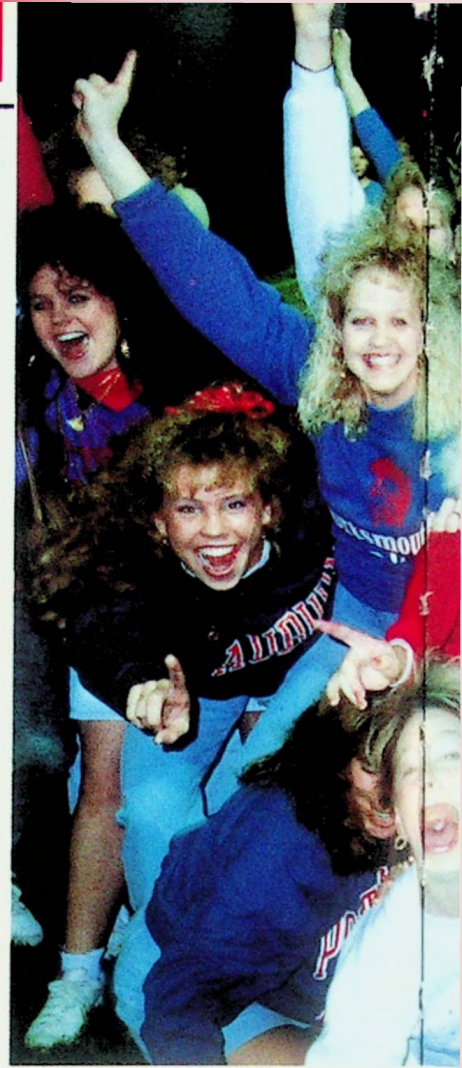

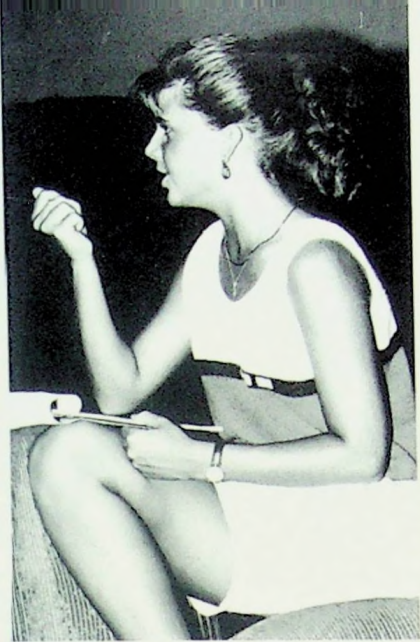

Student Life

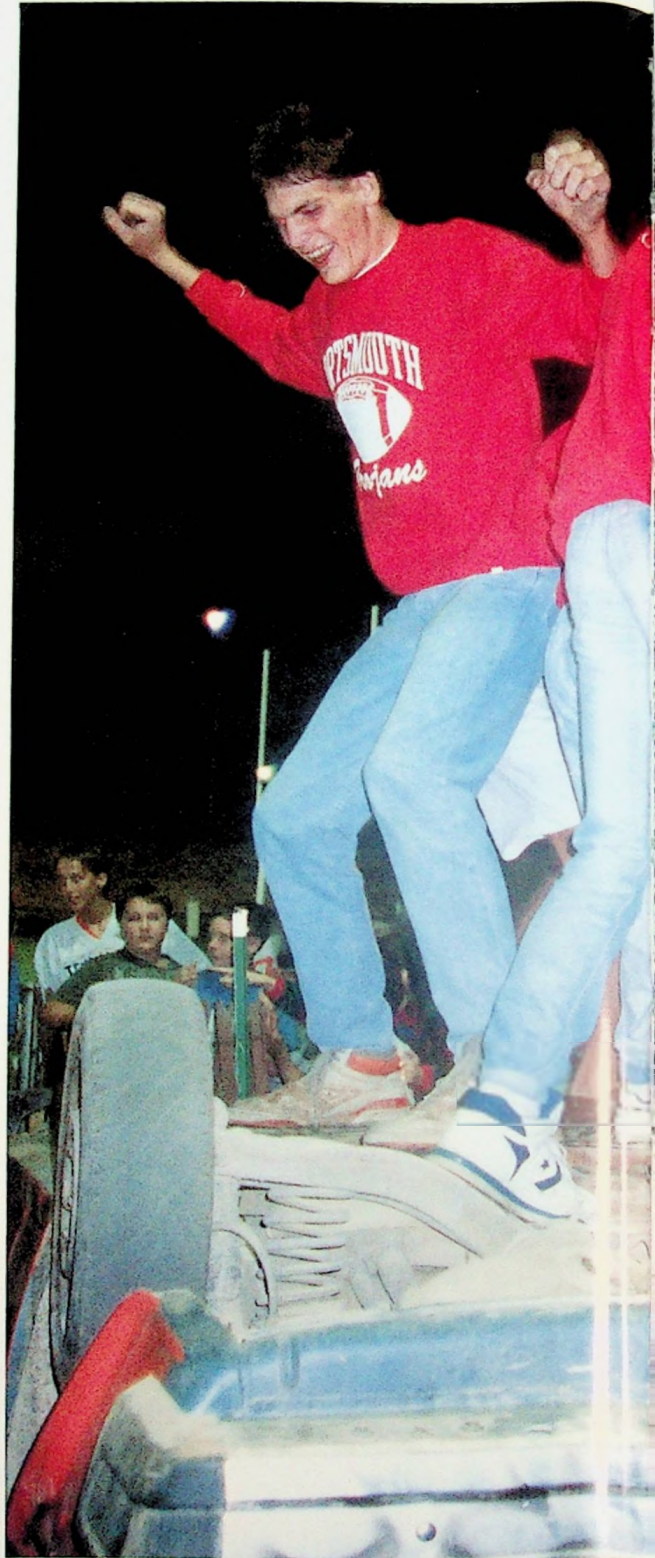
As new friendships began to grow, the students at Portsmouth High united together to make the school year memorable for everyone.

The talk around school in May was that of the Junior-Senior Prom. Final arrangements for that special evening were made so students could dance the night away.

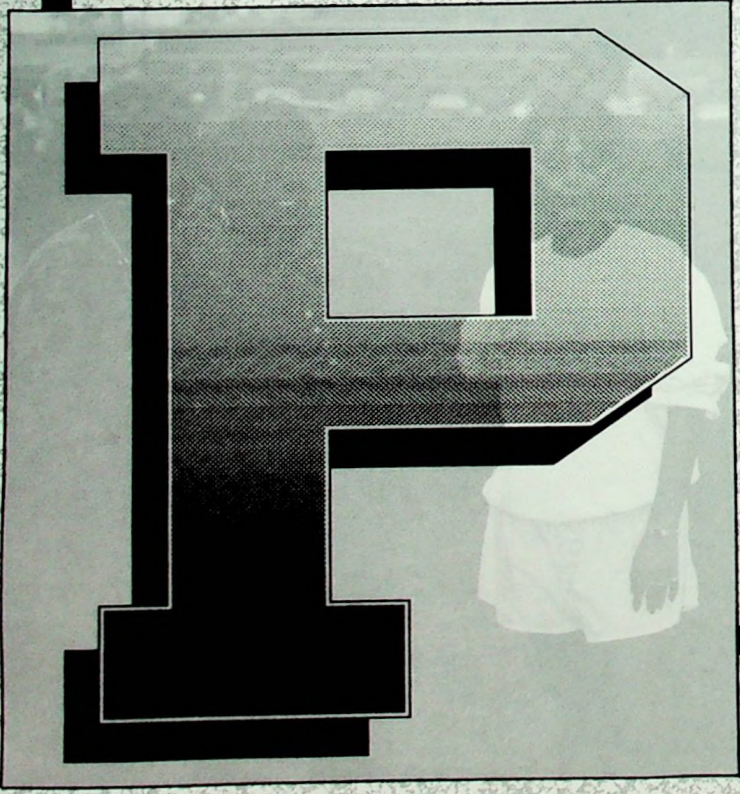
As the final weeks of school approached, schedules and study sheets for exams were handed out to the students. The all night cram sessions and the never ending cups of coffee became the routine for many students.

