles, and Jonathan Dunham in the 100m, 200m, and the 400m dashes. Dunham also received the high point award at the SOC meet with 32.5 points. At Districts three relay teams qualified for Regionals: the 1600m, 400m, and 3200m relay teams. Also, Jonathan Dunham qualified in the 400m dash, Dustin Chamberlin in the high jump, and Matt Ruggles in the 800m run. At Regionals, Jonathan Dunham qualified for state in the 400m dash breaking the school record with a time of 49.50. Dusty Chamberlin qualified in the high jump and the 400m relay team of Dunham, Riepenhoff, J. Chamberlin, and Weaver qualified for the State meet. In State competition the 400m relay team placed sixteenth and Jonathan Dunham placed third in the 400m dash with a time of 50.33.

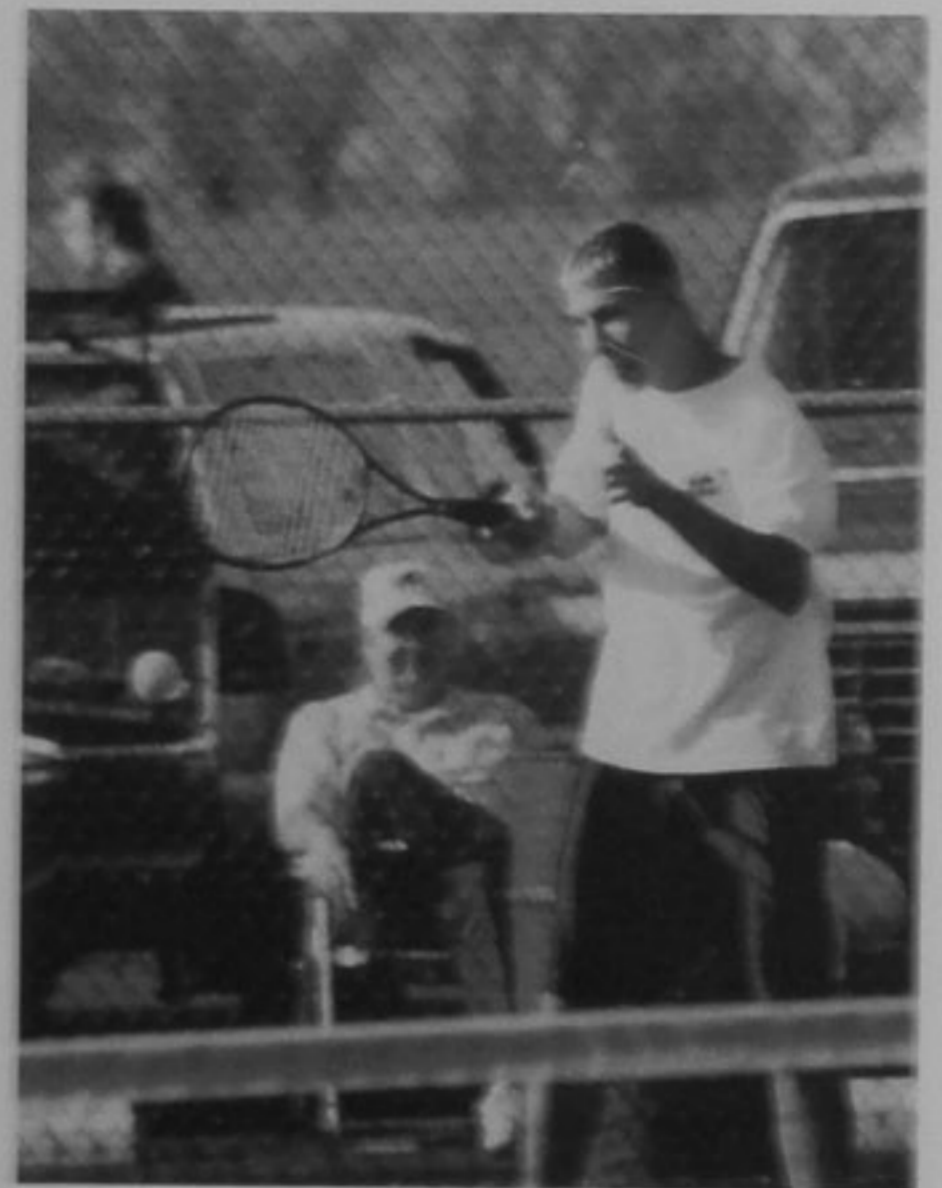

