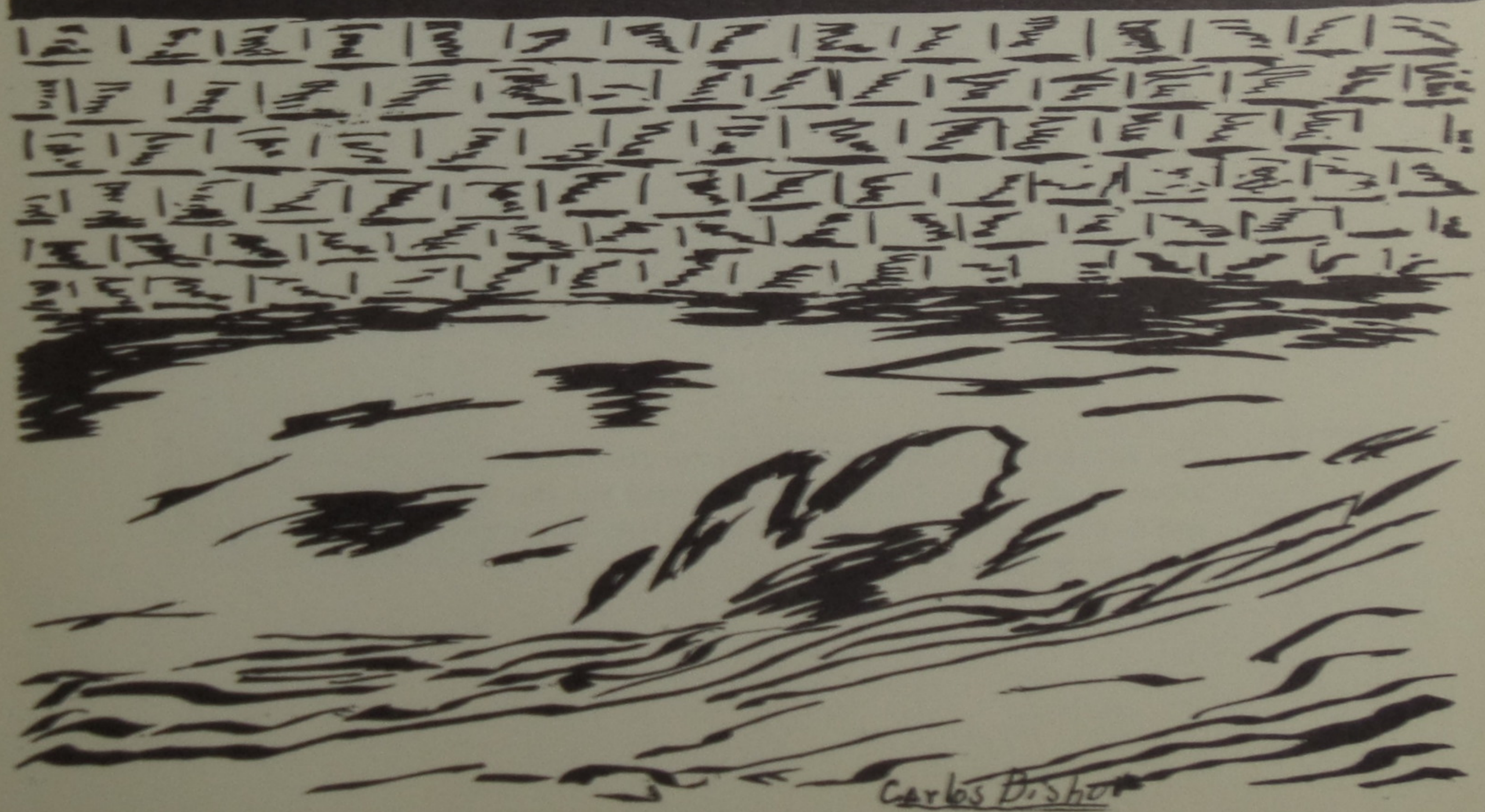

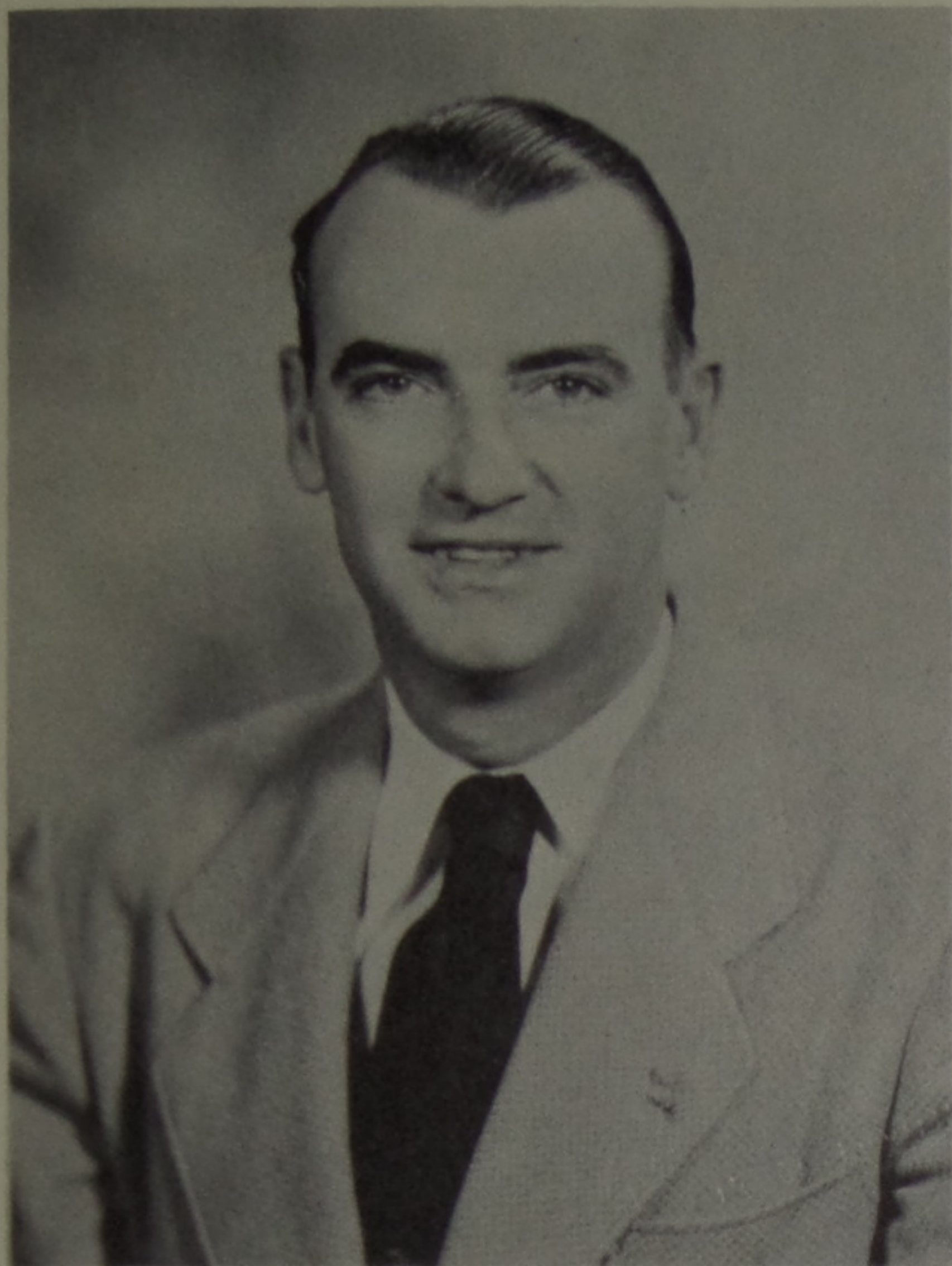

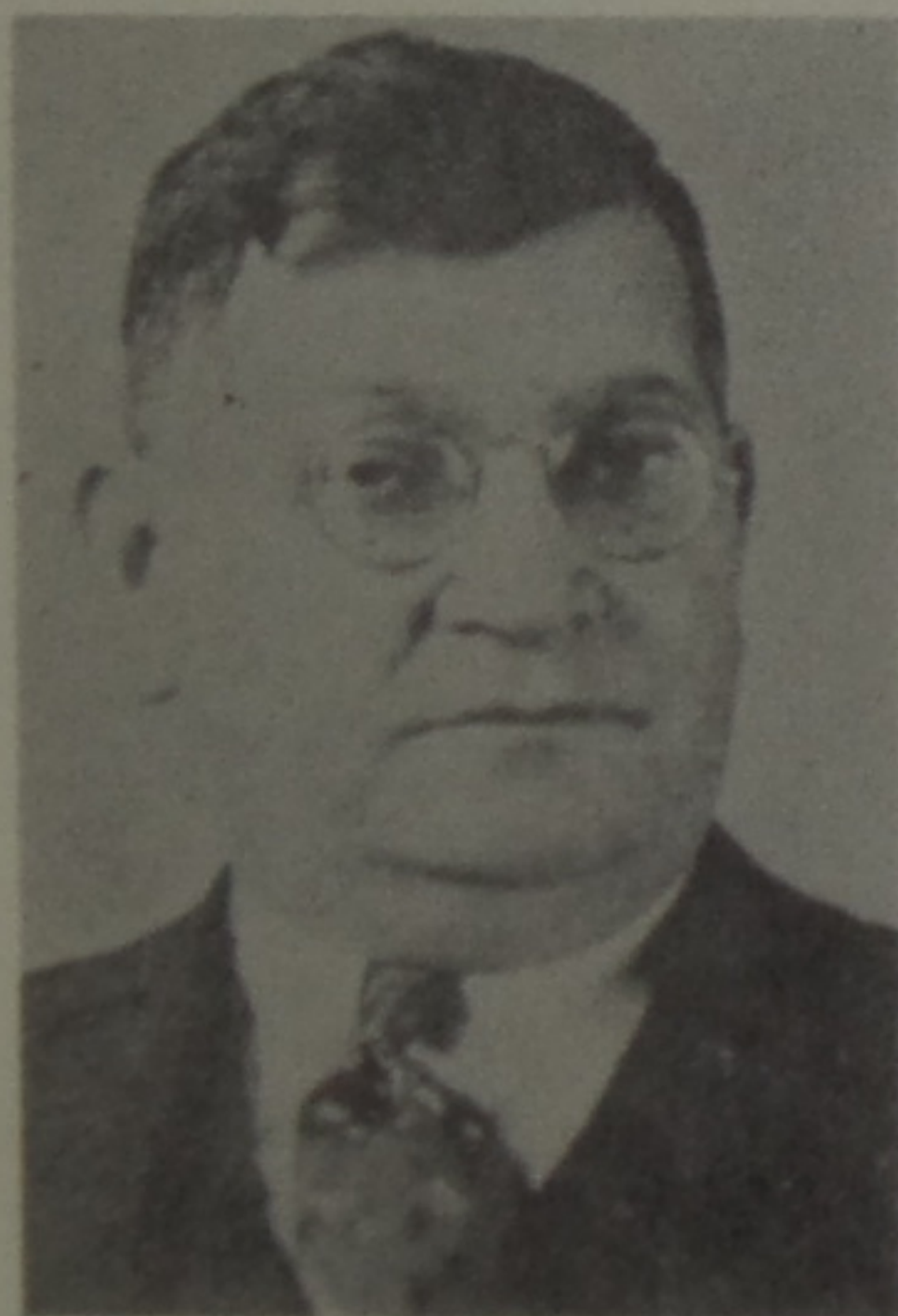


