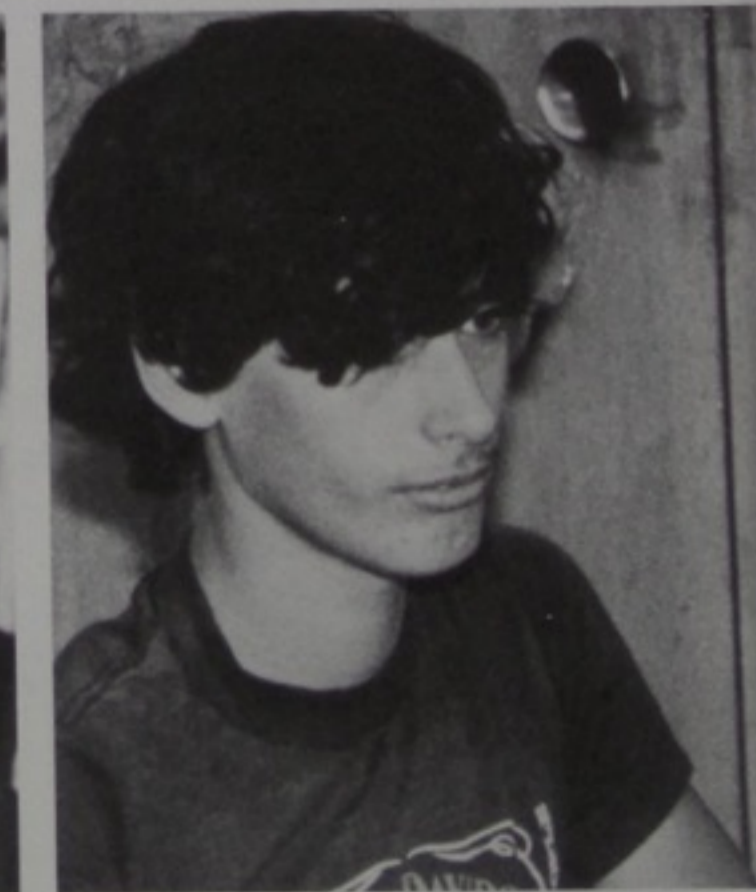
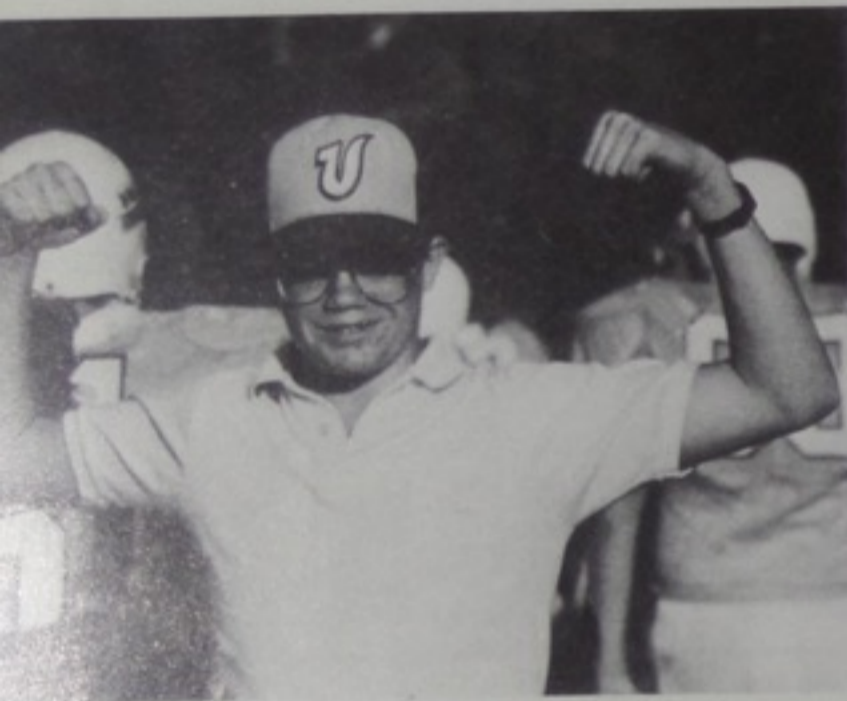

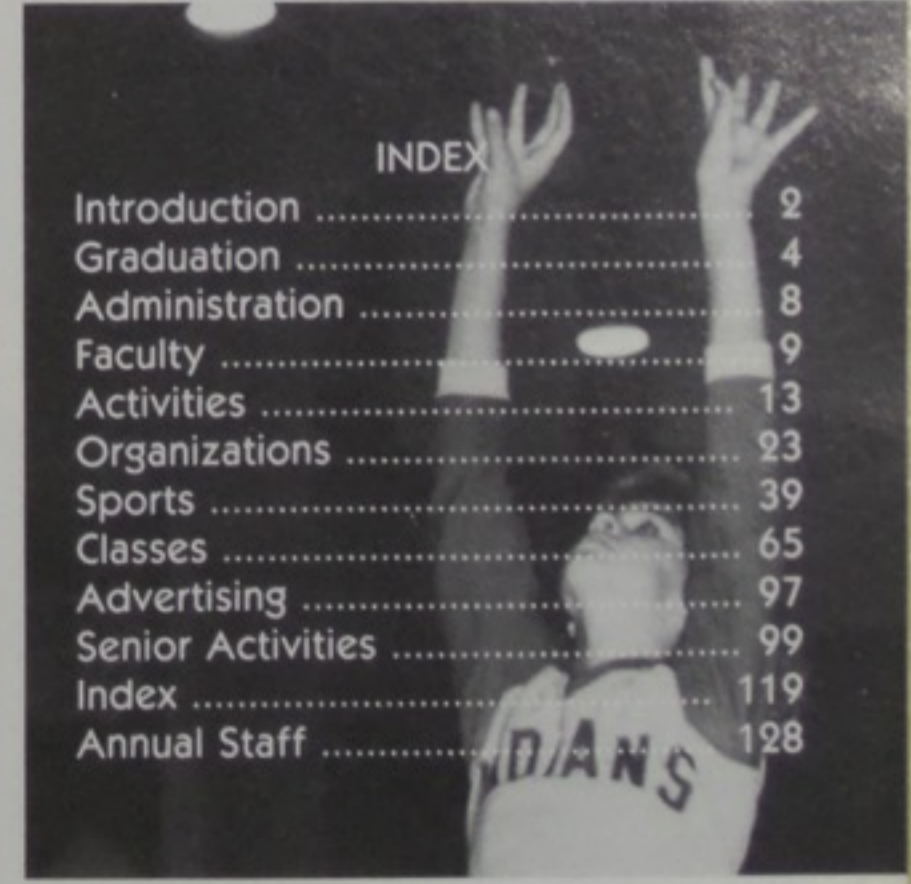

Amy Glaze presented one of the class addresses and spoke of the goals of the future.