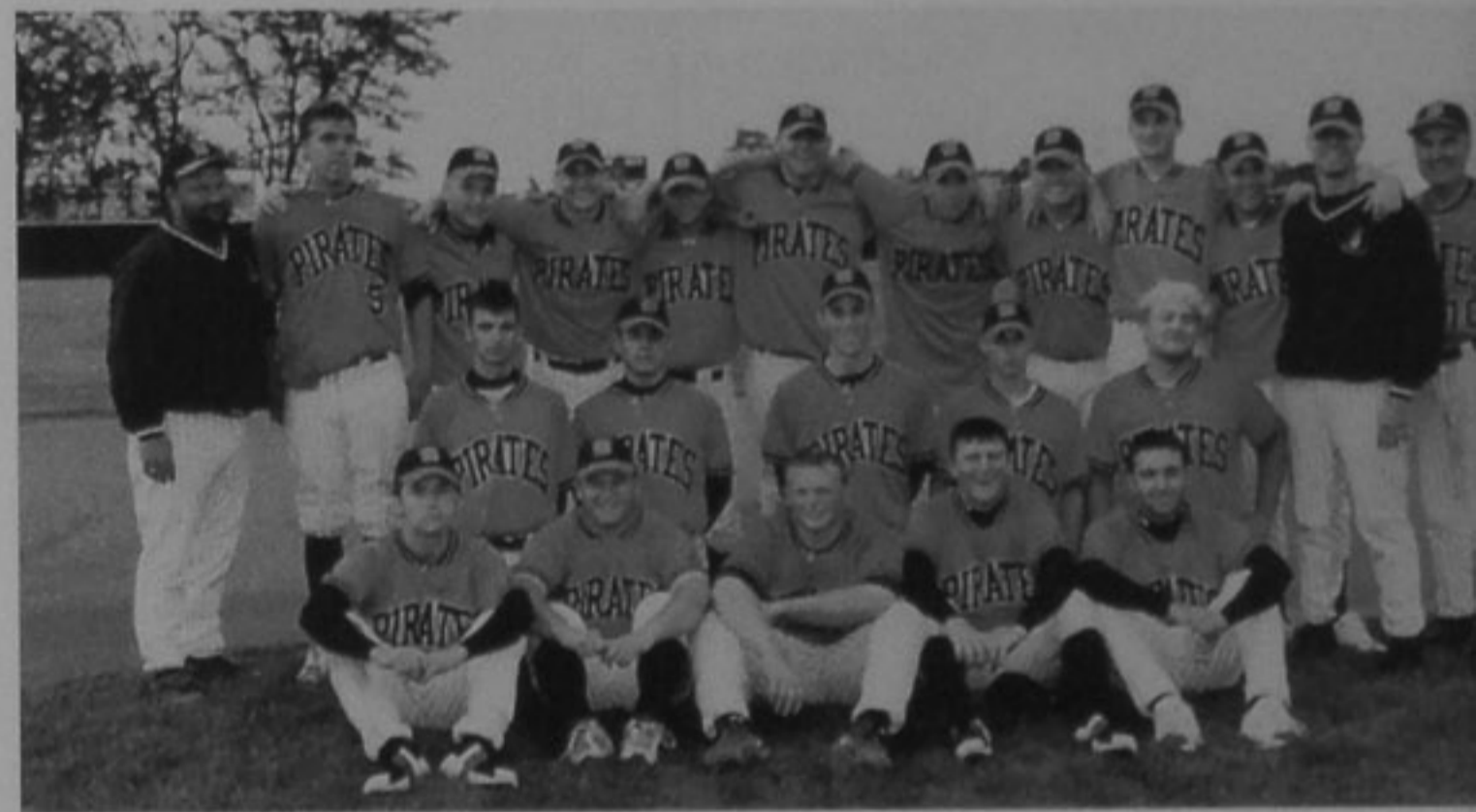

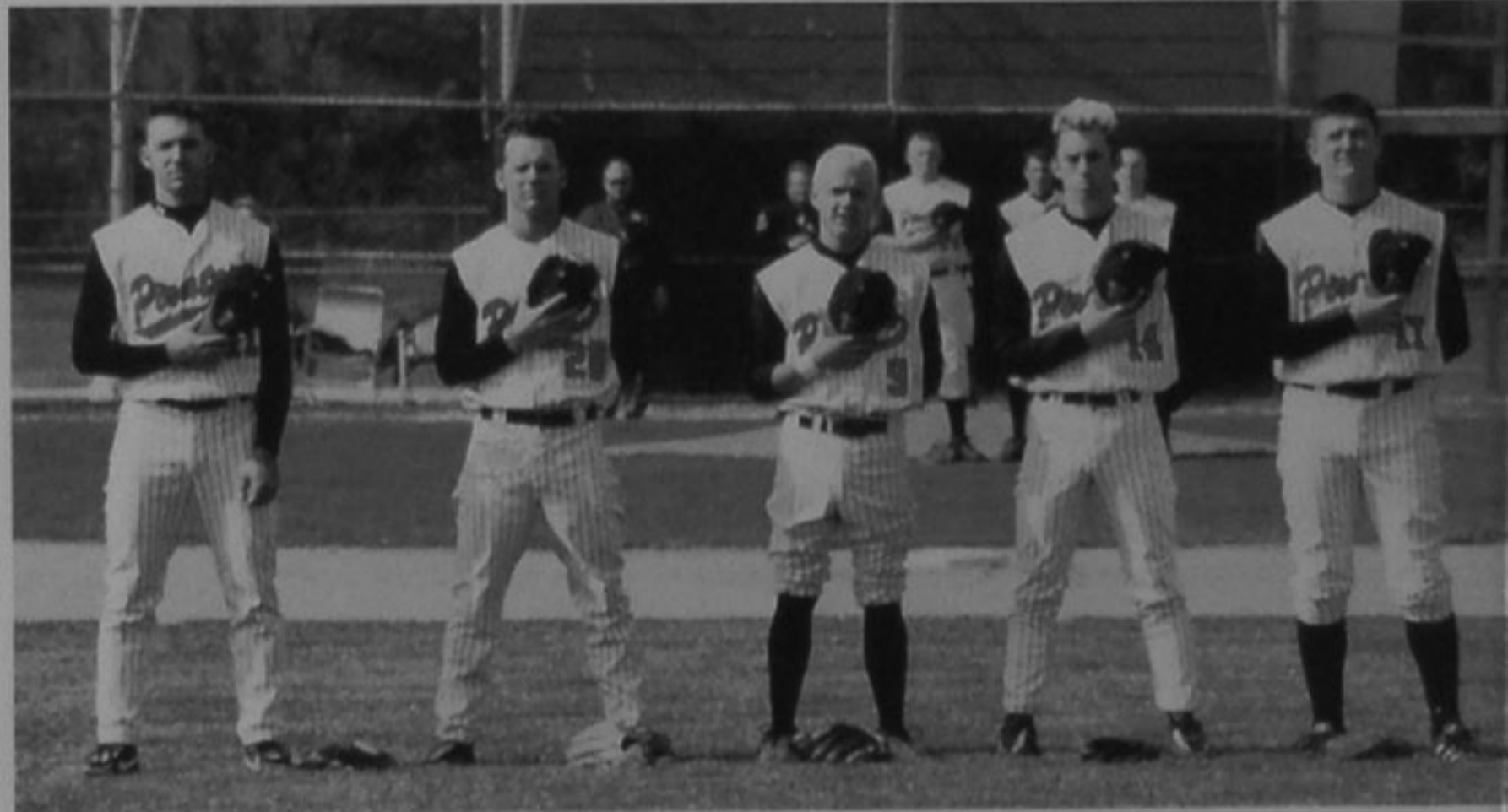

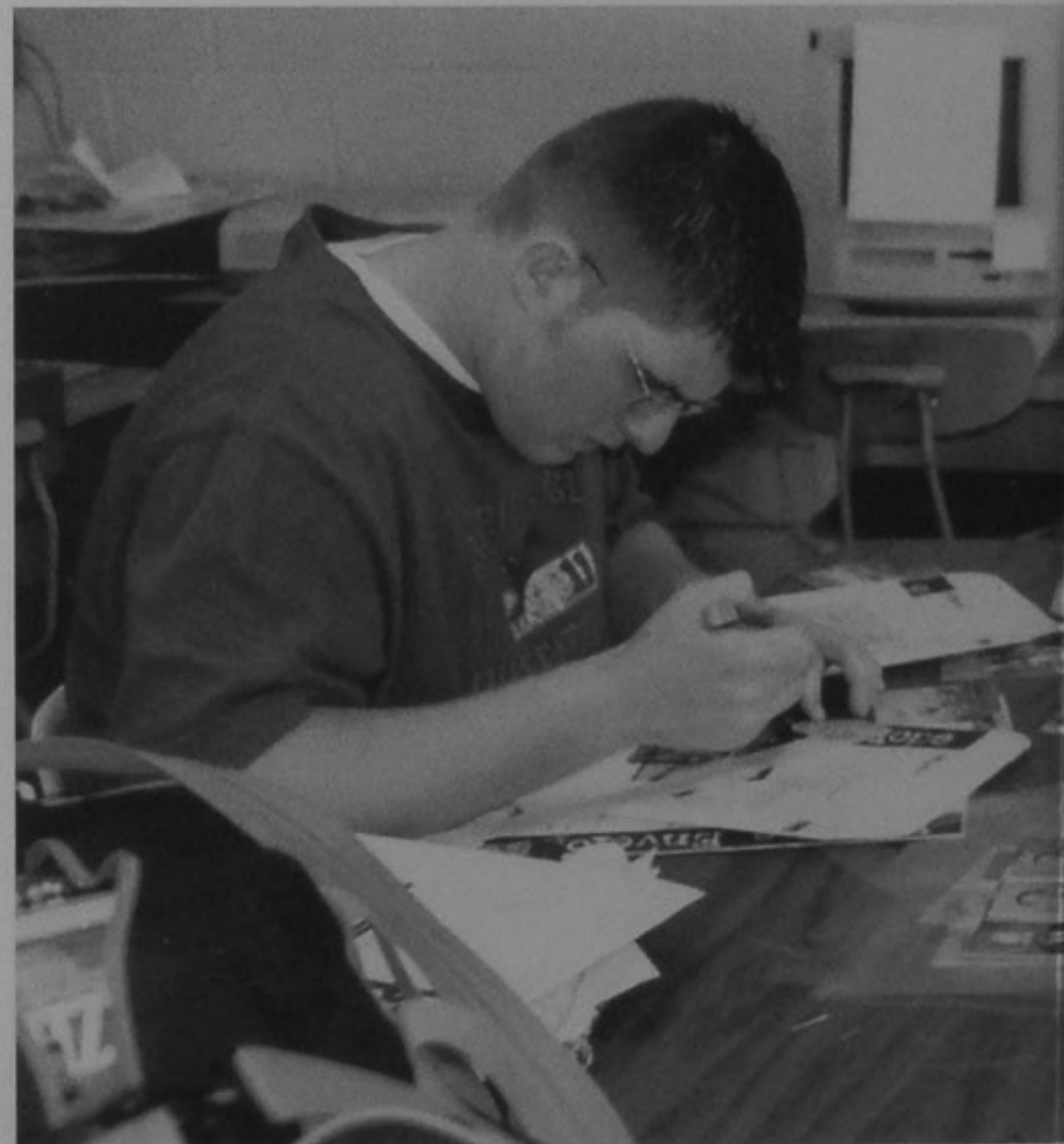

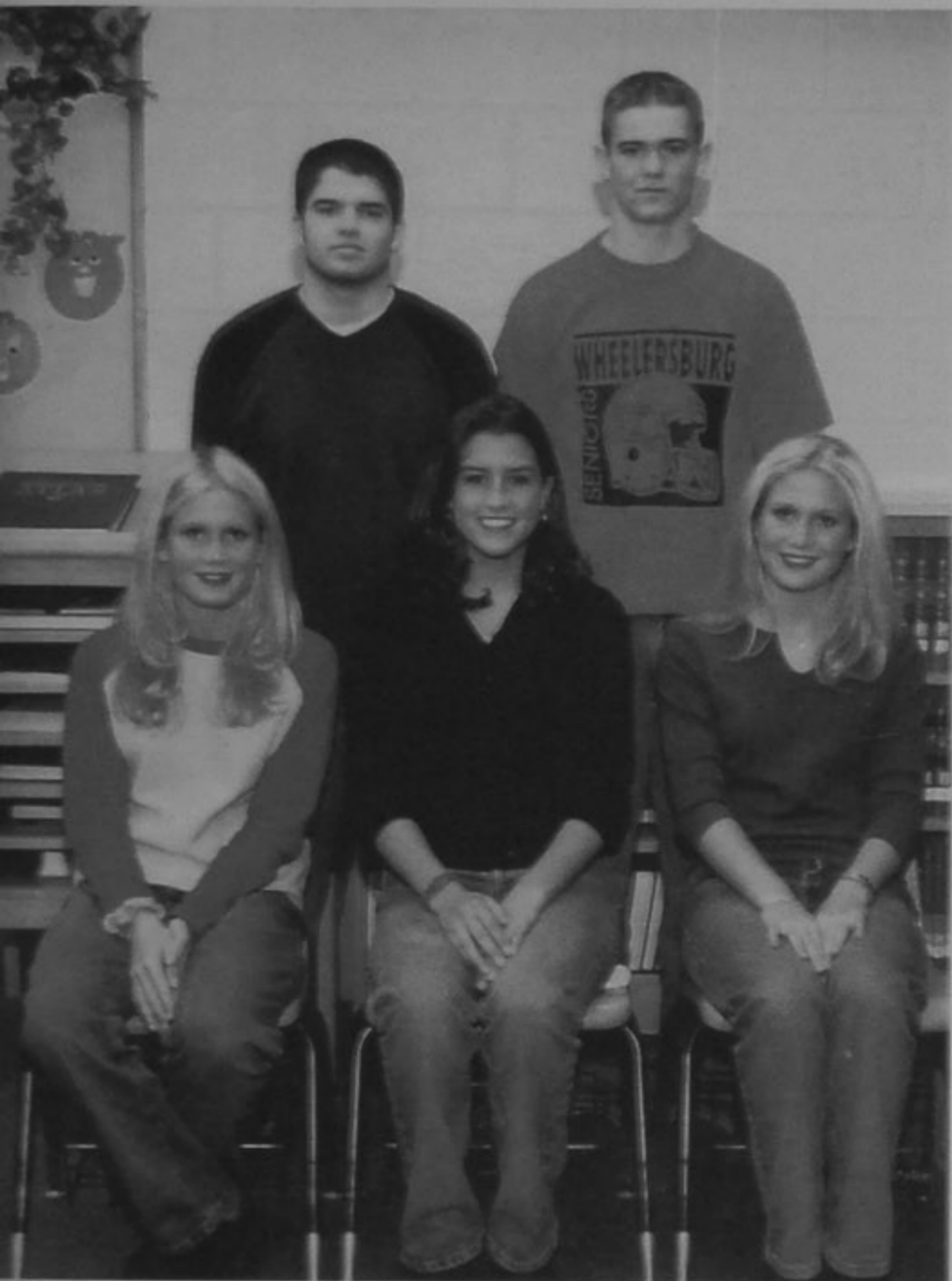