E. R. McCowen

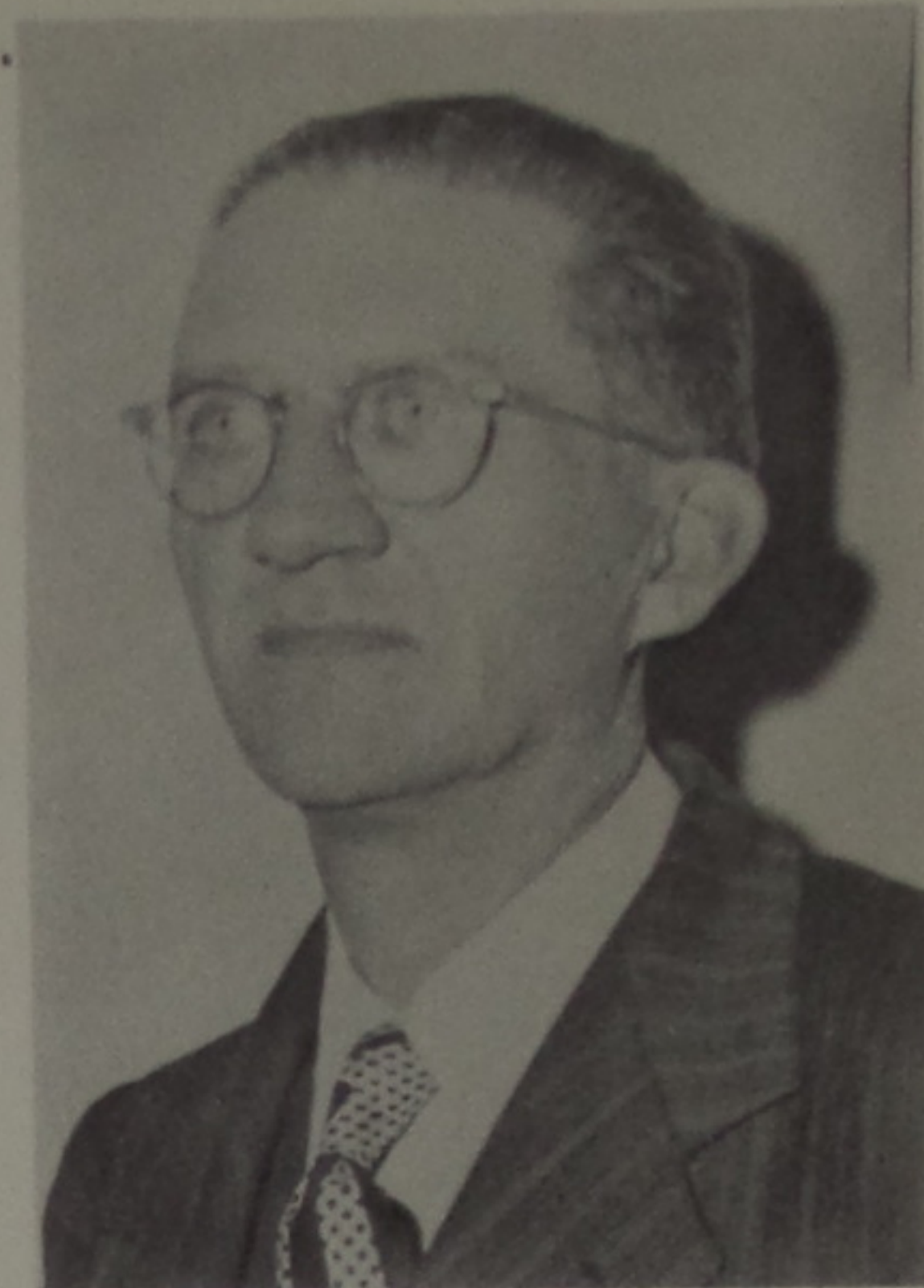
Mr. Potts is known for his interest in education. He served for several years as principal of two Scioto County High Schools, Bloom Township and Valley Township.

During World War II he served very ably as County Superintendent in the absence of Superintendent E. R. McCowen who served in the United States Navy.

