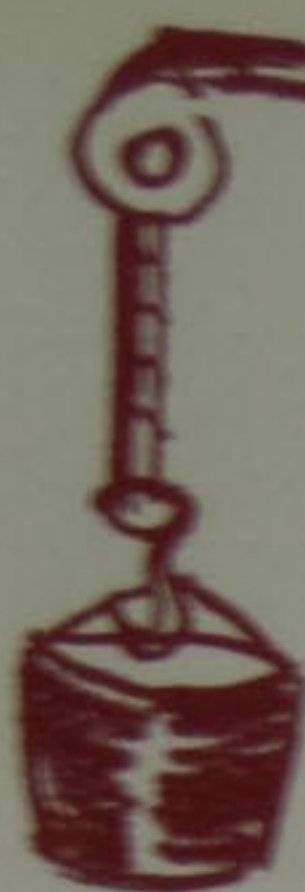

Business Education Commercial Co-op

This program is designed to develop skills needed in business. It provides for clerical as well as secretarial training. These fundamental skills are essential as a help not only in securing a job but in keeping one and succeeding in the business world of today.

Portsmouth High's Commercial Co-op Class specializes in education for senior girls and boys who are preparing themselves for employment in the city's many business offices. To obtain this type of education, pupils must meet qualifications set up by businesses pertaining to personality, integrity, intelligence, physical fitness, health, appearance, and skills.

On-the-job work experience is given by the Portsmouth employers who cooperate with the school in a training course to prepare youths for careers in the business field. These students attend school four periods a day for classroom instruction and are on the job for training during the afternoon. Miss Alberta Wittenburg is the class instructor.