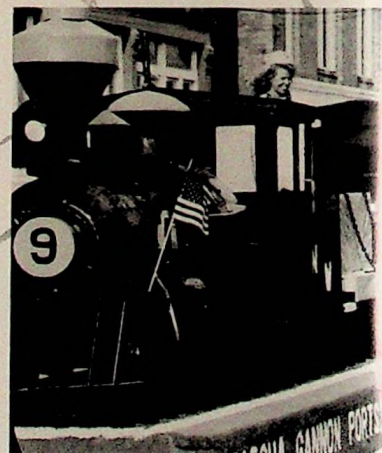

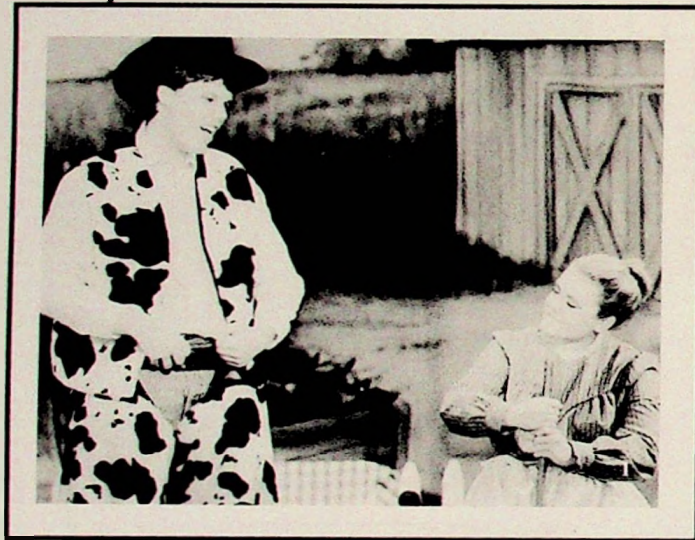
The sets were constructed by several students from the cast during spring break.