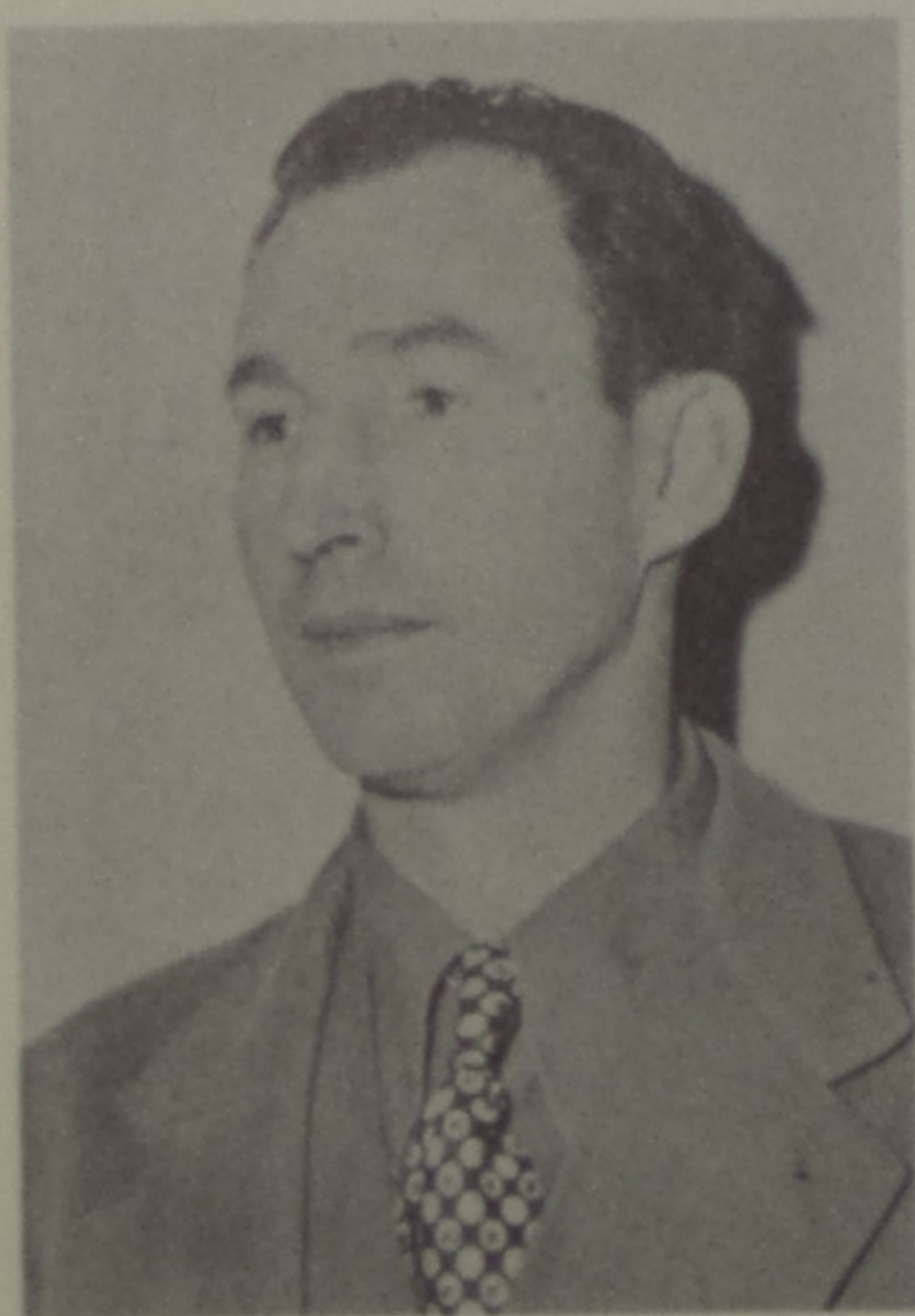
