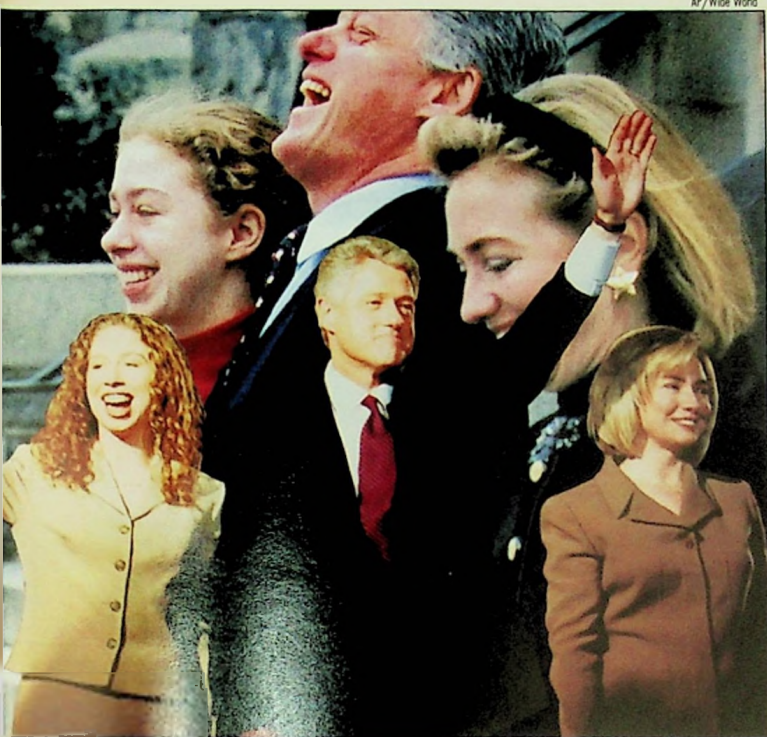
Everything but X-Ray Vision

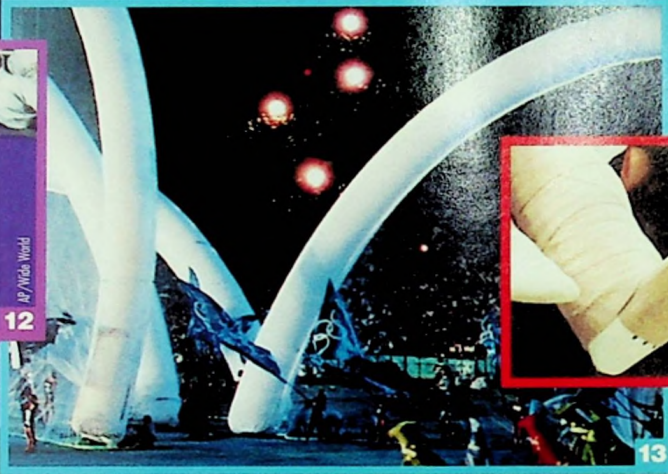