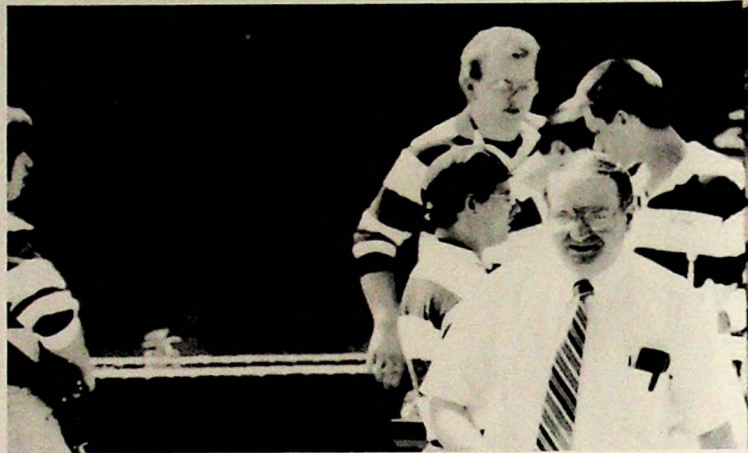

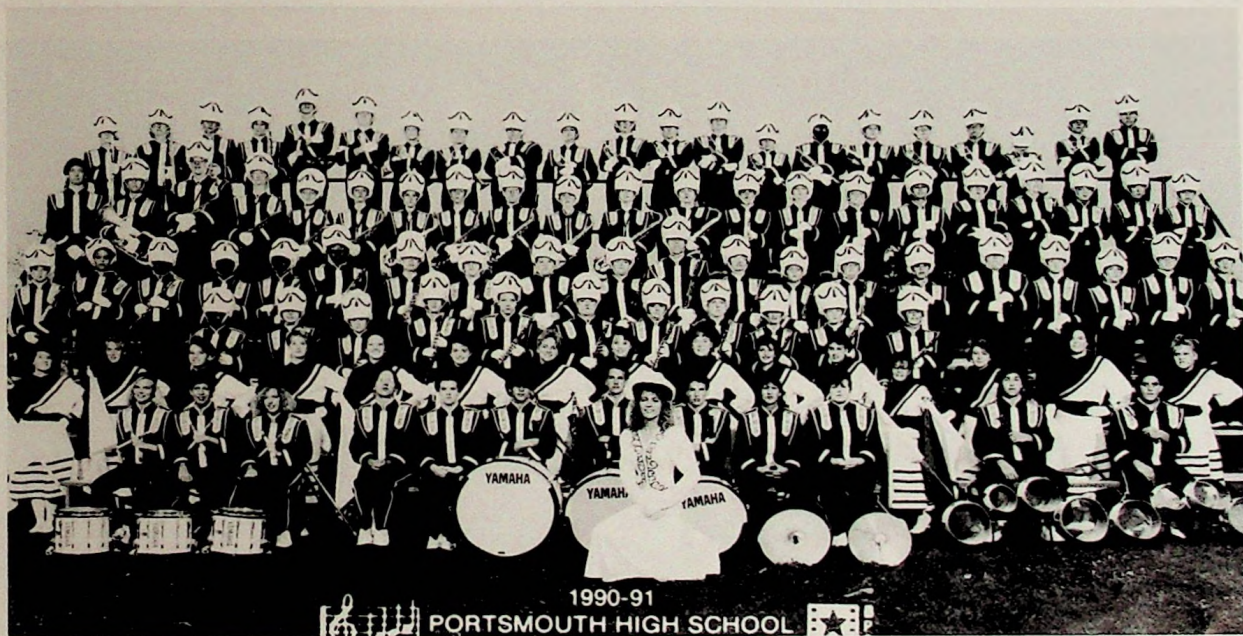

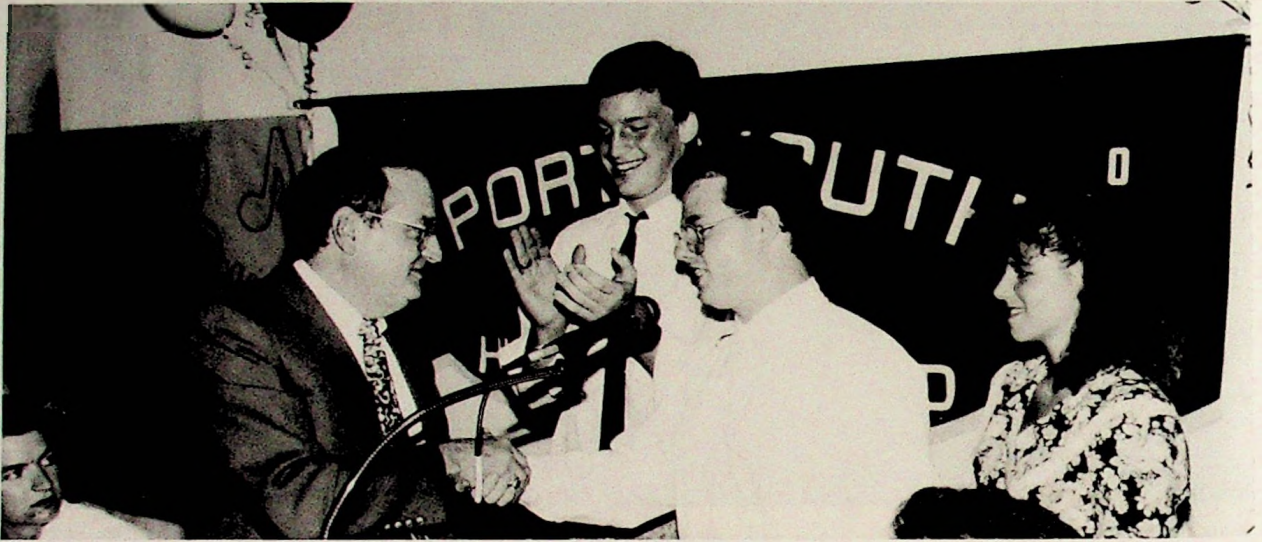

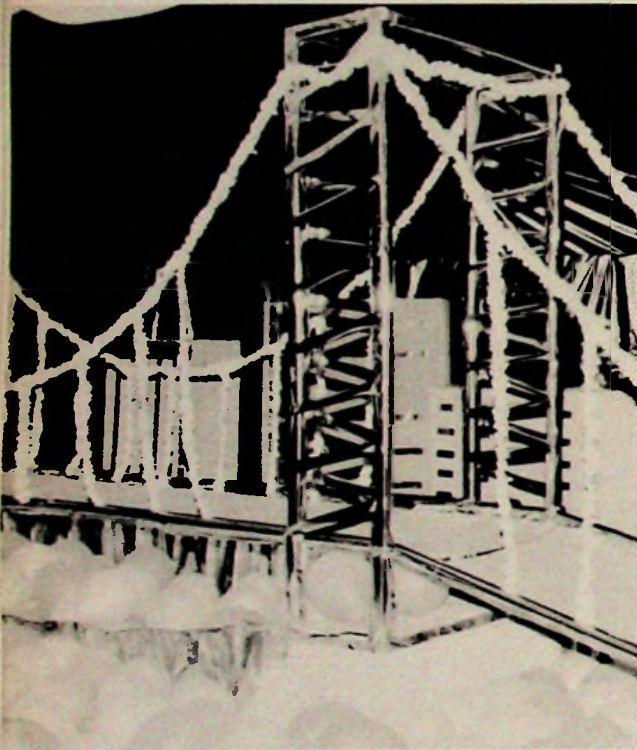

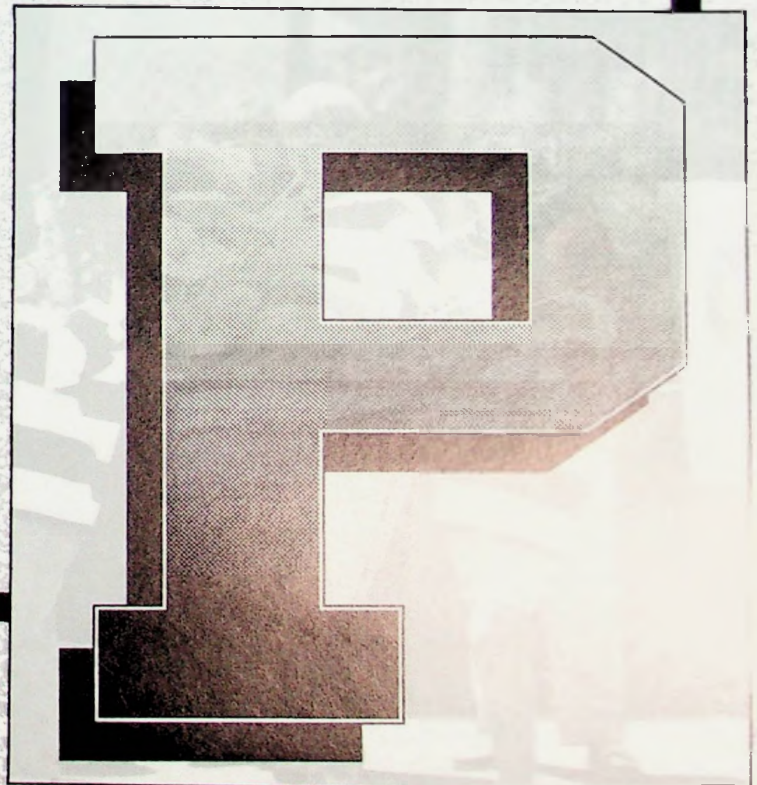

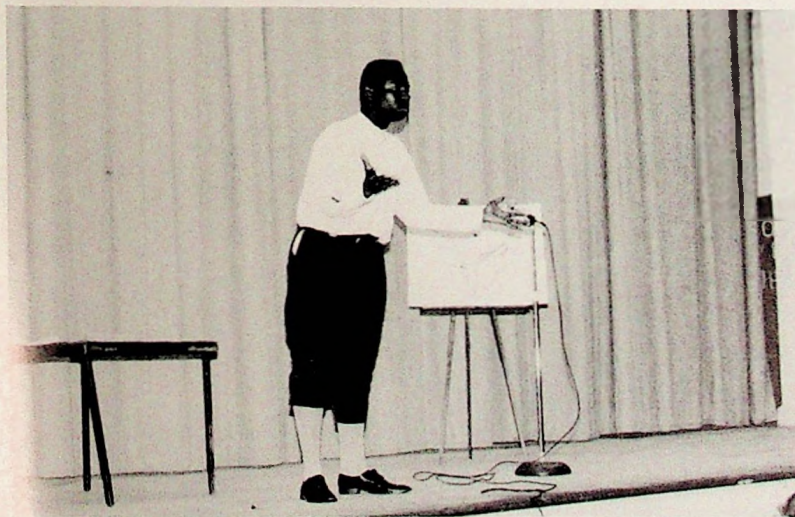

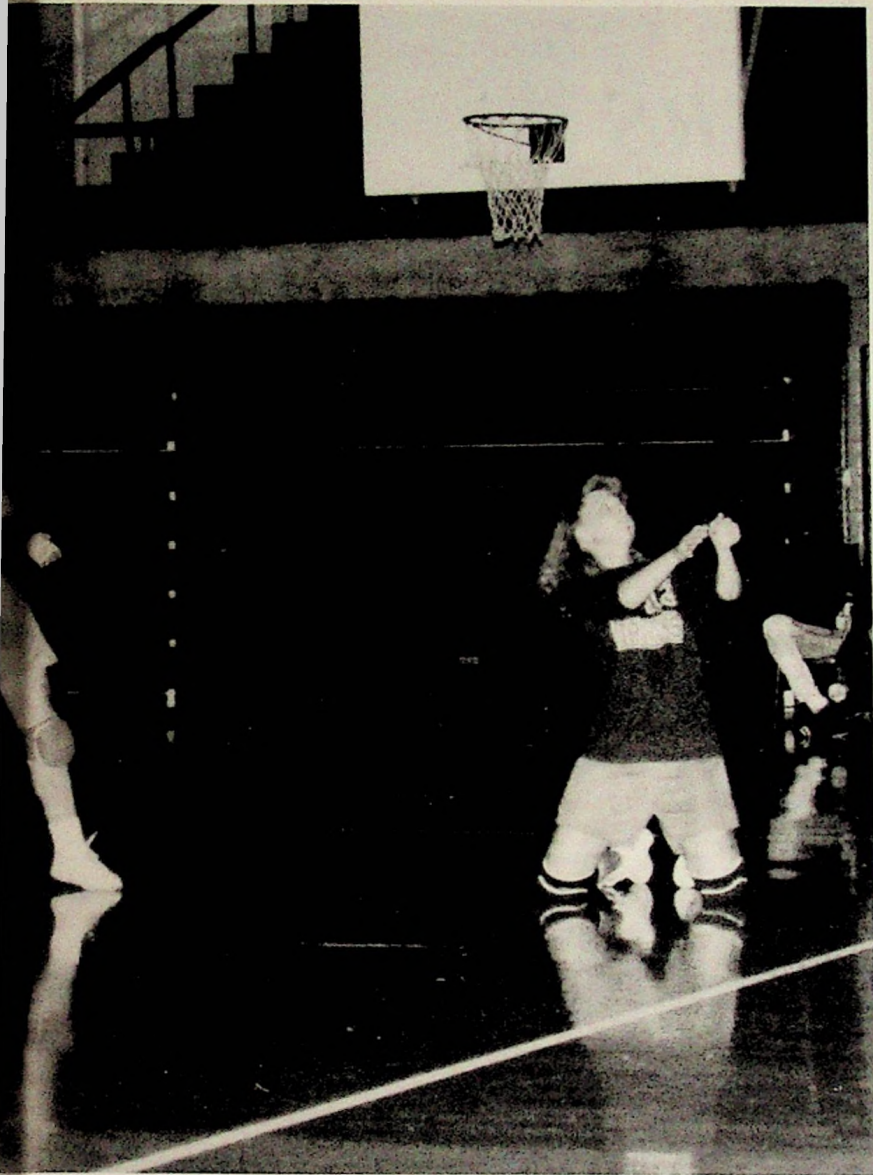

The PHS cheerleaders had a wonderful year.