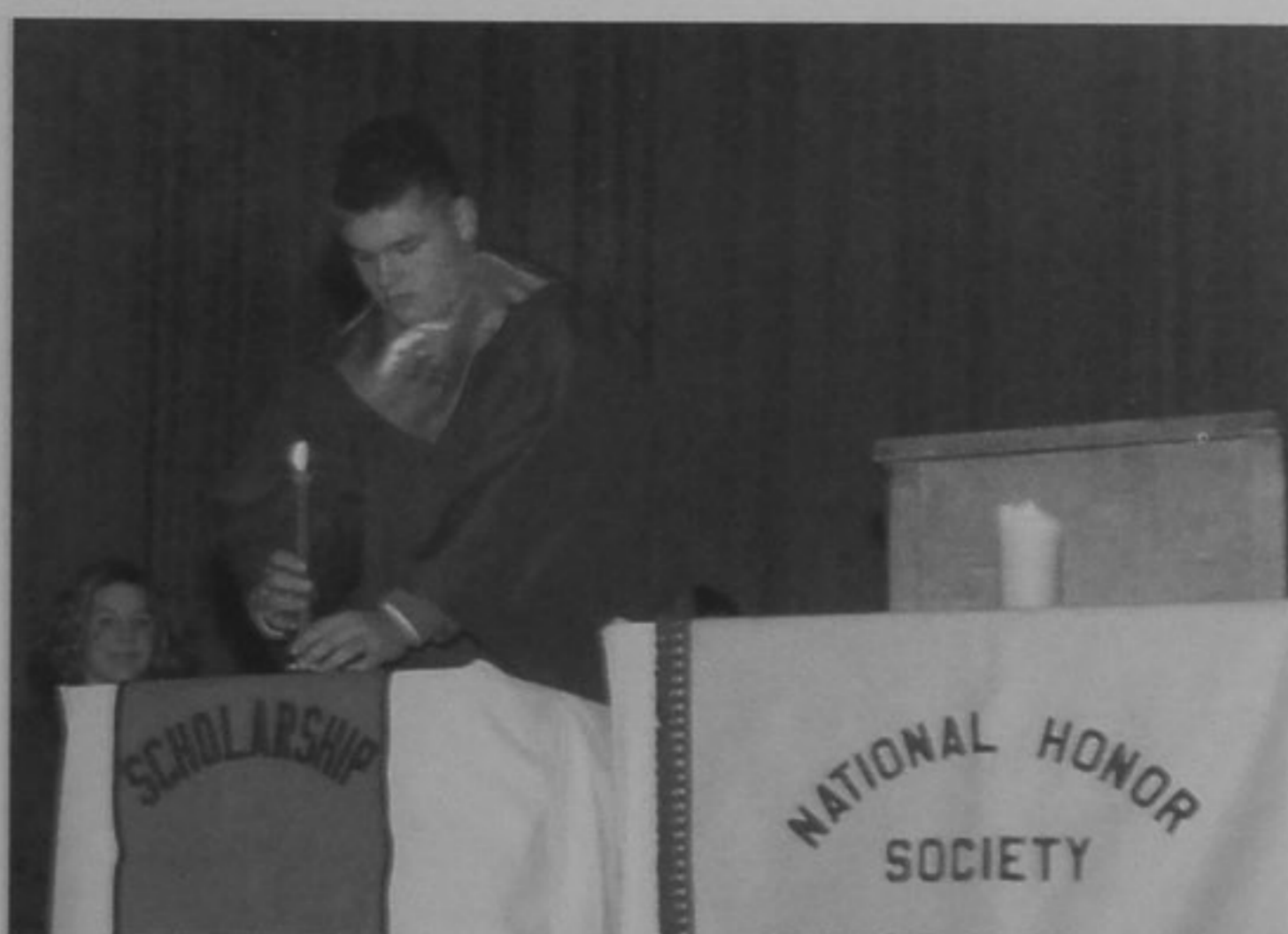
National Honor Society

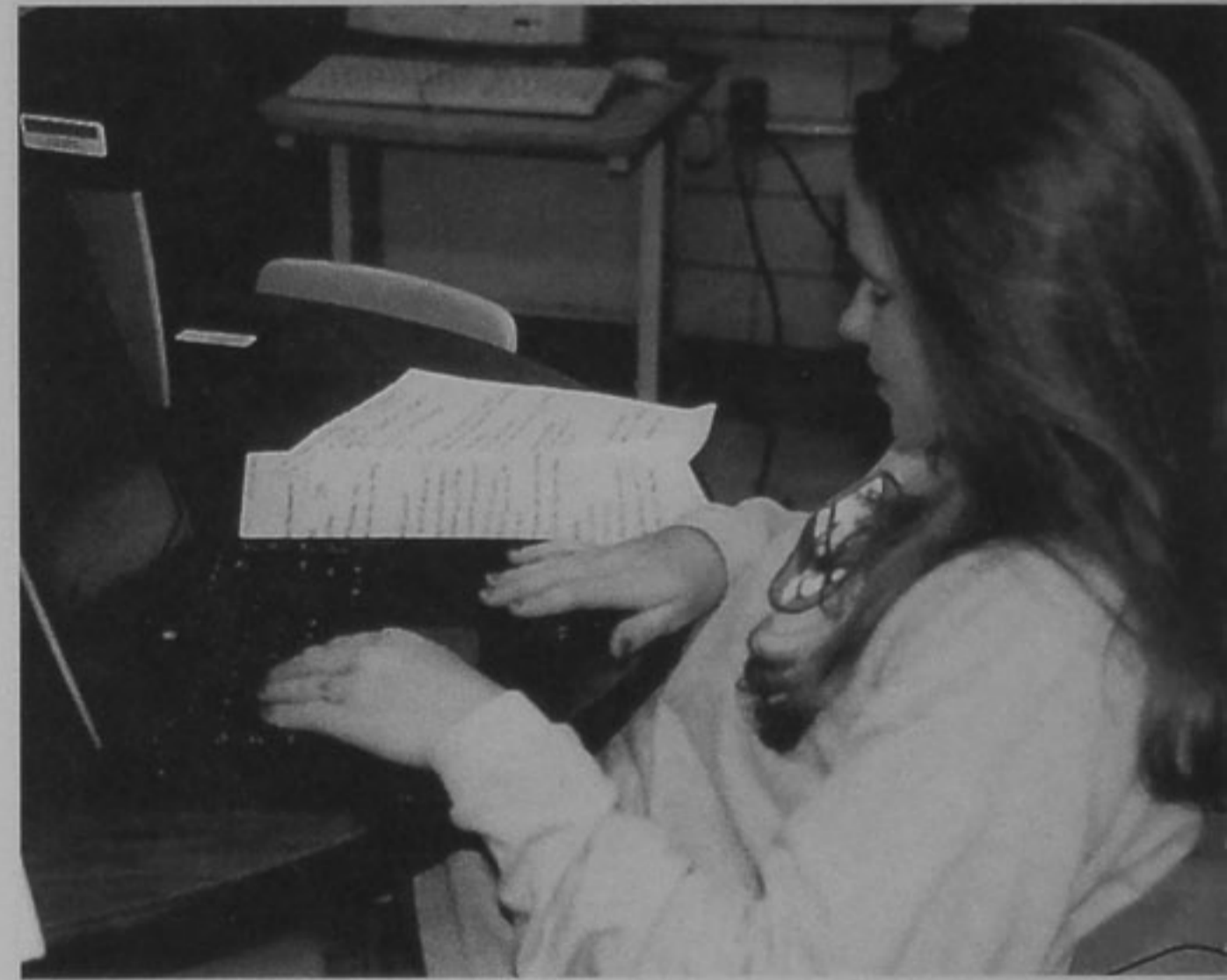

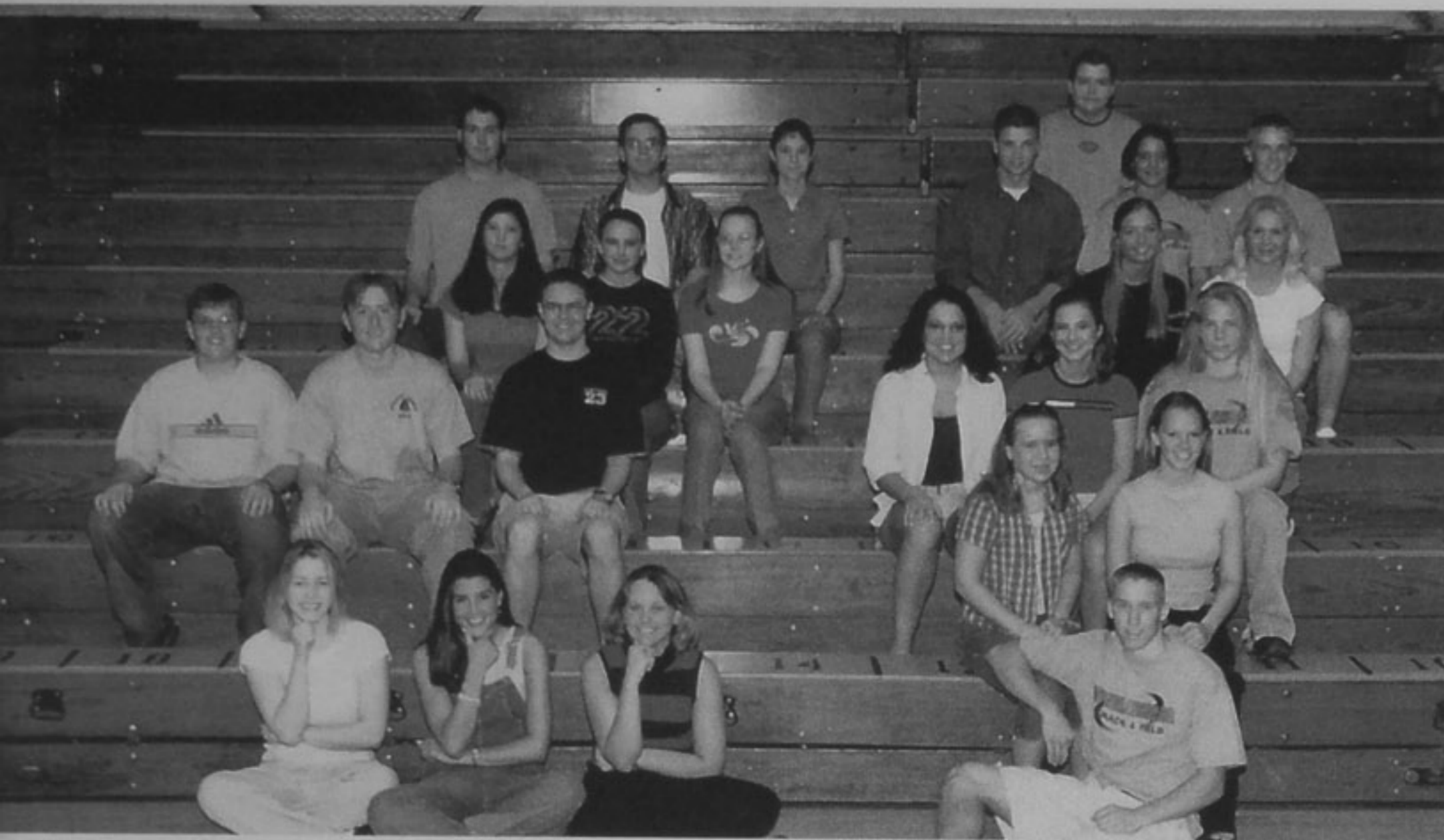