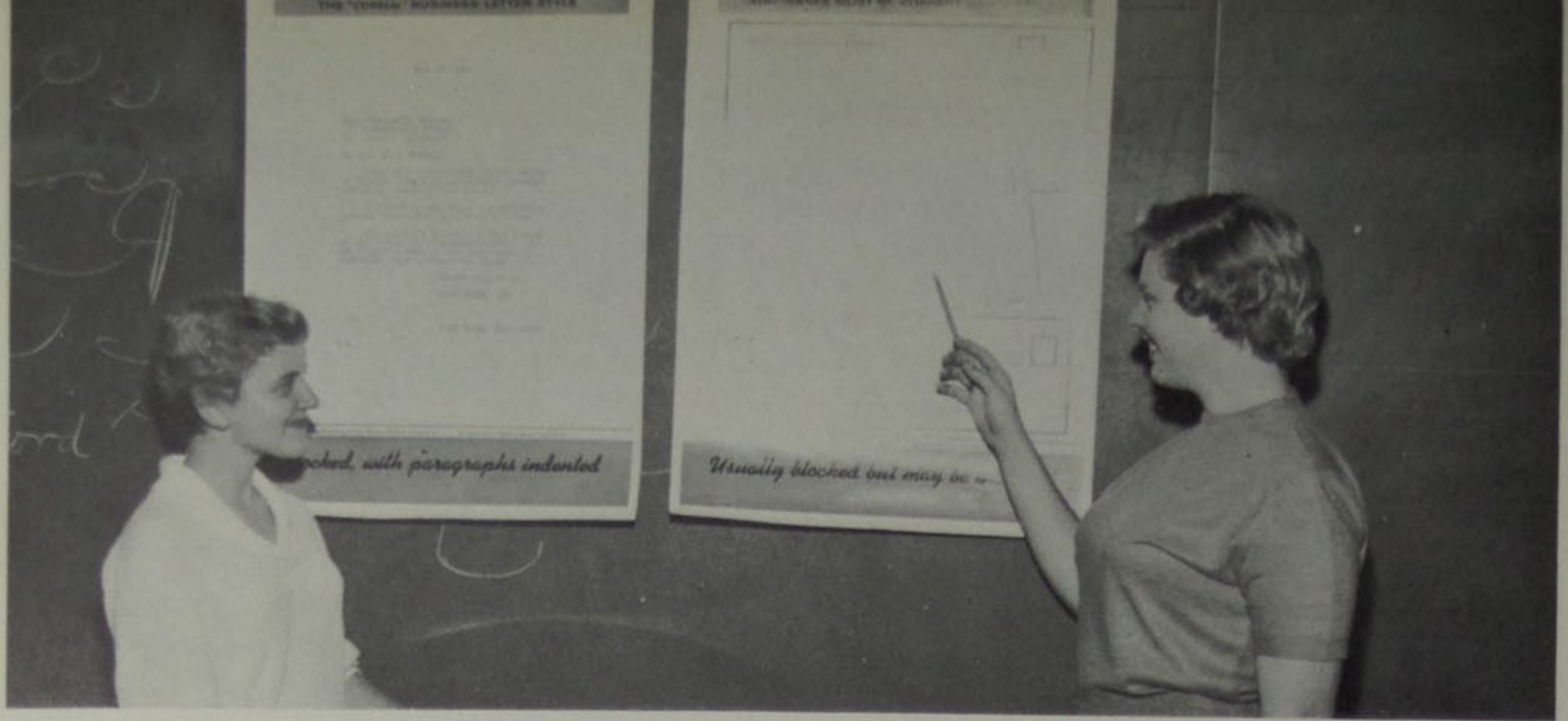

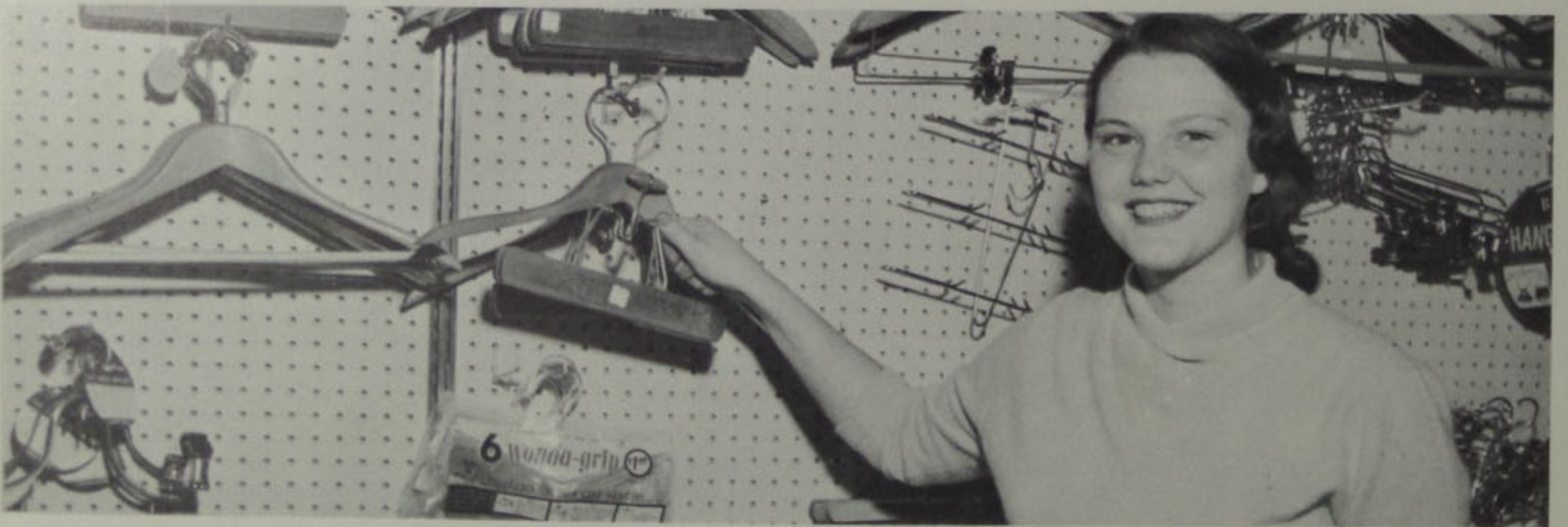

Trades and Industries Vocational School

... We Prepare For Careers of Service to the Communities of the Nation

Trade and Industrial Education is that phase of modern educational program which has, for one of its direct objectives, the preparing of high school students for entrance into specific trades, or occupations to be found within the area serviced by the educational system.