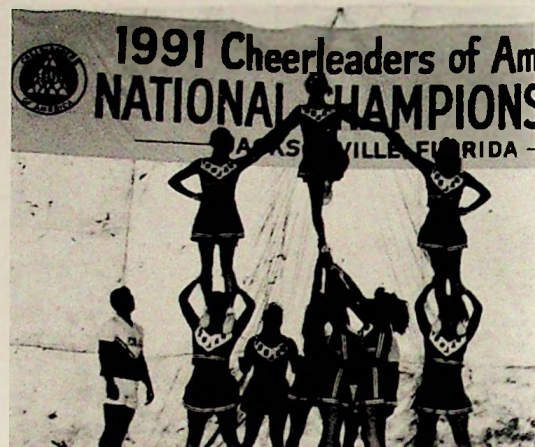
They went to Americheer Cheerleading Camp last summer. All three squads worked very hard to learn new cheers and stunts for the football and basketball games.

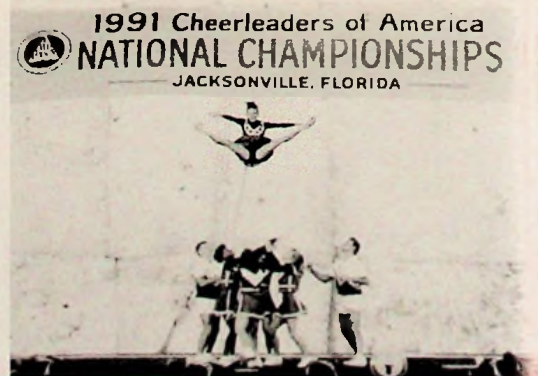

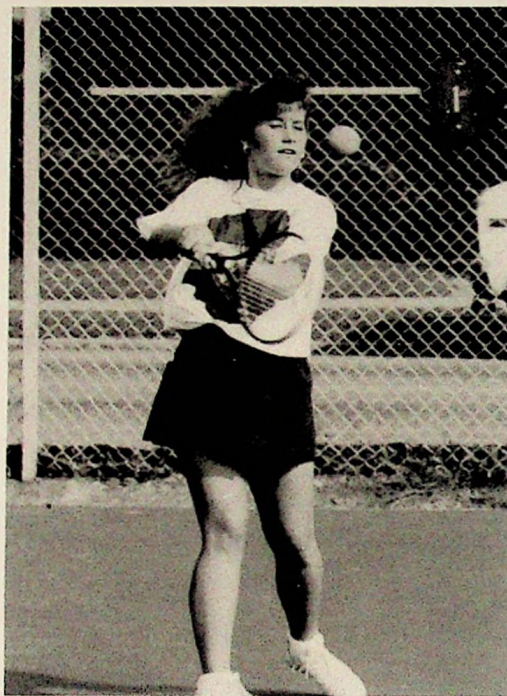

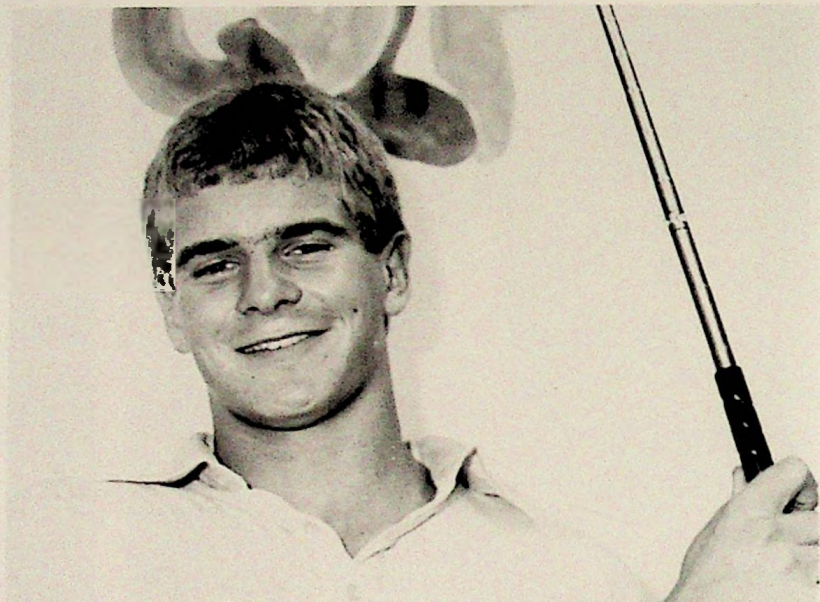

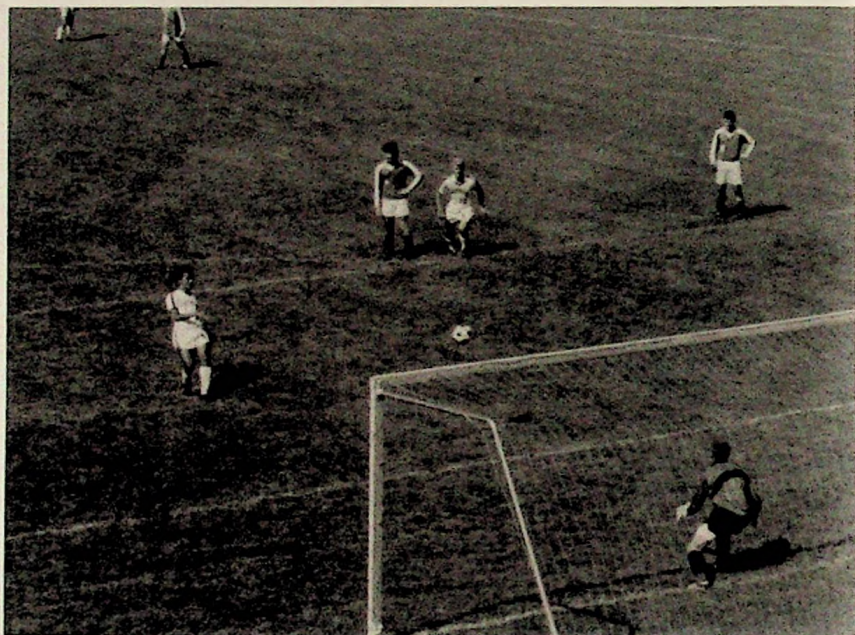

The Trojans opened the season with a 32-13 victory over Linden McKinley, to begin a season of high expectations. The Linden team couldn't stop the Trojans passing game, as Estep threw for 122 yards and two TD's of 13 and 12 yards to Matt Apel. Chris Duncan caught 6 passes for 85 yards on the night and Michael Parker rushed for 88 yards and 1 TD. Estep and Chris Poore scored on runs of 1 and 3 yards to round out the scoring.

The Trojans made it 2-0 by crushing Washington Court House 45-7. The Air Arsenal continued its assault as Mike Estep threw for 322 yards and 5 TD's. Chris Duncan broke school receiving records for most receptions: 8; yards 199; and TD receptions: 3 in a game. Estep hit Apel with a 61 yard score, Duncan with TD passes of

50, 26, and 37 yards, and Ryan Harris with a 1 yarder. Aaron Duncan returned an interception 50 yards for a score as the gun sounded.

The Trojans lost a heart breaker to Greenup County 21-19; but really beat themselves because of a few mistakes. Mike Parker scored from 2 yards out and Estep hit Duncan for a 28 yard TD to go up 13-0. Greenup scored with 30 seconds left in the half and got an easy score set up by fumbled punt at their own 1 yard line. The Trojans came back as Parker scored on an 11 yard run, but Greenup scored to go up and withstood a last minute Trojan drive to hold on. Estep threw for 220 yards and Chris Duncan caught 6 passes for 150 yards.

The Trojans came back after being down 21-0 to defeat Galli-

polis 32-27. Estep threw for 274 yards and 2 TD's. Duncan caught 6 passes for 134 yards and a 12 yard TD, and Apel caught 5 passes for 104 yards and a 46 yard TD. Parker rushed for 68 yards and 2 TD's and had 75 yards receiving along with his game winning 75 yard interception return for a TD.