29 Students Rank in District and 6 Rank in State

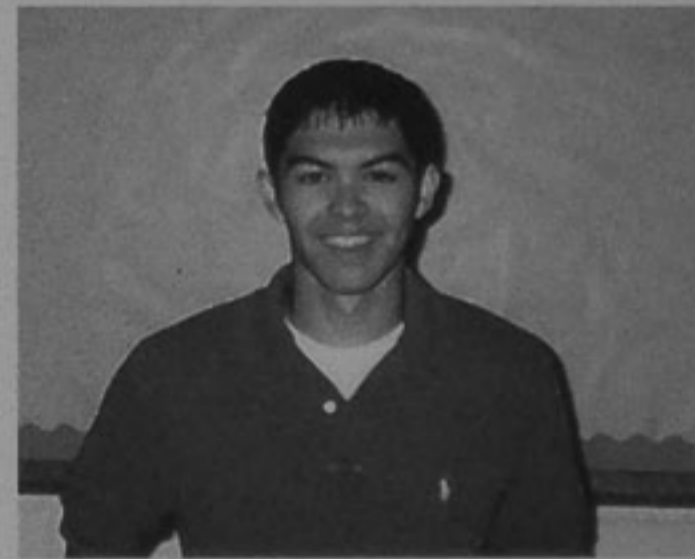

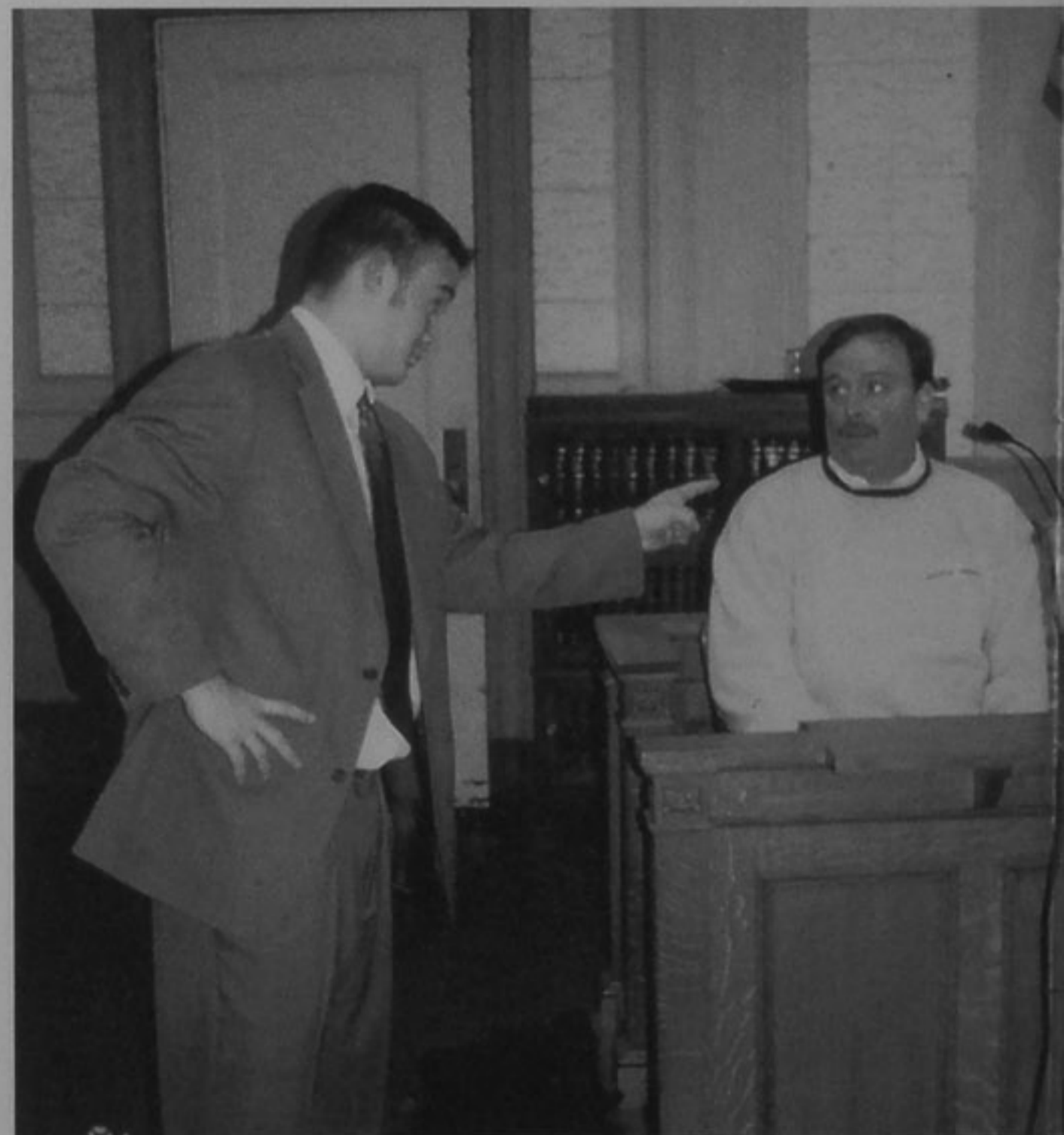

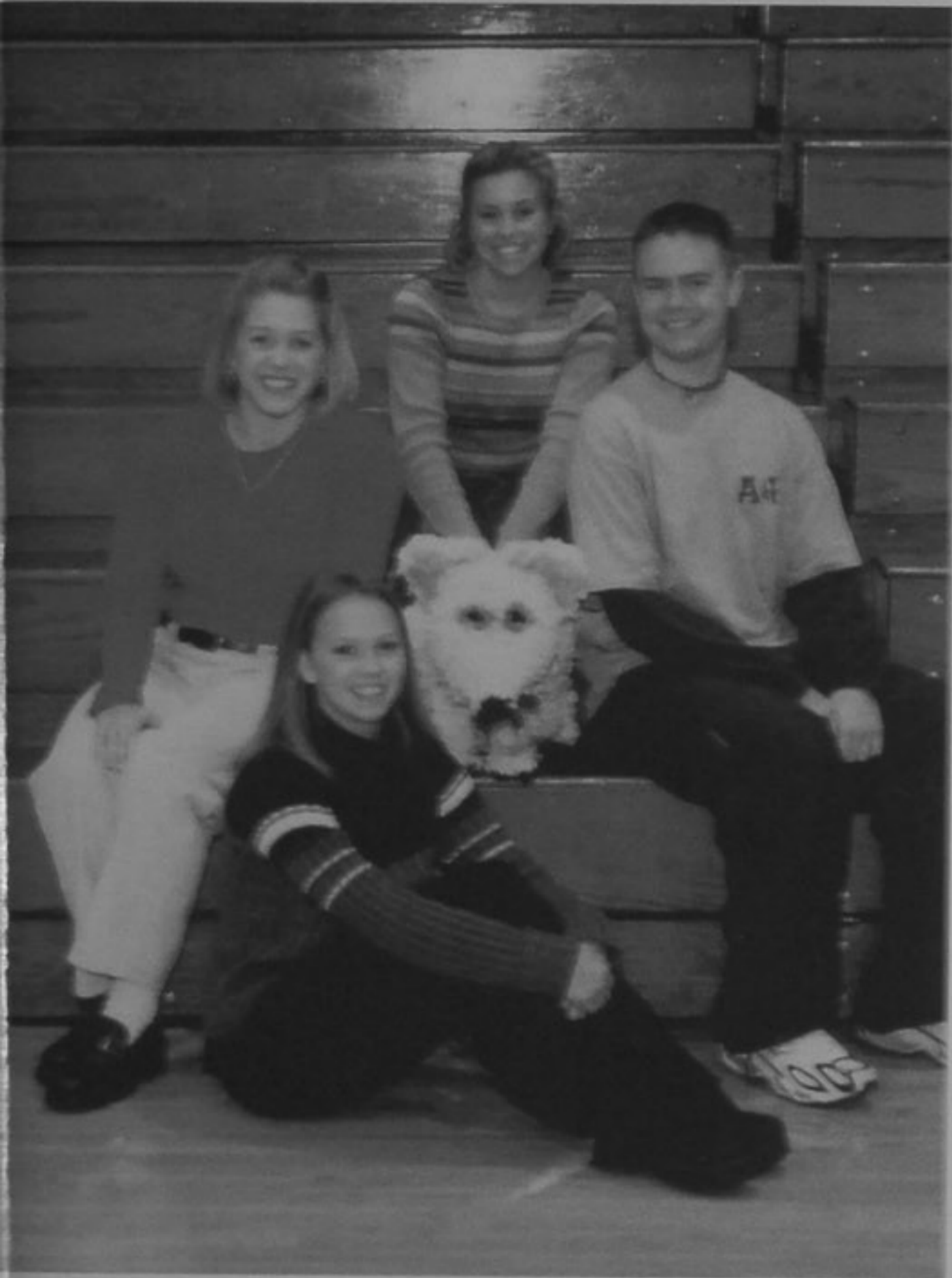