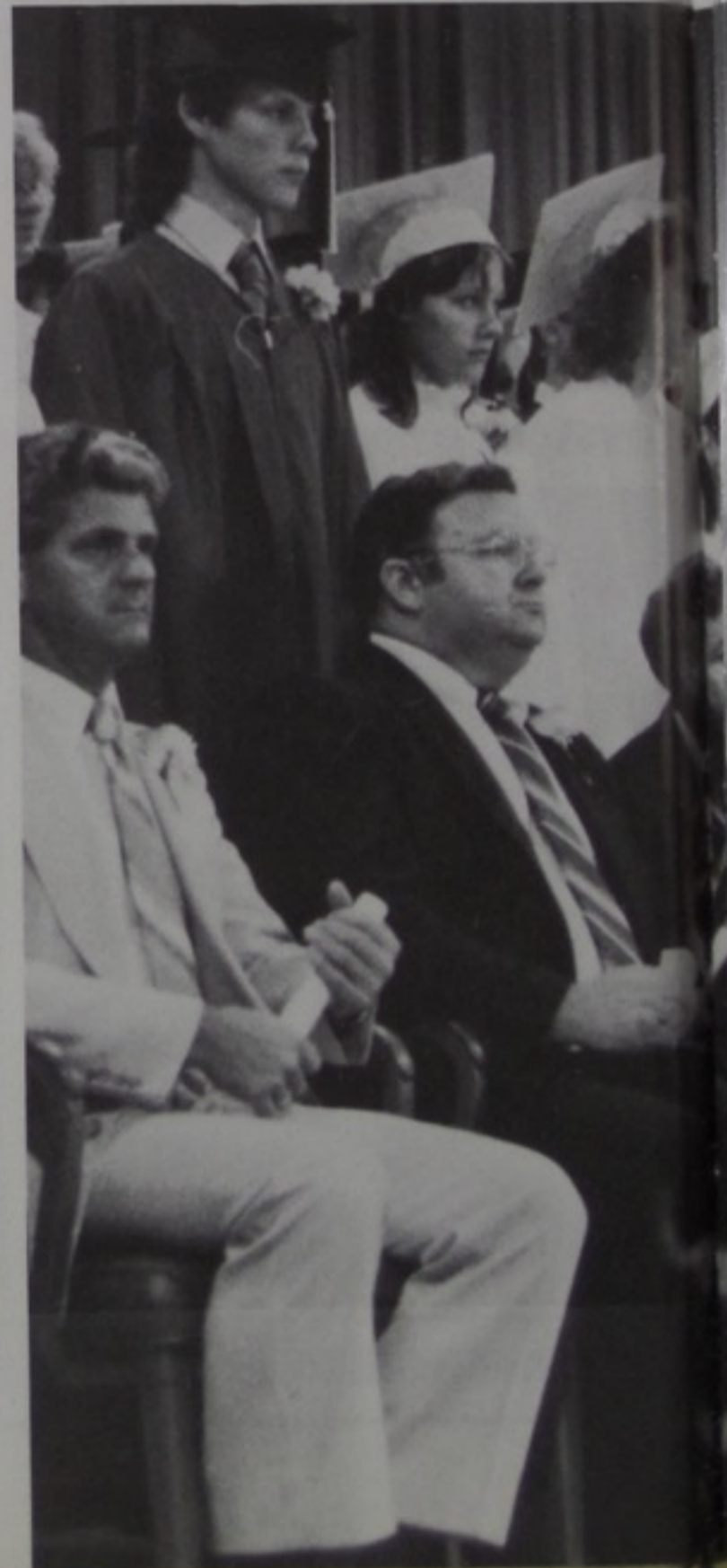

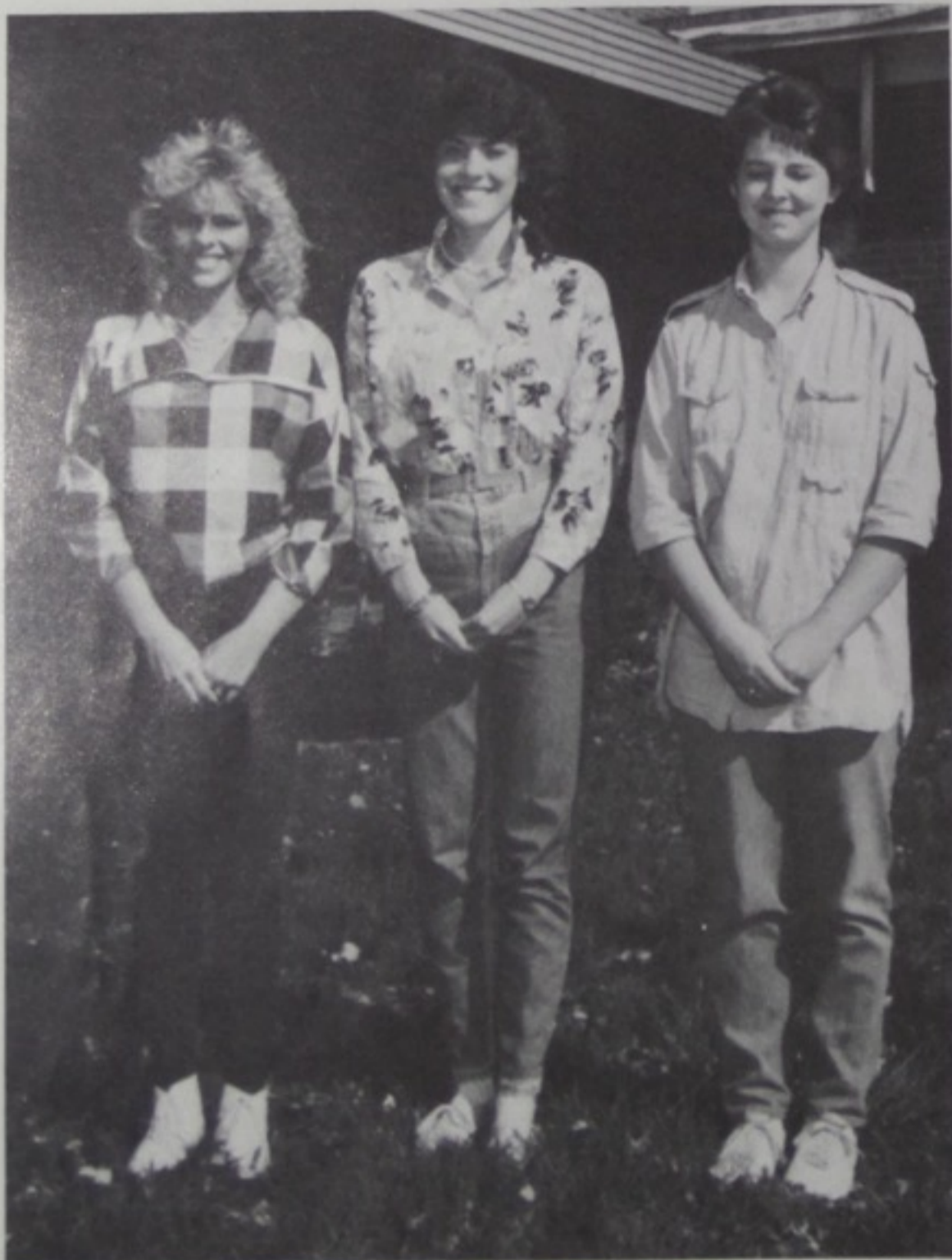

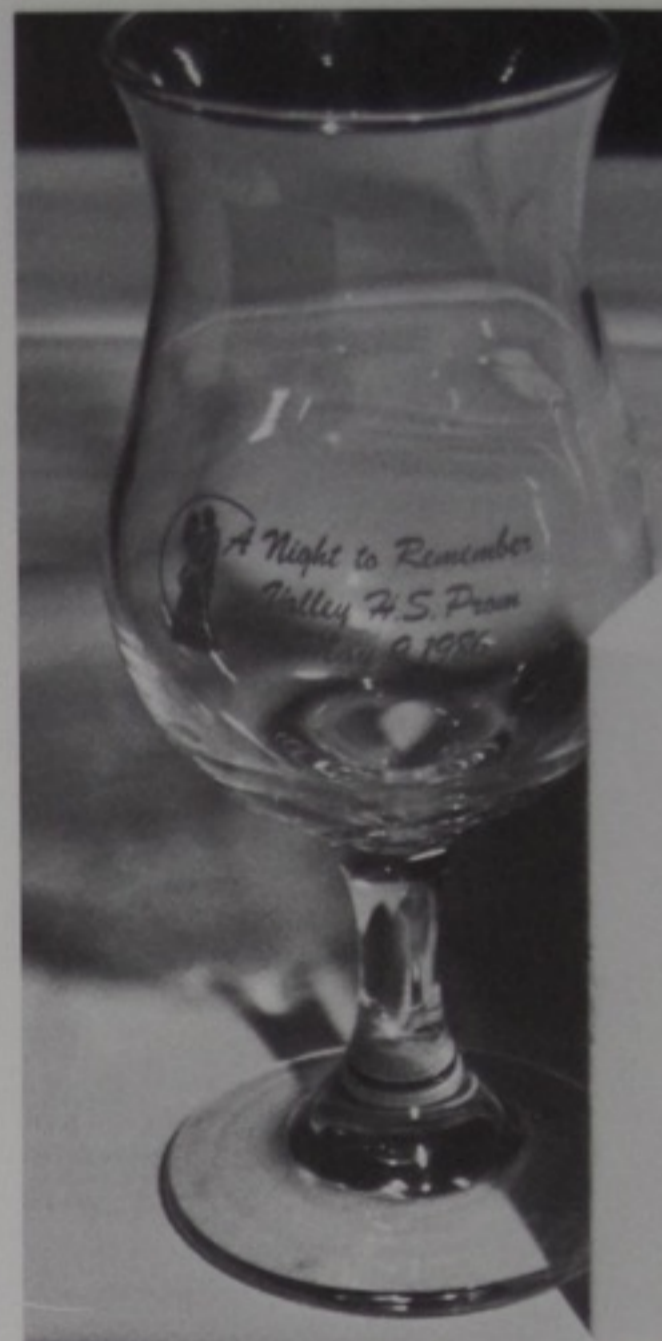

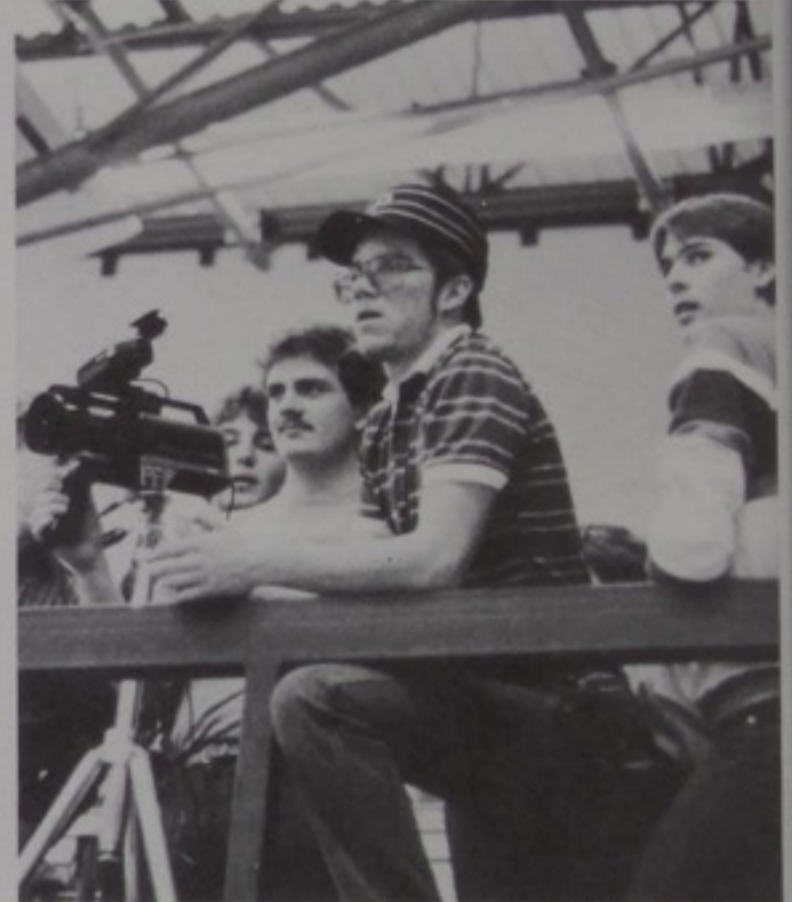

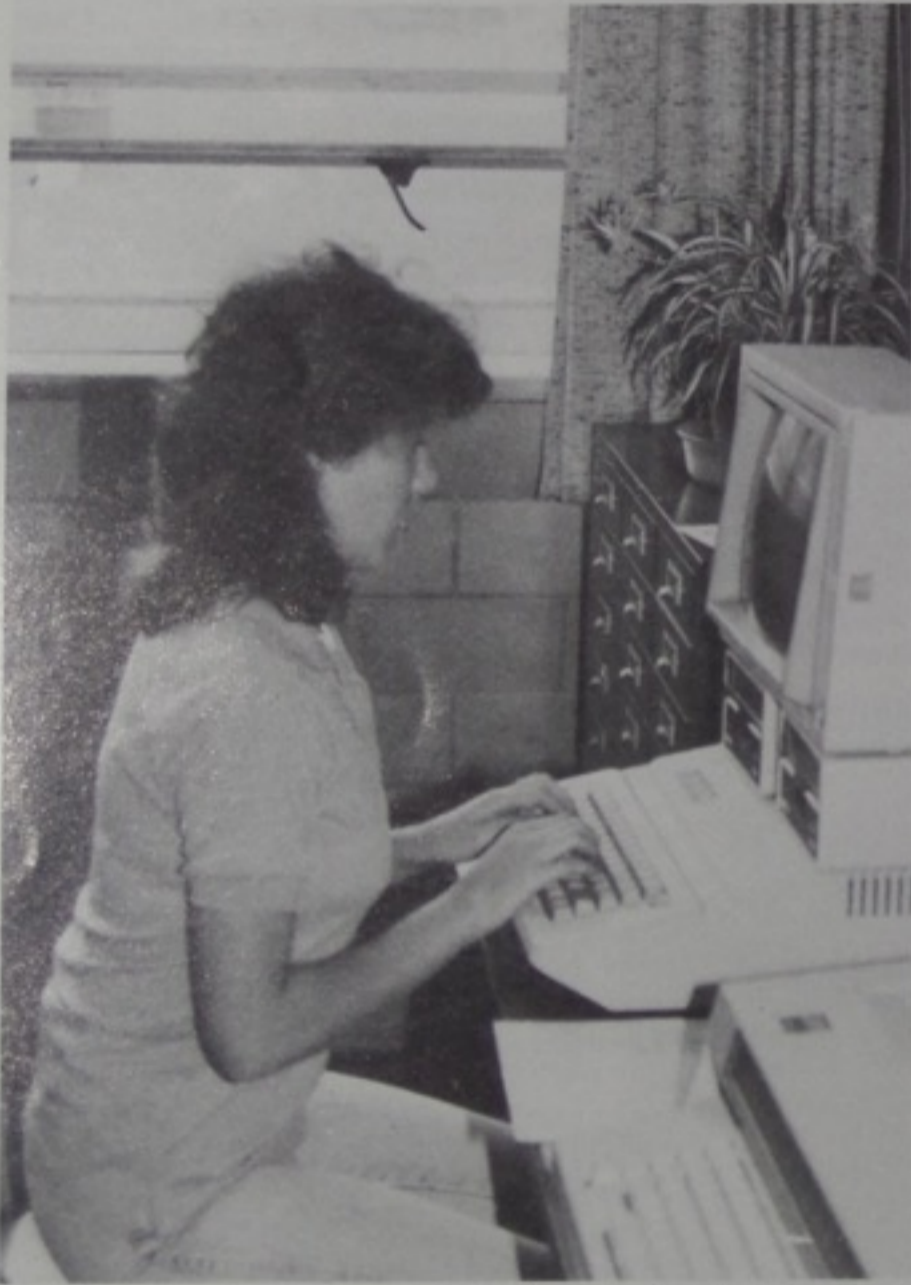

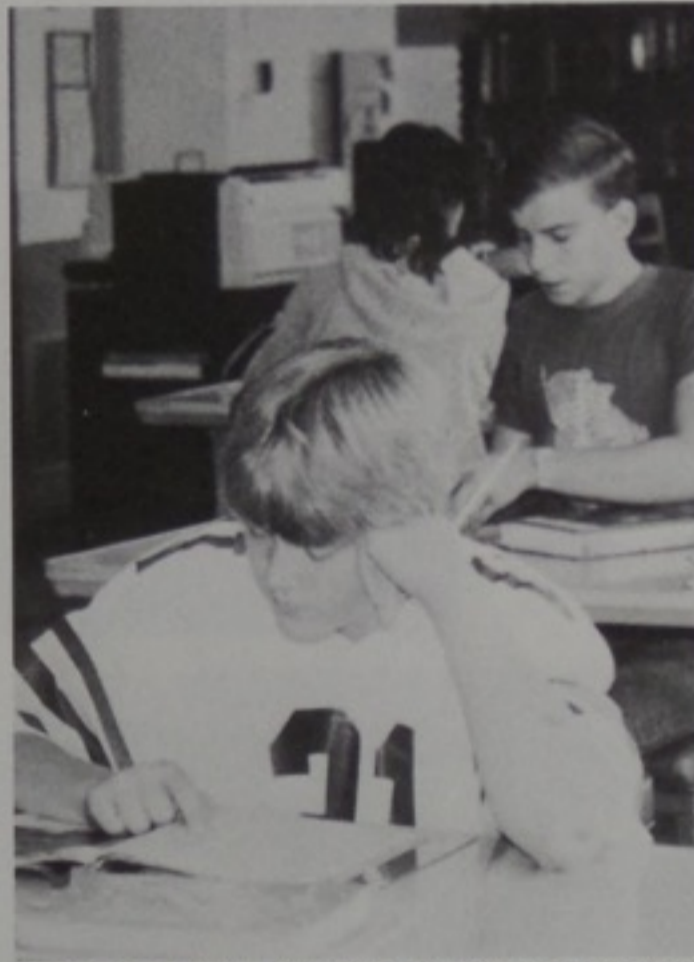

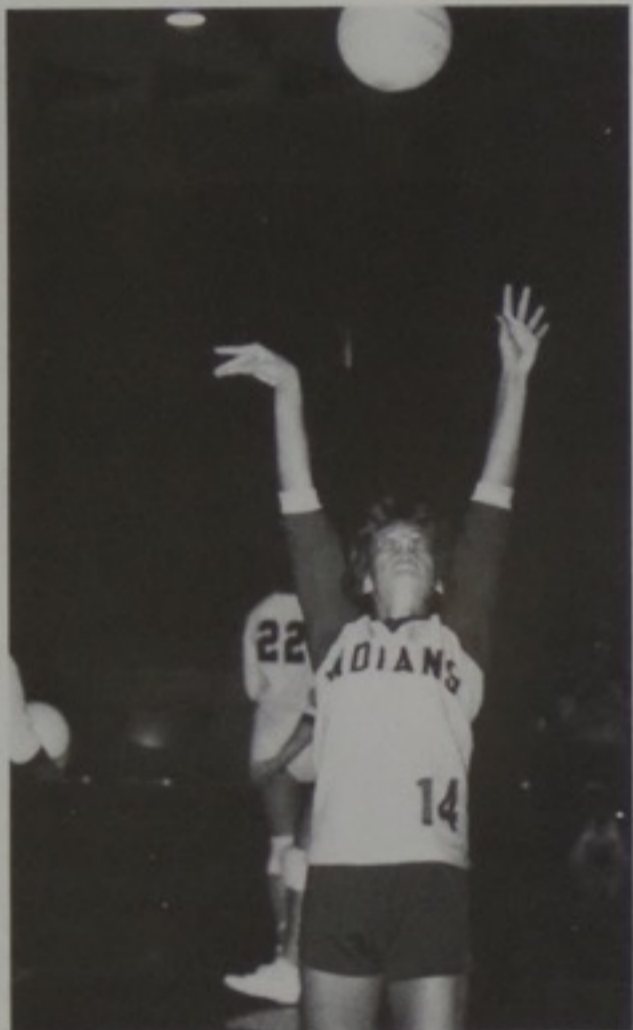

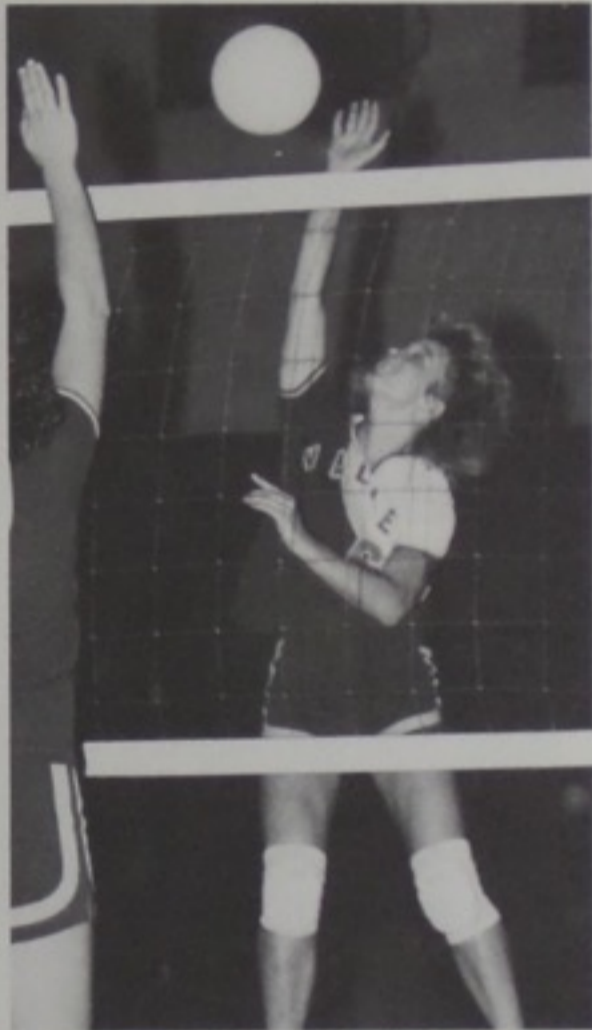

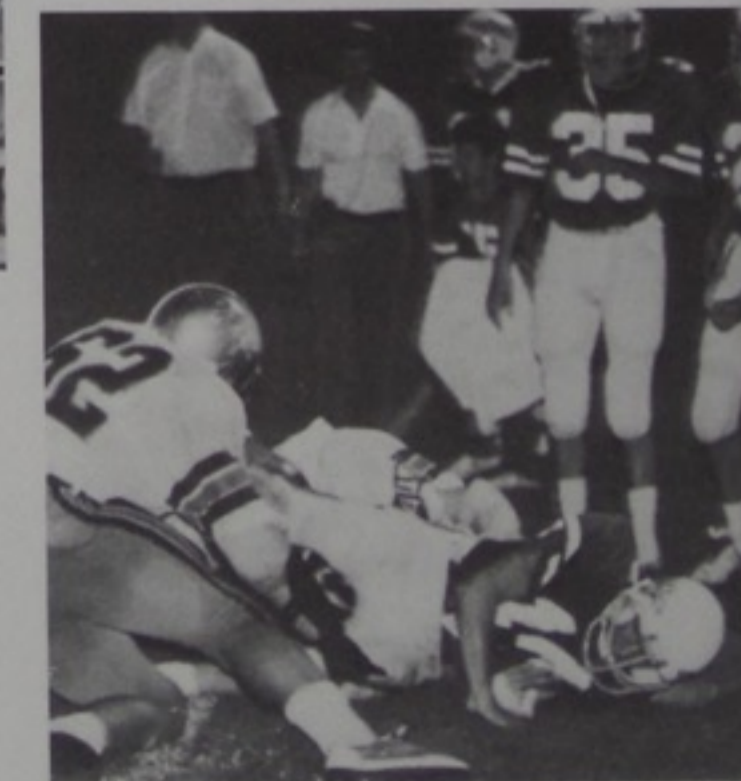

