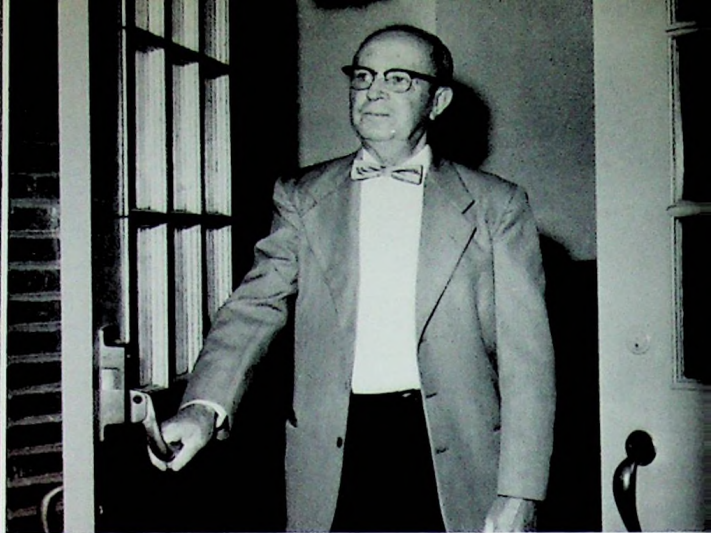
The four basic fundamentals are measured by the degree of success of each of the four factors as related to:

MR. DARLING, MR. GROH, MR. SIMPSON



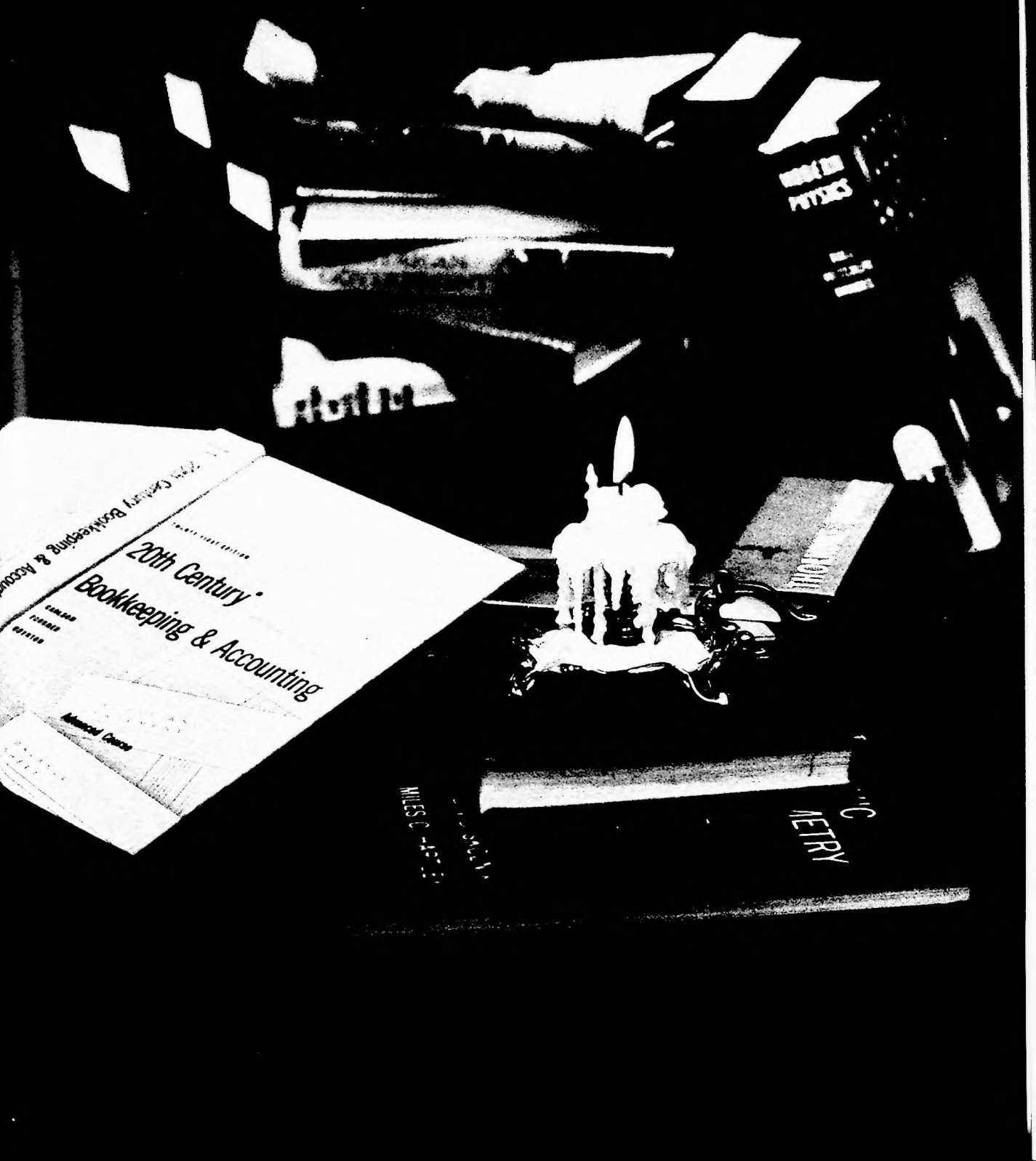
