hauled in  
hay the rest  
of the day

Sat. July 4  
A cloudy day  
Bahr.  
Rained a small  
amount in the  
afternoon.  
Bill & I worked  
most all day  
getting ready to  
stack and  
stacked two  
loads.  
Jim took Bill &  
the buggy and  
started to drive  
his pen to.

Sun. July 5-  
A cloudy day  
Rained a little  
this morning.  
I took a drive  
this morning up  
to Big Run and  
back.  
Singing Sparrows a  
little practice in  
the east.  
Set house. The  
rest of the day  
to and here.

Mon. July 6  
A cold day  
C. & I made bee  
hive out of an  
old gun log  
& took 4, clover to  
Ed. baileys to get  
some bees

Tues. July 7  
A nice day cool  
& cut grain and  
raked hay  
C. & I hauled beams  
and helped stack  
hay

Wed July 8  
A cold windy misty  
day

I cart grass  
most all day  
Oss plowed potatoes  
and corn  
most all day

Thurs, July 9  
A cool morning.  
Ground too wet to  
work  
I & Oss dug the dust  
of the garden  
We then sowed  
up beans and  
hacked weeds in the  
corn.

I mowed the dust of  
the day  
A cold rain fell  
last night  
Rained most all  
night

Fri. July 10

A nice warm day

A little cool in

the morning

I mowed until

noon

Then put

up hay the rest

of the day

Our sakiid,

Sat July 11

A warm day

Threatened storm but

failed

The boys finish

hauling in the

rest of the hay

that was cut.

Perked had all day

and all of meat.

He had

Chas.

Santos to help

us in the hay

work.

Sun July 12  
A nice day rain  
Char. Bull &  
drove home up to  
synod school  
Jim McHale &  
then drove down to  
the office after  
the mail day  
back past  
Shepard's home  
At home the end  
of the day.

Mon. July 13  
A sunnier day  
The real rain  
sprinkled a little  
The boys all  
helped Smith  
stack his wheat  
She stacked it  
all  
Had one upset  
and a sunning  
over a stick  
bluff  
Beaked the cowbird  
pole and cracked  
the tongue to  
the newspaper.



Tues. July 14  
A warm day  
Two hours of rain  
Bill & I plowed  
corn most all  
day.

I settled up  
with Oscar Wood  
and let him

go.  
Should have kept  
him on hood  
he not got  
suntensity and  
milked yesterday  
for contrary milk

Wed July 15  
A damp day  
Rained most all  
the afternoon  
A hard wind &  
rain.

Blowid several  
of the limbs off  
the old apple  
tree.  
Bill & I don a  
good half days  
cradling of  
oats in the  
orchard.

Thurs. July 16

A cloudy day.  
Turned cool.

Bill & I cut  
out a barrel

all day.  
The creek is  
high to ford.

Fri. July 17

A nice day.  
Cool.

Bill & I cut and  
banded crabs all  
day.

Sat. July 18.

A nice day.  
Got at morning  
Bill & I finished  
the gate on the  
hill. By noon  
we hauled in  
hay the rest of  
the day

Did not work hard  
A few peach trees  
had a few ripe  
peaches on

Sun. July 18

A nice day  
Threatened rain  
a little  
Mr. & Mrs. Bull  
came over on a  
visit and to get  
chick chickens  
he bought of ma.  
Gene. took the buggy  
& Belle over to  
the little school  
Fair's nurse Henry  
came over.

A long, long  
day from  
at night all day  
Mr. & Mrs. Bull was  
burred to day.

Mon. July 20  
A low, warm day  
Rained a little  
in the evening  
I finished  
flaming over  
and the rest  
of the day.

Tues. July 21  
Rained hard  
most all night  
and showed the  
most of the day  
beak part over  
the bottom above  
and below sea.  
Cat out & pay.  
damaged  
Over all right  
so far,  
Nothing done to  
day  
I went up to  
the pits to see  
tripp about getting  
water & get  
some money  
13 dollars of this.

Wed. July 22  
Home prairie and  
creek still out.  
Jim & Jake went  
home.

I fixed around  
until noon.  
Chas. Beryl & I  
fixed the pig-  
pen pencil and  
chopped wood.

Thurs. July 23.  
And still it  
rains a little.  
Chas & John  
worked at the  
hauling until  
noon.  
I set out oats  
and cut some  
grass.  
All got wet.

Fri. July 24  
H. Shaker had  
day  
D. Johnson gave  
over to Blom  
and Vernon  
Stopped and  
eat supper  
at Cassin's  
Out collecting but  
got none.

Sat. July 25.  
A stamp foreman  
but could not  
after dinner.  
Got a few  
by later by cook  
for the page.  
Found they were  
bad. & then  
spread out cards  
of day. The set  
by the day  
found them in  
a bad shape  
part to number  
a big lot.

Sun. July 26  
A very warm  
dry day  
& worked at  
my oats most  
all day.

Heard Tom A. H.  
until 3 P. M.  
Eat dinner  
and then went  
over to Mr. Chaffin  
to see the Mr. Chaffin  
Had a dish of  
ice cream and  
a lot of ripe  
peaches to eat.

Mon. July 27  
A very warm dry  
day.  
The first mow  
for some time  
that it did not  
rain.  
I finished rebanding  
my oats.  
Then tried to  
cut with the  
mower but fairly  
ground to soft  
ferns & then  
stacked oats.  
Smith & Bill  
put up hay.

Friday July - 28  
A warm day  
Rained a little  
A hard rain  
at 10:30  
Gene & I finished  
hauling in all  
of his oats that  
would do  
Smith & Bill  
hauled in hay

Saturday July 29.  
An after-noon  
day  
We have cut  
oats.  
Run the binder  
part of the time  
I & C added some  
Oats most all  
shattered off.  
A threatening  
rain on Sunday  
Sun  
L.P.H.



Thurs. July 30  
An extremely warm  
day.

Rained & blowed  
hard last night  
but not long.

A hard rain this  
evening. Went  
at about midday  
of year.

The cut oats  
most all day.  
Oats not filled.

Fri. July 31  
A cool night last  
night after the  
rain.

Some coolers to do  
I dug potatoes  
set out crates  
and helped put  
up hay.

The published cut  
hay down hill.

We have just  
up the oat crop  
and have put  
the bundles away.

The oats not  
filled and the  
other boxes  
oats all to ripe  
have sheared the  
heads off.

A bad month  
for harvesting  
Rained every  
week during the  
month and one  
week rained  
every day.

Leek a lot of bank  
and done more  
damage than a  
little.

The war just  
damaged by creek  
but wet weather  
damaged us lots  
lost most all  
of over a thousand  
bat. egg. and new  
has.