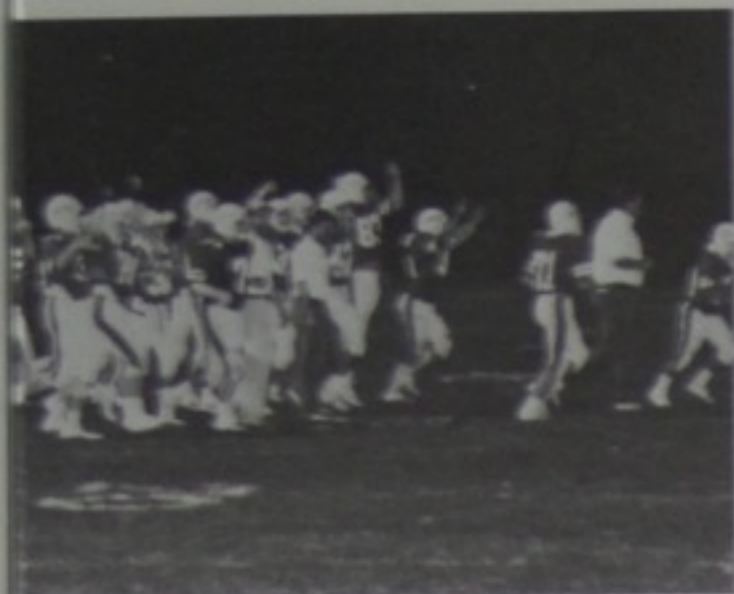

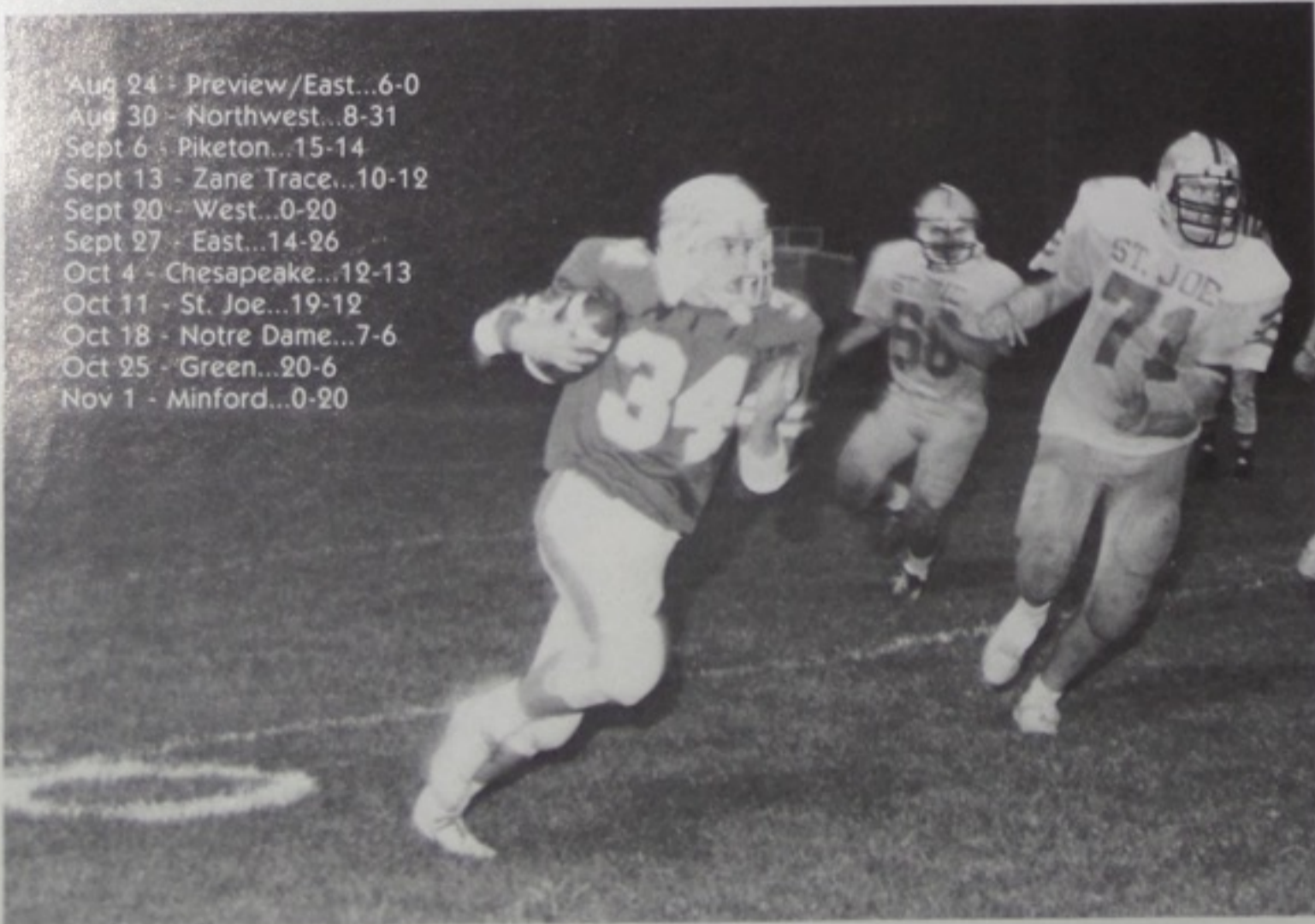

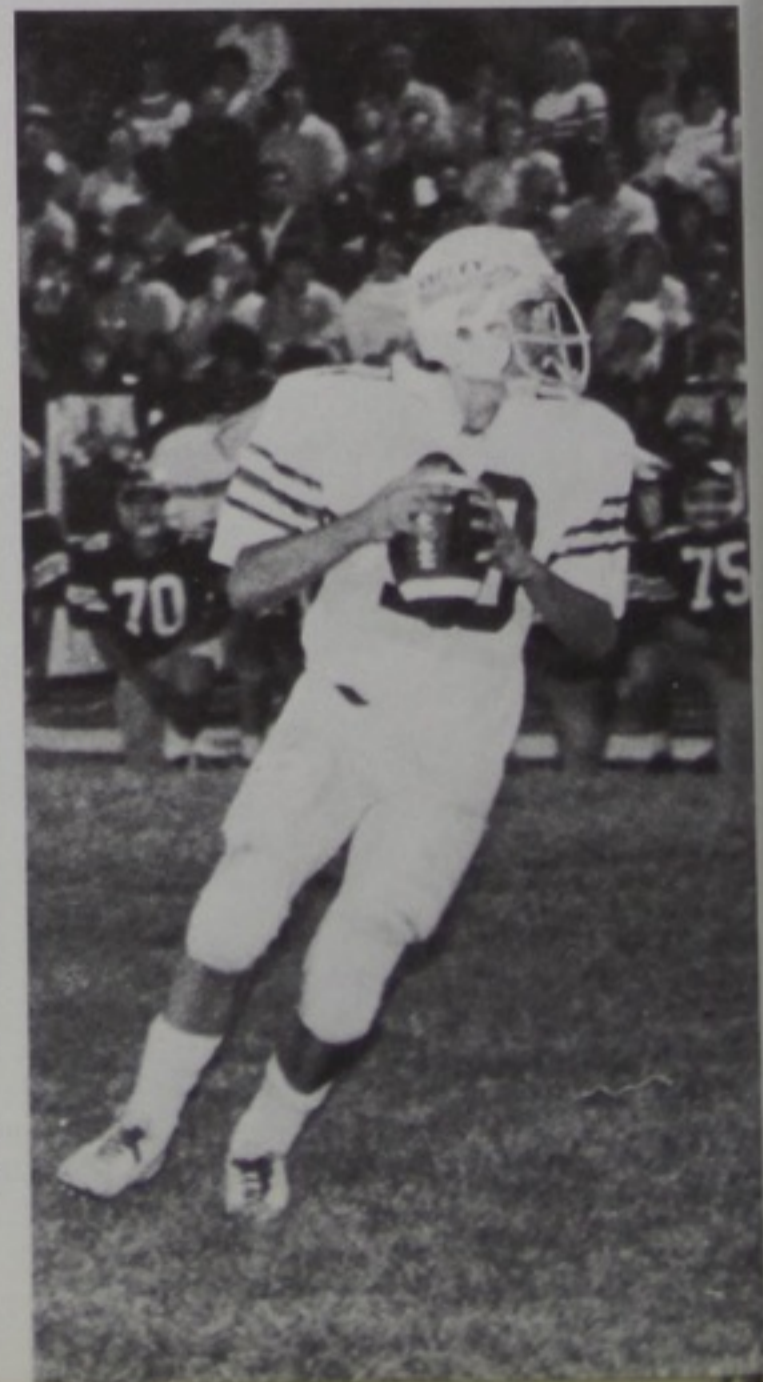

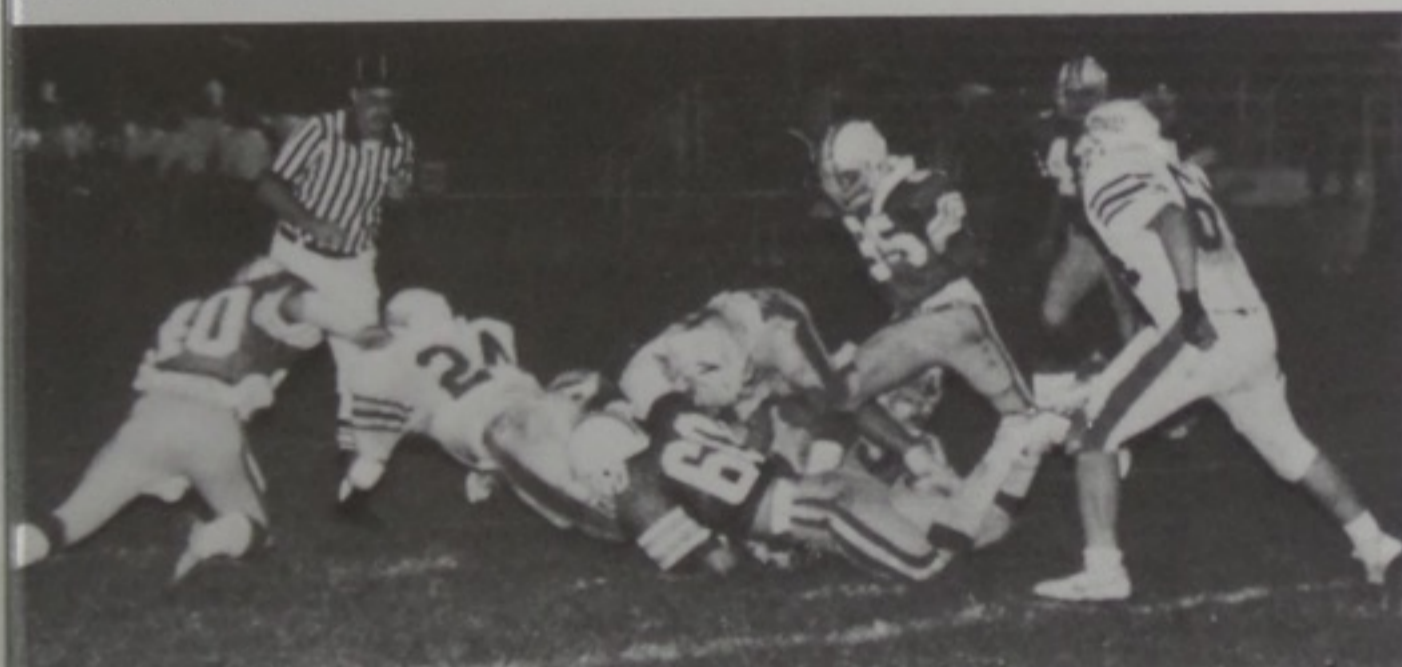

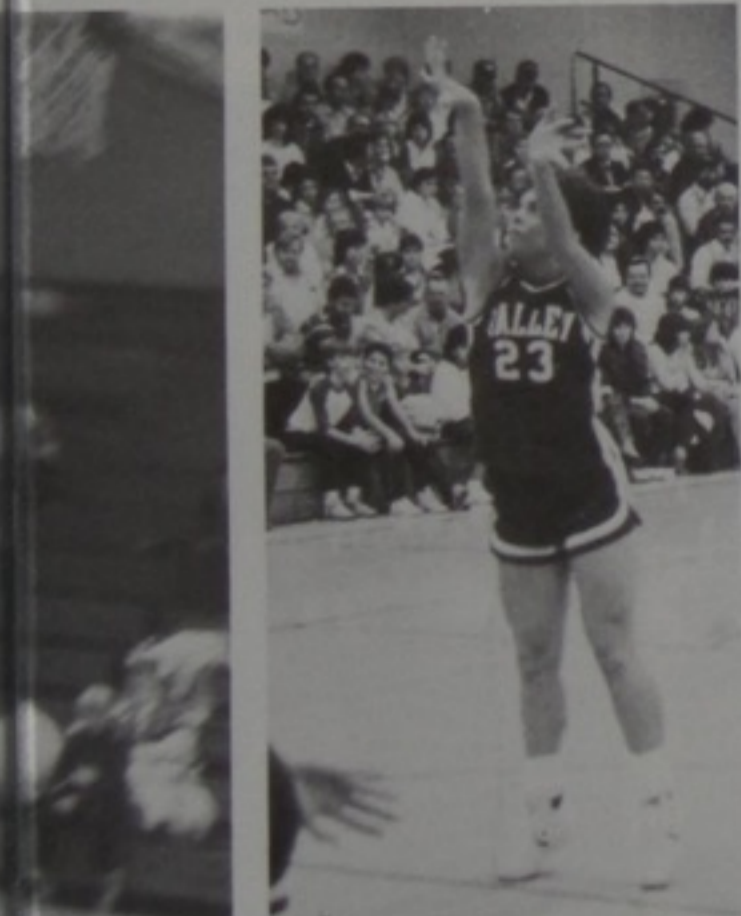

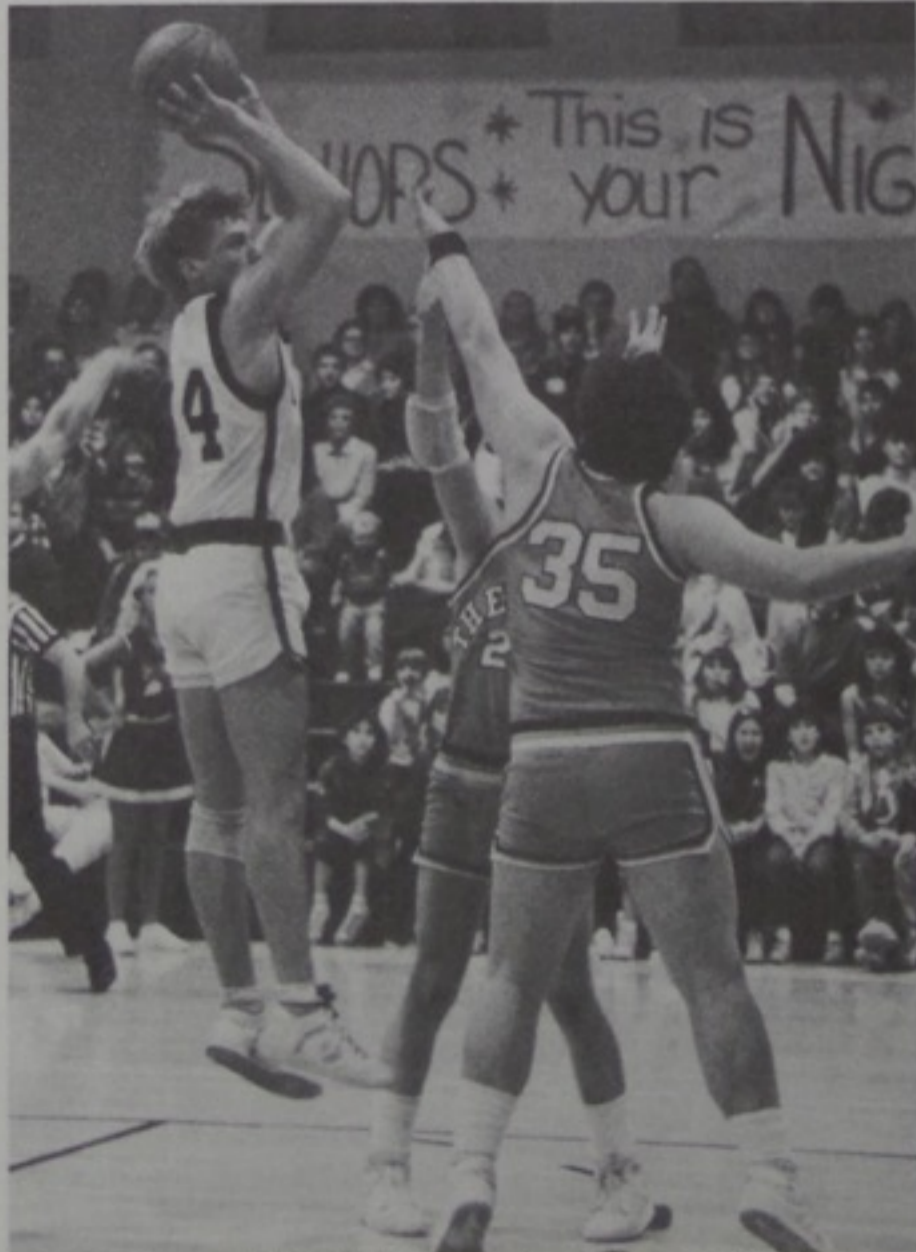

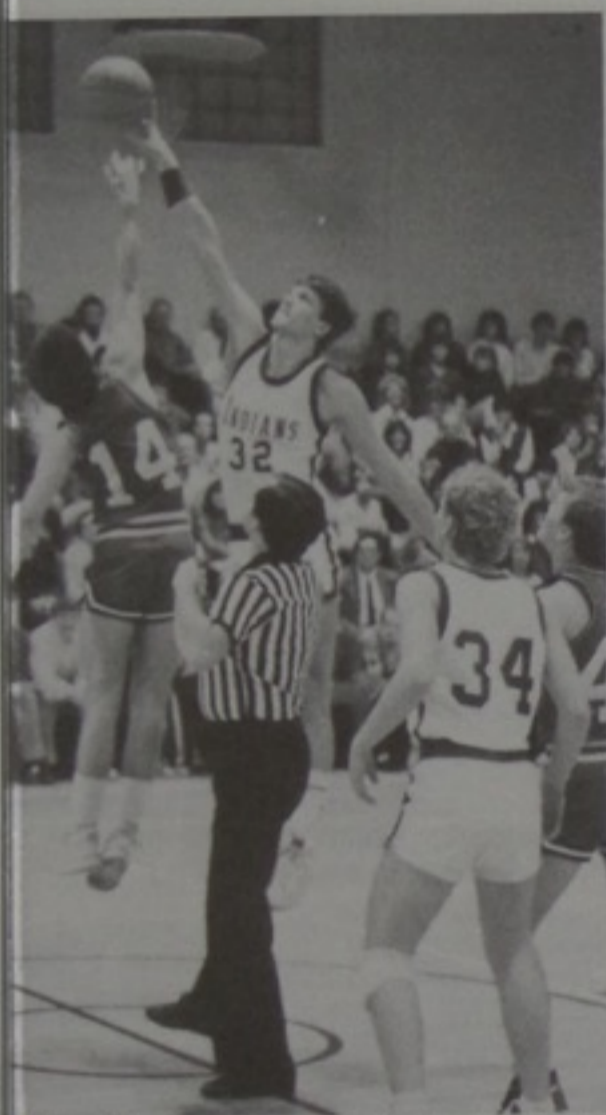

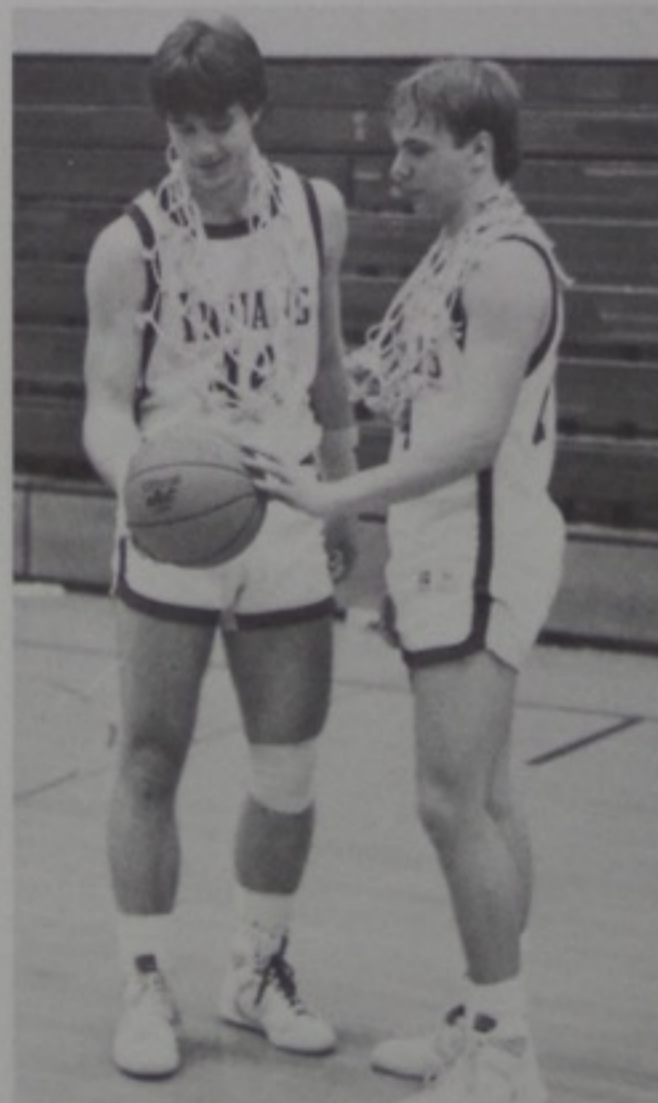

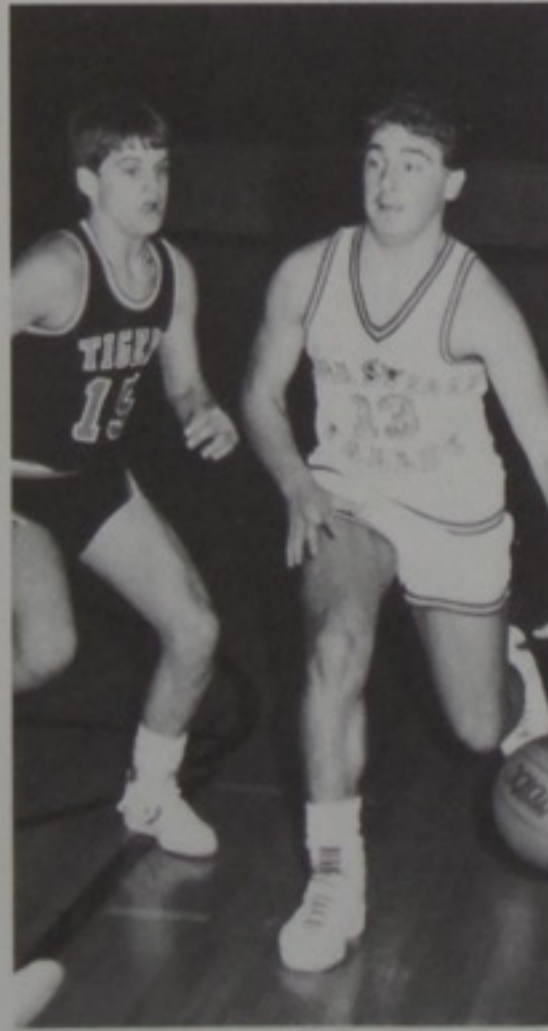

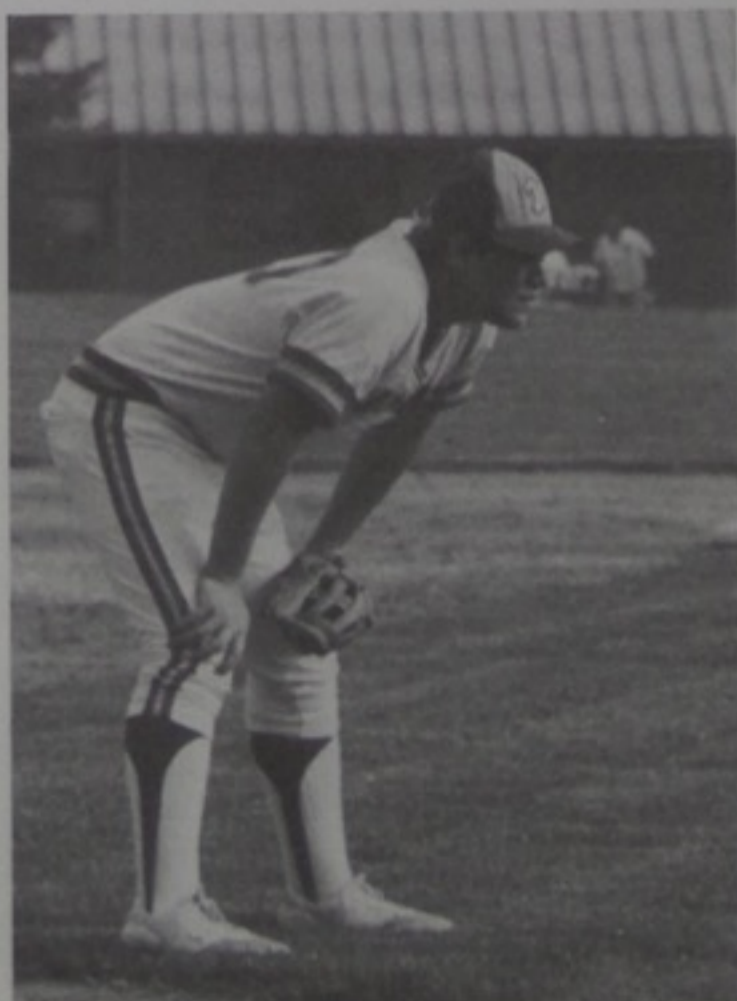