The Trojans beat Russell 28-6 on a rainy and slippery night. Aaron Shabazz rushed 199 yards and scored three TD's on runs of 30, 62, and 3 yards. The other TD was a 42 yard run by Parker, who finished with 89 yards rushing.

as Parker scored on a 1 yard plunge. Estep hit Shabazz for a 73 yard T.D. for the Trojans last lead 18-13, as the Tomcats strength overtook the Trojans. Ashland went on to go 14-1 and win the state in Kentucky.

The Trojans lost another heart-breaker to rival Ironton 20-12 in front of a large crowd. The Trojans missed many opportunities and had some controversial calls against them in the contest. The Trojans down 14-0 at the half came out firing as Estep hit Apel for a 53 yard gain and Duncan for a 10 yard T.D. to narrow the margin to 14-7. A controversial roughing the kicker call set up Ironton's final T.D. and the Trojans scored on 3 yard shuffle pass from Estep to Parker. Estep finished with 236 yards passing and Apel and Duncan finished with 98 and 71 yards receiving on the night. 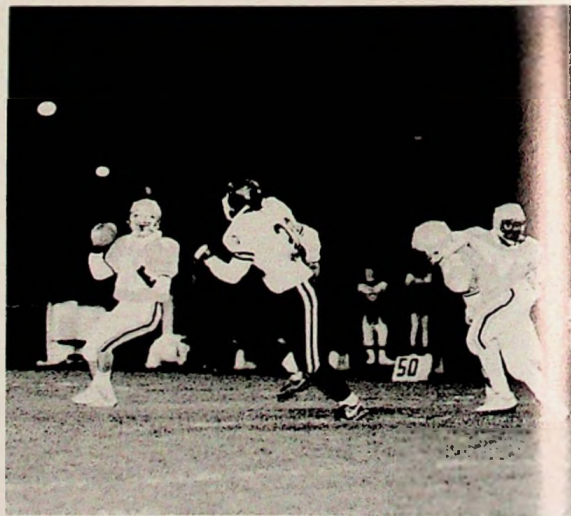

The Trojans football program is a class act now and strives on discipline, weightlifting, conditioning, and fundamentals. 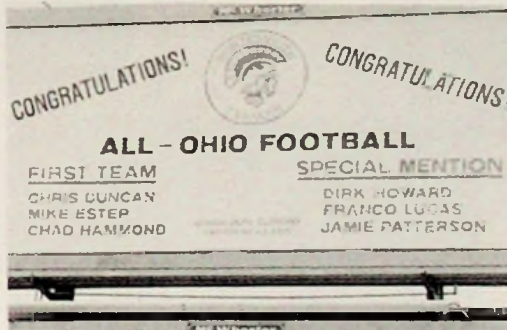

