noon, but had to

of rain.

at the mill as

A cold chilly day.  
H. Jant & I dug  
potatoes until  
noon, when we  
stopped.

We then sorted  
them over and  
got them ready

Fri. Nov. 6.  
A big frost this  
morning but a nice  
day

My butchard a  
hog and firmed  
around until  
noon.

late at night  
tired and worn  
out.

Sat. Nov. 11

A rain set in  
last night and  
rained until  
about 8 AM.  
We finished digging  
potatoes  
the rest of the day.

Thurs Nov. 12

A steady rain  
prevented us from  
going this morning  
but slackened off  
before noon. By  
Brenton & I  
began to dig  
potatoes this

Fri Nov. 13

A cool morning  
I dug a little  
the front & I dug  
potatoes all day  
We have done  
swath to see  
over.



Sat/Nov. 14  
A cold morning  
The coldest as  
yet I ever had.  
We sorted potatoes  
all day.  
Went to church  
in the evening  
by large crowd.  
We got there late  
so I did not  
talk with  
Ed. Porter the  
rest of the time  
on the results  
of the election

Sun. Nov. 15  
A nice warm day  
At home most  
all day  
Went to Baptist  
a little while  
after dinner.

they raised the  
flag & went

what I spent a pleasant

evening and one or two remembered

Sun. Nov. 22

A cool chill  
Turned warmer  
towards evening  
& spent the day  
over at Mr. Cull's  
very pleasantly  
Mr. Brill is  
sick with a  
fever.

I returned her  
a little after  
midnight  
Wool had buck  
coming home  
Hance trying to  
elude a mud  
hole struck the  
fence and  
broke the shaft  
which took me  
an hour to mend

Mon Nov. 23.

A nice warm day  
A little frost this  
morning.  
Benton & I shuck  
corn all day.

Tues. Nov. 24

A rainy bad looking morning but did not rain much. I went to mill. Had to stay all day as usual. Victor is working for Gene. Shacking corn. I got a pair of old shafts for the buggy of Aunt Hannah's.

Wed. Nov. 25

A nice day. I fixed around all day. Painted the buggy shafts and cleaned the buggy. It started to haul in some corn but on going up to Hatter's I stopped and went in and she was Rosie Wagner. She had come. I brought the two girls back down with me in the wagon. We all went out to church at 10.

Thurs Nov 26

A fine warm  
day

I visited all day  
Popie, Annie & I  
took a horse back  
ride up past  
Blum Smith  
past the byes  
and over the  
was home.

Mother had a  
big turkey dinner

So we had a  
nice time  
Annie & I went  
a piece with  
Popie as she was  
home.

By all went to  
church in the  
evening.

Fri. Nov 27.

A damp cloudy  
day Rained the  
most of the  
afternoon

I hauled in  
corn this fore  
noon

Smith & I settled  
our trade on  
the feeding of  
the high stalk  
this winter  
I am to feed  
his two mules  
and a heifer  
for his share of  
the corn crop

Sat Nov 25  
A cool day with  
a good deal of  
rain.

Rained most all  
night

I hauled some  
boards out of  
the low ground  
to keep the creek  
from getting in

Bought 7 head  
of hog and pigs  
of J. L.

They have made  
get a perfect  
team and the  
year and me  
to my share  
of the farm

Sun Nov 26  
A cool saw day  
Drove most all  
day  
At home all day  
and talked farm  
talk and read  
I took a stroll  
up in the orchard  
and down to  
Tranter Street  
my gun to  
The First Baptist