The Indians began the tournament trail with a sectional championship for the fourth consecutive year. In the first game, they blasted Oak Hill 20-0, and defeated South Webster 9-7 to win the sectional. Valley advanced to the district tourney where they defeated Southern Racine 10-7 in a dramatic come-from-behind victory. For the first time since 1979, Valley advanced to the regional. Canal Winchester stopped the Indians at Otterbein College in a spectacular no-hit win. The final score was 3-1 in favor of Canal.

The team's three senior pitchers, Rusty Shope, Mark Medlin, and Chris Bishop, combined for a 20-3 record. Jack Hoover and Chris Clark each clubbed seven homers for the season. Clark also added 45 RBI's. Rod Gregory, Rusty Shope, and Mike Alley combined for 103 stolen bases. Rod and Rusty were selected for the all-district team.

At the spring sports banquet, Mark Medlin received the Most Improved Award, Rod received the Hustle award, and Rusty Shope received the Best Pitcher Award. Mike Alley was given a standing ovation after it was announced that he received the Best Defensive Player for "his great range and his shotgun arm." He also received the award for Best Average after compiling a .511 batting average. Mike was also voted MVP by his teammates. He led the team in hits, stolen bases, and runs. His total of 58 runs was one of the five highest totals in American high school baseball. Mike has stolen 51 consecutive bases and was not caught stealing in the 1986 season. He was selected to First Team All-Ohio.