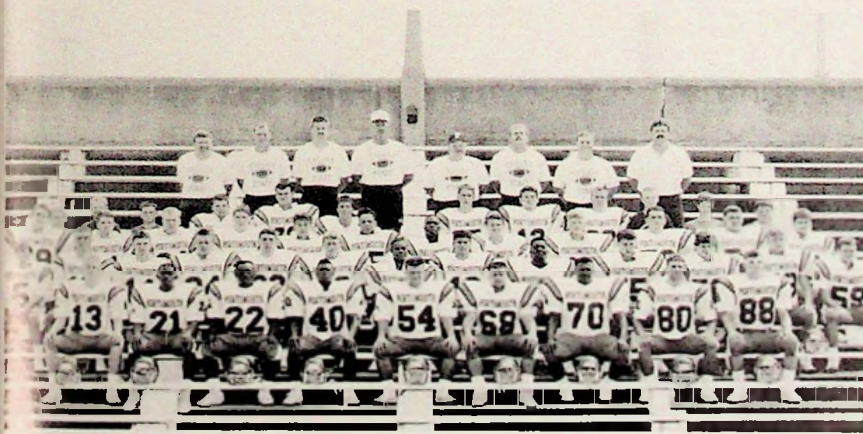

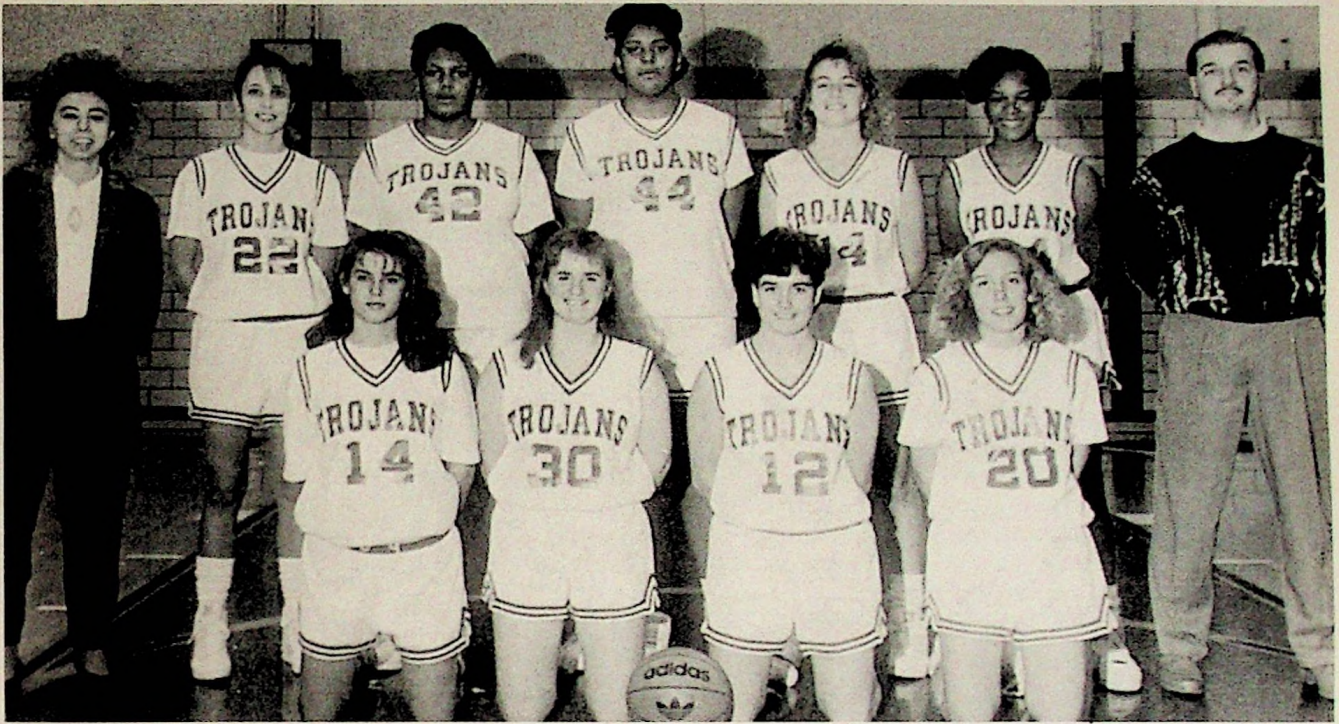

Trojans Season A Success

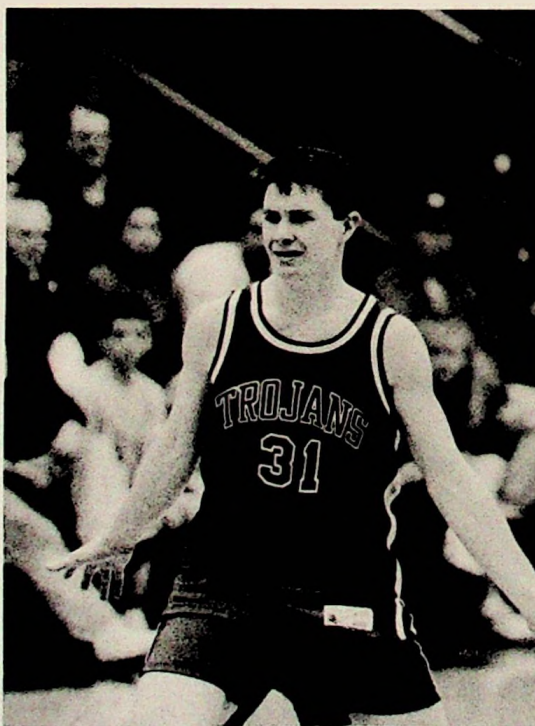

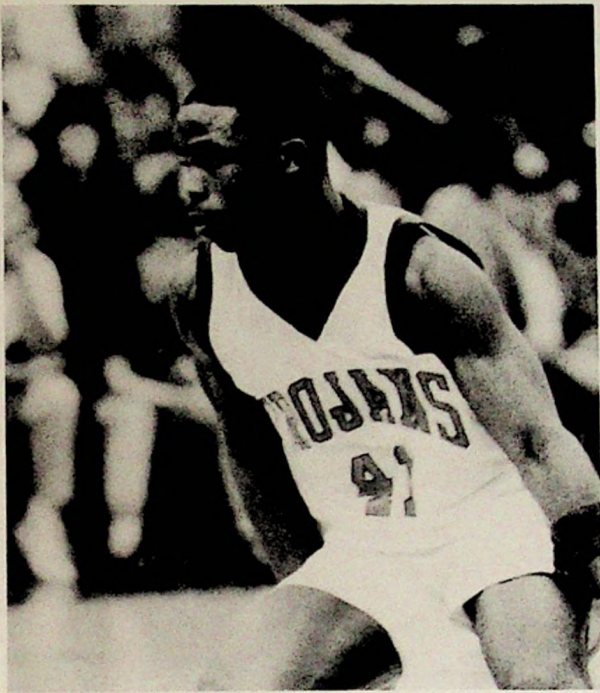

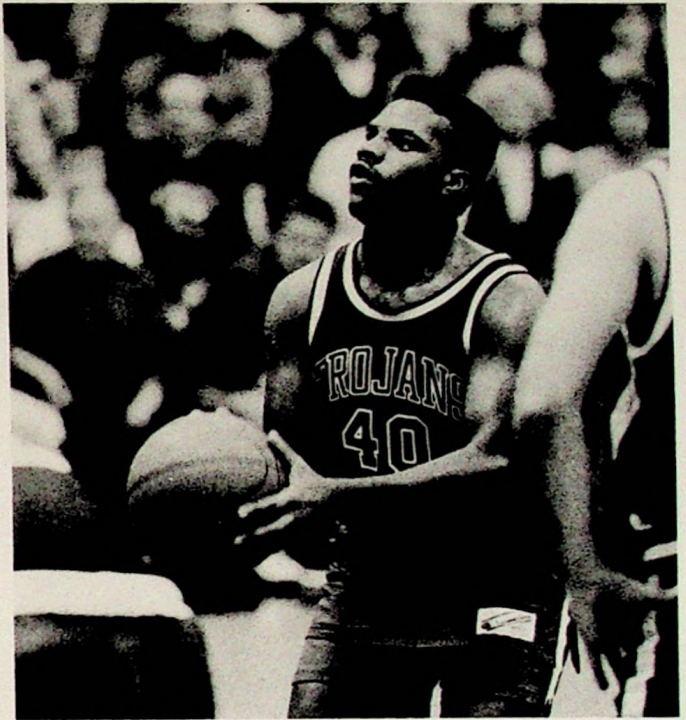