Three clock hours each day are spent in the "shop" of the student's choice where the correct use of hand and machine tools are taught. The work performed in the shop must be on a useful or productive basis under actual job conditions so far as is possible. Students are given individual attention rather than group instruction in their shop training.

Automotive Shop observe a demonstration by Mr. McGoron. This class is for students who like to work with machines and tools, and who enjoy repairing mechanical things.

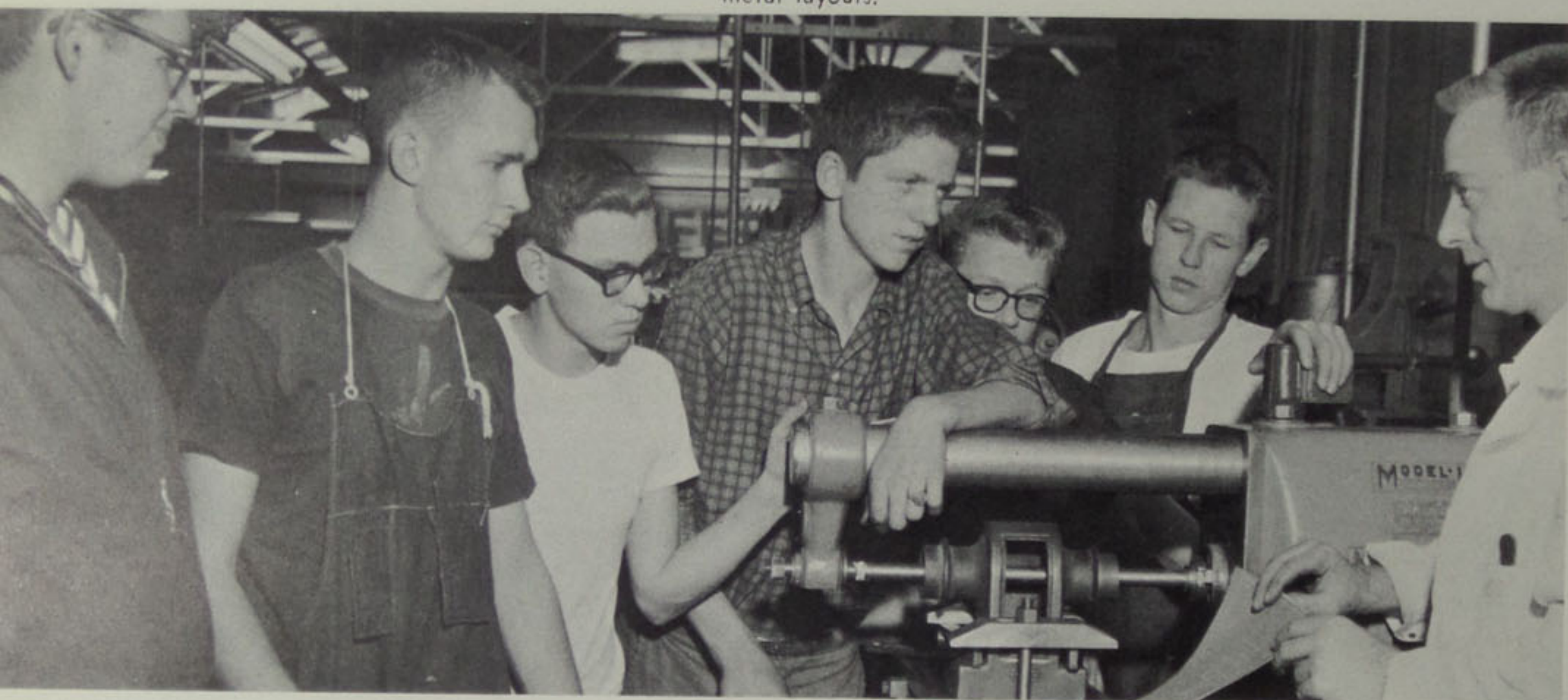

Much credit should be extended to our gallant crew of Trojan warriors, led by Coach Howard Baughman, for outstanding performance in their