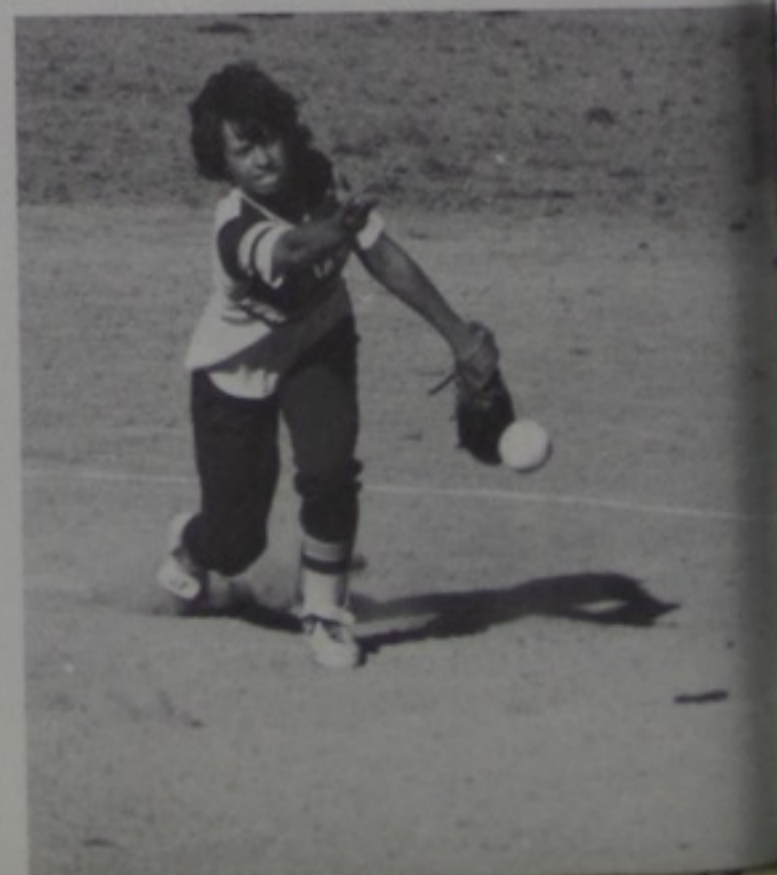

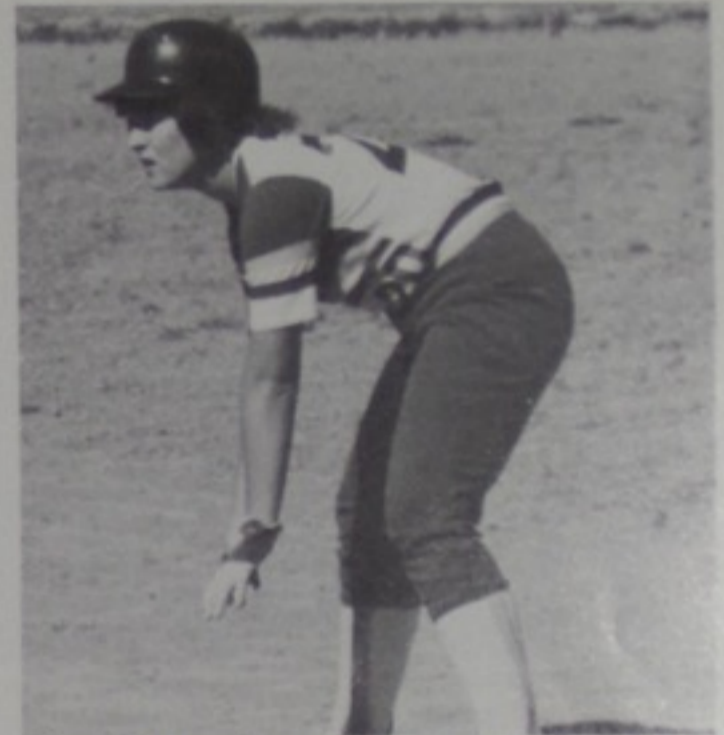

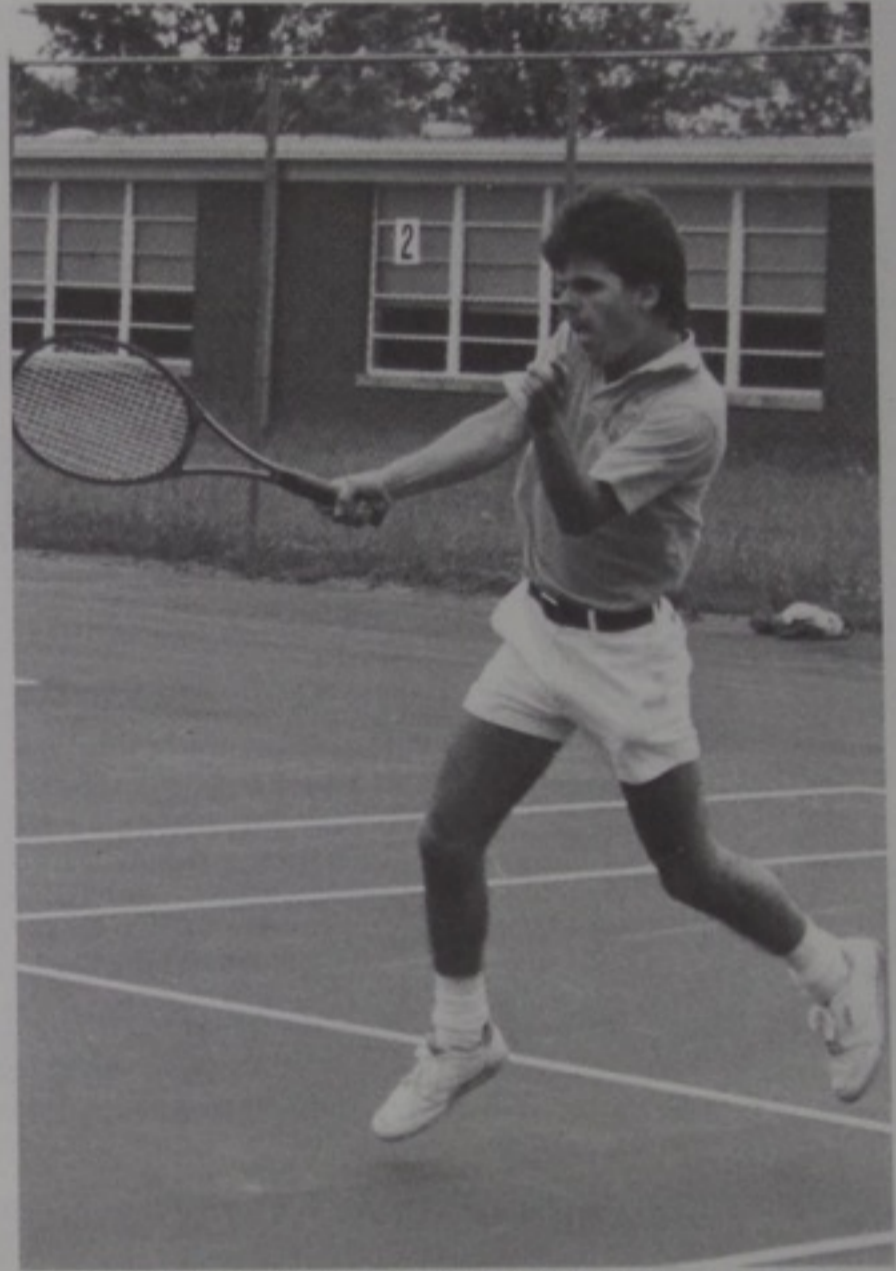

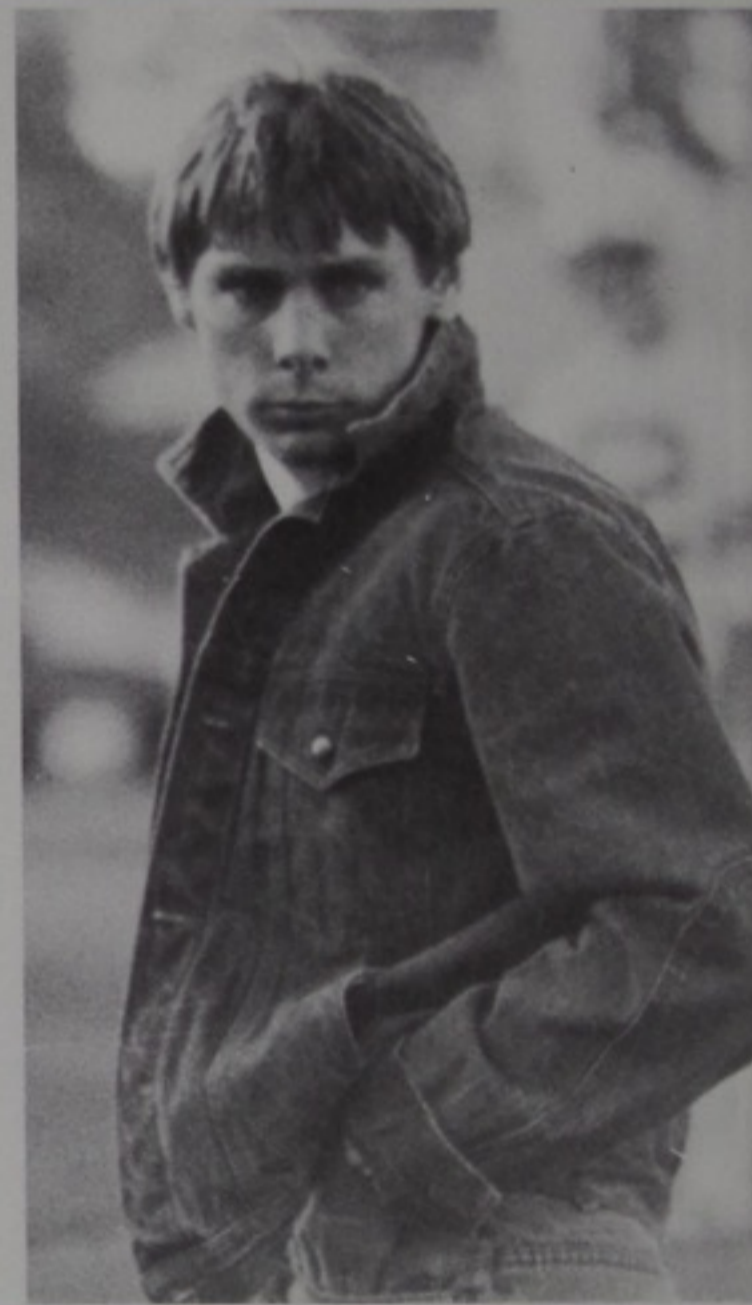

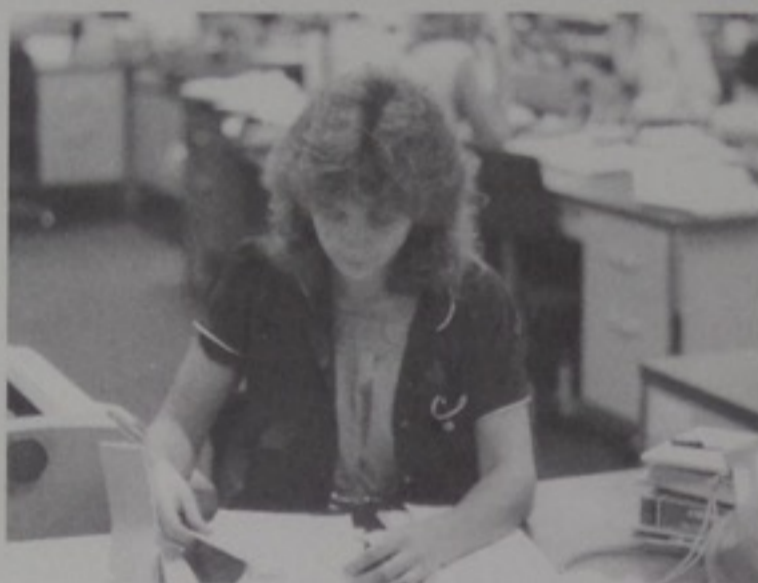

Valley has a large number of students representing them at the Scioto County Joint Vocational School. Juniors and seniors from the high school may go to Vo-tec for either one or two year programs. There are twelve schools from Scioto County involved at Vo-Tec. Each program is taught by an instructor who has had many years of experience in that field and has attained a college degree to teach it. These programs help students in areas of their interest.

At SCJVS, a student must have two and one-half hours of Related Class, which involves an intense study of their programs and different types of math and algebra. They also have an hour of academic study; juniors study English and seniors study history and government during this time. The rest of the day is spent in lab, where the students put their skills to work in a job-like atmosphere. During a student's senior year, they may leave their lab period to go on early placement, if they find a job related to their studies.

In 1986, the Smoke Signals entered the computer era. Using a program provided by the publisher, the staff entered all copy onto a floppy disk which was then sent to the publisher. The company places the disk directly into their computer to produce the type in this book. As publishing costs rise, the YB staff spends more time on fundraisers.