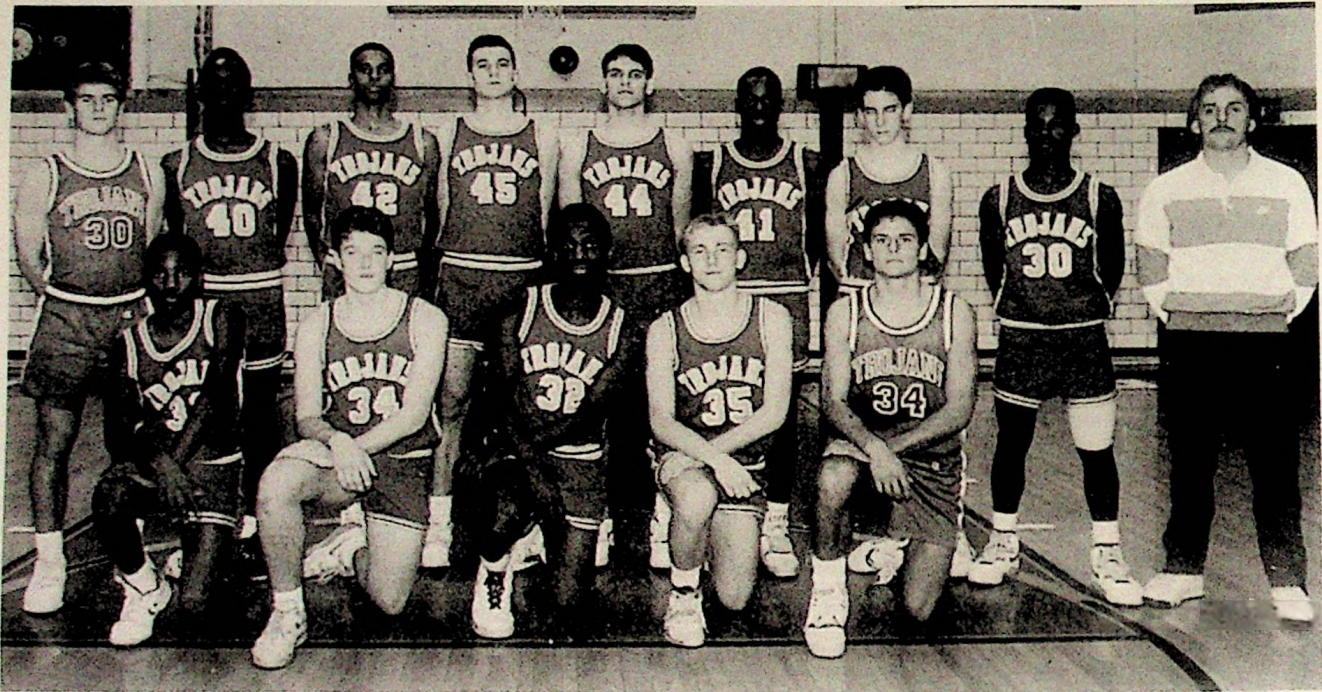

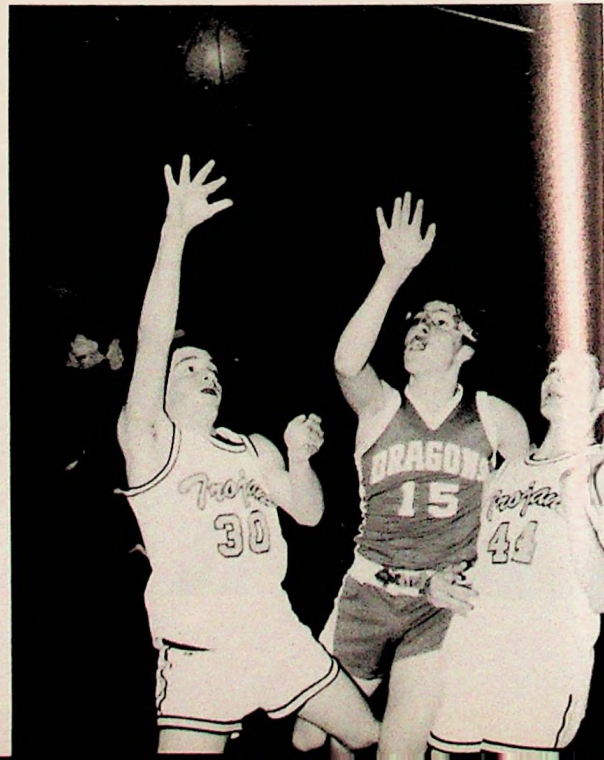

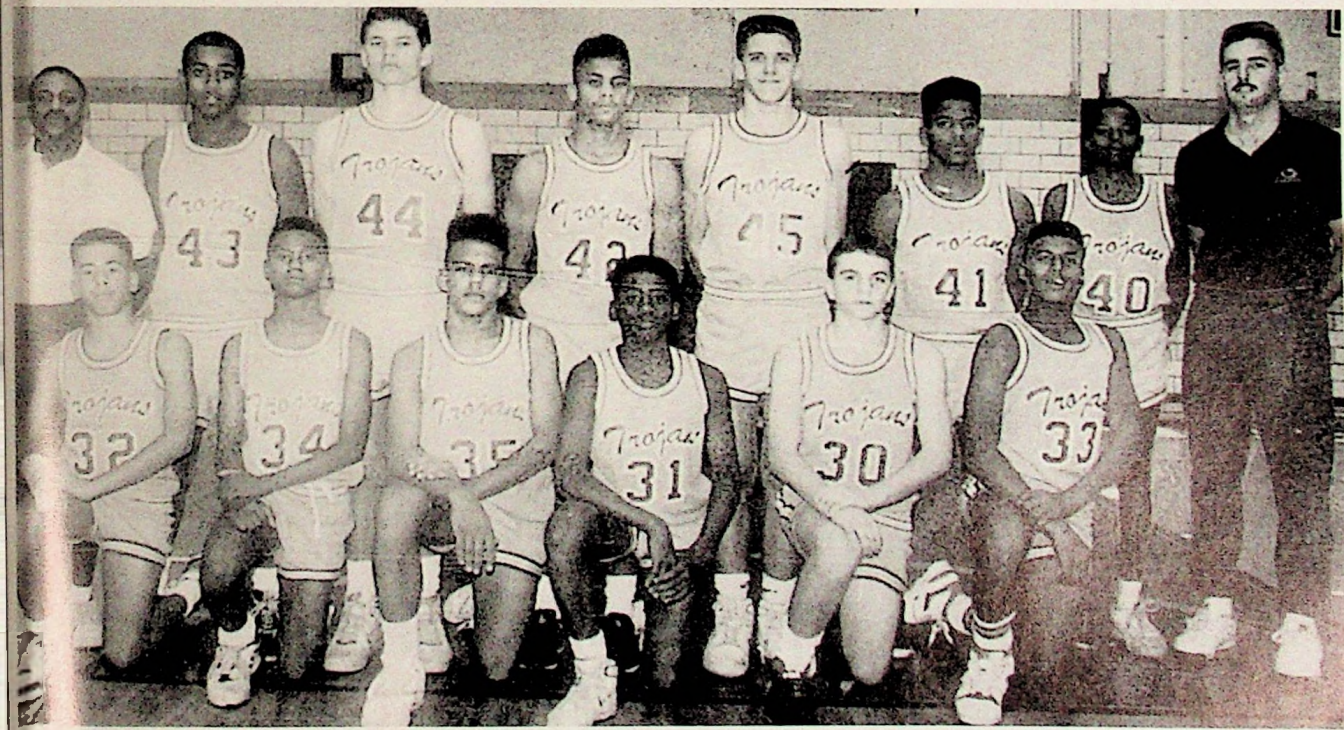

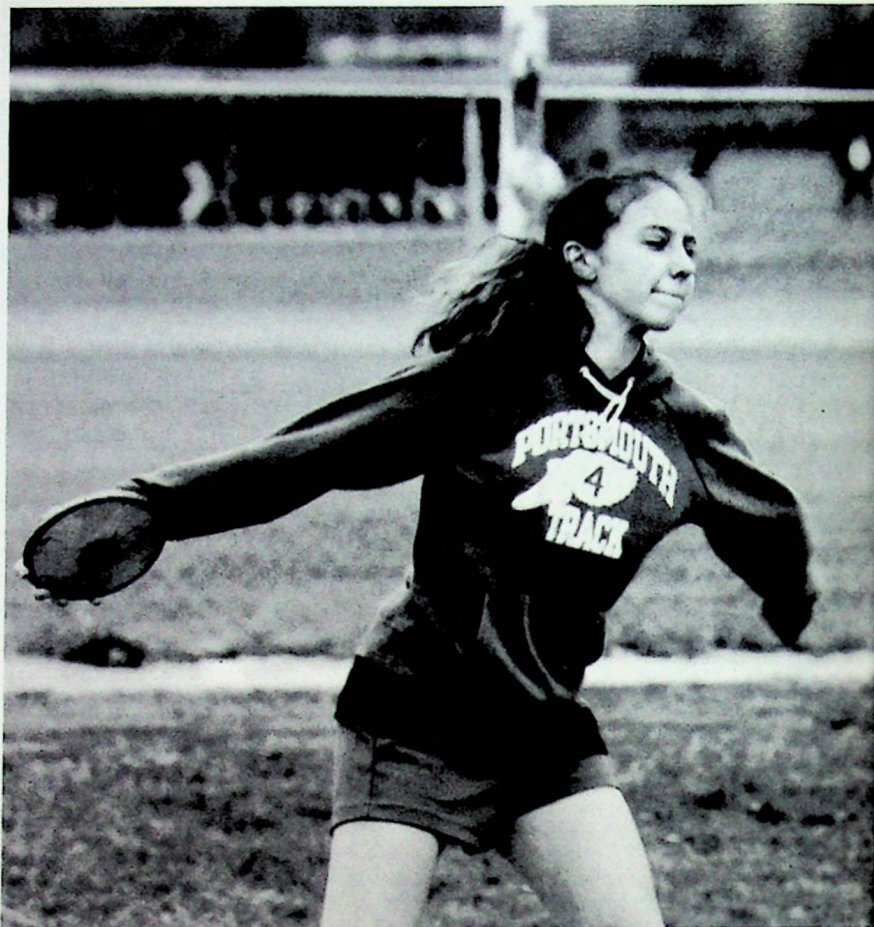

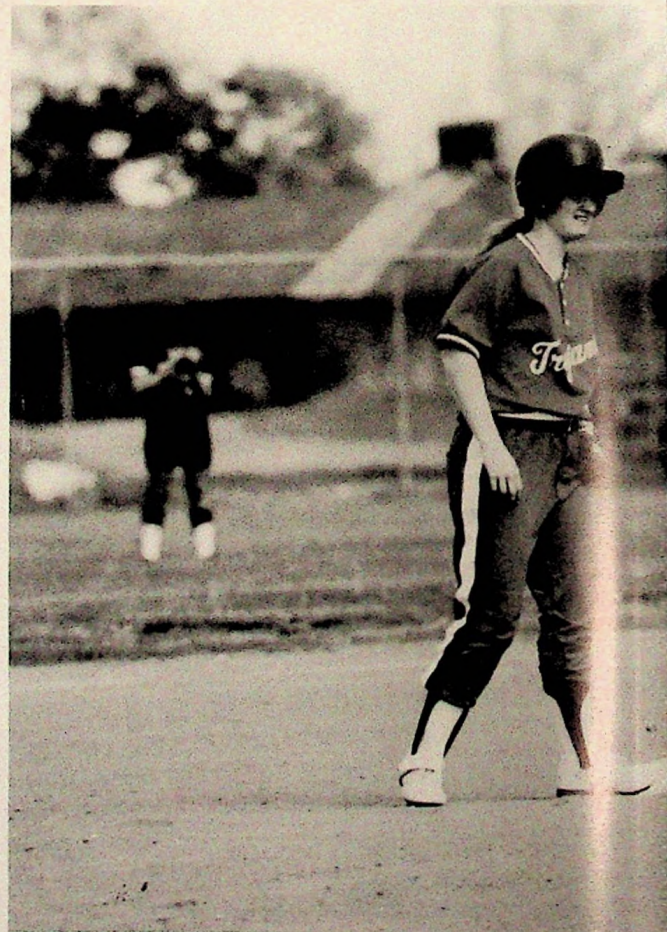
Trojan Softball