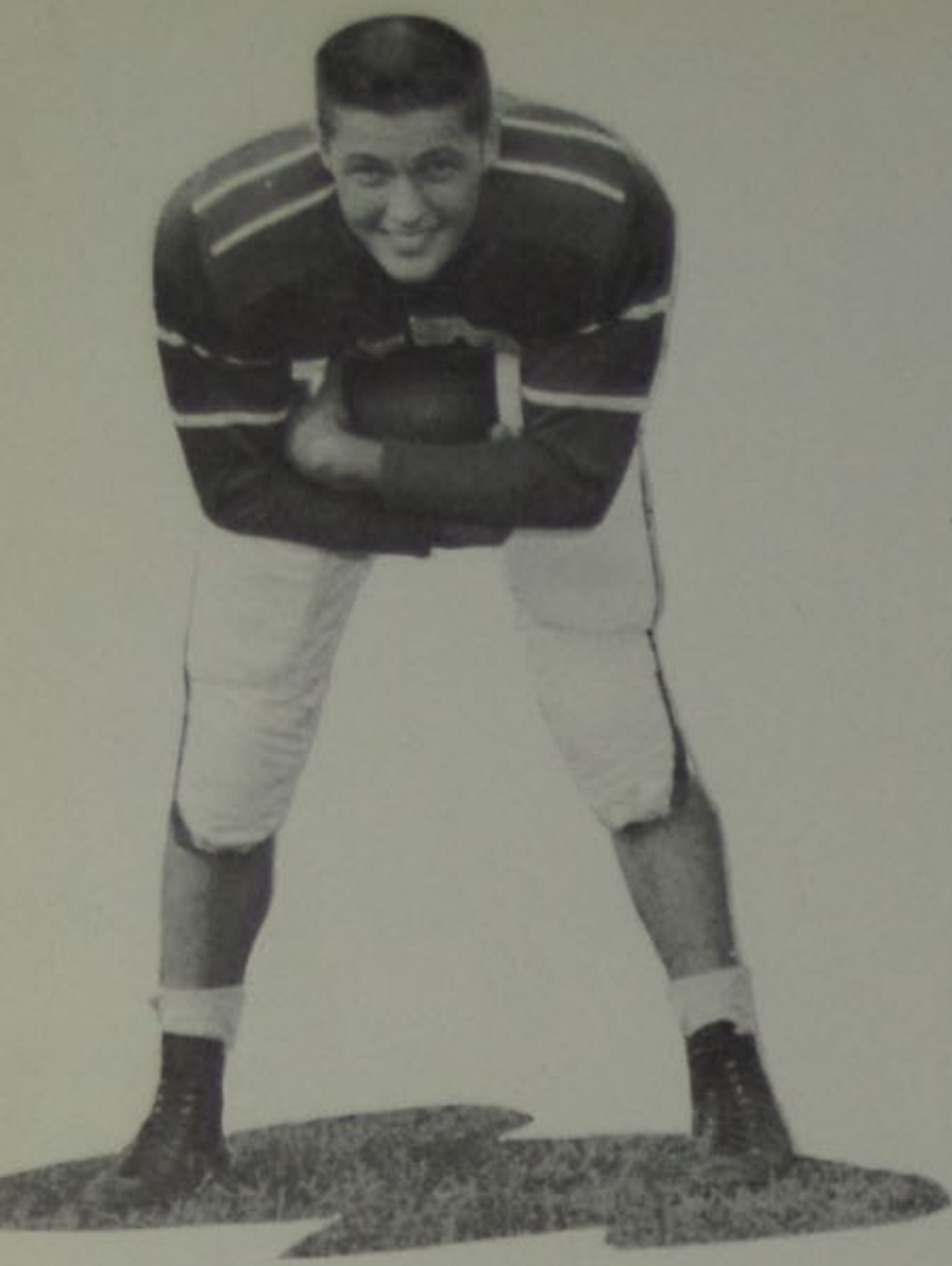
1958 football season. The season's record was one of the most successful in Portsmouth High football history.