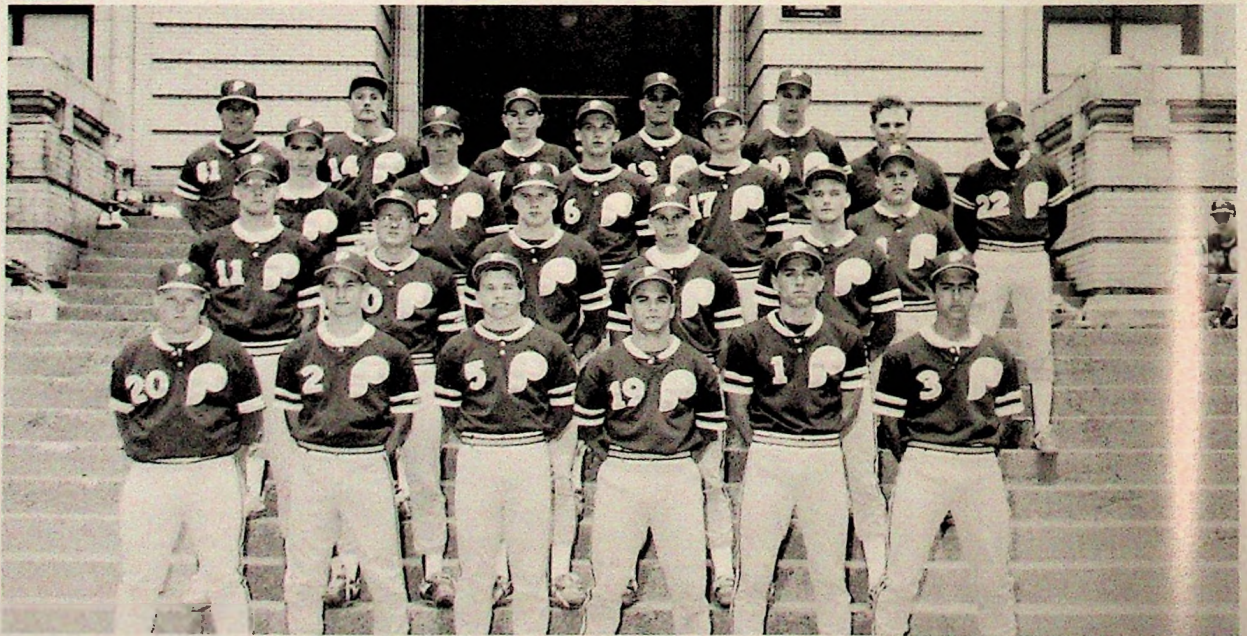

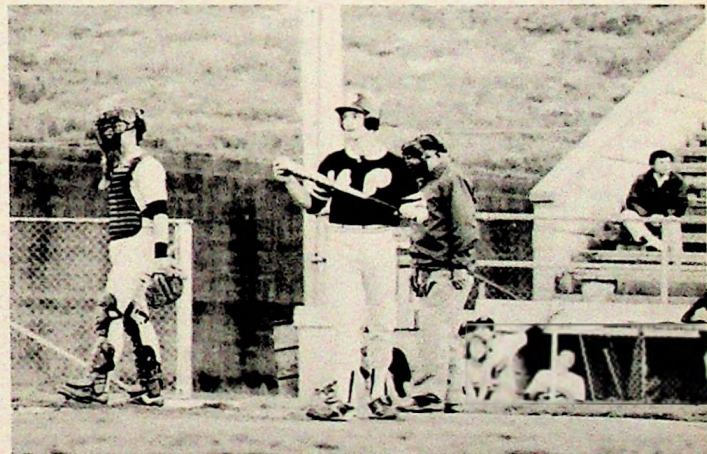

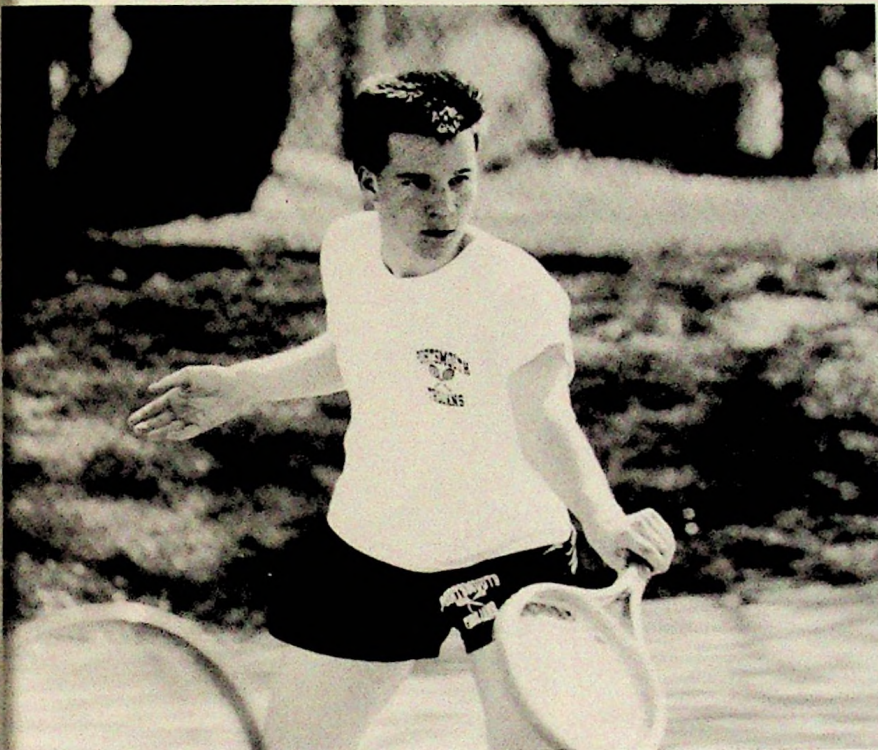

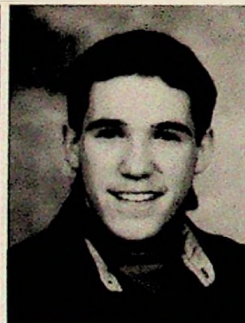
Seniors ... At Last!!

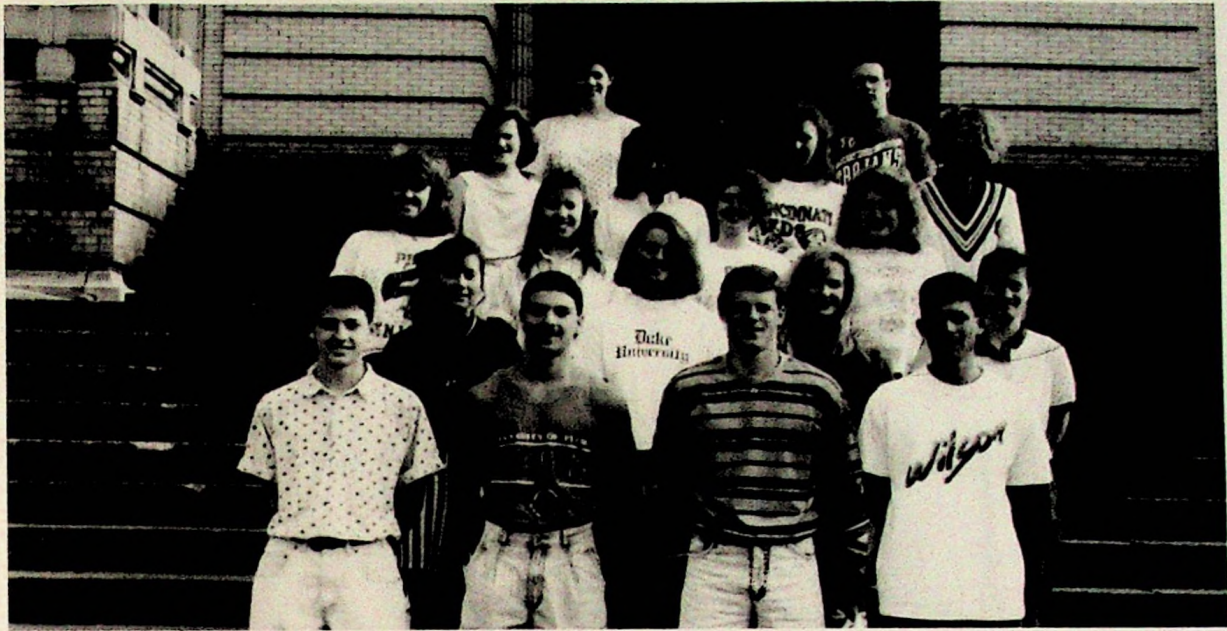