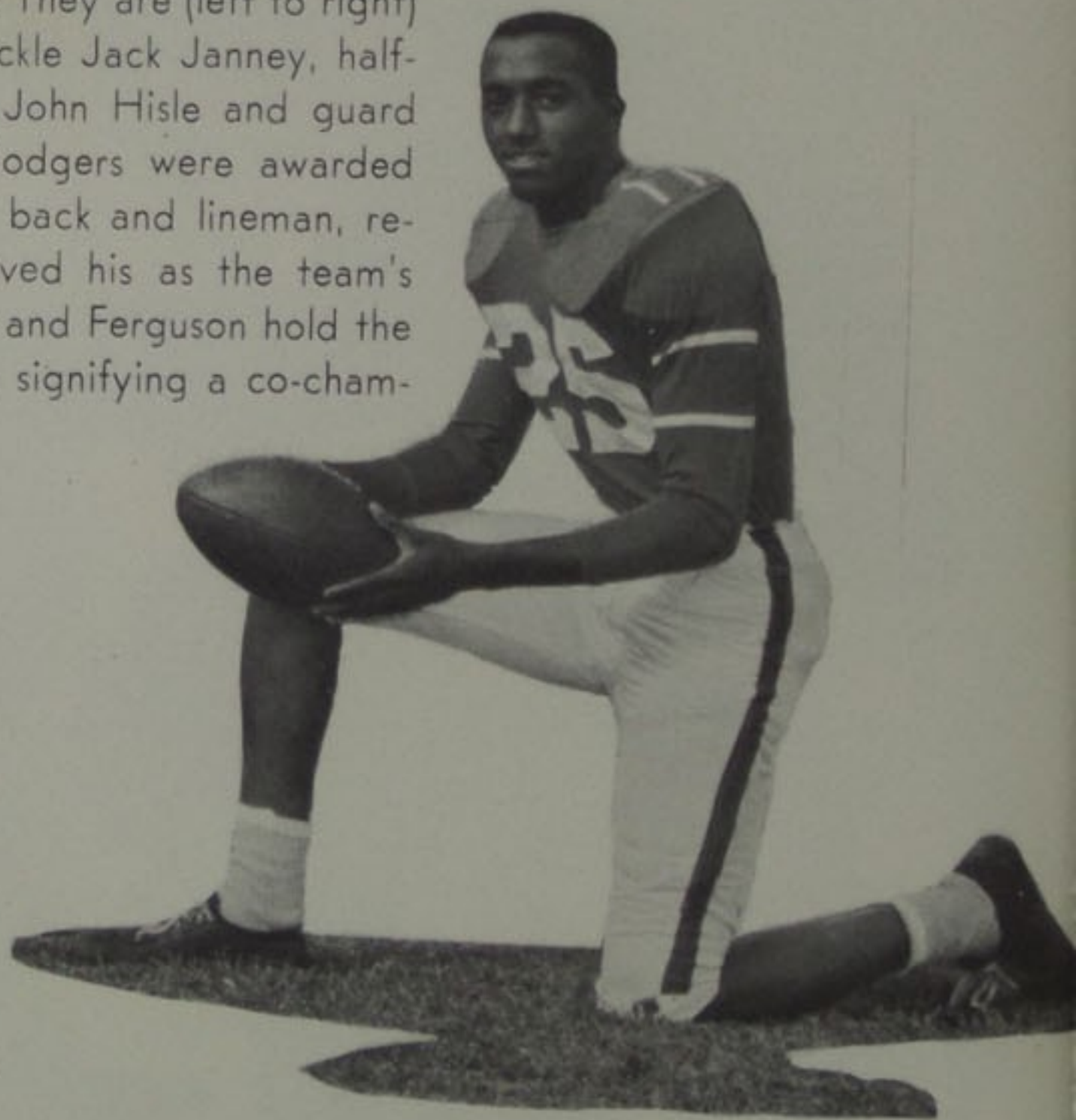


Trojans Awarded Trophies
